SERIES INFORMATION

• Today's game will be the 12th meeting between the Hoyas and Fighting Irish, with the Hoyas winning the last five games, dating back to 1998. Georgetown's last trip to South Bend, Ind. came in 1999. GU leads the All-Time series 7-4.
 • In last season's 11-8 GU win Travis Comeau scored twice and goalie Jack Davis held Notre Dame scoreless in the second half.

UP NEXT

The Hoyas return home to Multi-Sport Field to take on Loyola (Md.) at 7 p.m. on Saturday, April 16. It will be the only the third home game for Georgetown during the 2011 season.

FOR STARTERS

• **EHRMANN MAKING AN IMPACT AT LSM:** Barney Ehrmann has moved to long stick middle over the past two games, helping the Hoyas to its first two game winning streak of the season. Ehrmann is second on the team with 41 ground balls and has caused 31 turnovers.

• **OFFENSE AMONG LEADERS:** Georgetown's scoring offense leads the BIG EAST and is sixth in the nation, averaging 12.14 goals per game.

• **EMALA LEADS THE NATION:** Prior to GU's game with Mount St. Mary's, Davey Emala was leading NCAA Division I, averaging 3.0 goals per game. Emala has scored three or more goals in five of eight GU games this season. He scored twice against The Mount on Tuesday.

• **NEW ROLE:** Rickey Mirabito has had to take on the role of set-up man with Zac Guy's injury and has responded leading the Hoyas and tied for sixth in the NCAA averaging 2.0 assists per game (17). Mirabito has 17 assists this season, after having 16 assists in his first three seasons on the Hilltop.

• **ON THE GROUND:** The Hoyas are seventh in the nation in ground balls, averaging 36.88 per game. Brian Tabb (48) and Barney Ehrmann (41) currently lead the team.

• **SUPER SOPHS:** Three of the team's top four point scorers are members of the sophomore class, with Emala (31), Travis Comeau (25), and Brian Casey (17) in the top four. Another soph. Chris Nourse is second on the squad with 22 caused turnovers.

• **URICK AT 336 WINS:** With 335 career wins, Head Coach Dave Urick is the winningest active coach in NCAA Lacrosse. In his 22nd season at Georgetown, Urick, who is also third in winning percentage among active coaches (.738), has 213 wins on the Hilltop.

DAVEY EMALA THE NATION'S TOP SCORER

At the beginning of the week, sophomore attackman Davey Emala (Baltimore, Md./Gilman) was leading NCAA Division I in scoring, averaging 3.0 goals per game through the first eight games of the season. He scored twice in the Hoyas game against Mount St. Mary's on Tuesday.

In consecutive games against Harvard and Syracuse, Emala set and tied his career-high with five goals apiece to help him earn a spot on the BIG EAST Weekly honor roll for the week (March 14). Emala was one goal shy of tying Mark Murphy's string of consecutive games with three or more goals that was set in 1990. Emala had scored three against St. John's five against Harvard, five against Syracuse and was held to two goals in the Hoyas 14-5 victory over Providence. He rebounded with four goals and an assist in a loss to No. 4 Duke on March 26.

BARNEY EHRMANN NAMED AMONG QUINT KESSENICH'S TOP 50 SENIORS

Barney Ehrmann (Baltimore, Md./Gilman) was named the fourth best senior when Inside Lacrosse/ESPN analyst Quint Kessenich introduced a list of the nation's Top 50 Seniors in this week's issue of Inside Lacrosse. Kessenich said about Ehrmann: "This kid is a beast. He can run, hit, carry the rock and cover. The only question mark is whether the year off has slowed him down after Ehrmann missed the majority of 2010 with injury and did not play in the fall.

Ehrmann, who started the season at close defense and has moved to long stick middle has been an integral part of the Hoyas defensive improvement throughout the season, picking up 41 ground balls and causing 31 turnovers. Ehrmann has also been valuable for the Hoyas in winning face-offs.

RICKEY MIRABITO AND BRIAN TABB MOVING UP GU CAREER LISTS

Rickey Mirabito has been thrust into the role as the set-up man, leading the Hoyas with 17 assists on the season, but throughout his career on the Hilltop Mirabito has been a productive goal-scorer. With his four goal performance against Mount Saint Mary's on Tuesday, Mirabito moved to 12th all-time in goals with 74.

