No. 12 Irish Travel To Oxford, Ohio To Face No. 1 Ranked Miami RedHawks

- Notre Dame to make first-ever visit to Miami's new Steve Cady Arena.
- Irish to face nation's top team for the first time since October of 2006.

IRISH BATTLE TOP-RANKED REDHAWKS: The Notre Dame hockey team makes its first-ever visit to Miami's new Steve Cady Arena in Oxford, Ohio on Fri.-Sat., Nov., 9-10 to face the nation's No. 1 ranked Miami RedHawks. The two-game series begins on Friday night at 8:05 p.m. with Saturday's game set for 7:05 p.m. The Irish enter the weekend with a 6-3-0 overall record and are 4-1-0 in the CCHA. Notre Dame is coming off a series sweep at home last weekend against Lake Superior State

(7-3, 4-1). The RedHawks have gotten the 2007-08 season off to a fast start and are 8-0-0 overall and 6-0-0 in the conference. Miami won a pair of games last weekend at Northern Michigan, taking a 9-2 decision on Friday night and a 3-2 victory on Saturday. The RedHawks lead the nation in scoring with 40 goals (5.00 goals per game) while giving up just 12 goals in the first eight contests (1.50 goals-against average). The two teams have met 50 times in the all-time series with Miami holding a 28-14-8 edge. At Miami, the RedHawks own a 15-7-2 record against the Irish. The last Notre Dame victory at Miami came on March 16, 2003, a 5-0 Irish win in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs. Since that win, Notre Dame is 0-5-1 at Oxford, Ohio. Last season, the two teams met twice at the Joyce Center with the Irish winning one (4-1) and the teams settling for a 2-2 tie in the second game of the series.

STRONG WEEKENDS: Notre Dame's top two scorers - junior Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) and senior Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.) – had their best weekends of the season in the sweep of Lake Superior on Nov. 1-2. Condra recorded six points on the weekend, scoring three goals with three assists while Van Guilder had a five-point weekend with two goals and three assists. Condra had the second five-point game of his career on Nov. 1, when he picked up two goals and three assists in the 7-3 win over the Lakers. Van Guilder chipped in two goals and two assists in that win. In the Nov. 2, 4-1 win, Condra scored one goal and

Van Guilder added an assist to finish off their series scoring.

VERSUS THE BEST: The last time that Notre Dame faced the top-ranked team in the country came on Oct. 20, 2006 when the Irish faced Boston College at Chestnut Hill, Mass. Notre Dame won that game, 7-1. Here's a list of Irish wins over No. 1 ranked teams in the 40-year history of the program.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Five of Notre Dame's first 11 games will come against teams ranked in the top 15 in the nation. This weekend, the Irish travel to Oxford, Ohio for a pair of games against No. 1 ranked Miami. Earlier this season, the Irish opened the year with a 4-1 loss to #14/#15 Wisconsin (10/12), before splitting a pair with #5/#5 Denver on Oct. 18-19. The Irish won 4-3 in the series opener before falling 3-1 on Friday night to the Pioneers. The Irish are 1-2-0 against ranked teams this season. They were 10-2-1 a year ago.

LAKE SUPERIOR RECAP: The Irish recorded their first series sweep of the season versus Lake Superior State. Notre Dame took a 7-3 win on Thur., Nov. 1 and then followed with a 4-1 victory on Fri., Nov. 2. On Thursday night at the Joyce Center, the Irish got two goals each from Erik Condra and Mark Van Guilder while Robin Bergman (Fr., Stockholm, Sweden), Ryan Thang (So., Edina, Minn.) and Dan VeNard (Sr., Vernon Hills, Ill.) scored single goals in the win. Condra picked up three assists for a five-point game and Van Guilder added two helpers for a four-point night. Sophomore center Kevin Deeth also assisted on three goals in the win. The Lakers got goals from Nathan Perkovich, Rick Schofield and Josh Sim on the night. Thang (ppg) and VeNard scored first period goals to give the Irish a 2-1 lead. Bergman built the lead to 3-1 just 17 seconds into the second period and Van Guilder got his first of the night at 4:20 for a 4-1 lead. Schofield cut the lead to 4-2 at 8:08 of the second period before the Irish got power-play goals from Condra (14:47) and Van Guilder (16:19) for a 6-2 lead after two periods. Condra closed Notre Dame's scoring just 40 seconds into the third period before Sim closed the scoring at 8:28. On the night, Notre Dame out shot Lake Superior, 27-15. Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska) made 12 saves while Pat Inglis had 20 for the Lakers. The Irish were 3-for-5 on the power play while Lake Superior was 1-for-4.

