Irish Advance To NCAA Tournament For Second Consecutive Year

- #12/#12 Notre Dame to face #4/#5 New Hampshire in West Regional Game at the World Arena in Colorado Springs, Colo., on Friday, March 28
- Irish and Wildcats joined in Colorado by Colorado College and Michigan State.
- Notre Dame making third NCAA appearance all-time (2004, 2007, 2008).

Friday's game will be seen live on ESPN 360 and on tape delay on ESPNU at 11:00 p.m. (MDT) on March 28. The West Regional on March 29 will be televised live on ESPNU at 8:00 p.m. (MDT).

BACK IN THE NCAA'S : Notre Dame makes its second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament on Friday, March 28 when the Irish face the New Hampshire Wildcats at 4:30 p.m. (MDT) in the opening game of the West Regional in Colorado Springs, Colo. This will also be the third appearance all-time for the Irish as they appeared in the tournament in 2004 (under head coach Dave Poulin) and then in 2007 and 2008 with Jeff Jackson behind the bench. Joining Notre Dame and New Hampshire in the West Regional are the host school, Colorado College and Michigan State. Those two teams will meet on Friday at 8:00 p.m. (MDT). The West Regional championship game between the two winners will be played on Saturday, March 29 at 8:00 p.m. (MDT). New Hampshire is the No. 1 seed in the West Regional and brings a 25-9-3 record into the tournament. The Wildcats were the Hockey East regular-season champions and lost in the conference tournament semifinals, 5-4, to Boston College in three overtimes. Colorado College is the No. 2 seed with the Tigers boasting a 28-11-1 record overall. The Tigers were the WCHAs MacNaughton Cup champions as the conference's regular-season champs. Michigan State is the third-seeded team and was 24-11-5 on the year while finishing third in the CCHA regular season. The Spartans are the defending national champions and lost in the second round of the CCHA playoffs to Northern Michigan. Notre Dame finished fourth in the CCHA and brings a 24-15-4 record into the regional. The Irish lost in the semifinals of the CCHA Tournament, 2-1, to Miami in overtime on March 21 and then dropped the third-place game, 2-1, to Northern Michigan on March 22.



IRISH NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY: Notre Dame owns a 1-2 record in the NCAA Tournament in its previous two appearances. In 2004, the Irish advanced to the Grand Rapids Regional to face two-time defending NCAA champion, Minnesota, and dropped a 5-2 decision in the opening round game to the Gophers. In 2007, Notre Dame was the No. 1 seed in the tournament and again played in Grand Rapids. The Irish faced Alabama-Huntsville in the opening game and beat the Chargers, 3-2, in double overtime. In the Regional Championship game, they fell to Michigan State, 2-1, as the Spartans went on to win the 2007 NCAA title.

NOTRE DAME AT THE WORLD ARENA: Notre Dame has played just once at the World Arena, facing Colorado College on Oct. 21, 2005. The Tigers won that game, 3-1. Seven members of this year's Irish team were dressed for that game - **Luke Lucyk, Erik Condra, Brock Sheahan, Evan Rankin, Mark Van Guilder** and **Jordan Pearce**. Pearce served as the back up in goal and did not play. Notre Dame has played 20 other times in Colorado Springs when they faced Colorado College as members of the WCHA from 1971-81.

BACK WHERE IT ALL STARTED: The first game of the **Jeff Jackson** era at Notre Dame was played at the World Arena on Oct. 21, 2005 with the Irish dropping a 3-1 decision to Colorado College. The Irish have come a long way since that first-game loss for Jackson and his squad. Since that loss, the Irish are 69-40-11 (.621) with one CCHA regular-season and tournament championship and two trips to the NCAA tournament.

NOTRE DAME VS. NEW HAMPSHIRE: The Irish and the Wildcats have met four times in the all-time series with UNH owning a 4-0 record. The series began on Jan. 2, 1991 in Durham with the Wildcats taking a 2-1 decision. The two teams met the following year, on Nov. 8-9, 1991 in South Bend, with UNH taking 7-1 and 8-2 verdicts. The last time the two schools met was on Nov. 27, 1999 in the Conference Classic at New Hampshire. The Wildcats won that opening round game, 2-1.

