## 2006 NOTRE DAME BASEBALL

(vs. Louisville ... May 5-7 ... Eck Stadium)

**FINAL HOMESTAND** – The Notre Dame baseball team (36-9-1, 16-1-1 BIG EAST) plays its final home games of the 2006 regular season in a Fri.-Sun. series vs. Louisville on May 5-7 (games times of 6:05, 1:05 and 12:05 EDT) ... ND's rotation (in order) will include Jeff Manship, Jeff Samardzija and Tom Thornton ... the Irish already have clinched a BIG EAST Tournament spot and now are taking aim at the regular-season title (UConn stands 2nd at 13-5-1).

## AROUND THE HORN

• **RBI BY COMMITTEE** – ND has no players in the BIG EAST's top-10 RBI leaders but four share the team RBI lead with 34 (housemates Rizzo, Cooper, Branfield, Lopez) while two others have 33 (Dressman and Barnes).

• **SILVER STREAK** – The recent 23-game win streak bested the '91 team (18) for longest (single-season) and topped the 1906-07 teams (21) for the best at any time in ND history (also longest in D-I this season) ... ND owned a .353-.227 batting edge in the streak (2.81 ERA, .972 fielding/24 Es).

• **THREE-PRONGED ATTACK** – ND entered the week ranked 22nd nationally in batting avg. (.322, now .325), 14th in ERA (3.33, now 3.25) and 28th in fielding (.971, now .970), with Nebraska the only other in top-30 for all three.

• **WILY VETERANS** – ND's 10 regular position players include 5 seniors, 2 juniors, 2 sophomore and freshman Jeremy Barnes, with that group combining to start 1,428 career games (4,574 ABs; 1,389 hits; 828 RBI; .304 bat. avg.).

• **HOME BOYS** – The Irish lost their home opener on March 21 but have lost just once more at Eck Stadium in the past six weeks (22-2), batting .339 (16 HRs) with a 3.55 staff ERA (just 4 HR allowed) in the 24 home games.

• **LOTS-O-LINEUPS** – ND's first 46 games have featured 37 different batting orders, including 32 different orders in the first 32 games.

• **IN THE CLUTCH** – The Irish are batting .342 with runners in scor. pos. (.309 in '05), led by Dressman (.419), Lopez (.414), Barnes (.364) and Rizzo (.359).

• **QUICK STARTERS** – ND owns a +26 scoring margin in the 1st inning this season (50-24), outhitting the opponents .354-.305 in the opening frame.

• **BIG INNINGS** – Notre Dame totaled just four "big innings" (5-plus runs) in the first 28 games of the '06 but has scored 5-plus in nine of the past 18 games.

• **HBP ... PDQ** – The Irish lead the BIG EAST with 74 times hit-by-pitch (310 over the past three seasons) and feature five players among the top-12 on the ND career HBP charts: Cody Rizzo (1st, 79; 3rd NCAA history), Brett Lilley (2nd, 41), Alex Nettey (3rd, 39), Greg Lopez (7th, 34) and Craig Cooper (12th, 27).

• **NO-FLY ZONE** – The ND pitchers have allowed just 8 home runs all season (4 at Eck) and had a 25-game stretch without an opp. HR (943 BF).

• **POWER SURGE** – The Irish managed just 10 home runs in the first 30 games of '06 but awoke for 15 HRs in the recent homestand (12 GP).

• **LEADOFF LEADER** – Craig Cooper has reached 26-of-37 times (70%) when leading off for ND (4 HR, 6 2B) and had a 21-game hit streak.

• **KILLER B's** – The pattern of rotating heroes has included the likes of (Matt) Bransfield, (Ross) Brezovsky, (Jeremy) Barnes and Brett (Lilley).

• **SUPER AT SHORT** – Greg Lopez owns a 4.8-to-1 ratio of RBI (34) to errors (7), 4th-best among shortstops from teams currently in the BA top-25.

**SERIES NOTES** – ND and Louisville have met just twice previously in baseball: a 13-4 ND win in 1922 and a 3-2 win by the Irish in '92 (both at UL) ... the ND-UL game at the 2004 USC Classic was rained out ... former UL All-America OF Mark Jurich – who played on the 2002 U.S. National Team alongside former ND pitcher Grant Johnson – is the son of UL's AD Tom Jurich ... three players in the Paul Mainieri era at ND (since '95) have been Kentucky natives, including RHP Craig Allen (Franklin-Simpson HS) and two Louisville high school products: 1B Craig DeSensi (Trinity HS) and C/DH Jeff Wagner (St. Xavier HS; ND-record 49 career HRs), now the V.P. with the Louisville-based Wagner Companies.

**THE BIG EAST RACE** – Notre Dame (16-1-1) is the only team to clinch a spot in the 8-team BIG EAST Tournament (May 23-27, in Clearwater, Fla.) and is followed in the standing by UConn (13-5-1), St. John's (10-7), Cincinnati (10-8), West Virginia (9-9) and Louisville (9-9) ... the Irish are close to clinching the regular-season title but can't clinch this week due to UConn having a BIG EAST bye week ... standings are based on win pct. (and not the traditional "games back," due to rainouts that are not made up) – meaning that ND could go 20-6-1 and UConn 19-5-1 and the Huskies would be regular-season champs.

**AWESOME IN APRIL** – ND has won just 67% of its pre-April games in the 12-year Paul Mainieri era (182-90-1/+92; .669) but now has won 82% of its April games in those 12 seasons (234-52-2/+180; .816).

**EVERYBODY'S DOING IT ...** – There's been plenty of streaking to talk about during the 2006 Notre Dame baseball season and yet another streak will be on the line this weekend, as the Irish have won nine straight games vs. UConn ... the Irish have compiled eight all-time winning streaks vs. BIG EAST teams of 7-plus games, including an active 7-game win streak vs. West Virginia (ND and WVU will not meet in the '06 regular season) ... ND's longest win streak vs. a BIG EAST team (23 games) ended last season with a loss to Georgetown ... ND has outscored UConn 70-31 during the current head-to-head win streak, which came on the heels of a four-game losing streak to the Huskies (one of ND's longest head-to-head loss streaks ever in BIG EAST play).

**MAINIERI'S MILESTONES** – Notre Dame 12th-year head coach Paul Mainieri posted his 500th victory with the Irish in the 6-3 win over Georgetown ... his 700th overall career coaching win also came vs. Georgetown, on March 29, 2003, at Eck Stadium (13-3).

**VETERAN UNIT** – Notre Dame's 2006 opening-day lineup included six seniors, a junior and two sophomores ... it marks just the third time in the 12-year Paul Mainieri era (and only second time since his first season at ND, in '95) that the Irish have not featured at least one freshman position starter from the start (although freshman Jeremy Barnes has emerged as a starter at multiple positions in '06):

**LOPEZ JOINS WEEKLY DIARY STAFF FOR COLLEGE BASEBALL INSIDER**

Notre Dame senior shortstop and second-year captain Greg Lopez is one of four players in all of Division I baseball who will be featured this season during a weekly diary feature on [www.collegebaseballinsider.com](http://www.collegebaseballinsider.com) ... check the CBI website and look for more on this series at und.com.