Tabb, who has been the Hoyas' primary player in the face-off circle has 305 career wins in the circle, good for fifth in Hoya history. In the Hoyas last home game with Providence, Tabb had a dominant day taking 18-of-21 to go along with 14 ground balls against the Friars. Through his first six games, Tabb is 12th in the nation in face-off percentage, winning .627 percent of his trips into the circle. He is currently second in the conference and tied for 11th in the nation in ground balls per game, picking up an average of 6.67 per game.

GAME NOTES

GEORGETOWN'S MAN-UP OFFENSE

Georgetown's man-up offense has been productive through the Hoyas' first nine games of the 2011 season. They are 13-of-38 (.342), as four different players have scored in man-up opportunities, including Davey Emala (7), Max Seligmann (2), David Shriver (2) and Stu Shannon (1). The unit is ranked 23th in the country behind Hobart and Rutgers, who they will see later in the season.

NEW DEFENSE YIELDS IMMEDIATE RESULTS

Georgetown had been allowing 14.75 goals per game following a 16-15 loss to Harvard on March 8. The following day the Hoyas started working on a zone defensive scheme that they rolled against Syracuse, holding the No. 1 Orange to a season-low nine goals and forcing them to overtime at the Konica Minolta Face-Off Classic.

With the strong defensive performance the Hoyas have seen its team numbers on the rise, as they are now 12th in the nation in caused turnovers per game (9.50).

GETTING IT DONE ON THE GROUND

After losing the ground ball battle in each of the first three games, Georgetown has turned it around in noticeable fashion. Against Harvard Georgetown had a ground ball differential of +1, the first time they had a plus differential on the season. Then against No. 1 Syracuse on March 12 Georgetown picked up 43 ground balls to hold a +16 differential over the Orange. Dan Hostetler had a team-leading seven ground balls in that game. Currently Georgetown is atop the BIG EAST and 13th in the nation, picking up 34.6 ground balls. The Hoyas continued the trend holding a +18 advantage picking up 45 ground balls against Providence with Brian Tabb picking up 14.

DAVEY EMALA NAMED TO BIG EAST WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

Sophomore attackman Davey Emala (Baltimore, Md./Gilman) was named to the BIG EAST Men's Lacrosse Weekly honor roll on Monday afternoon when the conference office announced its weekly awards. Emala scored 10 goals, setting a career-high with five goals against Harvard and tying the mark with five goals against No. 1 Syracuse on Saturday at the Face-Off Classic.

Emala, the BIG EAST leader in goals (17) is tied for second in NCAA Division I averaging 3.40 goals per game. He has scored three or more goals in four of the Hoyas five goals this season, including a pair of five-goal games during the past week to lead Georgetown's offense.

JACK DAVIS NAMED BIG EAST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior goalie Jack Davis (Glen Ridge, N.J./Glen Ridge) has been named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week by the

DAVE URICK HEAD COACH | 22ND SEASON

Dave Urick is beginning his 22nd season as the head coach of the Georgetown men's lacrosse team. Urick has brought the Hoyas' program to national prominence and has established GU as one of the elite lacrosse programs in the country.

Georgetown has made the NCAA Tournament in 11 of the past 14 seasons under Urick and during that stretch, the program advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals nine times, including six-straight seasons.

In 1999, the Hoyas advanced all the way to the NCAA semifinals, the best finish ever in the history of Georgetown lacrosse.

In 20 of his 21 years at Georgetown, the Hoyas have had winning records, the only winning seasons in the program's 36-year history of Division I competition. After leading GU to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1997, Urick was the recipient of Georgetown's 1996-97 Outstanding Coaching Achievement Award.

Urick has a 209-86 mark at Georgetown, including a school record 13 wins in 1999. His teams have won at least 10 games on 12 occasions. The Hoyas have been ranked in the top 10 of the final United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) Top 20 Poll in 12 of the past 14 years. After beating Maryland in the 2007 season opener, Georgetown was ranked No. 1 in the country in the USILA Top 20 poll, the first time the team was ranked first in program history.

In 31 seasons as a head coach at the collegiate level, Urick has posted an impressive record of 331-116 for a .740 winning percentage. Urick is the NCAA Division I leader for active coaches in total wins (331) and second in winning percentage (.740). Urick is also third with 331 career-coaching victories. He earned his 250th career-coaching win vs. Manhattan in the NCAA Tournament on May 12, 2002, and earned his 300th against Fairfield on April 7, 2007. Following the 2010 season Urick was named the USILA Howdy Myers Man of the Year in recognition for his contributions to the game and as the all-time wins leader in the sport.