IRISH VERSUS COLORADO COLLEGE: Notre Dame and Colorado College have met 44 times in the all-time series with the Irish holding a 25-18-1 edge to date. At Colorado Springs, Notre Dame is 12-8-1 with the last meeting coming on Oct. 21, 2005 and the Tigers taking a 3-1 decision. The Irish and Tigers were members of the WCHA from 1971-1981 before Notre Dame left to join the CCHA for the 1981-82 season. The two teams played in this season's Lightning College Hockey Classic in Tampa, Fla., in December but did not face each other.

NOTRE DAME VS. MICHIGAN STATE: The Irish and the Spartans have been banging heads as far back as 1921-22 and have played a total of 99 games in the all-time series. The Spartans own a 59-31-9 edge in the first 99 games. This season, Sparty had a 1-0-1 edge in the home-and-home series. Michigan State won at East Lansing on Jan. 11, 3-1. The teams played at Notre Dame on Jan. 13 and battled to a 1-1 tie. In the postseason, the Irish and Spartans have played three times with the Spartans holding a 3-0 edge. Michigan State beat Notre Dame, 4-1, in the 1982 CCHA Championship game; knocked off the Irish 4-0 in the 2000 CCHA semifinals and then ended the 2007 season with a 2-1 win in the NCAA Midwest Regional championship game.

CCHA REPRESENTATION: The Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) placed four teams in the 2008 NCAA Tournament, marking the third consecutive year that has occurred. Leading the way was Michigan (31-5-4) as the overall No. 1 seed. The Wolverines, the CCHA regular season and tournament champion is the No. 1 seed in the East Regional at Albany, N.Y. Miami (32-7-1) is the No. 2 seed overall and the top-seed in the Northeast Regional at Worcester, Mass. Michigan State (24-11-5) is the third seed in the West Regional and Notre Dame (24-15-4) is the fourth seed in Colorado Springs, Colo. This marks the fifth time that there are four CCHA teams in the tournament. The same four teams advanced to the 2007 tournament. In 2004, the conference record was set when five CCHA teams advanced - Miami, Michigan, Michigan State, Notre Dame and Ohio State.

CCHA TOURNAMENT RECAP: The Irish advanced to the CCHA Tournament at Joe Louis Arena for the second consecutive year and for their first time as defending champions. Things didn't go quite as well as 2007 as Notre Dame dropped a pair of 2-1 games to Miami and Northern Michigan. The loss to Miami was toughest as the Irish led 1-0 and surrendered the tying goal with four seconds left and then lost at 6:06 of overtime. Here are the game summaries:

THE COACH AND THE PLAYOFFS: Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** has had his share of success in the CCHA playoffs. His teams have made nine CCHA playoff appearances (six at Lake Superior State and three with Notre Dame) and Jackson is now 30-7 (.811) in conference postseason play. At Lake Superior, his teams were 24-2 while at Notre Dame, he is 6-5. His teams have advanced to the CCHA finals in eight of nine seasons (six at LSSU and two at Notre Dame). Jackson has seen his teams win five CCHA Tournament Championships (four with Lake Superior and one at Notre Dame).

JACKSON AND THE NAAS: Notre Dame's appearance in the 2008 NCAA West Regional marks the eighth time in nine seasons as a Division I head coach that **Jeff Jackson** has led his team to the NCAA Tournament (Lake Superior six times, Notre Dame twice). In his six trips with the Lakers, his teams advanced to the NCAA championship game three times (1992, 1993 and 1994), winning the title in 1992 and 1994. His all-time record in the NCAA Tournament is 13-6 (.684), 12-5 with the Lakers and 1-1 at Notre Dame.

VERSUS THE FIELD: Notre Dame owns a 4-7-1 record against teams in the 2008 NCAA Tournament. The Irish were 0-1 against Wisconsin, 1-1 versus Denver, 1-2 against Miami, 2-0 against Princeton, 0-1-1 against Michigan State and 0-2 versus Michigan.

OVERTIME: Notre Dame's 2-1 overtime loss to Miami on March 21 was the fifth overtime game for the Irish this season and the first one they lost. On the year, Notre Dame is 0-1-4 in overtime.

OUT FOR THE SEASON: Head coach **Jeff Jackson** announced on Monday, March 17, that Notre Dame would be without the services of leading scorer, **Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.)** who suffered an injury to his left knee in the first period of game three versus Ferris State. Condra leads the Irish in scoring with a career-high 15 goals to go with 23 assists for 38 points. He also has career highs in power-play goals (6) and short-handed goals (3) while equaling his career best with four game-winning goals.

