HOLIDAY HOCKEY IN FLORIDA: The Notre Dame hockey team will end its 20-day break for finals and the Christmas holidays on Saturday, Dec. 29 when the Irish meet the University of Massachusetts Minutemen in the opening game of the Lightning College Hockey Classic in Tampa, Fla. Notre Dame and UMass will meet at 5:05 p.m. with the Colorado College Tigers facing the Rensselaer Engineers in the second game at 8:05 p.m. The tournament will be played at the St. Pete Times Forum and is hosted by the NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning. The third-place and championship games will be played on Sunday, Dec. 30 with games at 5:05 p.m. and 8:05 p.m. The Irish are the defending champions after winning last season's first-time event on Oct. 28-29. This year's tournament features one of the top fields in college hockey as all four teams are ranked as of Dec. 17. Colorado College, a member of the WCHA, is 11-5-0 on the year and ranked fourth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and the USCHO.com/CSTV polls. Notre Dame is sixth in both polls and brings a 16-4-0 record into the tournament. Massachusetts is 7-3-5 overall and will enter the tournament ranked ninth in the nation. Rensselaer is 8-7-3 on the year and is receiving votes in the *USA Today* Poll while being 17th in the USCHO.com poll.

LIGHTNING COLLEGE HOCKEY CLASSIC HISTORY: The first Lightning College Hockey Classic was played on October 28-29, 2006 and featured Notre Dame, Alabama-Huntsville, Army and Air Force.

IRISH VERSUS MINUTEMEN: Notre Dame and Massachusetts (Hockey East) have met four times in the all-time series with each team winning twice. The last time the two schools met was during the 1999-2000 season when the teams split two games at Notre Dame on Dec. 10-11, 1999. UMass took the opener, 4-3, and the Irish won the second game, 5-3. The teams first played at Amherst, Mass., Dec. 30-31, 1994 with the Irish winning the opening game, 6-3 and the Minutemen taking a 4-3 overtime win on the second night.

IRISH VERSUS TIGERS: These two teams were long-time rivals in the WCHA from 1971-81, but have met just twice since the Irish left that conference for the CCHA in the 1981-82 season. The Irish and Tigers have faced off 43 times in the all-time series with Notre Dame holding a 25-18-1 edge. On neutral ice, CC owns a 1-0-0 record. The last time the two teams met was on Oct. 21, 2005 at Colorado Springs, Colo., with the Tigers taking a 3-1 win in the first game of Jeff Jackson's tenure as coach of the Irish. The two teams have met once before in tournament play as they met in the third-place game of the Norwest Cup in Denver, Colo., tournament on Jan. 1, 2000. The Tigers took a 5-2 win in that game.

IRISH VERSUS ENGINEERS: Notre Dame and Rensselaer (ECAC) have already met once this season in tournament play as the two teams met in the title game of the 57th Rensselaer Holiday Tournament on Nov. 24. The Irish rallied from a 3-1 deficit to take a 4-3 decision in that game. All-time, the two schools have played five times with R.P.I. holding a 3-2-0 edge. The teams have met three times in tournament play with all three games coming at the R.P.I. Tournament. The Engineers won the first two meetings in 1988-89 and 2000-01.

TOURNAMENT VETS: The Lightning College Hockey Classic is the third in-season tournament for the Irish this season. They opened the year at the Lefty McFadden Classic in Dayton, Ohio, losing to Wisconsin, 4-1, before defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, to take third place. Over Thanksgiving, the Irish played in the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, taking the championship with wins over Alabama-Huntsville (4-1) and Rensselaer (4-3).

TOURNEY RESULTS: With the victory at the R.P.I. Tournament, the Irish have now appeared in 29 in-season tournaments, winning six times, finishing second, six times with sixth third-place finishes and 11 fourth spots. Notre Dame has now won two of the last three in-season tournaments that the Irish have played in, winning the 2006 Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic in Oct. of 2006 in Tampa, Fla. All time, the Irish are 22-33-3 in tournament play.

BALANCING ACT: Notre Dame comes into the Lightning College Hockey Classic ranked third in the nation in scoring, averaging 3.55 goals per game. Despite the ranking, the Irish have just one player on the roster with 10 goals this season - **Ryan Thang (So., Edina, Minn.)**. The Irish have accumulated their 71 goals this year with nine players on the roster having five goals or more.

