BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH VS. YELLOW JACKETS

2	Notre Dame has claimed back-to-back in-season tournament titles over the past two seasons - the 2016 Legend Classic in Barclays Center and the 2017 Maui Jim Maui Invitational on Nov 22. Senior guard Matt Farrell was named Most Valuable Player of both tournaments, averaging 19.4 points in five games. See page 4 for more on Farrell's career in-season tournament statistics.
3	The Irish are 3-1 in overall and 3-1 in home ACC openers entering Saturday night's contest with Georgia Tech.
4	Mike Brey is the fourth-longest tenured head coach among power five conference teams - now in his 18th season at Notre Dame. Jim Boeheim (42), Mike Krzyzewski (38) and Tom Izzo (23) are the only other power five conference head coaches with a longer tenure at their current institution.
5	While Georgia Tech leads the all-time series with Notre Dame 9-7, the Irish hold a 5-3 advantage in ACC play.
16	Notre Dame is 16-1 in 'return games' (first game after the Christmas break) under Mike Brey . This season marks the first time the Irish will take on an ACC opponent in a 'return game.' Notre Dame has won its last 15 'return game' contests, including a 5-0 record against BIG EAST Conference opponents.
16.8	Points-per-game average for Matt Farrell , joining ACC leading scorer Bonzie Colson in the conference top-10 (Farrell is seventh as of December 28). The Irish join Duke as the only team with two players in the top seven of the ACC points-per-game rankings.
30	Senior forward Bonzie Colson has scored in double figures in 30 consecutive games and leads all current ACC players in career double-doubles (31) and rebounds (816).
26.5	Points-per-game average in the last two Notre Dame victories for Bonzie Colson , which earned him his third career ACC Player of the Week award and first of the 2017-18 season on December 26, 2017.
117.0	Adjusted offensive efficiency rating for the Irish, 10th-best in the country, as computed by kenpom.com. Notre Dame has finished in the top 10 of this rating in three of the last four seasons, including 2nd in 2015.
816	Career rebounds for Bonzie Colson , which places him 14th in Notre Dame men's basketball history and is seventh among all active NCAA players.
1,495	Career points scored by Bonzie Colson , who is poised to become just the eighth Notre Dame player to reach the 1,500-point, 800-rebound statistical milestone.

IRISH BEGIN ACC PLAY AGAINST GEORGIA TECH IN PURCELL

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (10-3) returns to action after a nine-day Christmas holiday layoff to begin the 2017-18 Atlantic Coast Conference basketball schedule against Georgia Tech (6-6) at Purcell Pavilion on Saturday night (ESPN, 2 p.m.).

NOTRE DAME - GEORGIA TECH SERIES HISTORY

Notre Dame and Georgia Tech will be meeting for the 17th time on Saturday afternoon, with the Yellow Jackets leading the all-time series 9-7. The Irish and Rambling Wreck have met eight times as ACC opponents, with Notre Dame holding a 5-3 advantage as a conference rivals. Georgia Tech is 0-4 at Purcell Pavilion in ACC competition.

The series dates back to the 1941 season, when Georgia Tech visited the Fieldhouse and the Irish prevailed 53-42.

BALANIS TAKES ON HIS ALMA MATER:

Notre Dame associate head coach Rod Balanis faces alma mater on Saturday afternoon. Balanis played for former Georgia Tech head coach Bobby Cremins from 1990-94, making four appearances in the NCAA tournament, two Sweet 16 berths and a spot in the 1990 Final Four.

Balanis was a member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll and graduated with honors (management) from Georgia Tech in 1993 and has been a member of the Irish coaching staff since Mike Brey's arrival on campus for the 2000-01 season.

COLSON POURS IN 37 POINTS VS. DARTMOUTH - BEST NOTRE DAME PERFORMANCE IN SEVEN YEARS

Senior forward Bonzie Colson carried the Irish to a 97-87 victory over Dartmouth on Tuesday, December 19, with a career-best 37 points on 15-of-21 shooting.

The 37 points mark the most for an Irish player since Luke Harangody posted 37 against Cincinnati on February 4, 2010.

NOTRE DAME 'RETURN GAME' HISTORY

Notre Dame improved to 17-1 in 'get-away games' (the final game before the Christmas holiday break) under Mike Brey against South-eastern Louisiana on December 21, 2017. The Irish have an equally impressive 'return game' history under Brey, with a 16-1 record in those contests. Saturday will mark the first time the Irish 'return game' will be against an ACC opponent.