**SAMARDZIJA, MANSHIP NAMED TOP-50 DRAFT PROSPECTS** – Notre Dame junior RHPs **Jeff Samardzija** (Valparaiso, Ind.) and **Jeff Manship** (San Antonio, Texas) have been attracting plenty of attention from professional scouts throughout the 2006 season and both recently were upgraded by *Baseball America* into top-50 status on the magazine's midseason list of college prospects who are eligible for the 2006 Major League Draft ... North Carolina is the only team with two starting pitchers rated higher than the Notre Dame duo while Missouri is the only other team with two starting pitchers among *BA*'s current top-50 prospects ... Samardzija had been slotted 94th in *BA*'s preseason list of the college game's top prospects, with the two-sport star making the third-biggest jump (54 spots) from the preseason to midseason list ... Manship was 75th on the preseason list of top college prospects, moving up 34 spots for the seventh-biggest jump among players on the current top-50 prospects list.

**EARLY RISERS** – The only players with more noteworthy jumps in the *BA* prospect rankings than Samardzija are a pair of RHPs who were not included on *BA*'s preseason list of the top-100 prospects: Cal State Northridge's Chris Baker (now #32) and Villanova's Kevin Mulvey (#43) ... only three others made a bigger jump than Manship's (+34): Kent State SS Emmanuel Burris (+43; 77 to 34); ASU's Zinicola (+41; 85 to 44) and Hawaii RHP Steven Wright (+37; 82 to 45) ... there are four others who improved 20-plus spots (all are RHPs): San Diego's Josh Butler (+27; 66 to 39), Washington's Tim Lincecum (+25; 31 to 6), Missouri State's Brent Sinkbeil (+25; 42 to 17) and VCU's Harold Mozingo (+20; 55 to 35).

**OTHERS OF NOTE** – UNC's pair of high-rated pitching prospects include LHP Andrew Miller (1st) and RHP Daniel Bard (9th), who lost to ND in an elimination game at the 2005 NCAA Gainesville Regional ... Missouri's pair of starting pitchers on the top-50 prospects list include righthander Max Scherzer (5th) and lefthander Nathan Culp (49th) ... Arizona State is the only other team with two pitchers in the top-50: righthanded reliever Zach Zinicola (44th) and righthanded starter Pat Bresnehan (50th) ... two of ND's early-season losses came at the hands of pitchers who are rated near the top of the *BA* list: Nebraska RH starter Joba Chamberlain (8th) and Arizona RH closer Mark Melancon (14th), who logged 4.2 innings to help edge the Irish in a 2-0, 10-inning game (UA shortstop Jason Donald is the No. 24 prospect on the list).

**AMIDST THE BEST OF THE BEST** – Among the four teams that have two pitchers on the top-50 prospects list, the UNC pair owns the top combined ERA (2.71), record (16-2), innings (142.2), low opp. batting avg. (.209), low hits per 9 IP (688) and most Ks per 9 IP (9.59) ... the Missouri pitchers have the lowest walk avg. (1.67 BB/9 IP), lowest WHIP (8.92 walks and hits per 9 IP), top K/BB ratio (4.39) and fewest wild pitches (2) among the four pitcher tandems ... Notre Dame's Jeff Samardzija and Jeff Manship's combined stats include the fewest home runs allowed (3, tied with the ASU pair, plus 52 more innings pitched) and are tied for the fewest hit batters (6) among the four pairs of pitchers ... Manship and Samardzija are tied for 2nd among the four pairs of elite pitching prospects in combined wins (12-2), also 2nd in innings pitched (131.1), Ks per 9 IP (7.81) and low wild pitches (6) ... their other combined stats this season, spanning 10 starts each, include: a 3.43 ERA, 116 hits allowed, 114 Ks, 45 walks, a 2.53 K/BB ratio and 9-inning averages of 7.95 hits and 3.08 walks (11.03 WHIP).

**BIG EAST LEADERS** – Jeff Manship, who was the nation's No. 3-rated freshman heading into the '04 season before seeing the start of his college career slowed by injury, has made an impressive comeback to elite national status and is on the short list of top candidates for BIG EAST pitcher-of-the-year honors, ranking 2nd in strikeouts (77, including a league-best 30 Ks "looking"), 3rd among the league's regular pitchers in low opp. batting avg. (.202), 4th in ERA (2.42), 4th in wins (6-1) and 8th with 67.0 innings ... in BIG EAST games only, Manship ranks 3rd among the conference's pitchers in wins (4-1) and opp. batting (.218), 4th in Ks (45, and 2nd in Ks "looking" with 16), 5th in ERA (3.00) and 7th with 42.0 IP ... Jeff Samardzija currently checks in 4th on the BIG EAST charts for overall wins (6-1) and 14th in ERA (4.06) while sharing the lead for most wins during BIG EAST games (5-0).

**LOPEZ AMONG NATION'S ELITE ALL-AROUND SHORTSTOPS** – A glance at Notre Dame senior Greg Lopez's season statistics reveals the rare combination for his position of shortstop, as the two-time Irish captain has paired a high RBI total (team-best 34) with a low error total (7) while appearing in 41 games this season ... the resulting 4.9-to-1 ratio of RBI-to-Es is a tremendous mark for even the most elite of shortstops and a check of the other 24 teams currently among the top-25 in the *Baseball America* poll reveals that only three shortstops from those teams – Oklahoma's Freddy Rodriguez (13.0; 26/2), Mississippi's Zack Cosart (6.1) and South Carolina's Reese Havens (5.3) – entered the week with better marks in the unique but telling stat of RBI-to-error ratio, with Lopez's .356 batting avg. higher than each of those players .. Lopez's current RBI total (34) is 6th-most among the top-25 shortstops ... he also owns the 2nd-lowest strikeout total (9) among the group (one more than Oregon State's Darwin Barney, who has 8 Ks) and boasts the 6th-best fielding pct. (.965) among the top-25 shortstops, in addition to having the 7th-lowest error total (7) and the 6th-best batting avg. and the 8th-best plate-discipline ratio (+2 for BB+HBP-Ks) ... Lopez – who is batting .414 with runners in scoring position (2nd-best on the team) – and Rodriguez are two of just threeseniors among the shortstops for teams currently in the *BA* top-25 (the other is Old Dominion's Jesse Schoendienst):

**COOPER EARNS NATIONAL AND BIG EAST PLAYER OF WEEK** – Notre Dame senior 1B **Craig Cooper** (Plainview, N.Y.) – two weeks ago batted over .500, had a slugging percentage of nearly 1.000, reached base 15 times over the course of five games, and tied the school record by extending his hitting streak to 21 – en route to receiving national player-of-the-week honors from both *Collegiate Baseball* magazine and *Rosenblatt Report*, in addition to being named the BIG EAST Conference player of the week for the second time this season and the third time in his career ... the righthanded slugger has been named a national player of the week twice in his career and entered the weekend ranked 2nd among all BIG EAST players with a .428 overall batting average while also pacing the conference with .493 batting in league play as he pursues an unprecedented third BIG EAST batting title.