PUTTING IN THE TIME: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Jr. Anchorage, Alaska)** became the single-season minutes played leader for the Irish during the CCHA Tournament. Pearce has now seen action in 39 games this season and has played a record 2,313:31 minutes in those games. That ranks him second in the CCHA and fifth in the nation. Coming into this year, Pearce had played in just 12 games, making nine starts for a total of 621:56 minutes.

PERSONAL STREAK: **Jordan Pearce** has made 15 consecutive starts, dating back to Jan. 25 at Bowling Green. He is 6-6-3 in those starts with a 1.84 goals-against average and a .924 save percentage. In those 15 games, Pearce has given up 28 goals (with two ENG) while Notre Dame has scored just 35 goals in those same 15 games. Earlier this season, Pearce had a personal seven-game winning streak between Nov. 16 and Dec. 8. During the streak, Pearce was 7-0-0 with a 1.72 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage. For the season, Pearce is 20-14-4 with a 1.95 goals-against average and a .917 save percentage with two shutouts.

SELECT COMPANY: With his win on Sunday, March 16 in game three versus Ferris State, **Jordan Pearce**, became the fourth goaltender in Notre Dame history to record 20 wins in a season. He joins **David Brown '07** (29 in 2006-07), **Lance Madson '90** (24 in 1987-88) and **Mark Kronholm '74** (20 in 1972-73).

MILESTONE: In Notre Dame's 6-3 win over Ferris State on Saturday, March 15 (Game Two), Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** recorded the 250th win of his collegiate coaching career in this his ninth season. Jackson is now 251-93-36 in six seasons at Lake Superior State and three years at Notre Dame. His .709 winning percentage is tops among active Division I coaches. In three seasons behind the Notre Dame bench, Jackson's teams own a 69-41-11 (.616) record.

GAMES PLAYED MARKS: Seniors **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** and **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** continue to move on the Notre Dame games played list. Van Guilder set the Notre Dame record for career games played in the CCHA Tournament versus Northern Michigan. Van Guilder has played every game of his career and passed **Dan Carlson '01** who held the record with 158 games played. A LEAGUE TITLE: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** closed out the CCHA regular season with the best goals-against average in conference games, giving up 1.80 goals-per game. Miami's Jeff Zatkoff was second with a 1.83 mark. This marks the second season in a row that a Notre Dame goaltender has won the goals-against title as **David Brown** was first in 2006-07 with a 1.77 league mark. This marks the fourth time since the 1982-83 season that the same school won back-to-back goaltending titles with different goaltenders.

SECOND HALF NUMBERS: After starting the 2007-08 season with a 16-4-0 record through Dec. 8, the Irish are 8-11-4 during the second half. The wins in game two and three versus Ferris State, gave the Irish back-to-back wins for the first time since Jan. 25-26 at Bowling Green. During the second half of the season that started on Dec. 29, the Irish have scored 49 goals (2.13) while giving up 50 (2.17). In the first half of the year (20 games) the Irish averaged 3.55 goals per game and were ranked third in the country in scoring. They are now 25th, averaging 2.79 goals-per-game.

THE GOOD AND THE BAD: Through the first 43 games of the season, when the Irish are good, they are very good. In the 24 wins, Notre Dame has scored 96 goals (4.00 per game). In the 15 losses and four ties, Notre Dame has scored just 24 goals for a 1.26 goals-per game mark. In the 24 wins, the Irish have given up just 35 goals (1.46 goals-against average) while in the 15 losses and four ties, they have given up 53 goals (2.79 goals against).

NATIONAL RANKINGS: Notre Dame is 12th in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls after the two games in the CCHA Tournament. For the first time in the program's 40-year history, Notre Dame has been ranked in every week of the season (24 weeks).

