**2005 NOTRE DAME WOMEN'S SOCCER
NCAA Second Round vs. Michigan State (Nov. 13, 1:00 EST)**

The Notre Dame women's soccer team (20-2-0) resumes its quest to repeat as NCAA champion with a second-round game vs. Michigan State on Sunday, Nov. 13 (1:00 EST, at Alumni Field) ... the Irish have outscored their opponents 52-1 in their current 11-game winning streak and also are riding a 33-game scoring streak and a 26-game unbeaten streak (25-0-1) at Alumni Field.

SERIES NOTES – Notre Dame holds a 9-2-0 series edge vs. Michigan State (5-1-0 at home), with the Irish winning the past nine meetings by a combined margin of 38-4 ... ND posted a home win over MSU in 1997 (6-0) and beat the Spartans in East Lansing the following season (4-0) ... ND has defeated MSU in recent spring-game scrimmages.

POSTSEASON HISTORY – Following Friday's 6-0 win over Valparaiso, ND is 5-0-0 in NCAA round-of-64 games ... the Irish are 7-2-0 in the round-of-32 (32-9 scoring edge), losing to Cincinnati in 2001 (2-3) and Michigan in '03 (0-1 ... N's 62-12-1 (.833) all-time record in postseason games now includes 33-10 in the NAAs (.761), 37-3-0 in all home postseason games (.925) and 26-3-0 (.897) in home NCAA games.

VS. THE BIG-10 – Prior to a 2-2 tie vs. Wisconsin in 2001, ND had posted 43 straight wins vs. Big Ten teams ('89-'01; now 49-3-1 since mid-'89 and 50-8-1 all-time, with 220-50 scoring edge) ... ND never has faced Illinois or Iowa and is unbeaten vs. Ohio State (5-0-0), Northwestern (2-0) and Penn State (1-0-0) ... ND's other records vs. the Big Ten include 11-1-1 vs. Wisconsin, 11-1-0 vs. Indiana, 11-2-0 vs. Michigan, 9-2-0 vs. Michigan State, 1-1-0 vs. Purdue and 0-1-0 vs. Minnesota.

ONE DAY AT A TIME MORE THAN JUST A CATCHPHRASE – Notre Dame's recent history in the NAAs provides plenty of second-round lessons, as the Irish were upset by Cincinnati in 2001 (2-3) and Michigan in '03 (0-1) ... that loss in '03 halted a promising season in which the Irish were ranked No. 1 and had started 18-0-1 ... another Big-10 team put a scare into the Irish during the 2004 second round, as ND needed a 90th-minute goal to beat Wisconsin, 1-0 (Jill Krivacek's header of a Katie Thorlakson header provided that dramatic ending).

VISITORS CENTER – Notre Dame has been the site of the four-team 1st/2nd-round format for each of the past five seasons ... teams that have come to Alumni Field for those games include four each from Illinois (Eastern Illinois three times and Loyola), Michigan (Oakland twice, Michigan and MSU) and Ohio (Cincinnati, Ohio State, Dayton and Bowling Green), plus Indiana teams Purdue and Valparaiso, and Wisconsin ... the breakdown by conference includes five Big-10 teams (UM, MSO, OSU, PU and UW), three from the Mid-Con (Oakland twice and Valpo) and OVC team EIU's three visits – plus single teams from the Mid-American (BG), Atlantic-10 (UD), Conference USA (Cincinnati) and the Horizon League (Loyola).

TWO-YEAR TEAR – ND's two-year record of 45-3-1 (.929) in the '04 and '05 seasons is tied for the second-most wins over a two-year stretch in the program's history, behind the 47-3-1 run in '96 and '97 (.931, also the best two-year win pct.) ... the Irish also have compiled an impressive three-year record from '03-'05 (65-6-2/.904).

