HOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS: Notre Dame closes out the first half of the 2010-11 season this weekend with a pair of games versus the Northern Michigan Wildcats at the Joyce Center on Sat.-Sun., Dec. 11-12. Saturday's game has a 7:05 p.m. start time while Sunday's game starts at 4:05 p.m. Sunday's contest will be televised live by Comcast Television in Michigan with Matt Shepard and Lyle Phair calling the action. The game will be available to South Bend Comcast subscribers on local channel 3. On Sunday afternoon, the Irish also will sponsor a Teddy Bear Toss where fans will be able to throw a Teddy Bear on the ice following the first Notre Dame goal of the game. The Teddy Bears will then benefit Toys for Tots and go to needy children in the area this Christmas. Following the game, fans will have the opportunity to Skate with the Irish on the Joyce Center ice with a visit from Santa Claus included. Notre Dame brings a 10-5-2 overall record into the series and is 8-3-1-1 in the CCHA, good for 26 points and second place in the conference. The Irish are one point behind first-place Miami and one point ahead of third-place Michigan in the league standings. Notre Dame has two games in hand versus the RedHawks. The Irish split a weekend series at Miami last week, winning 5-4 on Friday and losing a 5-2 decision on Saturday. Northern Michigan is 7-7-3 on the year and 6-4-2 in the CCHA and is tied for fourth with Alaska and Ferris State with 20 points. The Wildcats had a win and a tie last weekend at home versus Western Michigan, winning 3-1 and then tying the Broncos, 4-4. WMU picked up the extra point in the shootout. Following Sunday's game, the Irish will break for finals and the Christmas holidays and won't be in action until Wed., Dec., 29 when they play host to Canisius in a 7:05 p.m. game at the Joyce Center.

IRISH VERSUS WILDCATS: Notre Dame and Northern Michigan have met 46 times in the all-time series with the Wildcats holding a 21-19-6 edge in the series. At the Joyce Center, the series is even with each team winning 10 and losing 10 with four ties. Last season, the teams played twice at Notre Dame with Northern taking a 3-2 win and the Irish winning the shootout after a 2-2 tie the following night. Notre Dame is 6-3-1 in the last 10 meetings with the Wildcats, including five consecutive wins during the 2008-09 season. The teams will meet again on Jan. 7-8 in Marquette, Mich. for games three and four of the series.

OH CANADA: The Irish will be without the services of sophomore center **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** this weekend as he is one of 39 players to be selected to attend Canada's World Junior Selection Camp, Dec. 12-15, at Mastercard Arena in Toronto. From that group, the 22-man roster for the IIHF World Junior Championships will be selected. A 2010 first round draft choice of the Detroit Red Wings, Sheahan is one of four NCAA Division I college players invited to the Selection Camp. For the Irish this season, Sheahan has played in all 17 games and has six assists. The World Junior Championships will be held in Buffalo, N.Y., Dec. 26 to Jan. 5, 2011.

THE RANKINGS: Notre Dame enters the weekend series with Northern Michigan ranked 11th in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and the USCHO.com poll. Northern Michigan is receiving votes in the USCHO.com poll.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Last weekend's series at Miami closed out a grueling stretch of the schedule for Notre Dame as it closed out a four-game road streak, a streak of nine of the last 11 games since Oct. 31 on the road, and a stretch of four consecutive weekends versus teams that were ranked in the national polls. Starting on Nov. 12-13 the Irish faced #9/#8 Michigan in Ann Arbor, Mich where they split with the Wolverines. On Nov. 19-20, the Irish played host to rv/#17 Michigan State at the Joyce Center, taking two wins versus the Spartans. The weekend of Nov. 26-27 saw the Irish face #10/#9 North Dakota in Grand Forks where they had a loss and a tie. Against #6/#6 Miami last weekend, the Irish again had a split to give them a 4-3-1 record in the eight games against ranked teams.

