Irish Return To The Road For Series At Nebraska-Omaha

- Notre Dame announces plans for a new on-campus hockey arena.
- Irish power play erupts for 10 goals in 16 chances in sweep of Wildcats.

TAKING THE SHOW ON THE ROAD: Notre Dame takes to the road again this weekend as the Irish travel to Omaha, Neb., for a series with the Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks on Feb. 20-21. Both games will be played at the Omaha Civic Auditorium, the former home of the Mavs, as the Owest Center is hosting the state wrestling tournament. Both games begin at 7:05 p.m. (CT) and 8:05 p.m. in the Michiana area. Friday's game will be televised live by CBS College Sports. This

marks the fourth consecutive Friday night that Notre Dame hockey will be seen on CBSC. The Irish enter the weekend with a 23-5-3 overall record and a 17-4-3-3 mark in the CCHA, good for 40 points. That gives them a four-point lead on second-place Miami and a six-point lead on third-place Michigan with four games to play. The Mavericks are 13-13-7 overall and are 8-11-7-3 in the conference and have 26 points. That puts them in sixth place, one point ahead of seventh-place Ferris State and three behind fifth-place Ohio State. This weekend's games are the final CCHA games for the Mavs. The Irish are ranked second in both the USA Today/ American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/ CBS College Sports hockey polls.

IRISH VERSUS MAVERICKS: Notre Dame and Nebraska-Omaha have met 25 times in the all-time series with the Irish holding a 12-9-4 edge in games played to date. In Omaha, Notre Dame is 6-5-2 and has a 5-2-3 edge in the last 10 games overall. Last season, the two teams met twice at Notre Dame with the Irish taking 5-4 and 5-0 wins at the Joyce Center. The last time Notre Dame won at UNO was on Nov. 24, 2006, a 4-2 win at the Qwest Center. The Irish dropped a 3-2 decision to the Mavericks in the second game of that series the last time they played in Omaha.

CCHA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Notre Dame right wing Erik Condra (Sr., Livonia, Mich.) and junior defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) were selected as the CCHA offensive and defensive players of the

Going into this weekend's series, any combination of five points (Irish wins/ties or Miami losses/ties) will give Notre Dame the regular-season title. Three points will eliminate Michigan from title contention.

NORTHERN MICHIGAN RECAP: Friday, February 13

Offense was the name of the game at the Joyce Center on Friday night as Notre Dame took a 9-5 decision versus Northern Michigan. The Irish jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the first 11:56 of the first period only to see the Wildcats battle back to tie the game by the 5:24 mark of the second stanza. From there, the Irish out scored Northern Michigan by a 5-1 margin with four of the five goals coming on the power play. Erik Condra (Sr., Livonia, Mich.) led the attack with a five-point game, scoring twice and adding three assists. Defenseman Ian Cole (So., Ann Arbor, Mich.) also scored twice and picked up two assists for the first four-point game of his career. Senior center Justin White (Traverse City, Mich.) added two goals, including the game winner at 00:54 of the third period. Eight players had two or more points in the game. Also scoring goals for the Irish were Garrett Regan (Sr., Hastings, Minn.), Ben Ryan (So., Brighton, Mich.) and Calle Ridderwall (So., Stockholm, Sweden). The Irish were 6-for-8 on the power play while Northern was 1-for-4. Notre Dame out shot Ohio State by a 33-22 margin. Jordan Pearce (Sr., Anchorage, Alaska) made 17 saves on the night. Brian Stewart played 11:56 for the Wildcats and made five saves while Derek Janzen played the final 48:04, making 19 saves.

Saturday, February 14

Notre Dame's power play again took care of the Irish offense on Saturday night, scoring four times in eight tries in a 5-2 win over Northern Michigan. Billy Maday (Fr., Burr Ridge, Ill.), Calle Ridderwall, Kyle Lawson (Jr., New Hudson, Mich.) and Ben Ryan each scored power plays by the 3:18 mark of the second period to help the Irish build a 4-0 lead. Ryan's goal was followed by a pair of lamplighters by Northern Michigan's Gregor Hanson to cut the lead to 4-2 at 9:18 of the middle stanza. Garrett Regan scored his second goal of the weekend and seventh of the season for a 5-2 lead at 12:55 of the second period for the game's final goal. On the night, the Irish out shot Northern Michigan by a 33-19 margin. Jordan Pearce made 17 saves in goal for Notre Dame to pick up his 22nd win of the season. Northern Michigan's power play was 0-for-6 in the game.

