Storylines

- ◆ Notre Dame faces its first Top 25 opponent of the season, although the Irish already have played four teams that were receiving votes in both major national polls at tipoff.
- ◆ The Irish are closing on three program milestones — two wins from 600 overall, one win from 550 at the Division I level and two games from 800 as a Division I member.

Having experienced both the yin and yang of college basketball in less than 48 hours last weekend, Notre Dame will find out what the next curve in the 2006-07 schedule holds when the Irish welcome No. 10/9 Purdue to the Joyce Center Wednesday for a 7 p.m. (ET) regionally-televised contest.

Following a dramatic comeback win at Michigan last Friday, the Irish (5-3) landed on the other side of the emotional spectrum Sunday with a 54-51 loss at home to Indiana. Notre Dame did just about everything it wanted against the Hoosiers from a defensive standpoint, but couldn't seem to locate its shooting stroke, finishing the day with a .345 field goal percentage.

Junior guard **Charel Allen** led the Irish with 17 points and a career-high-tying nine rebounds. Junior center **Melissa D'Amico** added her second career double-double with 15 points (on 6-of-11 shooting) and a career-high-tying 10 rebounds.

Setting The Standard

Under the guidance of 20th-year head coach **Muffet McGraw**, Notre Dame has evolved into one of the country's leading women's basketball powers. The Irish have appeared in 13 NCAA Tournaments (including a current streak of 11 in a row) and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 six times in the previous 10 years. Notre Dame also has reached the NCAA Women's Final Four twice, winning college basketball's ultimate prize with the 2001 national championship.

In its history, Notre Dame has developed eight All-Americans, nine WNBA players (including six draft picks in the past six years) and four USA Basketball veterans (eight medals won). Now in their 30th season in 2006-07, the Irish own an all-time record of **598-269 (.690)**.

A Quick Look At The Fighting Irish

Less than one month into the 2006-07 season, the growth of the Notre Dame women's basketball team already is evident, and the best may be yet to come.

With a young and inexperienced roster that has only two seniors and is missing its top returning scorer from a year ago, the Irish have had to learn on the run — and run is exactly what they have done early this season. Notre Dame is averaging 70.8 points per game thus far, a significant improvement over the previous five Irish squads, none of which has averaged better than 66.3 points per night.

Of course, the Irish have traditionally hung their hat on their defense, a trait that is much harder to master and takes a bit longer. On the one hand, Notre Dame's aggressive style has rattled opponents throughout the campaign, causing 23.0 turnovers per game (including a BIG EAST-best 12.6 steals per night). However, the flip side has seen the Irish allow opponents to shoot .419 from the floor (.402 from the three-point line) and claim an 0.4 rpg. edge on the boards), two areas Notre Dame will continue to focus on as it works through the non-conference portion of the schedule.

Junior guard **Charel Allen** has been one of the main offensive catalysts for the Irish to this point, averaging a team-high 15.9 ppg., while scoring in double figures in all eight outings to date. The Monessen, Pa., native, who was limited last year while recovering from knee surgery in the summer of 2005, also is collecting 5.1 rebounds per game and was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on Monday after averaging 18.0 ppg. and 6.0 rpg. last week.

Allen's classmate and backcourt running

partner, **Tulyah Gaines**, is an early candidate as one of the conference's most improved players. The speedy Gaines has assumed the large footprint left at the point by All-American (and WNBA Draft pick) Megan Duffy and has stoked the Notre Dame offensive fire to an even hotter level, averaging 9.8 points and 3.5 assists per game with a .472 field goal percentage. Gaines, who came into the season with a 3.7 ppg. career scoring average, was a critical factor in Notre Dame's 85-81 overtime win over two-time Mid-American Conference champion Bowling Green last month, tallying a career-high 25 points.

Another Irish junior, 6-foot-5 center **Melissa D'Amico**, continues to make strides in the post. The second-year starter is averaging 9.6 points and 4.8 rebounds per game with a .526 field goal percentage (12th in the BIG EAST), and has scored in double figures four times this season, with her second career double-double vs. Indiana (15 points, 10 rebounds).

The most pleasing contributions of the year for Notre Dame to this point have come from its freshmen, three of whom have seen significant playing time. Guard **Ashley Barlow** is second on the team in scoring (10.4 ppg.) and tops in steals (2.5 spg., sixth in BIG EAST), and came up with a 19-point, 10-rebound effort vs. Bowling Green, including 11-of-12 free throws and the two clinchers with 3.8 ticks left in OT. Center **Erica Williamson** (6.4 ppg., 5.7 rpg., 1.4 bpg., .559 FG%) is proving to be a capable understudy to D'Amico, amassing season highs of 12 points and nine rebounds at USC. And, guard **Melissa Lechlitner** (5.4 ppg., 2.4 apg.) has shown little drop off at the point behind Gaines, registering five assists in a game twice this year, and carding a season-high 11 points (including 3-of-4 three-pointers) at Penn State.

On game days, no interviews will be granted with any Notre Dame player or coach prior to competition.

A bank of statistics monitors is located on press row for the media's convenience. Final statistics books include an official NCAA box score and play-by-play. Telephone, copier and fax services are available on a first-come, first-served basis. The Joyce Center also offers wireless Internet capability — check with **Chris Masters** for access.