VAN GUILDER IN FINAL 10: Notre Dame team captain **Mark Van Guilder** has been selected as one of the 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. Selected along with Van Guilder are: Mark Dekanich (Colgate), Bryce Hollweg (Army), Peter Mannino (Denver), Marty Mjelleli (St. Cloud State), Justin Pesony (St. Lawrence), Kevin Porter (Michigan), Frank Schiavone (Air Force), Topher Scott (Cornell) and Landis Stankieveh (Princeton). The 10 players will go on a ballot for nationwide voting that will begin on Feb. 14 and conclude on March 28. Fan balloting is available on the award's website at www.seniorclassaward.com. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender **David Brown '07** won the Lowe's Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

20 WINS: Notre Dame comes into its NCAA Tournament game with New Hampshire with 24 wins on the season. The 24 wins are the third highest total in the program's 40-year history surpassed only by the 32 in 2006-07 and the 27 in 1987-88. Combined with last year's 32-win year, Notre Dame now has back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time in the program's 40-year history.

DEADLINE DEALS: While no former Notre Dame players were dealt during the NHL's recent trade deadline on Tuesday, Feb. 26, one current Irish player saw his rights traded. Defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**, who was a second-round choice of the Washington Capitals in last June's Entry Draft, saw his rights go to the Columbus Blue Jackets in exchange for future NHL Hall-of-Famer Sergei Federov.

POSTSEASON HONORS: Sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** was an honorable mention all-CCHA selection in voting done by the league's coaches. Lawson ranked fifth among defensemen in points as he had one first-place vote and a total of 17 points. Freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was an honorable mention CCHA all-rookie selection for his play this season. Junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was Notre Dame's Scholar-Athlete winner and is one of 11 candidates for the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete Award. Pearce is also Notre Dame's Perani Cup winner as he had 24 points. **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** was second with 22.

FLANAGAN AWARD WINNER: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)** was selected as the winner of the Terry Flanagan Memorial Award at the CCHA Awards Show on March 20 at the Fox Theatre in Detroit, Mich.

The award is named after former New Hampshire player and Bowling Green assistant coach who died from cancer in 1991. The award honors a player for perseverance, dedication and courage while overcoming severe adversity. Prior to this season, VeNard had played in just 61 games during his career due to injuries that included shoulder separations to both shoulders, knee injuries, a quad injury, a stress fracture to one leg and a 15-stitch cut to his side after getting cut by a skate during a game in 2006-07. Through all the injuries, VeNard continued to work hard to get in the lineup while also becoming the team's community service leader and this year as a senior, the president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Earlier this season, the senior was a nominee for the prestigious College Hockey Humanitarian Award. In his final season at Notre Dame, VeNard has played in all 43 games while having career highs in goals (5), assists (7) and points (12). He also was selected as one of the team's alternate captains.

PLAYING SHORT-HANDED: Through the first 43 games of the season, Notre Dame is second in the CCHA and third in the nation in killing penalties. The Irish have killed 174-of-195 opponent power plays for an 89.2% success rate. The Irish also are tied for seventh on the national level with eight short-handed goals. In the two games at the CCHA Tournament, Notre Dame was 10-for-10 on the penalty kill against Miami and Northern Michigan. Since Jan. 19, Notre Dame has given up just seven power-play goals in 68 chances for an 89.7% success rate.

CLUTCH SCORER: **Ryan Thang's (So., Edina, Minn.)** goal with 5:11 left in the Feb. 8 win at Alaska proved to be the game-winning goal. On the season, Thang now has 16 goals with five coming as game winners and one as a game-tying goal. On Jan. 13, he scored with 38 seconds left versus Michigan State for a 1-1 tie. In 85 career games, the sophomore left wing has 36 goals with 16 coming on the power play and 11 of them game winners. His 11 game winners rank him sixth all-time at Notre Dame in the game-winning goals department for the Irish.

The Wildcats are ranked #4/#5 in the polls and will be the 13th ranked team that Notre Dame has faced this season. The Irish lost a 2-1 overtime decision to #3/#3 Miami in the CCHA semifinals. They are now 2-8-1 that were ranked in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and 4-8-1 versus teams in the U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV poll. During 2007-08, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

BALANCED ATTACK: Notre Dame goes into the CCHA playoffs ranked 25th in the nation with 2.79 goals per game. With 120 goals in 43 games, the Irish have just five players with 10 or more goals this season - **Ryan Thang** with 16, **Erik Condra** with 15, **Mark Van Guilder** with 11, **Ben Ryan** with 10 and **Christian Hanson** notched his 10th versus Northern Michigan on March 22. The Irish have accumulated their 120 goals this year with 10 players on the roster having five goals or more.