MR. RELIABLE: Notre Dame's All-American and Hobey Baker candidate - senior goaltender Jordan Pearce - has been a regular in the Notre Dame goal over the last two seasons. Since Jan. 5, 2008, Pearce has appeared in 53 of the last 54 Irish games. Of those 53 games, 52 have been starts. Pearce has now appeared in 28 straight games for the Irish, making 27 starts in that span. The last game he did not start was on Nov. 29 when Tommy O'Brien (Jr., Mokena, Ill.) made his second career start. Pearce came on in relief after 23:15 of action as O'Brien surrendered two goals on eight shots. Pearce has appeared in 30 of Notre Dame's first 31 games this season and is 22-5-2 with a 1.82 goals-against average and a .927 save percentage with four shutouts. Pearce played in all 20 games of Notre Dame's 20-game unbeaten streak, going 17-0-3 with a 1.36 goalsagainst average with a .944 save percentage and three shutouts.

MORE PEARCE: Jordan Pearce's two wins over Northern Michigan, gives him 22 wins on the season and a total of 51 in his career, making him just the third goaltender in the program's 41-year history to win over 50 games or more games in his career. Only **David Brown '07** with 54 and **Lance Madson '90** with 55 have wom more games than Pearce. With his 22 wins this season, Pearce has now won 20 or more games in each of the last two seasons to become the first goaltender in the program's history to win 20 or more games twice in his career.

HOW GOOD IS PEARCE: Going into this weekend's series at Nebraska-Omaha, Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** leads the nation in wins (22), is third in minutes played (1,783:08), is seventh in goals-against average (1.81), 10th in save percentage (.927), 4th in winning percentage (.783) and tied for second in shutouts (4).

TURNING ON THE POWER: Over the last four games, Notre Dame's power play has blasted off. In the four games, the Irish are 14-for-27 (51.9%) when playing with the extra man. On Feb. 6 at Ohio State, they were 3-for-5 and then followed that with a 1-for-6 afternoon on Feb. 8. Last weekend, the Irish were 6-for-12 in Friday's 9-5 win with Northern Michigan and followed that with a 4-for-8 night. For the season, the Irish are 48-for-190 for a 25.3% success rate on the power play. They lead the nation in power-play goals and percentage.



NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: The University of Notre Dame announced on Feb. 12, 2009 that construction on a new, freestanding, oncampus ice arena designed to meet both the needs of the nationally ranked Irish hockey team and the local community would begin next year.

The announcement was made by Notre Dame executive vice-president John Affleck-Graves and athletics director Jack Swarbrick. The construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2010 on a projected 5,000-seat arena - with the venue ready for play to start the 2011-12 season.

The University's Board of Trustees approved the project at its meetings on campus during the first week of February.

"We're thrilled about the plans for a new ice arena on our campus, particularly based on the superb job **Jeff Jackson** and our hockey team have done to position our program as one of the best in the nation," said Swarbrick.

"In addition to providing a first-rate home for our hockey team, this new facility will be made available whenever possible to our community as a whole, and, in particular, to the many area youth hockey and figure skating programs that are in need of an additional venue," Affleck-Graves said.

"This is the most important and missing piece of the puzzle to this hockey program. The new building will create an environment that our fans, the students, the players, and our hockey alumni can be proud of," said Irish coach Jeff Jackson. The new ice arena will be located south of

The new ice arena will be located south of the Joyce Center, just north of Edison Road, and just west of where the new Irish track and field facility is being constructed. In addition to the track and field project, the University currently is in the process of building new stadia for both soccer and lacrosse (both scheduled for completion this year) - in addition to the ongoing Joyce Center arena addition and renovation that began in September 2008.

The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety. The facility will include two sheets of ice (one of them Olympicsized), with limited seating availability for the second sheet.

The plan also will include offices and locker room and weight and cardio training facilities for the Notre Dame hockey program. Locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

The new ice arena will replace the Joyce Center fieldhouse as Notre Dame's home for ice hockey. The Joyce Center was dedicated in December 1968 as the Athletic and Convocation Center. It was renamed in 1987 in honor of **Rev. Edmund P. Joyce, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's executive vice president and chair of the Faculty Board on Athletics from 1952 to 1987.