In 30 seasons as a head coach, Urick has had 97 different players earn All-American accolades. All 60 of Georgetown's All-Americans have come under the tutelage of Urick. Attackman Greg McCavera became the first GU player to garner First Team All-America honors in 1999 and five other Hoyas have earned that distinction since, Steve Dusseau (2001, 2002), Kyle Sweeney (2002), Brodie Merrill (2004, 2005), Walid Hajj (2004) and Jerry Lambe (2008). In 2005, Merrill became only the second Georgetown player, joining Dusseau, to earn two first-team honors.

Urick was named the ECAC Lacrosse League Coach of the Year in 2000 and again in 2007, and has had 55 players named to the ECAC First and Second Teams. His players have won the ECAC Offensive Player of the Year Award five seasons, the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year Award five times and the ECAC Rookie of the Year Award twice. In addition, Urick has had 53 of his players participate in the prestigious North-South All-Star Game. All but two of the 26 Georgetown players to participate in the North-South Game played under Urick. Urick coached in the North-South All-Star Game in 1984 and 1992 and took the helm of the South squad again in 2004. Urick coached five players to All BIG EAST honors in the first year of the conference, including Chris Nixon, who was named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year.

Urick-coached players have also had a major impact on the international stage. At the 2006 International Lacrosse Federation World Championships, Merrill, who was named the tournament's Outstanding Defensive Player, led the Canadian National Team to a 15-10 win over the United States in the championship game. Team USA's roster included Sweeney and Urick's son, Scott. During the summer of 2008, then Hoya Craig Dowd was named the Most Outstanding Attackman, and Bobby Boyle helped lead the United States U-19 to the World Championship.

Urick came to Georgetown after spending 10 years as the head coach at Hobart College. During his tenure at Hobart, Urick amassed a 122-

30 record and won 10 consecutive NCAA Division III titles. He is one of only four coaches in the history of the NCAA to have won 10 consecutive national titles.

Urick has been inducted to four Halls of Fame for his contributions to lacrosse as a coach. The latest induction was to the Potomac Chapter of the United States Lacrosse Hall of Fame on January 22, 2005 and prior to that he was inducted into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame on July 23, 1998. On October 6, 1990, Urick was inducted into the Hobart College Athletic Hall of Fame. He was also inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Upstate New York Lacrosse Foundation Chapter in February of 1991.

Prior to his 10 years as the mentor of the Hobart lacrosse team, Urick served eight seasons as assistant coach and helped Hobart win back-to-back NCAA Championships in 1976 and 1977. Also in 1977, Urick took the helm of the Statesmen's football team and won Coach of the Year honors in the Independent College Athletic Conference in his first season, as he guided the team to a 7-2 mark. He served as Hobart's head football coach until 1981.

Urick is a 1970 graduate of Cortland State, where he was an All-ECAC linebacker as well as captain of both the football and lacrosse teams as a senior. He was inducted into Cortland State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1986 and was the recipient of the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 1980.

One of Urick's many honors in the lacrosse world was being selected to serve as head coach of the 1986 Team USA, which won the gold medal at the World Games in Toronto. He served as an assistant on the 1982 USA team that won the gold medal and is the current Chair of the USA Team Coaches Selection Committee. In 1980 and 1981, Urick was the recipient of the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association's Francis L. "Babe" Kraus Award as the Coach of the Year. Urick is a former Chairman and member of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Committee and the USILA Rules Advisory Committee.

He and his wife Linda, have three children, Holly (C'98), Scott (C'00) and Mindy (C'02), and reside in Fairfax, Va.

Matt Rienzo is in his 10th season as an assistant coach with the Georgetown men's lacrosse program. Rienzo will continue in

his primary role as defensive coordinator and running the substitution box.

During Rienzo's tenure, the Georgetown men's lacrosse team has reached the NCAA Quarterfinals six times. The Hoyas have consistently been one of the most imposing defensive teams in the country.