Post-Game Press Conferences

Following each Notre Dame home game, Irish head coach Muffet McGraw and selected players, followed by the visiting head coach and selected players, will be available to speak with the media. Potent Notables About The Irish

- Notre Dame is among the nation's winningest programs during the past 11 seasons (1996-97 to present), ranking seventh with 252 victories in that span.
- Notre Dame's incoming class of 2007 (announced Nov. 8) has been ranked 11th in the nation by *Blue Star Basketball*, marking the 11th consecutive season that the Irish have had a top-25 recruiting class. Notre Dame is one of only three schools (along with Connecticut and Tennessee) to have an active streak of that length. A thumbnail sketch of the newest Irish signees can be found on page 8 of these notes.
- Notre Dame currently is ranked eighth nationally in attendance (6,743 fans per game). Last season marked the sixth consecutive campaign the Irish were among the national top 20 in attendance (No. 11 ranking). Notre Dame also has attracted 5,000-or-more fans to 83 of its last 85 home games, including three Joyce Center sellouts of 11,418 (most

- recently on Dec. 31, 2005 vs. Tennessee).
- For the sixth time in school history, Notre Dame has been selected to host NCAA Tournament action, as the Joyce Center will be the site of NCAA Tournament first- and second-round games in 2010. In four of the five previous instances, Notre Dame was involved in NCAA Tournament play, going 6-1 all-time and advancing to the NCAA Sweet 16 three times (2000, 2001, 2004), with only a first-round loss to Minnesota in 1994 blotting the resume. Notre Dame also hosted the 1983 NCAA Midwest Regional at the Joyce Center, with Georgia defeating Tennessee, 67-63 in the regional final.
- The Irish have become a regular fixture in the WNBA Draft in recent years, as six Notre Dame players have been selected in the past six seasons. All-America guard **Megan Duffy** was the most recent Irish player to be chosen, going to the Minnesota Lynx in the third round (31st overall pick) of the 2006 WNBA Draft. Other active Notre Dame players in the WNBA during the 2006 season included **Ruth Riley** and **Jacqueline Batteast** (league champion Detroit Shock), while **Niele Ivey** sat out this year as a free agent, rehabilitating an injury after previously playing with Indiana, Detroit and Phoenix. Riley's WNBA title with Detroit was her second (she was the 2003 WNBA Finals MVP), while Batteast earned her first pro crown this year.
- Notre Dame has been an elite program in the classroom as well. The Irish posted a perfect 100-percent Graduation Success Rate (GSR), according to figures released by the NCAA in October 2006. Notre Dame was one of 16 Division I-A programs to achieve this distinction, and one of only two BIG EAST programs (Syracuse is the other). Furthermore, since **Muffet McGraw** became the Irish head coach in 1987, every Notre Dame women's basketball player that has completed her athletic and academic eligibility at the University has graduated.

A Quick Look At Purdue

For the second time in three seasons, the Preseason WNIT championship trophy resides in the Hoosier State, as Purdue claimed the hardware this year to follow up Notre Dame's four-game run to the title in 2004.

The WNIT crown has been the cornerstone of the Boilermakers' 7-1 start this season, a debut made even more impressive in light of the off-season coaching change that brought **Sharon Versyp** up Interstate 65 from Big Ten Conference rival Indiana. On its charge to the WNIT title, Purdue defeated North Carolina State and 2005 NCAA champion Baylor (the latter on the road), and even found time to mix in a victory over Washington between the aforementioned semifinal and final.

The Boilermakers last played on Saturday, taking a 69-44 decision over Gonzaga in West Lafayette. Junior forward **Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton** scored a game-high 21 points and grabbed nine rebounds, while senior forward **Erin Lawless** collected 12 points and seven boards, as Purdue bounced back from its first loss of the season at Connecticut (66-55 on Nov. 30).

Senior guard/forward **Katie Gearlds** (16.5 ppg.) paces a quartet of Boilermakers scoring in double figures, while Wisdom-Hylton is averaging nearly a double-double this season (14.6 ppg., 9.3 rpg., 3.4 bpg.). As a team, Purdue is allowing just 52.8 ppg. with a .321 defensive field goal percentage.

Although in her first year at Purdue, Versyp has a solid resume that includes five seasons at Maine and a year at Indiana. Her career record is 124-66 (.653), although she is 0-1 all-time against Notre Dame.

The Notre Dame-Purdue Series

Notre Dame and Purdue have played one another 19 times, including almost annually for the past 15 seasons (exception: 1998-99). The Boilermakers lead the overall series, 14-5, but by only a 4-3 margin in South Bend (with three of the seven games, and two Irish losses, decided by six points or less).

The past two matchups at the Joyce Center have seen the teams trade 17-point decisions. Purdue earned a 71-54 win on Jan. 4, 2003, while Notre Dame came back with an 86-69 victory on Jan. 16, 2005.

The consistent nature of the rivalry is reflected in its playing date — including Wednesday's game, 14 of the 20 meetings have been played in a 15-day window from Nov. 26-Dec. 10. This year's game is the second to take place on Dec. 6 — back in 2001, Purdue took a 70-57 victory in West Lafayette.

The Last Time Notre Dame And Purdue Met

Reserve forward **Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton** scored 14 points and **Katie Gearlds** added 13 to help No. 24 Purdue hand No. 10 Notre Dame its first loss of the season, 65-54 on Dec. 7, 2005 in West Lafayette, Ind.