SIX-PACK: Notre Dame's six power-play goals versus Northern Michigan on Feb. 13 marked the second time this season that the Irish scored six power-play goals in a game. The first time came on Nov. 22 in a 9-1 win at Bowling Green. They were 6-for-12 that night.

A FIVE SPOT: Senior captain Erik Condra recorded the third, five-point game of his career in the 9-5 win over Northern Michigan on Feb. 13. He also had five point games in his sophomore year versus Lake Superior State (2g, 3a) and Robert Morris (1g, 4a). He followed that up with two assists in the 5-2 win on February 14. The seven-point weekend gives him the team lead in scoring with 10 goals and 21 assists for 31 points. For his career, Condra now has 45 goals and 106 assists for 151 career points to move into 14th on the all-time points list as he moved past Tim Kuehl '90 (145), Jeff Logan '82 (146) and Bill Rothstein '82 (147). His 106 assists move him past Jamie Ling '96 into ninth on the all-time assist list, one behind Dave Poulin '82 who recruited him to Notre Dame.

COLE ON A ROLL: Sophomore defenseman Ian Cole picked up the first four-point game of his career, scoring a pair of power-play goals with two assists in the 9-5 win over Northern Michigan. He followed that up with an assist in the 5-2 win on Saturday, Feb. 14. A week ago (Feb. 6) at Ohio State. Cole had a goal and two assists in the 4-3 win over the Buckeyes. Cole has now scored in three of his last four games, getting eight points (3g, 5a). He is tied for the team lead in scoring among defensemen with 21 points on six goals and 15 assists. That ties him for the team lead in scoring among defensemen with Brett Blatchford (Jr., Temperance, Mich.) with 21 points. Cole also leads the team with a + 10.

ON THE SIDELINES: Senior center **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** and junior left wing **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** both missed both games of the Northern Michigan series after being injured on Feb. 6 at Ohio State. Hanson suffered a concussion and is expected to return to the lineup for the Nebraska-Omaha series. Thang suffered a high ankle sprain and is out indefinitely. They join sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, who has been out for the season, on the injured list. Phillips injured his right knee in the preseason and has not played this year. He was 4-1-0 as a freshman with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

SWEDISH POWER: Sophomore left wing **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)** has had a break out season in 2008-09 as he is second on the Irish scoresheet with 14 goals and 15 assists for 29 points. He has proven to be a sniper supreme on the power play as he leads the Irish and the CCHA with 11 power-play goals this season. That ranks him third in the nation in that category. Ridderwall also is tied for the team and CCHA lead with four game-winning goals this year. Both of his goals in the Northern Michigan series came via the power play.

FIRST AND LAST: Senior left wing **Garrett Regan** had two goals and an asssist for three points in the series sweep of Northern Michigan. Regan's first goal came on the power play at 1:21 of the first period to start the weekend's deluge of power-play goals. Regan then scored the final goal of the weekend at 12:55 of the second period. This one came at even strength, one of just four even-strength goals for the Irish on the weekend.

Career

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame brings an 11-2-1 record on the road into the series at Nebraska-Omaha this weekend. The Irish saw their 12-game road unbeaten streak snapped on Feb. 8 in a 4-1 loss at Ohio State. Prior to that, they had not lost on the road since Oct. 11 in the season opener. Notre Dame needs just one more win to equal their all-time best road total of 12 wins. The .821 road winning percentage is the best in the program's history with three road games left to play. Only three Irish teams have won 12 road games in a season at Notre Dame - '06-'07 (12-4-1), '97-'98 (12-11-0) and '79-'80 (12-11-1).

RYAN'S STORY: Sophomore center **Ben Ryan** has gotten the hot hand at the right time this season. In the series against Northern Michigan, Ryan had a pair of multi-point games, scoring a goal and two assists in the 9-5 win and then getting a goal and an assist the following night. After a slow start to the season, Ryan now has 20 points on nine goals and 11 assists. As a freshman last season, he had 10 goals and 16 assists for 26 points.

