FOR STARTERS

- Notre Dame opens the 2017–18 season with a home series against Alabama Huntsville.
- It will mark the first and second of eight consecutive non-conference home games for the Irish in the month of October.
- The Irish are 6-6-0 in season openers under Head Coach Jeff Jackson.
- Notre Dame and Alabama Huntsville will be meeting for the first time since the 2013– 14 season when they played three times at the Compton Family Ice Arena, including a 5–2 Notre Dame win in the Shillelagh Tournament (Nov. 29, 2013) and a series sweep (Jan. 10–11) that included wins of 7–1 and 5–0 by Notre Dame.
- Notre Dame is 6–1–0 in games against the Chargers under head coach Jeff Jackson.
- The Irish have won each of the last four meetings between the two teams and have also won eight of the last nine (complete series history on page 7).

UAH AT A GLANCE

- Members of the WCHA, the Chargers wen 9-22-3 overall and 9-16-3 in league play in 2016-17 which included three road series sweeps
- Huntsville native Josh Kestner returns after posting a career-best 22 points on nine goals and 13 assists last season.
- Eight players who had at least 10 points last season return to the Chargers' lineup this season.
- The Chargers also return all but one defensemen from its 2016-17 roster.
- The UAH program dates back to 1986 and the Chargers won NCAA Division II Championships in the 1995–96 and 1997–98.

NOTRE DAME 4, USNTDP 3

- Behind third period goals from Joe Wegwerth and Colin Theisen, the Fighting Irish
 opened the 2017–18 season with a 4–3 exhibition win over the U.S. National Team
 Development Program (U18) on Sunday night (Oct. 1) at the Compton Family Ice Arena
 (2,697).
- Cam Morrison finished with a goal and an assist and Jake Evans had two assists to lead the Irish.
- Additional goal scorers included Tory Dello, Joe Wegwerth and Colin Theisen (GWG).
- In the Notre Dame net, sophomore Cale Morris started and stopped 13 of the 15 shots he faced in 30:48 of work, while freshman Dylan St. Cyr played the final 29:07 and

- turned aside 10 of the 11 shots he faced to earn the win.
- Twenty-two skaters and two goaltenders were used by head coach Jeff Jackson, including Irish debuts for Theisen, Pierce Crawford, Matt Steeves, Max Eisenmenger, Felix Holmberg, Matt Hellickson and St. Cyr.
- Jackson served as the first head coach of the USNTDP from 1996-2000.
- In addition to Jackson, 36 Notre Dame hockey players have come through the U.S. National Team Development Program, including current players Dawson Cook, Hellickson, St. Cyr and Wegwerth.

UP NEXT FOR THE IRISH

- Next weekend, the Irish continue their eight-game home stand to open the 2017-18 season with a series versus top-ranked Denver (Oct. 13-14).
- Puck drop is scheduled for 7:05 p.m. on Friday Oct. 13 and then for 6:05 p.m. on Saturday Oct. 14 and both games will be televised on NBCSN.
- The teams will be meeting for the first time since Denver eliminated the Irish in the NCAA Semifinals at the 2017 Frozen Four at the United Center in Chicago.

LEADERSHIP QUARTET

- Senior Jake Evans will serve as the team captain in 2017–18, while seniors Jordan Gross and Luke Ripley as well as junior Andrew Oglevie will serve as alternate captains for the year.
- Evans and Ripley were alternate captains in 2016–17.
- Evans becomes the 13th Canadian born captain of the Irish and the first since two-year captain Steve Noble (1996-98).

MORRISON CLOSES STRONG

- Current sophomore forward Cam Morrison finished his freshman season with 12 goals and 12 assists for 24 points in 40 games.
- Nine of those 24 points (5-4-9) came over the final nine games of last season, a stretch that included six playoff games.
- Morrison picked up where he left off by notching a goal and an assist in Notre Dame's 4-3 exhibition win over the USNTDP to open the 2017-18 season (Oct.1).

