No. 8/8 Notre Dame Takes On Top-Ranked Michigan In Home And "Home" Series

- Irish to play their home game at The Palace of Auburn Hills on Sat., Jan. 19
- Notre Dame to play second series of season against a top-ranked team after facing then No. 1 Miami in November.
- Irish looking to find scoring touch after lighting the lamp just 11 times in last six games.

BATTLING THE BEST: The CCHA schedule makers did Notre Dame no favors in the first three weeks of January, sending the Irish to Northern Michigan for two games and then giving them a home-and-home series with #9/#10 Michigan State, the defending national champions. Just to add to the fun, they threw in a pair of games against the No. 1 ranked Michigan Wolverines for a home and "home" series, Jan. 18-19. On Friday, Jan. 18, the Irish travel to Ann Arbor to face Michigan at Yost Arena in an 8:05 p.m. game. The contest will be televised by CSTV with Matt McConnell and Dave Starman calling the action. The following night, Notre Dame will play its "home" game at the Palace of Auburn Hills with face off set for 7:05 p.m. That game will be televised by Comcast Local with Ben Holden and Sean Ritchlin handling the play-by-play and color duties. Notre Dame comes into the week with an 18-7-1 record and is 11-4-1 in the CCHA, good for 23 points. The Irish are three points behind Michigan and Miami in third place while the Wolverines have two games in hand. Michigan is now 20-2-0 on the season and 13-1-0 in the conference and is tied for first place with the Miami RedHawks. Since the start of the second half, the Irish are 2-3-1 in six games while the Wolverines are 4-0-0.

RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame fell two spots this week to eighth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. Michigan is ranked first in both polls for the fourth straight week.

IRISH VERSUS WOLVERINES: Michigan is Notre Dame's oldest rival as the two teams have met 112 times in the series that began in 1921-22. All-time, the Wolverines hold a 63-44-5 edge in the series. At Yost Arena, Michigan has a 35-21-3 advantage and on neutral ice, Michigan has won seven-of-nine meetings.

Last season, Notre Dame took all three meetings, winning 7-3 at Ann Arbor, 4-3 at Notre Dame and then 2-1 in the CCHA title game at Joe Louis Arena. Prior to last year's three-game sweep by the Irish, Michigan had won eight straight games over the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons. Since Notre Dame returned to the CCHA in 1992-93, Michigan is 37-9-3 versus the Irish. Of those games, the Irish are 3-20-1 at Yost Arena with wins in (1997-98, 2002-03 and 2006-07).

A TRIP TO THE PALACE: Notre Dame and Michigan have met four times in the all-time series at The Palace of Auburn Hills with the Wolverines winning all four games. The Irish also played Lake Superior in a fifth visit to the Palace.

At the time, the crowd of 20,899 on Jan. 21, 1995 was the largest crowd ever to watch an NCAA college hockey game. The five games in the 90s drew 83,940 or an average of 16,788 per game.

VERSUS THE BEST: Notre Dame's series with Michigan marks the second time this season that the Irish will face the top-ranked team in the nation. On Nov. 9-10, Notre Dame met No. 1 ranked Miami twice in Oxford, Ohio, defeating the RedHawks, 2-1, on Nov. 9 before dropping a 3-1 decision at Miami on Nov. 10. The Nov. 9 win marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. Before losing on Nov. 10, Notre Dame had won four straight versus top 10 teams. MICHIGAN STATE RECAP: Notre Dame played a home-and-home series last weekend with Michigan State, dropping a 3-1 decision at Munn Arena on Jan. 11 before battling to a 1-1 tie at the Joyce Center on Jan. 13. On Friday night, the Irish failed to win at Munn Arena for the seventh straight time (0-6-1) since Feb. 2002 as the Spartans took a 3-1 win. MSU's Matt Schepke and Irish center **Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** traded second-period goals for a 1-1 tie after two periods. The score stayed that way until the 18:03 mark of the third period when Justin Abdelkader scored on a goal mouth scramble to give MSU a 2-1 lead. Nick Sucharski added an empty-net goal with 22 seconds left for the 3-1 victory. Notre Dame won the shots on goal battle, getting 31 to Michigan State's 30. **Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska)** made 27 saves for Notre Dame while Jeff Lerg made 30 for the Spartans. The Irish were 0-for-5 on the power play (includes one of four seconds and

