Irish Return Home After Four Consecutive Road Games To Face Ohio State; Team Goes Back On The Road For BIG EAST Action At Loyola On March 25.

Notre Dame coming off a win over Yale (9-7) and a loss at Syracuse (16-13).

HOME AGAIN: The Notre Dame women's lacrosse team returns home for the first time since March 1 when the Irish play host to the Ohio State Buckeyes on Wednesday, March 21. The game will be played at the Loftus Sports Center and has a 7:45 p.m. start time. The original 4:00 p.m. start was changed due to the game moving indoors due to the threat of bad weather. The Irish return home after going 3-1 on the road with wins over Cornell (13-9), Canisius (18-8) and Yale (9-7), before dropping a 16-13 decision at Syracuse in the BIG EAST opener on Sunday. The Irish are now 5-2 on the year and 0-1 in BIG EAST play. Ohio State brings a 3-1 record with the lone loss coming in American Lacrosse Conference play to Johns Hopkins 915-14). Notre Dame saw the loss to Syracuse affect their national ranking as the Irish fell to 12th in both the IWLCA coaches' poll and the *Inside Lacrosse*.com polls. Notre Dame will return to the road this weekend when the Irish travel to Baltimore, Md., for the second BIG EAST game of the season when they face Loyola (Md.) in a 1:00 p.m. game. The Greyhounds open the week with a 1-4 record and are 0-1 in conference play. They travel to Princeton on Wednesday afternoon to face the Tigers before facing the Irish on Sunday.

IRISH AND THE BUCKEYES: The Irish and Buckeyes will meet for the 12th time in the all-time series on Wednesday, March 21 at the Loftus Center. Ohio State has a 6-5 record in the first 11 meetings. At Notre Dame, the Irish are 2-4 against the Buckeyes while they have a 3-2 edge in games played in Columbus, Ohio. Last season, the two teams met in Columbus on April 5 with Notre Dame taking a 13-6 win. The last time the two teams played at Notre Dame was on May 7, 2005 with the Buckeyes taking a 14-10 win in the season finale at Moose Krause Stadium.

IRISH AND GREYHOUNDS: Notre Dame travels to Baltimore, Md., on Sunday, March 25 to meet the Loyola (Md.) Greyhounds at 1:00 p.m. Loyola is an associate member of the BIG EAST so the game will count in the league standings. The two teams met for the first time in the 2006 season, playing in Wellington, Fla., in CSTV's Spring Fling on March 16, 2006. The Irish won that game by a 13-9 score. This weekend's game will be Notre Dame's first-ever visit to Loyola.

HEAD COACH TRACY COYNE: Tracy Coyne is in her 11th season at Notre Dame and 20th year in collegiate lacrosse. Coyne brings a 206-92 (.691) career record into the week against Ohio State and Loyola (Md.) and is 92-66 (.584) in her career. The 1983 graduate of Ohio University recorded her 200th career win last season in the first round of the NCAA tournament with a 16-8 victory against Cornell. She has guided Notre Dame to three NCAA tournament appearances (2002, 2004, 2006), including last year's first-ever trip to the NCAA finals. In her first 19 years of coaching, Coyne was 23-5 in two seasons at Denison (1988-89), 91-21 in seven years at Roanoke (1990-96) and 87-64 in 10 seasons at Notre Dame. The Pittsburgh, Pa., native led Denison (1988) and Roanoke (1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1996) to the NCAA Division III tournament during stops at those schools. Coyne also has coached on the international level as the head coach for the Canadian women's lacrosse national team from 1999-2005. In June of 2005, she led Team Canada to a fourth-place finish at the 2005 World Cup, her second fourth-place finish (2001) as Canada's field boss. Coyne is 5-6 all-time against Ohio State and 1-0 versus Loyola.

SYRACUSE RECAP: The Irish made their third trip to Western New York in the last three weeks and after winning at Cornell and Canisius, the results weren't as happy this time. Syracuse scored the last four goals of the game over the final 11:38 to wipe out a 13-12 Irish lead and hand Notre Dame its' first BIG EAST loss of the season, 16-13, at the Carrier Dome. Junior Caitlin McKinney (Lafayette Hill, Pa.) led Notre Dame with four goals and two assists on the afternoon. Jillian Byers (So., Northport, N.Y.) and Meghan Murphy (Sr., Centennial, Colo.) added three goals each. Kaki Orr (Sr., Darien, Conn.) and Jane Stoeckert (So., Mendham, N.J.) rounded out the scoring with two goals each. Syracuse was led offensively by Ashley Pike who scored five times and Bridget Looney who added four in the Orange victory. Halley Quillinan added three goals while Megan Mosenson scored twice and Katie Rowan and Jill DePetris added one goal each in the win. The victory improved the Orange to 4-3 overall and 1-1 in the BIG EAST while the Irish go to 5-2 for the

season and 0-1 in conference play. The Irish were out shot on the afternoon by a 37-24 margin. **Erin Goodman (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y.)** made eight saves for Notre Dame while Amber Pardee-Hill had six stops in the Syracuse goal.