BIG-GOAL SCORER – Sophomore F/M Amanda Cinalli has opened the scoring in the past two games (5-0 vs. UConn, 6-0 vs. Valparaiso), notching eventual gamewinners to give her 4 GWGs in her young ND career (also in '04 NAAs vs. EIU and Portland) ... Cinalli's next postseason GWG will tie the Irish career record for postseason GWGs, held by Monica Gerardo ('95-'98) ... Gerardo ('98) and Amy Van Laecke (in '95) share the ND record for GWGs in one postseason (3) ... Cinalli is tied with four other ND players who have posted 3 career GWGs: Van Laecke, Jenny Heft, Anne Makinen and Amanda Guertin.

GREAT CROWD – Notre Dame's 1st-round attendance of 1,530 ranked 6th among the 16 sites, behind Texas A&M (1,982) and within 100 fans of Utah (1,650), Santa Clara (1,627), Marquette (1,626) and North Carolina (1,582) ... the avg. 1st-round attendance was 1,227, with ND checking in 300 (or 125%) above that average.

OLD RELIABLE – Senior forward Katie Thorlakson played with Canada in the 2002 Under-19 World Championship (early fall) but has been in the Notre Dame lineup ever since, appearing in 92 career games to rank 16th in ND history ... only four Irish players have logged longer streaks of consecutive games played: Meotis Erikson (101; '97-'00), Shannon Boxx (101; '95-'98) and 1993-96 teammates Jen Renola and Kate Fisher.

THOR ROLLING AGAIN – Katie Thorlakson takes an 11-game point streak into the MSU game, one shy of matching the ND record she shares with Anne Makinen (in '99) ... Thorlakson has 33 points (8G-17A) in her current streak ... she closed the 2004 season with points in the final 11 games and then had points in the '05 opener for the 12-game streak that spanned two seasons.

SCORING WHEN IT MATTERS – Thorlakson has points in every postseason during the past two seasons (13), totaling 12G-16A (40 points) while factoring into two-thirds of the Notre Dames goals (28 of 42; 12G-16A) during 2004 and '05 postseason play.

ALL-TIME POSTSEASON POINT LEADER – Thorlakson's 46 career postseason points include 14 goals and 18 assists in 20 games spanning BIG EAST and NCAA tournament play, besting a record previously held by Anne Makinen (43) ... last weekend's action saw Thorlakson claim the ND record for career points in the BIG EAST Tournament (24) and she now is on the verge of setting the Irish record for career points in the NAACAs (22; 6G-10A), two shy of the mark held by Monica Gerardo (24; 10G-4A).

IRISH POST TENTH 20-WIN SEASON – Notre Dame has posted its 10th season with 20-plus wins during the past 12 seasons ... the Irish set the team record for wins in 2004 (25-1-1), with other 20-win seasons including 24 in '96; 23 in '94, '97 and '00; 21 in '95, '98 and '99; and 20 in '03.

SILVER STREAK – The current 11-game winning streak (52-1 scoring edge) includes a 7-0 win, three by 6-0 margins, wins by 6-1 and 5-0, three others by 4-0, a 3-0 game and the 1-0 overtime win at Rutgers ... ND has allowed just 17 shots on goal (1.6/gm) and 21 corner kicks (1.9) during the winning streak ... the Irish have erupted for a combined scoring margin of 34-1 in the second half of games during the win streak (22-1 in 2nd half of past six games).

IRISH STORM PAST CENTURY MARK – The Irish have topped 100 goals (101, with just 10 allowed) for the fourth time in the program's history and the first time since the high-powered 1997 team totaled 135 (one year after a record-setting 140-goal season in '96) ... the current ND team needs four more goals to pass the 1994 squad (94) into 3rd on the Irish single-season goals list.

SPECIAL MARGIN – The 6-0 win over Valparaiso (4 opp. shots) added to ND's margin of goals scored minus the opponent's total shots, now standing +5 (101-96) ... the stout all-around team defensive effort has yielded just 96 total shots in 22 games this season, with the opponents combining for only 44 shots on goal.

QUICK STRIKE – Amanda Cinalli's goal vs. Valparaiso (3:03) easily represented ND's quickest goal of '05 ... the previous quickest goal came on Sept. 16 vs. DePaul, when Katie Thorlakson scored at the 8:51 mark ... it was ND's quickest goal (3:03) in the past 38 games, dating back to Christie Shaner's corner-kick header (2:38) at West Virginia on Oct. 1, 2004 ... no other ND goals have come in the first 10 minutes of games this season (Kerri Hanks scored at 10:23 in the BIG EAST quarterfinal vs. Georgetown).

DOUBLE-DIGIT GROUP – Notre Dame is on the verge of having five double-digit goalscorers for the first time since the 1997 team set the ND record with seven players who posted 10-plus goals ... Kerri Hanks (25), Katie Thorlakson (17) and Brittany Bock (10) already have reached double-digit goals while Amanda Cinalli and super-sub Maggie Manning are lurking with 9G each.

POINT PRODUCTION – Notre Dame's storied history has seen only three players – including Katie Thorlakson (70, in '04) – total more points in a season than Kerri Hanks (65), with the others coming in 1996 when Cindy Daws racked up 72 points and Jenny Streiffer had 66 (still the record for points by an ND freshman) ... Hanks is just one goal shy of the 1996 total turned in by Daws (26), needing three more scores to tie the Irish record (28) set by Jenny Heft in '98.

20-20 REPEAT – Katie Thorlakson (17G-30A) is creeping closer to what would be a truly unique distinction, as she needs just three more goals to become the first player in the 24-year history of Division I women's soccer with multiple 20-goal, 20-assist seasons (she had 23G-24A in '04).

GOAL GROUPING – Friday's second-half goals by Kerri Hanks (59:39) and Amanda Cinalli (62:28) represented the 14th time this season that the Irish have scored twice in a span of 3:00 or shorter ... ND has scored such quick back-to-back goals in four of the past five games.

NAILS IN HE COFFIN – Maggie Manning's goal vs. Valpo at 76:36 continued ND's trend of wearing down the opposition with its tremendous depth, as the Irish have totaled 19 goals in the final 15 minutes of the 2nd half this season (plus one in overtime).

'THIRD LEG' STILL ONE OF THE ELITE – Amanda Cinalli has registered points in eight of the past nine games while her 33 points this season (9G-15A) would place her as the top scorer for many of the 307 teams currently playing on the Division I level ... instead, she ranks "just" third on the potent forward line with Katie Thorlakson and Kerri Hanks, a trio that now has combined for 51 goals, 60 assists and 162 points in 22 games (they are averaging 7.4 points per game as a unit) ... Cinalli is the 3rd-leading scorer among BIG EAST players but was relegated to 3rd team all-conference honors.

THE X-FACTOR – ND head coach Randy Waldrum said prior to the '05 season that junior D Kim **Lorenzen** was possibly the player that his team could least afford to lose ... as things turned out, the workmanlike and unheralded Lorenzen has helped the Irish go unbeaten in her 15 starts (15-0-0) – with the impressive domination in those '05 games including a 79-2 scoring edge (avg. 5.3-0.13) plus 372-59 in shots (24.8-3.9), 213-23 in shots on goal (14.2-1.5) and 107-26 in corner kicks (7.1-1.7).

TRENDY – In addition to extending its winning streak to 11 games, Friday's game continued several other trends for the Notre Dame program, as the Irish now are:

- Riding 33-game scoring streak (3rd in ND history, three shy of the 2nd-longest), with goals in 47 of the past 48 games
- 64-2-0 in their past 66 games when scoring first
- Perfect in past 223 games (223-0-0) when taking 2-0 lead
- 132-1-0 in their past 133 games when scoring 3-plus goals
- 16-0-0 this season when Hanks scores a goal
- Riding streak of 73 games without being outshot (65-6-2)
- Unscored upon in all four games of the '05 postseason (20-0 scoring edge; 388-minute shutout streak)
- Unbeaten in their past 25 home games (24-0-1)
- 11-0-0 at home this season (54-3 shots, 13 SOG allowed)

GOALS IN BUNCHES – Notre Dame now has scored three or more goals in each of the past nine games, breaking the ND record set by four previous teams that had three-plus goals in eight straight games ... the Irish have notched three-plus goals in 19 of the 22 games this season, are 19-0-0 in '05 when scoring multiple goals and have posted 19 wins this season by a margin of 3-plus goals (all but the 1-0 overtime game at Rutgers).

