BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH VS. TAR HEELS

1.69	Assist-to-turnover ratio for Notre Dame this season, the second-best in the nation behind UCLA (1.86).
2	Irish student-athletes as part of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame finalists for national awards. Senior guard Steve Vasturia is one of 10 on the Jerry West Award (top SG) list, while junior Bonzie Colson is one of the 10 in the running for the Karl Malone Award (top PF).
3.1	Team grade-point-average (rounded up from the official number of 3.096) for the Irish in the fall semester of 2016, the best combined group average posted by a Notre Dame men's basketball team since the spring of 2009.
5	Saturday will mark Notre Dame's fifth trip to Chapel Hill to face North Carolina. While the two teams have met 27 times previously, 17 of those meetings occurred at neutral sites (including four NCAA Tournament and two ACC Tournament matchups along with one NIT game).
7	Notre Dame has won seven of its last eight games played in the state of North Carolina, including a 71-70 victory in Chapel Hill over No. 18 North Carolina on Jan. 5, 2015 (see page three for more details).
9.9	Turnovers-per-game average for the Irish this season, third-best in the nation.
10.6	Rebounds-per-game average for Bonzie Colson , which leads the ACC and is 14th in the country (as of Jan. 29). Colson also leads the ACC in overall double-doubles (13) and double-doubles in ACC competition (6).
11.3	Improved points-per-game scoring average for junior Matt Farrell (13.9 this season compared to 2.6 from 2015-16), the second-best mark in the ACC and for a player from the Brey era (1st, +14.4, Tim Abromaitis, 2009-10, 3rd, Chris Quinn, +10.4, 2003-04).
18.0	Points-per-game average of the last five games for senior V.J. Beachem , who is coming off the first back-to-back 20 point games of his career (23 at Georgia Tech, 20 vs. Duke).
73	Victories over the past three seasons for the Irish (32 in 2014-15, 24 in 2015-16 and 17 this season) one away from the all-time best three-season mark of 74 in 2010-11 (27), 2011-12 (22) and 2012-13 (25). See page 3 of this notes package for more details.
80.5	Free-throw percentage for Notre Dame this season, the second-best in the nation behind Valparaiso (80.9).
92.3	Free throw percentage for Steve Vasturia this season, fifth in the nation and first in the ACC.
104	Consecutive games started by Steve Vasturia , dating back to the final seven games of the 2013-14 season. Vasturia is the fourth Irish player to start 100 consecutive games during his career (see page 5 of this note package for more details).
320	Over 320 college basketball coaches and staff will be wearing Autism Speaks pins this weekend to raise awareness for the autism community while helping to increase understanding and acceptance.
373	Victories at Notre Dame for head coach Mike Brey , the second-most in Notre Dame history and 20 away from the all-time record (393).
937	Career points scored for Bonzie Colson , who could become the third Irish player (Steve Vasturia, V.J. Beachem) to reach 1,000 career points this season. Colson will be the 61st Notre Dame player to reach 1,000 career points.

IRISH HEAD TO TOBACCO ROAD FOR ESPN NATIONAL MATCHUP WITH NORTH CAROLINA:

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (17-6, 6-4 ACC) heads back on the road this weekend to face No. 12/10 North Carolina (20-4, 8-2 ACC) in a key Atlantic Coast Conference game at the Dean Smith Center in Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

The matchup is the first and only scheduled of the season between the Irish and Tar Heels, who met three times last season. The Irish defeated No. 2/1 North Carolina in the Joyce Center 80-76 on Feb. 6, 2016 (one year ago to the day of Saturday's matchup) before falling to the red-hot Tar Heels in the ACC Semifinals and NCAA East Regional Final. North Carolina eventually advanced to the national championship game to face Villanova.

NOTRE DAME vs. NORTH CAROLINA SERIES HISTORY:

Notre Dame and North Carolina will be meeting for the 28th time on Saturday evening, with the Tar Heels holding a 20-7 advantage in the series. Two of the winningest college basketball programs, the Irish and Tar Heels have met on and off since the late 1950s, when No. 17 Notre Dame knocked off No. 11 North Carolina 89-70 in Chicago Stadium on Feb. 15, 1958.

North Carolina is a frequent postseason opponent for Notre Dame. The two teams have met four times in the NCAA Championship, once in the National Invitation Tournament and for the 2015 ACC Championship - a 90-82 Notre Dame victory to secure the program's first ACC Championship.

Saturday will mark just Notre Dame's fifth visit to Chapel Hill (the Irish are 1-3 at North Carolina), as 17 of the meetings in the series have occurred at neutral sites.

SUCCESS IN THE TAR HEEL STATE:

Notre Dame joined the ACC at the start of the 2013-14 basketball season. The Irish ended up 0-3 in the state of North Carolina that year (65-58 loss at Wake Forest, 63-61 loss at North Carolina, 81-69 loss to Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament in Greensboro). Since breaking through for the program's first win in Chapel Hill, 71-70, at North Carolina on Jan. 5, 2015, the Irish have won seven of the last eight games they have played in the Tar Heel State:

THREE-YEAR WIN TOTAL RECORD IN SIGHT:

As the only program in the nation with back-to-back NCAA Elite Eight appearances, Notre Dame has compiled the best two-year stretch of victories already, posting a program-best 56 wins in 2014-15 and 2015-16.

With 17 victories so far in 2016-17, the Irish are one win away from matching the 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2012-13 teams for the program-best 74 wins in three years.

STREAK BUSTERS:

Notre Dame began its three-game ACC road swing by ending two home court win streaks. The Irish ended Miami's 21-game win streak at the Watsco Center with a 67-62 victory on Jan. 12, 2017. Notre Dame ended Virginia Tech's 15-game streak at the Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 14, 2017 with a 76-71 victory. North Carolina has won 14 consecutive home games entering the match up with Notre Dame on Saturday night.

FARRELL - ONE OF MOST IMPROVED IN THE ACC:

Junior guard Matt Farrell has made a case as the most improved player in the nation this season. After starting Notre Dame's final four games of the 2015-16 season (his first four career starts as the Irish advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight) Farrell has stepped up his game even further in 2016-17.

Averaging 13.9 points per game (along with 5.5 assists per game and .432 3FG%) Farrell is the second-most improved player, in terms of points-per-game average, in the ACC with an 11.3 improvement (Georgia Tech's Bem Lammers is first at +11.5).

BREY REACHES 700-GAME MILESTONE:

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey coached his 700th career game on Saturday, Jan. 7, in the victory over Clemson. Brey is the 35th active Division I head coach to reach the 700-game plateau.

Brey entered the 2016-17 season 30th on the winningest active coaches list and 36th on the active total wins list.

Brey is 20 wins away from the all-time mark at Notre Dame of 393 victories and coached his 550th game at Notre Dame against Miami on Thursday, Jan. 12. He also is approaching the school record for games coached at Notre Dame (590).

COLSON ACC LEADING REBOUNDER:

Junior forward Bonzie Colson is currently averaging 10.6 rebounds per game, which leads the ACC and is 16th in the country. He has 13 double-doubles in 2016-17, which also leads the ACC and is ninth in the country.

Colson has increased his rebounding from 6.7 per game a year ago to 10.6 - a 3.9 improvement per game - while also increasing his scoring output from 11.1 last season to 15.5 (4.4 improvement) per game in 2016-17.

VASTURIA CAREER NUMBERS:

Senior Steve Vasturia continues to climb the career charts - at Notre Dame, in the ACC and the NCAA.

As of Jan. 23, 2017, Vasturia is seventh on the list of active career scorers in the ACC play with 1,252 points and fourth in career assists with 287.

On the Notre Dame career charts, Vasturia currently ranks second in FT% (.849), fourth in consecutive starts (104), 12th in 3FG attempted (464), 18th in 3FG% (.377), 19th in assists (287), 17th in steals (115) and 35th in scoring (1,252).

For NCAA career numbers, Vasturia is 34th in games played (124), 35th in FT% (.849), 86th in 3FGM (175), 98th in points (1,252) and 108th in assists (287).

VASTURIA = CLUTCH:

Notre Dame's first four ACC victories would not be possible without three clutch plays at the end of each game from Steve Vasturia.

In the ACC opener at Pittsburgh, Vasturia's two FTs pushed the game to overtime and his three pointer with 2.5 seconds remaining proved to be the game winner in the 78-77 OT victory.

Vasturia would end the Pittsburgh game scoring 10 of Notre Dame's final 12 points while assisting on the other field goal.

Against No. 9/9 Louisville, Vasturia poured in a career-best 24 points, none more important than his runner in the lane with :19 seconds remaining to put the Irish ahead 73-68 in the eventual 77-70 victory.

In the win over Clemson, Vasturia nailed a corner three-point field goal at the shot clock buzzer off an inbounds play with 1:45 remaining, pushing the Irish ahead 70-68 in an eventual 75-70 victory.

On the road at Miami, Vasturia's drive to the basket with :08 seconds remaining pushed the Irish ahead 65-62 in an eventual 67-62 victory.

Vasturia followed up the clutch score against Miami to score 20 points at Virginia Tech and was named the co-ACC Player of the Week on Monday, Jan. 16.

VASTURIA AND BEACHEM REACH CAREER MILESTONES:

Senior captain Steve Vasturia entered the Legends Classic final against Northwestern needing 18 points to reach 1,000 points in his career.

Not only did Vasturia reach that milestone, he might have played the best all-around game of his career against the Wildcats. The Medford, New Jersey, native grabbed eight rebounds to go along with 18 points, three assists and three steals.

Senior V.J. Beachem needed 10 points entering the game at Georgia Tech for 1,000 career points and eclipsed that in the first half, scoring 23 points in McCamish Pavilion.

Vasturia is the 59th and Beachem the 60th Notre Dame player to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

Teammate Bonzie Colson could join the duo in the 1,000-point club, as Colson has 937 career points entering the matchup at North Carolina.

604 AND COUNTING

Notre Dame has made at least one three-pointer in 604 straight contests dating back to the 1998-99 campaign. The Fighting Irish have made at least one three pointer during every game of the Mike Brey era. The last time an Irish team failed to hit a three-pointer in a game was in a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 12, 1999. Notre Dame finished 0-7 from beyond the arc in that contest.

USE INK TO PUT VASTURIA IN THE STARTING LINEUP:

Senior guard and team tri-captain Steve Vasturia, who head coach Mike Brey has said keeps him calm on the sidelines while in the lineup, has started 104 consecutive games for the Irish. As a freshman guard, Vasturia's first start came at Maryland on Jan. 15, 2014, but he entered the starting line up permanently on February 16, 2014, playing 30 minutes and scoring seven points in a victory at Boston College. The Philadelphia, Pa., native has not left the Irish starting five since that game.

Vasturia is the fourth Notre Dame player to start 100 consecutive games in a career.

NOTRE DAME REACHES 1800-WIN MILESTONE:

Notre Dame's 84-79 victory at Illinois on Dec. 2, 2015 marked the 1800th win in program history. The Fighting Irish are 1839-989 (.649) all-time in 112 seasons.

Notre Dame entered the season ranked seventh in Division I in all-time program wins behind Kentucky, Kansas, North Carolina, Duke, Temple and Syracuse. The Irish have improved five spots in the all-time wins list since Mike Brey took over the program for the 2000-01 season, surpassing Indiana, Oregon State, Pennsylvania and St. John's.

Notre Dame is the only NCAA program to rank in the top 10 for men's basketball and football victories.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS:

Not only did Notre Dame advance to the NCAA Championship Elite Eight for the second consecutive season for the first time since 1978-79, but the Irish combined for six NCAA tournament wins over the past two seasons - the most in program history over a two-year stretch. The previous high was Notre Dame's three wins in 1978 (the team's lone appearance in the Final Four) and two victories the next season.

The Irish were the only team in the nation to advance to the Elite Eight in both the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons and the back-to-back regional final games are a first for the program since the NCAA tournament expanded to 64 or more teams in 1985.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

For the first time in the Mike Brey era, the Irish head coach was tasked with replacing two assistant coaches in the same season. Long time aides Martin Ingelsby accepted the Delaware head coaching job (the same first-time Division I job Brey assumed in 1995-96) while Anthony Solomon joined the Georgetown coaching staff in the offseason.

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 stand out shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

IRISH PICKED SEVENTH IN PRESEASON ACC POLL:

LEGENDS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS:

Notre Dame claimed its first in-season tournament title since 2010 with a 70-66 victory over Northwestern on Tuesday, Nov. 22, in the championship game of the 2016 Legends Classic at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The four victories for the Irish in the tournament (over Bryant, Seattle, Colorado and Northwestern) mark the most the Irish have ever won in an in-season tournament. The trophy was the first in-season award claimed by the Irish since they won three games in 2010 to claim the Old Spice Classic at Disney's Wide World of Sports. Previous to the 2010 Old Spice victory, Notre Dame's most recent in-season tournament title came at the Hawaii-Pacific Thanksgiving Classic in 2001.

LEGENDS CLASSIC MVP:

Bridgewater, New Jersey, native Matt Farrell enjoyed his return to the Barclays Center, not far from the area where he played during his prep career, for the Legends Classic semifinal and final victories over Colorado and Northwestern, respectively.

Farrell, whose first two career starts came in Notre Dame's two NCAA tournament victories over Michigan and Stephen F. Austin in the Barclays Center during March of 2016, played a career-best game in the semifinal over Colorado, scoring 20 points with six assists and three steals.

He followed up that performance with 18 points and six assists against Northwestern in the championship game, including scoring Notre Dame's final five points in the come-from-behind victory.

With a 19 point-per-game average in the two games at Barclays Center, along with 6.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game, Farrell was the easy choice as the tournament's most valuable player.