The Boilermakers (5-2) held Notre Dame guard **Megan Duffy** to 12 points, six below her average. She didn't make a field goal for the first 19 minutes of the game as Purdue took a 39-22 halftime lead. The Boilermakers shot 48 percent from the field in the first half while holding the Irish to 29 percent shooting.

The Boilermakers led by as many as 21 points in the second half. **Aya Traore** scored 11 points and **Erin Lawless** had 11 points and 12 rebounds for Purdue, which outrebounded the Irish, 47-34.

Courtney LaVere scored 10 points for Notre Dame and **Crystal Erwin** finished with seven points and 11 rebounds.

The Last Time Notre Dame And Purdue Met At The Joyce Center

Junior guard **Megan Duffy** sparked seventh-ranked Notre Dame by scoring 17 of her 19 points in the first half and senior forward **Jacqueline Batteast** finished with 21 points and 11 rebounds, leading the seventh-ranked Irish past No. 20 Purdue 86-69 on Jan. 16, 2005, in the BIG EAST/Big Ten Challenge at the Joyce Center.

Batteast was held to eight points and Duffy six in Notre Dame's 17-point loss to No. 16 Connecticut four days earlier. But they surpassed those numbers in the first 15 minutes against the Boilermakers. The Irish (14-3) also beat

Purdue for the first time since the 2001 NCAA championship game, ending a four-game losing streak to the Boilermakers.

Purdue (10-6), beaten by 20 points in its previous game by No. 11 Minnesota, lost consecutive games for the first time since December 2001, when they lost to the Irish and LSU.

It was the 36th career double-double for Batteast, tying her with **Ruth Riley** for second place on Notre Dame's career list. Senior center **Teresa Borton** added 18 points, and Notre Dame outscored the Boilermakers 38-24 in the paint.

Erin Lawless led Purdue with 16 points, **Katie Gearlds** had 14 and **Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton, Emily Heikes** and **Tyeisha Jackson** had 10 points each.

The Irish led 54-38 at halftime, scoring four more points than they had in the entire game against UConn. Duffy shot 4-for-4 in the first half, including three from 3-point range, and 6-of-6 from the line. The Irish made seven free throws in the final 63 seconds to take a 16-point halftime lead — matching their biggest of the season.

Purdue cut the lead to 62-51 when Heikes stole the ball and hit a fast-break layup with 14:32 left. But Duffy answered with a pair of free throws, Borton scored inside and freshman guard **Tulyah Gaines** scored on a 15-foot jumper as the Irish regained control, leading by 21 points late in the game.

- Notre Dame's most frequent NCAA Tournament opponent has been Purdue. The Irish and Boilermakers have played one another four times in NCAA postseason competition, with each team winning twice (ND in 1996 and 2001; Purdue in 1998 and 2003).

mates with Purdue freshman guard **FahKara Malone** on the 2006 Indiana All-Star Team that swept a two-game series from their Kentucky counterparts back in June.

- Lechlitner and Purdue senior guard **Katie Gearlds** led their high school teams (South Bend St. Joseph's and Beech Grove, respectively) to the 2003 Indiana Class 3A state title game at Conesco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, with Gearlds scoring 33 points to help Beech Grove win the title. Lechlitner (who had 16 points as a ninth-grader in the '03 contest) got her own championship ring two years later, scoring 28 points in the state final vs. Corydon Central to trail only Gearlds' mark in the Indiana 3A record books.

Notre Dame vs. The Big Ten Conference

Notre Dame is 33-46 (.418) all-time against the Big Ten Conference, including an 18-16 (.529) record at home. The Irish also are 26-32 (.448) against the Big Ten in the **Muffet McGraw** era (13-11, .542 at home) and have won six of their last 10 games against that league.

Purdue is the last of four Big Ten teams on this year's Irish schedule, with Notre Dame going 1-2 against that conference thus far in 2006-07. The Irish dropped games at Penn State (75-49) and vs. Indiana at home (54-51), but won on the road at Michigan (61-58). The Purdue game also caps a three-game stretch against Big Ten opponents for the Irish.

Allen Named To BIG EAST Honor Roll

Junior guard **Charel Allen** was chosen for the BIG EAST Conference Weekly Honor Roll, the league office announced Monday. It's the second time in Allen's career she has earned a weekly conference honor, garnering the BIG EAST Freshman of the Week citation on Feb. 7, 2005. Allen is the first Irish women's basketball player to receive a weekly conference award this season, with **Megan Duffy** the last Notre Dame cager to pick up a BIG EAST honor with her Player of the Week selection on Feb. 27, 2006.

Allen averaged 18.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game with a .458 field goal percentage for the Irish last week, helping her squad earn wins in two of three games. She also scored in double figures in all three contests, including a career-high (and game-best) 22 points in an 87-66 Notre Dame victory over Richmond on Nov. 28. Allen went on to collect a game-high 15 points in the Irish comeback win at Michigan, hitting a key three-pointer with 10.9 seconds left to pull Notre Dame within a point, and then converting both ends of a one-and-one with 0.7 ticks to play, sealing the win. Allen capped off her week by scoring a team-high 17 points and grabbing a career-high-tying nine rebounds in a three-point loss to Indiana on Sunday.