YEAR ONE IN THE B1G

- Notre Dame embarks on its first season as an affiliate member of the Big Ten Conference in 2017-18.
- Coach Jackson will oversee the Fighting Irish in a third conference, having spent his first eight seasons with the Irish in the CCHA and the previous four seasons in Hockey East.
- Big Ten hockey will feature seven teams this season and each team will play 24 conference games.
- For all conference games as well as home non-conference games, the Irish will follow B1G protocol and if the game remains tied after a five minute overtime, there will be a shootout (three players per team).
- The 2018 Big Ten Tournament will feature a three-weekend format with all games taking place on the campus of the higher-seeded teams.
- The tournament will open March 2-4 with three best-of-three quarterfinal series, as the second-, third- and fourth-seeded teams will each host a series.
- The top-seeded team will have a bye to the single-elimination semifinals, which are scheduled for Saturday, March 10.
- The highest-seeded team remaining after the semifinals will host a championship game scheduled for Saturday, March 17.

TELEVISION

- Notre Dame will once again be one of college hockey's most televised teams in 2017–
 18
- The NBC Sports Group will televise and/or stream 19 Notre Dame regular-season home games, including NBCSN games against Denver (Oct. 13-14), Penn State (Nov. 11), Minnesota (Nov. 24), Michigan (Jan. 7), Wisconsin (Jan. 21) and Ohio State (Feb. 9).
- It marks the fifth consecutive season of NBC Sports coverage for the Irish.
- Additionally, NBC Sports Chicago Plus will also pick up Notre Dame home games against Alabama Huntsville (Oct. 6-7), Sacred Heart (Oct. 19-20), Nebraska Omaha (Oct. 26-27), Penn State and Minnesota (Nov. 25).
- Seven Notre Dame road games will be televised this season, including Notre Dame's first Big Ten conference game at Ohio State on Friday, Nov. 3 (BTN).
- The Big Ten Network will also televise Notre Dame games at Wisconsin (Dec. 8), at Michigan (Jan. 5) and at Penn State (Feb. 2).
- ESPN2 will carry the road game at Minnesota on Friday, Jan. 26.
- Additionally, Fox Sports Wisconsin Plus (at Wisconsin on Dec. 9) and Fox Sports North Plus (at Minnesota on Jan. 27) will also televise Fighting Irish road games.

2017 FROZEN FOUR RUN

- Notre Dame concluded the 2016-17 season with an appearance in the Frozen Four at the United Center in Chicago (The University of Notre Dame also served as the host institution).
- It marked Notre Dame's third ever Frozen Four appearance as well as the third in a 10year span (Boston College and North Dakota were the only other teams to make at least three Frozen Fours in that 10-year span).
- The Irish overcame deficits against both No. 1 seed Minnesota and No. 2 seed UMass Lowell to post back-to-back 3-2 victories at the Northeast Regional in Manchester, New Hampshire.
- In the combined 12 regional semifinal and regional games in the NCAA Tournament last season, Notre Dame was the only team to trail in the second period or later and post a win – and the Irish did it twice.
- After trailing in the third period of the regional semifinal against UMass Lowell, the lrish tied the game late in the third when Cam Morrison scored on a feed from Anders Bjork.
- Andrew Oglevie then scored the dramatic game winner just 2:44 into the overtime period.
- The win over UMass Lowell was Notre Dame's first overtime win since defeating Miami 3-2 on December 28, 2014, in the first round of the Florida College Hockey Classic in Estero, Florida.
- Notre Dame headed into the NCAA Tournament as a No. 4 seed and the Irish were the
 only team not seeded No. 1 to make it to Chicago.
- Cam Morrison scored the lone goal for the Irish in the Frozen Four contest, with assists from Jordan Gross and Jake Evans.

