1	Naismith Award and Wooden Award watch list selections on the 2016-17 Irish roster - senior forward V.J. Beachem (16.9 ppg, .459 FG%, .415 3FG% in seven games this season).
3	Notre Dame is the only team in the country with three players ranked in the top-40 in the nation for FT shooting - Matt Farrell (19-19, 1.000), Steve Vasturia (20-21, .952) and Bonzie Colson (40-44, .909). 8	A win over North Carolina A&T will give the Irish eight victories to start the 2016-17 season, matching the 2010-11 team for the best start of the Mike Brey era.

NORTH CAROLINA A&T AT A GLANCE:

North Carolina A&T is located in Greensboro, North Carolina and is a member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. The Aggies have made 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and earned the program's first NCAA victory in 2013, defeating Liberty 73-72 in a First Four game before falling to number-one seeded Louisville. North Carolina A&T finished the 2015-16 season with a 10-21 record and 7-9 in the MEAC. In 2016-17, the Aggies are 1-5, defeating Greensboro College in their home opener and will face North Dakota State on Friday, Dec. 2.

Sunday will mark the first-ever meeting between Notre Dame and North Carolina A&T in men's basketball.

THE 'DICE' MAN RETURNS:

Ray 'Dice' Martin returns to Notre Dame this weekend as an assistant coach with North Carolina A&T. Martin, whose coaching career has ranged over five decades after earning his degree from Notre Dame in 1977, played four years under Digger Phelps, was a team captain and a member of the team that ended UCLA's 88-game win streak on Jan. 19, 1974.

In that legendary contest Martin, then a freshman, was inserted into the lineup late in the game as the Irish made a stunning comeback over the Bruins. Martin took a charge from Keith Wilkes in the game's final minute to set up the final game-winning field goal from Dwight Clay.

Martin's coaching career has seen him criss-cross the country. Early in his career he was a member of Jim Valvano's 1983 NC State coaching staff that shocked Houston in the NCAA Championship game. Martin was the head coach at Long Island, while also making coaching stops at SMU, Tennessee, Shaw, Florida Atlantic, Miami (Ohio), South Carolina State, UMBC, North Carolina Central and Grambling.

"I would really call him an educator," Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey says of Martin. "There's a lot of young people in the college game, through his different coaching stops, who have benefited from his relationship. He's one of the good guys in the business. He's a class act. I think every young person who comes in touch with him feels good about himself.

"Ray Martin was a heck of a basketball player for us and a great guard coming out of New York City. I was younger, but I knew the name Dice Martin, growing up in D.C."

DOUBLE-DOUBLE TIMES FOUR FOR COLSON:

Junior Bonzie Colson has made the most of a significant increase in playing time this season as Notre Dame's top option in the post to compile a great start to his third season in an Irish uniform.

In the Legends Classic semifinal victory over Colorado, Colson led the Irish with 22 points and 12 rebounds - while also shooting 9-of-9 at the free throw line and collecting two steals.

He followed up with 13 points and 11 rebounds in the championship game victory over Northwestern while playing a team-high 38 minutes.

The double-double streak continued against Chicago State, as Colson logged 10 points and 11 rebounds.

In the ACC/Big Ten Challenge matchup against Iowa, Colson played perhaps his finest game yet this season, scoring 24 points with a career-high 17 rebounds for his fourth double-double this season and eighth of his career.

THE ULTIMATE WEAPON - THE FREE THROW LINE:

Notre Dame is second in the country (as of Dec. 2) in free throw percentage, shooting 84.5 percent (125-148) from the charity stripe this season. Here are some of the superlatives for the team from its free throw shooting -

- Junior Matt Farrell is tied with five other players in the country with a perfect 1.000 shooting percentage from the free throw line (19-19).
- Dating back to the 2015-16 season, Farrell has connected on 23 consecutive free throws.
- Farrell is the first Notre Dame player in the Brey era to begin the season connecting on their first 19 free throw attempts.
- Farrell combines with Steve Vasturia (ninth, 20-21, .952) to give Notre Dame the only team in the country with two players in the national top 10 for free throw shooting.
- Farrell and Vasturia combine with Bonzie Colson (39th, 40-44, .909) to give Notre Dame the only team in the country with three players in the top 40 for free throw shooting.
- Colson's 12-for-12 effort at the free throw line against Iowa tied four other ND players for fourth-best in school history.

CAREER PERFORMANCE BY RYAN:

Sophomore forward Matt Ryan connected on his first five shots of the game - all of them three pointers - in the victory over Chicago State on Nov. 26. Ryan eventually finished the game 7-of-14 from three point range to score a career-high 23 points.

The seven three point field goals tie 13 other performances for third on the all-time single-game list at Notre Dame - and is the most recent occurrence since Pat Connaughton connected on seven three pointers against Villanova on Feb. 18, 2012.

The Cortlandt Manor, New York, native missed a few weeks of practice before the season began and is back to full strength for the Irish.

VASTURIA REACHES CAREER MILESTONE:

Senior captain Steve Vasturia entered the Legends Classic final against Northwestern needing 18 points to reach 1,000 points in his career.