NOTRE DAME-YALE RECAP: The Notre Dame women's lacrosse team spent Spring Break in Florida, participating in CSTV's Spring Fling for the second year in a row. Again the Irish played strong defense and got outstanding goalkeeping from sophomore Erin Goodman as they handed Yale a 9-7 loss at Village Parks Field in front of a capacity crowd. The Irish were led offensively by Caitlin McKinney who scored three goals with one assists. Jillian Byers and Meghan Murphy added two goals to pace the Irish attack. Jane Stoeckert and Lena Zentgraf had single goals on the night. The victory gives Notre Dame a three-game winning streak and improves the Irish to 5-1 overall. Yale falls to 4-2 in the loss.

SCHEDULE CHANGE: Notre Dame will face Duquesne University on Sunday, April 1 in a 1:00 p.m. game at Moose Krause Stadium. This contest replaces the Ohio University game that was cancelled due to the school ending the program and the players deciding not to play. Duquesne and Ohio were to play on April 1.

FAST START: Junior attack player Caitlin McKinney added seven goals and three assists to her totals in two games last week. McKinney scored three times in the 9-7 win over Yale and then added her fourth game of the year with six or more points as she had four goals and two assists in the 16-13 loss at Syracuse. The speedster leads Notre Dame in scoring with 23 goals and 10 assists for 33 points. She started the week ranked second in the BIG EAST in scoring behind Connecticut's Shannon Burke who had 39 points (17g, 22a) in her first six games.

MOVER AND SHAKER: The ink wasn't even dry on the 2007 Notre Dame women's lacrosse media guide and already sophomore Jillian Byers has broken a record. With 21 goals and four assists through the first five games, Byers became the quickest player in Irish history to reach 100 points in her career with 75 goals and 28 assists for 103 points in her first 24 games. She breaks the record set last season by Caitlin McKinney who scored 100 points in her first 33 games. Byers has now played in 26 games and has 80 goals and 28 assists for 108 career points.

MURPHY MADNESS: Senior Meghan Murphy (Centennial, Colo.) found her offensive touch on the road as she had seven goals and four assists for 11 points in her last four games. Murphy has five goals in the last two games, getting two in the win versus Yale and three in the loss to Syracuse. On the year, Murphy has nine goals and six assists for 15 points in the first seven games. As a junior, she had career highs with 14 goals and nine assists for 23 points so she is on pace to reach those totals this season.

IRISH STREAKS: Six Notre Dame players bring point streaks into the game with Ohio State. They are:

COMING ON: Sophomore midfielder **Jane Stoeckert (Mendham, N.J.)** has started to become more involved in the Notre Dame offense. She has scored a goal and an assist in each of Notre Dame's last four games and brings a fivegame point streak into the game with Ohio State. Stoeckert had 11 goals and nine assists for 20 points last season. In seven games this year, she has five goals and four assists for nine points.

GOOD FOR GAUDREAU: After seeing action in just two games as a freshman, sophomore attacker Kelly Gaudreau (Annapolis, Md.) wasted little time getting on the scoreboard in her first action of 2007. She scored twice in the second half for her first goal and first two-goal game of her career in the same contest.

MAKING THE STOPS: Sophomore goaltender Erin Goodman had back-to-back 14-save games in wins over Cornell (13-9) and Yale (9-7). In her first seven career starts, Goodman is now 5-2 with a 10.77 goals-against average and a .462 save percentage. Prior to the 16-13 loss at Syracuse, she

won three straight games versus Canisius, Cornell and Yale with an 8.00 goals-against average and a sparkling .607 save percentage (37 saves on 61 shots). Through seven games, Goodman is averaging 9.14 saves per game for the Irish.

TEWAARATON WATCH LIST: Sophomore Jillian Byers and junior Caitlin McKinney have been named to the 2007 Tewaaraton "Watch List." They are among 34 Division I players, selected by a panel of coaches from around the country, eligible for women's collegiate lacrosse's top player award. The current duo join Crysti Foote '06, Meredith Simon '04 and Danielle Shearer '03 as Irish players previously named to the "Watch List." Shearer was the first selected as a nominee for the award and Foote was the first to be named a finalist.

