No. 15 Notre Dame Travels To Oxford, Ohio To Meet No. 1 Ranked Miami RedHawks

- Irish take a five-game unbeaten streak (2-0-3) into weekend series with top-ranked RedHawks.
- Notre Dame coming off win and tie versus Bowling Green; Calle Ridderwall (three goals) and Billy Maday (four assists) pace Irish attack in 4-4 tie on Nov. 27.

IRISH TO FACE TOP-RANKED MIAMI: Notre Dame travels to Oxford, Ohio this weekend to take on the No. 1-ranked Miami RedHawks in a pair of games at Steve Cady Arena on Dec. 4 and 5. Game time on Friday is 7:35 p.m. while Saturday's opening face off is set for 7:05 p.m. Both games of the series will be televised by the Ohio News Network (ONN) and carried by Comcast in Michigan. The games also will be carried live on South Bend Comcast Cable's channel 3. The Irish are in the midst of a five-game unbeaten streak, going 2-0-3 since November 15. Notre Dame is 7-5-4 overall and 4-2-4-2 in the CCHA, good for fourth place in the standings with 18 points. Miami is 9-2-5 on the year and 6-1-3-1 in the conference, good for 22 points and first place in the CCHA, two points ahead of second-place Michigan State and four ahead of the Irish. Notre Dame enters the week ranked 15th in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and 14th in the USCHO.com rankings. Miami is ranked first in each poll and has been No. 1 in the nation for eight straight weeks. Following the Miami series, the Irish close out December with a home-and-home series against Michigan, Dec. 11 and 13.

NOTRE DAME AND MIAMI: The Irish and the RedHawks have met 55 times in the all-time series with Miami holding a commanding 32-15-8 edge. At Oxford, Ohio, the Irish are 8-16-2 in 26 contests. The two teams met twice last season at Notre Dame with the RedHawks sweeping the Irish, 2-0 and 3-2 on Oct. 24-25. The Irish followed the two losses a year ago with a 20-game unbeaten streak (17-0-3). Miami has won four straight in the series and is 10-2-3 versus the Irish dating back to the start of the 2003-04 season. The last Notre Dame win in Oxford was on Nov. 9, 2007, a 2-1 victory.

KNOCKING OFF NO. 1: This weekend's series with Miami marks the first time since April 10, 2009 that the Irish have faced the top-ranked team in the nation. On that night, at the NCAA Frozen Four in Denver, Colo., in the semifinals, Notre Dame defeated No. 1 Michigan, 5-4 in overtime. During that season, the Irish played five games against No. 1 teams, going 2-3, including a November split (W, 2-1, L, 1-3) with No. 1 Miami.

BOWLING GREEN RECAP:

Friday, November 27 -

Freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson (Verona, Wis.)** stopped 20-of-21 Bowling Green shots and got goals from **Kyle Palmieri (Fr., Montvale, N.J.)** and **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** to as Notre Dame defeated the Falcons, 2-1, in overtime. Cole's game winner came with 2.4 seconds left in overtime to give the Irish the win. BG's Nathan Pageau scored on the Falcons' first shot of the game just 16 seconds into the contest to give Bowling Green an early lead. Palmieri picked up his fifth goal of the season and his third in as many games with a power-play goal at 4:07 of the second period. Notre Dame out shot the Falcons, 33-21. Nick Eno made 31 saves in goal for the Falcons.

Saturday, November 28 -

Junior left wing **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)** recorded his first career hat trick and linemate **Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** added four assists as Notre Dame and Bowling Green battled to a 4-4 tie. The Falcons won the shoot-out, 1-0, for the extra point in the CCHA standings. The Irish jumped out to a 2-0 lead on a pair of Ridderwall power-play goals. The Falcons tied the game with goals by Jordan Samuels-Thomas and Ian Ruel, 56 seconds apart at 5:04 and 6:00 to even the score, 2-2. Ridderwall put Notre Dame ahead with his third of the night at 8:45 of the second to give the Irish a 3-2 lead. In the third stanza, Bowling Green went ahead on goals by Tommy Dee (3:38) and Marc Rodriguez (9:53) only to see **Ryan Thang (Sr., Edina, Minn.)** tie the game with Notre Dame's third power-play goal of the game at 11:06. Junior **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** got the start in goal and made 13 stops in the first 50:09 before being pulled in favor of freshman **Mike Johnson**, who made eight saves in regulation and overtime. Nick Eno stopped 33-of-37 shots by the Irish. In the shoot-out, Samuels-Thomas scored the only goal for the Falcons.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Notre Dame's trip to Miami this weekend will be just the fifth and sixth road games of the season for the Irish. Notre Dame is 2-1-1 in its first four road games this year. Last season, the Irish were 14-2-2 away from the Joyce Center, the best road record in the program's 42-year history.