Not only did Vasturia reach that milestone, he might have played the best all-around game of his career against the Wildcats. The Medford, New Jersey, native grabbed a career-high eight rebounds to go along with 18 points, three assists and three steals.

Vasturia is the 59th Notre Dame player to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

NOTRE DAME REACHES 1800-WIN MILESTONE:

Notre Dame's 84-79 victory at Illinois on Dec. 2, 2015 marked the 1800th win in program history. The Fighting Irish are 1825-984 (.649) all-time in 112 seasons.

Notre Dame ranks seventh in Division I in all-time program wins behind Kentucky, Kansas, North Carolina, Duke, Temple and Syracuse (see top 10 wins list, page three of this notes package). The Irish have improved five spots in the all-time wins list since Mike Brey took over the program for the 2000-01 season, surpassing Indiana, Oregon State, Pennsylvania and St. John's.

Notre Dame is the only NCAA program to rank in the top 10 for men's basketball and football victories.

IRISH MATCH SECOND-BEST START OF THE BREY ERA:

Notre Dame enters the game against North Carolina A&T with a 7-0 record, the third time in the Mike Brey era (since 2000-01) the Irish have started the year with seven consecutive wins.

The 2010-11 team won its first eight games (also the most recent season the Irish won an in-season tournament - the 2010 Old Spice Classic), while the 2001-02 team won its first seven games.

V.J. BEACHEM'S MARCH MOMENTUM CONTINUES:

Senior V.J. Beachem's memorable run in March, when he averaged over 17 points per game and was named the NCAA East All-Regional Team, has continued in the first six games of the 2016-17 season.

Beachem is on a career-best 12-game streak of double-digit scoring performances dating back to the start of postseason play and the victory over Duke in the ACC Championship Quarterfinals on March 11, 2016. Over that run, he is averaging 16.8 points per game, shooting .471 from three-point range and .530 from the floor.

Notre Dame has made at least one three-pointer in 589 straight contests dating back to the 1998-99 campaign. The Fighting Irish have made at least one three pointer during every game of the Mike Brey era. The last time an Irish team failed to hit a three-pointer in a game was in a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 12, 1999. Notre Dame finished 0-7 from beyond the arc in that contest.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS:

Not only did Notre Dame advance to the NCAA Championship Elite Eight for the second consecutive season for the first time since 1978-79, but the Irish combined for six NCAA tournament wins over the past two seasons - the most in program history over a two-year stretch. The previous high was Notre Dame's three wins in 1978 (the team's lone appearance in the Final Four) and two victories the next season.

The Irish were the only team in the nation to advance to the Elite Eight in both the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons and the back-to-back regional final games are a first for the program since the NCAA tournament expanded to 64 or more teams in 1985.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

For the first time in the Mike Brey era, the Irish head coach was tasked with replacing two assistant coaches in the same season. Long time aides Martin Ingelsby accepted the Delaware head coaching job (the same first-time Division I job Brey assumed in 1995-96) while Anthony Solomon joined the Georgetown coaching staff in the offseason.

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 stand out shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

LEGENDS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS:

Notre Dame claimed its first in-season tournament title since 2010 with a 70-66 victory over Northwestern on Tuesday, Nov. 22, in the championship game of the 2016 Legends Classic at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The four victories for the Irish in the tournament (over Bryant, Seattle, Colorado and Northwestern) mark the most the Irish have ever won in an in-season tournament. The trophy was the first in-season award claimed by the Irish since they won three games in 2010 to claim the Old Spice Classic at Disney's Wide World of Sports. Previous to the 2010 Old Spice victory, Notre Dame's most recent in-season tournament title came at the Hawaii-Pacific Thanksgiving Classic in 2001.

LEGENDS CLASSIC MVP:

Bridgegewater, New Jersey, native Matt Farrell enjoyed his return to the Barclays Center, not far from the area where he played during his prep career, for the Legends Classic semifinal and final victories over Colorado and Northwestern, respectively.

Farrell, whose first two career starts came in Notre Dame's two NCAA tournament victories over Michigan and Stephen F. Austin in the Barclays Center during March of 2016, played a career-best game in the semifinal over Colorado, scoring 20 points with six assists and three steals.

He followed up that performance with 18 points and six assists against Northwestern in the championship game, including scoring Notre Dame's final five points in the come-from-behind victory.

With a 19 point-per-game average in the two games at Barclays Center, along with 6.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game, Farrell was the easy choice as the tournament's most valuable player.

BARCLAYS CENTER SUCCESS:

Notre Dame's victory over Northwestern in the 2016 Legends Classic championship game marked the program's fifth-straight victory in the home of the 2017 ACC Championship.

NOTRE DAME HELPS LEAGUE WIN THE ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE:

Notre Dame boasts a 3-1 record in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and avenged its only loss in the event with a 92-78 victory over Iowa on Tuesday, Nov. 29.

The Irish will be hosted the event for just the second time at Purcell Pavilion in the win over the Hawkeyes, with their other two victories coming last season at Illinois, where the Irish spoiled the dedication game of the State Farm Center with a victory over the Illini and in 2014 over #19/18 Michigan State in overtime at home.

The ACC ended up taking the ACC/Big Ten Challenge with a 9-4 record, claiming a victory in the event for the first time since 2008.