For the season, Allen leads the Irish in scoring (and ranks 11th in the BIG EAST) at 15.9 points

per game, while she also stands ninth in the conference in steals (2.25 per game) and free throw percentage (.818). Her current string of eight consecutive double-digit scoring games this season is tied for second in the BIG EAST (behind only Providence's **Chelsea Marandola**), and dating back to last year, Allen has scored in double figures in 16 of the past 20 Irish games.

Keeping The Home Fires Burning

In spite of Sunday's offensive dry spell in a loss to Indiana, Notre Dame has been largely solid at home this season, going 4-1 due in large part to an explosive offense that has averaged 79.6 points per game on the Joyce Center hardwood. Led by junior guard **Charel Allen** (17.4 ppg.), the Irish also have three players scoring in double figures (and a fourth at 9.8 ppg.) through the first five home games and are shooting .467 from the floor in front of the Notre Dame faithful.

Staying Close To Home

Notre Dame is in the midst of a seven-game stretch covering exactly one month, during which time the Irish will play five home games and travel only twice (bus trips to Michigan on Dec. 1 and Valparaiso on Dec. 19).

Inside this span of games is a run of four consecutive matchups against in-state opponents from Dec. 3-19. Indiana tipped off that stretch on Sunday, with Purdue (Wednesday), IUPUI (Dec. 16) and Valparaiso (Dec. 19) to follow. This block of consecutive in-state opponents is an extreme rarity for Notre Dame — to wit:

- Last time played four in-state opponents in same season: 2002-03 (Purdue [twice], Valparaiso, IPFW)
- Last time played four in-state opponents in regular season: 1993-94 (Butler [twice], Evansville [twice], Purdue)
- Last time played in-state opponents in consecutive games: Dec. 11 & 21, 1996 (Indiana and Valparaiso)
- Last time played four consecutive in-state opponents: Feb. 23-March 1, 1980 (Grace, Goshen, Huntington, Goshen); *came in program's last year as Division III member*

Contribute Early, Contribute Often

Notre Dame's freshman class has wasted little time in making its presence felt this season. Three of the Irish rookies — guards **Ashley Barlow** and **Melissa Lechlitner**, and center **Erica Williamson** — are averaging at least 15 minutes per game, all three have scored in double figures at least once, and Barlow has posted a double-double already this season (19 points, 10 rebounds vs. Bowling Green).

Barlow also is second on the team in scoring (10.4 ppg.) and ranks among the BIG EAST Conference leaders in both free throw percentage (second at .926, also 13th in NCAA) and steals (sixth at 2.5 spg.). Williamson is carding 6.4 points and a team-high 5.7 rebounds per game and ranks eighth in the BIG EAST with 1.43 blocks per game. And, Lechlitner is logging 5.4 points and 2.4 assists per night with six three-pointers (tied for second on the squad).

The Five-Finger Discount

Notre Dame's aggressive defense has forced





23.0 turnovers per game this season, logging 20-or-more takeaways in seven of eight games — the lone exception was a 19-turnover effort by Bowling Green on Nov. 13. In addition, the Irish caused an opponent season-high 30 turnovers at Michigan on Dec. 1, the first 30-turnover outing by the Notre Dame defense since Feb. 25, 2004 (37 turnovers by Miami at the Joyce Center).

The Irish also lead the BIG EAST Conference with 12.6 steals per night. In fact, Notre Dame has posted double-digit steal totals in six of eight games this season (and never fewer than eight in one game), with freshman guard **Ashley Barlow** committing the most larcenies to date (20, 2.5 per game, sixth in BIG EAST) and leading five Irish players with double-figure steals this season.

Barlow also recorded a combined 11 steals vs. Western Michigan (six) and at USC (five). That made her the first Notre Dame player with back-to-back five-steal games since March 30-April 1, 2001, when **Niele Ivey** did so against Connecticut (five) and Purdue (six) at the NCAA Women's Final Four in St. Louis.

Preserve And Protect

Coming off a school-record low 430 turnovers (14.3 per game) last season, Notre Dame appears to be headed in a similar direction again this year. The Irish are averaging only 17.5 give-aways through eight games, including a season-low 14 turnovers at Penn State on Nov. 16. Prior to Sunday's 20-turnover effort vs. Indiana, Notre Dame had put together a run of 19 consecutive games with less than 20 turnovers, dating back to a Jan. 24, 2006 loss at Rutgers (22).

Note These Schedule Changes

Earlier this week, two changes to the 2006-07 Notre Dame schedule were announced.

- **Dec. 19 at Valparaiso:** Game will be televised live in South Bend on WHME-TV (Channel 46); tip time remains 7:05 p.m. CT (8:05 p.m. ET in South Bend).
- **Jan. 23 at Marquette:** Game will tip off at 8 p.m. CT (9 p.m. ET in South Bend), one hour later than previously announced due to a programming change with the game's television broadcaster, CSTV, which still intends to carry the game live to a national audience.

Game #8 Recap: Indiana

On a day where the temperature outside the Joyce Center struggled to get out of the 20s, Notre Dame found its shooting touch to be similarly icy, as the Irish dropped a 54-51 decision to Indiana on Sunday afternoon before a season-high crowd of 9,494 fans. It was just the fifth non-conference loss for Notre Dame in the past 13 seasons, with four of those setbacks coming at the hands of Big Ten Conference opponents.

