Top-Ranked Irish Open Second Half With Visit From The Red-Hot Alaska Nanooks

- Irish start the New Year with a tournament win at the Shillelagh Tournament
- Notre Dame takes 3-1 wins from Union and Minnesota-Duluth to win tourney; Jordan Pearce is tourney's Most Outstanding Player
- Erik Condra and Pearce named candidates for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award

SECOND-HALF START UP: Notre Dame returns to CCHA action for the remainder of the 2008-09 season this weekend when the Irish play host to the Alaska Nanooks at the Joyce Center on Jan. 9-10. Friday's game has a 7:35 p.m. starting time while Saturday's game will drop the puck at 7:05 p.m. The Irish enter the weekend series with a 16-3-2 overall record and sit atop the CCHA with a 10-2-2-2 record, good for 24 points. They start the second half, one point ahead of second-place Miami and three points ahead of third-place Alaska. Notre Dame's final 14 regular-season games are against CCHA opponents. Alaska comes into the weekend with a 10-6-4 overall record and are 8-5-3-2 in the conference. The Nanooks are in the second week of a two-week trip to Michigan and Indiana. They played at Michigan State last weekend, splitting a series with the Spartans. Alaska remained in Michigan and will arrive in South Bend on Wednesday night. Alaska comes into the weekend ranked 19th in the USCHO.com poll and is receiving votes in the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll. The Nanooks are the first ranked team the Irish have faced since playing at No. 2 Boston College on Nov. 7.

IRISH VERSUS NANOOKS: Notre Dame and Alaska have met 47 times in the all-time series with the Irish holding a 23-20-4 advantage. At the Joyce Center, Notre Dame is 13-8-1 against the Nanooks. Last season, the teams met twice in Fairbanks with Notre Dame taking a 2-1 win in the series opener and then getting a 1-1 tie in the second game of the series. The last time Alaska won at the Joyce Center came on March 4, 2006, a 1-0 win in game two of the first round of the CCHA playoffs. Since then, Notre Dame is 7-0-1 against the Nanooks, going 4-0-0 at the Joyce Center and 3-0-1 at the Carlson Center in Fairbanks.

RECORD STREAK: With two wins in last weekend's Shillelagh Tournament, Notre Dame extended its unbeaten streak to a school-record 16 games (14-0-2). The streak broke the previous mark of 15 straight (15-0-0) that was set between Nov. 4, 1983 and Jan. 21, 1985. The Irish also are in the midst of a six-game winning streak since Nov. 29. Notre Dame has not been on the losing end of the score since falling to Miami, 3-2, on Oct. 25.

SHILLELAGH RECAP: Notre Dame hosted the first-ever Shillelagh Tournament at the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill., on Jan. 2-3. Joining Notre Dame in the tournament were Union College, UMass-Lowell and Minnesota-Duluth.

Friday, Jan. 2 - In the opening game of the tournament, Minnesota-Duluth handed UMass-Lowell a 2-1 loss to advance to the title game.

Notre Dame faced Union in its first game and, after falling behind, 1-0, ran off three unanswered goals in a 3-1 win. **Ben Ryan (So., Brighton, Mich.)** and **Dan Kissel (Sr., Crestwood, Ill.)** led Notre Dame with a goal and an assist each in the game while **Erik Condra (Sr. Livonia, Mich.)** chipped in pair of assists for a two-point night. Union's Brendan Milnamow started the scoring with a power-play goal at 18:14 of the first period for a 1-0 Dutchmen lead. The Irish answered with a pair of second-period goals to regain the advantage. **Justin White (Sr., Traverse City, Mich.)** picked up his fourth goal of the year at 2:49 of the second to tie the game at 1-1. Ryan scored the eventual game winner at 12:04 with his fifth goal of the campaign. Kissel closed the scoring with a power-play goal at 13:29 of the third for the final mark of 3-1. Goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Sr., Anchorage, Alaska)** stopped 20-of-21 shots in the game for the win.

Saturday, Jan. 3 - Union and UMass-Lowell met in the third-place game on Saturday with the Dutchmen taking a 2-1 victory.