A CASE FOR THE DEFENSE – ND entered the week ranked 8th nationally with a 0.47 season goals-against avg. (now 0.43, which would rank 3rd in ND history) .. ND's 16 shutouts also tie for 3rd in ND history, trailing the 18 in both 1995 and '97 ... the Irish have held their 2005 opponents to 0-1 goals in 20 of the 22 games ... since allowing a goal by Gonzaga on Sept. 11, the Irish have posted shutouts in 14 of the past 16 games ... senior 'keeper Erika Bohn's 0.41 GAA would match her '04 mark that ranks 3rd in ND history ... she would have ranked 9th in the national GAA charts entering the NCAAs but currently is 86 minutes shy of the 50% minimum of minutes played ... since returning from injury in early October, Bohn has faced just seven shots on goal in 551 minutes of game action (with no goals allowed).

PLAYER QUICK NOTES – Brittany Bock has 6G-5A (17 pts) in her past 9 GP (with points in 8 of past 10 games) ... Maggie Manning has 6G-3A (15 pts) in her past 10 GP ... the “second forward line” of Manning (9G-6A), Susan Pinnick (6G-3A) and junior Lizzie Reed (2G-3A) now have combined for 46 points (17H-12A), including 30 points in the current win streak (11G-8A) ... Friday’s game saw Thorlakson (92), Scheffter (73), Buczkowski (73), Shaner (70), Chapman (49), Cinalli (49) and sophomore D/M Ashley Jones (49) all extend their games played streaks (Thorlakson, Scheffter and Buczkowski have not missed a game since starting their ND careers) ... Chapman also has logged 49 consecutive starts (she and Dew are the only players to start every game in ‘05) ... the ND freshmen have combined for 108 points this season (41G-26A).

NOTRE DAME: “Home of the Assist Masters” – Seven players in NCAA Division I women’s soccer history have totaled 67-plus career assists and more of them (4) have played for Notre Dame than all other teams combined (3) ... ND’s assist elite include Holly Manthei (NCAA-record 129 assists from ‘95-’98), Jenny Streiffer (3rd, 71; ‘96-’99), current senior Katie Thorlakson (6th; 68) and Cindy Daws (7th, 67; ‘93-’96) and ... Thorlakson is the only player among the four from ND who has played the bulk of her career at forward (Manthei and Daws were midfielders; Streiffer shifted from M to F midway through her career) ... the NCAA record book also now includes four ND names in the top-5 for assists in a season: Manthei (44 in ‘96, 34 in ‘97, 30 in ‘94) and Thorlakson (30 in ‘05) ... former UNC great Mia Hamm had 33 assists in 1992.

ROOKIE TANDEMs – Kerri Hanks (25) and Brittany Bock (10) are the seventh set of ND freshmen (but first since 2000) to post double-digit goals in the same season ... others include: Alison Lester (14) and Stephanie Porter (10) in 1990; Rosella Guerrero (13) and Michelle McCarthy (12) in ‘92; Stacia Masters (13) and Cindy Daws (16) in ‘93; Jenny Streiffer (22) and Jenny Heft (12) in ‘96; Anne Makinen (23), Meotis Erikson (22) and Monica Gonzalez (10) in ‘97; and Amanda Guertin (11) and Amy Warner (10) in ‘00.

BLAME IT ON RIO (actually Campinas) – Since making its 2004 preseason training trip to Campinas, Brazil, the ND women’s soccer team has racked up a 57-3-3 (.929) overall record spanning the games in Brazil (5-0-1), the ‘04 NCAA title season (25-1-1), the ‘05 spring season (7-0-1) and the current 2005 campaign (20-2-0).