one of two seconds) while Michigan State was 0-for-3. The loss dropped the Irish to 2-20-1 at Munn Arena since the 1992-93 season. On Sunday at the Joyce Center, **Ryan Thang (So., Edina, Minn.)** scored with 38 seconds left to salvage a 1-1 tie with the Spartans. Michigan State got a second-period, power-play goal from Nick Sucharski at 8:27 to take a 1-0 lead. The score stayed that way until Notre Dame pulled **Jordan Pearce** with 1:20 left in the game. Following a face off outside the Michigan State zone, the Irish fired the puck in to the left corner where Thang tracked it down. He banked it off the boards to **Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.)** at the left point. Blatchford fired a shot on goal that hit Thang as he cut in front and deflected off his stick past Jeff Lerg. The goal was Thang's 12th of the season. In overtime, Notre Dame out shot the Spartans, 8-1, and also had a shot off the post by **Dan VeNard (Sr., Vernon Hills, Ill.)** but could not score. The Irish had 35 shots on goal while Michigan State had 15. Lerg finished with 34 saves while Pearce had 14. The Irish were 0-for-5 on the power play.

SHORT CIRCUITED: Notre Dame's power-play continued to struggle in the series with Michigan State. The Irish were 0-for-5 in each game and 0-for-10 on the weekend. Over the last six games, Notre Dame has not scored on the power play, going 0-for-30 since the Christmas break. The last time the Irish scored on the power play was Dec. 8 versus Princeton. The power-play woes actually started prior to the break as the Irish have just one power-play goal since Dec. 7 (eight games), going 1-for-36 (2.7%), including that series. Prior to that, Notre Dame was 21-for-109 with the man advantage for a 19.3% success rate. The Irish are now 22-for-146 (15.2%).

BERGMAN RETURNS TO USHL: Freshman left wing **Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden)** has left the Notre Dame hockey team and returned to the United States Hockey League (USHL). He will play for the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders, the team he played for last season. In 20 games at Notre Dame, Bergman had one goal and six assists for seven points and was +3 on the year. With Cedar Rapids last season, Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points to finish fourth on the team in scoring.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 1-1 overtime tie with Michigan State on Jan. 13 marked the first overtime game this season for the Irish. A year ago, Notre Dame was 3-1-3 in overtime. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two-plus seasons under head coach **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-8 in extra play.

CLUTCH SCORER: **Ryan Thang's** goal with 38 seconds left versus Michigan State on Jan. 13 salvaged a 1-1 tie for the Irish. The sophomore left wing has now scored four game-winning goals this season and one game-tying goal among his team-high 12 goals. In 67 career games, Thang has scored 32 goal with 14 coming on the power play and 10 of them game winners. His 10 game winners tie him for sixth on the all-time game-winning goals list at Notre Dame.

TWO-IN-A-ROW: Notre Dame has not lost two games in a row since losing twice to Alaska, March 3-4, 2006, in the 2006 CCHA playoffs. That covers a span of 68 games over the last two seasons. Since then, the Irish are 50-14-4 (.765).

SECOND-HALF NUMBERS: Scoring has been a problem for Notre Dame in the second half of the season that started on Dec. 29. In the six games played, the Irish have scored just 11 goals (1.83) while giving up 12 (2.00). Notre Dame is 2-3-1 in those six games. In the first half of the year (20 games) the Irish averaged 3.55 goals per game and were ranked third in the country in scoring.

HOBEBY HOPEFULS: Fan voting has begun for the 2008 Hobey Baker Award at www.hobey-baker.com. Two Notre Dame players are on the ballot - junior right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** and senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)**.

PERSONAL STREAK: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** has surrendered five goals in his last three starts and is 0-2-1 in those games as the Irish have lost at Northern Michigan, 2-1, lost at Michigan State, 3-1 and then tied the Spartans, 1-1. In those three games, Notre Dame has scored just three goals. Earlier this season, Pearce had a personal seven-game winning streak between Nov. 16 and Dec. 8. During the streak, Pearce was 7-0-0 with a 1.72 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage. Since Nov. 1, Pearce is 10-4-1 with losses to No. 1 Miami, No. 9 Massachusetts and No. 9 Michigan State. For the season, Pearce is 14-7-1 with a 2.01 goals-against average and a .911 save percentage with two shutouts.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career - 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 142 consecutive games played through the first 26 games this year.

