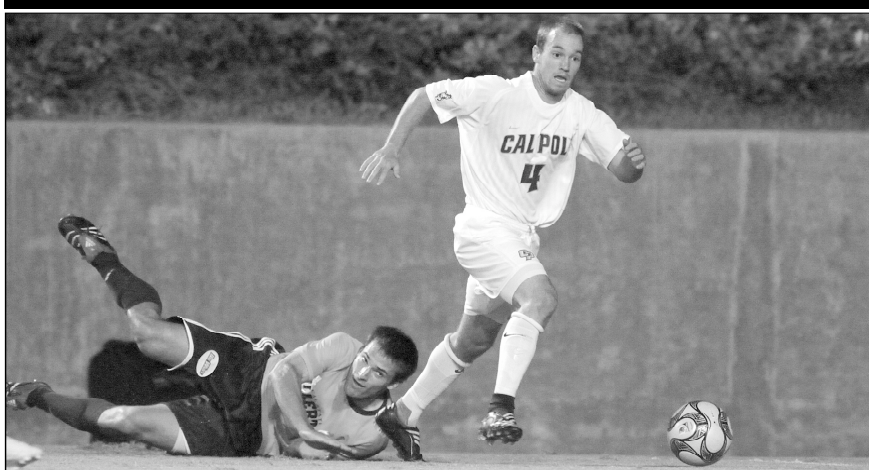

## No. 18 Indiana, Notre Dame Next Up for Cal Poly

**WHAT'S ON TAP:** The Cal Poly men's soccer team completes its season-opening four-match road trip with the Notre Dame-hosted Mike Berticelli Memorial Tournament at Alumni Stadium in South Bend, Ind. The Mustangs (1-1-0) open the competition on Friday, Sept. 10 at 2 p.m. PT versus six-time national champion and No. 18 Indiana (1-1-0) – the first of four opponents Cal Poly is scheduled to face this season that are ranked in the Sept. 7 edition of the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com Top 25 poll. Cal Poly caps the tournament against the host Fighting Irish (0-1-1) on Sept. 12 at 11 a.m. The Mustangs have never faced either Indiana or Notre Dame. No. 22 Drake (1-1-0) completes the Berticelli Tournament field. In determining the tournament champion, three points will be awarded for a victory with one given for a draw. GameTracker will be available for both of Cal Poly's contests via GoPoly.com.

**GASCHING THE OPPOSITION:** Cal Poly's third-leading scorer a season ago, forward **Chris Gaschen** began his sophomore campaign where he left off in 2009 as his 88th-minute goal on Sept. 3 at Denver secured the Mustangs a 1-0 opening-day victory. Gaschen, who led all players during the match in shots (four) and shots on target (three), enters Friday's contest versus No. 18 Indiana ranked eighth among Big West players with 2.50 shots per outing.

**McLAIN A SAFE PAIR OF HANDS:** A year after leading all Big West players in save percentage and saves per match, junior **Patrick McLain** again ranks as, arguably, the conference's most valuable goalkeeper. McLain enters Friday's match versus Indiana leading all Big West goalkeepers in saves (15) and saves per match (7.50) while ranking fourth in save percentage (.882) and fifth in goal-against average (0.96). Ignoring a 65th-minute penalty at Air Force on Sept. 5, McLain has allowed just one goal from open play in 187 minutes, six seconds this season. He is

also one of only three Big West goalkeepers to have registered a shutout in 2010.

**WHITE PLACE, WHITE TIME:** Only a 65th-minute penalty kept Mustang junior **Tim White's** third-career goal from standing as the game-winning strike during Cal Poly's 2-1 loss at Air Force on Sept. 5. During his career at Cal Poly, White – who has started both of Cal Poly's games this year – has made his goals count. His third-minute goal during a 3-0 victory against UC Riverside on Oct. 17, 2009 stood as the match-winning strike. Prior to redshirting in 2008, White rounded off Cal Poly's 3-0 victory against Wright State on Sept. 18, 2007 with a 33rd-minute goal.

**ZAMORA REMAINS IN FINE FORM:** Senior forward **David Zamora** finished as Cal Poly's leading scorer during each of his initial three seasons and though he's failed to find the back of the net in 2010, the Costa Rica native remains one of the Big West's top scoring threats. Just the second three-time All-Big West selection in program history, Zamora enters Friday's clash versus Indiana ranked second among Big West attackers with 4.00 shot attempts per game and third with eight shots. He also assisted on Tim White's 14th-

## MUSTANGS SELECTED THIRD IN BIG WEST COACHES POLL

A year removed from matching program records for Big West victories (six) and highest finish in the conference regular season standings (second), the Cal Poly men's soccer team was designated for a third-place showing in the league table, following the Aug. 18 results of the 2010 preseason coaches poll. Cal Poly recorded 28 total points in the poll to finish 15 votes shy of defending Big West Tournament champion UC Irvine, which garnered one of the available seven first-place votes. Defending regular season champion UC Santa Barbara collected the remaining six first-place votes and 48 total points. The complete results of the coaches poll are below.

