- 2004 Team Ranks - enters NCAAs as team leader in 12 categories: batting avg. (.380), home runs (14), hits (84), runs (72; 11th in nation), doubles (15), triples ( 7 ; 24th in nation), slugging pct. (.701; 26th in nation), on-base pct. - Hitting the Books and the Baseballs - ranks 2nd on ND career hits list (297) while recently earning prestigious honor of 1 st team Academic All-America, as selected by College Sports Information Directors of America ... closed with a 4.0 GPA in the spring semester (after the Academic All-America selections already had been made) ... graduated in mid-May with a 3.44 cumulative GPA as a business marketing major (he posted a 3.73 semester GPA in the 2003 fall term) ... sixth ND baseball player ever to earn Academic All-America in multiple seasons (2nd team in '03) and is the third to repeat the honor during the last four seasons ... completed the rare double of All-America and Academic All-America honors as a junior (just 10 other ND student-athletes, from all sports, ever have turned in that feat as non-seniors) ... the 11 other players named to the first team Academic All-America squad include just four others from teams that were selected for the upcoming NCAA Tournament: pitchers Wade Townsend (Rice) and Garrett Broshius (Missouri), infielder Jim Burt, Jr. (Miami) and outfielder Mark Johnson (Wichita State) ... - Classic Winner - the current senior class has helped ND compile a 193-59-1 four-year record from '01-'04, good for a . 765 winning pct. that is the best ever in a four-year span of ND baseball (the standing record of $.758 / 185-59$ was set in the ' 90 -' 93 seasons) ... the old ND record for wins in a four-year span was owned by the class of 2003 (190-67-1), which bested the ' 02 CWS seniors (188-67-1) ... Sollmann ranks as the winningest four-year starter in ND baseball history, with the Irish winning $76.5 \%$ of its games in his career ( $78.4 \%$ with him in starting lineup).

Alec Porzel (.957, in '01) is the only shortstop among ND's previous nine with a better fielding pct. than Lopez's current .939 but Porzel hit just .295 in that 2001 season (inverting his 2000 numbers, when he hit .342 with just .919 fielding at SS) ... on the offensive side of the comparisons, Brant Ust (.372) is the only Mainieri-era shortstop to post a season batting avg. better than Lopez's current .346 (Ust also split time at 2 B and 3 B in the ' 97 season) ... ND's nine previous SS in the Mainieri era have combined to bat just . 308 ( 38 points lower than Lopez's current avg.) ... the previous Irish shortstops averaged 44 RBI , with Lopez owning 34 (while batting mostly in the 9 -hole) ... his 17 errors are below the avg. of 22 Es from the previous nine ND shortstops ... (Porzel, with 12 Es in '01) is the only Mainieri-era SS to finish with fewer Es than Lopez's 17 ... Lopez's current .939 fielding pct. is a full 19 points better than his nine predecessors avg. (.920) ... it's also worth noting that the first four players on the below list (J.J. Brock twice, Paul Turco and Ust in one season) played before the NCAA changes in the bat restrictions (starting in '99) ... Lopez is the fourth sophomore (third straight, after Javi Sanchez and Matt Macri, ND's current C and 3B) to start at SS in the Mainieri era, with the others including two freshmen, two juniors, one senior and one graduate student ... here's a look at the last 10 Notre Dame shortstops and their statistical production:
