2015 Tournament in Review

Notre Dame and Saint Mary's duelled to the end and ultimately finished as the co-champions of the 2015 Fighting Irish Golf Classic at the Warren Golf Course.

While Notre Dame came out firing on the front nine, at one point getting to minus-six on the team leaderboard, Saint Mary's (California) responded on the back nine, creating a memorable finish down the stretch for both teams.

The Irish and Gaels each carded two-under-par 850's for the three-round tournament, marking the second lowest team scores in tournament history. Saint Mary's is now a two-time tournament champion after sharing the title with Houston in 2011, while Notre Dame also won for a second time after taking the 2009 crown.

The Warren Golf Course

May 1, 2000, marked the beginning of a new era in the history of Notre Dame golf as the University unveiled the championship-caliber William K. and Natalie O. Warren Golf Course at Notre Dame.

Since its opening, the course has been hailed as one of the best new courses in America by *Golf Digest* and has been featured in *Links Magazine* and *Golf Digest* as a must-play venue. In addition, *Golfweek* has tabbed the Warren Golf Course as one of the nation's top 15 on-campus collegiate layouts.



Through the generous donation of Notre Dame alumnus and Tulsa, Okla., resident Bill Warren ('56), the University features an impressive 18-hole golf course, designed by the Austin, Texas-based architectural firm of Coore and Crenshaw, headed by Bill Coore and PGA Tour veteran (and victorious 1999 U.S. Ryder Cup captain) Ben Crenshaw.

The design of the Warren Golf Course is reminiscent of the classic, "walkable" Irish and American courses built in the late 19th and early 20th century, with short distances between the greens and tees. Winding its way through 250 wooded acres on the northeast edge of the Notre Dame campus, the course incorporates traditional elements of the great golf courses of the early 20th century and — unlike many modern layouts — is built on subtleties rather than special effects.

Distinguishing features include: rectangular tee boxes that provide a classic start to each hole; undulating greens of varying shapes constructed in a push-up style that slopes from back to front; false fronts to greens that allow the golfer to run the ball or fly it to the flag; and strategically-placed bunkers that visually enhance each hole while challenging players to proceed with caution.

The course runs 7,023 yards from the championship tees, 6,743 yards from the back, 6,346 yards from the middle, and 5,302 from the front tees. It includes more than 88 reshaped and enhanced bunkers, scattered among the 18 holes, and water comes into play on six holes. The course has bent grass fairways and fescue grass rough, playing surfaces found at some of today's top facilities.

Two lakes add to the challenge of the course, with one stationed between the third and fourth holes, while another provides a hazard from the tee on No. 17. Water also comes into play with the existing Juday Creek winding through holes 16 and 18, and additional creeks have been added on holes 10 and 18.

The 7,000-square foot clubhouse — designed by Moake-Park Group, Inc., of Fort Wayne, Ind., in a French country style — was completed in June of 1999. The building matches the period of the course architecture (early 20th century), with a classic "clinker" style brick exterior. The design is completed by copper cupolas, dormers and trim, a slate rook and an enclosed porch. Brick fireplaces are located on both sides of the building, which welcomes the University community to venture over for lunch, meetings or shopping.

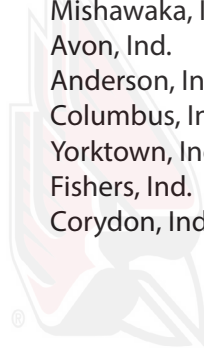

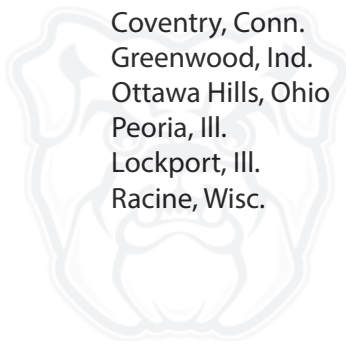

Tournament History

A new tradition began in 2006 when the University of Notre Dame played host to the inaugural Fighting Irish Gridiron Golf Classic at the Warren Golf Course. Created by head coach **Jim Kubinski**, the Gridiron Golf Classic features a fun-filled golf weekend and, given the season, a Fighting Irish football home game the Saturday of the event.

Lamar won the first-ever Fighting Irish Gridiron Golf Classic title in 2006 by carding a three-round total of 860 (+20), finishing 29 strokes clear of tournament runner-up Notre Dame (889, +49). The Cardinals' **Justin Harding** earned medalist honors at 213 (+3), one shot better than Notre Dame's **Cole Isban** and Vanderbilt's **Luke List** (both at 214, +4).

In 2007, Michigan State took the tournament championship at seven-over par 847, easing past Arkansas and defending champion Lamar by 14 strokes. MSU's **Ryan Brehm** was the '07 tournament medalist at 205 (-5), five shots in front of Notre Dame's **Doug Fortner** and Virginia's **Greg Carlin** (both shot even-par 210).

In 2008, Arkansas and Michigan State were tied for the lead heading into the final round. In the end, Arkansas prevailed with an 863 (+23), while UC Davis finished in second with an 867 (+27). Michigan State's **Randy Hutchison** earned medalist honors with a 210 (E). **Andrew Landry** of Arkansas finished in second with a 211 (+1) and he was followed by his teammate **Jamie Marshall** in third, who turned in a 212 (+2).

For the first time of the events existence, the Irish took the podium at their event in 2009, posting a score of 870 (+30). In addition, **Josh Sandman** made it a sweep for the Irish with his mark of 212 (+2) individually.

In 2010, Iowa (853, +13) took home tournament honors, while a pair of San Francisco golfers (**Ji Hwan Park** and **Taylor Travis**) shared medalist honors at 208 (-2).

The 2011 classic saw St. Mary's (CA) and the University of Houston finish as co-champions at +30. **Paul McConnell** of UT-Arlington won individually at Even. Houston's James Ross was second at +1, while ND's Max Scodro finished fourth at +3.

Michigan State became the first repeat winner in tournament history in 2012, firing a three-round score of 869 (+17). UNC Wilmington's **Thomas Bass** was the overall medalist at 211 (-2). Paul McNamara was the top ND finisher in 15th place.

Houston won its second FIGGC crown in 2013, tying the tournament record with a final team score of five-under-par 847 at the Warren Golf Course. Houston's **Kyle Pilgrim** (71-71-66=208, -5) was the event medalist.

Michigan State became a three-time event champion in 2014 as the Spartans topped the field over a challenging weekend of play. Only medalist **McCormick Clouser** of Ball State (-4) and Notre Dame's **Cory Sciupider** (-2) finished the event under par.

For just the second time, the 2015 leaderboard saw a tie at the top, fittingly between universities dedicated to the same person, as Notre Dame and St. Mary's (CA) each finished with an 850. The Gaels' **Jonathan De Los Reyes** claimed medalist honors with a 207, the second-best 54-hole score in the event's history.

Teams for this event are selected based upon two important criteria. Those schools that are among the very best academic institutions in the country are cross-referenced with the top golf programs in America to identify those teams with an elite blend of excellence on the course and in the classroom.