LAW(SON) AND ORDER: Junior defenseman Kyle Lawson equaled a career high with three assists in Notre Dame's 9-5 win over Northern Michigan. He followed that with the gamewinning goal and an assist the following night to record a five-point weekend. He ranks third on the Notre Dame defense in scoring with three goals and 15 assists for 18 points. The gamewinning goal was the third of his career. The leader and warrior on Notre Dame's defense is second on the team with a +9.

THE PASSMASTER: Junior center Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.) has become the team's top playmaker, dishing out a team and personal best 23 assists this season to go with four goals for 27 points. The speedy center is in the midst of a five-game point and assist streak as he has seven assists for seven points in those games. His 23 assists the him for third in the CCHA in that category. For his career, Deeth has played in 118 games and now has 32 goals and 59 assists for 91 points.

LATEST AND FASTEST: Erik Condra's goal with 1.3 seconds left on Feb. 6 against Ohio State was the latest goal in regulation scored by the Irish to send a game into overtime. That was followed by **Calle Ridderwall's** overtime game winner that was the fastest that a Notre Dame team has ever scored in overtime - 49 seconds. That beat the previous quickest overtime game winner by **Dan Carlson '01** who scored just 52 seconds into overtime on Jan. 21, 2000 to beat Western Michigan, 4-3.

LOOKING FOR A HERO: The 4-3 overtime win against Ohio State was the first overtime win for Notre Dame since April 10, 2008 when the Irish defeated Michigan, 5-4, in the NCAA semifinals. In that game, **Calle Ridderwall** scored the game winner in overtime. On Feb. 6, at Ohio State, Ridderwall was at it again, scoring the game-winning goal in overtime against Ohio State.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team are among the list of 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Named to the list last week are senior forward Erik Condra and goaltender Jordan Pearce. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, senior Mark Van Guilder '08 was one of 10 finalists for the award and in 2007, goaltender David Brown '07 was selected as the first winner of the hockey award.

A CHILL (ING) REUNION: When sophomore Calle Ridderwall and freshman Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, III.) were put on the same line with center Kevin Deeth (Jr., Gig Harbor, Wash.) in the second game of the Miami series (Oct. 25), it marked the first time that Ridderwall and Maday played together at Notre Dame. The two aren't strangers though as they spent the 2005-06 season as linemates with the Chicago Chill Midget AA program, helping the Chill to a second-place finish at the USA Midget AA championships. Maday had 38 goals and 87 assists for 125 points in 74 games with the Chill while Ridderwall had 52 goals and 66 assists for 118 points that season. In 27 games together this season, the duo has combined for 24 goals and and 28 assists with Maday having nine goals and 14 assists for 23 points while Ridderwall has 14 goals and 14 assists for 28 points in those games.

WINNING TEAMS: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame and Michigan have had the winningest hockey programs in the country. Both teams have won 82 games over that period. Michigan is 82-29-5 for a .728 mark while Notre Dame is 82-28-10 for a .725 winning perentage. Miami is third with 75 wins and a .697 winning percentage. The Irish are now 5-5-0 versus ranked teams this season. Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 11 with a 5-2 loss at No. 6 Denver. On the weekend of Oct. 24-25, the Irish lost a pair of games to No. 10 Miami, 2-0 and 3-2. They knocked off No. 2 Boston College, 4-1, on Nov. 7. Last season, Notre Dame faced 15 teams that were ranked when they faced the Irish. They were 5-9-1 in those games.

STREAK RANKINGS: When Notre Dame lost on Jan. 30 to Michigan, it not only snapped an overall 20-game unbeaten streak, but it snapped a 16-game CCHA unbeaten streak (13-0-3). That ties for the seventh-longest conference unbeaten streak in NCAA history and was the third-longest CCHA unbeaten streak in history. The streak trails just Lake Superior State's 28-game conference unbeaten streak (26-0-2) set in 1992-93 and a 17-game conference unbeaten streak (16-0-1) set by Michigan in 1993-94.

STREAK NUMBERS: In Notre Dame's 20game unbeaten streak, the Irish gave up one goal or less in 12 of the 20 games. The Irish only gave up three goals, four times - a 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (11/14), a 3-3 tie with Western Michigan (11/29), a 4-3 win over Bowling Green (12/13) and the 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (1/17). During the streak, the Irish out scored the opposition by a 72-29 margin (3.60 to 1.45).

