Francis has grabbed seven doubledoubles this season and hauled in 10-plus rebounds in 15 contests ... Prior to the DePaul on Saturday, he had posted four straight games with 10-plus rebounds — a first for his career.

Carter Power:

Junior guard Russell Carter continues to put up impressive numbers ... He is the team's third leading scorer at 11.3 points per game (a careerbest) and has led the Irish in scoring in each of the last three games ... Carter has netted double figures in 16 games and in seven of the last eight contests ... His back-to-back-toback 20-point effort against Marquette (20), Providence (21) and DePaul (22) marks the first time in his career with three consecutive 20-plus outings ... His combined three-game point total (63 points) is the best three-game total of his career.

Thirty Something I:

Chris Quinn's 34-point performance against Seton Hall on Feb. 18 marked his fourth 30-plus point performance of the season ... Three of his 30-point efforts have come on the road this season and all four have been in BIG EAST play ... His 31-point performance against Louisville on Feb. 4 marked his third 30-plus point effort of the season ...

Quinn's first career 30-point game came against Pittsburgh when he tossed in a career-high 37 points in a 100-97 double-overtime loss ... Against Providence 10 days later, he netted 31 points ... Quinn is the first Notre Dame player since Troy Murphy in 2000-01 to record four 30-plus outings (Murphy had five that season) ... He is just the third Notre Dame player to record four 30-plus performances during BIG EAST play ... The other two were Pat Garrity in 1997-98 and Troy Murphy in 1999-2000 ... Prior to Quinn's second 30-plus point performance against Providence, the last Notre Dame player to have multiple 30-point performances in a season was Chris Thomas during the 2003-04 season - 31 vs. Connecticut and 39 vs. St. Louis.

Thirty Something II:

Chris Quinn's 34 points and Colin Falls' 32 marked the first time since Jan, 11, 1992 that Notre Dame had two 30-point scorers in the same game ... In that contest, an 88-76 win against North Carolina at Madison Square Garden, LaPhonso Ellis netted 31 points and Daimon Sweet finished with 30 ... The 66 points combined were the most by two Irish players in a single game since Austin Carr and Collis Jones combined for 90 points against Butler in a 121-114 victory on the road on Feb. 23, 1970 ... In that game, Carr finished with 50, while Jones scored 40.

No Mistakes In These Efforts:

Freshman Kyle McAlarney, who has started 10 contests overall this season, dished off a combined 12 assists in the Rutgers and South Florida contests and not commit a turnover in averaging 33.5 minutes per game ... It marked the first time in his career that he did not commit a turnover in consecutive games ... While averaging 23.0 minutes per game, McAlarney has dished off 72 assists and turned the ball over 43 times.

Free Falls-ing:

Colin Falls has scored in double figures in 16 games this season and netted 20-plus points in six games overall ... His career-high 32-point outing versus Seton Hall on Feb. 18 and 23-point performance against Connecticut on Feb. 21 marks the first time in his career that he recorded back-to-back 20-point outings ... Against Seton Hall, he connected on 10-17 from the field and 8-15 from three-point range ... His eight threepoint field goals tied the single-game school record he already held with Keith Friel and Matt Carroll ... Heading into the Seton Hall game, Falls was just 4-17 (.235) from the field and 1-12 (.083) from three-point range in the two previous outings against Rutgers and South Florida ... In the eight games prior to Rutgers (vs. DePaul, Syracuse, Providence Marquette, Georgetown, Villanova, West Virginia and Louisville), he averaged 17.6 points and shot 47.3 percent (43-91) and 48.1 percent (38-79) from three-point range ... His 141 points over those eight contents was the highest eight-game point total in consecutive outings during his career ... Against Connecticut, he was 9-19 from the field and 5-14 from beyond the arc as he played 45 minutes of the overtime contest.

Falls Zeros In On Three-Point Mark:

Colin Falls is within reach of Matt Carroll's single-season three-point record of 99 that he set during the 2002-03 season ... Heading into the BIG EAST Championship, Falls has 90 three-point field goals this season ... Last year, his 93 three-pointers set the mark for most three-pointers by a sophomore and were the third-most all-time in a single season ... He will look to become the first Irish player in school history with better than 90 three-pointers in two seasons ... Chris Thomas' 94 three-point field goals during his junior year in 2003-04 were the second-most alltime in a single season.