MIAMI RECAP:

Friday, Dec. 3 - For the second Friday in a row, Notre Dame fell behind 2-0 after the first period only this time the Irish rallied for a 5-4 win over Miami, overcoming a pair of two-goal RedHawk leads. Freshman right wing **Bryan Rust (Novi, Mich.)** led the Irish with two goals and one assist while **Ryan Guentzel (Sr., Woodbury, Minn.)**, **Nick Larson (So., Apple Valley, Minn.)** and **T.J. Tynan** added single goals in the win. **Anders Lee (Fr., Edina, Minn.)** had a career-high three assists in the game. Trent Vogelhuber, Reilly Smith, Carter Camper and Matt Tomassoni scored for the RedHawks. Vogelhuber and Smith scored for Miami in the final 3:15 of the first period to give Miami its 2-0 lead. Rust got his first goal of the night at 2:28 of the second when he beat Cody Reichard with a backhand to make it 2-1. Camper scored on the power play at 18:18 to give the RedHawks their second two-goal lead at 3-1. Before the end of the second period, the Irish struck again, this time Guentzel got his third of the year at 19:32 to cut the lead to 3-2. In the third, Rust picked up his second of the night at 5:23 to make it 3-3. Larson's goal at 9:37 of the third gave the Irish their first lead of the night. Tomassoni tied it at 16:44 with his third of the season only to see Tynan team with Lee and Rust to get the game winner at 17:24. Notre Dame out shot Miami, 23-22 for the night. **Mike Johnson (So., Verona, Wis.)** made 18 saves as did Reichard in the Miami goal. The RedHawks were 2-for-4 on the power play while the Irish were 0-for-2.

Saturday, Dec. 4 - The Miami RedHawks broke open a 1-0 game in the second period, scoring four times in the middle stanza, on the way to a 5-2 win over the Irish. Alden Hirshfeld scored three goals in a 7:05 span in the second period while Garrett Kennedy and Trent Vogelhuber scored solo goals for Miami in the win. Notre Dame got second-period goals from **Billy Maday (Jr., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** and **Jeff Costello (Fr., Milwaukee, Wis.)** in the loss. Freshman goaltender **Steven Summerhays (Anchorage, Alaska)** got his first start in goal since Nov. 6 and played the first 40 minutes, giving up five goals on 15 shots to take the loss. **Mike Johnson** played the final 20 minutes, making eight saves. The Irish were 1-for-9 on the power play while Miami was 0-for-3. The two teams combined for 86 minutes in penalties with the Irish getting 10 for 36 minutes and the RedHawks 14 for 50.

TYNAN HONORED: Notre Dame freshman center **T.J. Tynan** was named the Hockey Commissioners' Association rookie of the month for November to add to his honors this month after being named CCHA rookie of the month for the month of November. In eight games during November, Tynan led all CCHA rookies with six goals and six assists for 12 points. Two goals came on the power play, two were short-handed and one was a game winner. He was +5 for the month and took just 19 shots for a .316 shooting percentage. During November, Tynan scored in seven of the team's eight games with five of the contests being multiple-point games. He was named the CCHA rookie of the month on two occasions - for games the week of Nov. 1 and Nov. 8. Tynan is the second Irish player to take CCHA rookie of the month honors this season as teammate **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)** was October's winner.

COMING FROM BEHIND: Notre Dame rallied from a pair of two-goal deficits (2-0 after one period and 3-1 in the second period) on Dec. 3 at Miami and won for the first time this season when trailing after two periods of play. The Irish are now 1-4-0 when trailing after two periods.

CAREER NIGHTS: Two members of Notre Dame's freshman class set career highs in the win over Miami on Dec. 3. Right wing **Bryan Rust** set career highs for goals (2) and points in a game (3) with his three-point night. Left wing **Anders Lee** had a career high with three assists in the contest and equaled a career high with three points in the game.

HOME WINNING STREAK: Notre Dame's sweep of Michigan State (Nov. 19-20) gives the Irish six straight wins at home this season and an eight-game home winning streak dating back to Jan. 30 of last season. The last time that the Irish lost at home was on Jan. 29, 2010, a 5-3 loss to Nebraska-Omaha. The eight-game home win streak is the longest for Notre Dame since the Irish won eight in a row at home between Oct. 12, 2006 and Dec. 31, 2006.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame's freshmen class has played a key role in the 10-5-2 start for the Irish. In the Dec. 3 win over Miami, members of the freshman class accounted for 11 (3g, 8a) of the team's 13 points on the night. Nine members of the 12-man class saw action in

the game with freshman **Steven Summerhays** serving as the back up in goal. The following night, the freshmen added a goal and an assist with **Jeff Costello** scoring on the power play and defenseman **Shayne Taker (Surrey, B.C.)** getting an assist. In the first 17 games of this season, the freshman class has accounted for 36 of the team's 61 goals (59.0%), 49 of the 107 assists (45.8%) and 84 of team's 168 points this season (50.0%). Summerhays has two of the team's 10 wins in goal.