ONE-GOAL GAMES: The Irish continue to play tight, 2-1 hockey games and added to the list last weekend with their ninth game decided by a 2-1 score. On the year, Notre Dame has played in 15 one-goal games, going 9-6 in those contests. Four of their last five games have been decided by 2-1 scores.

BIG BEN: Freshman center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** ran his scoring streak to five games (2-3-5) with an assist in the 2-1 loss to Miami on March 21. The streak was snapped the following night against Northern Michigan. Ryan is tied for fourth in scoring for the Irish and leads the team's freshmen with 10 goals and 14 assists for 24 points.

THE RIFLEMAN: Freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** has seen his offensive game take off in the playoffs. Cole had a career-high three-point game (2g, 1a) in the 6-3 win in game two of the CCHA second round against Ferris State and then added the game winning goal in game three on March 16. Since Feb. 23 (eight games), Cole has three goals and five assists for eight points. On the year, he is second among Irish defensemen with seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points.

MR. CONSISTENT: Sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson** sparked Notre Dame's comeback versus Ferris State with the first four-point game (1g, 3a) of his career in the 6-3 win over the Bulldogs. He then had a hand in setting up his

defensive partner, **Ian Cole**, for the game-winning goal in game three. A two-time CCHA defenseman of the week this season, Lawson leads all Notre Dame blueliners in scoring with four goals and career highs in assists (20) and points (24). He is fourth on the team with a +10 on the year.

THE CENTURY CLUB: Notre Dame's "Century Club" added its newest member on Nov. 24 when junior **Erik Condra** recorded an assist versus R.P.I. In 119 career games, Condra is now 33rd on the all-time points list with 120 career points. His 85 assists tie him for 20th on the all-time assist list with his uncle, All-American **Kirt Bjork '83**. For the third season in a row, Condra leads the Irish in scoring as he now has 15 goals and 23 assists for 38 points in 41 games. His 15 goals are a career high and his six power-play goals and three short-handed goals are career highs. Here's who is ahead of Condra on the all-time points list.

ON THE PLUS SIDE: Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** is one of the CCHA's top defensive defensemen. As a junior, he was a finalist for the conference's top defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan continues to be a force on the Irish blue line. He is currently +20 for the year to lead the team in that category.

HOT HANDS: Notre Dame's trio of left wing **Dan Kissel (So., Crestwood, Ill.)**, center **Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.)** and right wing **Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.)** all have career highs offensively for the Irish this season. Kissel is seventh in scoring with eight goals and 13 assists for 21 points, all career bests. He is followed by Hanson who has career highs in goals (10), assists (8) and points (18). Rankin has eight goals and 11 assists for 19 points, also his best numbers in each category.

PACKING THE PLACE: Notre Dame finished the 2007-08 regular season with sellout crowds in nine of its last 11 games (including the U.S. Under-18 exhibition game). For the season, the Irish played in front of sellouts in 12 of their 19 home dates (including the exhibition game) and averaged 2,693 fans per game.

HOME SWEET HOME: After 18 home games this season, Notre Dame is 11-4-3 (.694) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, the Irish were 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: With the 3-0 loss at Western Michigan on Feb. 29, Notre Dame is now 10-6-1 (.618) on the road this season. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better. The 10 road wins mark the ninth time in the program's history that the Irish have had 10 or more road wins in a season.

MORE THAN FIVE: The five goals given up by **Jordan Pearce** in the 5-3 loss to Ferris State on Feb. 8 marked the first time that an Irish goaltender had given up five goals or more in a game since Nov. 4, 2005 when **David Brown '07**, surrendered seven in an 8-5 loss to Michigan at the Joyce Center.

FIRING AWAY: The 36 shots on goal that Ferris State recorded on Feb. 9 in the 5-3 loss for Notre Dame were the most shots given up by the Irish in a game this season. The previous season high was 35 at Miami on Nov. 10.

FIVE-GOAL NIGHTS: The five goals scored by Ferris State on Feb. 8 marks just the third time in the last two seasons that Notre Dame has given up five goals in a game and the Bulldogs have done it twice. On Feb. 23, 2007, Ferris State defeated Notre Dame, 5-2. On Jan. 19 of this season, Michigan downed the Irish, 5-1, for the

third time it's happened. Under head coach **Jeff Jackson**, the Irish have given up five or more in a game just eight times in his three seasons (121 games) behind the bench.