ONE-GOAL LOSSES: During the first half of the season, Notre Dame was 6-0 in one-goal games. In the second half of the season, the Irish have seen three of their six games end in one-goal decisions with opponents winning two of the three. For the year, Notre Dame is now 7-2 in one-goal contests.

WELCOME BACK: Freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** returned to the Notre Dame lineup at Michigan State (Jan. 11) after participating in the World Junior Championships with the U.S. Junior National Team. At the World Championships, Cole played in all six games and had no points with six penalty minutes as the United States finished fourth in the tournament. He missed four games - the two games at the Lightning College Hockey Classic and the Northern Michigan series. Also returning on Friday night was fellow freshman defender **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Ruth missed five games (Princeton, Lightning College Classic and two with Northern Michigan) due to an injury.

SECOND PERIOD PROWESS: The second period has been Notre Dame's best period this season as the Irish have scored 37 goals while giving up just 13 for a +24 advantage in the middle stanza.

CENTURY CLUB: Notre Dame's "Century Club" added its newest member on Nov. 24 when junior **Erik Condra** recorded an assist versus R.P.I. In 104 career games, Condra is now tied for 36th on the all-time points list with 30 goals and 79 assists for 109 points. His 79 assists rank him 24th on the all-time assist list. For the third season in a row, Condra leads the Irish in scoring with 10 goals and 17 assists for 27 points in 26 games. Here's who is ahead of Condra on the all-time points list.

HOT HANDS: Notre Dame's trio of left wing **Dan Kissel (So., Crestwood, Ill.)**, center **Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.)** and right wing **Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.)** have carried the offensive attack over the last seven games for the Irish. The threesome has scored eight goals and added 11 assists for 19 points since Dec. 8 at Princeton. Kissel has three goals and four assists for seven points; Hanson checks in with three goals and three assists for six points and Rankin has two goals and four assists for six points. All three players have career highs in goals, assists and points this season. Kissel has six goals, eight assists and 14 points, Hanson has seven goals, six assists and 13 points and Rankin has six goals, seven assists and 13 points so far this year.

FAST START: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** has gotten his career off to a fast start between the pipes for the Irish. Phillips has won his first four collegiate starts while allowing just three goals and stopping 69 of 72 shots he's faced. Phillips is 4-0-0 with a 0.75 goals-against average and a .958 save percentage and one shutout.

RECORD STREAK: Notre Dame's nine-game winning streak from Nov. 16 through Dec. 8 was the longest for the Irish since a 14-game streak from Dec. 11, 1987 to Feb. 13, 1988. During that time, the Irish were a Division I Independent. The streak is the longest for the Irish as a member of the CCHA or the WCHA.

THE REPLACEMENTS: With **Ian Cole** at the World Junior Championships and **Teddy Ruth** sidelined with an injury, junior **Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.)** and sophomore **Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.)** stepped into the Notre Dame lineup and did yeoman's work on the blue line. In five games, Lucyk had a goal and an assist, had one shot on goal and was +3. Carlin played in four games, had eight shots on goal and was +1 in his playing time. He remained in the lineup for the Jan. 11 game at Michigan State.

THE PENALTY KILL: Through the first 26 games of the season, Notre Dame ranks third in the CCHA and seventh in the nation killing penalties. The Irish have killed 108-of-121 opponent power plays for an 89.2% success rate. Over the last six games, Notre Dame has given up six power-play goals in 25 chances for a 76.0% success rate. Over the first 20 games, the Irish led the nation in penalty killing, killing 89-of-96 for a 92.7% success rate. At the time, they had given up seven power-play goals while scoring seven short-handed tallies.

THREE PPG AGAINST: In the 4-3 loss to Massachusetts on Dec. 29, the Irish gave up three power-play goals to the Minutemen, the first time that has happened since Dec. 17, 2005, in a 4-0 loss to Lake Superior. For the year, the Irish are still fifth in the nation on the penalty kill, stopping 105 of 117 chances for an 89.7% success rate.