ON A ROLL: Notre Dame enters the Lightning College Hockey Classic on a nine-game winning streak that began on Nov. 16 for the longest active winning streak in the country. During the nine game run, the Irish are 4-0-0 at home, 4-0-0 on the road and 1-0-0 on neutral ice. The Irish have out scored the opposition 40-13 (4.44 gpg to 1.44 gpg). The Irish are 10-for-51 on the power play (19.6%) and have killed 39-of-41 power-play chances for a 92.9% success rate. They also have scored five times short-handed. The Irish are out shooting their opponents, 360 (31.7) to 160 (17.8). **Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.)** is the leading scorer with four goals and eight assists for 12 points and is followed by defenseman **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** with one goal and nine assists for 10 points. Lawson is also +12 to lead the team in the nine games. In goal, **Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska)** is 7-0-0 with a 1.72 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage. Freshman **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** is 2-0-0 with a 0.50 goals-against average and a .974 save percentage. Both goaltenders have one shutout.

RECORD STREAK: Notre Dame's nine-game winning streak is the longest since a 14-game streak from Dec. 11, 1987 to Feb. 13, 1988. During that time, the Irish were a Division I Independent. The streak is the longest for the Irish as a member of the CCHA or the WCHA.

COLE NAMED TO U.S. JUNIOR NATIONAL TEAM: Notre Dame defenseman **Ian Cole (Fr., Ann Arbor, Mich.)** has been selected to play on the U.S. Junior National Team that will participate in the World Junior Championships in the Czech Republic from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5. Cole, a first-round draft choice (18th overall) of the St. Louis Blues, has played in all 18 games for the Irish this season and has two goals and four assists for six points. He is -1 and has nine penalties for 18 minutes. Cole will miss both games of the Lightning College Hockey Classic and two conference games on Jan. 4-5 at Northern Michigan.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)** was named the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Dec. 9. In the weekend sweep at Princeton, VeNard had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2 on the weekend. His three-point game on Dec. 8 in Notre Dame's 7-0 win was a career high for the blueliner. He now has five goals and three assists for eight points in 20 games this year. In 71 career games prior to this season, VeNard had two goals and six assists for eight points.

SHORT-CIRCUITED: Notre Dame's penalty-killing unit is one of the top groups in the nation this season. In 20 games the Irish have given up just seven power-play goals on 96 chances for a 92.7% success rate that ranks second in the nation. More importantly, Notre Dame has scored seven short-handed goals in that same period. The seven shorties are tops in the nation.

NO GOALS FOR YOU: Junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** recorded his second shutout of the season in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. The shutout also was the fourth of his career and moved him into a tie for third with **Mark Kronholm '74** on Notre Dame's all-time shutout list. He trails just **Morgan Cey '05** (2nd with 6) and **David Brown '07** (first with 12). Pearce's first career shutout came in his second career game, a 2-0, 27-save win over Princeton on Oct. 28, 2005. Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** recorded his first career shutout on Dec. 8 with a 24-save, 7-0 whitewashing of the Princeton Tigers.

NIFTY NOVEMBER: Notre Dame finished November with a 9-1-0 record, including wins in the last six straight. Some other numbers for the month: The Irish were 7-1-0 in the CCHA and 5-0-0 at home while going 3-1-0 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites ... the Irish out scored the opposition by a 38-19 margin (3.8 gpg to 1.9 gpg) ... Notre Dame out shot the opposition by a 31-0 - 20-1 margin ... the Irish were 13-for-52 on the power play (25.0%) and killed 41-of-46 opponent power plays for an 89.1% success rate ... **Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.)** led the team in scoring with six goals and 10 assists for 16 points and was followed by **Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.)**, **Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** and **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** with 10 points each ... **Jordan Pearce** was 7-1-0 with a 2.13 goals-against average and a .900 save percentage ... **Brad Phillips (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.)** was 2-0-0 with a 1.00 goals-against and a .935 save percentage.

CENTURY CLUB: Notre Dame's "Century Club" added its newest member on Nov. 24 when junior **Erik Condra** recorded an assist versus R.P.I. In 98 career games, Condra now has 28 goals and 76 assists for 104 points. His 76 assists tie him for 27th on the all-time assist list. Here's who is ahead of Condra on the points list.