HOME RECORD: Notre Dame saw its 10-game home-winning streak snapped on March 1 when Northwestern handed the Irish an 18-10 loss at the Loftus Center. The streak included a 9-0 mark in 2006, the best home record the Irish have ever had.

CLUTCH PERFORMER: Junior Caitlin McKinney had her fourth game of the season with six or more points when she scored four times and added a pair of assists in the 16-13 loss to Syracuse. She leads the Irish with 23 goals and 10 assists for 33 points. Three of her goals have been game winners and they always seem to come in crucial situations. Despite being held to two goals in the win over James Madison on

Feb. 18, both came at crucial times in the game. Trailing 7-6 with time running out in regulation, McKinney scored with 19 seconds left to tie the game at 7-7 and send the game to overtime. Her second goal came in the second overtime. With Notre Dame trailing 9-8, McKinney tied the game with nine seconds left to make it 9-9 and send the game to sudden death.

FRESHMAN FIRSTS: Notre Dame freshman Gina Scioscia (Summit, N.J.) recorded the first goal, first assist and first multiple-point game of her career in the 18-10 loss to Northwestern. She followed up with an assist in the 13-9 win over Cornell and had two goals and an assist against Canisius. Scioscia has three goals and three assists in the first seven games of her Irish career.

OVERTIME NUMBERS: The Irish seem to play their share of overtime and one-goal games. The first two games this season went to extra time. On Feb. 18 at James Madison, the team's played 68:44 before Jillian Byers scored in sudden victory of the Irish. On Feb. 24, Notre Dame and Stanford played overtime for the second year in a row. This time, Caitlin McKinney scored with seven seconds left for the win. In 2006, the Irish were 1-1 in two sudden-victory games, losing at Georgetown (11-10) after winning a 12-11 game at Stanford. Notre Dame has now played 13 overtime games in their 11 seasons and are 6-7 in thos games. Over the last two seasons, the Irish are 6-2 in one goal games and 13-16 in the program's history.

LEAN ON LENA: Senior midfielder Lena **Zentgraf** equalled a career high with three goals in the 13-9 win at Cornell on March 4. In seven games this season, she is tied for third in scoring with seven goals and eight assists for 15 points. Her previous career best came in 2005 when she had 11 goals and eight assist for 19 points. She is second on the team with 14 draw controls and tied for second with 13 ground balls and leads the team with 10 caused turnovers.

NICE START: Sophomore Jillian Byers wasted little time getting her second season at Notre Dame off to a strong start in the win at James Madison. The talented attack player equaled her career high, netting six goals in the 10-9 suddendeath overtime win. After getting just one goal in the first half, the Northport, N.Y., native scored three goals in the second half, added a fifth in the second overtime and then got the game winner with 16 seconds left in the third overtime. She all ready has four games with four or more points and is second in scoring with 26 goals and four assists for 30 points.

CONTROLLING THE DRAW: The Irish tied a school record by winning 20 draws in the 13-9 win at Cornell on March 4. The 20 draws did set a school mark for draw controls in an away game. The previous mark of 20 was set versus Virginia Tech on March 26, 2004. The previous road mark was 19 and was done three times. Kaki Orr and Lena Zentgraf each had five in the game

while Jillian Byers had four to lead the team. Individually, Orr is Notre Dame's top player on the draw as she has 24 controls in the first seven games this season. As a team, the Irish have 104 draw controls and have lost 77 in the first seven games of the season.

TRADING CARDS: In Notre Dame's game with Stanford, the two teams combined for 10 yellow cards, one green card and one red card. Notre Dame was called for seven yellow cards while Stanford had three yellows, one red and had a green card for delay of game assessed. The two teams were called for 40 fouls. Notre Dame 17 and Stanford 23.

BIG EAST SCHOLARSHIP: Senior Meghan Murphy along with Irish swimmer Ted Brown, has been selected as one of Notre Dame's two BIG EAST post-graduate scholarship winners. The \$2,000 scholarship goes toward post-graduate studies. Murphy has already been accepted to medical school. She was the women's lacrosse team's 2006 Rockne Scholar-Athlete and was also selected to the 2006 IWLCA Academic honor roll with a 3.74 grade-point average in her double major in anthropology and pre-professional studies. She was a third team ESPN The Magazine/CoSida Academic All-American on the spring at-large team in 2006. Murphy was also selected as one of Notre Dame's Christopher Zorich Award winners for her involvement in community service work in the Notre Dame community and her home town of Denver, Colo.