BALANCED ATTACK: Notre Dame comes into the series with Michigan ranked 12th in the nation in scoring with 3.15 goals per game. Through the first 20 games, the Irish were third in the nation, averaging 3.55 goals per game. Despite the ranking, the Irish have just two players on the roster with 10 or more goals this season - **Ryan Thang** with 12 and **Erik Condra** with 10. The Irish have accumulated their 82 goals this year with 10 players on the roster having five goals or more.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain **Mark Van Guilder** has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender **David Brown '07** won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

TOURNAMENT VETS: The Lightning College Hockey Classic was the third in-season tournament for the Irish this season. They opened the year at the Lefty McFadden Classic in Dayton, Ohio, losing to Wisconsin, 4-1, before defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, to take third place. Over Thanksgiving, the Irish played in the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, taking the championship with wins over Alabama-Huntsville (4-1) and Rensselaer (4-3). At Tampa, Notre Dame dropped a 4-3 decision to Massachusetts and then took third place with a 3-1 win over Rensselaer.

STREAKS SNAPPED: Notre Dame's 4-3 loss to Massachusetts snapped a nine-game Irish winning streak that began back on Nov. 16 versus Western Michigan. The nine-game streak was the longest in the nation at the time. The Irish also saw a five-game CCHA winning streak (Nov. 16-Dec. 1) snapped last weekend in the 2-1 loss at Northern Michigan.

TOURNEY RESULTS: Notre Dame has now participated in 30 in-season tournaments in the program's 40-year history, winning six times and finishing second, six times. The Irish have been third a total of seven times and there have been 11 fourth-place finishes. Notre Dame has now won two of the last four in-season tournaments that the Irish have played in, winning the 2006 Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic in Oct. of 2006 in Tampa, Fla and the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, Nov. 24-25, 2007 in Troy, N.Y. All time, the Irish are 23-34-3 in tournament play.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. UMass forward Matt Burto, who scored the game winner in the championship game was the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

NO GOALS FOR YOU: Junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** recorded his second shutout of the season in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. Earlier this year, they faced Miami when the RedHawks were ranked No. 1 overall. Since Dec. 29, Notre Dame has will have played six of its eight games against ranked teams. For the year, the Irish are 2-5-1 against teams that were ranked in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and 4-5-1 versus teams in the U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV poll. Last season, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

THE GOOD AND THE BAD: Through the first 26 games of the season, when the Irish are good, they are very good. In the 18 wins this season, Notre Dame has scored 73 goals (4.06 per game). In the seven losses and one tie, Notre Dame has scored just nine goals for a 1.13 goals-per game mark. In the 18 wins, the Irish have given up just 27 goals (1.50 goals-against average) while in the seven losses and one tie, they have given up 23 goals (2.88 goals against). The 2-1 loss to Northern Michigan on Jan. 4 marked the first time all season that the Irish lost a game when giving up two goals or less.

GETTING THE BOUNCES: Sophomore center **Kevin Deeth** ranks third on the Irish in scoring this season with five goals and 12 assists for 17 points. Over his last 11 games, the speedy Deeth has scored five times and added four assists for nine points. Three of his five goals have come on the power play.

MR. CONSISTENT: Sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** has proven to be one of the CCHA's most consistent defensemen this season. A two-time CCHA defenseman of the week this season, Lawson leads all Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with three goals and 12 assists for 15 points. Already this year, he has a power-play goal and a pair of game-winning goals. Lawson's 15 points tie him for fifth among CCHA defensemen this season. He is tied for third on the team with a +11 on the year.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)** was named the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Dec. 9. In the weekend sweep at Princeton, VeNard had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2 on the weekend. His three-point game on Dec. 8 in Notre Dame's 7-0 win was a career high for the blueliner. He now has five goals and three assists for eight points in 20 games this year. In 71 career games prior to this season, VeNard had two goals and six assists for eight points.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that three players have signed national letters of intent in the early signing period to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2008. The trio - defensemen **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)** and **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** and forward **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** - will join **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** who signed in Nov. of 2007 but deferred until next fall. Lorenz and Gaul are members of the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 team. Ringel plays in the North American Hockey League for the Mahoning Valley Phantoms and Maday is a member of the Waterloo Black Hawks of the United States Hockey League (USHL). Ringel was ranked 163rd (sixth round) among North Americans in NHL Central Scouting's mid-term rankings that were released in January.