Quinn Earns Academic All-America Distinction:

Chris Quinn became the seventh player in the history of the Notre Dame men's basketball program to earn Academic All-America honors when he was named to the 2006 ESPN The Magazine Men's Basketball University Division Academic All-America First Team ... His selection marks the 11th time a Notre Dame player has been selected for the honor, but Quinn is the first Irish men's basketball All-American since Pat Garrity - currently a member of the NBA's Orlando Magic - who earned the honor in both 1997 and '98 ... A marketing major in the Mendoza College of Business, the 6-2 guard owns a 3.24 overall grade point average ... He had his highest grade index in the fall of 2005 when he finished with a 3.833 ... Women's basketball player Megan Duffy (Dayton, Ohio) also earned first-team Academic All-America honors, as Notre Dame was the only school to have a men's and women's player selected to the first team ... Quinn is the sixth Notre Dame player to earn first-team honors. Bob Arnzen was a three-time first-team honoree (1967-69), while John Paxson (1982-83) and Garrity (1997-98) were two-time selections. Gary Novak earned first-team distinction in 1974, while Kelly Tripucka garnered first-team recognition in 1979. The other Irish player to earn Academic All-America honors was Rich Branning in 1980.

Quinn Named To NABC District 10 Team:

Chris Quinn was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 10 First Team ... Joining him on the squad were Terence Dials (Ohio State), Marco Killingsworth (Indiana), Eric Hicks (Cincinnati) and Brian Thornton (Xavier).

Quinn Feeling Generous:

Senior co-captain Chris Quinn has been on a scoring tear of late, averaging 20.0 points per game (360 points) over his last 18 outings, but he has been just as adept at helping his teammates find scoring opportunities ... Over that same 18-game stretch, Quinn is averaging 6.3 assists (114 assists) and ranks 12th nationally in that category.

Backcourt Prowess:

Notre Dame's backcourt of Chris Quinn, Colin Falls and Kyle McAlarney had its most productive outing of the season in the win over Providence on Jan. 14 ... The trio combined for 67 of the team's 92 points and shot a combined 23-32 (.718) from the field and 13-19 (.684) from three-point range ... Quinn was 11-14 overall and 5-7 from beyond the arc, while Falls connected on 8-12 and 5-9 from three-point range ... McAlarney was 4-6 from the field and 3-3 from the three-point stripe.

Chris Quinn finished the BIG EAST regular season averaging 20.6 points per game ... He is just the third Irish player to average better than 20 points per game during the conference season ... Pat Garrity did it twice in both 1996-97 (20.1) and 1997-98 (24.1), while Troy Murphy averaged better than 20 points per game in both 1999-00 (21.7) and 2000-01 (22.8)

Beyond The Arc:

Notre Dame's 17 three-pointers against Louisville on Feb. 4 tied the school record set against St. John's on March 6, 2004 at Madison Square Garden ... Notre Dame is averaging 9.7 three-pointers in 27 games and 10.8 since the start of BIG EAST play ... Notre Dame has made 10-plus threes in nine of the last 16 games and in 12 games overall ... The Irish rank fourth nationally in three-point field goals made.

Paint Production:

Notre Dame's inside game proved dominant in the victory over Rutgers on Feb. 8 as the Irish outscored the Scarlet Knights 40-24 ... Torin Francis and Rick Cornett combined for their most productive outing together this season as they scored 35 points ... Francis netted 21 points on 8-12 shooting from the field, while Cornett tossed in a season-high 14 points, hitting 5-8 ... In the previous outing against Louisville, the duo was just 1-11 from the field and scored a combined three points.

Like A Lighting Rod:

All 12 of Kyle McAlarney's points against Providence came in the first half ... In fact, he scored Notre Dame's final nine points of the first half (all from three-point range) in a span of 1:30 that enabled the Irish to hold a 52-40 halftime advantage.

Comeback Kids:

Despite a 6-10 BIG EAST record, Notre Dame has made comebacks in several contests and put themselves in position to win the game ...