The Irish (5-3) lost their first home game of the season, thanks in part to a .345 field goal percentage, including a 1-of-14 (.071) mark from three-point range. Junior guard **Charel Allen** scored a team-high 17 points and tied her career best with nine rebounds, while

junior center **Melissa D'Amico** recorded her second career double-double with 15 points and a career-high-tying 10 rebounds. Notre Dame's defense did play well much of the day, forcing 21 Hoosier turnovers and decisively winning the battle on the boards, 41-27.

Nikki Smith scored a game-high 18 points and **Kim Roberson** chipped in with 12 points for Indiana (7-1), which defeated the Irish for the first time since 1990 and just the fourth time ever. Ironically, three of those four IU wins have come at the Joyce Center, where the series now is tied 3-3.

Sunday afternoon's game was particularly close, featuring six ties and 14 lead changes and seeing neither side lead by more than eight points. In the first half, it remained a one-possession game for a long stretch until Indiana scored five consecutive points to take a 25-19 lead with 6:11 remaining in the period. Notre Dame stayed within striking distance even though its offense went scoreless from the field during the final 9:09 of the first half, with D'Amico making three foul shots and freshman guard **Ashley Barlow** adding two free throws in that span.

Trailing 27-22 at halftime, the Irish seemed to put its shooting struggles to rest early in the second period, making eight of their first 11 shots and using a 10-0 run to take their largest lead of the day at 41-33 on a Barlow jumper with 11:54 left. However, Indiana scored nine unanswered points in a two-minute span to go back ahead and start a frantic stretch drive.

The teams traded the lead seven times during the next 5:30, with Notre Dame finally breaking the point exchange when freshman guard **Melissa Lechitner** hit a baseline jumper and Allen followed with an acrobatic reverse layup in transition with 4:11 to go. Allen then came up with a steal on the next IU possession, but moments later, Roberson got a steal of her own and converted a fast break layup to start a 6-0 game-ending rally for the visitors.

Leah Enterline gave Indiana the lead for good on a jumper with 2:47 to play, and Smith padded the margin with a jumper in the lane that rattled around the rim and fell with 35 ticks remaining. Following a timeout, Notre Dame drew up a potential game-tying play, but Allen's open three-point try from the right corner just missed with 13 seconds to go. The Irish got a reprieve when Enterline was called for traveling after coming down with the rebound, but after another timeout, Allen had her pocket picked by IU's **Whitney Thomas** with six seconds left. Roberson was fouled to put the Hoosiers in the bonus, but she missed her foul shot, giving Notre Dame one last chance, a half-court heave that was off the mark and did not beat the final horn.

Noting The Indiana Game

- All three Irish losses this season have come to teams that were receiving votes in both national polls at tipoff (Indiana was earning 14 votes in the AP poll and 15 votes in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll).
- Notre Dame had been averaging 86.8 points and shooting .496 from the floor in its first four home games.

- The Irish held Indiana to an opponent season-low 54 points (previous: 58 by Michigan on Dec. 1).
- The .345 field goal percentage for the Irish was their second-lowest of the seasons (.268 at Penn State) and their lowest at home (previous: .433 vs. Bowling Green).
- Notre Dame's rebounding margin (+14) was its best since Jan. 4, 2006 at St. John's, when they outrebounded the Red Storm by a 41-21 spread (also the fewest rebounds by a Notre Dame opponent prior to the IU game).
- The Irish shot a season-best .909 from the foul line, their best mark since Nov. 30, 2004, when they set a school record by going 18-of-18 from the stripe at Valparaiso.
- D'Amico's only other previous double-double came on Nov. 27, 2005 against USC at the Joyce Center (13 points, 10 rebounds); it's also the second double-double of the year for Notre Dame after Barlow's 19-point, 10-rebound effort vs. Bowling Green.
- The Indiana game marked just the second time all year the Irish didn't have at least three double-figure scorers (also in loss at USC on Nov. 24).
- The Notre Dame bench was held to a season-low eight points and was outscored for just the second time all year (also in loss at Penn State on Nov. 16).
- The crowd of 9,494 was the sixth-largest in program history and the 15th time Notre Dame has drawn a crowd of 8,000 fans or more.

Injury Bug Bites Irish Early

Sophomore guard **Lindsay Schrader** will miss the 2006-07 season after suffering a torn ACL in her right knee during practice on Oct. 15. Schrader underwent corrective surgery on Oct. 27, with the normal rehabilitation timeline extending 6-9 months.

Schrader was to be Notre Dame's top returning scorer and rebounder this season, after averaging 10.5 points and 5.4 rebounds per game during her rookie campaign in 2005-06.

2006-07: The Anniversary Season

- 2006-07 marks the 30th season of Notre Dame women's basketball, with the Irish having compiled an all-time record of 598-269 (.690) since making their varsity debut in 1977-78. Actually, Notre Dame spent its first three seasons at the Division III level, playing under the banner of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) before making the move to Division I status in 1980-81 (the NCAA began sponsoring a women's basketball championship the following season). The Irish have an overall Division I record of 549-249 (.688).
- This year also represents **Muffet McGraw's** 20th season as the head women's basketball coach at Notre Dame and her 25th campaign overall, including her five-year run at Lehigh (1982-87). McGraw's record is a stellar one — she is 434-170 (.719) at the helm of the Irish and has a career record of 522-211 (.712) in her silver anniversary season on the sidelines.