On Friday night, Notre Dame's special teams paced the Irish offense with one short-handed goal and a pair of power-play tallies. Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.) scored the opening goal of the game short-handed and was followed by power-play goals from defenseman Kyle Lawson and right wing Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.) while Condra added the lone even strength goal of the game. Hanson scored late in the first period (19:19) while Lawson's goal came at 4:54 of the second to give the Irish

a 2-0 lead. Perkovich cut that lead to 2-1 with his second power-play goal of the weekend to end the second period with the Irish protecting a one-goal lead. Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, making his first collegiate start, held the fort until the midway point of the third period when Condra got his third goal of the weekend for a 3-1 lead. Rankin finished the scoring at 12:22 of the third with a power-play marker and his third goal of the season. Phillips finished with 16 saves in getting his first career win. Notre Dame out shot Lake Superior by a 36-17 margin in the victory.

TURNING ON THE POWER: After going just 1-for-24 on the power play in the three previous games, Notre Dame was able to turn on the power on the power play in the weekend series against Lake Superior State. The Irish went 3-for-5 in Thursday's 7-3 win and then scored twice on five chances in Friday's 4-1 victory to go 5-for-10 in the series. That improved Notre Dame to 12-for-58 for a 20.7% success rate.

PENALTY KILLERS: For the first time all season, Notre Dame has surrendered power-play goals in back-to-back games as Lake Superior scored once in each game last weekend. In Thursday's 7-3 win, the Lakers snapped a streak of 31-consecutive power plays killed when Nathan Perkovich scored at 12:20 of the first period. Notre Dame went on to kill the three other Lake Superior chances in the game. In Friday's 4-1 victory, Perkovich again scored with the man advantage (5X3) as the Lakers were 1-for-7 on the power play in the game. On the season, the Irish have given up three power-play goals on 45 chances for a 93.3% success rate when short-handed.

CONDRA CAPERS: Right wing Erik Condra recorded the second, five-point game of his career in Thursday's 7-3 win over Lake Superior. Condra scored twice and added three assists for five points on the night. His previous five-point game came on Jan. 5, 2007 at Robert Morris when he had a goal and four assists. Condra currently leads the Irish in scoring with four goals and six assists for 10 points in the first nine games of the season.

ON THE MARK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder recorded the second four-point game of his career on Thursday night against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain leads the Irish in goals (6) and power-play goals (4) this season.

LINING UP: Notre Dame's trio of Condra, Van Guilder and freshman **Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden)** played on the same line for the first time this season against Lake Superior State. The trio combined for six goals and eight assists for 14 points over the two games. Bergman scored his first collegiate goal in the 7-3 win and had the first multiple-point game of his career in that game. He added an assist in the 4-1 win on Friday night for a three-point weekend. Condra had (3g, 3a) and Van Guilder added two goals and three assists for their weekend statistics.

THE MAN BETWEEN THE PIPES: After playing in just three games last season, junior goaltender Jordan Pearce has taken over in goal for the Irish this season, playing 476:33 of 480:00 minutes (3:27 of empty net time). His 476:33 minutes are second in the CCHA and second in the nation to Michigan's Billy Sauer (481:35). His eight starts are a career high and his win over Lake Superior on Nov. 1 was a career-best fifth win of the year. Pearce is 5-3-0 on with a 2.27 goals-against average and a .907 save percentage. He also has one shutout on the season.

NEW KID: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** made his first career start in goal for Notre Dame on Nov. 2 in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior State. Phillips stopped 16 of the 17 shots he faced, giving up just a five-on-three power-play goal in the game.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State

DYNAMITE DEETH: Sophomore center **Kevin Deeth**, held to just two assists in the first seven games of the season broke out of his slow start with a three-assist game in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior. He picked up assists on VeNard's goal and then the two power-play goals by Van Guilder and Condra in the second period. The three-assist night was the first of his career while the three-point game was the third of his young Notre Dame career. Deeth rang up his fourth assist of the weekend as he helped set up a Kyle Lawson goal in the 4-2 win on Nov. 2.

SPECIAL MENTION: Notre Dame freshmen forward **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** earned special mention for CCHA rookie of the month honors for October after scoring two goals and adding five assists for seven points in his first month of play. Miami's Carter Camper took the rookie of the month honors over Ryan.