•at Pittsburgh (1/4): Notre Dame trails the Panthers by nine with 47 seconds to play in regulation and stages a furious comeback, outscoring Pittsburgh 13-4 ... Notre Dame ties the score (77-77) with 14 seconds to play on Colin Falls' three-pointer... In the first overtime, Pittsburgh leads by seven with 1:08 to play, but the Irish outscore the Panthers 10-3 down the stretch ... Chris Quinn scores Notre Dame's final five points, including a game-tying layup with five seconds left in the first overtime session ... In the second overtime, the Irish take a three-point lead (97-94) with 2:20 to play, but are held scoreless down the stretch.

•at DePaul (1/7): Notre Dame trails by 17 less than nine minutes into the contest and trail by 10 (37-27) at the break ... Notre Dame erases the halftime deficit with three three-pointers by Colin Falls and a basket by Torin Francis to cut the deficit to one ... Notre Dame ties the game with 10:54 remaining, but is never able to take the lead.

•vs. Syracuse (1/11): Syracuse opens up an 11-point lead (68-57) in the second half with 8:32 to play, but the Irish pull to within two (73-71) with 5:33 remaining, Syracuse opens up a seven-point lead with 1:46 left to play ... The Irish close to within three with 45 seconds, but could get no closer.

•at Marquette (1/20): Notre Dame opens up an 11-point lead (30-19) with 5:01 remaining in the first half, but the Golden Eagles pull to within three (33-30) at the break ... Marquette takes the lead 44-43 with 13:38 remaining and has a six-point advantage (54-48) with 9:29 to play ... Notre Dame leads by three (59-56) with 7:09 to play and owns a two-point advantage (65-63) with 2:46, but the Irish are held scoreless down the stretch and the Golden Eagles pull out the victory on Steve Novak's jumper with one second remaining.

•vs. Georgetown (1/24): The Irish fall behind by as many as 15 in the first half and trail (36-28) at intermission ... The Hoyas hold a seven-point lead (63-56) with 3:13 remaining, but the Irish pull to within two (67-65) with nine seconds left ... Georgetown converts one of two free-throw attempts to lead by four with eight seconds left in regulation ... With one second remaining, Colin Falls nails a three-pointer and is fouled and converts the free throw to send the game into overtime ... In the first overtime session, Georgetown jumps out to a three-point advantage, but Rick Cornett's dunk with 40 seconds remaining knots the game at 76-76 — the third tie in overtime ... Chris Quinn misses a layup at the buzzer as the teams head into overtime ... Georgetown scores the first three points of overtime and go on to earn a three-point victory.

vs. Villanova (1/28): Notre Dame starts off strong and opens up a seven-point advantage with 5:18 to play in the first half, before Villanova closes out the final five minutes with an 18-10 run to take a 35-34 halftime lead ... The Wildcats outscore Notre Dame 24-8 in the first nine minutes of the second half and hold a 17-point advantage (59-42) with 10:42 to play ... Notre Dame holds Villanova scoreless for more than five minutes and cut the deficit to 11 points (61-50) with 7:08 to play ... Notre Dame then goes on a 16-2 run and take the lead 66-63 with 1:38 to play ... Villanova cuts the lead to one on two free throws, but two free throws by Russell Carter gives the Irish a 68-65 adavantage with 1:03 to play ... The Wildcats take a 69-68 lead after two free throws from Randy Foye and a layup by Allan Ray ... Torin Francis knots the game at 70-70 on a layup with 13 seconds remaining, but Kyle Lowry's tip-in with less than two seconds gives Villanova the victory.

at West Virginia ($\overline{2}/1$): Notre Dame trails by as many as 15 (29-14) with 6:50 to play in the first half, but the Irish close out the stanza with a 21-10 run, including a three-pointer by Chris Quinn as time expires ... The Irish jump out to a three-point advantage early in the second half, but the Mountaineers lead by five with 13:30 to play in the contest ... The game remains close for the final 13 minutes ... Notre Dame enjoys a one-point lead (62-61) with 5:14 left to play, but the Mountaineers take a six-point lead 71-65 with 1:40 remaining ... The Irish hold West Virginia scoreless for the remainder of the contest and close to within the final 71-70 outcome on a jumper by Russell Carter with 1:26 to play and a three-pointer by Quinn with 49 seconds left ... A missed layup by Johannes Herber gives Notre Dame the final position with 15 seconds to play ... Quinn is unable to convert a jumper with four seconds left as West Virginia holds on for the victory.