GOAL-SCORING MACHINE: Junior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** recorded his first career hat trick in Notre Dame's 4-4 tie with Bowling

SHOOTING IT OUT: The 2008-09 season was the first year that the CCHA used the shoot out to determine the winner of games that remained tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime period. During that season, the Irish were involved in three shoot outs, going 3-0 in all three games. In 2009-10, the Irish have been in three shoot outs, including back-to-back games versus Northern Michigan and Michigan State. To date, the Irish are 2-1 this season and 5-1 all-time in shoot outs. Green and now leads the Irish with 10 goals on the season. He is currently second among CCHA goal scorers and seventh in the nation. His six power-play goals tie him for the lead in the CCHA and tie him for second nationally. Over the last two seasons, he has scored 27 goals for Notre Dame with 17 of them coming via the power play. Ridderwall's hat trick on Nov. 28 was the first for an Irish player since Jan. 5, 2007 when **Kevin Deeth (Sr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** scored three in a win over Robert Morris at Mellon Arena in Pittsburgh.

LENDING A HELPING HAND: Sophomore right wing **Billy Maday** turned in a career high four-point and four-assist game in the 4-4 tie with Bowling Green. His previous best in both categories was two points and two assists. Maday's four-assist game was the first by a Notre Dame player since **Erik Condra '09** had four assists on March 9, 2007. The four-point game was the first by an Irish player since **Ian Cole (Jr., Ann Arbor, Mich.)** had four points (2g, 2a) on Feb. 13, 2009 versus Northern Michigan.

BEST OF THE BEST: Over the past three-plus seasons, the Notre Dame hockey program is tops in the nation in wins and winning percentage followed by Michigan and Miami. Since the start of the 2006-07 campaign, the Irish have won 97 games and own a .717 winning percentage over that period. Notre Dame leads Michigan (.95) in wins and winning percentage (.701). Miami has 89 wins and a .684 winning percentage. Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage since 2006-07.

DEFENSIVE DANDIES: Through the first 16 games this season, the Notre Dame defense has held opponents to two goals or less in 10 of them and has given up three or less in 15 of the 16 games. For the year, the Irish have given up just 30 goals for a 1.88 goals per game to rank second in the nation in team defense. The trio of Irish goaltenders - junior **Brad Phillips**, freshman **Mike Johnson** and senior **Tommy O'Brien (Mokena, Ill.)** own a 1.83 goals-against average and a .929 save percentage to go with the 7-5-4 record. Johnson's 1.35 goals-against average and .947 save percentage are tops in the nation.

USA...USA...USA: Freshman right wing **Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.)** is one of 29 players selected to the preliminary roster for the 2010 U.S. Junior National Team. The 29 players will participate in a three-day pre-tournament training camp Dec. 17-19 in Grand Forks, N.D. The tournament will run from Dec. 26, 2009 through Jan. 5, 2010 in Saskatoon and Regina, Sask. A 2009 first round draft choice of the Anaheim Ducks, Palmieri has five goals and two assists for seven points in the first 16 games for the Irish. Since 2006-07, Notre Dame has had at least one player on the U.S. Junior National Team - **Kyle Lawson (Sr., New Hudson, Mich.)** in 2006-07, **Ian Cole** in '07-'08 and '08-'09 and **Teddy Ruth (Jr., Naperville, Ill.)** in '08-'09.