SEVEN HEAVEN: The seven goals scored by the Irish on Nov. 1 is the most they have scored in a game since March 9, 2007 when they also hung seven goals on Alaska in the first game of the second round of the CCHA playoffs. Notre Dame won that game, 7-1.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: The sellout crowd of 2,857 on Friday, Nov. 2 at the Joyce Center is the largest crowd to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. This week, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity.

HOME SWEET HOME: After four home games this season, Notre Dame is 3-1-0 at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

APLUS START: Freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) has gotten his career off to a strong start through the first nine games of the season. Ruth currently leads Notre Dame with a +8 plus-minus for the season after going +3 in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior State. He and defensive partner Brock Sheahan (Sr., Lethbridge, Alb.) are one-two on the team as Sheahan is +7 on the season.

TICKLING THE TWINE: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** scored his first goal for the Irish since March 3, 2006 in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior. His last goal came against Alaska in the 2006 CCHA playoffs. He was goal less in 17 games last season and snapped a 25-game goalless drought with his first-period marker on Nov. 1. The goal was the third of VeNard's career.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace** '06 who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 125 consecutive games played through the first nine games this year.

THE REAL THANG: Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** has now scored goals in five of Notre Dame's first nine games this season. His goal against Lake Superior State was his fifth of the year and third on the power play. He has now scored 25 goals in his first 51 career games with 13 of them coming on the power play.

ON A FAST PACE: Senior right wing **Evan Rankin** scored his third goal of the season in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior on Nov. 2. The hard-working forward is one of his pace of last season when he had four goals. His career high is five and was set as a freshman during the 2004-05 campaign.

THE LAST TIME: Prior to the 3-0 shutout at Ferris State (Oct. 28), the last time that Notre Dame failed to score a goal in a game came on Nov. 18, 2006 when the Irish were shutout, 2-0, by Jeff Lerg at Michigan State.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 2-1 on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

CCHA OPENERS: Notre Dame's 3-2 win at Bowling Green on Tuesday night opened the 17th season in the CCHA for Notre Dame. The Irish joined the conference in 1981-82, left following the '82-'83 season and then returned in 1992-93. The win over the Falcons in the CCHA opener gives Notre Dame an 8-7-2 all-time mark in conference lid lifters.

HOME OPENERS: The October 18 win over Denver in the home opener gives Notre Dame a 22-17-1 record in Joyce Center openers. The Irish have won two straight home openers after beating Minnesota State, 6-1, last season.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team as they are now 1-2-0 on the year. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT: Notre Dame's most improved player for 2006-07, Garrett Regan (Jr., Hastings, Minn.), continued his strong play early this season when he scored his third goal of the season in the 4-2 win at Bowling Green. Regan also had a big game versus Denver on Oct. 18, scoring a power-play goal in the first period before setting up Ben Ryan's game winner in the third period. Last season, Regan had 14 goals and 12 assists for 26 points. This season, he's scored three and added an assist for four points in the first eight games.

BRINGING DOWN THE HOUSE: Notre Dame saw its streak of eight consecutive sell-outs snapped in the home opener on Oct. 18 as 2,413 fans saw the Irish defeat Denver, 4-3. A new sellout streak started the following night as a standing-room only crowd of 2,763 saw Notre Dame drop a 3-1 decision to the Pioneers. A year ago, the Irish sold out their final eight games of the season and 10 of the last 11. For the year, they had 11 sellouts (2,763) in 17 home dates and averaged 2,478 per game. Through four games this season, Notre Dame is averaging 2,538 fans per game.

FIRST TIMERS: Sophomore right wing Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.) made his first career appearance versus Denver (10/19). Carlin did not play in any games last year and lined up at right wing in his first appearance, getting one penalty for two minutes. Fellow sophomore Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.) made his first appearance of the season since being sidelined in the first week of practice with an injury.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, powerplay goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** was a finalist last season for the CCHA's defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan is showing his offensive game as he already has four assists in the first nine games of the season. For his career, Sheahan now has three goals and 21 assists for 24 points.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing Mark Van Guilder will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.) and Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.). They will be joined by junior forward Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.). This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