SCORING STREAK HITS 33 GAMES – Notre Dame is riding a 32-game scoring streak that ranks 3rd-longest in the program’s history and tops in the seven-year Randy Waldrum era ... the longest scoring streaks in ND women’s soccer history are 55 games (8/29/97-9/17/99) and 36 games (10/19/95-12/6/96) ... the current scoring streak dates back to the scoreless tie with Rutgers on Oct. 22, 2004 ... ND now has scored in 47 of its past 48 games (since ending the ‘03 season with a 1-0 loss to Michigan in the 2nd round of the NAACAs).

SUNDAY, BLOODY SUNDAY – The Irish are unbeaten in ‘05 Sunday games (11-0-0; with 10 of those being the second game of the weekend) while outscoring the opponents 56-2 in those games (as opposed to an 8-2-0 record and 39-8 scoring edge in the first games/on Friday) ... the past five Sundays have yielded a 30-1 combined scoring margin for the defending NCAA champs, with five-plus goals in each of those games (7-0 vs. Seton Hall, 6-0 vs. Providence, 6-1 and 6-0 vs. Georgetown, 5-0 vs. UConn).

DYNAMIC DUO UPDATE – Katie Thorlakson and Kerri Hanks suddenly have a shot to become just the second pair of Division I teammates to each reach 70 points in the same season ... SMU's Danielle Garret (now Fotopoulos) had 83 points in 1995 while her teammate Courtney Linex added 77 ... Friday's third score marked the 19th time in '05 that ND's potent tandem have combined on a goal (67 other goals have involved combinations involving one, but not both, of those players) ... their high rate of point production is all the more noteworthy when considering that each plays on average just two-thirds of a game Hanks is averaging 65 min./gm and Thorlakson 62 min./gm) ... Hanks and Thorlakson both have points in 19 of the 22 games this season (Thorlakson has points in 16 of the past 17) ... Thorlakson (17G-30A) and Hanks (25G-15A) are closing in on the rare 20G-20A mark from opposite ends of the equation ... only one pair of teammates in NCAA history (Daws with 26G-20A and Streiffer with 22G-22A, in '96) have reached 20G-20A in the same season ... Thorlakson has scored (4) or assisted (10), extending her own ND record for GWAs in a season) on 14 of the 20 game-winning goals this season ... her 18 gamewinning points this season are five shy of the ND record she set in '04 ... she extended her ND record for career gamewinning points (54) while her 20 career GWAs still rank 3rd (one behind Streiffer) ... Thorlakson's 54 career goals remain 9th in the ND record book, now one behind Rosella Guerrero ... Thorlakson's 92 career games played ranks 16th in the ND record book and 3rd-most by a four-year forward (behind Meotis Erikson's 101 and Gerardo's 98) ... Thorlakson has factored into more goals (47) than any other player in the nation this season (Hanks has a G/A on 40) ... Thorlakson has points in 30 of the past 33 games and is the 11th player in D-I history to reach 54G-54A in her career.

50-POINT CLUB CONTINUES TO GROW – Notre Dame’s storied women’s soccer history includes 29 players who have posted 50-plus career points – with five of those players being members of the 2005 team, among them: senior F **Katie Thorlakson** (7th ND history; 54G-68A/176), 5th-year D/F **Candace Chapman** (64; 20G-24A) and junior M **Jen Buczkowski** (62; 19G-24A) ... Chapman recently became ND’s 20th all-time player with 20G-20A (despite playing most of her career in the defense) ... freshman F **Kerri Hanks** has blown past 50 points in her first season (65; 25G-15A) while sophomore F/M **Amanda Cinalli** (58; 19G-20A) recently joined the 50-point club ... two seniors could reach 50 points with a strong finish: M **Annie Scheffter** (42; 11G-20A) and F **Maggie Manning** (43; 16G-11A) ... Thorlakson (92 GP; 16th in ND history) and Chapman (89; 24th) also are two of 36 Irish players ever to log 80-plus career games played.