CAREER YEAR: Senior right wing **Ryan Guentzel** is currently second on the Irish in scoring after 17 games as he has three goals and 15 assists for 18 points on the year. The assist and points totals are career highs for Guentzel who had a seven-game point streak (1g, 9a) snapped at Michigan on Nov. 13. He has now scored goals in two of his last four games. His previous best season was 2008-09 when he had four goals and seven assists for 11 points. He is currently sixth in the CCHA in scoring with 18 points and his 15 assists are third in the conference.

SHOOTING THE PUCK: Through the first 17 games of the season, Notre Dame has the edge in shots in a game 13 times while being tied once and the opposition outshooting the Irish three times. After being out shot in both games of the series at North Dakota, Notre Dame out shot Miami in both games of that series (23-22 and 29-23). Versus North Dakota, Notre Dame was out shot in both games with the Fighting Sioux

setting season highs for an Irish opponent in both games. On Nov. 26, North Dakota out shot the Irish 39-30. The following night, the Sioux had a 41-28 margin for the overtime contest. Through the first 17 games, Notre Dame has had 522 shots on goal for a 30.7 shots per game average. Opponents have fired 453 shots on the Irish goal for a 26.6 shot per game average.

BEST OF THE BEST: Over the past four seasons, the Notre Dame hockey program ranks among the top five programs in the country. Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Irish have won 113 games and have a .672 winning percentage. The Irish are third in that time period in wins, trailing Michigan (123) and Miami (119). Notre Dame's .672 winning percentage is also third behind Miami (.690) and Michigan (.681). Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage since 2006-07.

DOING IT SHORT-HANDED: Notre Dame's penalty-killing unit was at it again in the 2-2 tie with North Dakota as the Irish racked up their seventh short-handed goal of the season with **T.J. Tynan** getting his second of the year. Versus Michigan State (Nov. 19-20), Notre Dame scored short-handed three times in that series. The seven short-handed goals lead the nation going into this weekend's series and is already three more than the team had in 2009-10. The seven shorties are the most for the Irish since the 1997-98 season when they had nine. Notre Dame has a way to go for the school record which is 19 and was set during the 1981-82 season. Tynan and defenseman **Joe Lavin (Sr., Shrewsbury, Mass.)** lead the team with two each while **Sean Lorenz (Sr., Littleton, Colo.)**, **Bryan Rust (Fr., Novi, Mich.)** and **Billy Maday (Jr., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** have one each. On the season, the Irish have seven short-handed goals and have given up just 10 power-play goals.

PENALTY SHOTS: Senior center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** was awarded a penalty shot just 22 seconds into the Nov. 20 game with Michigan State and was stopped by goaltender Will Yanakeff. It was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Jan. 31, 2009 when **Ryan Thang '10**, scored in a 3-2 win at Michigan. It was the fourth for the Irish since the 2001-02 season. They are 2-for-4 in that span. The last time the opposition had a penalty shot against the Irish came on Dec. 4, 2009 when Miami's Carter Camper was stopped by **Mike Johnson**.

SHOOTOUT FACTS AND FIGURES: Notre Dame's shootout win over Western Michigan on Oct. 30 was the first for Notre Dame in CCHA play since Nov. 19, 2009 against Michigan State. The Irish had lost four consecutive CCHA shootouts. Last season, Notre Dame was 2-5 in the shootout in CCHA games and 3-5 overall. The extra win was a shootout win in the championship game of the Shillelagh Tournament. In the three seasons that the CCHA has had the shootout, the Irish are 6-5 all-time (3-0 in '08-'09; 2-5 in '09-'10 and 1-0 in '10-'11).

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Notre Dame's Oct. 30, 3-2 win over Western Michigan was the 200th CCHA win for Irish coach **Jeff Jackson**. Now in his 12th season at the Division I level, Jackson is 205-83-45 in his career in CCHA play in six seasons at Lake Superior State (1990-96) and six seasons at Notre Dame. Earlier in October (Oct. 14 vs. Lake Superior State), Jackson won his 300th career game as a Division I coach. His all-time record stands at 308-122-49 for a .695 winning percentage. His winning percentage is the tops among active coaches with 10 or more seasons.