Notre Dame has played five 'return games' against a conference opponent while a member of the BIG EAST Conference, posting a 5-0 record in those contest (4-0 at Purcell Pavilion).

The Fighting Irish have made at least one three pointer during every game of the Mike Brey era. The last time an Irish team failed to hit a three-pointer in a game was in a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 12, 1999. Notre Dame finished 0-7 from beyond the arc in that contest.

CONFERENCE HOME OPENERS

Notre Dame will begin the 2017-18 ACC season on Saturday against Georgia Tech. The Irish are 3-1 in ACC openers since joining the league for the 2013-14 season - and 3-1 in ACC home openers.

Overall under Mike Brey, the Irish have compiled a 14-3 record in conference home openers (losses to Villanova, 1/6/2002, Syracuse, 1/11/2006, and Pittsburgh 1/9/2016) and 12-5 record in overall conference openers.

BACK-TO-BACK IN-SEASON TOURNAMENT MVPs FOR FARRELL

Safe to say that senior guard Matt Farrell embraces the competition of in-season tournaments. The Bridgewater, N.J., native enjoyed his break out performances at the 2016 Legends Classic in the Barclays Center, earning tournament MVP honors.

He stepped up another level at the 2017 Maui Jim Maui Invitational, leading the Irish through three victories - including a career-high 27 points against Chaminade and the play of the game in the rally over No. 6/6 Wichita State, stealing an in-bounds pass with less than a minute remaining and finding Bonzie Colson to cut the Shocker lead to one point.

In the past two in-season tournaments, Farrell is averaging 19.4 ppg, shooting .482 from 3FG and averaging 5.4 apg.

GEBEN'S BIG MOMENT

Senior forward Martinas Geben has been playing his best basketball at Notre Dame early this season and stepped up in a clutch situation at the 2017 Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

With the Irish trailing by a point and three seconds remaining, Geben was fouled on an in-bounds play and sent to the foul line. A consistent free throw shooter in practice, Geben has not seen many opportunities in his career (he was 53-70, .750 percentage, before the two attempts against Wichita State) but stepped up to convert both free throw attempts and provide the game-winning points.

Geben's final two games in Maui, 10 pts vs. LSU and a career-high matching 12 against Wichita State, mark the first time in his career he has posted back-to-back double-digit scoring games. He also is shooting .690 from the floor this year (40-58).

The single-season record for field goal percentage (minimum of 150 attempts) is .656 by Bruce Flowers in 1978-79.

COLSON A CONSENSUS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Bonzie Colson, the top returning rebounder and second-leading returning scorer in the ACC, has been named a 2016-17 Preseason All-American by a majority of the publications and websites that cover college basketball. The Associated Press, Sports Illustrated, The Sporting News, The Athletic and Blue Ribbon Yearbook all placed Colson on their preseason first team.

In addition, Colson was named the preseason national player of the year by the Blue Ribbon Yearbook and the ACC Preseason Player of the Year.

COLSON NAMED TO ASSOCIATED PRESS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAM

The Associated Press has announced its 2017-18 Preseason All-America Team and senior forward Bonzie Colson was the second-leading vote getter on the five-person team. Colson is a consensus preseason All-American for the 2017-18 season after averaging 17.8 points and 10.1 rebounds per game in 2016-17.

NOTRE DAME PICKED THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team has been selected to finish third in the Atlantic Coast Conference for the 2017-18 season. The poll was conducted as part of the league's annual media day activities in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Wednesday, October 25.

The third-place preseason team poll position marks the high mark for the Irish in the ACC (Notre Dame joined the league for the 2013-14 season) and highest preseason conference mark since the 2012-13 team was selected to finish third in the BIG EAST Conference. The third-place recognition matches the top preseason conference ranking in program history. The Irish also were selected to finish third in the BIG EAST in 2003-04.

The preseason poll also points out just how difficult the ACC schedule will be for the Irish this season. Notre Dame is the only conference school with road games at Duke (1st), North Carolina (2nd) and Virginia (6th).

BONZIE COLSON NAMED ACC PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Senior forward Bonzie Colson was overwhelmingly voted as the Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Player of the Year as part of the league's annual media day activities in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Wednesday, October 25. Colson, who led the league in rebounding (10.1) during the 2016-17 season and finished ninth in scoring (17.8), received 49 of the 69 possible votes for the preseason player of the year nod. He was the lone ACC player to average a double-double per game last season.