MARCH IS HERE: February was a month the Irish would love to forget. Notre Dame was 1-3-3 in the month, scoring just 11 goals while giving up 17. During the month, the Irish averaged 34.3 shots per game, but scored 11 times in 240 shots for a 4.6% scoring percentage. During the month, Notre Dame was 5-for-40 on the power play (12.5%) while the penalty killers gave up three goals on 29 chances (89.7%). **Jordan Pearce** was 1-3-3 in the month with a 2.09 goals-against average and a .917 save percentage. Notre Dame's top scorer was **Erik Condra** with two goals and two assists for four points. No other player had more than one goal.

SHUTOUTS: Riley Gill's 42-save shutout of the Irish on Feb. 29 marked just the second time this season that Notre Dame failed to score a goal in a game. The previous time came on Nov. 27 at Ferris State when Mitch O'Keefe made 37 saves in a 3-0 shutout by the Bulldogs. Over the last three seasons with Jeff Jackson as the coach, the Irish have been shut out seven times (four in '05-'06 and once in '06-'07).

NANOOKS NUMBER: The win and the tie at Alaska improved Notre Dame to 7-0-1 in its last eight meetings with the Nanooks. The Irish were 6-0-0 in 2006-07, playing Alaska in four regular-season games and two CCHA playoff contests.

BIG MAC GOAL: **Brock Sheahan's** first goal in 34 games on Friday, Feb. 8 versus Ferris State not only brought a smile to the senior defenseman's face, but made 2,857 fans happy also. Sheahan's goal in the final minute of the second period earned each fan a free Big Mac courtesy of "McDonald's Magic Minute," promotion that is a regular in-game promotion at all Irish home games.

FATHER'S DAY IN FEBRUARY: The last three Saturday's in February were like Father's Day for Notre Dame as all three games have ended with ties. Last Saturday (Feb. 23) was a 2-2 tie with Ohio State. The previous Saturday (Feb. 16) was a 1-1 tie at Alaska and the month started with a Saturday tie (Feb. 9) with Ferris State. The fourth tie came on a Sunday afternoon (Jan. 13) with Michigan State. On the year, the Irish are 0-1-4 in overtime. Last season, they were 3-1-3 in overtime. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two-plus seasons under head coach **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-2-11 in extra play.

BUCKEYE JINX: With a win and a tie at the Joyce Center on Feb. 23-24, Ohio State extended its unbeaten streak at the Joyce Center to 10 games (7-0-3). The Buckeyes have not lost in South Bend since a 3-0 Notre Dame win on Oct. 23, 1998.

GOING HOME: Irish goaltender **Jordan Pearce** had a successful return to his home state, picking up a win and a tie versus Alaska on Feb. 15-16. The Anchorage, Alaska native is now 2-0-1 in his three games at the Carlson Center. He won his first game there last season, a 3-2

ON A ROLL: Notre Dame's two-game series sweep of Bowling Green on Jan. 25-26 gives the Irish a 12-game unbeaten streak (11-0-1) against the Falcons. That streak started with the 2005-06 season. The Irish are also 8-0-0 versus Bowling Green over the last two campaigns.

TWO SHORTIES: **Mark Van Guilder** and **Ryan Thang** each scored short-handed goals in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. That marked the first time the Irish had scored a pair of short-handed goals in a game since Dec. 20, 2000 when **Brett Lebda '04** and **Dan Carlson '01** scored short-handed goals in a 7-3 win at Nebraska-Omaha. As a team, the Irish have seven short-handed goals, the most of any team in the nation.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked ninth in the nation by both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Two Irish players were honored by the CCHA as players of the week for the week ending Jan. 27. Defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Sr., Lethbridge, Alb.)** was selected as the conference's defenseman of the week. Freshman right wing **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** was selected as the CCHA rookie of the week. In the Bowling Green series, Sheahan had an assist in each game, blocked three shots and was +3 while playing a key role in a 12-for-12 penalty-killing weekend. Ryan had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2. He had an assist in the 6-1 win on Friday and then had a career-best three-point game (2 ppg, 1 assist) in the 4-1 win on Saturday night.