POWER-PLAY PRODUCERS: Six Notre Dame players currently rank in the top 12 in the CCHA for power-play point production. Left wing **Calle Ridderwall** is tied for second (11-9-20) while center **Kevin Deeth** (3-13-16) is tied for fourth. Freshman right wing **Billy Maday** (6-9-15) is tied for seventh and senior Erik Condra (5-9-14) is tied for ninth. Center **Christian Hanson** (6-7-13) and defenseman **Brett Blatchford** (0-13-13) round out the group as they are tied for 12th.

PENALTY SHOTS: Ryan Thang's successful penalty shot goal in the Jan. 31 game at Michigan was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Oct. 27, 2006 when **Kevin Deeth** was stopped in a game against Army in the Lightning College Hockey Classic. His successful score was the first successful penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Oct. 12, 2001 when **Rob Globke '04** scored on a penalty shot against Union College at the Joyce Center. **HOUSE OF HORRORS:** Notre Dame's win at Yost Arena on Jan. 31 was just the fourth for the Irish since returning to the CCHA in 1992-93. The win improved Notre Dame to 4-21-1 at Yost since the start of the '92-'93 campaign. The Irish have won two of their last three games at Yost since the 2006-07 season.

BIG CROWD: The crowd of 3,007 at the Joyce Center on Jan. 30 was the largest crowd to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago, 5-2. The following year, new seating was installed in the Joyce Center and the building was reconfigured to 2,667. A current sellout crowd at the Joyce Center is 2,713. Ten of Notre Dame's 15 home games this season have had crowds of 2,713 or more.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The Irish were 3-3-0 in the month of October. They followed that with a 7-0-2 record in November and a 4-0-0 mark in December to close out the 2008 portion of the schedule. Notre Dame wrapped up the month of January with a 6-1-1 record and has started February with a 3-1-0 mark.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE MAN ADVANTAGE: Prior to Notre Dame's series with Bowling Green (11/21-22), Notre Dame's power-play was hitting at a 15.6% success rate and ranked fifth in the CCHA and 31st in the nation. Since then, the power-play is 36-for-113 for a 31.9% success rate. On the season, Notre Dame's power play is now 48-for-190 for a 25.3% success rate. That leads the CCHA and the nation.

JOINING THE CENTURY CLUB: Senior right wing Erik Condra recorded the 100th assist of his Notre Dame career on Ryan Thang's thirdperiod goal in the 3-0 win over Alaska on Jan. 10. The assist makes him just the 10th player in the 41-year history of the program to record 100 assists in his career. Condra now has 45 goals and 106 assists for 151 career points.

CLUTCH SCORER: Ryan Thang's gamewinning goal on Jan. 9 against Alaska was his second of the season and his first since Oct. 18 against Sacred Heart. The game winner gives him 13 for his career and moves him into a tie for the top spot on Notre Dame's all-time gamewinning goal list. Thang is now tied with **Rob Globke '04, Brian Urick '99** and **Dave Poulin '82** - as all four players now have 13 game winners to their credit.

PRACTICE ON THE POND: Notre Dame took its Friday practice (Jan. 23) outdoors to a local rink - Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind. - as the players got the chance to play a little shinny. Over 250 kids and adults attended the event that was complete with temperatures in the low teens, stocking caps, hot chocolate and a great deal of laughter. The kids in attendance got a chance to meet the Notre Dame players while they scrimmaged and afterwards with an autograph session. This is the second time the Irish have done this, doing it prior to their series with Bowling Green last January.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: With the two shutouts versus Alaska, **Jordan Pearce** now has four shutouts this season and eight for his career. The seven career shutouts move Pearce into second on the all-time list. **David Brown '07** holds the Irish record with 12 during his Irish career.

BACK-TO-BACK BLANKINGS: The Irish recorded back-to-back shutouts at the Joyce Center on Jan. 9-10 versus Alaska by 2-0 and 3-0 scores. Senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was between the pipes for both blankings. That marks the second time this season that the Irish have had back-to-back shutouts. In October, Notre Dame shut out Sacred Heart, 3-0 and 7-0, on Oct. 17-18. The last time the Irish had back-to-back shutouts in CCHA play came on March 15-16, 2003, when **Morgan Cey '05** blanked Miami, 1-0 and 5-0, in games two and three of the CCHA playoffs. The Irish have never had back-to-back shutout wins in a CCHA regular-season series before last weekend.