TWO SHORTIES: **Mark Van Guilder** and **Ryan Thang** each scored short-handed goals in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. That marked the first time the Irish had scored a pair of short-handed goals in a game since Dec. 20, 2000 when **Brett Lebda '04** and **Dan Carlson '01** scored short-handed goals in a 7-3 win at Nebraska-Omaha. As a team, the Irish have seven short-handed goals, the most of any team in the nation.

WITH A KISS-EL: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** turned in a career-best four-point game in Notre Dame's 7-0 win at Princeton on Dec. 8. The speedy forward scored twice and added two assists in the contest while turning in a +4 plus/minus. He and his linemates - **Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.)** and **Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.)** had a big night in the win. Rankin had a career-best three-point game (1g, 2a) and Hanson added a goal and an assist in the win as the line combined for four goals and five assists and nine points in the game.

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** has career highs in assists (8) and points (14) this season. For his career, Kissel has played in 44 games with 12 goals and 11 assists for 23 points. Of his 12 goals, he has two power-play goals, two shorthanded tallies and four game winners.

NIFTY NOVEMBER: Notre Dame finished November with a 9-1-0 record, including wins in the last six straight. Some other numbers for the month: The Irish were 7-1-0 in the CCHA and 5-0-0 at home while going 3-1-0 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites ... the Irish out scored the opposition by a 38-19 margin (3.8 gpg to 1.9 gpg) ... Notre Dame out shot the opposition by a 31.0 - 20.1 margin ... the Irish were 13-for-52 on the power play (25.0%) and killed 41-of-46 opponent power plays for an 89.1% success rate ... **Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.)** led the team in scoring with six goals and 10 assists for 16 points and was followed by **Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.)**, **Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** and **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** with 10 points each ... **Jordan Pearce** was 7-1-0 with a 2.13 goals-against average and a .900 save percentage ... **Brad Phillips (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.)** was 2-0-0 with a 1.00 goals-against and a .935 save percentage.

TWO-TIMER: Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** has been named the CCHA defenseman of the week twice this season (Nov. 25 and Nov. 18). Lawson, who helped the Irish to three wins from Nov. 20-24, had one goal and three assists for four points and was +2. In the Nov. 20, 2-1 win over Bowling Green, Lawson was +1 and scored the game-winning goal in the 2-1 victory. Versus Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 23, Lawson was even and set up one goal. In the championship game against Rensselaer, Lawson set up two goals, including **Ryan Thang** game winner with 3:56 left in the game and was +1.

TOURNAMENT HARDWARE: Three Notre Dame players were named to the all-tournament team at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Junior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded three assists on the weekend and was the lone Irish forward selected. Defensemen **Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.)** and **Ian Cole** joined Condra on the team. Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** was named the tournament MVP after scoring the game-winning goal in each of Notre Dame's victories.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame on Nov. 17 are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances against Western Michigan (Nov. 16) were also a season high.

HOME SWEET HOME: After nine home games this season, Notre Dame is 7-1-1 (.833) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records - 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame has had four sellouts (2,713) in its first nine home games and just missed a fifth against Bowling Green on Nov. 20 with a crowd of 2,711 in attendance. The previous two sellout crowds of 2,857 were the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through nine games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,637 fans per game.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 8-4-0 (.667) on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. The first win on Nov. 9 came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

ON THE MARK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain is second in goals (8) and leads the team in power-play goals (5) this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)**. They will be joined by junior forward **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)**. This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category. Bergman left the Irish on Jan. 14 to return to Cedar Rapids.

NHL DRAFTTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**

rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork ('83)** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak** who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM: Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alumni grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips. Other NTDP alumni who played at Notre Dame include: **Brett Henning (1997-98)**, **Michael Chin (1997-98)**, **Connor Dunlop (1997-99)**, **Paul Harris (1997-99)**, **John Wroblewski (1997-99)**, **Neil Komadoski (1998-2000)**, **Brett Lebda (1998-2000)**, **Rob Globke (1998-2000)**, **Derek Smith (2000-01)** and **Tim Wallace (2002-06)**, **Noah Babin (2003-07)**, **Michael Bartlett (2003-07)**, **Tom Sawatske (2005-07)** and **Josh Sciba (2003-07)**.

HOMETOWNS: The 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 13 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia.