Notre Dame met Minnesota-Duluth in the title game and Irish senior **Garrett Regan (Sr., Hastings, Minn.)** led the way with a pair of goals in the first 14:11 of the game in the 3-1 win. Regan got Notre Dame on the scoreboard at 1:44 of the first period when he converted a feed from **Christiaan Minella (Jr., Aurora, Colo.)**, who had two assists in the game. Minella also set up Regan's second goal of the night at 14:1 that gave the Irish a 2-0 lead and was Regan's fifth of the year. The Bulldogs cut the lead to 2-1 at 18:30 on a goal by Drew Akins and that would be the final goal of the night until the 19:59 mark of the third period. **Ryan Thang (Sr., Edina, Minn.)** scored into an empty net for his sixth of the year and the final of 2-1. Pearce again was stellar in goal, stopping 19-of-20 shots. Both teams were 0-for-6 on the power play.

TOURNAMENT HONORS: Notre Dame placed four players on the Shillelagh Tournament all-tournament team. Selected to the team were: junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)**, forwards **Ben Ryan** and **Garrett Regan** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, who also was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Lawson anchored an Irish defense that limited Union and Minnesota-Duluth to 41 shots in the tournament while playing over 30 minutes per game. Ryan had a goal and an assist, getting the game winner in the win over Union. Regan scored two goals in the title game, including the game winner versus Minnesota-Duluth. Pearce surrendered just two goals (one even-strength goal) on 41 shots (.951 sv%) and picked up two wins in the tournament. Also selected to the all-tournament team were Minnesota-Duluth defenseman Erik Oberg and forward Justin Fontaine.

THREE IN A ROW: With the win in the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, the Irish have now won one in-season hockey tournament in each of the last three seasons. In 2006-07, the Irish won the Lightning College Hockey Tournament in Tampa, Fla. In 2007-08, Notre Dame was the winner of the Rensselaer Holiday Hockey Tournament in Troy, N.Y. and this season, the Irish got the win in the Shillelagh Tournament.

IRISH TOURNEY HISTORY: For Notre Dame, the Shillelagh Tournament was the 31st in-season tournament that the Irish have participated in. The two wins give Notre Dame an all-time mark of 25-34-3 in those tournaments. The Irish now have finished first (seven times), second (six times), third (seven times) and fourth (11 times) in those tournaments.

TAKE ME OUT TO THE HOCKEY GAME: As part of the first-ever Shillelagh Tournament, all four tournament teams attended the NHL's Winter Classic at Wrigley Field on Jan. 1. Notre Dame got to see former Irish defenseman **Brett Lebda '04** score a goal for Detroit in the Red Wings' victory.

BACK IN THE GAME: Two members of the Notre Dame roster missed out on the Shillelagh Tournament as they were away, playing for the United States in the World Junior Championships in Ottawa, Ont. Returning to the Irish lineup this weekend will be sophomore defensemen **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who helped the U.S. to a fifth-place finish at the championships. Cole, playing in his second tournament had two goals and two assists in his six games while Ruth had no points with 25 penalty minutes in his first appearance. The duo are among 12 Notre Dame players all-time to play for the U.S. in the World Junior Championships. They join fellow defenseman **Kyle Lawson** as current Irish players to have played in the tournament during their careers.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team are among a list of 20 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Named to the list last week are senior forward **Erik Condra** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, senior **Mark Van Guilder '08** was one of 10 finalists for the award and in 2007, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award.

ROAD WIN STREAK: Notre Dame's 3-1 win at Bowling Green on Dec. 12, gives the Irish an eight-game road winning streak, the longest road streak in the program's history. Notre Dame's last road loss came in the season-opener at Denver (5-2) on Oct. 11. The previous longest road win streak came between Jan. 7- Feb. 4, 1977. The Irish are 8-1-0 on the road this season.

MR. RELIABLE: Notre Dame's All-American and Hobey Baker candidate - senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** - has been a regular in the Notre Dame goal over the last two seasons. Since Jan. 5, 2008, Pearce has appeared in 43 of the last 44 Irish games. Of those 43 games, 42 have been starts. Pearce has now appeared in 18 straight games for the Irish, making 17 starts in that span. The last game he did not start was on Nov. 29 when **Tommy O'Brien (Jr., Mokena, Ill.)** made his second career start. Pearce came on in relief after 23:15 of action as O'Brien surrendered two goals on eight shots. Pearce has appeared in 20 of Notre Dame's first 21 games this season and is 15-3-2 with a 1.63 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage. In his current 16-game unbeaten streak (14-0-2), Pearce has a 1.40 goals-against average and a .945 save percentage. His 40-save performance against the Lakers on Nov. 14, was the most saves in his career, surpassing the previous high of 34 set on Feb. 17, 2006 versus Bowling Green in a 7-4 win. He stopped 55-of-56 shots in the weekend series at Ferris State, including a 1-0 shutout on Dec. 6. Pearce saw his shutout streak snapped after 138:42 against Bowling Green, the longest of his Notre Dame career.