- In addition, Notre Dame is celebrating the 35th anniversary of women's athletics at the University during the 2006-07 season. All Irish women's sports teams will hold events to commemorate this milestone during their respective seasons. What's more, all Notre Dame women's teams are sporting special 35th anniversary logo patches on their uniforms for the '06-07 campaign.



Notre Dame Ranked 11th In Preseason BIG EAST Coaches' Poll

According to a preseason poll of the BIG EAST Conference coaches, Notre Dame will finish 11th in the conference this season. Those were the results released at the league's annual Media Day Oct. 26 at the ESPN Zone in New York's Times Square. The Irish earned 108 points, while reigning BIG EAST Championship victor, Connecticut (221 points, 11 first-place votes) was tabbed first, ahead of regular-season champion Rutgers (215 points, five first-place votes). The BIG EAST sent 11 teams to the postseason last year, including seven NCAA Tournament qualifiers (Notre Dame was one).

The Irish are beginning their 12th season as a member of the BIG EAST Conference in 2006-07. The Irish have gone 145-39 (.788) all-time in regular-season conference games, posting the best winning percentage in league history. Connecticut is second with a .783 success rate. Notre Dame also has finished among the top three in the final BIG EAST regular-season standings nine times in its first 11 seasons in the conference, including a share of the BIG EAST title in 2000-01.

Half And Half

During the past seven seasons, Notre Dame has been nearly unbeatable when it has the lead at halftime. The Irish are 112-10 (.918) since the start of the 2000-01 campaign when they go into the dressing room with the lead, including wins in 40 of their last 44 such contests. Three times this year, Notre Dame has led at the break, going on to win each time (Central Michigan, Western Michigan and Richmond).

The Best Offense Is A Good Defense...

During the past 12 seasons, Notre Dame has discovered that a solid defensive effort can almost certainly guarantee a victory. In fact, since the beginning of the 1995-96 season (Notre Dame's first in the BIG EAST Conference), the Irish have an amazing 160-10



(.941) record when they hold their opponents below 60 points in a game. Notre Dame has held its last two foes to less than 60 points, but is 1-1 in those games (61-58 win at Michigan, 54-51 loss at home to Indiana).

...But Sometimes You Have To Score If You Want To Win

Not resting solely on its defensive laurels, Notre Dame also seemingly has found the magic mark when it comes to outscoring its opponents. During the past 12 seasons (1995-96 to present), the Irish are 95-3 (.969) when they score at least 80 points in a game. The only blemishes on that record are a pair of overtime losses to Texas A&M (88-84) and Michigan State (87-83) in 1995 and a 106-81 loss to Connecticut in 1998. Notre Dame has topped the 80-point mark four times this season, winning on each occasion (Central Michigan, Bowling Green, Western Michigan and Richmond).

Now That's A Home Court Advantage

One of the hallmarks of Notre Dame's success has been its stellar play at home. In fact, the Irish have been virtually untouchable at home in recent years, winning 139 of their last 156 games (.891) at the 11,418-seat Joyce Center, including winning streaks of 51 and 25 games in that span. Notre Dame also has a 80-12 (.870) record in BIG EAST Conference play at the Joyce Center, sporting a 31-game league winning streak at home before it ended with a 48-45 loss to Villanova in the '02 home finale.

The Irish have been particularly strong when it comes to non-conference games at home, winning 61 of their last 66 non-BIG EAST contests (.924) at the Joyce Center, dating back to the 1994-95 season. Four of the losses in that span came at the hands of Big Ten Conference opponents — Wisconsin in 1996 (81-69), Purdue in 2003 (71-54), Michigan State in 2004 (82-73 OT) and Indiana this year (54-51), with the fifth defeat coming to Tennessee last year (62-51). The Purdue loss also snapped a 33-game non-conference home winning streak which began after the UW setback.

Since its inaugural season in 1977-78, Notre Dame has played all of its games at the Joyce Center, posting a 289-78 (.787) record at the venerable facility. Three times (1999-2000, 2000-01 and 2003-04), the Irish went a perfect 15-0 at home, setting a school record for home wins in a season. The 2006-07 campaign will tie for the most regular-season home games (16) in school history, although in 2004-05, the Irish played host to all four rounds of the Preseason WNIT before its regular 12-game home slate began.

Jammin' The Joyce

Beginning with its national championship season of 2000-01, Notre Dame has ranked among the top 20 in the nation in attendance each of the past six years. This season looks to be no exception, as the Irish currently are eighth in the nation in average attendance (6,743 fans per game), according to the first unofficial weekly

rankings compiled by the University of Wisconsin Sports Information Office.

What's more, each of the top 20 women's basketball crowds in Joyce Center history have occurred during the 20-year tenure of head coach **Muffet McGraw** (1987-present), with 19 of those 20 occurring in the past seven seasons (2000-01 to present). Lastly, the Irish have attracted at least 5,000 fans to 83 of their last 85 home games, including 15 contests with at least 8,000 fans and the first three sellouts in the program's history (two in 2000-01, one in 2005-06).

Oh Captain, My Captain

Senior guard **Breona Gray** and junior guard **Tulyah Gaines** will serve as team captains for the 2006-07 season. Both players are serving as captains for the first time in their respective careers, and each received the captain's honor following a vote of their teammates prior to the season.