IRISH IN THE NHL

- Seven former Notre Dame players made 2017 NHL opening night rosters including, back-to-back defending Stanley Cup Champions Ian Cole and Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh), Anders Bjork (Boston), Stephen Johns (Dallas), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Kyle Palmieri (New Jersey) and Riley Sheahan (Detroit).
- Bjork, who has skated with Boston's first line during the preseason, is slated to become
 the 17th former Irish player under Jeff Jackson to reach the NHL and the program's 31st
 overall (Boston opens with a home game against Nashville on Thursday, Oct. 5).
- During the 2016–17 season, a program–record 10 former Notre Dame hockey players played in the NHL (nine was the previous high in 2011–12.
- The 2016-17 included several stretches where eight former Irish players were in the league at the same time, marking the first time in program history eight former players were on active NHL rosters at the same time.
- Prior to Bjork, Robbie Russo (Detroit) and T.J. Tynan (Columbus) were the most recent former Irish players to make their NHL debuts when they both did so on March 7, 2017.
- Also last season, Rust became the third former Irish player to record an NHL hat trick, joining Palmieri (1) and Dave Poulin (5).
- With Pittsburgh defeating Nashville to win the 2017 Stanley Cup, Rust and Cole became
 the third and fourth former Irish players to win back-to-back Stanley Cup Championships, joining Bill Nyrop (Montreal '76-'77-'78) and Don Jackson (Edmonton '84-'85).
- Also in 2016-17, Lee totaled 34 goals to set the record by a former Irish player for NHL goals in a season.

NOTRE DAME IN THE 2017 NHL DRAFT

- Freshman defenseman Matt Hellickson was chosen in the seventh round (214th overall) by the New Jersey Devils in the June 2017 NHL Draft hosted (United Center).
- Future Irish defenseman and NLI signee Nicky Leivermann was also selected in the seventh round (187th overall) of the 2017 Draft by the Colorado Avalanche.
- Leivermann and Hellickson became the 80th and 81st Irish players selected in the NHL

HEAD COACH JEFF JACKSON



- The 2017-18 hockey season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach
 Jeff Jackson's 13th season behind the Irish bench. The highly regarded
 Jackson now has over 30 years of coaching experience.
- Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson era began in 2005 when the University searched for a man who could move the program among the elite hockey schools in the country.
- During his now 13-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams, winning the Central Collegiate Hockey Association's (CCHA) regular-season title twice (2006-07 and 2008-09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (`07, `09 and the final one in 2013)
- Since his arrival at Notre Dame, the Irish skaters have accumulated an overall record of 268–167–52, including eight trips to the NCAA Tournament (2006–09, 2010–11, 2012–14 and 2016–17), three Frozen Four appearances (2008, 2011 and 2017) and one national championship berth (2008).
- The 2017-18 season begins Notre Dame's hockey tenure in the Big Ten Conference. Since the introduction of hockey to the Big Ten, Jackson's Irish hold a 4-7-1 record against members of the conference.
- Between 2006–09, the Irish turned in win totals of 32, 27 and 31 for three
 consecutive seasons of 25 or more wins and three consecutive NCAA tournament appearances, a first in program history.
- Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey - The Compton Family Ice Arena - one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The new venue opened on Oct. 21, 2011.
- The Irish have seen 34 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry
 Draft during Jackson's tenure, including three first round selections. Since
 his arrival on campus, Notre Dame has also seen 21 products from USA
 Hockey's National Team Development Program reach the Irish ranks.
- Jackson has coached six Irish players to All-America honors Anders Bjork (2017) Robbie Russo (2015), Anders Lee (2013), Ian Cole (2009), Erik Condra (2009) and David Brown (2007).
- In addition, 16 of his players have gone on to play in the NHL, including most recently Robbie Russo (Detroit) and T.J. Tynan (Columbus), who each made their NHL debuts on March 7, 2017.
- Jackson's Notre Dame teams have played with poise, discipline, team speed and have also featured strong goaltending and excellent special teams play.
- Having led the Lake Superior State Lakers to an NCAA Division I title in 1992 and 1994, Jackson became the first coach to have won the championship prior to joining Notre Dame's hockey staff.
- As a head coach, Jackson has led teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven conference championships (1991–93, '95, '07, '09 and '13).

- A 1978 graduate of Michigan State University with a degree in communications, Jackson followed with an education degree from Michigan State in 1979.
- In May 2003, Inside College Hockey ranked Jackson 12th on its list of the 16 greatest college coaches of all-time with only five of the 16 still active.
- He made his NHL debut as an assistant coach with the New York Islanders
 during the 2003 season in which they earned a spot in the 2004 Stanley
 Cup playoffs. The following season all games were canceled due to the unresolved 2004-05 NHL lockout, and at the end of the year Jackson left the
 Islanders to join the Fighting Irish as head coach for the 2005-06 season.
- Jackson is a member of the USA Hockey Coaches Achievement Program, the American Hockey Coaches Association and the National Hockey League Coaches Association.