DRAWING IT UP: Senior midfielder Kaki Orr (Darien, Conn.) set a Notre Dame single-game record with nine draw controls in the win over Vanderbilt on May 7 of 2006. She was second on the team with 41 draw controls in 2006, the second-best single-season total at Notre Dame. In seven games this season, she leads the team with 24 draw controls, almost four per game and for her career now has 81. Orr has also been finding the back of the net as she has four goals in her last three games.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS: Three members of the 2007 Notre Dame women's lacrosse team have been selected to the Inside Lacrosse Magazine preseason All-American team. Attack standouts Jillian Byers and Caitlin McKinney have been selected to the preseason second team while defender Meaghan Fitzpatrick (Sr., Farmingdale, N.Y.) was a third team selection. Byers and McKinney were both selected as third team All-Americans at the end of the 2006 season by Inside Lacrosse.

PRESEASON HONORS: Three members of the Notre Dame women's lacrosse team have been selected to the preseason all-BIG EAST team. Senior defender Meaghan Fitzpatrick, junior midfielder/attack Caitlin McKinney and sophomore attack Jillian Bvers were named to the 2007 team with McKinney and Byers being unanimous selections. Fitzpatrick, a 2006 second team all-BIG EAST selection, is a three-year starter on defense who started all 19 games last

season, grabbing 39 ground balls while causing 20 turnovers. McKinney was a first team all-BIG EAST selection last year and a third team IWLCA All-American after scoring 42 goals with 22 assists for 64 points. Byers also was a first team all-BIG EAST choice and a second team IWLCA All-American while scoring 54 goals and 24 assists for 78 points, the second-best single-season totals and freshman records at Notre Dame.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore **Jillian Byers** was named the BIG EAST offensive player of the week for the week ending March 4 as she had six goals and two assists for eight points. Byers had three goals and an assist in a loss to Northwestern and followed that with three goals and an assist in the win at Cornell. She joins **Caitlin McKinney** who received BIG EAST honors the previous week.

BIG EAST OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior attack standout Caitlin McKinney was selected as the BIG EAST offensive player of the week for the week ending Feb. 25. In two games, McKinney had eight goals and one assist for nine points. Included was a career-best, six-goal, seven-point game in the 12-11 overtime win versus Stanford on Feb. 24. In that game, McKinney scored the game winner with seven seconds left. She opened the season with a pair of goals in the sudden-victory win at James Madison on Feb. 18.

HELPING HAND: Junior **Heather Ferguson** (Newtown Square, Pa.) assisted on three goals in Notre Dame's 10-9 win over James Madison. The three assists equaled a career high set March 25, 2006 against Canisius. She recorded her first goal of the season in the 12-11 win over Stanford, Ferguson is coming off a break out season in 2006 when she finished fourth in scoring with 25 goals and 11 assists for 36 points, all career highs.

TURNAROUND SEASON: Notre Dame's dramatic turnaround from 2005 (3-12) to 2006 (15-4), a +10 differential, is the largest turnaround in NCAA women's lacrosse history, according to the NCAA record book. The previous biggest changes were seven-game turnarounds by American University (0-14 in 1996 to 8-8 in 1997) and Holy Cross (4-12 in 2000 to 13-7 in 2001). Notre Dame also turned the tables in BIG EAST play, going 4-1 last season and finishing second after going 1-4 in 2005 and finishing in fifth place.

RECORD-SETTING CAMPAIGN: Notre Dame's 2006 season was a record-setting campaign. The Irish set team records for wins (15), goals (263), assists (144), points (407) and draw controls (273). **Crysti Foote** set individual team records for goals (74), assists (40), points (114) and draw controls (44).

SISTER ACTS: Notre Dame has had eight sets of sisters in the program's 11-year history and has two sets on this year's team. Heading the group are twin sisters, juniors Heather and Lindsey Ferguson (Newtown Square, Pa.).

They are joined by senior Lena Zentgraf and her younger sister Maggie (Charlottesville, Va.). Three other members of this year's team have sisters who played at Notre Dame. Junior Julie Foote (Suffern, N.Y.) was preceded by her sister, Crysti '06 while sophomores Lauren deMello (Manlius, N.Y.) and Kelly Gaudreau (Annapolis, Md.) were preceded by sisters Meghan deMello '06 and Kristen Gaudreau '04. Other sisters duos to play for the Irish include: Carol '06 and Angela '03 Dixon and Mary '06 and Annemarie McGrath. The sisters that started the tradition are Amy ('98) and Mara ('98) Grace. They each played in the first two seasons of the program.

