BACK TO LEAGUE PLAY: Notre Dame returns to CCHA action this weekend and for the remainder of the 2010-11 season as the Irish travel to Marquette, Mich., to face the Northern Michigan Wildcats at the Berry Events Center on Jan. 7-8. Game time both nights is 7:35 p.m. Notre Dame is coming off a third-place finish at the Shillelagh Tournament last weekend where the Irish fell to Min-

nesota State, 4-3, in the opening round and then tied Boston University, 3-3, in the third-place contest on Jan. 2. Notre Dame took third in the tournament on the strength of a 1-0 win in the shootout. The Irish are 12-7-3 on the year and 9-4-1-1 in CCHA action, good for first place after the first half of the season. Notre Dame has 29 points in conference play and is one point ahead of second-place Michigan (28), two ahead of third-place Miami (27) and six ahead of fourthplace Northern Michigan (23) as the Wildcats are part of a three-way tie for the fourth spot in the CCHA. Northern Michigan is 9-9-4 overall and 7-5-2-0 in the CCHA. The Wildcats are coming off a two-game series last weekend at Denver that saw them lose (5-2) and tie (2-2) the Pioneers. Following this weekend's series, the Irish will return home on Jan. 14-15 to face the Alaska Nanooks at the Joyce Center.

IRISH VERSUS WILDCATS: This weekend's series between Notre Dame and Northern Michigan is the second meeting this season between the two teams. The Irish and Wildcats closed the first half of the CCHA schedule on Dec. 11-12, splitting that series at the Joyce Center. Northern Michigan won the opener, 3-2 with Notre Dame taking game two, 5-2. The teams have met 48 times in the all-time series with the Wildcats holding a 22-20-6 edge. At Marquette, Northern Michigan is 9-7-2 against the Irish. Notre Dame's last win at the Berry Events Center came on Oct. 31-Nov. 1, 2008 when the Irish took two from the Wildcats, 3-2 and 4-2. Notre Dame is 4-2-0 in its last six



CCHA ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Freshman left wing Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) has been selected as the CCHA rookie of the month for December. In five games during December, Lee had two goals and six assists for eight points to finish second to T.J. Tynan in scoring in the CCHA for the month. Lee had points in four of the five games, including three with two or more points. On Dec. 3, at Miami, he had a career-best three assists as he helped the Irish rally from a two-goal deficit to beat Miami, 5-4. The three-point game equaled a career-high for Lee who now has 12 goals and 10 assists for 22 points to rank third on the Irish in scoring and second to Tynan in the conference freshman scoring race.

**THE RANKINGS:** Notre Dame enters the series with Northern Michigan ranked 12th in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and 11th in the USCHO.com poll. Northern Michigan is not ranked in either poll this week.

SHILLELAGH TOURNAMENT RECAP: Saturday, Jan. 1 - Minnesota State junior forward Michael Dorr beat Notre Dame goaltender Mike

Johnson (Jr., Verona, Wis.) with a slap shot from inside the Irish blue line with 22.9 seconds left in the game to give the Mavericks a 4-3 win over the Irish in the semifinals of the 2011 Shillelagh Tournament. Minnesota State jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first period on goals by Cameron Cooper and Evan Mosey. The Irish roared back in the second stanza with three straight goals by Ben Ryan (Sr., Brighton, Mich.), freshman Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.), on the power play and senior Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) in a 6:09 span to take a 3-2 lead. The Mavericks would get the equalizer at 19:07 of the second on a goal by Rylan Galiardi to make it 3-3 after two periods. Dorr then got the only goal of the third for the 4-3 Minnesota State win. Notre Dame out shot the Mavericks, 37-27, in the game. Phil Cook made 34 saves in the Minnesota State goal while Johnson had 23 for the Irish. Both teams were 1-for-5 on the power play.

