TV Test for Big Green

- Dartmouth concludes its five-game road swing with the difficult task of playing at Notre Dame in the Big Green's first over-the-top televised game of the year, courtesy of ESPN3.
- Last time out, Dartmouth was within four points with little more than 10 minutes to play before falling at UIC, 76-60.
- Senior **Miles Wright** led the Green with 16 points while sophomore **Will Emery** added a career-high 15 on 7-of-11 from the floor.
- Dartmouth has four players averaging between 11.4 and 12.4 ppg, led by sophomore **Brendan Barry**, who has scored in double figures in seven of the eight games and hit at least two 3-pointers in 10 straight dating back to last year.
- Wright is right on Barry's heels at 12.3 ppg, plus leads the team on the glass with 4.6 rpg, and senior **Taylor Johnson** adds 12.0 ppg while shooting 52.2 percent from the floor.
- Freshman **Chris Knight**, last week's Ivy League Rookie of the Week and the Big Green's leading scorer entering the UIC game, was held in check due to foul trouble, producing just one point in a mere nine minutes of action, which dropped him to 11.4 ppg on the season.
- Junior **Guilien Smith**, who provided 10.0 ppg in the first three games and is the Big Green's leading returning scorer from last year, is out indefinitely with a (non-shooting) hand injury.
- What more exciting way would there be for head coach David McLaughlin to earn the 200th victory of his collegiate coaching career than by taking down Notre Dame on the road?

Series vs. Notre Dame

- This is the sixth meeting between these two programs on the hardwood, and the Fighting Irish have won each of the first five here in South Bend and all by double digits.
- The last showdown came six years ago with Notre Dame coming away with a 65-47 triumph.
- A freshman, Gabas Maldunas, was the lone Big Green player to score in double figures with 12 points to go with nine rebounds.

IVY LEAGUE TOURNEY

The second-ever Ivy League men's and women's basketball tournaments will take place Saturday and Sunday, March 10-11, 2018, at the Palestra in Philadelphia. The top four teams will earn berths in the tournament, with the semifinals on Saturday and the championships on Sunday. All six games will be broadcast live on ESPN's networks.

- Dartmouth is 1-13 all-time within the state borders, and 3-15 against Indiana schools with the lone road win at Valparaiso on New Year's Eve in 1969.

Scouting the Fighting Irish

- Since winning its first six games, Notre Dame has dropped three of its last five, including an 80-77 overtime loss to Indiana on Saturday.
- Bonzie Colson is averaging close to a double-double with 20.4 points per game while shooting 52.5 percent from the floor to go with 9.7 rebounds a night, not to mention 24 total blocks.
- Two others average in double figures — Matt Farrell at 16.4 ppg and T.J. Gibbs at 14.5. Both are 3-point marksmen with the latter draining 53.8 percent from long range (28-of-52).
- As a team, Notre Dame is shooting 41.6 percent from downtown, 17th in the country, as well as 49.8 percent overall, which ranks 26th.
- The Fighting Irish are also careful with the basketball, ranking third nationally in fewest turnovers per game (8.9).
- The Notre Dame rotation is mostly seven players with four of the five starters averaging at least 31 minutes a night, with Farrell and Gibbs over 35.
- Three of the five starters shoot at least 80 percent at the foul line, with the lone player under 76 percent being Gibbs (.682).
- Mike Brey (George Washington '82) is the Glen and Stacey Murphy Head Basketball Coach with a 390-190 record over 17-plus seasons at Notre Dame and 489-242 mark in this his 23rd season as a Division I head coach. He has taken the Irish and Delaware to a combined 14 trips to the NCAA Tournament and eight times has had Notre Dame in the final national rankings.

HEAD COACH DAVID McLAUGHLIN



Dartmouth Director of Athletics and Recreation Harry Sheehy announced on April 25, 2016 that David McLaughlin was hired as the 28th head coach of the Big Green men's basketball program.