NEW KIDS: Six of Notre Dame's freshmen made their Irish debuts at the Lefty McFadden Invitational (Oct. 12-13). Leading the way was right wing Ben Ryan who recorded three assists in his first two games. Also playing in both games were forwards Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) along with defensemen Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.). Joining those five was right wing Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.) who played his first game against Mercyhurst in the second game of the weekend. Goaltender Brad Phillips saw his first action on Nov. 2, making his first career start in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

TOP CLASSES: Notre Dame's incoming freshman class of seven has been ranked among the best for the 2007-08 season. Inside College Hockey.com ranked the group fourth in it's preseason rankings while *Red Line Report* ranked the group fifth in the nation last spring. Inside College Hockey.com rankings:

IRISH VERSUS TOP 15-RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame will play its fourth and fifth games of the season against a ranked team when the Irish travel to Miam this weekend. The RedHawks bring a No. 1 ranking into the weekend series. Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season, playing three of its first four games against ranked teams. The Irish opened against #14/#15 Wisconsin, dropping a 4-1 decision at Dayton, Ohio. Versus fifth-ranked Denver, the Irish won the opening game (4-3) before dropping the second by a 3-1 score. Last season, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most-ever for the Irish in a single season. In 59 overtime games since the start of the 1999-2000 season, the Irish are 10-7-42 in overtime. In two seasons under Jeff Jackson, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman Dan VeNard has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

DROP THE PUCK: For the third season in a row, the Irish opened the year with the "Drop The Puck Reception" at the Joyce Center. This year's event took place on Oct. 10 with former Detroit Red Wings' great and current team vice-president Steve Yzerman serving as guest speaker. This year's reception took place prior to the annual Blue/Gold intrasquad scrimmage. Yzerman joins Chicago Blackhawk TV analyst Ed Olczyk and Scotty Bowman who were guest speakers in 2006 and 2005 respectively. Bowman, who won nine Stanley Cups in his illustrious coaching career, also was invited by Notre Dame head football coach Charlie Weis to address his team at practice, just four days prior to the upset win at Michigan in 2005.

THE KIDS WERE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame placed three players on the CCHA all-rookie team in 2007. Forwards Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.) and Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) were joined by defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.). Notre Dame became the third school in CCHA history to have three players on the all-rookie team, joining Michigan (five times) and Michigan State (once). The 1993-94

Michigan team set the record with four freshmen named to that team. Thang became the first Irish freshman to score 20 or more goals in a season since **Dave Poulin '82** had 28 in his rookie year of 1978-79. His 20 goals were the sixth most by a Notre Dame freshman while his 41 points tied for eighth best. Deeth's 17 goals tied him for the eighth-best total and his 39 points tied him for 10th among Irish freshmen.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, **III.)** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore Rvan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and 13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

LEADING THE NATION: Defense was the key to Notre Dame's success in 2006-07 as the Irish led the nation in several categories. As a team, Notre Dame surrendered just 1.67 goals as a team and was also tops in the area of goal differential as they scored 1.74 more goals than they game up to rank first in that category. Goaltender **David Brown '07** led the nation with a 1.58 goals-against average and his 30 wins were also tops. In the area of penalty killing, the Irish also did it best as they allowed just 20 opponent power-play goals on 209 chances for a 90.4% success rate.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

JUNIOR EVALUATIONS: Three members of the Notre Dame freshman class participated in the U.S. Junior Evaluation Camp this past August in hopes of making the United States' roster for the 2007 World Junior Championships. Freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth were joined by center Ben Ryan. Irish head coach Jeff Jackson served as one of the assistant coaches at the camp.

HOMETOWNS: The 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 13 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. This season, freshmen Robin Bergman (Stockholm) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork ('83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave **Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

RIVALRY CLUSTERS: – The CCHA begins its sixth season with the 12 teams grouped in "rivalry pairings." In the pairings, Notre Dame is paired with Bowling Green. The league's other pairings include Michigan-Michigan State, Miami-Ohio State, Lake Superior State-Northern Michigan, Ferris State-Western Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks-Nebraska-Omaha. Each season the teams are divided into three, four-team clusters and play a 28-game conference schedule. Cluster teams will face each other four times during the season with two games against each of the remaining eight teams. In 2007-08, Notre Dame will play

Bowling Green, Ferris State and Western Michigan four times with two games at home and two away. The Irish will also play home-and-home series with Michigan and Michigan State. Notre Dame hosts two-game home series with Lake Superior, Nebraska-Omaha and Ohio State while playing two-game road series at Alaska, Miami and Northern Michigan.