Sunday, Jan. 2 - Notre Dame rallied from a 3-1 deficit to tie Boston University, 3-3, in the third-place game of the 2011 Shillelagh Tournament. Sophomore defenseman Sam Calabrese's (Park Ridge, III.) short-handed goal with 2:53 left in the game was the equalizer. Senior Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) scored the lone goal in the shootout to give the Irish third place in the tournament. The game goes into the record books as a tie. T.J. Tynan and Anders Lee had

Notre Dame's other goals as each player had a goal and an assist in the contest. Boston University got goals from Joe Pereira, Adam Clendening and Chris Connolly in the game. The Terriers led 2-1 after one period as Pereira and Clendening sandwiched goals around Tynan's 14th of the year. The BU lead went to 3-1 in the second as Connolly got his sixth of the year at 13:08. The score stayed that way until the 6:09 mark when Tynan set up Lee on a beautiful pass off a 2-on-1 one to make it 3-2. With the Terriers on their first power play of the night late in the third, Ryan Guentzel (Sr., Woodbury, Minn.) broke up a BU rush in the neutral zone and carried the puck deep into the Terriers' zone where he found Calabrese coming late down the left side. The sophomore defender snapped a shot from below the left circle past goaltender Kieran Millan for the tying goal at 17:07. Millan finished with 39 saves in the game while Mike Johnson (So., Verona, Wis.) made 16 in the Irish goal. BU was 0-for-2 on the power play while Notre Dame was 0-for-3.

**BACK ON TOP:** Notre Dame's 5-2 win over Northern Michigan on Sunday, Dec. 12, moved the Irish back into first place in the CCHA with a 9-4-1-1 mark. Last season as the Irish went into the break for finals and the Christmas holidays, they were 8-8-4 overall and 5-5-4 in the CCHA, good for 21 points and sixth place in the league standings.

DOING IT SHORT-HANDED: Sam Calabrese's short-handed goal with 2:53 left in the third period against Boston University not only tied the game against the Terriers at 3-3, but was the ninth short-handed goal of the season for the Irish. They lead the nation in that category with four teams behind them with six short-handed tallies. Through 22 games this season, Notre Dame has seen seven different players get a goal while the team was a man down. Versus Michigan State (Nov. 19-20), Notre Dame scored short-handed three times in that series. The nine short-handed goals lead the CCHA and the nation going into the weekend series with Northern Michigan. The nine shorties are the most for the Irish since the 1997-98 season when they also had nine. Notre Dame has a way to go for the school record which is 19 and was set during the 1981-82 season. T.J. Tynan and defenseman Joe Lavin (Sr., Shrewsbury, Mass.) lead the team with two each while Sean Lorenz (Sr., Littleton, Colo.), Bryan Rust (Fr., Novi, Mich.), Billy Maday (Jr., Burr Ridge, Ill.), Ryan Guentzel and now Calabrese have one each.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame's freshman class has played a key role in the 12-7-3 start for the Irish. In the first 22 games of this season, the freshman class has accounted for 47 of the team's 84 goals (55.9%), 67 of the 147 assists (45.6%) and 114 of team's 231 points this season (49.4%). Freshman goaltender Steven Summerhays (Anchorage, Alaska) has three of the team's 12 wins in goal.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN: Freshmen T.J. Tynan and Anders Lee come into the series at Northern Michigan ranked first and second in the CCHA in rookie scoring. Tynan has 14 goals and 15 assists for 29 points while Lee has 12 goals and 10 assists for 22 points. With 14 and 12 goals respectively, Lee and Tynan are tops among freshman goal scorers. Fellow freshman Mike Voran (2g, 10a, 12 pts) is tied for seventh among freshmen and is followed by Bryan Rust (4g, 5a) and Jeff Costello (6g, 3a, 9 pts) who are tied for 12th. Defensemen Stephen Johns (1g, 7a) is 17th while Shayne Taker (1g, 6a) is tied for 21st along with Irish center David Gerths (6g, 1a). Johns and Taker rank fourth and fifth among rookie defensemen in scoring. Tynan is third overall in scoring in the league while Lee is tied for seventh.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Sophomore goaltender Mike Johnson (Verona, Wis.) has now appeared in 12 of Notre Dame's last 13 games. making 11 starts in that span that began on Nov. 12 versus Michigan. In his last 12 appearances, he is 5-4-2 with 2.97 goals-against average and a .880 save percentage. Johnson, who started the year with a 4-0-1 unbeaten streak in his first five starts is 9-5-3 on the year with a 2.69 goals against average and a .897 save percentage. As a freshman, Johnson took CCHA all-rookie team honors, playing in 29 games in '09-'10, going 10-13-5 with a 2.60 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage. Behind Johnson are a pair of freshmen - Steven Summerhays and Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.). Summerhays is now 3-2-0 with a 3.71 goals-against average and a .818 save percentage. He played the first 40 minutes on Dec. 29 in the 10-2 win over Canisius, stopping 14-of-15 shots. He owns wins over Canisius, Bowling Green and Western Michigan while his losses have been to Boston University (10/10) and Miami (12/4). Summerhays joined the Irish after playing the last two seasons with the USHL's Green Bay Gamblers. In '09-'10, Summerhays was a first team all-USHL selection and the USHL goaltender of the year after going 31-2-3 with a 2.17 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. Joe Rogers made his first career appearance in the Canisius game, playing the final 20 minutes while stopping eight-of-nine shots. He is 0-0-0 with a 3.00 goals-against average and a .889 save percentage. Rogers joins the Notre Dame roster after playing last season in the North American Hockey League (NAHL) with the Albert Lea Thunder. Rogers was 13-19-2 with a 3.97 goals-against average and a .891 save percentage.