"It is my great pleasure to bring David on board as our men's basketball coach," Sheehy said. "He brings a wealth of experience along with great passion for the game. He is a strong tactician with a terrific history of developing players. I could not be more excited looking to the future for Dartmouth men's basketball."

The first season of that future in 2016-17 had the Big Green in the race to qualify for the inaugural Ivy League Tournament going into the final day of the season. Although Dartmouth ultimately came up short with a road loss to undefeated Princeton, McLaughlin had rewarded the Big Green faithful with an exciting season featuring a mostly youthful roster. Dartmouth finished the season 7-20 overall and 4-10 in the Ancient Eight, including just the second season sweep of Penn in the previous 58 years, while Evan Boudreaux earned all-district honors from both the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA).

McLaughlin came to Dartmouth after serving three years as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Northeastern University, during which time the Huskies posted a combined record of 52-48. In 2014-15, he helped guide the Huskies to a 23-12 overall record and a regular season co-championship in the Colonial Athletic Association, as well as the CAA Tournament Championship to secure the school's first bid to the NCAA Tournament in 24 years.

Three of Northeastern's players earned a total of five All-CAA honors, including Scott Eatherton who was the 2013-14 CAA Defensive Player of the year and Quincy Ford who garnered the CAA Tournament MVP award in 2014-15. McLaughlin also secured eight student-athletes for the classes of 2019 and 2020 from six different states, including Massachusetts, Florida and California.

Prior to his tenure at Northeastern, McLaughlin was the head coach at Division II Stonehill College in the Northeast-10 Conference. Under his tutelage, the Skyhawks — which had been 11-45 in the two seasons before he took over — enjoyed terrific success with a combined 189-99 (.656) record in his nine-plus seasons (2004-13), including a 135-80 (.630) mark in conference play. Six times Stonehill won at least 20 games, topping out at 27 during the team's run to the national semifinals in 2005-06.

The Skyhawks qualified for the NCAA Tournament on five occasions (2006, '09-12), twice winning the East Regional Championship to advance to the Division II Final Four (2006, '12). McLaughlin

also led Stonehill to two NE-10 regular-season championships (2006, '10) and an NE-10 Tournament championship (2012), as well as a spot in the top-10 national rankings in four years.

The NABC Regional Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2011, and the NE-10 Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2010, McLaughlin is the all-time wins leader at Stonehill. He mentored a total of 14 All-Northeast-10 Conference players, including three first-team selections, as well as a player who received the NCAA Elite 89 Award for having the highest cumulative grade point average among the teams competing at the 2012 Division II Elite Eight.

He produced three-straight NE-10 Defensive Players of the Year to highlight the program's regular place atop the NE-10 and NCAA Division II defensive charts. Three Skyhawks earned NE-10 All-Rookie Team status during his tenure, and he produced three-straight NE-10 Defensive Players of the Year (2010-12).

McLaughlin was named Stonehill's interim head coach in January 2004 after three-and-a-half seasons as an assistant coach, and hired on a permanent basis later that year. In his first full season, he navigated the team to a 20-8 finish in 2004-05. Every one of his players graduated during his time as the head coach, spanning nearly a full decade.

Before joining the staff at Stonehill in 2000, McLaughlin served as an assistant coach at Wesleyan University for two seasons. He also spent time on the Suffolk University staff and was the head coach of the gold-medal-winning Northeast entry of the 1999 Bay State Games. McLaughlin served as a head coach at the Collegiate Basketball Invitational for four years, coaching top Division II senior players.

McLaughlin was a four-year letterwinner at Colby College, graduating in 1997 with a degree in history and going on to earn his Master of Education from Suffolk in 1999. In May 2000, McLaughlin earned partial certification from the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) and is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

He and his wife, Jenna, have three children — Sydney (10), Ryan (9) and Colin (7).

