Notes

This Week:

- The Lakers are playing their first Central Collegiate Hockey Association games of 2010-11 at Notre Dame. On the road against the Fighting Irish, LSSU is 16-11-6. UND leads the all-time record 25-23-7. UND and LSSU are playing the only CCHA series of the weekend.
- Last season at home against UND, LSSU lost 6-1 and tied 1-1 with a shootout victory. The only returning point grabber, for the Lakers from the 2009-10 series is sophomore defenseman Zach Trotman. Trotman scored the only Laker goal in the 1-1 tie. Sophomore forward Domenic Monardo was the only skater to net a goal during the shootout.
- Notre Dame is returning four out of its five goal scores from last season's series. UND's Calle Ridderwall netted a hat trick during the 6-1 victory over LSSU. Ridderwall is scoreless so far in 2010-11.
- Senior forward Rick Schofield (2-3--5) leads LSSU in points with five. Sophomore forwards Monardo (1-3--4) and Nick McParland (0-3--3) rank second and third for the Lakers.
- The last time LSSU defeated Notre Dame was Dec. 17, 2005, in South Bend, Ind. The Lakers won that game, 4-0, but are 0-9-3 since then.
- The Lakers' record during the first half of the 2009-10 season was 10-7-3-1 overall and 7-6-1-1 CCHA. The Lakers were 5-11-2 overall and 3-9-2 in the CCHA during the second half.

Last Weekend:

- The Lakers finished the Superior Cup Showcase 0-1-1 and are now 1-4-3 during the all-time series, which has spanned four seasons. LSSU tied with No. 8 Minnesota-Duluth, 6-6, and lost to Michigan Tech, 6-2, in Taffy Abel Arena. Seven LSSU players ended the showcase with two or more points.
- Freshman goaltender Kevin Kapalka made his collegiate debut Saturday and gave up six goals on 25 shots faced. Rookie defenseman Andrew Perreault recorded his first collegiate point with an assists against the Huskies.
- LSSU was 4-for-10 on the power play for the weekend.

Lake Superior State coach Jim Roque



Jim Roque stormed onto the head coaching scene in 2005-06 by leading LSSU to its first winning season in six years and to its first home-ice berth in the CCHA Playoffs since 1999-00. During his second season, the Lakers finished 21-19-3 and reached the CCHA semifinals at Joe Louis Arena for the first time since 1995-96.

The Lakers are 72-91-30 during Roque's five-year tenure, including 15-18-5 in 2009-10. Last year's team had its share of wire-to-wire thrillers and finished 8-6 in one-goal games, making a vast improvement from the 1-12 record in 2008-09. The 2010-11 squad has 10 newcomers, but returns four of its top five scorers.

Roque became the ninth coach in the 42-year history of Laker hockey when he replaced Frank Anzalone in June of 2005. He is the second former Laker player to take the helm of the LSSU program.

Roque's most-recent of three LSSU assistant coaching stints ran from 2001-02 through 2004-05. Previously, he was an assistant coach for the Lakers from 1988-91 and also in 1994-95. After six seasons as an assistant at Clarkson University, he returned to LSSU again in 2001. Roque also coached in the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League from 1991-93.

After graduating from LSSU in 1987 with a bachelor's degree

in management, the Killarney, Ont., native started his coaching career as an assistant under Anzalone and stayed on to work with former coach Jeff Jackson. This is his 11th overall season as a coach at LSSU.

Roque played for the Lakers from 1983-87 and totaled 56 goals and 144 career points, which ranks 19th on the Lakers' career points list. Roque was a part of the first recruited class brought in by Anzalone and was also a member of the first Laker squad to advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1985.

The only other former Laker who went on to become the program's head coach was Rick Comley, who is now the head coach of the Michigan State Spartans. He coached at LSSU from 1973-76.

Roque was on the LSSU coaching staff when it won the 1988 NCAA Championship, and he recruited the majority of the 1992 title team. He has played a role in all five NCAA Tournament appearances and was part of two CCHA playoff titles and two regular-season titles.

At Clarkson, he coached two Hobey Baker finalists and four National Hockey League players (Todd White, Erik Cole, Chris Clark and Willie Mitchell). He was also a part of three Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) regular-season titles, four NCAA Tournament berths and one playoff championship.

He and his wife, Julia, have two children—Emma (15) and Abby (13).