HERE COMES PEARCE: With wins in both games of the Shillelagh Tournament, **Jordan Pearce** now has 44 career wins at Notre Dame and is fifth on the all-time wins list. He is currently just one behind **Dave Laurion '82**, who has 45 career wins. Here are the top five goaltenders in wins at Notre Dame:

CLOSING IN ON 100: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** needs just one more assist to reach 100 for his Notre Dame career. The 100 assists will move Condra into elite company at Notre Dame as he will become just the 10th player in the program's history with 100 career assists. Condra is currently 19th on the all-time points list with 39 goals and 99 assists for 138 career points. He is tied for third on this year's team with 18 points on four goals and 14 assists.

RED HOT HANSON: Senior center **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** is off to the best start of his collegiate career. Through the first 21 games of the season, Hanson leads the Irish in scoring with 13 goals and 10 assists for 23 points. He also has six power-play goals, one short-handed marker and three game winners. He has equaled his career bests in goals (13) and short-handed goals (1) and now has career highs in assists (10), points (23), power-play goals (6) and game winners (3). The 6-4, 228-pound center has points in eight of his last 12 games (9-8-17).

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: With the shutout at Ferris State (Dec. 6), **Jordan Pearce** now has two shutouts this season and six for his career. The six career shutouts for Pearce tie him for second on the all-time Notre Dame shutout list with **Morgan Cey '05** who had six from 2001 to 2005. **David Brown '07** holds the Irish record with 12 during his Irish career.

A CHILL (ING) REUNION: When **Calle Ridderwall (So., Stockholm, Sweden)** and freshman **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** were put on the same line with center **Kevin Deeth (Jr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** in the second game of the Miami series, it marked the first time that Ridderwall and Maday played together at Notre Dame. The two aren't strangers as they spent the 2005-06 season as linemates with the Chicago Chill Midget AA program, helping the Chill to a second-place finish at the USA Midget AA championships. Maday had 38 goals and 87 assists for 125 points in 74 games with the Chill while Ridderwall had 52 goals and 66 assists for 118 points that season. In 16 games together this season, the duo has combined for 16 goals and 18 assists with Maday having seven goals and seven assists and Ridderwall nine goals and 11 assists for 20 points in those games.

ON THE SIDELINES: The Irish will be without the services of sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** for the entire season. Phillips injured his right knee in the pre-season and will be out of action for the year. He was 4-1-0 as a freshman with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

WINNING TEAMS: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has the winningest hockey program in the nation. Heading into the Shillelagh Tournament this weekend, Notre Dame ranks first in wins (75) and first in winning percentage (.718). Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage (as of Jan. 1).

NICE NOVEMBER: Notre Dame closed out the month of November with a 7-0-2 mark in the nine games played. During the month, the Irish out scored the opposition by a 41-15 margin (4.56 to 1.67). In the two ties, Notre Dame won the CCHA contests with a pair of 2-1 shootout victories. Last season, the Irish were 9-1-0 in the month of November.

BETTER DECEMBER: The Irish finished up the month of December with a 4-0-0 record, out scoring the opposition by an 11-5 margin (2.75 to 1.25). Notre Dame takes an 11-0-2 mark over the last two months into January.

STREAK NUMBERS: In Notre Dame's 16-game unbeaten streak, the Irish have given up one goal or less in 10 of the 16 games. The Irish have only given up three goals twice - a 3-3 tie with Lake Superior and a 4-3 win over Bowling Green. During the streak, the Irish have out scored the opposition by a 61-24 margin (3.81 to 1.50).

