## KEY STORYLINES

- Marquette earned its second straight BIG EAST Men's Soccer Championship berth by virtue of earning the No. 6 seed in the Blue Division with a league record of 3-4-2 and 11 points in conference play this season.
- MU is coming off a 3-1 opening-round victory at St. John's and advances to the BIG EAST quarterfinals for the first time since joining the conference in 2005 ... The Golden Eagles have a 1-1 all-time record in the tournament, falling to USF 2-1 in last year's first round.
- Saturday's winner will advance to the semifinals at Red Bull Arena, home of Major League Soccer's New York Red Bull, in Harrison, N.J. on Nov. 12 and will face the winner of Louisville vs. West Virginia ... The championship match will be played on Nov. 14 ... Winner of the BIG EAST Championship final receives the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Championship field of 48.
- Saturday's BIG EAST quarterfinal is a re-match from Oct. 13 when Notre Dame defeated Marquette 4-1 at Alumni Stadium, snapping the Golden Eagles' season-best sixgame unbeaten streak ... The Irish scored three goals in the first 30 minutes of action and sophomore Chris Madsen tallied MU's lone goal.


## ABOUT THE OPPONENT

- Notre Dame is ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation (Soccer America) this week and received a first-round bye in the BIG EAST Men's Soccer Championship with a runner-up finish in the Blue Division standings.
- The Irish finished the regular season with a 6-2-1 record in conference play ... They are 7-1-1 this season at Alumni Stadium and own a perfect 5-0 mark at home against conference foes ... Steven Perry has scored nearly half (12) of Notre Dame's 27 goals this season and with 27 points is tied for the league lead ... Harrison Shipp leads the team with six assists, including three helpers in the Irish's first meeting with Marquette back on Oct. 13.
- Notre Dame is 12-9-5 in the BIG EAST Championship, including a pair of tournament titles $(1996,2003)$.

## SERIES HISTORY

- The Irish lead the all-time series with Marquette, 12-5-1, and have won their last six matches against the Golden Eagles ... MU's last win over Notre Dame was a 4-0 decision back in 1990 ... The Golden Eagles have not won at Notre Dame since 1983.


## MU AGAINST NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

- MU has earned a point in three of its last four matches against teams ranked in the top-10 in the NSCAA poll ... MU tied No. 9 Louisville (T, 2-2) and No. 5 USF (T, 1-1) last season ... The Golden Eagles have played one top-10 opponent this season, playing to a 1-1 draw against No. 3 UConn.
- MU's last win over an opponent ranked in the top 25 of the NSCAA poll was a 1-0 shutout over No. 23 Penn State on Sept. 4, 2005 in Columbus, Ohio ... The Golden Eagles tied No. 5 USF, 1-1, in Tampa last season and played to a 2-2 draw against No. 9 Louisville later in the week.
- Bennett's Golden Eagles defeated Georgetown 1-0 at Valley Fields on Oct. 17, 2009 when the Hoyas were ranked No. 16 in the nation by Soccer America.

## FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTING TO THE CAUSE

- Four different freshmen have found the back of the net thus far in 2010 -Eric Pothast, Tee Jay East, Bryan Ciesiulka and Paul Dillon ... Pothast and Ciesiulka have both netted two goals this season and each have a gamewinner to their credit ... Pothast's header against Wright State proved to be the game-winner in the 2-0 decision over the Raiders, while Ciesiulka scored the Golden Goal in the 97th minute of MU's 3-2 overtime win over Seton Hall in the regular season finale.


## MALLACE IN THE MIDDLE

- Junior midfielder Calum Mallace has been the centerpiece of MU's increased offensive production in $2010 \ldots$.. He has been involved in 12 of the Golden Eagles' 23 goals scored this season and leads MU in most offensive categories, including points (18), goals (6) and assists (6).
- Mallace's 18 points and six goals are the most in a single season by an individual MU player since Chris Lee tallied 23 points and 10 goals during the 2004 season ... Mallace also has a team-high six assists this season, the most since Derek Gutierrez (8) in 2003.
- The Torphichen, Scotland native is MU's active all-time leader in points (27), goals scored (10), shots (143) and shots on goal (56).
- Seven of Mallace's 10 career goals have been game-winners, including three game-winning goals this season ... His seven career game-winners is tied for fourth all-time at MU.


## KEEPING OPPONENTS IN 'CHECK’

- Sophomore goalkeeper David Check became the first player since 2004 to earn BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week two consecutive weeks (Oct. 4 and Sept. 27) ... Since taking over as the starting keeper, Check has posted six shutouts in 13 matches, the most shutouts in a season by an MU keeper since Jim Welch posted nine during the 1998 campaign.
- He posted his fourth shutout of the season with a 1-0 victory over in-state rival Wisconsin (Sept. 28) and followed that performance with 1-1 draw against No. 3/4 Connecticut (Oct. 1), in which he made a career high nine saves, to earn BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week for the second straight week on Oct. 4.
- Check picked up his third shutout of the season at Rutgers (Sept. 24) and was selected as BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week on Monday, Sept. 27 ... He faced 18 shots in the match vs. RU and made six saves.


## WHEN MU SCORES FIRST ...

- Marquette is $10-1$ over the course of its last 11 games when the Golden Eagles score the go-ahead goal ... Going back to the 2008 season opener, the Golden Eagles boast a 14-2-1 mark when they score first, outscoring their opponents 33-12 during that stretch, including 11 shutouts on defense.


