Notre Dame (18-5, 8-0) vs. Providence (2-23, 0-7) Oct. 31, 4 p.m., Joyce Center Notre Dame vs. Boston College Nov. 2, 1 p.m., Joyce Center

Notre Dame returns home for BIG EAST action this weekend: Fans hoping to catch the 18-5 University of Notre Dame volleyball team are running out of chances for the 2002 season. The Irish are ready to host their final home stand this weekend, taking on 2-23 Providence and 12-13 Boston College. Notre Dame is currently in first place in the league standing with an 8-0 record, while Providence is 14th with an 0-7 record and Boston College is 11th with an 2-5 mark.

The Irish are fresh off a 3-1 victory (18-30, 30-19, 30-22, 30-28) at Illinois State on Tuesday, Oct. 29. Boston College will face Syracuse on Friday, Nov. 1, before making the trip to Notre Dame to take on the Irish.

Former Bethel College (Ind.) head volleyball coach Loren Oake will serve as the color commentator for the Boston College match on Sunday.

All audio features on the Notre Dame website are available with the "Fighting Irish Pass" – which includes the Irish volleyball matches. Simply click on the 'listen' link under the volleyball match on the www.und.com front page for more information.

Follow all Irish home matches via live statistics on the official athletic web site: The University of Notre Dame official web site, www.und.com, will provide live statistics for all Irish **HOME** volleyball matches this season.

The link, <u>http://und.ocsn.com/livestats/w-volley</u>, will be available as soon as the matches start in the Joyce Center. Be advised, however, that the statistics displayed are not official until the match is over.

Notre Dame continues to lead the nation in block average: Even though Notre Dame did not post double-digit blocks in all its matches last week, the Irish maintained their spot atop the nation in team block average. Notre Dame's 3.79 block average (as of Oct. 28) leads the nation and is .06 ahead of Stanford in second place.

The Irish moved into first in the country in block average with 22 team blocks against St. John's on Sept. 29 and have not looked back. After a subpar blocking performance at Illinois State (eight total team blocks) on Tuesday, the Irish are currently averaging 3.70 blocks per game.

<u>Conference winning streak will be put on the line again against Provi-</u> <u>dence Friday:</u> The Irish are looking to extend their conference win streaks this weekend. Notre Dame has not lost a regular-season BIG EAST Conference match since a loss at West Virginia on Nov. 15, 1998, a streak of 40 consecutive regular-season wins.

During the regular-season streak, the Irish have lost just one match to a BIG EAST foe, in the 1999 conference championship to Georgetown. Dating back to that setback vs. the Hoyas, Notre Dame has won 33 straight matches against league opponents (including BIG EAST Championship play).

Perhaps the most impressive streak the Irish have compiled is their home

court win streak against conference opponents. Since Notre Dame began BIG EAST play in 1995, they have not lost to a BIG EAST team on the Joyce Center floor. That winning streak stands at 47.

Notre Dame also has won 33 consecutive matches at home.

Lauren Brewster nabs first BIG EAST Rookie of the Week award: Freshman middle blocker Lauren Brewster, ranked fourth in the nation in blocking as of Oct. 28, turned in another dominating performance at the net last week and earned the first BIG EAST weekly award of her career.

The Brentwood, Tenn., native averaged an eye-popping 2.14 blocks per game last week - including five at #2 Hawaii, 10 against Pittsburgh and 10 once again vs. West Virginia. Brewster ended up with 30 total blocks last week, adding 27 kills and four aces.

Brewster also is approaching the freshman record for blocks in a season (see: Brewster enjoying top rookie season note on p. 5 of this notes package.)

Brewster moves up to fourth in the nation in block average: An exceptional week of defense at the net, which enabled Lauren Brewster to earn the BIG EAST rookie of the week award on Oct. 28, also moved the middle blocker up the national rankings in block average. Brewster was 12th as of Oct. 21, but her output during last week's four matches moved her average to 1.64, which is fourth in the country. Brewster is behind Montana State's Ana Schanze (1.72), Nebraska's Amber Holmquist (1.90) and Arkansas-Little Rock's Ivana Kuzmic (2.08).

Lauren Kelbley enjoys a top performance at Illinois State on Tuesday: Freshman middle blocker Lauren Kelbley stepped up to lead the Irish offense on Tuesday at Illinois State. The Bascom, Ohio, native chalked up 15 kills on .462 hitting, while also leading the team with five blocks.

"Lauren has been steadily improving all season," Irish head coach Debbie Brown said in the post-match press conference.

"She is beginning to evolve into one of our top options on offense this season."

Kelbley is currently third on the team in kills (191) and has raised her hitting percentage to .312.

Jessica Kinder stepping forward: Junior outside hitter Jessica Kinder is well on her way to establishing career-highs for kills, blocks and aces in a season, but the Fresno, Calif., native has stepped her game up even further lately.

Irish earn academic award: The University of Notre Dame volleyball team was one of 47 Division I programs honored with the American Volleyball Coaches Associaton/Molten Team Academic Award for the 2001-02 season. The award honors college and high school teams that displayed excellence in the classroom by maintaining at least a 3.30 cumulative team gradepoint average on a 4.00 scale (or 4.10 on 5.0 scale) during the school year.

The Irish finished the 2001-02 school year with a 3.33 team grade-point average and were one of the 27 Division I teams honored by the AVCA to compete in the 2001 NCAA Tournament. Fellow BIG EAST Conference member Syracuse also was in the Division I list.

The AVCA/Molten award was distributed to a record 177 volleyball programs this year. The college ranks produced 120 schools (47 Division I, 20 Division II, 32 Division III, 12 NAIA and nine junior/community colleges). A total of 57 high school programs earned the distinction.