at Louisville (2/4): Two free throws by Chris Quinn give Notre Dame an 80-77 lead with 11 seconds to play ... Taquan Dean's three-pointer with one second remaining sends the game into overtime ... The Irish take a one-point lead 20 seconds into the overtime session ... With 2:43 remaining, David Padgett's tip-in gives the Cardinals an 86-82 advantage ... Notre Dame ties the game with 50 seconds left in overtime on back-to-back jumpers by Quinn and Russell Carter ... Brandon Jenkins scores the last three points of the game for Louisville with a layup at 22 seconds and then on a free throw with eight seconds left.

at Connecticut (2/21): Trailing by 16 ($\overline{48}$ -32) at the half and by as many as 19 in the second half. Notre Dame goes on an 18-0 and 25-2 run in the second half ... Trailing 58-41 with 15:49 to play, the Irish make up the deficit in just over five minutes and take a 61-60 lead with 10:35 to play ... Notre Dame goes up by as many as six on two occasions and hold a six-point advantage (69-63) with 5:19 to play ... Connecticut holds the Irish scoreless in the final 3:43 and Marcus Williams' jumper off of a missed free throw with nine seconds remaining sends the game into overtime ... Notre Dame is just 1-5 in the overtime session and misses two key free throws, but does have a chance to win the game ... Trailing 75-74 with 46 seconds remaining, a shot attempt by Russell Carter is blocked and Chris Quinn's running floater misses with one second remaining.

<u>A 'Quinn'tessential Performance:</u>

Senior co-captain Chris Quinn's career-high 37 points against Pittsburgh in Notre Dame's double-overtime nailbiter on Jan. 4 was a single-game record for the Petersen Events Center (the Panthers' home arena) ... From the 4:02 mark of the second half — when the Irish were down 64-55 — Quinn scored 16 straight Notre Dame points to bring them within three, 77-74, with 14 seconds left in regulation and then picked up the assist on Colin Falls' game-tying three-point field goal in regulation ... On top of those gaudy scoring numbers, Quinn also tied a career-high by dishing out nine assists and chipped in six rebounds. Quinn also set personal bests in field goals (12), field goals attempted (23) and minutes played (49) in the contest ... The 37 points also was a Petersen Events Center single-game record ... The point total matched Pat Garrity's 37-point performance against Seton Hall on Jan. 17, 1998 and Troy Murphy's 37-point effort against Rutgers on Jan. 6, 2001 as the most points scored by an Irish player in a BIG EAST game ... It also was the first 30-point plus effort by a Notre Dame player since Chris Thomas scored 39 points against Saint Louis in the second round of the NIT on March 22, 2004.

Opponents Take Notice:

Freshman Kyle McAlarney has scored double figures in eight games this season ... The Irish rookie has played in all 27 contests and made 10 starts (nine in BIG EAST play) ... He earned his first career start against IPFW when Chris Quinn missed the contest due to an ankle injury and has been in the starting lineups against Marquette, Georgetown, Louisville and Rutgers ... McAlarney is the fifth-leading scorer, averaging 6.9 points and is shooting 46.4 percent from the field ... McAlarney had scored in double-figures in four straight games before the Pittsburgh contest on Jan. 4 ... The last freshman to have four consecutive double-figure scoring outings was Chris Thomas in 2001-02 when he had streaks of nine and seven straight games in double figures.

Carter Cutting Loose:

Russell Carter's last three outings against Marquette, Providence and DePaul were the most productive of his career based on a threegame stretch ... He has a combined point total of 63 points over the last three games (the most of his career) after scoring 20 against the Golden Eagles, 21 in the win over the Friars and 22 versus DePaul ... He has twice registered a combined 41 points in back-to-back performances against Louisville (24) and Rutgers (17) and against Marquettte (20) and Providence (21) ... In the Louisville game, Carter scored a careerhigh 24 points (the first 20-point effort of his career) in the overtime loss while playing 38 minutes and grabbing six boards ... He shot 8-11 (.727) from the field and was 4-6 (.667) from three-point range ... In the win over Rutgers, he netted 17 points and grabbed nine rebounds ... Carter was 5-11 from the field and 3-7 from beyond the arc in 31 minutes ... Prior to his scoring eight points against Connecticut, he had been in double figures in four consecutive games (a first in his career) ... He topped the 20-point mark for the second time in his career last Saturday night against Marguette as he was 5-9 from the field and 4-5 from three-point range and third time in Wednesday's win at Providence when he converted 5-8 from the field and 2-5 from beyond the arc ... Against DePaul, he finished with 22 points as he was 7-13 from the field and 3-7 from three-point range.