COACHING STAFF



Asst. Coach Pete Hutchins
Plymouth State '05 • 2nd year

Hutchins served as the head coach at New Hampton School — where he went to school — in New Hampton, New Hampshire, for nine years and earned NEPSAC AAA Coach of the year honors in

2015-16 after leading the Huskies to a 21-8 record. After studying for one year at UNH, Hutchins completed his degree in history at Plymouth State in 2005. A team captain as a senior, he also helped the Panthers to a 24-6 record and the second round of the NCAA Division III Tournament as a junior.



Asst. Coach Mike Quinn
Bentley '10 • 2nd year

Quinn came to Dartmouth with two seasons of Division I experience, acting as the director of basketball operations at two Atlantic-10 institutions — Fordham in 2014-15 and George Mason the next year.

Quinn's familiarity with Big Green head coach David McLaughlin dates back to his three years as an assistant for him at Stonehill College from 2011-14.

As a player at Bentley, Quinn set school career records for starts and minutes played while helping the team to two Division II Final Four appearances.



Asst. Coach Jabari Trotter
Dartmouth '12 • 2nd year

Trotter begins his second year at the school where he played in the second-most games in program history, averaging 6.9 points with 102 3-pointers.

After graduation, Trotter played professionally in Dublin, Ireland, and coached women's basketball. He also received a master's from the Dublin Business School.

Trotter worked as an admissions officer intern and a boys' basketball assistant at Phillips Exeter before returning to Division I as the director of basketball operations at Lehigh last year.



Dir. of Ops Ben Davis
Wheaton '06 • 1st year

A former assistant coach for McLaughlin at Stonehill, Davis joined the staff in October after four years as the head coach at Division III Mount Ida.

The Mustangs improved their record in each of his four years, culminating in 12 conference wins and a 17-10 overall record in 2016-17, leading to Davis' selection as the GNAC Coach of the Year.

Davis was a four-year letter winner at Wheaton and was instrumental in ECAC Championship titles in 2005 and '06.

ESPNU Broadcast

It has been at least a dozen years (and probably longer) since Dartmouth last appeared on an ESPN television station, but don't expect the Big Green to be camera shy. Every game this season can be seen either on TV or online with video streaming with a total of 19 games shown live on the Ivy League Network and nine on ESPN3 (some simulcast on the ILN).

Emery Scratches the Scoreboard

Sophomore **Will Emery** had never scored more than eight points in any of his first 19 career games, until he traveled to Chicago for a game against UIC. The forward went 7-of-11 from the floor and hit his only free throw to post a career-high 15 points.

Off the Mark

While Emery was knocking down shots, the rest of the team struggled a bit at UIC as Dartmouth finished the game shooting a season-low 37.5 percent (18-of-48) from the floor. The Big Green have hit at least 41 percent in their other contests, topping 50 percent three times already, matching last year's total.

Barry-ing the Three

Sophomore **Brendan Barry** has been Dartmouth's deadliest shooter from long distance, hitting 47.7 percent (21-of-44) from behind the arc, which ranks 30th in the nation. In each of the last 10 games (going back to last year), Barry has provided at least two triples, and twice has hit four this year (Albany, Maine).

Back on the Wright Track

After seeing his season scoring average drop after three consecutive games, senior **Miles Wright** came through with 16 points at UIC to lead the Big Green. He is easily on pace to become the 29th player in Dartmouth history to score 1,000 points in a career, needing to average just 5.6 points a game the rest of the way.

Starting Power

Against UIC on Dec. 15, Dartmouth relied almost exclusively on its starters to put points on the board. Of the 60 Big Green points, 55 were scored by the starting five, or 91.7 percent. The last time the reserves did not score at least 10 percent of the points in a game was in an 87-70 victory over Brown on Feb. 13, 2016 (eight points).

Not an Illinois State of Mind

In its 118-year history, Dartmouth has not played many Illinois schools, nor made the trek to the state for a game. With the 76-60 loss to UIC, the Big Green are now 1-7 all-time within the state borders and 2-10 against programs from Illinois. The lone victory in the state was a 52-49 triumph at Northwestern on New Year's Day — in 1949.