**DAMAGE REPORT** – Craig Cooper's damage in the five victories from march 18-23 included a .526 batting avg. (10-for-19), 13 RBI, 9 runs scored, a .952 slugging pct. (4 home runs, 2 doubles), a .654 on-base pct. (5 walks and a hit-by-pitch) and a lofty 1.606 OPS (on-base plus slugging) ... the first individual to repeat as BIG EAST player of the week this season, Cooper joins 1997 catcher Mike Amrhein as the only players in the history of ND baseball who are known to have pushed single-season hit streaks to 21 games ... Cooper's key role during the 5-0 mid-March showing included a 2-run HR in the 8-2 win over Toledo (1-for-3, 3 RBI, R, BB, HBP) before adding an RBI single in the 10-inning win over IPFW (4-3) ... he opened the Rutgers series 2-for-4 (4 RBI, 2 R), breaking a 2-2 tie with a 2-run blast in the 5th, walking in the 6th and hitting another 2-run HR in the 7th for his first career multi-HR game (11-5) ... he opened game-2 vs. RU with walk and run scored, later adding a single and run, another single and then an HBP/run (2-for-2, 3 R; 15-3) ... Cooper then started the game for the ND offense with a home run for the fourth time this season, in the RU series finale ... he added a walk/R in the 2nd inning of the series finale, a 2-run 2B/R in the 3rd and a 2-run 2B in the 4th (plus a single in the 8th) of that 14-12 slugfest (4-for-5, tied career-best with 5 RBI).

**AMONG THE NCAA LEADERS** – Craig Cooper entered this week ranked 18th in the nation with a .420 batting avg. (now .428) and 2nd in runs per game (1.41; now 1.24/57 total), also checking in at 46th on the slugging pct. charts (.682, now .692) and 36th in "toughest to stike out" (15.7 ABs per K; now 15.9).

**BEST THERE EVER WAS** – Cooper's impressive display in the three-game sweep of rival Rutgers (8-for-11/.727, 9 RBI, 8 R, 3 HR, 2 2B, 5 BB, HBP, 1.727 slug, .813 OB, 2.540 OPS) pushed his career batting average in BIG EAST games to .445 (98-for-220), placing him ahead of former Rutgers player Joe Cirrone (.443; 51-for-115) as the top hitter in the 22-year history of BIG EAST baseball ... he then hit 5-for-13 in the UConn series and now is batting .442 (103-for-233) in career BIG EAST games, dipping just below Cirrone with nine BIG EAST games left in his career ... Cooper needs eight more hits and three more HRs (currently 15) to crack those BIG EAST career top-10 lists (for league games) ... he also owns 16 doubles and 38 walks spanning 75 career games in BIG EAST regular-season play.

**TRADING HRs FOR Ks** – Craig Cooper's many impressive stats this season include totaling nearly as many home runs (9) as strikeouts (10) while grounding into just two double plays all season (no GDPs in past 31 games).

**HITTING BASEBALLS AND TEXTBOOKS** – Craig Cooper has rocketed to the top of most All-America projections and narrowly missed a chance at being considered for 2006 Academic All-America honors, with a 3.197 cumulative GPA as a political science major (min. 3.20) ... Cooper was one of 21 members of the 2006 ND baseball team to post a GPA of 3.0 or higher (3.40) during the 2005 fall semester ... six of his teammates – senior LHP **Tom Thornton**, senior SS **Greg Lopez**, senior LF/DH **Matt Bransfield**, junior C **Sean Gaston**, sophomore 3B **Brett Lilley** and sophomore 2B **Ross Brezovsky** – are potential candidates for the official 2006 Academic All-America honors (as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America).

**OH-SO-CLOSE** – Prior to the 0-for-4 game vs. Purdue that snapped his 21-game hitting streak, Craig Cooper had hits in 30 of his previous 31 games and possibly would have been riding a 31-game hit streak if he could have managed another at-bat or two versus Central Michigan on March 22 (when he went 0-for-1, walked three times and added a sacrifice fly) ... he now has collected at least one hit in 35 of his 40 games played during the 2006 season, with only three hitless games in which he had at least four ABs (also 0-for-4 vs. Memphis and 0-for-5 at UConn).

**EXTENDED ROLL** – Including the final 17 games of his junior season, Craig Cooper has collected hits in 50 of his past 57 games (45 of 49 in the regular season) ... he ended the 2005 regular season on a 10-game hitting streak, then hit safely in all three games of the '05 BIG EAST Tournament before enduring a two-game slump at the NCAA Gainesville Regional (he bounced back with hits in ND's final two games of the '05 NCAAs) ... the current stretch of collecting hits in 50 of his past 57 games played spans the only double-digit hitting streaks of Cooper's four-year ND career (13 and 21 games, plus the 9-game streak that ended with the 0-for-1 game vs. Central Michigan).

**HOME & AWAY** – Craig Cooper has compiled strong batting marks both at home (.436, 34-for-78) and on the road (.420, 34-for-81) this season.

**LEADOFF LEADER** – Craig Cooper has reached a team-best 61% of the time when leading off any inning but his production is even more impressive when leading off for the Irish in the 1st inning ... Cooper has reached base 26-of-37 times (70.3%) when leading off the game for the ND offense, batting 20-for-31 (.645) in his 1st-inning leadoff plate appearances, including 4 leadoff home runs (1.226 slugging pct., 6 doubles, 5 walks, plus a time hit-by-pitch) ... his OPS (on-base plus slugging) is an off-the-charts 1.929 as the 1st-inning leadoff batter this season ... led by Cooper, the Irish are batting .354 as a team this season in the 1st inning while outscoring their opponents 50-24 in the opening frame.

**BIG EAST'S BEST** – Craig Cooper currently leads all BIG EAST players with 57 runs scored and a 1.218 OPS (on-base plus slugging) while ranking 2nd in batting avg. (.428), slugging pct. (.692) and on-base pct. (.526), plus 3rd in home runs (9) and 4th in hits (61) and total bases (110) ... Pitt's Jim Negrych owns the top batting avg. (.435) and OB pct. (.543) while Villanova's Jeremy Hunt leads the league in slugging (.753) ... in league games only, Cooper leads the BIG EAST in seven categories: .493 batting, .859 slugging, .586 on-base, 1.445 OPS, 29 runs, 7 HRs and 30 hits (also 2nd with 56 TBs and 21 RBI, plus 7th with 13 walks) ... Cooper could duplicate the sweep of the three offensive pct. titles that he posted during 2004 BIG EAST play (.470 batting, .545 OB, .712 slugging), when he became the only player ever to lead the conference in all three of those categories during the same season.

**THE X FACTOR** – Notre Dame is 32-4-1 with Cooper batting in the leadoff spot and just 4-5 when another player serves as the leadoff batter ... the Irish dropped four straight games when Cooper was out of the lineup (vs. top opponents Oklahoma, Nebraska, Minnesota and Arizona) but ND now is riding a 34-4-1 extended streak over the past nine weeks after Cooper's return to the lineup (he has played in all but two of those games).

**LOFTY COMPANY** – Craig Cooper's current .493 batting avg. in BIG EAST games puts him in range of the conference record, set more than 20 seasons ago by UConn's Dave Ford (.522/24-for-46, in '85) ... Cooper's overall stat line during 2006 BIG EAST games include 35 hits in 71 ABs, 21 RBI, 29 runs, an .859 slugging pct. (7 HR, 3B, 3 2B), a .586 on-base pct. (13 BB, 3 HBP, just 3 Ks), a 1.445 OPS, 4 stolen bases and an error ... he needs 20 hits in ND's final nine BIG EAST games to break the league's record for most hits in one BIG EAST season (54, by Rutgers shortstop Darren Fenster in '99).