States of Grace

Notre Dame is one of 12 schools in the country to have more than one player on its roster who was named a high school Player of the Year in their home state. Irish junior guard **Tulyah Gaines** was tapped as the 2004 Gatorade Nevada Player of the Year, while sophomore guard **Lindsay Schrader** was chosen as the 2005 Illinois Miss Basketball and Illinois Gatorade Player of the Year.

Notre Dame On The Small Screen

Notre Dame will have 11 of its regular-season games televised during the 2006-07 season. Highlighting this year's television docket are five nationally-televised Irish women's basketball contests, including a pair of games on the ESPN family of networks a week apart in early February.

This year's TV slate continues a recent trend that has seen the Irish become a regular fixture on television. Beginning with the NCAA championship season of 2000-01 and continuing through this year, Notre Dame has played in 72 televised games, including 46 that were broadcast nationally.

Notre Dame made its 2006-07 television debut Nov. 16 when its road opener at Penn State aired live on College Sports Television (CSTV). That was the first of three Irish women's basketball broadcasts for the national cable network, with the second coming Jan. 23 at Marquette (8 p.m. CT tip) and the third coming in the regular-season finale on Feb. 26 at DePaul (8 p.m. CT). The latter two contests are part of the BIG EAST-CSTV Game of the Week package, now in its second season. Counting the Penn State contest, CSTV now has aired 12 Notre Dame women's basketball games during the past five seasons,

Fall Signees

University of Notre Dame head women's basketball coach Muffet McGraw announced Nov. 8 that three of the country's top high school student-athletes have chosen to continue their academic and athletic careers with the Irish, each signing a National Letter of Intent to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2007. **Becca Bruszewski**, a 6-1 forward from Valparaiso, Ind. (Wheeler High School), **Brittany Mallory**, a 5-10 guard from Baltimore, Md. (McDonogh School) and **Devereaux Peters**, a 6-2 forward from Chicago, Ill. (Fenwick High School) all made their official commitments to the Irish during the early signing period.

All three student-athletes are rated among the top 100 players in the country by *Blue Star Basketball*, with that outlet also ranking the Notre Dame incoming class of 2007 as the No. 11 group in the nation. It marks the 11th consecutive year that the Irish have attracted a Top 25 recruiting class, a streak only two other programs in the country (Connecticut and Tennessee) can match.

"I think we've done a tremendous job of addressing our needs with the addition of these three ladies," McGraw said. "We're getting some very skilled offensive players who will fit well into our system. There's a good balance between perimeter shooting and rebounding, and I think rebounding was the area that we felt was our biggest need. What I also like about these players is that they're smart, competitive athletes who catch on to new ideas and concepts quickly. They're all should complement our current team very well and we're excited to have them join our program next year."

Notre Dame Student-Athletes Rank Among Nation's Best

Whether measured by the federal government in its Department of Education report or by the NCAA through its newer Graduation Success Rate (GSR) numbers, graduation rates for Notre Dame student-athletes again rank among the national leaders in all major categories among all Division I-A football-playing colleges and universities, according to statistics released Nov. 9 by the NCAA.

The federally-mandated NCAA Graduation-Rates Report, the 16th such survey issued by the association, covers students who enrolled between 1996 and 1999 at all Division I institutions. The NCAA bases graduation rates on the raw percentage of student-athletes who entered an institution and graduated within six years. Students who leave or transfer are considered non-graduates. All those receiving athletics aid are included in the statistics.

Using the federal formula, Notre Dame graduated a four-year average of 89 percent, behind Duke at 90 percent, and ahead of Stanford and Northwestern (88 percent).

Notre Dame ranks second among Division I-A football schools (and also among all 318 I-A programs) on another scale, called the GSR, which was instituted two years ago by the NCAA. The University's 98 percent GSR for all its student-athletes is second only to the 99 percent of the United States Naval Academy, which is exempt from the federal survey because it does not offer grants-in-aid to student-athletes.

The GSR was created to more accurately reflect actual graduation rates by including transfer data in the calculation. College and university presidents asked the NCAA to develop a new methodology that takes into account the mobility among students in today's higher education environment.

Among 627 student-athletes who completed all four years of athletic eligibility at Notre Dame from among those entering over a 10-year period from 1990-91 through 1999-2000, 99 percent earned their degrees.

Notre Dame graduated 94 percent of all women competing in varsity athletics, to rank second (tied with Duke), behind only Northwestern's 95 percent rate among its peer institutions based on the federal calculations. Notre Dame also graduated 75 percent of its black student-athletes.

In the GSR standings, Notre Dame finished second among all student-athletes at 98 percent (behind only the U.S. Naval Academy at 99), fourth among black student-athletes at 91 percent (behind the Naval Academy at 96, Northwestern at 93 and Wake Forest at 93) and tied for fourth among female student-athletes at 99 percent (Vanderbilt, Northwestern and the Naval Academy finished at 100).

Academic All-Americans

Entering the 2006-07 academic year, Notre Dame ranks second in the nation with 176 Academic All-America® selections, including 14 last year alone. The Academic All-America® Program is administered by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), whose membership votes on the award winners, and the program is sponsored this year by *ESPN The Magazine*.

