SEATTLE UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE:

Seattle is a Jesuit Catholic university founded in 1891 and located in the First Hill neighborhood of Seattle, Washington. Seattle has an enrollment of over 7,400.

The Red Hawks are a member of the Western Athletic Conference. They finished the 2015-16 season with a 15-17 record and 7-7 in the WAC. Seattle advanced to the quarterfinals of the College Basketball Invitational last season and have made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances in its program history.

Seattle is 1-1 in 2016-17 and 0-1 in the Legends Classic. The Red Hawks began their season with a 76-65 victory over Pacific Lutheran on Nov. 11, then lost at Colorado 67-55 in their first game of the Legends Classic. Brendan Westendorf leads the Red Hawks in scoring, averaging 19.5 points per game.

NOTRE DAME vs. SEATTLE SERIES HISTORY:

Notre Dame and Seattle will be meeting for the first time.

HOME/SEASON OPENERS:

Notre Dame improved to 17-0 all-time in season openers under head coach Mike Brey (since 2000-01) with all of those games also serving as the team's home opener, with its 89-64 victory over Bryant on Nov. 12, 2016. Notre Dame has outscored its opponents 83.3 - 55.3 in its first game of the season during the Brey era.

Historically, the Irish are 94-18 (.839) in season openers and 101-11 (.902) in home openers.

Among the superlatives posted in season/home openers in the Brey era, Chris Thomas posted the first and only triple-double in school history in 2001 against New Hampshire, scoring 24 points with 11 assists and 11 steals. It also was his first game in an Irish uniform.

Both Thomas' assist and steal totals are the best in a season/home opener in the Brey era, as is Troy Murphy's 31 points in 2000 against Sacred Heart, Thomas' 34 minutes played vs. New Hampshire, Torin Francis' 19 rebounds against Northern Illinois in 2003 and Jordan Cornette's 11 blocks against Belmont in 2002.

2016-17 TEAM CAPTAINS:

Head coach Mike Brey has announced the 2016-17 team captains. Seniors V.J. Beachem and Steve Vasturia, along with junior Bonzie Colson, will lead the Irish through the 16-17 college basketball campaign. All three are first-time captains for the Irish.

NOTRE DAME IN-SEASON TOURNAMENT HISTORY:

Notre Dame started its in-season tournament appearances during the 1948 season, taking part in the Hoosier Classic at Hinkle Fieldhouse in Indianapolis. The Hoosier Classic was made up of Notre Dame, Indiana, Purdue and Butler - a similar layout to the current Crossroads Classic that takes place at BankersLife Fieldhouse in December of each season. The Hoosier Classic, however, featured two games for each team over the course of two days, while the Crossroads Classic is a one-game event.

The 89-64 victory over Bryant on Nov. 12, 2016, was the first of the 2016 Legends Classic tournament for the Irish, a four-game slate of contests that will wrap up with two games in the Barclays Center on Nov. 21 and 22. The Irish have taken part in two previous in-season tournaments that followed this format - the 2009 Chicago Invitational Tournament and the 2013 BlackRock Gotham Classic (in which the Irish also faced Bryant).

Since 1948, Notre Dame has competed in 34 multiple-game tournaments and compiled a 47-35 (.573) record in those events.

NOTRE DAME REACHES 1800-WIN MILESTONE:

Notre Dame's 84-79 victory at Illinois on Dec. 2, 2015 marked the 1800th win in program history. The Fighting Irish are 1820-984 (.648) all-time in 112 seasons.

Notre Dame ranks seventh in Division I in all-time program wins behind Kentucky, Kansas, North Carolina, Duke, Temple and Syracuse (see top 10 wins list, page three of this notes package). The Irish have improved five spots in the all-time wins list since Mike Brey took over the program for the 2000-01 season, surpassing Indiana, Oregon State, Pennsylvania and St. John's.

Notre Dame is the only NCAA program to rank in the top 10 for men's basketball and football victories.

SUCCESS IN THE TAR HEEL STATE:

Notre Dame joined the ACC at the start of the 2013-14 basketball season. The Irish ended up 0-3 in the state of North Carolina that year (65-58 loss at Wake Forest, 63-61 loss at North Carolina, 81-69 loss to Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament in Greensboro).

Since breaking through for the program's first win in Chapel Hill, 71-70, at North Carolina on Jan. 5, 2015, the Irish have won seven of the last eight games they have played in the Tar Heel State:

POST SEASON SUCCESS:

Not only did Notre Dame advance to the NCAA Championship Elite Eight for the second consecutive season for the first time since 1978-79, but the Irish combined for six NCAA tournament wins over the past two seasons - the most in program history over a two-year stretch. The previous high was Notre Dame's three wins in 1978 (the team's lone appearance in the Final Four) and two victories the next season.