**30-30 IN HIS SIGHTS** – Craig Cooper's sophomore season in 2004 yielded 10 home runs and made him a legit candidate to become the program's third all-time player with 30-plus stolen bases and 30-plus home runs in his career (he currently ranks 9th in ND history with 44 SBs) ... his HR output dropped off to 7 in 2005 and Cooper did not have a long ball in his first 14 games of the 2006 season – before a power surge that included 9 HRs in ND's 23-game win streak ... that recent HR spike has lifted his career total to 26, leaving Cooper 4 HRs shy of joining shortstop Alec Porzel (37 HR, 32 SB; '98-'01) and catcher Paul O'Toole (31 HR, 54 SB; '99-'02) in the exclusive 30-30 club.

**SLAYER OF THE KNIGHTS** – Craig Cooper has feasted on Rutgers pitching throughout his career, batting .500 (19-for-38) versus the Scarlet Knights with 12 RBI, 15 runs and 8 extra-base hits (3 HR, 5 2B, 8 BB, 5 SB, 5 Ks) in 13 games played ... ND's other veteran players had combined for just a .193 career batting avg. vs. RU (22-for-114) prior to an offensive explosion in the 2006 series that saw the Irish bat .438 with 49 total hits vs. the Knights (Cooper batted 8-for-11 while the rest of the team was 41-for-101/.406).

**TEAM RANKS** – Cooper leads the Irish (or shares the lead) in 13 total categories: batting (.428), slugging (.693), on-base (.526), OPS (1.219), HRs (9), runs (57), hits (68), RBI (34), walks (27), total bases (110), leadoff on-base pct. (.606) and batting vs. RHPs (.426) ... he also ranks 2nd on the team in doubles (13), stolen bases (8), batting with runners on base (.411) and batting vs. LHPs (.432), plus 4th in hit-by-pitch (7), games started (40) and batting vs. LHPs (.432) ... he has struck out just 10 times all season (in 193 plate appearances, for nearly 19 PAs per K), owns the team's best plate-discipline ratio (+24; 27 BB+7 HBP-10 Ks) and is batting equally strong this season vs. RHPs (.426) as LHPs (.432).

**PAIR OF LONG HIT STREAKS** – Craig Cooper's 13-game hit streak near the end of the 2005 season and his recent 21-game tear made him the third player in the 12-year Paul Mainieri era to post multiple hit streaks of 13-plus games ... centerfielder Steve Stanley had a 16-game hit streak in 2000 and hit safely in 13 straight games during the 2002 season while another former ND All-American, second baseman Steve Sollmann, had 13- and 15-game hit streaks during the 2003 season.

**BACK-TO-BACK BATTING TITLES FOR COOPER** – Current senior 1B **Craig Cooper** ended up batting .403 in 2005 BIG EAST games, placing him 16 points ahead of second-place finishers Doug Nelms of West Virginia and Dan McDonald of Seton Hall (both hit .386) ... Cooper also led the league in batting as a sophomore (.470, in '04) and joined former Boston College player Kevin Penwell ('95 and '96) as the only repeat batting champions in the 21-year history of BIG EAST baseball ... he now is making a bid for an unprecedented third BIG EAST batting title, currently leading the conference with a .517 avg. in BIG EAST games (30-for-58).

**NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT SHINES AGAIN** – Craig Cooper previously earned a national honor at the end of the 2005 regular season, when the National Collegiate Baseball Writers of America named him their national hitter of the week ... Cooper batted 13-for-22 (.565) in that May 16-21, 2005, stretch that included one game at Pittsburgh, two versus #17 USC and a three-game series with West Virginia (13 RBI, 8 R, 2 HR, 3 2B, 2 BB, HBP, SB, 2 Ks), as the Irish closed 5-1 to roll into the postseason ... five other recent ND players have received national weekly honors ... RHP **Aaron Heilman** was named the *Collegiate Baseball* national pitcher of the week twice during his junior season in 2000, after a 12-K game in a 6-4 win over Georgia (March 9, at the Metrodome) and an 18-K game in a 3-1, 10-inning win at West Virginia (April 15) ... then-sophomore RF **Brian Stavisky** opened the '01 season by batting .692 (9-for-13) and reaching base 10 consecutive times at the Mississippi State Classic, earning the weekly hitter honor from the NCBWA and CB's national player-of-the-week award ... the 25-1 win over South Alabama in the '02 NAAs resulted in then-sophomore 2B **Steve Sollmann** (6-for-7, 7 RBI, 6 R, HR, 2 3B) and then-freshman RHP **Grant Johnson** (1-hitter, 8 Ks, BB, HBP, 30 BF) earning the respective player/hitter and pitcher-of-the-week awards from the NCBWA and CB ... more recently, current junior catcher **Sean Gaston** earned the NCBWA hitter-of-the-week honor after opening his career by batting 10-for-12 during 2004 games played in Boca Raton, Fla., vs. Winthrop, Florida Memorial and Minnesota (6 RBI, 7 R, 3 2B, 2 SB).

**AWARDS PILE UP FOR IRISH** – Notre Dame players have combined for more 2006 BIG EAST player-of-the-week awards (3) than any other team while the Irish have totaled five player or pitcher weekly awards from the BIG EAST this season (UConn and Cincinnati are next, with three each) ... Craig Cooper's first BIG EAST weekly award of the 2006 season came on April 10, after ND's 5-0 week that included wins over Chicago State and Ball State, plus the 3-0 sweep at South Florida (he hit 12-for-20 that week, with 5 RBI, 10 R, HR, 3B, 2 2B, 3 BB, 2 SB, K) ... junior OF **Danny Dressman** earned the March 13th honor after opening the Spring Break trip in San Antonio by batting 7-for-12 in wins over Texas A&M, Iowa and Illinois (8 RBI, 2 R) ... senior LHP **Tom Thornton** has been named BIG EAST pitcher of the week twice this season, after beating Indiana State on Feb. 23 (3-0, in Millington, Tenn.; 7 IP, 5 H, 0 BB, 5 Ks) and then hurling a 5-hit shutout vs. Southern Illinois on March 19, in San Antonio (2 Ks, 0 BB, 84 pitches).

**THREE-TIME HONOREE** – Craig Cooper's three career BIG EAST player-of-the-week honors tie him for second-most in BIG EAST history (four former ND standouts also collected three weekly player honors from the BIG EAST) ... in addition to his pair of 2006 weekly honors noted above, Cooper previously was named BIG EAST player of the week for the final week of the 2005 regular season (the same stretch that earned the national honor cited above) ... former Boston College outfielder Jason Delaney holds the record for most career BIG EAST player-of-the-week honors (5), while former Virginia Tech 2B Marc Tugwell totaled three awards, as did four former ND greats: OF Brian Stavisky (4/24/00, 2/19/01, 4/2/01), SS Alec Porzel (5/0/00, 4/15/01, 5/7/01), 2B Steve Sollmann (2/24, 3/17 and 5/19 in '03) and SS/3B Matt Macri (4/21/03, 4/5/04, 5/17/04) ... Cooper is the only repeat honoree this season and could join Sollmann as the only position player in BIG EAST history to receive three weekly awards in the same season ... a total of 20 Notre Dame players - including current junior catcher Sean Gaston (3/1/04) and current senior SS Greg Lopez (4/19/04) - now have combined to earn 34 BIG EAST baseball player-of-the-week awards, since Notre Dame joined the BIG EAST in 1995-96 ... the ND program also has produced 31 total BIG EAST pitcher-of-the-week recipients in the past 11 years, including five honors for current senior LHP Tom Thornton (2nd-most all-time, behind 10 by former ND ace Aaron Heilman) ... ND's previous all-time BIG EAST player-of-the-week recipients include the five three-time honorees (Stavisky, Porzel, Sollmann, Macri and Cooper) - plus five two-time recipients: catcher Jeff Wagner (4/7/97, 5/5/97), SS/3B Brant Ust (4/3/98, 3/29/99), 1B Jeff Felker (4/15, 5/12), catcher Paul O'Toole (5/13/00, 4/1/02) and CF Steve Stanley (2/26, 4/23) ... the other seven ND position players who have received weekly BIG EAST honors include catcher Mike Amrhein (3/17/97), OF Allen Greene (4/28/97), SS J.J. Brock (3/16/98), catcher Mike Knecht (5/4/98), 3B/C Andrew Bushey (2/25/02), 1B Joe Thaman (5/13/02) and 3B Matt Edwards (4/7/03), plus Gaston and Lopez.