Points Are Plenty:

Notre Dame has topped the 80-point mark 12 times in 26 games this season and scored 90-plus points on four occasions ... The Irish are averaging 79.5 points in BIG EAST play ... Their 85-49 (36 points) victory over Fordham was their largest of the season ... Last year, Notre Dame reached the 80-point plateau only once — an 88-73 win over Marist on Dec. 22, 2004 ... The 36-point margin of victory against Fordam on Dec. 28 was the largest for an Irish team since a 44-point win against IUPUI on Nov. 18, 2002.

<u>Close Calls:</u>

Notre Dame has played in 17 games that have been decided by seven or fewer points ... The Irish are 7-10 in those contests ... Notre Dame was involved in 15 games last season that were decided by seven points or less ... The Irish finished with a 9-6 record in those contests.

Francis Ranks Among Best In Double-Doubles:

Senior co-captain Torin Francis' 30 career double-doubles rank him 10th in school history ... While LaPhonso Ellis' record of 54 double-doubles may be out of reach, Francis is within striking distance of some of Notre Dame's greatest players as he continues to climb the list:

Double Delight:

In the win over IPFW, Notre Dame had two players register doubledoubles in the same game ... Torin Francis recorded his third doubledouble of the season with 24 points and 11 rebounds, while teammate Russell Carter earned his first career double-double with an 11-point and 14-rebound effort ... The 14 boards were a career high for Carter ... Ironically, the last time two Irish players posted double-doubles in the same game was against the Mastodons in a 73-45 victory on Nov. 23, 2004 ... In the contest, Chris Thomas finished with 10 points and 11 ssists, while Dennis Latimore had 12 points and 11 rebounds ... Against Syracuse, Francis again recorded a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Colin Falls registered his first career double-double as he netted 18 points and handed out a career-high 10 assists.

Francis Collects 900th Rebound:

With his 10 rebounds against Seton Hall on Feb. 18, Torin Francis became just the seventh player in Notre Dame history to grab 900 rebounds ... Francis stands fifth on the all-time Irish rebounding charts ... He currently has 945 career boards in 110 games.

Double The Pleasure:

Torin Francis' 22 points and 13 rebounds against Michigan marked his second straight double-double following a 13-point and 11-rebound effort against North Carolina State ... It also marked the third time in four games that he had grabbed 10-plus rebounds (he also had 14 in the season opener against Lafayette) ... Francis only recorded back-to-back double-doubles once last season — 16 pts./10 rebs. vs. Pittsburgh and 21 pts./13 rebs. vs. Rutgers ... His third double-double of the season came against IPFW as he netted a season-high 24 points (one off of his career high) and grabbed 11 rebounds ... He registered his fourth of the season in Notre Dame's win over Wofford as he scored 12 points and grabbed 11 boards and had his fifth against Syracuse with 13 points and 10 rebounds ... His most recent double-doubles came against Marquette as he scored

Francis has scored in double figures in 63 career games, netted 20-plus points in 13 contests and registered 30career double-doubles (good for 10th in school history) ... He has seven double-doubles overall in 2005-06.

Rookie Ball:

With Chris Quinn out of the lineup against IPFW due to an injury, freshman Kyle McAlarney started at point guard for the Irish ... Also in the starting lineup was another first-year player — Luke Zeller ... Zeller has been in the starting rotation for nine games and earned his first career start against Alabama ... The last time two freshmen were in the starting lineup in the same game was during the 2001-02 campaign when Chris Thomas and Jordan Cornette made starts together six different times throughout the season.