Over the last nine years, the Hoyas' defense has ranked among the top defensive units in the country. In 2003, Rienzo coached the unit to a Georgetown record for goals allowed per game at 7.33, which ranked seventh nationally. In 2004, the Hoyas gave up only 8.00 goals per game and in 2005, the unit allowed only 8.27 goals per game. The Hoyas ranked among the top-10 in the country in 2006 – ranking ninth by allowing only 7.54 goals per game – as the team won 12 games and the 2006 ECAC Championship. In 2007, GU limited 12 opponents to 10 goals or fewer and ranked 19th nationally in scoring defense, allowing only 8.20 goals per game. In 2008, the unit held nine teams to 10 goals or fewer and allowed only 8.76 goals per game.

Under Rienzo's tutelage, defensemen have received All-American honors 16 times in nine years, highlighted by the play of three-time honorees Kyle Sweeney and Brodie Merrill, who earned national honors twice. In 2002, he coached Sweeney to ECAC Defensive Player of the Year honors and to a spot on the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) All-American First Team. Sweeney went on to start every game for Team USA at the 2006 World Championships and was selected to represent the United States in the 2010 Games in England. Sweeney has played in Major League Lacrosse (MLL) for eight years and is currently playing for the Boston Cannons, in addition to playing for the Philadelphia Wings in the National Lacrosse League. Rienzo also guided Merrill to USILA First Team All-American honors in 2004 and 2005, respectively, the first Georgetown player to earn a spot on the first team in consecutive years. Merrill the 2005 ECAC Defensive Player of the Year and two-time First Team All-ECAC selection, was also a Tewaaraton Trophy Finalist in 2005. Merrill was named the Outstanding Defensive Player of the World Games after leading the Canadian National Team to the 2006 and 2010 World Lacrosse Championship. Following his graduation from Georgetown, Merrill embarked on a professional career that saw him earn a

league-record five-straight Defensive Player of the Year awards from the MLL. He was also named the NLL's Defensive Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year in 2006.

During his time at Georgetown, Rienzo also tutored Jerry Lambe, and Chris Nixon. Lambe was a two-time ECAC Defensive Player of the Year (2007, 2008) and earned USILA First Team All-American honors in 2007. Last year, Nixon was the recipient of the first BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year Award and was an Honorable Mention All-American.

Rienzo served on the staff at the University of Notre Dame in 2001. He worked with the Fighting Irish defense, which ranked third in the nation, giving up less than seven goals per game. The Irish advanced to the NCAA Semifinals for the first time in school history that year.

Prior to his stint at Notre Dame, Rienzo was the Dean of Students and Head Lacrosse Coach at Gonzaga High School in Washington. He guided his alma mater to a 14-7 record in 2000 as Gonzaga advanced to the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference Finals. In 2004, Rienzo was inducted into Gonzaga College High School's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Rienzo graduated from Georgetown in 1997 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English. In May of 2010, he completed a master's degree in Sports Industry Management from Georgetown.

As an undergraduate, he played four seasons and was a three-year starter under Head Coach Dave Urick. A two-time team Most Valuable Player, Rienzo helped lead the Hoyas to their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 1997, when he was named an Honorable Mention All-American. He played in the 1997 North-South All-Star Game after graduation. Rienzo was drafted by the Bridgeport (Conn.) Barrage of the MLL in the 2002 Supplemental Draft.

Rienzo, the son of former Georgetown Athletics Director Francis X. Rienzo, is married to the former Julie Shaw and resides in Bethesda, Md. They are the proud parents of Matthew Xavier (6), Grace (4) and Lila (8mo.).

Scott Urick is in his 10th season as an assistant coach with the Georgetown men's lacrosse program. Urick will again focus his coaching efforts on the team's offense.

In six of the last nine seasons, the Georgetown offense has finished the season ranked among the top-20 nationally in scoring offense. Last season, the offense ranked No. 9 in the country in scoring offense, averaging 11.86 goals per game, and scored at least 10 goals times. Seniors Andrew Brancaccio and Scott Kocis both earned All-American honors under Urick. Along with attack Craig Dowd, Brancaccio and Kocis were named First Team All-BIG EAST.

In 2008, the offensive unit averaged 11.46 goals per game, which ranked No.7 in the country, and scored at least 10 goals in nine different games. The squad also ranked fifth in the country in 2008 in man-up offense, scoring 25 goals in 58 chances (43.1 percent).

In 2007, the Hoyas averaged 9.33 goals per game and scored at least 10 goals in 10 games. Brendan Cannon, who led the team in scoring with 44 points, was named the ECAC's Offensive Player of the Year and earned second team All-America honors, while Andrew Brancaccio was named an honorable mention All-American.

In 2006, the unit finished the season ranked 18th nationally in scoring, tallying 9.77 goals per game. Four of his players earned All-ECAC honors and three were named All-American, including Cannon, who led the team in scoring in 2006 with 46 points and ranked fourth in the country with 32 assists.

In 2005, the squad averaged 10.53 goals per game and ranked 13th in the country. The Hoya offense finished the 2004 season in a tie for 12th nationally in scoring with a 10.57 goals per game average. Urick was a major key to Walid Hajj being named USILA First Team All-American and the ECAC's Offensive Player of the Year in 2004. He has also coached 2007 senior captain Trevor Casey, who won the ECAC's Rookie of the Year award.

In 2003, Georgetown's offense hit double digits on eight occasions and three players garnered All-ECAC honors. In Urick's first season with the Hoyas, he helped coach the offense to the number seven spot nationally in scoring offense, averaging 12.47 goals a game. He also coached the ECAC Offensive Player of the Year and All-American Steve Dusseau who set a Georgetown single season record with 53 tallies.

Urick served on the Cornell staff in 2001, where he helped guide the team to a 7-6 overall

record and a second-place finish in the Ivy League.

Urick played nine years of professional lacrosse in the Major League Lacrosse League, spending eight years with the New Jersey Pride (2001-08) and the 2009 season with the Washington Bayhawks. A four-time all-star selection, Urick was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2002 MLL All-Star Game after netting four goals and handing out one assist. Urick, who once appeared in 76-straight MLL games, scored 234 goals in 102 career games.

During the summer of 2006, Urick was a member of the United States national team, which advanced to the championship game of the World Lacrosse Championships in Ontario, Canada. Urick scored a team-high 20 goals for Team USA.

Urick graduated from Georgetown as the school's all-time leading goal scorer with 144 and is second in GU history with 47 goals in one season. He was a two-time All-America selection and was a captain in both his junior and senior years. Urick recorded 180 career points, the fifth highest total in school history, and played on four NCAA Tournament teams, including the 1999 team, which advanced to the NCAA Semifinals. An All-Tournament selection in 1999, he also represented Georgetown in the 2000 North/South All-Star game and was the team MVP.

Urick, the son of Georgetown head men's lacrosse coach Dave Urick, resides in Washington, D.C.

Jesse Miller is in his fifth season as an assistant volunteer coach with the Georgetown men's lacrosse program.

Miller came to the Hilltop after spending three years as an assistant at Tufts University in Massachusetts. While at Tufts, Miller served as the team's defensive coordinator, directed the team's recruiting efforts and assisted with fundraising and other team events.

A four-year letterwinner at Tufts, Miller earned a bachelor of science degree in chemical engineering in 2004. He helped lead the Jumbos to a No. 10 national ranking and a 13-3 record as a senior in 2004 and to a No. 20 national ranking and an 11- 5 mark in 2003. Miller was selected to play in the North-South Senior All-Star Game in 2004 and was an honorable mention All-New England selection.

Miller earned a master of engineering degree from Tufts in 2006.

2011 OUTLOOK

The Georgetown men's lacrosse team enters the 2011 season determined to make the NCAA tournament and win the BIG EAST title. The Hoyas, who have missed the NCAA Tournament the past three seasons, after advancing to at least the quarterfinals for eight of the nine previous years, will also be tasked with replacing five All BIG EAST caliber performers.

The Hoyas will not be without the talent to do so, as senior long pole Barney Ehrmann, who returns from injury and sophomore Travis Comeau, the leading freshman goal scorer in Georgetown lacrosse history, were both preseason All BIG EAST selections.

The squad also features a strong corps of senior captains, including Dan Hostetter, Rickey Mirabito, Max Seligmann, David Shriver and Ryan Shuler, for a team that went 5-1 and finished in second place in the first year of BIG EAST men's lacrosse.

Dave Urick returns at the helm for his 22nd season on the Hilltop. Urick, who is the all-time winningest active coach in NCAA lacrosse has compiled 331 wins overall and 209 at Georgetown through his storied career.

ATTACK

Georgetown will have some firepower in its attack unit with two of its top three goal scorers returning, in graduate student Rickey Mirabito (24 goals, five assists) and sophomore Travis Comeau (25 goals, 5 assists) coming back to the Hilltop.