**IN-STATE BATTLES** – After the season-opening win over Indiana State and the ensuing wins over Valparaiso, Ball State, Manchester, IPFW and Purdue, Notre Dame now owns a 54-10 record (.841) vs. fellow Indiana-based schools during the Paul Mainieri era (since '95), with games versus: Valparaiso (11-1), Butler (7-0), Manchester (7-0), Purdue (7-2), IUPUI (5-0), Indiana Tech (4-1), Indiana (3-0), Indianapolis (2-0), IPFW (3-0), Indiana St. (2-1), Ball State (3-4) and Evansville (1-1).

**ECK-CELLENT** – Notre Dame recently posted the program's 300th win in 13 seasons at Eck Stadium (now 309-67-1), winning better than 82% of the games in the home facility ... the only teams with more than three wins at Eck vs. ND: St. John's (5-10), West Virginia (5-8), Miami, Fla. (4-1), Ball State (4-3) and Rutgers (4-11).

**FOUR-PEAT NO EASY FEAT** – Oral Roberts (8, Mid-Continent Conference) is the only team in the nation with a longer active streak of conference tournament titles than Notre Dame's four straight BIG EAST Tournament titles ... Rice won nine straight Western Athletic Conference automatic bids from 1997-2005 (the WAC does not sponsor a tournament and awards its bid to the regular-season champ) ... ORU and Rice are the only teams – among 30 Division I conferences – that are riding a streak of more than four consecutive conference automatic bids ... ND also owns the record for consecutive wins in BIG EAST tournament play (7, still active).



**23-GAME WIN STREAK OVERVIEW** – The Irish hit .353 during their record-setting 23-game win streak from March 25-April 25, averaging 8.6 runs per game with a .499 team slugging pct. (20 HR, 6 3B, 44 2B), a .442 on-base pct. (106 BB, 31 HBP, 88 Ks), 30 stolen bases and 32 sac. bunts ... the ND pitchers owned a 2.81 staff ERA during the win streak (79 total runs allowed/3.43 per game), with a .227 opp. batting avg., a 3-to-1 K-to-walk ratio (192/62) and 36 more innings pitched (208) than hits allowed (172, with just 5 HR) ... ND had a .972 fielding pct. in the win streak (24 Es) ...

The streak included 12 blowout wins (by 5-plus runs) and the Irish scored 14 times in the first inning ... ND totaled 0-1 errors in 18 of the games during the win streak ... the Irish outhit the opponents in 20 of the 23 games during the streak, reached on 48% of the time when leading off the inning and batted .366 with runners in scoring position ... ND dominated the middle innings during the win streak, with a 104-12 scoring edge from the 4th to the 6th innings (37-3, 37-2, 30-7) ... the win streak spanned 31 days and was part of 19 straight wins at Eck Stadium (18).

**SCHEDULE CHANGES** – There have been several minor changes to the Notre Dame 2006 baseball schedule, since its initial release on Dec. 10:

- The BIG EAST also has announced that the eight-team conference tournament will be held in the new venue of Bright House Networks Field (Clearwater, Fla.), the Philadelphia Phillies spring-training site and home field for their single-A affiliate.

- Also of note is the fact that South Bend/Notre Dame now observes Eastern time (including DST) all year-round ... that's a switch from past years when South Bend residents never changed their clocks (and were on EST year-round) ... thus, South Bend no longer will be on the equivalent of Central time from April through October, as it has been in recent years (South Bend's time zone now will be aligned with the east coast all 12 months).

**NEW FORMAT** – Most BIG EAST series in 2006 have shifted to a three-day format (typically Fri.-Sat.-Sun.) ... all BIG EAST games will be nine innings, except in the instance where a doubleheader must be played on Sunday ... there also no longer is the option to use Monday as a makeup day for a weekend series.

**ND BASEBALL AND ECK STADIUM FEATURED IN EA SPORTS GAME** – The Notre Dame baseball program and Eck Stadium are prominent elements in the newly-released EA Sports home video game MVP 06 NCAA Baseball ... the revolutionary game features Notre Dame and 127 other Division I teams while Eck Stadium is one of 19 stadiums featured in the popular new release ... EA Sports – the makers of the highest-rated and top-selling baseball game of the past three years – has created a completely new baseball experience: MVP 06 NCAA® Baseball. Inspired by the spirit and emotion of collegiate athletics, MVP 06 NCAA Baseball is the first-ever college baseball game.

**LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON** – Six current Irish players are second-generation college baseball players: senior IF Eddie **Smith** (Ed Smith, Gonzaga), junior LHP/1B Mike **Dury** (John Dury, N.C. State), junior RHP Jeff **Manship** (John Manship, Arizona), freshman IF Evan **Sharpley** (Tom Sharpley, Spring Arbor) and freshman C **Mike Many** (Bob Many, Northern Illinois).

**ND TEAM NOTES** – The Irish have lost just once in the past 28 games (26-1-1) ... since the start of the current decade (2000-06), ND owns the 3rd-best win pct. among nearly 300 D-I teams (.737; 315-112), trailing once Rice (.748; 330-111-0) and Florida State (.745; 348-119-1) ... ND, FSU and Wichita State currently are the only teams to post 35-plus wins every season since 1989 (the '89-'04 ND teams all won 40-plus), with Georgia Tech (33-12), Clemson (33-13) and LSU (29-17) the only others that could join that group with 35-plus wins every year since '89 ... ND and Nebraska remain the only teams in the nation ranked among the top-30 for batting avg. (ND 22nd at .322, now .325), staff ERA (14th at 3.33, now 3.25) and fielding pct. (28th at .971, now .970) ... the Irish also rank 6th in the nation for win pct. (now .794) ... ND has totaled 62 runs in the past six games at Eck Stadium and is 20-2 at home this season (35-3-1 in the past 39 games at "The Eck") ... ND has totaled 13 "big innings" (5-plus runs) this season (4 in the 4th inning) ... the Irish own a 57-11 overall scoring edge in the 4th inning ... ND has totaled 30 games with double-digit hits ... ND saw several streaks end last week: Craig Cooper's 21-game hit streak (tied ND record) ended vs. Purdue; the team's 23-game win streak (ND record) was halted by Bowling Green and also ended an 18-game home win streak; and the team's 16-game BIG EAST win streak (two shy of the BIG EAST record) ended in the 1-1 tie with UConn ... the Irish still could set a BIG EAST record for unbeaten streak (19) by winning the first two games vs. Louisville (ND's '01 team had a 18-0 stretch in BIG EAST play) ... the 23-game win streak was one of the longest in ND athletics history, ranking alongside streaks by the softball (33), women's soccer (24), football (23), women's basketball (23) and men's basketball (22) teams ... the two wins at UConn gave ND its best-ever BIG EAST start (16-1; the '98 team started 14-1) ... since the start of the win streak on March 25, ND has erased 19 of 20 deficits it has faced ... ND is 23-1-1 in its past 25 games vs. BIG EAST teams ... the six largest attendance numbers in Eck Stadium history have come this season (record 3,507 for opener vs. Rutgers) ... ND had totaled just 11 HRs in its first 30 games but has 16 HRs in the past 16 games ... the current 3.28 staff ERA and .325 team batting avg. both would rank 2nd-best at ND in the Paul Mainieri era (the .970 fielding pct. would tie the ND record) ... Alex Netthey's 2-run blast vs. St. John's (9-7) was ND's 12th game-ending home run in the Mainieri era (first at Eck Stadium since '01) ... the Irish reached 30 wins (30-8) quicker than all but the '04 (30-5) and '01 (30-5-1) Irish teams ... ND's 10 regular position players are a veteran group, combining for more than 1,209 career starts ... the Irish staff has allowed just 8 HRs all season and recently went 25 games (943 batters faced) without allowing a HR ... ND owns a 50-24 scoring edge in the 1st inning this season ... ND rapped out 49 hits in the sweeps of USF and Rutgers, the most hits for the Irish in a BIG EAST series since 50 vs. Georgetown in '98 ... ND's 46 games this season have featured 38 different batting orders.