FULL HOUSE: With sellout crowds in each of the first six home games, Notre Dame has now recorded 13 consecutive sellouts since Nov. 28, 2009. The Irish have had sell outs in 20 of the team's last 24 home games and last year averaged 2,765 fans per game. Since Dec. 13, 2008, the Irish have recorded sellouts in 29 of their last 33 home games. A sellout at the Joyce Center is 2,713 with 2,857 capacity with standing room. Twice during the '09-'10 season - Jan. 15 vs. Michigan State and Jan. 29 against Nebraska-Omaha - 3,007 fans jammed into the Joyce Center. Prior to that number, the largest crowd to see an Irish hockey game was 3,310 on March of 1995 when Notre Dame play Illinois-Chicago. The following season, new seating was installed and capacity was reconfigured.

FAST FRESHMEN: Freshmen **T.J. Tynan** and **Anders Lee** come into the Northern Michigan series ranked first and second in the CCHA in rookie scoring. Tynan has nine goals and 11 assists for 20 points while Lee has nine goals and six assists for 18 points. With nine goals each, Lee and Tynan are tops among freshman goal scorers. Fellow freshman **Mike Voran** (2g, 8a, 8 pts) is tied for seventh among freshmen and is followed by **Jeff Costello** (5g, 3a, 8 pts) who is tied for 11th. Defensemen **Kevin Lind** (1g, 5a) and **Shayne Taker** (1g, 5a) are tied for 18th with six points and tied for third among CCHA rookie defensemen. Tynan is fourth overall in scoring in the league and he and Lee are tied for fifth in goals in the CCHA with nine each.

LATE ADDITIONS: Center **T.J. Tynan's** fast start (9g, 11a) in the first 17 games has been a key to the 10-5-2 start for the Irish. The 5-8, 156-pound center has moved in to become one of the team's quarterbacks on the power play. The Orland Park, Ill., native wasn't even supposed to be on this year's team. Even though he signed a national letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009, Tynan was going to defer and play another year with the Des Moines Buccaneers in the USHL where he was the Bucs' leading scorer in '09-'10 and a member of the USHL's all-rookie team. When **Kyle Palmieri** decided to sign with the Anaheim Ducks in early August, the call went out to Tynan and he joined the Irish roster. Freshman defenseman **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)** also signed a letter-of-intent in Nov. of '09 and was going to be playing this season with Tri-Cities in the USHL. He was asked to join the team in mid-August after Jarred Tinordi opted to play in the OHL. The 6-3, 221-pound Lind has played in 13 games and tops the defensemen in scoring with six points (one goal, five assists), and is tied for first with a +8 plus-minus.

GOT THEIR NUMBER: From 1992-93 through the 2007-08 season, Notre Dame struggled when it came to facing Michigan State. In that time span, the Irish were just 5-32-7 versus the Spartans. Since March 29, 2008, a span of 10 games, Notre Dame is 7-0-3 against Michigan State, including a 5-0-1 mark at the Joyce Center.

SHARING THE WEALTH: Through 17 games this season, the Irish are 10-5-2 on the year. In the 10 wins, Notre Dame has had nine different players score the game-winning goal. Only **T.J. Tynan** has two game winners this year.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Sophomore goaltender **Mike Johnson** has now appeared in eight consecutive games, making seven starts in that span that began on Nov. 12 versus Michigan. In his last eight appearances, he is 4-2-1 with 2.98 goals-against average and a .893 save percentage. Johnson, who started the year with a 4-0-1 unbeaten streak in his first five starts is 8-3-2 on the year with a 2.61 goals against average and a .909 save percentage. As a freshman, Johnson took CCHA all-rookie team honors, playing in 29 games in '09-'10, going 10-13-5 with a 2.60 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage. Behind Johnson are a pair of freshmen - **Steven Summerhays** and **Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.)**. Summerhays is now 2-2-0 with a 4.12 goals-against average and a .795 save percentage. He owns wins over Bowling Green and Western Michigan while his losses have been to Boston University (10/10) and Miami (12/4). Summerhays joined the Irish after playing the last two seasons with the USHL's Green Bay Gamblers. In '09-'10, Summerhays was a first team all-USHL selection and the USHL goaltender of the year after going 31-2-3 with a 2.17 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. Joe Rogers who has yet to play this season. Rogers joins the Notre Dame roster after playing last season in the North American Hockey League (NAHL) with the Albert Lea Thunder. Rogers was 13-19-2 with a 3.97 goals-against average and a .891 save percentage.