Comeau, an All BIG EAST Preseason Team selection will look to build on a rookie season that saw him become the leading freshmen goal-scorer in Georgetown lacrosse history, with 25 goals. Comeau, a left-handed goal-scorer, started seven games last season and should be a mainstay at attack.

Mirabito returns for his final season after scoring 24 goals last season and 62 over his last three. Last season, Mirabito finished second in the conference in goals per game (2.40) and points per game (3.20) in five BIG EAST games. Sophomore Zac Guy will move to attack after tallying 11 assists as a midfielder during his freshman year. The Hoyas will hope for Guy's playmaking abilities to shine through while on the field with scoring threats Comeau and Mirabito. Sophomore Davey Emala, who scored six goals and proved to be a well-rounded player as a freshman, is expected to see minutes at attack.

The Hoyas will have depth in the form of David Shriver, who will also compete for time on the extra-man unit, as well as junior Adam Donahue and freshman Jeff Fountain.

MIDFIELD

GU will be tasked with replacing All BIG EAST middies Andrew Brancaccio, Scott Kocis and Chris Schuville, but will be able to do so with a mix of experience and youth.

Max Seligmann, an athletic, two-way midfielder scored 14 goals last season and is the Hoyas third-leading returning scorer. Seligmann brings experience to what will be a

young midfield unit.

Sophomores Brian Casey, the younger brother of former Hoya standout Trevor Casey, and Dan McKinney will compete to fill out the rest of the starting midfield line. Junior Zack Angel, who scored seven goals last season and was the team's 2009 freshman of the year, will also compete to fill out the rest of the starting midfield line.

The Hoyas second line will include senior Stu Shannon, whose shooting range and hard shot will also earn him time on the Hoyas' extra-man unit. Ryan Shuler will again move from attack to midfield and sophomore Jason McFadden will compete along with senior Brett Weiss, who will move between attack and midfield throughout the season. Depth in the midfield will be provided by juniors Brian Will and Henry Van Wagenberg.

Junior Gerry Reilly and graduate student Matt Sutherland, a transfer from Cornell, will be counted on to be leaders at defensive middle. Junior Kurt Watkinson will also see time, while junior Neil McGroarty and freshman John Wujciak will also compete for playing time. Junior Francis McDonough could also become a factor at defensive middle as he recovers from surgery in the offseason.

DEFENSE

The Hoyas have traditionally had one of the most athletic defenses in the country. The 2011 edition should be no different, as the unit should be experienced and physically imposing with seniors Barney Ehrmann (6-6, 230), Dan Hostetter (6-2, 205) and Bobby Boyle (6-2, 210) Ehrmann returns as one of the best long-stick players in the nation. Ehrmann, a 6-6, 230 pound former All-American is an exceptional athlete, who will play close defense and long stick middle (LSM).

Hostetter, one of the most athletic players in the country, will play close defense and could also see time at long stick middle. Boyle returns after sitting out 2010 due to injury and could be a key part of the defense becoming a cohesive unit. Boyle has proved to be a very good off-ball defender and team defender.

Sophomore Brennan Bicknese also returns after gaining valuable minutes as a freshman on close defense. Chris Nourse also gained experience as a freshman and is poised to earn minutes at close defense and LSM. Patrick Murray, Tyler Knarr, Robert Koger, John Schoen and Pat Schmitz will also provide depth on defense.

GOALIE

Senior Jack Davis returns with a clean bill of health, after being hampered by injury during the 2010 season. Despite playing hurt through the better part of last season, Davis led Georgetown to six wins, playing in nine games. In 2009, Davis started all 14 games, finishing the season with an 8.49 goals against average.

CT Fisher and Matt Winter will both compete with Davis to start and earn the backup role. Fisher started five games and played in nine

during the 2010 season, holding opponents to 9.66 goals per game and recording three victories.

SPECIALISTS

Senior Brian Tabb, returns to the face-off circle and could establish himself as one of the best in the nation. Tabb, whose .549 face-off percentage was second in the BIG EAST and 22nd in the NCAA, also led the BIG EAST and tied for seventh in the nation averaging 6.14 ground balls per game. Tabb is currently seventh in Georgetown history with 219 career face-off wins.

Georgetown will have the luxury of depth at the face-off X, with redshirt freshman Tyler Knarr providing another strong face-off option, as does sophomore Patrick Murray. Both long pole players, along with Matt Sutherland will push to be the first or second face-off option for the Hoyas.