**SILVER STREAKS** – Notre Dame now has totaled 11 double-digit win streaks in the Paul Mainieri era ... all but three (1997, 2000, '05) of the 12 Mainieri-era seasons have featured at least one double-digit winning streak (with two in both '98 and '04) ... the recent 23-game win streak began on March 25, within a day of the starting point in four of the 10 previous double-digit streaks (March 24 in '96, '03 and '04; March 26 in '98):

(.420, now .428), 2nd in runs/gm (1.41, now 57 total), 46th in slugging (.682, now .692) and 36th in “toughest to strike out” (15.7 ABs per K; now 15.9) ... Greg Lopez is 32nd on the toughest-to-K list (16.2, now 16.6) ... Danny Dressman ranks 21st nationally in sac. bunts (11) and Lilley is 26th (10), with Alex Nettey 6th in HBPs (20) ... two ND pitchers rank among the national ERA leaders: Wade Korpi (11th; 1.53) and Jeff Manship (68th; 2.42), with Korpi 20th in Ks per 9 IP (11.3) and Manship 36th (10.3 Ks) ... Kyle Weiland’s 12 saves (one shy of J.P. Gagne’s ND record) stand 6th in the nation (2nd among closers from top-25 teams) ... Matt Bransfield (10) and Jeremy Barnes (8) are riding noteworthy hit streaks ... Cody Rizzo’s 79 career HBPs remain 3rd in NCAA history, three shy of 2nd place and 13 back of the record ... Lopez has an impressive combination for a shortstop, with a high RBI total (team-best 34) and low errors (7) ... Lopez entered the week with a 4.9 ratio of RBI to errors (only one SS from a team in the top-25 had a better ratio) ... Wade Korpi last week had two strong 7-inning starts (vs. Purdue and UConn; 16 Ks, 3 BB, 7 H) en route to taking over the BIG EAST overall ERA lead (1.53) ... Mainieri is 524-205-3 at ND, 855-484-4 overall (24 yrs) ... Jeff Samardzija (40th) and Manship (41st) recently were upgraded to top-50 status on *Baseball America*’s list of top college prospects for the '06 MLB draft (UNC and Missouri are the only other teams with two starting pitchers among the top-50) ... Dressman (.417), Lopez (.414), Jeremy Barnes (.362) and Rizzo (.356) are ND’s top batters with runners in scoring position.

**FIRST-INNING FOCUS** – Notre Dame’s impressive 1st-inning stats this season include a 50-24 scoring margin, with 1st-inning runs in 24 games ... the Irish recently had a 7-game scoring streak in the 1st inning, longest by an ND team in the past five seasons (the 2004 team scored in the 1st inning of six straight games, the ’05 team in five straight) ... ND is batting .354 as a team in the 1st inning this season (22 extra-base hits, 7 HRs), led by:

**STRONG STARTERS** – The ND pitchers have posted a scoreless first inning in 33 of 46 games this season.

**JUMPING ON TOP** – Notre Dame’s best 1st-inning scoring margin of the Mainieri era (since ’95) came in 2001 (+48; 59-11) ... the recent streak of scoring 1st-inning runs in seven straight games (March 21-29) was longest by an ND team since that 2001 team scored in eight straight, from April 21-29 of that season ... ND’s current +26 scoring margin in the 1st inning (50-24) is nearly triple that of the ’05 team (+9; 58-49) and would rank 5th-best by an Irish team in the Mainieri era (on pace for +36) ... the current 1st-inning scoring ratio of 2.0 ranks 4th in Mainieri’s 12 seasons ... ND has finished with a positive 1st-inning scoring margin every season of the Mainieri era except 1998 (-12), with an average margin of +18 and avg. ratio of 1.9 ... the most 1st-inning runs ever scored by a Mainieri-era offense at ND are 75 (in ’04; 1.19/gm) while the fewest allowed are 11 (in ’01; 0.18/gm) ... ND’s current averages are 1.09 runs/gm and 0.52 runs allowed/gm in the 1st ... here’s a look at the Mainieri-era teams and their 1st-inning production:

**MORE IN FOUR** – ND’s ability to make midgame adjustments (at the plate and on the mound) resulted in a dominating 37-3 scoring edge during the 4th-inning of the 23-game win streak ... the 4th now has become ND’s most dominating overall inning in 2004 (+46, 57-11), led by Jeremy Barnes (.643, 9-for-14, 5 R), Danny Dressman (.462, 6-for-13, 5 R), Alex Nettey (.417, 10-for-24, 12 R) and Brett Lilley (.412, 7-for-17, 4 R).

**IS THE EIGHTH ENOUGH?** – The Irish have put away several games this season in the 8th, owning a 38-23 scoring edge in the inning (+15) ... ND is batting .351 in the 8th inning this season led by:

**MANSHIP, SAMARDZIJA  
 AMONG NATION’S TOP PROSPECTS**

• *Baseball America* released its annual preseason list of college baseball’s top-100 prospects for the 2006 Major League baseball draft and Notre Dame was one of six teams in the nation to feature two starting pitchers among those top-100 prospects – as **Jeff Manship** was slotted at No. 75 on that list (now #41) while fellow junior righthander **Jeff Samardzija** was listed 94th (now 40th) ... the other teams with two starting pitchers among the preseason top-100 prospects were UNC, Missouri, Cal Poly, Washington and San Diego (ND, UNC and Missouri are the only ones currently with two starting pitchers among the top-50 prospects).

• *BA’s* college preview listed ND senior 1B **Craig Cooper** and sophomore B **Brett Lilley** on its preseason all-BIG EAST team ... *BA* cited Lilley, senior SS **Greg Lopez** and junior catcher **Sean Gaston** as the BIG EAST’s best defensive players at their positions while tabbing Lilley as the BIG EAST batter with the “best strike-zone discipline,” **Samardzija** as the BIG EAST’s best athlete, **Manship** as the league’s pitcher with the best breaking ball and senior LHP **Tom Thornton** as the BIG EAST pitcher with the best control.