The Irish All-Time:

The 2005-06 men's basketball campaign marks the 101st season of basketball and 11th as a member of the BIG EAST Conference ... In 100-plus seasons, Irish teams have posted a 1580-875 record for a .643 winning percentage ... In BIG EAST play, Notre Dame owns an 90-94 (.489) record all-time in conference regular-season play.

The Captains:

Guard Chris Quinn and forwards Torin Francis and Rick Cornett are serving as captains for the 2005-06 season ... It marks the second straight year that Francis and Quinn have served in that role ... The duo are the 11th and 12th players to serve as two-time captains.

Postseason Trend:

Since 2000, Notre Dame has appeared in either the NCAA or NIT tournaments each of the last six years ... The Irish played in the 2000 NIT and then earned three consecutive NCAA tournament berths -2001, '02 and '03 - followed by NIT appearances in '04 and '05 ... This is the longest stretch of postseason appearances for Irish teams since making eight consecutive postseason trips from 1983-90 - (NIT in 1983 and '84 and NCAA from 1985-90).

Home Sweet Home:

Since the inaugural season in 1968-69 at the Joyce Center, Notre Dame owns a 455-140 record all-time for a .765 winning percentage ... The Irish are 70-27 (.722) at the Joyce Center during Mike Brey's five seasons, and since the 1996-97 campaign, they own a 118-42 mark for a .738 winning percentage ... Notre Dame's 11-5 mark this season at home marks the eighth time in nine years that the Irish won 10 or more home games.

Welcome To The Club:

With his career-high 26-point performance against Michigan on Dec. 3, Chris Quinn became the 44th player in Notre Dame basketball history to score 1,000 career points ... In 120 (he played in his 100th career game against Florida International) career outings, Quinn has scored 1,413 points for an 11.8 career scoring average.

Francis Gets To 1,000:

With his first basket of the game against Florida International on Dec. 10, Torin Francis became the 45th player in Notre Dame basketball history to score 1,000 points, joining teammate Chris Quinn who just a week earlier reached the mark against Michigan on Dec. 3 ... In 110 career games, Francis has scored 1,236 points and owns an 11.2 career scoring average.

1,000-Point Duo:

Teammates Chris Quinn and Torin Francis became the 44th and 45th players, respectively, in Notre Dame basketball history to reach the 1,000-point plateau ... The senior co-captains reached the mark on successive Saturday outings ... Francis has 1,236 career points in 110 outings for an 11.2 average, while Quinn has scored 1,413 points in 120 games in an Irish uniform for a 11.8 career average ... The last time two players from the same class scored 1,000 points was Notre Dame's Class of 2002 — Troy Murphy and David Graves ... Murphy had reached the 1,000-point mark in his sophomore season and finished his career with 2,011 points before leaving after his junior year for the NBA ... In 94 career games, he averaged 21.4 points per game ... Graves finished his career with 1,746 points and reached the 1,000-point mark in his junior year (2000-01), the same season that Murphy topped the 2,000-point mark.

Quinn and Francis In Elite Company:

Notre Dame's previous season high was against IPFW (17-19 for 89.5 percent) ... The Irish shot a season-low 47.1 (8-17) percent in their recent matchup against DePaul ... The 45 free throws attempted by Notre Dame in their win over Columbia constitute a high mark in the Mike Brey era ... In that contest, Notre Dame was 28-45 (.622) ... The 33 free throws made against Seton Hall were the most ever by an Irish team in a BIG EAST game ... Notre Dame finished 33-38 (.868) from the charity stripe in the contest and was 27-90 (.900) in the second half ... The only teams to outrebound the Irish are Hofstra (40-39), Columbia (39-37), Pittsburgh (51-43), Marquette (33-27), Georgetown (45-42), Louisville (42-37), Connecticut (56-46) and DePaul (36-31) with the Irish owning a 3-5 record in those games ... The Irish connected on 56.9 (29-51) percent from the field against Providence on Jan. 14 marking the third game this season that they have shot better than 50.0 percent ... Notre Dame connected on 54.7 (29-53) percent against Fordham ... The Irish shot a season-best 58.9 percent from the field (33-56) against Rutgers and were 27-52 (51.9 percent) against Seton Hall which marked the fifth game this season shooting better than 50.0 percent.