NOTRE DAME AT NO. 1: Note Dame saw its run at the top of the national polls stopped after seven consecutive weeks (Dec. 1 through Jan. 26) as the Irish are now No. 2 in the nation in the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and third in the USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls this week. The seven-week run marked the third time in the program's history that the Irish were No. 1 in the nation and tied for the longest streak of consecutive weeks there with their seven-week run at the end of 2006-07.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked fourth in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO. com/CBS College Sports polls. The Irish finished the 2007-08 campaign ranked third in the USA Today poll and 12th in the USCHO.com polls. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 54 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers. During the '06-'07

season, Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. This season, the Irish were No. 1 from Dec. 1 to Feb. 1, a span covering seven weeks. The third time that Notre Dame was No. 1 came for one week in the 1976-77 season.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT: Senior right wing Erik Condra recorded his second shorthanded goal this season in the 3-3 overtime tie/ shootout win for the Irish. The goal was the sixth shortie of Condra's career and moved him into fourth on Notre Dame's all-time short-handed goals list. He is one behind the leaders - Dave Bankoske ('93), Mike McNeill ('88) and Kevin Humphreys ('81) who had seven in their Irish careers.

WELCOME BACK: Sophomore defensemen Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) returned to the Notre Dame lineup for the Alaska series after missing both games of the Shillelagh Tournament while playing for the U.S. Junior National Team in the World Junior Championships from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5. The duo helped the U.S. to a fifth-place finish. Cole, playing in his second tournament had two goals and two assists in his six games while Ruth had no points with 25 penalty minutes in his first appearance. The duo are among 12 Notre Dame players all-time to play for the U.S. in the World Junior Championships. They join fellow defenseman Kyle Lawson as current Irish players to have played in the tournament during their careers.

IRISH TOURNEY HISTORY: For Notre Dame, the Shillelagh Tournament was the 31st inseason tournament that the Irish have participated in. The two wins give Notre Dame an all-time mark of 25-34-3 in those tournaments. The Irish now have finished first (seven times), second (six times), third (seven times) and fourth (11 times) in those tournaments.

TOURNAMENT HONORS: Notre Dame collected its first Shillelagh Tournament title on Jan. 2-3 at the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The Irish defeated Union College, 3-1 in the first game and then knocked off Minnesota-Duluth, 3-1, in the title game. Notre Dame placed four players on the Shillelagh Tournament all-tournament team. Selected to the team were: junior defenseman Kyle Lawson, forwards Ben Ryan and Garrett Regan and goaltender Jordan Pearce, who also was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Lawson anchored an Irish defense that limited Union and Minnesota-Duluth to 41 shots in the tournament while playing over 30 minutes per game. Ryan had a goal and an assist, getting the game winner in the win over Union. Regan scored two goals in the title game, including the game winner versus Minnesota-Duluth. Pearce surrendered just two goals (one even-strength goal) on 41 shots (.951 sv%) and picked up two wins in the tournament. Also selected to the all-tournament team were Minnesota-Duluth defenseman Erik Oberg and forward Justin Fontaine.

THREE IN A ROW: With the win in the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, the Irish have now won one in-season hockey tournament in each of the last three seasons. In 2006-07, the Irish won the Lightning College Hockey Tournament in Tampa, Fla. In 2007-08, Notre Dame was the winner of the Rensselaer Holiday Hockey Tournament in Troy, N.Y. and this season, the Irish got the win in the Shillelagh Tournament.

TAKE ME OUT TO THE HOCKEY GAME: As part of the first-ever Shillelagh Tournament, all four tournament teams attended the NHL's Winter Classic at Wrigley Field on Jan. 1. Notre Dame got to see former Irish defenseman **Brett Lebda '04** score a goal for Detroit in the Red Wings' victory.

