NOTRE DAME VOLLEYBALL RELEASE #22 Notre Dame at Toledo, Tuesday, Oct. 2, 7 p.m.

Notre Dame vs. Toledo series history: Notre Dame and Toledo will be meeting for the fourth time ... the Irish have won all four previous meetings ... this will be the first trip to Toledo for the Irish since 1991 (a 15-5, 15-5, 15-4 victory) ... the Rockets have visited the Joyce Center twice, once for the 1996 Shamrock Invitational and most recently for a non-conference matchup in 1998 ... Toledo competes in the Mid-American Conference and finished 7-21 in 2000.

A look at the Rockets: Toledo (7-3, 3-2) is riding a three-match winning streak entering Tuesday's match with the Irish ... the Rockets defeated Akron 3-2 on Sunday, Oct. 30 ... Lindsey Kretzmann leads the Toledo offense with 142 kills (3.94 per game) on .279 hitting ... Jessica Buck leads the team in hitting at .288 with 134 kills (3.72 per game) ... Toledo's setter, Carrie McCaw, is averaging 12.03 assists per game and had posted 21 aces this season (0.58 per game) ... the Rockets are undefeated (5-0) at home this season.

 <u>Matches cancelled:</u> The matches previously scheduled against Michigan, Indiana State, Tulane and Purdue, originally postponed due to the terrorm. ist attack on the United States, will not be replayed this season.

<u>Boston College match start time changed:</u> When the Irish travel to Chestnut Hill, Mass., to take on BIG EAST Conference opponent Boston College, the match will take place at 1 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 6. The match was originally scheduled to take place at 3:30 p.m., but was moved after a Boston College football game time change.

Irish move up to 22nd in latest national poll: After two BIG EAST Conference victories over Virginia Tech and Georgetown, Notre Dame moved up two spots in the USA Today/AVCA Top 25. The 22nd ranking is the highest the Irish have been ranked since Sept. 3, when they were 20th.

<u>Kreher named BIG EAST Player of the Week</u>: Senior opposite Kristy Kreher
was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on Monday, Oct. 1, for her
outstanding performance while leading the team through two conference
victories over the weekend.

One of the main offensive weapons for head coach Debbie Brown's team, Kreher totaled 32 kills in the two matches (4.57 kills per game) and posted a .407 attack percentage. The senior also was highly active on defense, digging 14 attacks (2.00 per game) and blocking 13 shots (1.86 per game).

The Preseason BIG EAST Player of the Year, Kreher stepped up to the challenge in Notre Dame's match against conference rival Georgetown. She helped the Irish even the match at one game apiece with two consecutive kills to score the 29th and 30th points of game two. In the fourth and deciding game, she played a hand in four of Notre Dame's final five points with three kills and a block to ensure a 3-1 victory over the Hoyas.

The Notre Dame team, which moved up to 22nd in the latest *USA Today/* AVCA Top 25 poll released on Monday, Oct. 1, will travel to Toledo, Ohio, on Tuesday, Oct. 2, for a non-conference matchup with the University of Toledo.

Goralski leads BIG EAST: Senior middle blocker **Malinda Goralski** ranks at the top of two statistical categories in the conference rankings. The Missouri City, Texas, native leads all league players in blocks per game with 1.81 (51 total). She also is ranked first in hitting percentage (.427) and plays a major role in Notre Dame's top team ranking in blocks per game (3.27).

In the latest NCAA statistical rankings (Sept. 24), Goralski is ranked 13th in blocks per game (1.79) and 28th in hitting percentage (.401).

Fletcher emerges in the middle of the Irish offense: Sophomore middle blocker Kim Fletcher, who earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team honors in 2000, is third on the team in kills (85), fourth in digs (58) and second in blocks (34). Her quickness and ability to reach the entire court caught the eye of competing coaches in the 2001 Shamrock Invitational, who played a hand in voting her the Most Outstanding Player of the twoday tournament.

Fletcher has set career marks this season for kills (14) and digs (10) while posting her first career doubledouble against Idaho in the Shamrock Invitational championship match. She currently ranks eighth in the BIG EAST in hitting percentage (.301).

The second-year middle has stepped up her blocking lately, stopping a career-best nine shots at the net against Georgetown. She is currently averaging 1.10 blocks per game.

<u>Kreher getting back into form:</u> After suffering through a hitting slump early in the season, senior **Kristy Kreher** seems poised to break out into her old form. One of the top percentage hitters in Irish volleyball history, Kreher was slowed early in the season fighting off the effects of a severe high ankle sprain suffered over the summer.

In the first BIG EAST match of the season she posted her first doubledouble of the season with 14 kills and 11 digs against the Syracuse Orangewomen. She also posted a .458 hitting percentage in the match.

Continuing to show marked improvement, the senior opposite was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on Oct. 1, after posting 32 kills in two matches against Virginia Tech and Georgetown.

<u>Alderete excels in the back row</u>: Irish defensive specialist Janie Alderete, who usually subs in for starting middle blocker Malinda Goralski in the back row, is becoming one of the top performers on the Irish roster. A junior from Santa Clara, Calif., Alderete has recorded more than four digs in nine out of ten matches this season.

She was all over the court against #15 Pepperdine on Sept. 9, digging a career-high 19 balls. She has continued that form lately as well, recording 13 digs vs. Valparaiso and nine against Georgetown.

Alderete currently leads the team in digs per game with a 2.56 average (82 total).

Not just a defensive threat, Alderete is second on the team with 11 aces this season and recorded a careerhigh four against Virginia Tech on Sept. 28.