OVERTIME MARKS: Four of Notre Dame's last five games have gone into overtime with one game decided in the extra session and three going to a shoot-out. For the season, the Irish are 1-0-4 in overtime games. In the four shoot-outs to date, Notre Dame is 2-2. The overtime win on Nov. 27 versus Bowling Green was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win. Notre Dame is now 3-0-7 in overtime since its last overtime loss, a 2-1 decision to Miami on March 21, 2008, in the CCHA semifinal game.

ON A ROLL: Over the last five games, Notre Dame's penalty killers have killed 24 straight power-play chances and for the year are 68-of-74 for a 91.4% success rate that is second best in the nation and tops in the CCHA. On Nov. 19 at Michigan State, the final stat sheet showed that Notre Dame was 4-for-4 killing penalties. Behind that number is the fact that the Irish had to kill a pair of five-minute majors and one 5X3 power-play for a full two minutes. On the night,

Michigan State had 9:57 of power-play time while the Irish had just 2:17. Versus Bowling Green last weekend, Notre Dame was 5-for-5 in each game against the Falcons.

THE KID IS ALRIGHT: Freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** has gotten his collegiate career off to a fast start through the first 16 games of the season. In eight games, including seven starts, Johnson is 4-2-2 with a 1.35 goals-against average and a .947 save percentage with one shutout. Johnson recorded a shutout versus Providence College on Oct. 16 in his first career start. His 1.35 goals-against average and .947 save percentage are tops in the nation so far this year.

HERE COMES THE FUTURE: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that nine players have signed national letters-of-intent to begin playing hockey at Notre Dame over the next two seasons. The list included three defensemen and six forwards. The defensemen are **Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.)**, **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)** and **Jarred Tinordi (Millersville, Md.)** and the forwards include **Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.)**, **David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa)**, **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)**, **Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.)**, **Bryan Rust (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.)** and **T.J. Tynan (Orland Park, Ill.)**. In making the announcement, Jackson said, "We're very excited about this class of players and over the next two years they will have an impact on the next phase of our program. This class gives us a nice balance of skill, grit and size for the future." Three members of the incoming class - Johns, Rust and Tinordi - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other six are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Two members of this group - Costello and Lee - have already been drafted by National Hockey League teams in the 2009 Entry Draft and four are currently listed by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in their preliminary rankings - Johns, Rust, Tinordi and Kevin Lind. HOME ICE STRUGGLES: After going 1-0-1 last weekend versus Bowling Green, the Irish are now 4-4-3 in their first 11 home games this season. During the 2008-09 campaign, the Irish were 13-3-2 at the Joyce Center and over the previous three seasons owned a 37-9-7 mark on home ice.

SCORING DROUGHT: Through the first 16 games of the season, Notre Dame has scored a total of 38 goals. The Irish have scored goals via the power play in 13 of their first 16 games and going into the Miami series, have 18 power-play goals and one short-handed goal to go with 19 even-strength goals. Notre Dame has scored four or more goals in just two games this season. For the year, the Irish are averaging 2.38 goals-per game and the offensive attack is tied for 47th in the nation.

TOUGH TICKET: Friday's standing room-only crowd of 2,857 was the seventh sellout crowd for Notre Dame in 11 home games this season. The Irish have now sold out 16 of their last 20 home games dating back to Dec. 13, 2008 versus Bowling Green. This season's opening night crowd of 2,994 against Alabama-Huntsville is the largest crowd to see a home opener since 1995 as the building's seating capacity was re-configured following that year with 2,713 being a sellout since then. Through 11 games, the Irish are averaging 2,685 per game.

DEETH TOPS 100: Senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** became the 44th player in the 42-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program to reach 100 points for his career on Oct. 23. His assist on **Calle Ridderwall's** first-period goal gave Deeth 32 goals and 68 assists for his 100th career point. He reached that mark in 133 games. Deeth now has 106 career points and is 39th on the all-time points list. Right behind him is senior teammate **Ryan Thang** who has now played in 135 career games, scoring 51 goals with 46 assists for 97 points. He needs just four assists to join the 50/50 club for players with 50 goals and 50 assists in a career.

On Nov. 6-7, the Irish split a pair with #14/#13 Alaska in Fairbanks, winning 3-2 before dropping a 3-1 decision in the closing game of the series. Notre Dame was 5-5 during the 2008-09 season against nationally ranked teams.