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman right wing **Billy Maday** was selected as the CCHA rookie of the month for November. In nine games during the month, Maday had seven goals and four assists for 11 points. Included in his seven goals were five power-play markers. Maday scored points in eight of the nine games and was +4 in the month. He finished the month scoring goals in the last five consecutive games, going 5g, 2a in that span. The freshman is fourth in scoring on the team with nine goals and seven assists for 16 points in his first 18 games.

RED HOT SWEDE: Sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** credits his strong second season to an increase in confidence. The speedy left wing has seen his game take off in recent weeks as he has now scored 17 points (7g, 10a), notching points in seven of his last nine games. His current tear started in a game that he didn't get credited with any points, but got the winning goal for the Irish. On Nov. 14, Notre Dame faced Lake Superior in their first-ever shootout and Ridderwall dazzled the crowd with a great move to score the winning goal for the Irish. He followed that with a career-best three-point game (1g, 2a) in the win over the Lakers the following night. Versus Bowling Green (Nov. 21-22), Ridderwall had a pair of assists in the 5-1 win and then added his first career four-point game (2g, 2a) in the 9-1 win over the Falcons. He didn't wait long to get his second four-point game as he followed the first with another two-goal, two-assist night in the 4-1 win over Western Michigan and then added an assist in the second game versus the Broncos.

For the year, Ridderwall is second in scoring on the Irish roster with nine goals and 12 assists for 21 points, surpassing his freshman totals of five goals and two assists for seven points.

THE PLAYMAKER: With assists in each game of the Shillelagh Tournament, junior defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** now leads the CCHA in assists with 18 and ranks second among all CCHA defensemen with 18 points this season. The smooth-skating defenseman has already exceeded his output of last year when he had 12 assists in 45 games. He leads Notre Dame defensemen in scoring and currently ranks ninth nationally among defensemen in scoring.

MAKING THE MOST OF IT: Center **Ben Ryan** has made the most of the goals he's scored this season. With a goal versus Union, Ryan now has five goals this season. More importantly, three of his five goals have been game-winning goals. The three game winners this season tie him with Christian Hanson for the team lead.

THE NEW KIDS: With **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** off to the World Junior Championships last weekend, head coach Jeff Jackson called on a pair of freshmen defensemen to step into the lineup. **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** and **Nick Condon (Wausau, Wis.)** stepped into the lineup and played well in place of Cole and Ruth. For Ringel, it was his fourth and fifth games this season. He had no shots but was +1 on the weekend. Condon played in his second and third games and also had no shots but was +1 for the weekend.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that five players have signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2009. The list includes two defensemen and three forwards. Joining the Irish for next season are: **Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.)**, **Cam Fowler (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)**, **Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)**. Calabrese, Fowler and Palmieri all play for the USA Under-18 team while Larson plays for Waterloo in the USHL and Sheahan is a member of the St. Catharines Falcons organization in the Greater Ontario Junior Hockey League. Calabrese and Palmieri are eligible for the 2009 NHL Entry Draft next June while Fowler and Sheahan can't be drafted until the June of 2010 draft. Larson was selected in the fourth round of last year's draft by the Calgary Flames.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame picked up its first win of the season against a ranked team when the Irish knocked off No. 2 Boston College, 4-1, on Nov. 7. The Irish are now 1-3-0 versus ranked teams this season. Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 11 with a 5-2 loss at No. 6 Denver. On the weekend of Oct. 24-25, the Irish lost a pair of games to No. 10 Miami, 2-0 and 3-2. Last season, Notre Dame faced 15 teams that were ranked when they faced the Irish. They were 5-9-1 in those games.

MINELLA MAGIC: Junior right wing **Christiaan Minella (Aurora, Colo.)** scored his first career goal, on his first shot in his first collegiate game against Bowling Green on Nov. 11, 2006. It would be 46 games before he would score again, getting the second goal of his career on Oct. 18 of this season against Sacred Heart. The 6-2, 216-pound forward then had a three-game goal-scoring streak between Nov. 14-Nov. 21 with goals in each game of the Lake Superior series and one against Bowling Green. Since November 14, Minella has three goals and six assists for nine points. His four goals and 10 points this season are career highs for Minella and he's done it in just 19 games.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE MAN ADVANTAGE: Prior to Notre Dame's series with Bowling Green (11/21-22), Notre Dame's power-play was hitting at a 15.6% success rate and ranked fifth in the CCHA and 31st in the nation. Since then, the power-play is 19-for-60 for a 31.6% success rate. On the season, Notre Dame's power play is now 31-for-137 for a 22.6% success rate. That leads the CCHA and is third nationally.