ALL-AMERICANS: For the second time in the program's history, Notre Dame had three players selected All-American during the 2006 season. Senior Crysti Foote became the school's first two-time All-American as she was selected first team by the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA). Foote led the Irish and the nation in scoring with 74 goals and 40 assists for 114 points. She was a third team pick in 2005. Joining Foote in 2006 were sophomore Caitlin McKinney and freshman Jillian Byers. McKinney was selected third team IWLCA All-American while Byers was a second team choice. They became the eighth and ninth All-Americans in the program's history.

Foote, Byers and McKinney were also selected to the *Inside Lacrosse* and womenslacrosse.com All-American teams.

THE KID WAS ALRIGHT: Sophomore attack standout Jillian Byers turned in an outstanding rookie season in 2006. Byers set Notre Dame freshmen records for goals (54), assists (24) and points (78) in a season. Her 78 points were the second-best point total in the program's history, trailing Crysti Foote (114 in 2006). Her 54 goals trailed just Foote's 74 set in 2006. Byers was selected as a unanimous first team all-BIG EAST selection in her freshman year, a first for any Notre Dame rookie. She was named a second team IWLCA and womenslacrosse.com All-American and a third team Inside Lacrosse Magazine All-American. She owns the freshman record for points in a game with nine points (5g, 4a) versus Lehigh. Her nine-point game also tied an Irish record for points in a home game, matching the nine points recorded by Kerry Callahan '99 (6g, 3a) on March 24, 1997 versus Stanford and Lael O'Shaughnessy '01 (6g, 3a) on March 28, 1999 vs. Connecticut.

HAMMER TIME: Junior midfielder Mary Carpenter (Rochester, N.Y.) was selected

second team all-BIG EAST for the 2006 season after turning in a strong year at midfield. In 19 games, Carpenter had career highs in goals (12), assists (10), points (20), ground balls (51), draw controls (30) and caused turnovers (23). She led the team in ground balls, tied for third in draw controls and was second in caused turnovers. Her 51 ground balls were the sixth-best single-season total for the Irish. Through the first five games of the season, Carpenter has one goal and one assist to go along with three ground balls, seven draw controls and three caused turnovers.

GETTING IT DONE ON AND OFF THE FIELD: Senior Meghan Murphy (Centennial, Colo.) who finished fifth in scoring with the Irish (14g, 9a) in 2006 was just as successful off the field. The winner of Notre Dame's Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award, Murphy was a third team ESPN The Magazine/CoSida Academic All-American with a 3.70 grade-point average with a double major in anthropology and pre-professioan studies. She has already been accepted to medical school for the fall of 2007. Murphy also received the prestigious Christopher Zorich Award at Notre Dame's annual O.S.C.A.R.S. awards program. The award was created in 1998 to recognize the contributions of Notre Dame student-athletes to the University and community at large. The award holds the name of Christopher Zorich, a two-time football All-American and 1991 graduate. He went on to play in the National Football League for both the Chicago Bears and Washington Redskins and received his law degree from Notre Dame in 2002. Murphy has been involved in community service work during her three seasons at Notre Dame. She organized the team's community service work this season and has been involved with the YWCA Women's Shelter Spring Cleaning, the Cavanaugh/Zahm Winter Carnival and several projects at the Center for the Homeless, including cooking and serving meals, spending time at Thanksgiving with the children and helping coordinate a shoebox assembly first as part of a class project and then as a Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) project that delivered several carloads of personal-use items for use at the Center. Working with children has been a focus for Murphy as she has been involved with holiday parties for kids at both the St. Joseph's Pediatric and Memorial Hospital Pediatric wings, as well as, Notre Dame's annual Christmas Pediatric Party. In October of 2006, she helped organize a trip with Notre Dame students to go to New Orleans over fall break to assist in the recovery of the city in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina.

THE DEFENSE RESTS: Notre Dame's terrific trio on defense – Meaghan Fitzpatrick (Sr., Farmingdale, N.Y.), Kristin Hopson (Sr., Rosemont, Pa.) and Becky Ranck (Jr., Radnor, Pa.) returns for their third season together. The threesome combined for 86 ground balls, 39 draw controls and 64 caused turnovers during the 2006 season. They helped the Irish hold the opposition to less than 10 goals per game. Through the first seven games of the 2007 season, the trio has 22