**NATIONAL LEADERS**: Freshman center **T.J. Tynan** has burst on to the national scene as he finds himself ranked fourth in the nation in points scored and tied for fifth with 14 goals on the year.

CAREER YEAR: Senior right wing Ryan Guentzel had the best game of his career with three goals and an assist in the win over Canisius (Dec. 29). He is currently second on the team in scoring with six goals and 18 assists for 24 points. His goal, assist and point totals are career highs for Guentzel. He had a career-best seven-game point streak (1g, 9a) snapped at Michigan on Nov. 13. His previous best season was 2008-09 when he had four goals and seven assists for 11 points. He is currently fifth in the CCHA in scoring with 24 points and his 18 assists are third in the conference.

THE SPECIALIST: Senior left wing Calle **Ridderwall** is third on the team in goals with 10 through the first 22 games this season and tied for second on the team in power-play goals with three. His goal versus Canisius on Dec. 29th was the 50th of his Notre Dame career. With 10 goals this season, Ridderwall has now been in double figures in goals in each of the last three seasons for the Irish after getting 17 in 2008-09 and 19 last season in 2009-10. Over the last two-plus seasons, Ridderwall has scored 46 goals with 25 of them coming via the power play. Last season, his 11 power-play goals led the CCHA. Ridderwall had 11 power-play goals in '08-'09 to match last season's total and has two this year. His 25 power-play goals move him into a tie for sixth on Notre Dame's all-time power-play goal list with Aniket Dhadphale '99, Tim Kuehl '90 and Kirt Bjork '83, all of whom had 25 man-advantage goals in their careers. For his career, Ridderwall has 51 goals and 32 assists for 83 career points in 139 games.

BOMBS AWAY: In four of Notre Dame's last five games, the Irish have fired 40 or more shots on the opponent's goal. After three straight games of 40 or more, the Irish were held to 37 by Minnesota State in the Shillelagh Tournament and followed that with 42 versus Boston University. Over the last five games, the Irish have averaged 44.6 shots per game after getting 53 versus Northern Michigan (Dec. 11) and then 43 the following night for 96 in the weekend series. Versus Canisius on Dec., 29, Notre Dame had 48 shots against the Golden Griffins. Through the first 22 games this season, the Irish have outshot the opposition in 19 of those games, going 12-6-1. In the three games the Irish have been outshot, they are 0-1-2. Going into this weekend, the Irish are averaging 33.9 shots per game to 25.2 for the opposition.

SHOOTOUT FACTS AND FIGURES: Notre Dame's shootout win over Western Michigan on Oct. 30 was the first for Notre Dame in CCHA play since Nov. 19, 2009 against Michigan State. The Irish had lost four consecutive CCHA shootouts. Notre Dame's second shootout win this year came in the Shillelagh Tournament against Boston University to decide third place. The Irish are 1-0 in the CCHA this season and 2-0 overall after going 2-5 in conference and 3-5 overall last season. In the three seasons that the CCHA has had the shootout, the Irish are 6-5 all-time (3-0

in '08-'09; 2-5 in '09-'10 and 1-0 in '10-'11).

STREAK SNAPPED: Northern Michigan's 3-2 win on Dec. 11, snapped an eight-game home winning streak for the Irish that went back to Jan. 30 of last season. The Irish came into the series with the Wildcats with six straight wins at home during the 2010-11 season. Since the Dec. 11 loss, the Irish have won two straight at home and are now 8-1-0 at home this year.