POWER-PLAY PRODUCERS: Five Notre Dame players currently rank in the top 10 in the CCHA for power-play point production. Left wing **Calle Ridderwall** is tied for first (7-8-15) with center **Christian Hanson** third (6-7-13). Defenseman **Brett Blatchford** is sixth (0-11-11) and is followed by right wing **Billy Maday** (5-4-9) and center **Kevin Deeth** (2-7-9) who are tied for ninth.

PICK SIX: Notre Dame had one of the best power-play performances in program history on Nov. 22 at Bowling Green when the Irish went 6-for-12 on the night with the man advantage. Prior to that, the last time Notre Dame scored six power-play goals in a game was Oct. 21, 1994 when the Irish had six ppg's in an 8-4 win over Waterloo at the Joyce Center. The last time the Irish had 12 power-play chances in a game was on Oct. 8, 2004 at home against Minnesota-Duluth. The Irish were 1-for-12 on the power play in that game.

FRESHMAN LEADER: Notre Dame rookie **Billy Maday** is sixth on the Irish in scoring with nine goals and seven assists for 16 points in his first 20 games this season. He is tied for tops among freshmen scorers in the CCHA with his 16 points and is tied for 13th on the national level. His nine goals and five power-play goals are second and first respectively among CCHA freshmen while his nine goals tie him for second among freshmen nationally and his five power-play goals tie him for second among the nation's rookies.

WE'RE NO. 1: For just the third time in the 41-year history of the Notre Dame hockey team, the Irish are ranked No. 1 in the nation. Both polls, the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls, have Notre Dame at the top of their lists for the fourth consecutive week. This is the first time since the 2006-07 campaign that Notre Dame has been ranked No. 1. During that year, the Irish were tops in the nation for seven consecutive weeks. The first time that Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 was during February of 1977 when the Irish were on top for just one week.

CCHA GOALTENDER OF THE WEEK: **Jordan Pearce** was honored by the CCHA as he was selected as the conference's goaltender of the week for the week ending Dec. 7. Pearce stopped 55-of-56 shots (.982) in the two wins against Ferris State. On Friday, Pearce made 30 saves in a 3-1 win and followed it with a 25-save night in the 1-0 shutout on Saturday. The two wins ran Pearce's personal unbeaten streak to 12 games (10-0-2) since Oct. 25. This marks the second time this season that Pearce was named the CCHA's goaltender of the week.

THE LAST TIME: Notre Dame won by the score of 1-0 prior to the Dec. 6 win at Ferris State came on Feb. 16, 2007, a 1-0 overtime win at Alaska. That win came with **David Brown '07** in goal and clinched the first-ever regular season CCHA championship for the Irish.

ALL GOOD THINGS MUST END: The 1-0 win at Ferris State (Dec. 6) ended three players six-game scoring streaks. From Nov. 15 to Dec. 5, sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** had six goals and 10 assists, senior **Christian Hanson** had six goals and eight assists and freshman **Billy Maday** had five goals and three assists for eight points. All three streaks ended at Ferris State.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked fourth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls. The Irish finished the 2007-08 campaign ranked third in the *USA Today* poll and 12th in the USCHO.com polls. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 48 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers. During the '06-'07 season, Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. Prior to that, the Irish had been No. 1 just one other time, for a week during the 1976-77 season. Week-by-week with the Irish this season:

FIRST POINT: Freshman center **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** picked up his first collegiate point in the 1-0 win over Ferris State. Gaul started the game-winning play as he moved the puck through the neutral zone to defenseman **Ian Cole** who set up **Dan Kissel's** game winner. Gaul has played in eight games this season for the Irish.

NINE LIVES: The nine-goal output by the Irish in the 9-1 win at Bowling Green on Nov. 22 marked the first time that Notre Dame had scored nine goals in a game since Nov. 10, 2005 when they scored nine versus Bowling Green in a 9-4 victory.