Knight Ivy Rookie of the Week

While Dartmouth did not have a single rookie of the week honor from the Ivy League office last year (after getting nine in 2015-16), **Chris Knight** ended that drought on Dec. 11. The freshman put up 13 points and four rebounds on the road against both Sacred Heart and Maine, helping Dartmouth to its first road victory of the year versus the latter. He also blocked three shots at SHU and shot a combined 10-of-19 (.526) from the floor.

Johnson Explodes for 29

Coming off a 20-point performance at Sacred Heart, Johnson outdid himself the next game by dropping a career-high 29 points to lead Dartmouth to a 73-66 win at Maine on Dec. 8. The senior hit a sizzling 11-of-13 shots and 4-of-6 from downtown, plus scored 12 of the final 15 points, including his last 3-pointer to give the Big Green the lead for good with 1:47 to play. It was his third career game with at least 20 points, and although he was held to just seven at UIC, he did lead Dartmouth with six rebounds and four assists.

Shot of Rai on the Glass

Rebounding has been a bit of an issue thus far with Dartmouth giving up three more boards a night. Against Maine, however, the Big Green enjoyed a sizeable 32-24 advantage, led by three players with five, one of which was freshman **Aaryn Rai**. The game before, Rai hauled in eight rebounds — the most by any Dartmouth player all season — as the Green battled Sacred Heart to a draw on the glass with each team hauling in 35 caroms.

by joining the basketball team. The Big Green were lacking some depth in the frontcourt, so Coach McLaughlin added the former all-league selection at Bishop Amat for averaging a double-double as the team's captain during his senior year.

Barry Buzzer Beater

After trailing Loyola by as many as 13 in the first half, Dartmouth got itself into position to defeat the Greyhounds in the final seconds on Nov. 28. **Brendan Barry** lofted a layup high off the glass and through the hoop with 1.7 seconds remaining, lifting the Big Green to a 64-63 victory, their first over Loyola in three tries. This was Barry's second game-winner in the final three seconds, having drilled a 3-pointer with 2.8 seconds left on New Year's Eve last year to beat New Hampshire, 63-62.

Big Comeback

As noted above, Dartmouth fell behind Loyola by 13 points on Nov. 28, yet still managed to rally and defeat the Greyhounds, 64-63. It was the first deficit of 10 points or more that the Big Green had overcome since a 63-50 triumph over Harvard on Jan. 23, 2016 in which they faced an 11-point deficit. The last time Dartmouth overcame a deficit of at least 13 points was when it set the school record by battling back from a 24-point hole (with 14 minutes to play) against Brown on March 6, 2015.

Loyola Off the Mark

Loyola had a terrible time shooting from long distance against the Big Green defense on Nov. 28, hitting just 1-of-14 (.071) from 3-point range. The last Dartmouth opponent to collect no more than one trey was Vermont on Jan. 4, 2014 when it went 0-for-4. That is also the last time an opponent shot worse than the Greyhounds did from the perimeter. Oddly enough, that Catamount team had just three assists, the last time an opponent had as few as Loyola's five.

Smith Smothered

Junior **Guilien Smith** had played in all 58 Big Green games during his career before missing the clash with Loyola on Nov. 28 due to a hand (non-shooting) injury he suffered against Albany six days prior. Unfortunately, Dartmouth's leading returning scorer from last year's squad will not be available for quite awhile with no timetable for his return.

The Wright Stuff

Senior **Miles Wright** had his most prolific game shooting the basketball in 11 months when he hit 9-of-17 field goals and 3-of-7 from deep for 21 points against Albany on Nov. 22. But not only was it his sixth career 20-point game, he also matched a personal best with three blocked shots and recorded two steals, making him the 18th player in Dartmouth history with 100 career steals.

Turnover Trouble

Dartmouth did a good job of taking care of the basketball in its first two games, committing just

First Win Comes by 35 Points

With its first win of the season, 78-43 over Division III Emerson College on Nov. 14, Dartmouth enjoyed its largest margin of victory since setting the program scoring record in a 121-56 triumph over another D-III school in Pine Manor on Jan. 16, 2016. The Big Green defense was the star of this game, however, holding the Lions scoreless over the final 8:30 of the first half. For the game, Emerson shot just 27.6 percent while turning the ball over 17 times. The last opponent to shoot worse than 30 percent was Old Dominion (.288) last Nov. 30.