FUTURE IRISH: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson announced in early December that five players had signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at the University beginning for the 2011-12 season. The group includes three defensemen and two forwards. the defensemen are Eric Johnson (Verona, Wis.), Robbie Russo (Westmont, III.) and Andrew Ryan (Brighton, Mich.). The forwards are Peter Schnedier (Vienna, Austria) and Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.). Peterson signed his letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009 but returned to the USHL this season with the Lincoln Stars. In making the announcement, Jackson said, "We're very excited about this group of players." We think they have the potential to step in and play. What I like most about them is that they are all strong skaters that play with a little grit to their game." Two of the players - Russo and Ryan - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other three are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Russo and Ryan are currently listed by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in their preliminary ratings. For more information on the five players check the Notre Dame website at und.com

TYNAN HONORED: Notre Dame freshman center T.J. Tynan was named the Hockey Commissioners' Association rookie of the month for November to add to his honors this month after being named CCHA rookie of the month for the month of November. In eight games during November, Tynan led all CCHA rookies with six goals and six assists for 12 points. Two goals came on the power play, two were short-handed and one was a game winner. He was +5 for the month and took just 19 shots for a .316 shooting percentage. During November, Tynan scored in seven of the team's eight games with five of the contests being multiple-point games. He was named the CCHA rookie of the month on two occasions - for games the week of Nov. 1 and Nov. 8. Tynan is the second Irish player to take CCHA rookie of the month honors this season as teammate Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) was October's winner.

LATE ADDITIONS: Center T.J. Tynan's fast start (14g, 15a) in the first 22 games has been a key to the 12-7-3 start for the Irish. The 5-8, 156-pound center has moved in to become one of the team's quarterbacks on the power play. The Orland Park, Ill., native wasn't even supposed to be on this year's team. Even though he signed a national letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009, Tynan was going to defer and play another year with the Des Moines Buccaneers in the USHL where he was the Bucs' leading scorer in '09-'10 and a member of the USHL's all-rookie team. When Kyle Palmieri decided to sign with the Anaheim Ducks in early August, the call went out to Tynan and he joined the Irish roster. Freshman defense-

man **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)** also signed a letter-of-intent in Nov. of '09 and was going to be playing this season with Tri-Cities in the USHL. He was asked to join the team in mid-August after Jarred Tinordi opted to play in the OHL. The 6-3, 221-pound Lind has played in 16 games and has six points (one goal, five assists) with a +7 for the year.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE:** From Oct. 31 through Dec. 4, Notre Dame played nine of 11 games on the road, including a streak of eight straight games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish came through that streak with a 4-3-1 record. Starting on Nov. 12-13 the Irish faced #9/#8 Michigan in Ann Arbor, Mich where they split with the Wolverines. On Nov. 19-20, the Irish played host to rv/#17 Michigan State at the Joyce Center, taking two wins versus the Spartans. The weekend of Nov. 26-27 saw the Irish face #10/#9 North Dakota in Grand Forks where they had a loss and a tie. Against #6/#6 Miami Dec. 3-4, the Irish again had a split to give them a 4-3-1 record in the eight games against ranked teams.

GOING TO THE GOAL: Freshman center-David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa) has become a specialist when it comes to scoring those "dirty" goals. The 6-0, 208-pounder does his best work right in front of the goal. He picked up his sixth goal of the season in the Dec. 11 game with Northern Michigan as he jammed a rebound past Jared Coreau in the third period. In 21 games this season, he has scored six goals with one assist for seven points. In 55 games last season in the USHL with Lincoln and Green Bay, Gerths scored just five goals. His six goals are fourth most for Notre Dame this season.

COMING FROM BEHIND: Notre Dame rallied from two-goal deficits twice in the Shillelagh Tournament. The Irish trailed Minnesota State, 2-0 after one period and went ahead 3-2, before falling 4-3 in that game. Notre Dame trailed Boston University 3-1 entering the third period on Jan. 2 and scored twice to pull out the 3-3 tie. On Dec. 3, at Miami, the Irish overcame a pair of two-goal deficits (2-0 after one period and 3-1 in the second period) and won for the first time this season when trailing after two periods of play. The Irish are now 1-4-1 when trailing after two periods.

CAREER NIGHTS: Two members of Notre Dame's freshman class set career highs in the win over Miami on Dec. 3. Right wing Bryan Rust set career highs for goals (2) and points in a game (3) with his three-point night. Left wing Anders Lee had a career high with three assists in the contest and equaled a career high with three points in the game.