BAD BOYS: Notre Dame and Bowling Green combined for 51 penalties and 157 minutes in the two-game series on Jan. 25-26. On Friday night, the two teams had 23 penalties for 97 minutes with the Falcons getting 10-for-44 and the Irish a season-high 13-for-57. On Saturday, Notre Dame had just seven for 14 minutes while the Falcons had an opponent's season high of

11-for-46 minutes.

SHINNY ANYONE?: On Monday, Jan. 21, Notre Dame's practice had a different look. The Irish went back to their hockey roots that day as they ventured to nearby Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind., to play a little shinny on the outdoor rink. Complete with temperatures in the single digits, stocking caps, hot chocolate and a great deal of laughter, the Irish spent some time having fun playing the game they love. Smiles were the number one priority and practice was a smashing success in that area.

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** has career highs in goals (8), assists (13) and points (21) this season. For his career, Kissel has played in 61 games with 14 goals and 16 assists for 30 points. Of his 14 goals, he has two power-play goals, two shorthanded tallies and four game winners.

HOCKEY HUMANITARIAN: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** was one of 22 nominees for the College Hockey Humanitarian Award that goes to college hockey's "top citizen". The list was cut to 10 on Jan. 28 and VeNard did not advance. The Irish alternate captain has been heavily involved in community service work in and around the Notre Dame campus during his career. He also serves as the president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

BUMP IN THE ROAD: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** saw his four-game winning streak snapped on Jan. 19 in the 5-1 loss to Michigan. The rookie netminder played 35:16 of the game, giving up four goals on 19 shots. In the first four starts of his career, Phillips was 4-0-0 with a 0.75 goals-against average and a .958 with one shutout. His numbers are currently 4-1-0 with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

RECORD STREAK: Notre Dame's nine-game winning streak from Nov. 16 through Dec. 8 was the longest for the Irish since a 14-game streak from Dec. 11, 1987 to Feb. 13, 1988. During that time, the Irish were a Division I Independent. The streak is the longest for the Irish as a member of the CCHA or the WCHA.

THREE PPG AGAINST: In the 4-3 loss to Massachusetts on Dec. 29, the Irish gave up three power-play goals to the Minutemen, the first time that has happened since Dec. 17, 2005, in a 4-0 loss to Lake Superior. Ferris State duplicated the feat on March 15 in game two of the CCHA playoff series when the Bulldogs had three power-play goals on seven chances in the 6-3 Irish victory.

BERGMAN RETURNS TO USHL: Freshman left wing **Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden)** has left the Notre Dame hockey team and returned to the United States Hockey League (USHL). He will play for the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders, the team he played for last season. In 20 games at Notre Dame, Bergman had one goal and six assists for seven points and was +3 on the year. With Cedar Rapids last season, Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points to finish fourth on the team in scoring.

VERSUS THE BEST: Notre Dame failed to record a win in the weekend series with top-ranked Michigan (Jan. 18-19), the second time this year that the Irish faced the nation's top-ranked team. On Nov. 9-10, Notre Dame met No. 1 ranked Miami twice in Oxford, Ohio, defeating the RedHawks, 2-1, on Nov. 9 before dropping a 3-1 decision at Miami on Nov. 10. The Nov. 9 win marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. Before losing on Nov. 10, Notre Dame had won four straight versus top 10 teams. WELCOME BACK: Freshman defenseman **Ian Cole** returned to the Notre Dame lineup at Michigan State (Jan. 11) after participating in the World Junior Championships with the U.S. Junior National Team. At the World Championships, Cole played in all six games and had no points with six penalty minutes as the United States finished fourth in the tournament. He missed four games – the two games at the Lightning College Hockey Classic and the Northern Michigan series. Also returning on Friday night was fellow freshman defender **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Ruth missed five games (Princeton, Lightning College Classic and two with Northern Michigan) due to an injury.

NO GOALS FOR YOU: Junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** recorded his second shutout of the season in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. The shutout also was the fourth of his career and moved him into a tie for third with **Mark Kronholm '74** on Notre Dame's all-time shutout list. He trails just **Morgan Cey '05** (2nd with 6) and **David Brown '07** (first with 12). Pearce's first career shutout came in his second career game, a 2-0, 27-save win over Princeton on Oct. 28, 2005. Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** recorded his first career shutout on Dec. 8 with a 24-save, 7-0 whitewashing of the Princeton Tigers.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that three players have signed national letters of intent in the early signing period to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2008. The trio - defensemen **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)** and **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** and forward **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** - will join **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** who signed in Nov. of 2007 but deferred until next fall. Lorenz and Gaul are members of the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 team. Ringel plays in the North American Hockey League for the Mahoning Valley Phantoms and Maday is a member of the Waterloo Black Hawks of the United States Hockey League (USHL). Ringel was ranked 163rd (sixth round) among North Americans in NHL Central Scouting's mid-term rankings that were released in January.

