## PROVIDENCE TO FACE NOTRE DAME

Providence College will play its second BIG EAST Conference match of the season on Sunday, October 3 against Notre Dame in Notre Dame, Ind. It will mark the first game for the Friars in Notre Dame's new Alumni Stadium.

## FRIARS HEAD WEST

Providence's trip to Notre Dame will mark the second of its four trips to the midwest this season. The Friars have played at Michigan State and also will play at DePaul and Marquette.

## SERIES HISTORY VERSUS NOTRE DAME

The Fighting Irish hold a 12-2-1 edge in the all-time series against the Friars. Most recently, Notre Dame defeated Providence, 1-0, in double overtime on October 10, 2009. UND scored with 51 seconds left in the second overtime to earn the win in Providence. The Friars' last victory against the Fighting Irish was on October 8, 2000 when they posted a 3-1 result at Glaxo Field.

## WHAT'S NEXT

After the match against Notre Dame, Providence will play three consecutive home matches at Glaxo Field in a span of one week. The Friars will play a non-conference match against Boston University before playing conference foes Georgetown and No. 3/4 Connecticut. Providence has posted a 3-1 home record this season.

## MARCIN NAMED TO BIG EAST WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

Senior Matt Marcin (Wilmington, Del.) was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on Monday, September 27. Marcin scored the lone goal of the match as Providence defeated Northeastern, 1-0, in Brookline, Mass. on September 21. It marked his first goal of the season. On September 25, he netted one goal in PC's 2-1 loss to No. 8/10 Louisville.

**LAST TIME OUT**

In its last match, Providence defeated Harvard, 2-1, Wednesday night in Cambridge, Mass. It marked Providence's first win over Harvard since September 12, 1999. Sophomore Keith Jecewiz (Smithtown, N.Y.) scored his first career goal to give the Friars a 1-0 lead in the 36th minute as classmate Marc Cintron (Piscataway, N.J.) assisted on the goal. The Friars doubled their lead with two seconds remaining in the first half when Matt Marcin connected on his third goal of the season. Jecewiz assisted on Marcin's goal. The Crimson cut the Friars' lead to 2-1 as Jamie Rees scored just 1:55 into the second half, but the Friars thwarted Harvard's chances the rest of the way to earn their second consecutive road victory. Red-shirt junior goalkeeper Jhojan Obando (Kissimmee, Fla.) made five saves for PC, including three in the first half.

**SCOUTING NOTRE DAME**

Notre Dame is coming off a 1-1 double overtime tie at Northwestern Wednesday night. Steven Perry scored the equalizer in the 79th minute for the Fighting Irish, who outshot the Wildcats, 30-16. Prior to that match, UND defeated St. John's, 1-0, in the BIG EAST Conference opener on September 25. Perry leads the team in scoring with four goals, while Will Walsh has played in seven games in goal and has posted four shutouts.

**MARCIN ON GOAL SCORING STREAK**

Matt Marcin, who did not score a goal in his first five matches, has scored in three consecutive games and is now tied for the team lead with three goals and one assist. Marcin netted his first goal of the season in a 1-0 win at Northeastern on September 21. Four days later, he recorded his second goal in a 2-1 loss to No. 8/10 Louisville. On September 29, Marcin's goal with two seconds left in the first half proved to be the difference as Providence posted a 2-1 victory at Harvard.

**ARBOLEDA LEADING PROVIDENCE IN SCORING**

Wilder Arboleda, who red-shirted his freshman season, is tied for the Providence lead in scoring with seven points on three goals and one assist. He made his first career start on September 15 against Sacred Heart and scored two goals as the Friars prevailed, 3-1. In the following match on September 18, Arboleda netted the only goal of the match as Providence defeated Quinnipiac, 1-0. For his efforts, he was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on September 20.

**PROVIDENCE ON THE ROAD**

After a loss to No. 17/23 Michigan State on September 9, Providence has won its last two road matches. The Friars captured their first win away from Glay Field on September 21 when they earned a 1-0 result at Northeastern. On September 29, Providence posted a 2-1 triumph at Harvard. Last season, the Friars won four consecutive road games towards the end of the season to finish with a 6-4 road record.

**OBANDO LEADING THE WAY IN GOAL**

Jhojan Obando, who is in his first season as the starting goalkeeper, has played in every game for the Friars this season. He is tied for seventh in the BIG EAST with three shutouts and also ranks in the top-seven with 32 saves. He made a career-high 10 stops in a 1-0 win at Northeastern on September 21. He also posted shutouts against Sacred Heart (four saves) on September 15 and Quinnipiac (three saves) on September 18.

**PROVIDENCE CLAIMS FIRST EVER OCEAN STATE CLASSIC**

Providence College captured the inaugural Ocean Classic on September 6. The Friars played Brown to a scoreless double overtime draw, but earned the Classic with a 5-4 shootout victory. Wilder Arboleda converted the decisive penalty kick. Jhojan Obando stopped Brown's second penalty kick, while the Friars were flawless in their attempts. Providence made it to the championship game with a 2-1 home victory against rival Rhode Island on September 2. Senior Bryan Minogue (Miller Place, N.Y.), junior Daniel Fabian (Southbury, Conn.), freshman Greg Davis (Jamaica, N.Y.) and Obando were named to the All-Tournament Team. Minogue was named Defensive MVP.