SWEEPLESS IN SOUTH BEND: On Nov. 16, for the third time this season, Notre Dame found itself in a position that it hasn't been in very often over the last four seasons - looking at a possible opponent sweep. Since **Jeff Jackson** took over behind the Irish bench for the 2005-06 season, the Irish have lost back-to-back games on a weekend just eight times. Five of those series losses came during the 2005-06 season with two

coming in 2007-08 and one last year (2008-09). The last time the Irish dropped a weekend series came on Oct. 24-25, 2008 when they lost twice to Miami at the Joyce Center.

BACK BETWEEN THE PIPES: The second half of Notre Dame's 1-2 punch in goal - junior **Brad Phillips** has had a successful return to the Notre Dame lineup this season. The 6-2, 187-pound goaltender missed all of last season due to a knee injury suffered in the 2008-09 preseason that required surgery. Phillips, who made five starts in his freshman year (2007-08) and was 4-1-0 with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage to go with one shutout, has started eight games this season and is 2-3-2 with a 2.26 goals-against average and a .919 save percentage with one shutout. In his last outing (Nov. 28), Phillips gave up four goals with 13 saves in 50:09 of playing time in a 4-4 tie with Bowling Green.

CLOSE ONES: With the 2-1 overtime win versus Bowling Green on Nov. 27, Notre Dame improved to 2-4 this season in one-goal games. During the 2008-09 campaign, the Irish were 11-2 in games decided by one goal.

RING(EL) THE BELL: Sophomore defenseman **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** recorded his first career point with the Irish when he assisted on a **Calle Ridderwall** goal in the 4-4 tie with Bowling Green. After playing in just six games as a freshman, Ringel has become a regular on the Irish defense, playing in 15 of the team's 16 games.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's game versus Michigan State at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum on Nov. 22 marked the third time the Irish had played there. They are now 2-1 all-time at the Ft. Wayne building. Notre Dame first played there on Feb. 18, 2005, dropping a 9-2 decision to Michigan in front of 7,948 fans. The Irish returned on Dec. 30, 2006 and defeated Northern Michigan, 4-3, with a crowd of 3,134 on hand for the contest. This time, Notre Dame prevailed, 4-1, on Nov. 22 with a 3,572 in attendance. Notre Dame, the Allen Co. War Memorial Coliseum and the city of Ft. Wayne will serve as cohosts of the 2010 NCAA Hockey Midwest Regional on March 27-28, 2010.

All four NCAA hockey regionals will sell tickets in three-game packages only. If Notre Dame is selected to participate in the 2010 NCAA Division I Men's Ice Hockey Championship, they will be assigned to play in the Midwest Regional at Ft. Wayne, Ind.

Game times on March 27 are set for 4:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. with the regional championship on March 28 set for 8:00 p.m.

IN ARUT: Notre Dame's 4-1 win over Michigan State (Nov. 19) snapped a four-game winless skid (0-2-2) for the Irish. That was the longest winless streak since Feb. 16-Feb. 29, 2008 when they were 0-2-2 over that four-game span.

FRESHMEN SCORERS: Freshmen forwards **Kyle Palmieri** and **Riley Sheahan** each scored a goal in the 4-1 win over Michigan State. That marked the first time since the season opener that the dynamic duo each scored in the same game.

BACK-TO-BACK: Freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** made three consecutive starts in goal for the Irish from Nov. 6 through Nov. 14 for the first time in his career. On Friday, Nov. 6, Johnson made a career-high 35 saves in the 3-2 win over the Nanooks. Included were 16 saves in the third period as the Irish were out shot, 16-3, in the final stanza. On Saturday, Nov. 7, Johnson gave up two goals on 23 shots in a 3-1 loss to Alaska. On Nov. 14, he made 15 saves in a 3-2 loss to Northern Michigan. In the three-game span he was 1-2-0 with a 2.34 goals against and a .910 save percentage. On Nov. 19, Johnson played in his first CCHA shoot-out, stopping three-of-four shots in a 2-1 shoot-out win for the Irish.