PENALTY SHOTS: Senior center Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) was awarded a penalty shot just 22 seconds into the Nov. 20 game with Michigan State and was stopped by goaltender Will Yanakeff. It was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Jan. 31, 2009 when Ryan Thang '10, scored in a 3-2 win at Michigan. It was the fourth for the Irish since the 2001-02 season. They are 2-for-4 in that span. The last time the opposition had a penalty shot against teh Irish came on Dec. 4, 2009 when Miami's Carter Camper was stopped by Mike Johnson.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Notre Dame's Oct. 30, 3-2 win over Western Michigan was the 200th CCHA win for Irish coach Jeff Jackson. Now in his 12th season at the Division I level, Jackson is 206-84-45 in his career in CCHA play in six seasons at Lake Superior State (1990-96) and six seasons at Notre Dame. Earlier in October (Oct. 14 vs. Lake Superior State), Jackson won his 300th career game as a Division I coach. His all-time record stands at 310-124-50 for a .692 winning percentage. His winning percentage is the tops among active coaches with 10 or more seasons.

FULL HOUSE: The Irish saw another streak end with the series versus Northern Michigan (Dec. 11-12). Notre Dame went into that series with a mark of 13 consecutive sellout crownds since since Nov. 28, 2009. With finals and the end of the semester, the Irish came up short with crowds of 2,623 and 2,592 to snap that mark. They were able to start a new streak on Dec. 29 when a sellout crowd of 2,857 saw the Irish beat Canisius, 10-2. Notre Dame has now had sell outs in 21 of the team's last 27 home games and last year averaged 2,765 fans per game. Since Dec. 13, 2008, the Irish have recorded sellouts in 30 of their last 36 home games. A sellout at the Joyce Center is 2,713 with 2,857 capacity with standing room. Twice during the '09-'10 season - Jan. 15 vs. Michigan State and Jan. 29 against Nebraska-Omaha - 3,007 fans jammed into the Joyce Center. Prior to that number, the largest crowd to see an Irish hockey game was 3,310 on March of 1995 when Notre Dame play Illinois-Chicago. The following season, new seating was installed and capacity was reconfigured.

GOT THEIR NUMBER: From 1992-93 through the 2007-08 season, Notre Dame struggled when it came to facing Michigan State. In that time span, the Irish were just 5-32-7 versus the Spartans. Since March 29, 2008, a span of 10 games, Notre Dame is 7-0-3 against Michigan State, including a 5-0-1 mark at the Joyce Center.

ONE IN THE BOOKS: Sophomore defenseman Sam Calabrese notched his first career goal in Notre Dame's 2-2 tie at North Dakota on Nov. 27. He added his second goal of the season on Dec. 29 in the win versus Canisius and followed with his third (a short-handed goal) in the 3-3 tie with Boston University. That gives him three goals and five assists for eight points in 20 games this season with a team-high +13. This comes after a freshman year he would love to forget. The product of the USA Under-18 Team, Calabrese played in just three games, registering no points. Last Dec. 4, on the first shift of his third game, he suffered a broken leg at Miami that sidelined him for most of the season.

**IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS:** Notre Dame is 5-4-2 this season against nationally ranked teams after the 3-3 tie with #11/#10 Boston University on Jan. 2. The Irish are 3-0-0 at home against ranked teams, 2-3-1 on the road and 0-1-1 on neutral ice. In 2009-10, the Irish were 5-6-4 versus teams ranked in the national polls.

**EXTRA HOCKEY:** Notre Dame's 3-3 tie with Boston University (Jan. 2) extended the Irish unbeaten streak in overtime games to 17 as they are now 3-0-14 in games that have gone to overtime since their last loss on March 21, 2008, a 2-1 overtime loss to Miami at the CCHA semifinals. Through the first 22 games of the 2010-11 season, the Irish have played three overtime game - Jan. 2 vs. Boston University, the Nov. 27 game at North Dakota and on Oct. 30 at Western Michigan. That game ended in a 2-2 tie and the Irish won the overtime shootout, 1-0. Notre Dame is now 0-0-3 in overtime this season. During the '09-'10 season, the Irish were involved in nine overtime contests, finishing 1-0-8 in those games. The eight ties equaled a Notre Dame record set during the 1999-2000 season. All eight ties in '09-'10 went to a shootout where the Irish were 3-5 in those games. The lone overtime win came on Nov. 27, 2009 versus Bowling Green (2-1) and was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win. Notre Dame is now 3-0-12 in overtime since its last overtime loss, a 2-1 decision to Miami on March 21, 2008, in the CCHA semifinal game.