<u>Kristen Kinder takes advantage of</u> <u>starting opportunity</u>: Heading into the 2001 season, the starting setter was clearly one of the more pivotal position on the team. After the graduation of four-year starter Denise Boylan, the reigns of the Irish offense

a presence across the boxscore after every match. She is first on the team in aces with 12, third in digs with 73 and has collected 18 blocks (including three solo). Her assist average is second in the conference at 11.88 and she also has shown the ability to provide a kill when needed - knocking down 31 shots this season (0.97 per game).

Notre Dame in BIG EAST volleyball competition: Since the Irish joined the BIG EAST Conference in 1995, they have posted an exceptional 67-2 (.971) regular-season conference mark. Notre Dame has also won 36 consecutive conference regular-season matches. The two conference losses the Irish suffered were to Connecticut and West Virginia (both on the road) in 1998.

The Irish are 39-0 at home in regular-season BIG EAST matches.

Goralski grabs BIG EAST weekly award: Senior middle blocker Malinda Goralski earned her first BIG EAST Player of the Week award on Monday, Sept. 3, after helping lead the Irish to three straight victories in the Shamrock Invitational.

She recorded 37 kills and 25 blocks during the weekend, including slamming down a career-high 18 kills Friday (Aug. 31) against Southwest Texas State. Goralski, who earned alltournament honors, also tied a ca-

were handed to sophomore **Kristen Kinder**.

The second-year player from Fresno, Calif., has responded. Leading the team to a .260 hitting percentage 10 matches into the season, Kinder has turned a possible team weakness into a team strength.

Shrugging off a lack of playing time in 2000, Kinder has helped the Irish lead the conference in hitting and is

reer high with 11 blocks against Idaho in Notre Dame's 3-1 win against the Vandals. On the weekend, Goralski recorded 3.7 kills and 2.5 blocks per game while hitting .463.

<u>Coaching change:</u> Robin Davis, most recently an assistant at Northern Arizona, has joined the Irish staff as an assistant. Davis replaces Lindsay Rosenthal and will help the Irish in the day-to-day business of the program, recruiting and on-court teaching.

Davis also has head coaching experience at Biola (Calif.) University. He coached 10 years at Biola, then moved on to Northern Arizona, helping them qualify for the NCAA Tournament in 1999 and 2000 while capturing the Big Sky Conference Co-Championship in 2000.

Irish forced to adjust from the comforts of home to life on the road: Notre Dame played 19 matches in the friendly confines of the Joyce Center last season. The Irish had 17 regularseason home matches scheduled and won both matches at the 2000 BIG EAST Volleyball Championship, which was held on campus. The 2001 schedule calls for at least 13 road matches, a number that could increase if the Irish qualify for the BIG EAST Championship. A key stretch of the Irish schedule will be six consecutive road matches from Oct. 16 through Nov. 4.

Freshman ready to contribute: Even as the Irish welcome back 10 monogram winners to the 2001 roster, three talented freshman have joined the team and have already seen playing time early in the season. Emily Loomis (Fort Wayne, Ind.) has made a push for playing time after posting a 10-6 jump-reach in a preseason test and displaying solid offensive and defensive skills. Loomis tied for the team lead in kills in the Shamrock Invitational championship match vs. Idaho with 14. She also tied for a team-high with eight kills vs. #15 Pepperdine at the U.S.Bank/Arby's Tournament in Lincoln, Neb.

OH Leah Nedderman (Grapevine, Texas) and MB Kelly Corbett (Mountain View, Calif.) have both impressed the Irish coaching staff in the preseason and are poised to see significant playing time off the bench. Both Corbett and Nedderman hit their first career kills against Valparaiso and also saw action vs. Syracuse on Sept. 22.

Strong schedule: Irish head coach Debbie Brown, who led the team to two key victories over high ranked opponents in 2000 (3-2 come-frombehind victory over #15 BYU and a 3-1 win over #22 Loyola Marymount), has scheduled a number of highly-rated teams this season. Notre Dame will face five top 25 teams in 2001, including #8 Florida in the Gator's Volleyball Conference Challenge at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex on Nov. 24. The Irish have already faced #1 Nebraska, #7 UCLA and #15 Pepperdine this season at the US Bank/Arby's Tournament in Lincoln, Neb.

Northern Iowa, who entered the *USA Today*/AVCA Poll on Sept. 9 (currently ranked 18th), will meet the Irish on Tuesday, Oct. 16, in the Quad Cities.

Career-bests: A number of Irish players have posted career-bests during the 2001 season. Malinda Goralski tied her career high in both kills (18) and blocks (11) vs. Southwest Texas and Idaho, respectively. Kim Fletcher posted two career-bests while achieving her first career double-double with 14 kills and 10 digs against Idaho. Fletcher also posted a personal-best nine blocks against Georgetown. Freshman Emily Loomis also posted 14 kills vs. the Vandals, for a personal-best total of her young career.

Junior DS Janie Alderete set a new career mark with 19 digs against #15 Pepperdine on Sept. 9. Alderete followed up her career-high digs effort with 13 against Valparaiso on Tuesday.

Notre Dame cancels four matches due to national developments last week: Due to the tragedies in New York, Pennsylvania and Northern Virginia on Sept. 11, Notre Dame postponed its volleyball matches with Michigan (Sept. 12), Indiana State (Sept. 14), Tulane (Sept. 14) and Purdue (Sept. 15).

Said University of Notre Dame director of athletics Kevin White: "We believe the horrific developments (last) Tuesday warrant a national period of bereavement and a moratorium as far as athletics are concerned. Consistent with the BIG EAST decision not to compete in any sports, we have postponed all athletic events through the weekend."

The matches will not be made up in 2001. The BIG EAST Conference did not compete in any sports over the weekend of Sept. 14-16, therefore no Player of the Week announcements were available on Sept. 17.

The Irish will wear an embroidered American flag on their uniform for the rest of the season in remembrance of the victims from the Sept. 11 attacks.