ONE IN THE BOOKS: Sophomore defenseman **Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.)** notched his first career goal in Notre Dame's 2-2 tie at North Dakota on Nov. 27. That gives him a goal and four assists for five points in 15 games this season and a +8. This comes after a freshman year he would love to forget. The product of the USA Under-18 Team, Calabrese played in just three games, registering no points. Last Dec. 4, on the first shift of his third game, he suffered a broken leg at Miami that sidelined him for most of the season.

GOING TO THE GOAL: Freshman center **David Gerths (Ankeny, Ia.)** has become a specialist when it comes to scoring those "dirty" goals. The 6-0, 208-pounder does his best work right in front of the net. In 16 games this season, he has scored five goals with one assist for six points. His last goal came at North Dakota (Nov. 26) when he jammed a rebound under goaltender Aaron Dell.

NOSE FOR THE NET: Freshman left wing **Jeff Costello** now has points in five of his last six games, scoring four goals with an assist over the last three weekends. He scored on the power-play, his third of the year in the 5-2 loss at Miami. On the year, he has five goals and three assists for eight points. He is tied for the team lead with three power-play goals.

HOMETOWN HERO: Freshman defenseman **Jared Beers (Mishawaka, Ind.)** has worked his way into the Notre Dame lineup and doesn't seem to want to come out. In nine games this season, Beers has four assists for four points and is +2 for the year. He picked up his first career points on Nov. 6 versus Bowling Green with a two-point night. Beers joins **Mike McNeill '84-'88 (South Bend)**, **Tommy Smith '88-89 (South Bend)** and **Carey Nemeth '93-'94 (Granger)** as local players to play for the Irish. Beers played two seasons at Culver Academy and then saw action in the NAHL with the Kenai River Brown Bears (2008-09) and the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders in the USHL in 2009-10.

THE SPECIALIST: Senior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** is third on the team in goals with seven through the first 17 games this season and tied for the team lead in power-play goals with three. He has led Notre Dame in goals in each of the last two seasons, getting 17 in 2008-09 and 19 last season in 2009-10. Over the last two-plus seasons, Ridderwall has scored 43 goals with 25 of them coming via the power play. Last season,

his 11 power-play goals led the CCHA. Ridderwall had 11 power-play goals in '08-'09 to match last season's total and has two this year. His 25 power-play goals move him into a tie for sixth on Notre Dame's all-time power-play goal list with **Aniket Dhadphale '99**, **Tim Kuehl '90** and **Kirt Bjork '83**, all of whom had 25 man-advantage goals in their careers. For his career, Ridderwall has 48 goals and 29 assists for 77 career points in 134 games.

POWER LESS: In the Nov. 12 game at Michigan, a 3-1 Irish win, Notre Dame did not have one power-play chance in the game. That marked the first time in seven seasons - since March 5, 2004 - a span of 258 games - that the Irish did not have a power-play opportunity in a game. In the weekend series at Michigan, the Irish did not get their first power-play on the weekend until there was 6:09 left in the third period, a span of 113:51 over the two games without a power play. In the final six minutes of Saturday's game, the Irish did get three straight power plays.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame is 5-4-1 this season against nationally ranked teams after a split at Miami on Dec. 3-4. The Irish are 3-0-0 at home against ranked teams, 2-3-1 on the road and 0-1-0 on neutral ice. Notre Dame just finished a streak of eight straight games against ranked teams, going 4-3-1 in that span. In 2009-10, the Irish were 5-6-4 versus teams ranked in the national polls.

FAST START: Notre Dame freshman left wing **Anders Lee** knows how to get his career off to a fast start. The 6-3, 218-pounder scored a goal on his first shot in the 6-3 win over Holy Cross (Oct. 8), just 1:58 into the first period. He went on to record two more goals for a hat trick in his first-ever collegiate game. Lee then added an assist in the 5-4 loss to Boston University in the championship game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament. For his efforts, Anders Lee was named the CCHA rookie of the week for the week ending Oct. 10. He joins **John Noble '73** as the only other freshman to score three goals in his first game as Noble did the trick on Nov. 15, 1969 in an 8-3 win over Windsor. He joins recent Irish players - **Billy Maday**, **Christiaan Minella '10** and **Tim Wallace '06** - as freshmen who scored on their first shot on goal. Lee added a goal and an assist in the Oct. 15 win over Lake Superior State and through the first 17 games of the season, he leads the team with nine goals, is tied for the top spot with three power-play goals and is fourth in points with 15 (9g, 6a). He was named the CCHA rookie of the month for October.