The Irish were the only team in the nation to advance to the Elite Eight in both the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons and the back-to-back regional final games are a first for the program since the NCAA tournament expanded to 64 or more teams in 1985.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

For the first time in the Mike Brey era, the Irish head coach was tasked with replacing two assistant coaches in the same season. Long time aides Martin Ingelsby accepted the Delaware head coaching job (the same first-time Division I job Brey assumed in 1995-96) while Anthony Solomon joined the Georgetown coaching staff in the offseason.

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 stand out shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

WHAT IS ACC NETWORK EXTRA?

ACC Olympic sporting events will be streamed live this fall by ACC Network Extra, a dedicated digital channel for ACC sports which made its debut on Friday, August 19.

The coverage marks the initial phase of the full ACC Network announced July 21 by ESPN and the Atlantic Coast Conference. Live streaming of Olympic sports will increase annually, culminating with 1,300 total ACC events when the linear network launches in 2019.

The events covered by ACC Network Extra will be immediately available to users who have access to WatchESPN and the ESPN app. More than 600 total Olympic sporting events - encompassing the Fall, Winter and Spring seasons - will be carried exclusively by ACC Network Extra during the 2016-17 academic year.

583 AND COUNTING

Notre Dame has made at least one three-pointer in 583 straight contests dating back to the 1998-99 campaign. The Fighting Irish have made at least one three pointer during every game of the Mike Brey era. The last time an Irish team failed to hit a three-pointer in a game was in a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 12, 1999. Notre Dame finished 0-7 from beyond the arc in that contest.

NOTRE DAME - BRYANT RECAP:

Led by junior Bonzie Colson and senior V.J. Beachem, the Irish opened the 2016-17 season at home on Saturday with a 89-64 win over Bryant in Purcell Pavilion. Notre Dame is now 17-0 in season-openers during the Mike Brey era, all coming at home.

Colson led the Irish with 23 points and nearly recorded a double-double, as the forward finished with a team-high nine rebounds. Beachem also poured in 22 points, matching his career high in scoring. The senior added five rebounds, three blocks and a steal to complete his afternoon.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Irish jumped out to an early 13-4 lead to begin the game in just over six minute of play but Bryant answered by scoring 15 of the next 17 points to take a 19-15 lead with nine minutes to go in the first. Notre Dame immediately responded, as Beachem went on a 7-0 run of his own to put the Irish back on top at 22-19.

Over the final 7:30 of play in the first Notre Dame extended its lead to double figures, as the team went into halftime with a 12-point advantage at 43-31. Colson and Beachem carried the Irish offense in the opening 20 minutes, as the duo combined for 27 points on 9-of-12 shooting from the floor.

Notre Dame pulled away in the second half, as the team outscored the Bulldogs 20-6 in a span of just over six minutes midway through the frame to open up a 22-point lead at 75-53. The Irish went on to win by a final score of 89-64.

PLAYER OF THE GAME

Colson had an ultra-efficient game from an offensive perspective, as the New Bedford, Massachusetts native finished with a team-high 23 points on 8-of-11 shooting from the field. The junior was a perfect 6-for-6 from the charity stripe as well. The 23-point performance marked the third game of his career with 20 or more points. Colson also added a team-high nine rebounds, twob blocks, an assist and a steal in the victory.

NOTRE DAME STAT OF THE GAME

The Irish shot the ball extremely well from the foul line against Bryant, finishing 26-of-29 on the afternoon. Beachem and Colson provided half of the makes, combining to go 13-for-13 from the line.

NOTES OF THE GAME

- Notre Dame moves to 17-0 in season-openers under head coach Mike Brey and is 94-18 in program history
- The Irish are now 3-0 against Bryant in the all-time series.
- Notre Dame is 47-35 when playing in-season tournament games, as Saturday's contest was a game in the Legends Classic.
- The 89 points are the most the Irish have scored in a season-opener since posting 98 against Georgia Southern in 2010.
- With 22 points, Beachem scored 20+ points for the second time in his career.
- Beachem's three blocks tie his career high.
- Saturday was the first time the Irish have had two players score at least 20 points in a game since Colson and former standout Demetrius Jackson accomplished the feat against Louisville on February 13, 2016.
- Senior Steve Vasturia started his 87th consecutive game on Saturday, while Martinus Geben recorded the first start of his career.
- Vasturia scored 16 points, marking his 51st game with double figures in points.
- Junior Matt Farrell notched career highs in assists (six) and steals (three).
- T.J. Gibbs, Elijah Burns and John Mooney all made their official Notre Dame debuts in the win