GOOD FOR GUENTZEL: **Ryan Guentzel's (Woodbury, Minn.)** third-period goal on November 14 tied the game against Lake Superior State and was the final goal of the game in Notre Dame's 3-3 tie and shootout win against the Lakers. The goal also was the first of the sophomore right wing's collegiate career and snapped a 35-game goal-less drought. Since then, Guentzel has added a goal and three assists to give him two goals and five assists for seven points, career highs in goals, assist and points. As a freshman, he had just four assists on the season.

POWER PLAYS AGAINST: Notre Dame has given up just 12 power-play goals in the first 19 games this season. The 11 goals have actually come in just eight games and the Irish are 4-2-2 in those contests. So far this season, the Irish have given up 12 power-play goals in 115 chances for a 89.8% success rate. Notre Dame has given up those power play goals to: two to Denver on Oct. 11, two to Miami on Oct. 25, two to the Lake

Superior on Nov. 14, one to Bowling Green on Nov. 22, one to Western Michigan, Nov. 29, one to Ferris State, Dec. 5, two to Bowling Green, Dec. 13 and one to Union on Jan. 2.

GOING ON THE OFFENSIVE: Notre Dame's defense has gone on the offensive during the first 19 games of the 2008-09 season. Irish defensemen have scored seven goals and 37 assists this year for 44 of the team's 207 points. **Brett Blatchford** leads the defensemen with 18 points (all assists). He is followed by sophomore **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** with three goals and eight assists for 11 points. Junior **Kyle Lawson** is third with nine points (2g, 7a). Sophomore **Teddy Ruth** has two goals and freshman **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)** has three assists. Senior **Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.)** has one assist on the season.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's 4-1 win at Boston College's Kelley Rink on Nov. 7 was the third consecutive win for the Irish on BC's home ice. In 2003-04, the Irish handed the then-No.1 Eagles a 1-0 loss. Two years ago (2006-07), Notre Dame downed the top-ranked Eagles, 7-1 and this year, they handed the second-ranked Eagles the 4-1 loss. In the last three wins at Kelley Rink, Notre Dame has outscored Boston College, 12-2. In the last six meetings between the two schools, the Irish are 4-1-1 against the Eagles.

FIRST TIMERS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Northern Michigan (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) marked the first time that the Irish have ever won a two-game series in Marquette, Mich., since the teams began playing during the 1981-82 season. Last weekend's sweep coupled with a 2-1 win on Jan. 5 of last season gives Notre Dame three straight wins at Northern Michigan.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: **Erik Condra** is sixth on the team in scoring with four goals and 11 assists for 15 points. That has moved him into 19th on the all-time points list with 135 career points. Condra now has 39 goals and 96 assists for his 135 points. He is 12th on the all-time assists list with 96.

SHORT STUFF: Senior center **Christian Hanson** recorded the second short-handed goal of his career in the 3-1 win at Bowling Green. The Irish now have five short-handed goals this season in the first 19 games. A year ago, the Irish had nine shorties in 47 games.

TWO IN A ROW: The two consecutive losses by Notre Dame to Miami on Oct. 24-25 marked the first time that the Irish have lost two in a row at home since March 3-4, 2006 when they lost both games of their first round, CCHA playoff series to Alaska, 3-1 and 1-0. The last time that Notre Dame was swept at home in a regular-season CCHA series was Nov. 25-26, 2005 when the Irish were swept at the Joyce Center by Ohio State, 4-1 and 5-2.

FIRST TIME OUT: Junior goaltender **Tom O'Brien** became the first Notre Dame goaltender to record a shutout in his first career start when he blanked Sacred Heart, 7-0, making 17 saves in the Oct. 18 contest. The previous earliest shutout was held by **Jordan Pearce** who recorded a shutout in just his second start in 2005. **David Brown '07** had his first shutout in his third game as a freshman in October of 2003.

KNOCKING OFF NO. 1: Notre Dame played five games during the 2008-09 season versus teams ranked No. 1 in the nation. On Nov. 9-10, the Irish faced top-ranked Miami in Oxford, Ohio, splitting a weekend series with the RedHawks. In January (18-19), the Irish dropped two games to No. 1 Michigan, losing at Yost Arena and also at the Palace of Auburn Hills. Notre Dame met the top-ranked Wolverines a third time on Apr. 10 at the Frozen Four in Denver, Colo., and knocked off Michigan, 5-4 in overtime to advance to the national championship game. CLUTCH SCORER: **Ryan Thang's** game-winning goal in the Oct. 18 win over Sacred Heart gives him 12 for his career and moves him into a tie for fourth on the all-time list with **David Bankoske '93**. He is one off the school record of 13 for his career. Three people - **Rob Globke '04**, **Brian Urick '99** and **Dave Poulin '82** - hold that mark.

