NOTRE DAME TAKES ON ANOTHER NEIGHBOR - NAIA POWER BETHEL COLLEGE

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team will face its second local NAIA team in exhibition play on Friday, November 3, when Bethel College (Mishawaka, Indiana) visits Purcell Pavilion (7 p.m. ET, ACC Network Extra, Notre Dame Basketball Radio Network).

The Irish won their first exhibition game, one added to aid in national hurricane relief, 97-57 over Holy Cross College on Friday, October 20. Holy Cross College is located just across the street from the University of Notre Dame, while Bethel College is located on the border between South Bend and Mishawaka, Indiana.

The Pilots have won three NAIA national championships (1995, 1997 and 1998) and will be visiting Purcell Pavilion for the first time. They are coached by Ryne Lightfoot in his first season, the son of longtime Bethel coach Mike Lightfoot, who served six full seasons under his father as an assistant coach. Ryne Lightfoot scored 2,075 points as a player at Bethel and was a two-time NAIA All-American.

This weekend Notre Dame is holding its annual alumni weekend with over 100 former players expected back on campus in addition to the Notre Dame - Wake Forest football game set for Saturday afternoon. Factor in Bethel's local fans and alumni and Friday night's contest is set to be very close to capacity in Purcell Pavilion.

LaPhonso Ellis - A Notre Dame men's basketball legend, Ellis is in his first season as an assistant coach with the Pilots, while also continuing his work as an analyst at ESPN. NOTRE DAME ENTERS SEASON 14th IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

The Irish will enter the 2017-18 season with their highest preseason national poll rankings since the 2008-09 season. Both the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches Poll have Notre Dame ranked 14th in their respective preseason rankings.

This marks the 22nd time Notre Dame has appeared in the AP preseason poll, tied for the 12th best in the history of the listing dating back to 1949. The Irish, Michigan State and Oklahoma have all been ranked in the preseason poll 22 times, with the Irish average of 12.59 and highest preseason ranking of third in 1979.

Notre Dame has been either ranked or receiving votes in 11 of 18 AP polls in the Mike Brev era, including four of the last five seasons, Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked ninth in each poll.

NOTRE DAME PICKED THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team has been selected to finish third in the Atlantic Coast Conference for the 2017-18 season. The poll was conducted as part of the league's annual media day activities in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Wednesday, October 25.

The third-place preseason team poll position marks the high mark for the Irish in the ACC (Notre Dame joined the league for the 2013–14 season) and highest preseason conference mark since the 2012–13 team was selected to finish third in the BIG EAST Conference. The third-place recognition matches the top preseason conference ranking in program history. The Irish also were selected to finish third in the BIG EAST in 2003–04.

The preseason poll also points out just how difficult the ACC schedule will be for the Irish this season. Notre Dame is the only conference school with road games at Duke (1st), North Carolina (2nd) and Virginia (6th).

NOTRE DAME vs. HOLY CROSS COLLEGE RECAP

The Irish unofficially got the 2017–18 season underway on Friday evening, as the Irish comfortably defeated Holy Cross College by a final score of 97–57 in the first of three exhibitions. Five players finished in double figures for Notre Dame, as Martinas Geben led the way with 20 points. All proceeds from the game will be earmarked for St. Catherine of Siena, a Catholic elementary and middle school in Port Arthur, Texas. The school suffered extensive damage because of Hurricane Harvey with repairs needed to the HVAC system, roof and gym floor.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Irish held a 9-6 advantage in the early stages of the first half and then blew the game wide open, rattling off 21 straight points to take a commanding 30-6 lead with seven minutes to play. Notre Dame continued to increase its advantage, as the squad led by 30 points at the half with the score 49-19. Farrell led all scorers at the break with 11 points.

The scoreboard was reset to 0-0 coming out of the halftime intermission for the second stanza. Notre Dame continued its offensive onslaught in the final 20 minutes, pouring in 48 points to total 97 for the evening. Rex Pflueger (13), Geben (11) and Nikola Djogo (10) each scored 10+ points in the second half.

PLAYER OF THE GAME

Geben was a beast underneath for the Irish on Friday, posting a double-double with 20 points and 11 rebounds. Geben's 20 points led the Irish in scoring and the senior finished an impressive 7-of-8 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line.

NOTRE DAME STAT OF THE GAME

The Irish shot 56.7 percent from the field against the Saints (34-of-60) en route to the 97-point effort. Picking up where it left off last year, Notre Dame also excelled from the charity stripe finishing 26-for-32 to shoot 81.3 percent for the evening.