PICK SIX: Notre Dame had one of the best power-play performances in program history on Nov. 22 at Bowling Green when the Irish went 6-for-12 on the night with the man advantage. Prior to that, the last time Notre Dame scored six power-play goals in a game was Oct. 21, 1994 when the Irish had six ppg's in an 8-4 win over Waterloo at the Joyce Center. The last time the Irish had 12 power-play chances in a game was on Oct. 8, 2004 at home against Minnesota-Duluth. The Irish were 1-for-12 on the power play in that game.

FIRST POINT: Freshman center Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.) picked up his first collegiate point in the 1-0 win over Ferris State. Gaul started the game-winning play as he moved the puck through the neutral zone to defenseman Ian Cole who set up Dan Kissel's game winner. Gaul has played in 11 games this season for the Irish. LETTERS OF INTENT: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that five players have signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2009: The list includes two defensemen and three forwards. Joining the Irish for next season are: Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.), Cam Fowler (Farmington Hills, Mich.), Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.), Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, Ñ.J.) and Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.). Calabrese, Fowler and Palmieri all play for the USA Under-18 team while Larson plays for Waterloo in the USHL and Sheahan is a member of the St. Catharines Falcons organization in the Greater Ontario Junior Hockey League. Calabrese and Palmieri are eligible for the 2009 NHL Entry Draft next June while Fowler and Sheahan can't be drafted until the June of 2010 draft. Larson was selected in the fourth round of last year's draft by the Calgary Flames.

NINE LIVES: The nine-goal output by the Irish in the 9-1 win at Bowling Green on Nov. 22 marked the first time that Notre Dame had scored nine goals in a game since Nov. 10, 2005 when they scored nine versus Bowling Green in a 9-4 victory.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's 4-1 win at Boston College's Kelley Rink on Nov. 7 was the third consecutive win for the Irish on BC's home ice. In 2003-04, the Irish handed the then-No.1 Eagles a 1-0 loss. Two years ago (2006-07), Notre Dame downed the top-ranked Eagles, 7-1 and this year, they handed the second-ranked Eagles the 4-1 loss. In the last three wins at Kelley Rink, Notre Dame has outscored Boston College, 12-2. In the last six meetings between the two schools, the Irish are 4-1-1 against the Eagles.

FIRST TIMERS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Northern Michigan (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) marked the first time that the Irish have ever won a twogame series in Marquette, Mich., since the teams began playing during the 1981-82 season. Last weekend's sweep coupled with a 2-1 win on Jan. 5 of last season gives Notre Dame three straight wins at Northern Michigan.

FIRST TIME OUT: Junior goaltender Tom O'Brien became the first Notre Dame goaltender to record a shutout in his first career start when he blanked Sacred Heart, 7-0, making 17 saves in the Oct. 18 contest. The previous earliest shutout was held by Jordan Pearce who recorded a shutout in just his second start in 2005. David Brown '07 had his first shutout in his third game as a freshman in October of 2003.

DOCTOR, DOCTOR: Seniors Erik Condra and Jordan Pearce don't have much in common on the ice as one is known for shooting pucks and the other for stopping them. Off the ice, the senior duo have a great deal in common as they are both pre-med majors at Notre Dame, balancing the books and hockey and doing both rather well. Condra has a double major in psychology and pre-med whil Pearce has his double major in anthropology and pre-med. On the ice, Condra is the team's top returning scorer as he led the Irish with 15 goals and 23 assists for 38 points as a junior. Pearce started 43 games in goal for the Irish, going 23-15-4 with a 2.04 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. He had the best goals against in the CCHA with a 1.80 mark in conference games. The native of Anchorage, Alaska was the team's Most Valuable Player and won the Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award while being selected to the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete team and a second team Academic All-American.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2008-09 season. Joining Condra as alternate captains in '08-'09, are senior center **Christian Hanson** along with junior left wing **Ryan Thang** and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson**. Condra served as an alternate captain in 2007-08 while this is the first season as captains for Hanson, Thang and Lawson.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - senior forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) and sophomore goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) - have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork '83 who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. Bjork took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota. Phillips' uncle, is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak '89, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN HONORS: Goaltender Jordan Pearce was selected as an ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-American during the 2007-08 season. Pearce, with a double major in anthropology/pre-med, was a second team selection on the At-Large team. He owns a 3.816 grade-point average and has made the Dean's List in four of his first six semesters. Pearce became the first Notre Dame hockey player to take Academic All-American honors since Dan Carlson '01 and the fifth player overall. He joins Carlson (third team), Andy Jurkowski '00 (third team), Forrest Karr '99 (second team) and Steve Noble '97 and '98 (first team and second team). Two other Irish players were selected to the all-Region V team in '07-²08 – Mark Van Guilder '08 and Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: Nineteen of 22 athletics programs at the University of Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 90 percent, according to the fourth year of Graduation Success Rate mea-