In Notre Dame's last five matches (two at Hawai'i, vs. Pittsburgh, vs. West Virginia, at Illinois State) Jessica Kinder has led the team in kills (3.00 per game - 18 games) and aces (12) while adding 46 digs (2.56 per game) and 12 blocks (0.67).

One of the most versatile players on the team, Jessica Kinder has six doubledoubles this season (including a 12-kill, 16-dig effort at Illinois State on Tuesday) and possesses possibly the best weapon on the team. Her jump serve has given the Irish 40 aces this season and continues to keep the other team's offense off-balance when she is at the serving line.

Notre Dame vs. Providence series notes: The Irish and Friars will be meeting for the eighth time ... Notre Dame leads the all-time series 7-0 ... the Irish swept the Friars in three games last season (30-25, 30-22, 30-22) ... Kim Fletcher had seven kills and five blocks in two games of action ... Katie Neff registered four kills for the Irish ... Ayana Cadres had 10 kills and eight digs for Providence ... Notre Dame is 3-0 against Providence in the Joyce Center ... Cadres is leading the Friar offense this season with 313 kills and 41 blocks ... Providence enters Friday's match with a 12-match losing streak.

Notre Dame vs. Boston College series notes: The Irish and the Eagles will be meeting for the ninth time ... Notre Dame leads the all-time series 8-0 ... seven of the eight Irish victories have come in three games ... the 2001 meeting ended up as a three-game win for Notre Dame (30-23, 30-17, 31-29) ... Kristen Kinder recorded five kills, 36 assists and eight digs in the match ... Jessica Brizzolara posted 28 assists and seven digs for BC ... Notre Dame is 4-0 against Boston College in the Joyce Center ... the Eagles feature several offensive threats, including Rachel Bach (361 kills, .284 hitting), Kim Carlson (137 kills), Katie Andersen (296 kills) and Liz Aron (237 kills) ... Jessica Brizzolara returns to run the Eagle offense at setter, averaging 11.79 assists per game.

Notre Dame ranked first in the Northeast Region: While the Irish have not yet broken back into the USA Today/AVCA top 25 rankings after placing 25th in the preseason poll this year, Notre Dame is ranked first in the Northeast Region, according to the NCAA Division I women's volleyball committee.

The rankings were released on Oct. 22, and Notre Dame led the way with a 15-3 overall record and 6-0 mark in the BIG EAST. The regional rankings are a key consideration when the NCAA Division I women's volleyball tournament pairings are announced. The winner of the BIG EAST Conference Championship will receive and automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

Notre Dame has already knocked off #7 Georgetown and #6 Pittsburgh this season. The Irish have yet to face #2 Miami and #10 Virginia Tech.

Notre Dame in the BIG EAST statistical rankings: As a team, the Irish are second in league hitting percentage (.260), first in blocks (3.79 - a whole 1.08 ahead of Pittsburgh in second place), fourth in assists (13.65) and third in kills (15.32).

As individuals, Lauren Brewster, who is ranked fourth in the country in blocks per game, leads the conference with a 1.64 average. Lauren Kelbley is

eighth in the conference with a 1.11 average, followed by teammate Emily Loomis in ninth place (1.07). Jessica Kinder is second in the conference in aces (0.51).

Irish set a new standard for consecutive home victories in memorable fashion: Notre Dame's victory over #10 Pepperdine extended the Irish home court winning streak to 28 matches. Notre Dame has moved that total to 33 with five victories since their upset of the Waves. The 33-match streak is the longest in school history, eclipsing the previous mark of 27 matches from Sept. 9, 1993 through Sept. 2, 1995.

The Irish have not lost in the Joyce Center since a three-game setback to #7 Colorado State on Sept. 23, 2000.

During the Irish winning streak at home, they have dropped just 11 games while winning 23 matches 3-0. Notre Dame also has won four tournament titles during the streak, including the 2000 BIG EAST Championship, the 2001 and 2002 Shamrock Invitational titles and the 2002 Golden Dome Invitational.

Irish attendance starting to increase along with their home-court win-**<u>ning streak:</u>** The University of Notre Dame volleyball team has cracked the top 30 in team attendance this season. In the latest release of NCAA attendance figures (compiled by Diane Nordstrom at Wisconsin) Notre Dame is 30th in the nation, averaging 862 per date (11 matches total).

Irish set school records during classic victory over #10 Pepperdine: The victory over the visiting Waves on Saturday, Sept. 14, was more than just Notre Dame's first victory over a top-10 opponent since 1995. The win stretched the Irish home court winning streak to a record 28 matches and provided Notre Dame its second home tournament title of the season (combined with the Shamrock Invitational).

The match against the Waves also set two team records. The 30-32, 30-24, 29-31, 30-25 and 15-10 game scores matched the team record for points in a match (134) from Notre Dame's five-game victory over Illinois State in 2001. The Notre Dame - Pepperdine match also is the longest in the Joyce Center under the new rally scoring rules, as the match ended two hours, 28 minutes after it began (surpassing the Illinois State match by six minutes).

Another team record was set earlier in the tournament, when Notre Dame defeated Loyola College 30-16, 30-16 and 30-14 to win by 44 points, the largest winning margin for the Irish under the new rally scoring method.

Notre Dame utilizing its front row strength to dominate at the net: The 2001 Irish team posted a 3.42 blocks-per-game average, second to just the '85 (3.51) and '88 (3.57) teams.

Entering this weekend's matches, the Irish are averaging 3.70 blocks per vance.