McAlarney Magic:

Freshman Kyle McAlarney has played in all 26 games for the Irish and is averaging 6.9 points and 1.8 rebounds and is one of Notre Dame's top scorers off the bench ... In eight of the last 19 games, he has scored in double figures, netting a career-high 16 points against Niagara, 14 points versus Columbia, 10 points against Fordham, 12 in the wins over Wofford and Providence and 13 in the loss to Villanova ... McAlarney enjoyed a stellar shooting performance in consecutive outings against Niagara, Columbia, Fordham and Wofford as he shot a combined 17-24 (.708) from the field and 12-19 (.632) from three-point range.

Tough Enough:

Notre Dame's 2005-06 schedule features five teams — Connecticut, Louisville, Alabama, West Virginia and Syracuse — that began the season ranked in the top 25 ... Russellmania:

Prior to the Marquette game on Jan. 20, guard Russell Carter had been in the starting lineup for 16 straight games dating back to last season ... He had been in the starting lineup for each of Notre Dame's first 15 contests and earned his first career start in the first round NIT matchup against Holy Cross in what was the final game of the season ... After not starting the Marquette and Georgetown contests, he returned to the starting lineup against Villanova ... He has started 25 games this season and 26 overall during his career ... Carter produced his best performance in an Irish uniform against Louisville as he scored a career-high 24 points on 8-11 shooting from the field, including a 4-6 performance from three-point range ... In addition, he grabbed six rebounds while playing 38 minutes ... He reached the 20-point mark for the second time this season against Marguette when he scored 20 points and followed that up with a 21-point effort against Providence on Wednesday evening ... He followed that up with 22-point effort on Saturday against DePaul ... Carter has posted 16 double-figure scoring efforts in 2005-06.

Big Luke:

Freshman Luke Zeller has performed well for the Irish this season and is averaging 3.7 points and 3.4 rebounds ... He keyed Notre Dame's victory over Hofstra when he scored six points and grabbed nine rebounds (eight in the second half) and was instrumental in the Irish second-half comeback against Michigan with two three-pointers as he finished with eight points and grabbed six rebounds in 23 minutes of action ... He was held scoreless and without a rebound in the first half against Niagara, but responded with four points and seven boards in the final stanza ... He chipped in three offensive rebounds en route to a five-board night against Columbia ... Against Fordham, he scored a career-high 11 points and was one rebound away from being the first Notre Dame freshman to record a double-double since Torin Francis in 2002-03 ... Against Pittsburgh, he turned in his second consecutive 11-point effort to help the Irish battle the Panthers in a double-overtime shootout ... Irish Among Best In Wins Average:

Over the last six years, Notre Dame is one of 25 teams nationally that has averaged better than 20 wins per season ... The Irish have compiled a 123-71 record for a .634 winning percentage after finishing 22-15 (1999-2000), 20-10 (2000-01), 21-11 (2001-02), 24-10 (2002-03), 19-13 (2003-04) and 17-12 (2004-05).

Keeping It Close:

In the 68 losses suffered by Irish teams in Mike Brey's four seasons, only 16 have been by 10 or more points and have been by a combined 451 points for an average of 6.6 points ... Notre Dame's biggest losses have been on the road at Pittsburgh (72-55 on January 6, 2003) and against Arizona (88-71 on March 27, 2003) in the West Regional semifinal in Anaheim, Calif.... Prior to those setbacks, the worst defeat was a 16-point decision at Connecticut during Brey's first season ... Notre Dame's 11 losses during the 2001-02 season were by a combined 49 points for an average margin of defeat of 4.5 points ... Only one loss that season (versus Georgetown at the Joyce Center) was by double figures, while eight of those setbacks were by five or less points.

Irish Athletes Fare Well In Graduation Success Rate Survey

Sixteen of 20 athletics programs at the University of Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 90 percent, according to a new measurement developed by the NCAA.

The Graduation Success Rate (GSR) was created to more accurately reflect actual graduation rates by including transfer data in the calculation. The graduation rate methodology used for the past decade by the Department of Education counts all student-athletes who transfer from or leave an institution for any reason as nongraduates from their initial school, even if they leave in good academic standing.

College and university presidents asked the NCAA to develop a new methodology that takes into account the mobility among students in today's higher education environment. Research indicates that approximately 60 percent of all new bachelor's degree recipients are attending more than one undergraduate institution during their collegiate careers.