MADAY TO THE RESCUE: Trailing 2-0 to Northern Michigan on Nov. 15, the Irish turned to sophomore **Billy Maday** to jump start the offense. His power-play goal at 8:42 of the second period cut the lead to 2-1 and his four-on-four tally at 2:36 of the third tied the game at 2-2. In the shoot out, Maday scored Notre Dame's first goal of the shoot out (he's scored on four of seven shoot out attempts in two seasons) as the Irish picked up the extra point with a 2-1 win. The two-goal game was the second of Maday's career. He leads the team in scoring with four goals and 11 assists for 15 points.

STEALING THE SHOW: Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips** made a career-high 34 saves as he handed the Boston University Terriers a 3-0 loss at Agganis Arena. Phillips got all the offensive

support he needed in the second period when **Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** and **Ben Ryan** scored 12 seconds apart to give the Irish a 2-0 lead. **Calle Ridderwall** added a power-play goal in the third period for the 3-0 final score. Maday, Ryan and Ridderwall each had a goal and an assist in the game. Phillips made 27 of his 34 saves in the first and third periods, including 17 in the final stanza. Notre Dame was 8-for-8 killing penalties on the night and 1-for-6 on the power play. BU out shot the Irish, 34-16, in the game. The win was the first-ever for the Friars against Boston University (1-2-0 all-time).

STINGY IRISH: Over the last three seasons, the Irish have been ranked first in the nation twice with lowest goals-against average. For the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame was best in the nation with a 1.67 goals against. The Irish followed that in 2007-08 with a 2.13 goals-against average to rank fifth in the country and last year the goals-against average was best with a 1.73 average. Through the first 16 games of the 2009-10 season, the Irish are second in the nation, giving up just 1.83 goals per game.

CCHA DIFFERENCES: With the start of Notre Dame's CCHA schedule this weekend, there are a couple differences to remember with the final results of a game. First is the shootout - should a game remain tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime, a winner will be decided via a shootout. Each team will select three shooters who will go one-on-one versus the opponent's goaltender with the winner being the team that scores the most. If the game remains tied after the first three shooters, single shooters will continue until a winner is found. The team winning the shootout will receive two points in the standings while the loser just one. On the national level, the game is still considered a tie. Secondly, the standings in the conference will be different. A regulation or overtime win will see the winning team awarded three points with the loser none. If the game goes to a shootout, both teams will get one point with the shootout winner getting the extra point in the standings.

STREAK BUSTERS: Notre Dame's 3-0 shutout win over Boston University, snapped a streak of 99-consecutive games that the Terriers had not been shutout. The last time BU was shutout came on Dec. 2, 2006 when the Terriers shutout Boston College, 1-0. The win also marked the first time since Jan. 15, 2008 that Boston University lost a non-conference game, a streak of 10 consecutive wins.

A STUNNING START: Prior to **Brad Phillips'** 3-0 shutout at Boston University, freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson (Verona, Wis.)** showed the way with a 2-0 blanking of Providence College in his rookie debut on Oct. 16. Johnson stopped all 29 shots he faced in blanking the Friars, 2-0, becoming the second Irish goaltender to record a shutout in his first career contest. He joins teammate **Tom O'Brien (Sr., Mokena, Ill.)** who picked up a shutout in his first start last season, a 7-0 blanking of Sacred Heart on Oct. 18, 2008.

LIGHTING THE LAMP: When senior defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** scored his power-play goal in the first period of the Oct. 10 game with Alabama-Huntsville, it was his first time lighting the lamp since his freshman year. Blatchford's last goal came on Jan. 20, 2007 when he scored versus Western Michigan. Before that goal, Blatchford went 99 games without scoring. The Temperance, Mich., native would rather set them up than score them as he now has three career goals to go with 54 assists for 57 points. He was second on the team in assists in 2008-09 when he had 25 helpers on the year.

FRESHMEN FIRSTS: Notre Dame freshmen forwards **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.)** and **Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.)** wasted little time getting on the scoresheet in the 3-2 loss to Alabama-Huntsville on Oct. 9. Sheahan scored on his first career shot, scoring on the power play at 3:02 of the first period to give Notre Dame a 1-0 lead. He joins **Billy Maday** and **Tim Wallace '06** as recent Notre Dame players to score on the first shots of their college careers. Palmieri joined in with a second-period power-play goal to get his first career score in his first game.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Notre Dame senior captain **Ryan Thang** has been named one of 20 nominees for the 2009-10 Lowes Senior CLASS Award. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, two members of the Irish hockey team - **Erik Condra '09** and **Jordan Pearce '09** - were selected as one of 10 finalists for the honor. For the 2007-08 campaign, captain **Mark Van Guilder '08** made it to the list of 10 finalists. For the 2006-07 season, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award. The list of 20 candidates will be narrowed down midway through the season with the final 10 going on a ballot to select the national winner.

CAPTAINS: Senior left wing **Ryan Thang** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2009-10 season. Joining Thang as alternate captains in '09-'10, are senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)**, senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** and junior defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Thang and Lawson served as alternate captains in 2008-09, while this is the first season as captain for Deeth and Ruth.

NUMERO UNO: Notre Dame reached the top of the college hockey rankings twice during the 2008-09 season, marking the third and fourth time in the program's 42-year history that the Irish sat atop the national polls. From Dec. 1 to Jan. 26 (seven weeks), Notre Dame was ranked first in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and *USCHO.com/CSTV* polls. The Irish then reached the top spot one time in each poll the rest of the season - the week of Feb. 23 in the *USA Today* poll and the week of March 16 in the *USCHO.com* rankings. Previously, Notre Dame reached number one in the nation status during the 2006-07 season. The Irish moved into the top spot in both polls on Feb. 5, 2007 and remained there for seven consecutive weeks through March 25. The Irish finished the year ranked fourth in the *USA Today* poll that covers the entire season and finished number one in the *USCHO.com* poll that ended with the finish of the regular season. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 64 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers.

ALL-AMERICANS: Two Notre Dame players were selected AHCA/Reebok All-Americans following the 2008-09 season. Current junior defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was selected as a first team All-American while right wing **Erik Condra '09** was selected second team. That marked the third time in the program's history that the Irish had two players selected All-American in the same year. The previous times came in 1972-73 when **Eddie Bumbacco '74** and **Bill Nyrop '74** were chosen and again in 1976-77 when **Jack Brownschidle '77** and **Brian Walsh '77** were honored.

CLUTCH SCORER: During his first three seasons at Notre Dame, senior left wing **Ryan Thang** has proven to be a clutch player. In those three seasons, Thang has amassed 13 game-winning goals, getting six in 2006-07, five in 2007-08 and two last season. He is currently tied for the top spot with 13 game-winning goals. That ties him with **Rob Globke '04**, **Brian Urick '99** and **Dave Poulin '82**, with all three having 13 game winners.

DROP THE PUCK: For the fifth year in a row, Notre Dame hockey opened its season with the annual "Drop The Puck Reception" at the Joyce Center for season ticket holders and fans. This year's event was held on Oct. 6 and featured Garth Snow, the general manager of the New York Islanders. A goaltender with the Islanders from 2001-06, Snow was on Long Island when Jeff Jackson was an assistant coach there. Snow joins Brian Burke, who was the executive vice-president and general manager of the Anaheim Ducks at the time and the G.M. of the 2010 U.S. Olympic hockey team in 2008, Detroit Red Wings' player and current team vice-president Steve Yzerman (2007), Chicago Black Hawk and Versus/NBC TV analyst Ed Olczyk (2006) and Hall of Fame coach Scotty Bowman, who handled the honors at the first Drop The Puck reception on Sept. 6, 2005 with over 400 fans in attendance. Bowman, who won nine Stanley Cups in his illustrious coaching career, also was invited by Notre Dame head football coach Charlie Weiss to address his team at practice that day, just four days prior to the upset win at Michigan.

SHILLELAGH TOURNAMENT: Notre Dame will host the second ever Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, 2010 at the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The tournament will feature North Dakota, Niagara and Colgate. On Saturday, Jan. 2, North Dakota and Niagara will meet in the 3:05 p.m. (CT) game with the Irish facing Colgate at 6:05 p.m. (CT). On Sunday, Jan. 3, Colgate will face either North Dakota or Niagara at 2:05 p.m. (CT) with Notre Dame playing either the Fighting Sioux or the Purple Eagles at 5:05 p.m. (CT). The Irish won the first tournament last season with 3-1 wins over Union College and Minnesota-Duluth in the championship game.