The Notre Dame women's basketball program has produced five Academic All-America® honorees in its 30-year history, with those five players winning a total of seven citations. In addition, two-time first-team Academic All-America® pick **Ruth Riley** was tapped as the 2001 Academic All-America® Women's Basketball Team Member of the Year, as well as the Academic All-America® Team Member of the Year.

Riley also is one of only 10 student-athletes in Notre Dame history to earn All-American and Academic All-America® honors twice in her career.

Last year, **Megan Duffy** was named a first-team Academic All-America® selection, becoming the second Irish player ever to attain that distinction. Duffy graduated in May 2006 with a 3.576 grade-point average (GPA) and a degree in psychology and computer applications from Notre Dame's College of Arts and Letters. She also garnered Dean's List honors in four of her final five semesters (spring 2004, fall 2004, spring 2005, fall 2005).

with the first being that network's inaugural broadcast of any sport (a Feb. 2003 game at Connecticut).

The Irish also are scheduled to make two appearances on the ESPN family of networks, beginning with a Feb. 4 home game against West Virginia that will be broadcast live on ESPNU and will start at 5:30 p.m. (ET). The following Sunday (Feb. 11), Notre Dame will play host to DePaul for a 5:30 p.m. (ET) game that will air on ESPN2 as part of that network's "February Frenzy" split-national coverage designed to preview a similar coverage pattern for the NCAA Tournament. During the past six seasons, Notre Dame has appeared on the ESPN family of networks 28 times, averaging nearly five telecasts per year on "The Worldwide Leader in Sports".

In addition, Notre Dame will play in five regionally-televised games this season. The first of those will come Wednesday, when the Irish welcome Purdue to the Joyce Center for a 7 p.m. (ET) game that will air live on Comcast Local (based in Detroit). On Dec. 30, Notre Dame will venture to Tennessee for a 2 p.m. (ET) contest at Thompson-Boling Arena that can be seen live on Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast. And, on Jan. 27, the Irish will visit Connecticut for a 7 p.m. (ET) matchup that will be carried live on Connecticut Public Television (CPTV).

Notre Dame will appear twice on the BIG EAST-Regional Sports Network (RSN) package this season with contests at South Florida (Jan. 13, noon ET) and home against Rutgers (Feb. 24, noon ET). SportsNet New York will serve as the flagship for the BIG EAST package, with additional clearances to be announced at a later date.

The other televised game for the Irish will be a local broadcast (WHME-TV in South Bend) of the Dec. 19 contest at Valparaiso.

Notre Dame On The Airwaves

For the 11th consecutive season, every Irish women's basketball game (home and away) will air on commercial radio in South Bend, and for the seventh year in a row, Notre Dame can be heard on the flagship station of the Artistic Media Partners (AMP) Network — WDND-AM (ESPN Radio 1490) in South Bend. Veteran broadcaster and AMP sports director **Sean Stires** is now in his seventh season handling the play-by-play for Notre Dame. The Irish also can be heard free of charge on the Internet at Notre Dame's official athletics web site (www.und.com).

Irish To Debut Free Video Coverage

In the latest instance of the wide-ranging media avenues afforded the Notre Dame women's basketball program, the Irish will have several of their 2006-07 home games televised free of charge through the official Notre Dame athletics web site (www.und.com). Thanks to the considerable efforts of CSTV Online (based in Carlsbad, Calif.) and its new Fighting Irish All-Access package, fans of Notre Dame women's basketball can watch every minute of exciting action at the Joyce Center live from the comfort of their own homes. The video will be supplemented by an audio simulcast of the Notre Dame

radio broadcast, led by veteran sportscaster **Sean Stires**.

This free service is limited to those home games that have not been selected for broadcast by other TV outlets. The Irish made their und.com debut Dec. 3 vs. Indiana, with the remainder of this year's Internet video broadcast schedule to be announced at a later date.

Joyce Center Arena Renovation On Tap

On Oct. 5, Notre Dame announced plans for a nearly \$25 million renovation of the Joyce Center arena, including new chairback seating, a four-sided digital video scoreboard, and a club/hospitality area (as part of a new two-story addition to be built on the south side of the facility).

The \$24.7 million renovation project has been underwritten with a \$12.5 million leadership gift from **Philip J. Purcell III**, a Notre Dame alumnus and Trustee, and the retired chairman and CEO of Morgan Stanley. Upon completion, the arena will be known as Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center. The Purcell gift, combined with other benefactions, including a \$5 million gift from 1959 Notre Dame graduate and Tampa Bay Devil Rays owner **Vince Naimoli**, brings the total contributions to the project to \$22 million.

In accordance with University policies for new construction, work on the renovation will begin after the project is fully funded and designed. The University is actively seeking additional contributions.

Notre Dame also has recorded double-digit steals in six of seven games thus far, with the Michigan game marking the third 15-steal effort for the Irish defense this season, all in the past four outings (also 15 vs. Western Michigan and 16 at USC) ... conversely, Notre Dame had 17 turnovers, stretching its streak of games with fewer than 20 turnovers to 19 in a row ... only once this year has Notre Dame failed to have at least three double-digit scorers (two at USC), with Allen, Barlow and Gaines doing the honors at Michigan ... Notre Dame's second platoon at Michigan, which consisted of three freshmen (Barlow, Williamson, Lechlitner), outscored the Wolverine bench, 25-23, making it six times in seven games that the Irish reserves have outpointed the opposition (ND is 5-1 in those games).