• *BA’s* preseason rankings had Manship 4th and Samardzija 6th among the BIG EAST’s prospects (Cooper was 44th among the nation’s top senior prospects).

**LIDGE NAMED TO WBC TEAM** – Former Notre Dame ace pitcher and current Houston Astros all-star closer **Brad Lidge** (’96-’98) was one of 16 college baseball products named to the United States original 30-man roster for the World Baseball Classic, a 16-nation tournament held March 3-20 in Japan, Puerto Rico and the U.S. ... former Notre Dame standout and current Arizona Diamondbacks infielder **Craig Counsell** (’92) was not named to the team but is one of 22 players who remain on the provisional roster – with the official U.S. 30-man roster not to be submitted to WBC organizers until March 2 ... all 10 of the relief pitchers originally named to the team are former college baseball players, as is Astros starting pitcher Roger Clemens (Texas) and five position players ... Lidge saved the 2-0 win over Canada and was the pitcher of record in the 4-3 win over eventual champion Japan.

**FAR & WIDE** – Notre Dame’s nine position player starters hail from seven states, including two outfielders from **California** (senior LF/DH Steve Andres and RF Cody Rizzo) and two leftside infielders from **Ohio** (senior SS Greg Lopez and sophomore 3B Brett Lilley), plus one each from **New York** (senior 1B Craig Cooper), **Colorado** (senior LF/DH Matt Bransfield), **Indiana** (junior C Sean Gaston), **Florida** (sophomore 3B Ross Brezovsky) and **Illinois** (senior CF Alex Nettey)

**STATE ROLL CALL** – The Notre Dame list of all-time monogram winners includes players from 44 home states ... pitchers Brandon Vioria (Wailuku, Hawaii) in 2000 and Cody Wilkins (Hudson, N.C.) in 2004 became the first players from their respective states ever to monogram with the Irish baseball program ... the only states that have not produced ND baseball letterwinners include Alaska, Idaho, Nevada, New Hampshire, South Carolina and Vermont ... the 12-year Paul Mainieri era has featured players from 36 states, including 15 states on the 2006 roster (see list below):

**CLUTCH HITTING KEY COMPONENT** – Three stats that measure clutch offensive production – leadoff on-base pct., batting with runners in scoring position and 2-out batting – show that clutch hitting can overcome a team’s dropoff in power numbers ... using a formula that combines those three situational hitting numbers, **Brett Lilley** was the 2005 team’s runaway team leader with a “clutch hitting” score of 1.402 ... that number can be skewed a bit by the on-base pct. (which has the benefit of including walks and HBPs and thus is higher than the batting avg. stats) ... using an adjustment whereby the leadoff on-base pct. is multiplied by 75%, Lilley still checked in as ND’s all-around leader in 2005 clutch hitting with a 1,273 score (.515 leadoff on-base/.386 adjusted, .448 RISP, .439 with 2-outs) ... Lilley led the ’05 team in 2-out batting and batting with RISP while ranking 3rd in leadoff OB (better than his overall team-leading .502 OB pct.) ... current senior 1B **Craig Cooper** was 2nd overall with a 1,117 clutch-hitting score in ’05 that included the team’s 2nd-best batting averages with 2 outs (.439) and with runners in scoring position (.448) ... as a team, the most consistent part of ND’s 2005 clutch offense was leadoff on-base pct. (.406/.311 adjusted), followed by batting with RISP (.309) while the 2-out batting lagged behind at .294 ... the 2005 team’s overall clutch-hitting score was 908 but the 2006 team has gone well beyond that, checking in at 969 thanks to a big jump in leadoff on-base pct. (.406 to .441) and batting with runners in scoring position (.309 to .342) ... junior OF **Danny Dressman** leads the ’06 team with a 1,124 clutch-hitting score – nearly double his 673 in ’05, with huge jumps in all three categories (up 253 points in leadoff OB, 131 in batting with RISP and 131 in 2-out hitting) ... Cooper’s CH score (1,090) is a bit below his ’05 number but he has made a 187-point jump in leadoff OB (.419 to .606) ... senior SS **Greg Lopez** owns a 1,030 CH score that is 244 points higher than his 2005 mark, mostly due to a 172-point rise in his batting with RISP (team-best .414).

**LORDS OF DISCIPLINE** – The 2006 Notre Dame offense owns a +65 plate-discipline ratio (walks + hit-by-pitch - strikeouts) that is nearly four times the 2005 team's PDR (+17) and is on pace for +90 over 64 games ... the Irish batters have boosted their walks (3.5/gm in '05 to 4.2/gm in '06) while hitting at a .325 clip (30 points higher than in '05) ... the ND offense also is averaging nearly one fewer K per game this season (4.4) than in 2005 (5.2) ... the biggest improvements in PDR have been seen by junior OF Danny **Dressman** (up 25; from -6 to +19), sophomore 2B Ross **Brezovsky** (22; from -20 to +2), senior SS Greg **Lopez** (19; from -17 to +2), senior CF Alex **Nettey** (16; from -2 to +14) and junior C Sean **Gaston** (13; from -7 to +6) ... Dressman is on pace to finish at +26 while senior 1B **Craig Cooper** (+24) is on pace for a +33, which would surpass Brett Lilley's team-best +29 in from the 2005 season:

**IRISH POST 500th WIN OF MAINIERI ERA** – The 6-3 win over Georgetown on March 26 was Paul Mainieri's 500th victory in 11-plus seasons at ND (now 524-205-3/.718; 855-484-4/.638 in 24 overall seasons) ... the Mainieri era has included an average of 44-plus wins per season, eight trips to the NAAs, eight conference titles, 43 players who have been drafted or signed as free-agents, 12 All-America seasons and nine Academic All-America honors (all 63 of his four-year players have graduated and 11 who signed professionally as juniors have returned to complete or near completion of their undergraduate requirements).

- The Irish are **34-3-1 when Barnes has started**, including a 20-1 combined record when he has started in the middle infield (12-0 at 2B, 4-1 at SS) or at third base (6-0), plus 2-1 with him at first base and 10-1-1 as the DH ... ND is **14-3 when Rizzo has started at catcher** (he has caught **6 games by Manship**, 5 by Gruener, 3 by Samardzija, 2 by Phelps and just a single game by Korpi).
- The **DH** spot has managed to hit **just .235** this season (36-for-153), with most of the hits coming from Bransfield (9-for-17, .529) or Barnes (11-for-42, .262) ... those two are batting a combined .339 as the DH while the other nine who have DH'd are a combined 16-for-94 (.170) ... **Dressman** is hitting **.400 as an outfielder** (52-for-130, 31 RBI, 30 R) but is 0-for-16 as the DH (0 RBI, R) while Brezovsky is 6-for-20 (.300) as the DH, Gaston 2-for-15 (.153), Andres 3-for-19 (.158) and Dury 2-for-13 (.154) .. **Barnes** is batting just 4-for-23 (.174) when playing as the ND shortstop this season, compared to **.309** (42-for-136) at **all other positions**.

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

• The Notre Dame baseball team traditionally has matched its stellar play on the field with strong performances in the classroom and that continued to be the case in the 2005 fall semester – as the 32 players combined for a 3.17 team GPA during the semester.

• The NCAA's recently-released Graduation Success Rate (GSR) data also reinforced the Notre Dame baseball program's elite academic standing, as the Irish were one of 17 teams among 268 in Division I – but one of only two teams from that group that also currently are in the national top-25 polls – to compile a 100% graduation rate, during a four-year sample of classes entering from 1995-98.