## CHAKA DALEY

Head Coach • 11th Season • Providence College, 1996

### AS PROVIDENCE HEAD COACH

- Chaka Daley is entering his 11th season as head coach at Providence College.
- Daley, who was appointed the third head coach in the history of the program just prior to the start of 2000 season, has led the Friars to the NCAA Tournament three times during the last four years.
- The 2009 campaign was another successful season for Providence as it registered a 10-7-3 record and posted its fifth consecutive winning season for the first time since 1983-87.
- Providence recorded three consecutive victories to complete the regular season and earned a spot in the BIG EAST Championship.
- Providence then posted road wins at Villanova and at No.8 Connecticut. It marked Providence's first win at UConn since 1984. In addition, the win was the fifth consecutive triumph and it also marked the first time since 1984 that the Friars won five straight games.
- In 2008, Providence finished with a 9-7-3 overall record, advanced to the BIG EAST Quarterfinals, but fell just short of a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth.
- The Friars posted wins over three ranked teams, including No. 10 UConn. It marked PC's first win over UConn since 1997. The Friars, who were ranked as high as 17th nationally, recorded their fourth-consecutive winning season.
- In 2007, the Friars finished with a 9-8-2 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in school history.
- In addition, the Friars posted a 5-4-2 record in the BIG EAST. It marked the first time ever that the Friars enjoyed back-to-back winning seasons in the league. Among the big wins was a 1-0 result at Boston College, which was the top overall seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2006, Daley led the Friars to another remarkable season. PC posted a 13-7 overall record, including a 7-4 mark in league play. The seven BIG EAST wins set a school record, while the 13 overall victories were one shy of a school mark (14 set in 1984). The Friars were ranked in the national polls for six-consecutive weeks.
- PC defeated Rutgers for the first time in school history and recorded its first win over Brown since 1993.
- The Friars advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament, where they hosted Louisville in the first round. PC defeated Louisville, 2-0, then posted

a 2-0 win at Cincinnati in the quarterfinals and advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the third time in four seasons.

- Daley also coached Ryan Maduro, who was selected to the NSCAA Division I All-America First Team, thus becoming the second Friar to be named to the All-America First Team in the 40-year history of the program. Daley also coached three players who earned All-BIG EAST honors, a first in the program's history.
- In 2005, he guided his team to one of the most impressive seasons in the history of Friar soccer as the squad advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Friars registered a 7-4-9 mark and recorded one of the most improved records in NCAA history. The Friars finished 9.5 games better than the 2004 season, which tied the team for the 10th best turnaround in NCAA history. The team started the season with a nine-game unbeaten streak (4-0-5), which was the longest by a PC team since the 1972 team was undefeated through 10 games.
- Daley's team finished with a regular season record of 5-3-7, which included 3-3-4 mark in league play. He also led the Friars to their first win in BIG EAST Tournament play since 1984 with a 2-1 victory at Cincinnati on November 2, 2005 in the First Round. Daley then led the Friars back to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the second time in three years as they earned a 2-2 tie at No.21 Seton Hall and advanced when they won the penalty kick shootout, 4-2. In the semifinals, PC earned a 0-0 tie against 16th-ranked USF, but were defeated in the penalty kick shootout, 3-2.
- On November 14, it was announced that the Friars had been selected to participate in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. It marked the first time since 1983 and just the second time ever that the Friars advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Daley continued to lead the Friars to new heights as they earned their first NCAA Tournament win ever when they defeated 13th-ranked Hofstra, 1-0, in overtime in the First Round on November 18. The Friars magical season came to an end when they were defeated in the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament at No. 2 North Carolina, 2-0, on November 22.
- In recognition of his strong coaching performance, Daley earned the NSCAA Division I New England Coach of the Year honors and was one of eight finalists for the NSCAA/Adidas National Coach of the Year accolades.
- In 2003, Daley led his team to one of its best finishes as the team placed seventh of 13 teams during the regular season and advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the first time since 1987. In the opening game of the BIG EAST

Tournament, the Friars posted a dramatic come-from-behind, 2-2, tie with 23rd-ranked Virginia Tech. The Friars then defeated the Hokies in a penalty kick shootout to advance to the league Semifinals where they lost, 1-0, to eventual BIG EAST Champions, Notre Dame.

- Daley's 2002 squad posted a 7-11-0 overall record and a 5-5-0 mark in league play which was good for a seventh place tie in the league standings and a spot in the BIG EAST Tournament for the first time since 1998. The five BIG EAST wins marked a personal-high for Daley.

### AS PROVIDENCE ASSISTANT COACH

- Daley replaced former Friar Head Coach Brian Ainscough, who led the rebuilding effort at Providence for five seasons. Daley served as Ainscough's top assistant for four seasons. During his time as an assistant to Ainscough, Daley handled a variety of duties for the Friars, including assisting with the team's defense and overseeing a number of administrative duties.
- A 1996 graduate of Providence, Daley brought solid credentials to the head coaching position. Besides being credited with helping turn around the Friar program as an assistant coach, Daley earned four varsity letters while playing for the black and white. He is one of the top players to ever play at Providence.

### AS PROVIDENCE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- He began his playing career with the Friars as a defender. Daley played his second and third seasons at the forward position before being shifted to defense again as a senior by Ainscough. Throughout his career, Daley recorded nine goals and six assists in 69 games.

### PROFESSIONAL PLAYING EXPERIENCE

- Daley, a native of Toronto, Ontario, played professional soccer after graduating from Providence.
- On June 14, 1999, he signed with the New England Revolution, becoming the first former-Friar to play in the MLS. Prior to signing with the Revolution, Daley played for the Revolution's A-League affiliate, the Boston Bulldogs.
- He also spent one season with the Rhode Island Stingrays of the USL from 1996-97.