CAN'T TELL THE PLAYERS WITHOUT A SCORECARD: The 2010-11 Notre Dame hockey team has a much different look than last year's 13-17-8 team as 13 players from that team are gone and 12 freshmen will take their place. Seven players - seniors **Brett Blatchford**, **Kevin Deeth**, **Dan Kissel**, **Kyle Lawson**, **Christiaan Minella**, **Tom O'Brien** and **Ryan Thang** - have graduated. Three players - defensemen **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** along with forward **Kyle Palmieri** - signed with the NHL teams that drafted them. Cole (St. Louis) and Ruth (Columbus) left after their junior seasons while Palmieri (Anaheim) left after his freshman year. Three are no longer with the team. Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips** is currently with the Bloomington Prairie Thunder of the Central Hockey League. Sophomore left wing **Kyle Murphy** returned to junior hockey for more playing time and is with the Vernon Vipers of the British Columbia Hockey League (BCHL). The third player, defenseman **Eric Ringel** has retired from hockey after a concussion and the concussion symptoms that occurred last season. He was not cleared to play by doctors and will serve as an undergraduate student

assistant coach. The 12 freshmen include two goaltenders, four defensemen and six forwards.

IRISH WINS VERSUS NO. 1: Notre Dame's win over No. 1 ranked Boston College on Oct. 23 marked the 12th time in the program's history that the Irish have defeated the nation's top team. Prior to Oct. 23, 2010, the last time came on April 10, 2008 in the NCAA semifinals versus No. 1 Michigan. A year ago, the Irish played twice versus the No. 1 team in the nation - Miami University - and lost both games on Dec. 4-5. and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. This is the fifth year that Lowe's has sponsored an award for hockey. EXTRA HOCKEY: Notre Dame's 2-2 tie with North Dakota extended the Irish unbeaten streak in overtime games to 16 as they are now 3-0-13 in games that have gone to overtime since their last loss on March 21, 2008, a 2-1 overtime loss to Miami at the CCHA semifinals. Through the first 15 games of the 2010-11 season, the Irish have played two overtime game - the Nov. 27 game at North Dakota and on Oct. 30 at Western Michigan. That game ended in a 2-2 tie and the Irish won the overtime shootout, 1-0. During the '09-'10 season, the Irish were involved in nine overtime contests, finishing 1-0-8 in those games. The eight ties equaled a Notre Dame record set during the 1999-2000 season. All eight ties in '09-'10 went to a shootout where the Irish were 3-5 in those games. The lone overtime win came on Nov. 27, 2009 versus Bowling Green (2-1) and was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win. Notre Dame is now 3-0-12 in overtime since its last overtime loss, a 2-1 decision to Miami on March 21, 2008, in the CCHA semifinal game.

CAPTAINS: Four members of the Irish senior class will serve as captains for the 2010-11 season. Defenseman **Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.)** will wear the "C" for Jeff Jackson's squad this year. His three assistant captains will be **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)**, **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** and **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)**. For all four players, this is their first time as captains at Notre Dame.

HOME OPENERS: Notre Dame's home opener on Thursday, Oct. 14, a 4-2 win over Lake Superior State, gives Notre Dame an all-time record of 24-18-1 in home openers at the Joyce Center. With the win on Oct. 8 against Holy Cross, Notre Dame is now 21-20-2 in season-opening games.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - sophomore forwards **Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** and freshman goaltender **Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.)** - have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Nugent's father, **Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78** was a member of the Notre Dame hockey team from 1974-78. During his career he played in 131 games, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. His son becomes the second Irish player to follow his father to Notre Dame. He joins **Rory Walsh '06** who followed his father, **Brian Walsh '77**