THEY HAVE OUR NUMBER: Notre Dame's loss to the University of Denver drops the Irish to just 10-35-3 all-time against the Pioneers. Playing at DU has been a problem for the Irish as they are now 2-22-2 in the all-time series at the Mile High City. The two teams were members of the WCHA from 1971-1981. Since leaving the WCHA following the 1980-81 season, the Irish are just 1-4-1 against Denver and 1-3-0 since **Jeff Jackson** took over as head coach in 2005-06.

FOUR OR MORE: When the University of Denver scored four times in the third period of the 5-2 win on Oct. 11, it marked just the second time since the start of the 2005-06 season that the Irish had given up four goals in one period. The first time came on Nov. 4, 2005 when Notre Dame surrendered four goals in the third period to Michigan in an 8-5 loss. The four-goal period snaps a streak of 120 games where the Irish held opponents to three goals or less in a period. In fact, in those 120 games, the Irish had just five games (over three seasons) where opponents had three goals in one period. Last season the Irish surrendered five or more goals in a game just twice. They gave up five goals just once in 2006-07 and five times in 2005-06.

FOUR FOR US: After giving up four goals in the third period of the season opener at Denver (10/11), the Irish blitzed Sacred Heart for four goals in the second period of the 7-0 shutout on Oct. 18. The four-goal outburst was the first for Notre Dame since doing it on Dec. 8, 2007, getting four goals in the second period of a 7-0 shutout at Princeton. Notre Dame also scored four goals in a period on November 1, 2007 with four in the second versus Lake Superior State in a 7-3 victory.

DOCTOR, DOCTOR: Seniors **Erik Condra** and **Jordan Pearce** don't have much in common on the ice as one is known for shooting pucks and the other for stopping them. Off the ice, the senior duo have a great deal in common as they are both pre-med majors at Notre Dame, balancing the books and hockey and doing both rather well. Condra has a double major in psychology and pre-med while Pearce has his double major in anthropology and pre-med. On the ice, Condra is the team's top returning scorer as he led the Irish with 15 goals and 23 assists for 38 points as a junior. Pearce started 43 games in goal for the Irish, going 23-15-4 with a 2.04 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. He had the best goals against in the CCHA with a 1.80 mark in conference games. The native of Anchorage, Alaska was the team's Most Valuable Player and won the Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award while being selected to the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete team and a second team Academic All-American.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: Nineteen of 22 athletics programs at the University of Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 90 percent, according to the fourth year of Graduation Success Rate measurements developed by the NCAA and released on Oct. 11. None of the 119 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I) programs in the country had a higher percentage of 100 GSR scores than did Notre Dame with its .863 figure (19 of 22). This marked the third time in the four years of the survey that Notre Dame has ranked number one in percentage of teams with 100 scores. Here are the top 10 in that category (only 10 institutions had 50% or more of their sports registering 100 marks):

NCAA figures showed that all 11 Irish women's programs posted a GSR of 100 percent -- basketball, cross country/track, fencing, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Among Notre Dame's men's sports, baseball, basketball, cross country/track, fencing, lacrosse, soccer, swimming and tennis achieved 100 percent GSR scores. Ice hockey scored 96 percent, football scored 94 percent, and golf was at 90. Overall, that's one more perfect score than

a year ago for the Irish programs, after Notre Dame recorded 18 100 percent GSR scores (of 22 sports) in 2007. In 2005, among the 119 NCAA Division I-A football-playing institutions, Notre Dame had the highest percentage of its sports with 100 percent scores, with a .800 figure (16 of 20). The 2006 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .773 (17 of 22), to rank second behind the U.S. Naval Academy. The 2007 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .818 (18 of 22), which again ranked number one.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN HONORS: Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was selected as an *ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA* Academic All-American during the 2007-08 season. Pearce, with a double major in anthropology/pre-med, was a second team selection on the At-Large team. He owns a 3.816 grade-point average and has made the Dean's List in four of his first six semesters. Pearce became the first Notre Dame hockey player to take Academic All-American honors since **Dan Carlson '01** and the fifth player overall. He joins Carlson (third team), **Andy Jurkowski '00** (third team), **Forrest Karr '99** (second team) and **Steve Noble '97** and '98 (first team and second team). Two other Irish players were selected to the all-Region V team in '07-'08 – **Mark Van Guilder '08** and **Erik Condra** (Livonia, Mich.)