surements developed by the NCAA and released on Oct. 11. None of the 119 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I) programs in the country had a higher percentage of 100 GSR scores than did Notre Dame with its .863 figure (19 of 22). This marked the third time in the four years of the survey that Notre Dame has ranked number one in percentage of teams with 100 scores. Here are the top 10 in that category (only 10 institutions had 50% or more of their sports registering 100 marks):

NCAA figures showed that all 11 Irish women's programs posted a GSR of 100 percent -- basketball, cross country/track, fencing, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Among Notre Dame's men's sports, baseball, basketball, cross country/track, fencing, lacrosse, soccer, swimming and tennis achieved 100 percent GSR scores. Ice hockey scored 96 percent, football scored 94 percent, and golf was at 90. Overall, that's one more perfect score than a year ago for the Irish programs, after Notre Dame recorded 18 100 percent GSR scores (of 22 sports) in 2007. In 2005, among the 119 NCAA Division I-A football-playing institutions, Notre Dame had the highest percentage of its sports with 100 percent scores, with a .800 figure (16 of 20). The 2006 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .773 (17 of 22), to rank second behind the U.S. Naval Academy. The 2007 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .818 (18 of 22), which again ranked number one.

FAMOUS FATHERS: Two members of the 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team - senior center Christian Hanson and sophomore goaltender Brian Brooke (Eden Prairie, Minn.) - have hockey in their blood as their fathers played at the highest level in the National Hockey League. Hanson's father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of prossional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson is still involved in hockey as he currently serves as the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh. Brooke's father, Bob Brooke, played seven seasons in the NHL between 1984 and 1990 with the New York Rangers, Minnesota North Stars and New Jersey. A 1983 hockey All-American at Yale, Brooke also was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena, located within the Joyce Center is built, the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles** "Lefty" Smith. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, III., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 56 years, Lefty and his wife, Mickey, are parents of seven living children, with 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

HOMETOWNS: The 2008-09 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 14 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces - those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Sophomore Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden during the 2007-08 season.

TRADING PLACES: Sophomore Irish defenseman Teddy Ruth was a second round draft choice of the Washington Capitals in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. The rugged defenseman won't have a chance to play for the Capitals though. At the 2008 NHL trading deadline, Ruth saw his rights traded even up to the Columbus Bluejackets for future Hall of Famer Sergei Fedorov.

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Sophomore defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) was named to the U.S. National Junior team for 2009 and was joined by fellow sophomore Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) who becomes the 12th Notre Dame hockey player to participate in the World Junior Championships. Cole, and Ruth, along with Sean Lorenz (Fr., Littleton, Colo.) were invited to the 2009 Junior National Evaluation Camp this past August as they tried out for a berth on this winter's team that will play in Ottawa, Ontario. Cole and Ruth join Jack Brownschidle (`76-'77, `78-'79), Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98), Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98), Dan Carlson ('98-'99), Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, `00-'01), Brett Henning (`99-'00), David Inman ('99-'00), **Rob Globke** ('00-'01, '01-'02), **Brett** Lebda ('01-'02) and Kyle Lawson ('06-'07) as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have eight players on the 2008-09 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Just one incoming freshman - defenseman Sean Lorenz – was selected in the 2008 draft as he was picked by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. In the previous draft in June of 2007. Notre Dame saw five of its players selected. Leading the way was current sophomore defenseman Ian Cole who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th

pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman Teddy Ruth who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Ryan Thang was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender Brad Phillips rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. They join senior right wing Erik Condra who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and junior defenseman Kyle Lawson who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

USA...USA: Notre Dame will have seven players on the 2008-09 roster who have cut their teeth with the U.S. National Team Developmental Program. The list includes: senior Jordan Pearce, junior Kyle Lawson, sophomores Ian Cole, Teddy Ruth and Brad Phillips and newcomers Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and Sean Lorenz.