Helping Spirit

In each of the first two games, the Big Green have had a player hand out six assists. First, senior **Taylor Johnson** collected those dimes at Quinnipiac, then freshman **Isaac Letoa** passed out the helpers against Emerson. Six was the single-game high last year, which happened just three times. Johnson added five more to his ledger against Loyola and currently has a team-leading 23 on the season.

So Close in Season Opener

Dartmouth was looking to earn a victory in a road season opener for the first time since 1987 when it traveled to Quinnipiac on Nov. 11. After falling behind by as many as 16 in the second half, the Big Green stormed back to knot the score four times, then had the ball with less than five seconds down by one. But the final shot was blocked, denying Dartmouth a buzzer-beating game-winner, leaving the team on the wrong end of a 78-77 score, the first one-point loss under second-year head coach David McLaughlin (two one-point wins last year).

Thank You Barry Much

Sophomore **Brendan Barry** was handed the reins to the offense as the starting point guard, and he did not disappoint in the opener, leading Dartmouth with a career-high 19 points on 7-of-10 shooting and 2-of-3 from long range.

Block as Knight

Plenty of "Knight" puns to last a long time. Freshman **Chris Knight** made his presence felt in his collegiate debut during the season opener at Quinnipiac, swatting four Bobcat shots during his 18 minutes on the court. No Ivy player had as many in any game

Preseason Poll

At the top is Harvard with 121 points and six first-place votes, just beating out Yale (118 points, eight first-place votes) and Princeton (114, three). So the media believe it will be a dogfight as to who gets the fourth slot for the Ivy league Tournament with Penn the favorite as the Quakers garnered 86 points. The bottom half shapes up with Columbia (55), Cornell (48), Dartmouth (39) and Brown (31).

International Experience

Two members of the Class of 2021 hail from outside of the United States — **Isaac Letoa** (New Zealand) and **Aaryn Rai** (Canada). Letoa even played for the New Zealand National Team (Junior Tall Backs), playing in the U19 FIBA World Championships in Cairo this past July.

The Long and Short of It

The coaching staff reached far and wide to bring the Class of 2021 to Hanover. The furthest distance traveled belongs to freshman **Isaac Letoa**, who hails from New Zealand, a distance of 8,962 miles. Contrast that trip to the one traveled by walk-on **Ben Swett**, who is from Exeter, New Hampshire, a mere 103 miles by car.

Freshman Chris Knight scored 16 points on 7-of-8 shooting to lead Dartmouth to its first victory of the year. The 35-point margin of victory was the largest for Dartmouth since a 65-point win over Pine Manor in January of 2016.

No less than a dozen players put points on the scoreboard for Dartmouth, while Brendan Barry grabbed seven rebounds and freshman reserve point guard Isaac Letoa dished out six assists.

But the Flames hit 13 of their final 18 field goals while the Green were just 3-of-7 from the floor, although Dartmouth continually got to the foul line and scored 13 of its final 19 points at the charity stripe.

Dartmouth jumped out to an early 10-4 lead on 3-pointers by Taylor Johnson and Brendan Barry — who finished with 10 points — sandwiched between two Emery buckets.

Dominique Matthews capped an 11-3 Flames run with his second of three trifectas, giving UIC a brief 15-13 lead. The lead see-sawed back and forth for a bit, and Emery gave the Big Green their last lead at 23-21 with seven minutes to go.

Wright scored the only five Dartmouth points for the remainder of the half as the Flames took a 31-28 advantage into the locker room.

UIC got off to a quick start in the second stanza, boosting its lead to nine before the Green clawed their way back to within one. But after Emery dropped in a layup to keep Dartmouth within four, the Flames caught fire and took control.