NOTES OF THE GAME

- With the win the Irish are 35-0 in exhibitions under Brey.
- Five players finished in double figures against Holy Cross.
- Pflueger filled up the stat sheet, scoring 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting, while also adding 18 rebounds, five assists, three steals and two blocks.
- The Irish outrebounded the Saints 47-25.
- Bonzie Colson recorded a double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds.
- Matt Farrell and Djogo each finished with 15 points apiece in the winning effort.

BONZIE COLSON NAMED ACC PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Senior forward Bonzie Colson was overwhelmingly voted as the Atlantic Coach Conference Preseason Player of the Year as part of the league's annual media day activities in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Wednesday, October 25. Colson, who led the league in rebounding (10.1) during the 2016-17 season and finished ninth in scoring (17.8), received 49 of the 69 possible votes for the preseason player of the year nod. He was the lone ACC player to average a double-double per game last season.

Colson is the first Notre Dame player to earn a preseason conference player of the year award since Luke Harangody repeated as the BIG EAST preseason player of the year in 2008-09 and 2009-10. Colson also joins Jerian Grant (2013-14, 2014-15) and Demetrius Jackson (2015-16) as Irish players selected to the preseason all-ACC team.

Other previous Notre Dame preseason conference player of the year selections include Pat Garrity (BIG EAST, 1997-98) and Troy Murphy (BIG EAST, 2000-01). Murphy ended up earning the BIG EAST Player of the Year award at the end of the 2000-01 campaign. Colson was also named to the Preseason All-ACC First Team

A SEASON OF MILESTONES AHEAD FOR MIKE BREY

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey is poised to reach three key milestones in his coaching career this season.

Brey is 12 wins away from becoming the all-time wins leader at Notre Dame (382 current, 393 is the record).

Brey is 18 wins away from 400 at Notre Dame, which would make him the 13th active coach to have 400 wins at his current school. Brey is 19 wins away from 500 in his coaching career, on pace to become the 31st active coach to reach 500 career wins.

Should Brey reach the 500-win barrier, he will join Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Roy Williams, Greg Kampe, Tony Shaver, Tom Izzo, Fran Dunphy, Bob McKillop, Jay Wright and Mark Few as the only current coaches to win 500 or more games while coaching at just one or two schools.

COLSON LEADS ACC IN REBOUNDING IN HISTORIC FASHION

Senior forward Bonzie Colson has been labeled as 'under-sized,' due to his listed 6-6 height measurement. The New Bedford, Massachusetts, native does boast a 7-2 wing span, however, which helped the Irish captain lead the ACC in rebounding at 10.1 per game.

Colson became the shortest ACC player to lead the league in rebounding since South Carolina's Grady Wallace grabbed 14.4 rebounds per game in 1957 - a span of 60 years.

Since 1958 (Pete Brennan, North Carolina) Colson is the only player under 6-7 to lead the ACC in rebounding. PLAYERS UNDER 6-7 TO LEAD THE ACC IN REBOUNDING:

Colson also became the second consecutive Notre Dame player to lead the ACC in rebounding, joining Zach Auguste (10.7 in 2015-16).

BREY AMONG THE BEST IN CRUNCH TIME

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey was recently declared the second-best 'crunch time' college basketball coach by The Athletic's Ken Pomeroy. Using his win probability model, Pomeroy assessed a coach's ability to make halfitme adjustments. He looked at every game coached over the past eight seasons to determine if a team won more games than it should have based on its halftime win probablity. Here are the top five on the list for post-halftime performance (minimum 150 games, win percentage is relative to expectation).

BASKETBALL TIMES PROCLAIMS NOTRE DAME ONE OF THE TOP PROGRAMS IN THE NATION

The Basketball Times, utilzing a blue ribbon panel and five different ranking criteria, named Notre Dame the second-best college basketball program in the nation on November 1, 2017. With input from a panel of basketball writers, the five criteria – winning percentage over the past 10 years, NBA players, the federal graduation rate of the last four-year class, the U.S. News and World Report analysis of best colleges (graduation rate with perceived value of a diploma) and program cleanliness, the Irish finished with an average of 9.3, behind Duke and ahead of Wisconsin (9.5), Gonzaga (10.2) and Villanova (10.5).

The Basketball Times also ranked head coaches across the country, with Mike Brey taking up the fourth spot in a ranking of 35 coaches.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

The 2016–17 season marked the most significant shake up of Mike Brey's staff at Notre Dame, when Martin Ingelsby accepted the head coaching position at Delaware while Anthony Solomon moved to an assistant position at Georgetown (he is now currently at Dayton).

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 standout shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

MIKE BREY, HEAD COACH

18th Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 481-239 | ND Record: 382-187



In 17 seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to 382 victories and is poised to become the all-time winningest coach in the history of the program during the 2017-18 season.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 112-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over two million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance. He has been inducted into the University of Delaware and George Washington University Halls of Fame.