### MUSTANG FRESHMEN A PEDIGREED GROUP:

Graded No. 38 among CollegeSoccerNews.com's Top 40 Recruiting Classes of 2010, Cal Poly's six-member freshman class also features three players selected to last year's ESPN RISE All-America high school squads. Highlighting the triumvirate and selected to the elite 12-member All-America first team is midfielder **George Malki** (Scottsdale, Ariz.), a former United States Under-17 Men's National Team player. Selected to the ESPN RISE All-America third team were defenders **Connor Drechsler** (Temecula, Calif.) and **Chris Fisher** (Menlo Park, Calif.). Among the 36 players named to the three ESPN RISE All-America teams, Cal Poly's three selections matched Southern Methodist for the highest total of any Division I program. Cal Poly's freshman class also includes midfielder **Nolan Moore** (New Westminster, B.C.) and forwards **Justin Hill** (Boise, Idaho) and **Ronald Medrano Williams** (San Jose, Costa Rica), one of

24 players invited to train with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team earlier this summer. Additionally, Malki and Williams were each cited among CollegeSoccerNews.com's 100 Freshmen to Keep an Eye On.

### DISCIPLINE MATTERS:

After receiving red cards in the 65th and 90th minutes, respectively, during Cal Poly's Sept. 5 overtime loss at Air Force, both junior midfielder **Evan Richter** and freshman midfielder George Malki will be ineligible for Friday's match versus No. 18 Indiana.

### MASSIVE ATTACK:

Cal Poly has proven to be the Big West side most adept at creating scoring opportunities with the Mustangs leading all conference programs in shot attempts per match (19.00) and ranking second with 8.50 corner kicks per outing. The Mustangs have also been whistled offside a Big West-high eight times.

the central coast. The 1-0 victory at Denver on Sept. 3 ranked as Cal Poly's first victory outside of California since defeating then-No. 23 New Mexico, 2-1, on Sept. 14, 2008.

**GOLDEN GOAL IN NEED OF POLISH:** Since the start of the 2009 campaign, Cal Poly has prevailed in only one of its six matches that have gone to overtime. That decision occurred on Sept. 30, 2009 at Cal State Fullerton, as David Zamora's 95th-minute strike delivered Cal Poly a 1-0 Big West-opening victory. Cal Poly, which bookended its 2009 campaign with overtime defeats, has failed to win its last four overtime matches.

**MUSTANGS FACE NATION'S FINEST IN 2010:** In what has become a hallmark of head coach **Paul Holocher's** five-year tenure, Cal Poly will again face one of the more testing schedules in Division I soccer during the 2010 campaign. Beginning with Friday's clash against No. 18 Indiana, Cal Poly will contest eight total matches this season against programs that qualified for the 2009 NCAA Tournament. Below is a list of Cal Poly's 2010 matches against last year's postseason qualifiers.

**FORTRESS SPANOS:** A 2-1 victory by UC Irvine on Nov. 11, 2009 marked just Cal Poly's fourth loss at Alex G. Spanos Stadium since the venue's 2007 christening. Cal Poly, 21-4-3 at Spanos Stadium through the previous three seasons, has recorded 14 victories via shutout while Mustang goalkeepers have kept 14 clean sheets at home. **MUSTANGS, GAUCHOS RENEW SERIES ON NATIONAL TELEVISION:** For the second time in three seasons, Cal Poly's central coast showdown at Alex G. Spanos Stadium against UC Santa Barbara will be broadcast live on national television. Scheduled for Wednesday, Oct. 27 on Fox Soccer Channel, the match will kick off at 8 p.m. The Mustang program last welcomed Fox Soccer Channel on Oct. 17, 2008 as Cal Poly and UC Santa Barbara battled into double overtime before former Gaucho forward and current D.C. United player Chris Pontius scored to eschew a scoreless draw. That match drew a sellout crowd of 11,075 supporters, a figure that remains the fifth-highest regular season crowd figure in NCAA history. Four of the top-10 regular season crowd figures in NCAA history have occurred in matches between Cal Poly and UC Santa Barbara and all have been set during the previous three seasons. Since the start of the 2007 campaign, 55,336 total spectators and an average of 7,905 fans per match have witnessed Cal Poly and UC Santa Barbara clash on seven occasions. Last season alone, 5,842 supporters filed into UC Santa Barbara's Harder Stadium as the Gauchos edged Cal Poly, 1-0, on Oct. 7. The return leg in San Luis Obispo, a scoreless draw on Nov. 4, drew 9,824 supporters – the seventh-largest regular season crowd figure in NCAA history. Overall, Cal Poly has drawn 1,000-plus spectators during 23 of its previous 28 home matches.

**THE ENGLISH PATIENCE – PETERLIN FLOURISHES OVERSEAS:** On Aug. 7, former Cal Poly midfielder Anton Peterlin became the first Mustang men's soccer program alum to appear in an