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2008-09 season. Joining Condra as alternate captains in '08-'09, are senior center **Christian Hanson** along with junior left wing **Ryan Thang** and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson**. Condra served as an alternate captain in 2007-08 while this is the first season as captains for Hanson, Thang and Lawson.

BACK-TO-BACK: Following the 2007-08 CCHA regular season, goaltender **Jordan Pearce** won the league's top goaltender award based on his 1.80 goals-against average in CCHA games. Pearce followed **David Brown '07**, who had a 1.77 goals-against average to win the 2006-07 award. This marks the fourth time since the 1982-83 season that the same school has won back-to-back goaltending titles with different goaltenders between the pipes. Pearce and Brown are joined on that list by:

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team – senior forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan** (Hastings, Minn.) and sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) – have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork '83** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. Bjork took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota. Phillips' uncle, is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak '89**, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

FAMOUS FATHERS: Two members of the 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team – senior center **Christian Hanson** and sophomore goaltender **Brian Brooke** (Eden Prairie, Minn.) – have hockey in their blood as their fathers played at the highest level in the National Hockey League. Hanson's father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years

of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson is still involved in hockey as he currently serves as the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh. Brooke's father, **Bob Brooke**, played seven seasons in the NHL between 1984 and 1990 with the New York Rangers, Minnesota North Stars and New Jersey. A 1983 hockey All-American at Yale, Brooke also was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team.

MINUTES MAN: Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** entered the 2007-08 season having played in just 12 games and 622 minutes in the first two years of his Irish hockey career. During the '07-'08 campaign, Pearce showed everyone that he could play as he set Notre Dame goaltending marks for games played (43), games started (42) and minutes played (2,557:46). He finished the season ranked second in the nation in minutes played behind Boston College's John Muse who saw action in 2,725:06 minutes for the Eagles.

TRADING PLACES: Sophomore Irish defenseman **Teddy Ruth** was a second round draft choice of the Washington Capitals in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. The rugged defenseman won't have a chance to play for the Capitals though. At the 2008 NHL trading deadline, Ruth saw his rights traded even up to the Columbus Bluejackets for future Hall of Famer Sergei Fedorov.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena, located within the Joyce Center is built, the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing

LEADER OF THE PACK: Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** begins his fourth season behind the Irish bench in 2008-09. In his first three years he has compiled a 72-42-11 (.620) record, highlighted by a 32-7-3 mark in 2006-07 and last season's 27-16-4 record on the way to the first-ever appearance for the Irish in the Frozen Four. The '06-'07 CCHA coach-of-the-year and Spencer Penrose Award winner as the national coach-of-the-year, Jackson enters the '08-'09 season with the best winning percentage among Division I coaches with five or more years. His current overall record stands at 254-94-36 for a .708 success rate. His 254 wins tie him for 17th on the list of active coaches. In six seasons at his previous collegiate stop – Lake Superior State (1990-96) – Jackson's teams were 182-52-25 with two national championships, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA tournament championships. Included in his 254 career wins are 46 postseason victories (46-14 in postseason) and a .767 winning percentage. In nine trips to the CCHA postseason, Jackson's teams are 30-7 (.811). Those totals include a 24-2 mark at Lake Superior and a 6-5 record at Notre Dame. In those nine seasons, Jackson has seen his teams advance to the CCHA finals eight times, winning five tournament championships (four at Lake Superior and one at Notre Dame).

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was named to the U.S. National Junior team for 2009 and was joined by fellow sophomore **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who becomes the 12th Notre Dame hockey player to participate in the World Junior Championships. Cole, and Ruth, along with **Sean Lorenz (Fr., Littleton, Colo.)** were invited to the 2009 Junior National Evaluation Camp this past August as they tried out for a berth on this winter's team that will play in Ottawa, Ontario. Cole and Ruth join **Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77, '78-'79)**, **Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98)**, **Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98)**, **Dan Carlson ('98-'99)**, **Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01)**,