TOURNAMENT VETS: The Lightning College Hockey Classic was the third in-season tournament for the Irish this season. They opened the year at the Lefty McFadden Classic in Dayton, Ohio, losing to Wisconsin, 4-1, before defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, to take third place. Over Thanksgiving, the Irish played in the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, taking the championship with wins over Alabama-Huntsville (4-1) and Rensselaer (4-3). At Tampa, Notre Dame dropped a 4-3 decision to Massachusetts and then took third place with a 3-1 win over Rensselaer.

TOURNEY RESULTS: Notre Dame has now participated in 30 in-season tournaments in the program's 40-year history, winning six times and finishing second, six times. The Irish have been third a total of seven times and there have been 11 fourth-place finishes. Notre Dame has now won two of the last four in-season tournaments that the Irish have played in, winning the 2006 Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic in Oct. of 2006 in Tampa, Fla and the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, Nov. 24-25, 2007 in Troy, N.Y. All time, the Irish are 23-34-3 in tournament play.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Notre Dame placed two players on the 2007 Lightning College Hockey Classic all-tournament team. Irish forward **Erik Condra** and defenseman **Luke Lucyk** were named to the all-tournament team after helping Notre Dame to a 1-1 record. Condra had two goals and one assist in the tournament, took nine shots and was +3 on the weekend. Lucyk had one goal in two games and was +2 in the two games. They were joined by RPI goaltender Mathias Lange, Colorado College defenseman Nate Prosser and Colorado College forwards Chad Rau and Jimmy Kilpatrick. UMass forward Matt Burto, who scored the game winner in the championship game was the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)** was named the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Dec. 9. In the weekend sweep at Princeton, VeNard had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2 on the weekend. His three-point game on Dec. 8 in Notre Dame's 7-0 win was a career high for the blueliner.

NIFTY NOVEMBER: Notre Dame finished November with a 9-1-0 record, including wins in the last six straight. Some other numbers for the month: The Irish were 7-1-0 in the CCHA and 5-0-0 at home while going 3-1-0 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites ... the Irish out scored the opposition by a 38-19 margin (3.8 gpg to 1.9 gpg) ... Notre Dame out shot the opposition by a 31.0 - 20.1 margin ... the Irish were 13-for-52 on the power play (25.0%) and killed 41-of-46 opponent power plays for an 89.1% success rate ... **Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.)** led the team in scoring with six goals and 10 assists for 16 points and was followed by **Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.)**, **Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** and **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** with 10 points each ... **Jordan Pearce** was 7-1-0 with a 2.13 goals-against average and a .900 save percentage ... **Brad Phillips (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.)** was 2-0-0 with a 1.00 goals-against and a .935 save percentage.

TOURNAMENT HARDWARE: Three Notre Dame players were named to the all-tournament team at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Junior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded three assists on the weekend and was the lone Irish forward selected. Defensemen **Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.)** and **Ian Cole** joined Condra on the team. Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** was named the tournament MVP after scoring the game-winning goal in each of Notre Dame's victories.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame on Nov. 17 are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances against Western Michigan (Nov. 16) were also a season high.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)**. They will be joined by junior forward **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)**. This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

NHL DRAFTTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork ('83)** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists

for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak** who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips. Other NTDP alums who played at Notre Dame include: **Brett Henning** (1997-98), **Michael Chin** (1997-98), **Connor Dunlop** (1997-99), **Paul Harris** (1997-99), **John Wroblewski** (1997-99), **Neil Komadoski** (1998-2000), **Brett Lebda** (1998-2000), **Rob Globke** (1998-2000), **Derek Smith** (2000-01) and **Tim Wallace** (2002-06), **Noah Babin** (2003-07), **Michael Bartlett** (2003-07), **Tom Sawatske** (2005-07) and **Josh Sciba** (2003-07).