SCHEDULE

Georgetown will play five road games to open the season, a task that could prove daunting, but one the Blue & Gray are looking forward to.

During that opening stretch, the Hoyas will play two games in NFL Stadiums, opening the season in the Sunshine Classic on February 20 with second-year program Jacksonville at Everbank Field, the home of the Jacksonville Jaguars. Georgetown will also host Syracuse as part of the Konica Minolta Face-Off Classic at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore, Md. on March 12, which will be broadcast on ESPNU.

Nine of the Hoyas' 14 games in 2011 will be played against opponents that finished the 2010 season ranked in the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) national poll, giving fans a look at some of the top competition in the country.

The Hoyas first home game is slated for March 19 against BIG EAST opponent Providence College. Georgetown's home schedule will also include three games under the lights of MSF, including Navy (Friday, April 1), Loyola (Md.) (Saturday, April 16) and Villanova (Saturday, May 7). They will also host Yale (Saturday, April 23), and Villanova (Saturday, May 7). Once again, Georgetown will have each of its home games televised during the 2011 season, playing Yale on MASN, while each of the remaining games will be broadcast on Verizon Fios1.

Three of the Hoyas eight road games will appear on the ESPN family of networks, with its opener against Jacksonville appearing on ESPN3. The annual game with local-rival Maryland (Feb. 25) will appear on ESPNU, while they will also appear on ESPNU when they travel to South Bend, Ind. on April 10 to take on Notre Dame. Georgetown will also travel to face St. John's (Saturday, March 5), Harvard (Tuesday, March 8), Duke (Saturday, March 26) and Mount Saint Mary's (Tuesday, April 5).

HOYAS BEYOND THE HILLTOP

Since Major League Lacrosse was founded in 2001, Georgetown University players have had a significant impact on the league. In its first year, three former Hoyas were selected to play in the league, which features fast-paced, high scoring, hardhitting action that has made it the fastest growing team sport in the United States.

Overall, more than 20 former George-

town players have been selected in the Major League Lacrosse draft and several, including Andy Corno (C'05), Brodie Merrill (C'05), Kyle Sweeney (B '03) and Scott Urick (C '00), are still on MLL rosters.

Georgetown has had at least one player drafted in all but one collegiate draft since the MLL's inaugural season in 2001, including Dusseau who was the second overall pick in the 2002 draft. Another

Hoya-MLL highlight has been Urick, who was the 2002 MLL All-Star game's MVP and is the third all-time leading goal scorer in the league with 232 goals.

Overall 22 different Hoyas have played in the MLL and as usual the 2010 Georgetown senior class has several players looking to become the next Hoya to don a Major League Lacrosse uniform.

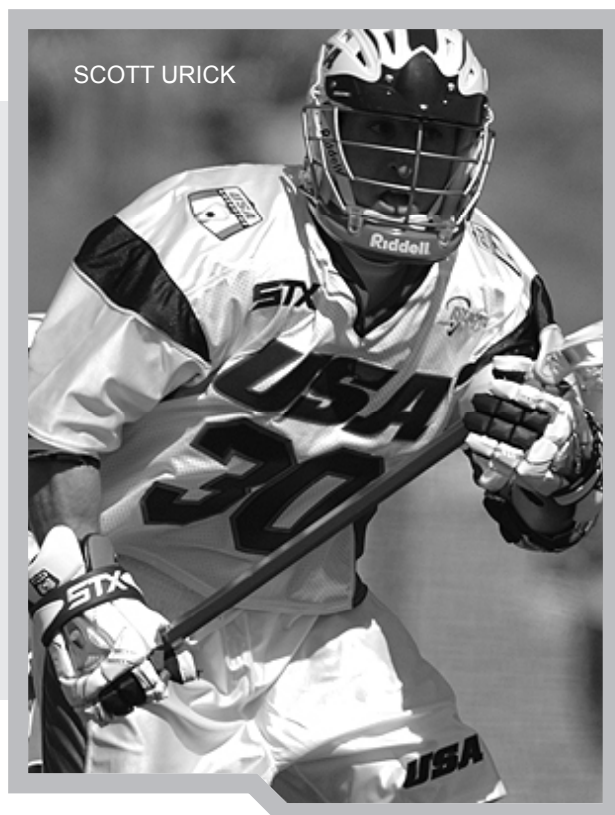