who was a teammate of Nugent, Sr. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman **Brock Sheahan '08** who played for the Irish from 2004-08. Rogers is a cousin of former Notre Dame defenseman **Tony Bonadio '83** is a Port Huron, Mich., native. Bonadio played in 79 games between 1980-83, scoring one goal with nine assists for 10 points.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have 10 players on the 2010-11 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Leading the way is sophomore **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** who became Notre Dame's third-ever, first-round pick last June when he was chosen 21st overall by the Detroit Red Wings. He joins former defenseman **Ian Cole (2007 - St. Louis)** who was selected 18th overall and former right wing **Kyle Palmieri (2009 - Anaheim)**, the 26th pick overall. Sheahan was followed by freshman defenseman **Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.)**, who went in the second round, 60th overall to the Chicago Black Hawks. One round later in the third round, with the 80th overall pick, freshman forward **Bryan Rust (Novi, Mich.)** was chosen by the Pittsburgh Penguins. Notre Dame's final player selected in 2010 was defenseman **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)**, who was picked in the sixth round, 177th overall by the Anaheim Ducks. Two other Irish freshmen were selected in the 2009 draft. Left wing **Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.)** was chosen by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round, 146th overall and six picks later, center **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)** was a New York Islanders' choice in the sixth round, 152nd overall. The new group of draftees join sophomore left wing **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)**, a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall; junior defenseman **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)**, a member of the 2008 draft class, by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall and seniors **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** and **Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.)**. Ryan was picked in the 2007 entry draft by Nashville in the fourth round with the 114th pick and Lavin was a Chicago Black Hawks choice in the fifth round, 126th overall.

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: Construction on Notre Dame's new, on-campus ice facility - The Compton Family Center - began in March of 2010 and is on pace to be finished for the Notre Dame hockey team to begin play there during the 2011-12 campaign.

On Sept. 11, 2010, a project blessing ceremony for the \$50-million facility was held with many of the key benefactors in attendance. At the ceremony, Notre Dame director of athletics, **Jack Swarbrick**, announced that the building would be named the Compton Family Center in honor of the generous donation from Kevin and Gayla Compton and their family. The Comptons are part of the ownership group of the National Hockey League's San Jose Sharks.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., Notre Dame's President began the ceremony with a blessing of the site and offering of a prayer for the safety of those working on the project.

Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** followed by talking about the original plans and how those plans changed to become the Compton Family Center.

"When I first came here, we were talking

about a renovation in the Joyce Center," said Jackson, now in his sixth season behind the Notre Dame bench.

"With Jack's (Swarbrick) foresight and Tom [Nevala] and everyone involved in pushing for this to happen, waiting an additional year to have a new facility is something that is going to have a tremendous impact on the future of our program, and we're very proud of that."

Jackson also thanked the benefactors in attendance for their generosity towards the project.

Notre Dame's head coach was followed by Irish junior **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** who spoke for his teammates to the benefactors in attendance.

Swarbrick spoke last at the ceremony, and touched upon how important the Compton Family Center will be for the Michiana community.

"There's a limit to how much the community can use our dormitories and our classrooms and our laboratories, but the athletic facilities can be a special point of contact," Swarbrick said.

"I hope we win national championships with teams that train here and I hope we build new programs for our athletes and our students. But the ultimate success of this facility will be if we inspire a young boy or a young girl from the community to shoot higher, if we challenge them to be better people because they spend time on our campus. Then we've realized the potential of athletics at Notre Dame."

The original announcement for the new building was made on Feb. 12, 2009 by Notre Dame executive vice-president John Affleck-Graves and Swarbrick after the University's Board of Trustees approved the plan.

The Compton Family Center will house both the Charles "Lefty" Smith rink, within the new 5,000-person capacity, home of the Irish hockey team and a second sheet of ice (Olympic-sized) with limited seating availability. The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety.

The Compton Family Center also will include offices for the Notre Dame coaching staff, a state-of-the art locker room suite that includes both wet and dry locker rooms, meeting rooms, a sports medicine area that includes hot and cold hydrotherapy, cardio and weight rooms, a players' lounge, equipment areas, video operations and a multi-purpose room that will be the location for weekly team Mass and serve as a study lounge and dining area.

The arena also will feature a balcony level with a 200-seat, Irish pub-themed club, multiple concession areas on both levels, spacious restrooms and a merchandise shop.

The Compton Family Center also will serve the Notre Dame and South Bend community as a place for the Irish Youth Hockey League (IYHL) and local figure skating groups to flourish. On campus it will become the home of club and interhall hockey, the figure skating club and intramural broomball, curling and physical education classes.

Multiple locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

Design and construction of the Compton Family Center are under the auspices of the Southfield, Mich., office of Barton Malow, a national design and construction services firm and their project partner Rossetti Architects, also of Southfield, Mich.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, 2009, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