NČAA figures released today showed that, among Notre Dame's men's sports, baseball, cross country/track, fencing, ice hockey, soccer, swimming and tennis achieved 100 percent GSR scores. Football scored 96 percent, golf was 92 percent and basketball was 90 percent. (Lacrosse is not included because the program did not offer grants in aid during the years covered in the survey.)

The Irish women's programs with a GSR of 100 percent were basketball, cross country/track, fencing, golf, lacrosse, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Soccer scored a 94 percent GSR.

Among the 119 NCAA Division I-A institutions, Notre Dame had the highest percentage of its sports with 100 percent scores, with a .800 figure (16 of 20). Here are the top 10 in that category:

In addition to the GSR, the NCAA will continue to compile data and release results based upon the federally mandated methodology.

Notre Dame Student-Athletes Lead The Way In National Graduate Rate

The graduation rate for student-athletes at the University of Notre Dame is the highest in the nation among Division I-A colleges and universities in an annual federal report for the Department of Education, and is the second-highest in a new survey developed by the NCAA.

Notre Dame's federal graduation rate is 90.4 percent, according to statistics released (Jan. 19) by the NCAA, slightly ahead of Duke University at 89.6 percent as the best among the major football-playing schools of Division I-A. The federal rate is based on the raw percentage of student-athletes who entered an institution and graduated within six years. Students who leave or transfer, regardless of academic standing, are considered nongraduates.

Notre Dame ranks second among Division I-A schools on another scale, called the Graduation Success Rate (GSR), which was developed last year by the NCAA. The University's 98 percent GSR is second only to the 99 percent of the U.S. Naval Academy, which, like all the military academies, is exempt from the federal survey because it does not offer grants-in-aid to student-athletes.

Road Warriors:

In Mike Brey's five-plus seasons, his Irish teams have compiled a road record of 46-40 (.535) ... That includes a 31-29 mark (.526) in true road games and a 15-11 (.577) record in neutral site contests.

BIG EAST Formula For Success Under Brey:

Since his arrival at Notre Dame, Brey has led Notre Dame to a 55-41 (.573) record in BIG EAST regular-season games and a 2-5 mark in tournament play for an overall record of 57-45 (.559) against league foes ... In Brey's first season, the Irish posted their first-ever winning record in BIG EAST play and won the BIG EAST West Division title with an 11-5 mark ... Heading into today's game against Georgetown, Notre Dame has hit at least one three-pointer in 234 straight games, a mark that dates back to the 1998-99 campaign ... The last time an Irish team failed to hit a three-pointer was a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 12, 1999 as Notre Dame finished 0-7 from beyond the arc in the game.

Over The Century Mark:

The 102-91 victory over Seton Hall on Feb. 18 marked the sixth time Notre Dame scored 100-plus points during the Mike Brey era ... The last 100-point effort by an Irish team prior to that game was in a 101-96 overtime decision at Boston College on Jan. 25, 2003.

Threes Fall For Falls:

In 88 career outings, 220 of Colin Falls' 262 field goals have come from three-point range ... That translates into 84.0 percent ... Ninetynine of his 114 field goals this season have come from three-point range (78.9) ... Overall during his career, he has connected on 220 of 552 three-point attempts for 39.9 accuracy from the field.

Another Way To Get His Three Points:

He earned the recognition for the first time the week of Dec. 12 after averaging 15.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in wins over Alabama and Florida International ... Against the Crimson Tide, he scored 14 points and grabbed nine rebounds and followed up that performance with 16 points, seven rebounds, three blocked shots, two steals and two assists versus the Golden Panthers ... Francis also was named to the honor roll this week after scoring 24 points and grabbing 11 rebounds against IPFW in Notre Dame's 65-63 win ... He copped his third honor Feb. 8 following his 21-point and seven-rebound effort against Rutgers.

Mr. Indiana:

When former standout Chris Thomas (2001-05) entered Notre Dame in the fall of 2001, he became the first Mr. Indiana Basketball to play for the Irish. Thomas, who graduated in May of 2005 and finished as the school's career leader in nine categories, earned the honor in 2001. History repeated itself four years later when current freshman Luke Zeller copped the state's top honor in 2005.