• The Irish also own a 100% graduation rate (63-of-63) among four-year players throughout the tenure of head coach Paul Mainieri ('95-present), with 12 others who signed professionally prior to their senior season returning to complete or near completion of their degree requirements.

• Twenty-one of the ND baseball players posted a GPA of 3.0-plus during the 2005 fall semester, with 11 checking in at 3.4 or higher ... the ND players also have combined for an impressive 3.10 cumulative team GPA over the course of their college careers.

• Notre Dame boasts several strong Academic All-America candidates in 2006, most notably: senior LHP **Tom Thornton** (3.54 cumulative GPA; double major in anthropology and film-television-and-theater), sophomore 3B **Brett Lilley** (3.64; accounting), senior SS **Greg Lopez** (3.39; pre-professional studies and anthropology), senior LF/DH **Matt Bransfield** (3.36; sociology), junior catcher **Sean Gaston** (3.36; political science and history) and sophomore 2B **Ross Brezovsky** (3.26; economics) ... Notre Dame's unmatched Academic All-America history includes 20 honorees since 1992.

• The senior class led the way for the Irish during the 2005 fall semester, averaging a 3.54 semester GPA that included seven players above a 3.4 and all eight posting a semester GPA of 3.05 or higher.

**Alex Netzey** (Fayetteville, NC, Swampdogs; Coastal Plains League) – hit .236 as starting CF (3 BB, 9 HB, 8 R, 12 RBI, 8 SB)

**Danny Dressman** (Madison, WI Mallards; Northwoods League) – team's top defensive outfielder, making just one error in 54 GP (hit .297, 18 R, 17 RBI, 3 2B, 12 BB, 6 SB)

**Ross Brezovsky** (Hays, KS Larks; Jayhawk League) – hit .256 with 18 runs scored (8 RBI, 3 2B, 15 BB, 12 K, 31 G)

**David Gruener** (Hays, KS Larks; Jayhawk League) – had 9 starts in 11 appearances (5-2, 59 Ks, 23 BB, 44 H, 52 IP)

**Wade Korpi** (Staunton, VA, Braves; Valley League) – went 3-3 with 4.67 ERA in 12 appearances (46 Ks, 34.2 IP, 4 GS, 18 BB, 36 H, .265 opp. avg.)

**Joey Williamson** (Luray, VA, Wranglers; Valley League) – posted 2.06 ERA, 3-0 record (9 GP/6 GS, 42 Ks, 20 BB, 26 H)

**Eddie Smith** (DuPage Dragons; Central Illinois Collegiate League) – stole 4 bases on 5 attempts (.156, 8 R, 5 RBI, .315 OBP, .938 FLD)

**BULLPEN BOOST** – Notre Dame lost two of its top relief pitchers (junior RHP Dan Kapala/shoulder and sophomore RHP Tony Langford/elbow) before the 2006 season even began but the Irish relievers have responded with a solid season that now includes a 3.19 bullpen ERA, a .236 opponent batting avg., a 2.2 K-to-walk ratio (121/56) and 21 more innings pitched (149.2) than hits allowed (129) ... the relievers have allowed nearly one-half (28-of-70; 40%) of inherited baserunners to score and steadily have improved vs. first batters faced, allowing a .294 batting avg. (25-for-85) with 15 runs scored, 6 walks and 4 hit-batters among those 103 first batters (17 Ks):

**GIVING BACK THE INHERITANCE** – Junior RHP **Joey Williamson** has taken the mound with 11 batters on base this season and has allowed just three of them to score (27%) ... Williamson has been particularly strong versus his first batters faced, allowing just 2-for-13 batting (.154) with seven strikeouts in those situations (BB, 2 HBP, 3 R).

**SUPER SAVER** – Closer **Kyle Weiland** (11) already has bested Aaron Heilman's ND record for saves by a freshman (9, in '98) ... Weiland converted each of his first nine save chances (now 12-of-13) and is second on the ND season saves list, behind J.P. Gagne (13, in '03) ... his 12 saves rank he typically has done better at the end of his outings, allowing 6-of-7 inherited runners to score while first batters faced are hitting 7-for-16 (.438) vs. him (BB, HBP, 4 R, 2 Ks) ... after the first batters in his outings, Weiland has held opposing hitters to a combined .215 batting avg. (17-for-79).

**DURY DOES IT** – Junior LHP **Mike Dury** was the third of four Irish relievers and retired five of the six batters he faced in the key comeback win over Ball State (K) while improving to 5-0 in his Irish career ... Dury took the mound with two outs and two runners on base in the top of the seventh, inducing a rightside popup off the bat of Kyle Dygert to keep the deficit at 4-3 ... his 2006 season stats include a 2.06 ERA in 16 appearances and 17.1 innings (11 H/.183 opp. avg., 11 Ks, 4 BB), with a 1.87 career ERA in 57.2 IP (38 Ks, 15 BB, 50 H/.236) ... he is close to reaching the minimum innings pitched (60) required for inclusion on the ND career ERA list and ultimately could break a record that has stood for 45 years (All-American Nick Palihnich's 2.36 career ERA, from 1959-61).

**IRISH TAKE AIM AT EIGHTH STRAIGHT NCAA TRIP** – Notre Dame, which bounced back from a 14-14 start to the 2005 season by going 22-8-1 in the second half, made its seventh straight appearance in the NCAAs and eighth of the Paul Mainieri era (since '95) during that 2005 season ... the Irish are part of an elite group of 12 teams that have appeared in the NCAAs every year since 1999, with others including: recent NCAA champions Miami, LSU, Texas, Rice and Cal State Fullerton, plus Florida State, Stanford, Clemson, Tulane, East Carolina and Oral Roberts ... ND is part of an even smaller list of seven teams that have advanced to at least the NCAA Regional final every year since 2000 (six straight), with the other five teams including LSU, Miami, Rice, South Carolina, Stanford and Texas.

**FOR OPENERS** – Following the 3-0 win over Indiana State, ND now is 8-1 in its past nine season openers, with five straight wins (29-9 margin in the past three openers).

**PLAYING THE FIELD** – Notre Dame faced three Big 12 Conference teams earlier this season (Oklahoma, Nebraska and Texas A&M), continuing a long trend that has seen the Irish face teams from all over the nation ... Big 12 team Oklahoma State is one of just a handful of teams from the nation's top conferences that Notre Dame never has faced (as are Kansas, also of the Big 12, and ACC team Maryland) ... ND baseball has faced 285 opponents in its 115-year history, including 177 of 283 teams (63%) that played on the Div. I level in 2005 (many of the teams ND has not faced are from the smaller conferences) ... other teams of note that ND has yet to face include emerging programs such as the College of Charleston, Virginia Commonwealth, Coastal Carolina, Louisiana-Lafayette, East Carolina and Southern Miss.– plus west-coast teams such as Cal Poly, San Jose State, UNLV and Utah.

**SCORING STREAK ENDS AT 215** – The second-longest scoring streak in ND baseball history (215 games, dating back to 2002) ended in the early-season loss to the host team Minnesota at the DQ Classic (8-0; followed by a 2-0 loss to Arizona) ... a 2002 shut-out loss to Rutgers ended ND's record scoring streak (231) but the Irish then scored in 215 straight before the loss to the Gophers ... ND now has been shut out just eight times in the 12-year Paul Mainieri era (never more than twice in the same season).