LORD STANLEY, LORD STANLEY: For the second consecutive season, a former Notre Dame defenseman played for a Stanley Cup winning team. This time it was Pittsburgh defenseman **Mark Eaton** who became the fourth Notre Dame player to hoist the Stanley Cup. Eaton, who played just one season for the Irish in 1997-98, joins **Brett Lebda '04** who won the Stanley Cup

versus Eaton's Penguins in 2008. They follow two other Notre Dame defenseman who have their names etched on the Cup three times - **Bill Nyrop '74** and **Don Jackson '78**. Nyrop played on three Stanley Cup winners with the Montreal Canadiens (1975-78) and Jackson was a member of three Cup-winning teams with the Edmonton Oilers (1982-85). The Pittsburgh defenseman was honored by Notre Dame at halftime of the season-opening game versus Nevada on Sept. 5.

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Notre Dame defensemen **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** were selected to play for Team USA in the 2009 World Junior Championships in Ottawa, Ont. The Irish now have 12 players to play on the Junior National Team with Cole making his second appearance. The defensive duo were part of a team that finished fifth. Cole had two goals and two assists for four points in six games while Ruth was scoreless in six contests. This past summer, defenseman **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)** and forward **Kyle Palmieri** were invited to the 2010 Junior National Evaluation Camp to try out for this winter's squad. Cole and Ruth join Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77, '78-'79), Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98), Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98), Dan Carlson ('98-'99), Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01), Brett Henning ('99-'00), David Inman ('99-'00), Rob Globke ('00-'01, '01-'02), Brett Lebda ('01-'02) and Kyle Lawson ('06-'07) as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have nine players on the 2009-10 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Two incoming freshmen added to the list this season. Left wing **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)** was a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall. Right wing **Kyle Palmieri** was a first round pick, 26th overall in the 2009 Draft last June. He became the second Notre Dame player ever selected in the first round. They join defenseman **Sean Lorenz** who also was selected in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. Defenseman **Ian Cole** was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues, who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman **Teddy Ruth** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. **Ryan Thang** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)**

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: The University of Notre Dame announced on Feb. 12, 2009 that construction on a new, freestanding, on-campus ice arena designed to meet both the needs of the nationally ranked Irish hockey team and the local community would begin next year.

The announcement was made by Notre Dame executive vice-president **John Affleck-Graves** and athletics director **Jack Swarbrick**. The construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2010 on a projected 5,000-seat arena - with the venue ready for play to start the 2011-12 season.

The University's Board of Trustees approved the project at its meetings on campus during the first week of February.

"We're thrilled about the plans for a new ice arena on our campus, particularly based on the superb job **Jeff Jackson** and our hockey team have done to position our program as one of the best in the nation," said Swarbrick.

"In addition to providing a first-rate home for our hockey team, this new facility will be made available whenever possible to our community as a whole, and, in particular, to the many area youth hockey and figure skating programs that are in need of an additional venue," Affleck-Graves said.

"This is the most important and missing piece of the puzzle to this hockey program. The new building will create an environment that our fans, the students, the players, and our hockey alumni can be proud of," said Irish coach Jeff Jackson.

The new ice arena will be located south of the Joyce Center, just north of Edison Road, and just west of where the new Irish track and field facility is being constructed. In addition to the track and field project, the University currently is in the process of building new stadia for both soccer and lacrosse (both scheduled for completion this year) - in addition to the ongoing Joyce Center arena addition and renovation that began in September 2008.

The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety. The facility will include two sheets of ice (one of them Olympic-sized), with limited seating availability for the second sheet.

The plan also will include offices and locker room and weight and cardio training facilities for the Notre Dame hockey program. Locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

The new ice arena will replace the Joyce Center fieldhouse as Notre Dame's home for ice hockey. The Joyce Center was dedicated in December 1968 as the Athletic and Convocation Center. It was renamed in 1987 in honor of **Rev. Edmund P. Joyce, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's executive vice president and chair of the Faculty Board on Athletics from 1952 to 1987.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral part in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