## POTHAST'S PRESENCE FELT

- Freshman central defender Eric Pothast has proved to be a big addition to MU's backline ... MU is 5-3-4 this season with six shutouts when Pothast is in the lineup ... He missed five games during the middle of the season due to illness ... Golden Eagles went 1-4 and were outscored by their opponents by a margin of 14-6 with Pothast on the sideline.

## BENNETT EARNS 150TH CAREER WIN

- Head coach Louis Bennett picked up his 150th career coaching victory on Oct. 6, 2010, with a 2-0 shutout vs. Wright State at Valley Fields ... Bennett, who is in his fifth season at MU, accumulated 136 of his wins in 10 previous seasons as head coach at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Coach Bennett, who was raised in England, is joined on the staff by volunteer assistant Marcelo Santos (Brazil), along with video coordinator and former MU midfielder Michael Greene (Liberia).


## FORMER PLAYERS IN THE PROS

- Head coach Louis Bennett has coached 26 players during his college career who have gone on to sign professional contract ... The most recent player to turn pro was goalkeeper Matt Pyzdrowski who signed with the Portland Timbers (USSF Division-2).
- Bennett has helped train former U.S. Men's National Team member Tony Sanneh while they were both at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee ... Sanneh last played professionally in 2009 with the Los Angeles Galaxy and spent over seven season in Major League Soccer ... Sanneh also played internationally with FC Nuremberg and Hertha BSC.
- Assistant coach Steve Bode, who played under Coach Bennett at Milwaukee, was a fourth-round draft pick of the Chicago Fire (MLS) in 2007.

## Louis Bennett, Head Coach (5th Season at MU)



Head Coach Louis Bennett enters his fifth season as head men's soccer coach at Marquette University in 2010, a season removed from leading the Golden Eagles to their first ever appearance in the BIG EAST men's soccer postseason tournament.

A lifelong ambassador of the "beautiful game" and beloved in the Milwaukee soccer community, Bennett has boasted a 146-111-29 career record in 14 seasons as a collegiate head coach. During that span, Bennett has helped develop 26 collegiate players who have gone on to play in the professional ranks. He has also coached six all-America selections and 61 all-conference performers.

Bennett's squads have improved every year since he took over at Marquette in 2006. It's a testament to the drive that Bennett instills in his young players and the leadership the he helps to foster among his team captains, coupled with sound technical and tactical training MU players receive.

Widely regarded as one of the top head coaches in college soccer, Bennett is a five-time winner of the Horizon League's Coach of the Year Award and twice was named Great Lakes Coach of the Year.

At UWM, Bennett led the Panthers to five straight NCAA Tournament berths, including four consecutive appearances in the second round of the tournament. The most successful coach in the history of UWM men's soccer, Bennett compiled a 136-63-17 record in 10 seasons. UWM had dominated the Horizon League posting a 41-4-2 record in conference play and earning five league titles from 2001 to 2005. Over the same time, UWM was 14-1 in the conference tournament, reached five conference championship games, and won four tournament titles. Bennett also guided his squad to a 25 -game league unbeaten streak ( $23-0-2$ ) that stretched into the 2004 season. In 2005, Bennett led UWM to its fifth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, winning the regular season crown for the fith consecutive year and the conference tournament for fourth straight time. Bennett had UWM poised to upset top-seeded New Mexico in the second round of the 2005 national tournament before falling in penalty kicks.

The 2004 campaign included a fourth-straight trip to the NCAA Tournament, winning the regular season crown for the fourth-straight season and the league tournament for the third consecutive year. That same year, Bennett surpassed Dan Harris in the UWM coaching ranks, becoming the school's all-time winningest coach in a Sept. 25 victory over Detroit. The Panthers' run in the NCAA Tournament included a $3-2$ win at No. 16 San Francisco in the first round and an overtime loss at UC-Santa Barbara in the second round. UCSB made it the NCAA Championship game.

In 2003, Bennett earned a third consecutive Horizon League Coach of the Year award while leading UWM to its fitth-straight winning season. Milwaukee defeated Western Michigan, 4-1, to advance to the second round of the tourney for the second-straight year.

All of this came on the heels of a record-breaking season in 2002 which included a school-record 19-2-1 record, a no. 8 national ranking -- the highest in school history, an NCAA-best 19 consecutive wins and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament win. Bennett also earned NSCAA Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year honors as well as League Coach of the Year accolades.

In the 2001 season, UWM posted an 18-5 overall record, including a perfect 7-0 mark in Horizon League play. Under Bennett's direction, the Panthers advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1990 and for the fourth time in school history. Prior to taking over the head coaching position in 1996, Bennett served as an assistant coach at Wis.-Milwaukee from 1993 to 1995.

A native of Great Britain, Bennett has made the Milwaukee area his home since 1985. Two years later, he started the British-American Soccer Program in Milwaukee. He is now the owner and director of the organization that operates as a camp and touring program for soccer players ages $6-18$. Prior to his assistant position at UWM, Bennett coached the boys' and girls' varsity soccer teams at Nicolet High School for five years. He also has coaching experience at the adult club level in Wisconsin with F.C. Victoria, the Bavarian Soccer Club and the ODP.

Bennett played collegiate soccer at Crewe \& Alsager College in England, helping win the British Colleges National Championship in 1982. He was also honored as a Great Britain Colleges International Player for three years. Bennett played professional soccer for seven years in the U.S., including three seasons with the Milwaukee Wave of the NPSL (1985-87).

Bennett is married to the former Julie Harper of Yorkshire, England. The couple has three children -- Eston, Yve and Louis -- and resides in Shorewood.