NOSE FOR THE NET: Freshman left wing Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.) took over the team lead in power-play goals with four after scoring with the man advantage in the 4-3 loss to Minnesota State. For the season, Costello now has six goals and three assists for nine points in 22 games.

HOMETOWN HERO: Freshman defenseman Jared Beers (Mishawaka, Ind.) has worked his way into the Notre Dame lineup and doesn't seem to want to come out. In 11 games this season, Beers has five assists for five points and is +3 for the year. He picked up his first career points on Nov. 6 versus Bowling Green with a two-point night. Beers joins Mike McNeill '84-'88 (South Bend), Tommy Smith '88-89 (South Bend) and Carey Nemeth'93-'94 (Granger) as local players to play for the Irish. Beers played two seasons at Culver Academy and then saw action in the NAHL with the Kenai River Brown Bears (2008-09) and the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders in the USHL in 2009-10.

**POWER LESS:** In the Nov. 12 game at Michigan, a 3-1 Irish win, Notre Dame did not have one power-play chance in the game. That marked the first time in seven seasons - since March 5, 2004 - a span of 258 games - that the Irish did not have a power-play opportunity in a game. In the weekend series at Michigan, the Irish did not get their first power-play on the weekend until there was 6:09 left in the third period, a span of 113:51 over the two games without a power play. In the final six minutes of Saturday's game, the Irish did get three straight power plays.

FAST START: Notre Dame freshman left wing **Anders** Lee knows how to get his career off to a fast start. The 6-3, 218-pounder scored a goal on his first shot in the 6-3 win over Holy Cross (Oct. 8), just 1:58 into the first period. He went on to record two more goals for a hat trick in his first-ever collegiate game. Lee then added an assist in the 5-4 loss to Boston University in the championship game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament. For his efforts, Anders Lee was named the CCHA rookie of the week for the week ending Oct. 10. He joins John Noble '73 as the only other freshman to score three goals in his first game as Noble did the trick on Nov. 15, 1969 in an 8-3 win over Windsor. He joins recent Irish players - Billy Maday, Christiaan Minella '10 and Tim Wallace '06 - as freshmen who scored on their first shot on goal. Lee added a goal and an assist in the Oct. 15 win over Lake Superior State and through the first 17 games of the season, he leads the team with nine goals, is tied for the top spot with three power-play goals and is fourth in points with 15 (9g, 6a). He was named the CCHA rookie of the month for October.

IRISH WINS VERSUS NO. 1: Notre Dame's win over No. 1 ranked Boston College on Oct. 23 marked the 12th time in the program's history that the Irish have defeated the nation's top team. Prior to Oct. 23, 2010, the last time came on April 10, 2008 in the NCAA semifinals versus No. 1 Michigan. A year ago, the Irish played twice versus the No. 1 team in the nation - Miami University - and lost both games on Dec. 4-5. Notre Dame has defeated Boston College when the Eagles were ranked No. 1 four times since the 2003-04 season. Here's a list of previous Irish wins versus top-ranked teams.

CAPTAINS: Four members of the Irish senior class will serve as captains for the 2010-11 season. Defenseman Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) will wear the "C" for Jeff Jackson's squad this year. His three assistant captains will be Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden), Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) and Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.). For all four players, this is their first time as captains at Notre Dame.

**HOME OPENERS:** Notre Dame's home opener on Thursday, Oct. 14, a 4-2 win over Lake Superior State, gives Notre Dame an all-time record of 24-18-1 in home openers at the Joyce Center. With the win on Oct. 8 against Holy Cross, Notre Dame is now 21-20-2 in season-opening games.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team – sophomore forwards Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.) and Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) and freshman goaltender Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Nugent's father, Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78 was a member of the Notre Dame hockey team from 1974-78. During his career he played in 131 games, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. His son becomes the second Irish player to follow his father to Notre Dame. He joins Rory Walsh '06 who followed his father, Brian Walsh '77 who was a teammate of Nugent, Sr. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish

defenseman **Brock Sheahan '08** who played for the Irish from 2004-08. Rogers is a cousin of former Notre Dame defenseman **Tony Bonadio '83** is a Port Huron, Mich., native. Bonadio played in 79 games between 1980-83, scoring one goal with nine assists for 10 points.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have 10 players on the 2010-11 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Leading the way is sophomore Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) who became Notre Dame's third-ever, first-round pick last June when he was chosen 21st overall by the Detroit Red Wings. He joins former defenseman Ian Cole (2007 - St. Louis) who was selected 18th overall and former right wing Kyle Palmieri (2009 - Anaheim), the 26th pick overall. Sheahan was followed by freshman defenseman Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.), who went in the second round, 60th overall to the Chicago Black Hawks. One round later in the third round, with the 80th overall pick, freshman forward Bryan Rust (Novi, Mich.) was chosen by the Pittsburgh Penguins. Notre Dame's final player selected in 2010 was defenseman Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.), who was picked in the sixth round, 177th overall by the Anaheim Ducks. Two other Irish freshman were selected in the 2009 draft. Left wing Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.) was chosen by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round, 146th overall and six picks later, center Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) was a New York Islanders' choice in the sixth round, 152nd overall. The new group of draftees join sophomore left wing Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.), a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall; junior defenseman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.), a member of the 2008 draft class, by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall and seniors Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) and Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.). Ryan was picked in the 2007 entry draft by Nashville in the fourth round with the 114th pick and Lavin was a Chicago Black Hawks choice in the fifth round, 126th overall

## NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH:

Construction on Notre Dame's new, on-campus ice facility - The Compton Family Center - began in March of 2010 and is on pace to be finished for the Notre Dame hockey team to begin play there during the 2011-12 campaign.

On Sept. 11, 2010, a project blessing ceremony for the \$50-million facility was held with many of the key benefactors in attendance. At the ceremony, Notre Dame director of athletics, **Jack Swarbrick**, announced that the building would be named the Compton Family Center in honor of the generous donation from Kevin and

Gayla Compton and their family. The Comptons are part of the ownership group of the National Hockey League's San Jose Sharks.

**Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's President began the ceremony with a blessing of the site and offering of a prayer for the safety of those working on the project.

Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** followed by talking about the original plans and how those plans changed to become the Compton Family Center.

"When I first came here, we were talking about a renovation in the Joyce Center," said Jackson, now in his sixth season behind the Notre Dame bench.

"With Jack's (Swarbrick) foresight and Tom [Nevala] and everyone involved in pushing for this to happen, waiting an additional year to have a new facility is something that is going to have a tremendous impact on the future of our program, and we're very proud of that."

Jackson also thanked the benefactors in attendance for their generosity towards the project.

Notre Dame's head coach was followed by Irish junior **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** who spoke for his teammates to the benefactors in attendance.

Swarbrick spoke last at the ceremony, and touched upon how important the Compton Family Center will be for the Michiana community.

"There's a limit to how much the community can use our dormitories and our classrooms and our laboratories, but the athletic facilities can be a special point of contact," Swarbrick said.

"I hope we win national championships with teams that train here and I hope we build new programs for our athletes and our students. But the ultimate success of this facility will be if we inspire a young boy or a young girl from the community to shoot higher, if we challenge them to be better people because they spend time on our campus. Then we've realized the potential of athletics at Notre Dame."

The original announcement for the new building was made on Feb. 12, 2009 by Notre Dame executive vice-president John Affleck-Graves and Swarbrick after the University's Board of Trustees approved the plan.

The Compton Family Center will house both the Charles "Lefty" Smith rink, within the new 5,000-person capacity, home of the Irish hockey team and a second sheet of ice (Olympic-sized) with limited seating availability. The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety.

The Compton Family Center also will include offices for the Notre Dame coaching staff, a state-of-the art locker room suite that includes both wet and dry locker rooms, meeting rooms, a sports medicine area that includes hot and cold hydrotherapy, cardio and weight rooms, a players' lounge, equipment areas, video operations and a multi-purpose room that will be the location for weekly team Mass and serve as a study lounge and dining area.

The arena also will feature a balcony level with a 200-seat, Irish pub-themed club, multiple concession areas on both levels, spacious restrooms and a merchandise shop.

The Compton Family Center also will serve the Notre Dame and South Bend community as a place for the Irish Youth Hockey League (IYHL) and local figure skating groups to flourish. On campus it will become the home of club and interhall hockey, the figure skating club and intramural broomball, curling and physical education classes.

Multiple locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

Design and construction of the Compton Family Center are under the auspices of the Southfield, Mich., office of Barton Malow, a national design and construction services firm and their project partner Rossetti Architects, also of Southfield, Mich.

**LEFTY'S RINK:** When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, 2009, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