TWO SHORTIES: **Mark Van Guilder** and **Ryan Thang** each scored short-handed goals in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. That marked the first time the Irish had scored a pair of short-handed goals in a game since Dec. 20, 2000 when **Brett Lebda '04** and **Dan Carlson '01** scored short-handed goals in a 7-3 win at Nebraska-Omaha.

WITH A KISS-EL: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** turned in a career-best four-point game in Notre Dame's 7-0 win at Princeton on Dec. 8. The speedy forward scored twice and added two assists in the contest while turning in a +4 plus/minus. He and his linemates - **Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.)** and **Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.)** had a big night in the win. Rankin had a career-best three-point game (1g, 2a) and Hanson added a goal and an assist in the win as the line combined for four goals and five assists and nine points in the game.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career - 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 136 consecutive games played through the first 20 games this year.

END THE DROUGHT: It took freshman defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** 18 games to record his first collegiate point, but when he got on the scoresheet once, he decided to do it again. On Dec. 1 against Nebraska-Omaha, Ruth picked up a second-period assist when his shot was deflected by **Christian Hanson** past goaltender Eric Aarnio. Less than four minutes later, Ruth was at it again, notching his first collegiate goal when he scored off a face off just 49 seconds into the third period to give the Irish a 3-0 lead. Ruth has gotten it done all season defensively as he is currently +9 on the season, second to defensive partner Brock Sheahan's +14.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that three players have signed national letters of intent in the early signing period to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2008. The trio - defensemen **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)** and **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** and forward **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** - will join **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** who signed in Nov. of 2007 but deferred until next fall. Lorenz and Gaul are members of the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 team. Ringel plays in the North American Hockey League for the Mahoning Valley Phantoms and Maday is a member of the Waterloo Black Hawks of the United States Hockey League (USHL).

HOT HAND: During Notre Dame's current nine-game winning streak, goaltender **Jordan Pearce** has his own seven-game streak, going 7-0-0 with a 1.72 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage. Pearce is 9-1-0 since Nov. 1 with the lone loss coming to No. 1 ranked Miami on Nov. 10. For the season, Pearce is 13-4-0 with a 2.01 goals against and a .911 save percentage and two shutouts.

FUN RUN: Since the start of the 2006-07 season through today, Notre Dame has recorded a mark of 48-11-3 (.798) in 62 games. Prior to that it took the Irish 138 games (from the middle of 2002-03 through 2005-06) to win 48 games.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain **Mark Van Guilder** has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender **David Brown '07** won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS: Through the first 20 games of the season, when the Irish are good, they are very good. In the 16 wins this season, Notre Dame has scored 68 goals (4.25 per game). In the four losses, Notre Dame has scored just three goals for a 0.75 goals-per game mark. In the 16 wins, the Irish have given up just 25 goals (1.56 goals-against average) while in the four losses, they have given up 13 goals (3.25 goals against).

GETTING THE BOUNCES: Sophomore center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** went without a goal in Notre Dame's first 14 games this season. In his last five contests, the speedy Deeth has scored three times and added three assists for six points. All three goals have come on the power play. He is currently tied for third on the team in scoring with three goals and 11 assists for 14 points.

CLUTCH SCORER: Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** leads Notre Dame 10 goals on the season. Of those 10, four have come on the power play and three are game winners. In 62 career games, Thang has now scored 30 goals with 14 coming on the power play and nine of them game winners. His nine game-winning goals already tie him for ninth on the all-time game-winning goals list at Notre Dame.

MR. CONSISTENT: Sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson** has proven to be one of the CCHA's most consistent defensemen this season. A two-time CCHA defenseman of the week this season, Lawson leads all Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with three goals and 11 assists for 14 points. Already this year, he has a power-play goal and a pair of game-winning goals. Lawson's 14 points tie him for third among CCHA defensemen this season. He is +7 on the year.

TWO-TIMER: Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** has been named the CCHA defenseman of the week twice this season (Nov. 25 and Nov. 18). Lawson, who helped the Irish to three wins from Nov. 20-24, had one goal and three assists for four points and was +2. In the Nov. 20, 2-1 win over Bowling Green, Lawson was +1 and scored the game-winning goal in the 2-1 victory. Versus Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 23, Lawson was even and set up one goal. In the championship game against Rensselaer, Lawson set up two goals, including **Ryan Thang** game winner with 3:56 left in the game and was +1.

TOURNAMENT HARDWARE: Three Notre Dame players were named to the all-tournament team at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Junior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded three assists on the weekend and was the lone Irish forward selected. Defensemen **Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.)** and **Ian Cole** joined Condra on the team. Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** was named the tournament MVP after scoring the game-winning goal in each of Notre Dame's victories.

HOME SWEET HOME: After eight home games this season, Notre Dame is 7-1-0 (.875) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

FIVE-IN-NINE: The Rensselaer Holiday Tournament closed out a stretch of five games in nine days for Notre Dame. In the nine-day period (Nov. 16-Nov. 24) the Irish won all five games, defeating Western Michigan, 4-1 and 5-1, in a home-and-home series on Nov. 16-17, before defeating Bowling Green on Nov. 20, 2-1 at the Joyce Center. That was followed by the two wins at the R.P.I. Tournament. This was the second time this season that the Irish played five games in nine days. The first time occurred between Oct. 18-27, with Notre Dame going 3-2-0 in that span.

Notre Dame comes into the tournament with a 2-3-0 record after a split with #1/#1 Miami on Nov. 9-10 at Oxford, Ohio. Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season, playing three of its first four games against ranked teams. The Irish opened against #14/#15 Wisconsin, dropping a 4-1 decision at Dayton, Ohio. Versus fifth-ranked Denver, the Irish won the opening game (4-3) before dropping the second by a 3-1 score. Last season, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame has had three sellouts (2,713) in its first eight home games and just missed a fourth against Bowling Green on Nov. 20 with a crowd of 2,711 in attendance. The previous two sellout crowds of 2,857 were the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through eight games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,621 fans per game.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had

their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 7-2-0 (.778) on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame in Saturday's game (Nov. 17) are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances on Friday night were also a season high.

NEW KID: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** has had a strong start in his young career for the Irish as he is now 3-0-0 following his 7-0 shutout at Princeton on Dec. 8. Phillips has given up just two goals this season for a 0.67 goals-against average and he has a .964 save percentage.

VERSUS THE BEST: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9 marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. In fact, the last four times that Notre Dame has faced a No.1 team, the Irish have come away with the victory. WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. Last Friday's win came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** has career highs in assists (6) and points (11) this season after his four-point game at Princeton on Dec. 8. For his career, Kissel has played in 39 games with 11 goals and nine assists for 20 points. Of his 11 goals, he has two power-play goals, two shorthanded tallies and four game winners.

STRONG SCHEDULE: Through the first 20 games of the season, Notre Dame has played five games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish opened the year dropping a 4-1 decision to #14/#15 Wisconsin. They then split a series in South Bend with #5/#5 Denver, winning, 4-3 and losing, 3-1. On Nov. 9-10, Notre Dame split with #1/#1 Miami with a 2-1 win on Friday and a 3-1 loss on Saturday. The Irish are 2-3-0 against ranked teams this season.

ON THE MARK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain is second in goals (8) and leads the team in power-play goals (5) this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)**. They will be joined by junior forward **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)**. This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman (Stockholm)** and **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm)** join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two seasons under **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman **Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.)** returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and

13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

NHL DRAFT: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork ('83)** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak** who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM: Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alumni grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** and freshmen defensemen **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** plus goaltender **Brad Phillips**. Other NTDP alumni who played at Notre Dame include: **Brett Henning** (1997-98), **Michael Chin** (1997-98), **Connor Dunlop** (1997-99), **Paul Harris** (1997-99), **John Wroblewski** (1997-99), **Neil Komadoski** (1998-2000), **Brett Lebda** (1998-2000), **Rob Globke** (1998-2000), **Derek Smith** (2000-01) and **Tim Wallace** (2002-06), **Noah Babin** (2003-07), **Michael Bartlett** (2003-07), **Tom Sawatske** (2005-07) and **Josh Sciba** (2003-07).

HOMETOWNS: The 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 13 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia.