Colson is the first Notre Dame player to earn a preseason conference player of the year award since Luke Harangody repeated as the BIG EAST preseason player of the year in 2008-09 and 2009-10. Colson also joins Jerian Grant (2013-14, 2014-15) and Demetrius Jackson (2015-16) as Irish players selected to the preseason all-ACC team.

Other previous Notre Dame preseason conference player of the year selections include Pat Garrity (BIG EAST, 1997-98) and Troy Murphy (BIG EAST, 2000-01). Murphy ended up earning the BIG EAST Player of the Year award at the end of the 2000-01 campaign.

Colson was also named to the Preseason All-ACC First Team.

A SEASON OF MILESTONES AHEAD FOR MIKE BREY

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey is poised to reach three key milestones in his coaching career this season.

Brey is two wins away from becoming the all-time wins leader at Notre Dame (392 current, 393 is the record).

Brey is eight wins away from 400 at Notre Dame, which would make him the 13th active coach to have 400 wins at his current school.

Brey is nine wins away from 500 in his coaching career, on pace to become the 31st active coach to reach 500 career wins.

Should Brey reach the 500-win barrier, he will join Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Roy Williams, Greg Kampe, Tony Shaver, Tom Izzo, Fran Dunphy, Bob McKillop, Jay Wright and Mark Few as the only current coaches to win 500 or more games while coaching at just one or two schools.

BREY AMONG THE BEST IN CRUNCH TIME

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey was recently declared the second-best 'crunch time' college basketball coach by The Athletic's Ken Pomeroy. Using his win probability model, Pomeroy assessed a coach's ability to make halftime adjustments. He looked at every game coached over the past eight seasons to determine if a team won more games than it should have based on its halftime win probability.

BASKETBALL TIMES PROCLAIMS NOTRE DAME ONE OF THE TOP PROGRAMS IN THE NATION

The Basketball Times, utilizing a blue ribbon panel and five different ranking criteria, named Notre Dame the second-best college basketball program in the nation on November 1, 2017. With input from a panel of basketball writers, the five criteria - winning percentage over the past 10 years, NBA players, the federal graduation rate of the last four-year class, the U.S. News and World Report analysis of best colleges (graduation rate with perceived value of a diploma) and program cleanliness, the Irish finished with an average of 9.3, behind Duke and ahead of Wisconsin (9.5), Gonzaga (10.2) and Villanova (10.5).

The Basketball Times also ranked head coaches across the country, with Mike Brey taking up the fourth spot in a ranking of 35 coaches.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

The 2016-17 season marked the most significant shake up of Mike Brey's staff at Notre Dame, when Martin Ingelsby accepted the head coaching position at Delaware while Anthony Solomon moved to an assistant position at Georgetown (he is now currently at Dayton).

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 standout shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

NOTRE DAME EARNS ANOTHER ARENA DEDICATION GAME IN STATE OF ILLINOIS

Notre Dame's season-opening 72-58 victory at DePaul on Saturday, November 11, marked the dedication game of Wintrust Arena in downtown Chicago. The win marked Notre Dame's second consecutive victory in an arena dedication game in the state of Illinois, as the Irish defeated Illinois 84-79 in the State Farm Center dedication on Dec. 2, 2015 (also a part of the ACC-Big Ten Challenge that season).

The Irish have now participated in the opening of five arenas on the road in program history. Here is a list of those contests, which also includes the Joyce Center/Purcell Pavilion dedication game with UCLA in 1968.

November 11, 2017, was not the first dedication that has taken place during a Notre Dame - DePaul game. On December 14, 2003, the Irish and Blue Demons met at Allstate Arena for the dedication of Ray and Marge Meyer Court - honoring the Hall of Fame DePaul coach and former Irish basketball team captain. Notre Dame won that meeting 82-69.

Also on January 29, 1934, Notre Dame was part of the first college basketball doubleheader ever played in Madison Square Garden. The Irish lost to NYU 18-26, while St. John's lost to Westminster 37-33 in front of 16,138 fans.

MIKE BREY, HEAD COACH

18th Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 491-243 | ND Record: 392-190



In 17 seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to 391 victories and is poised to become the all-time winningest coach in the history of the program during the 2017-18 season.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 112-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over two million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance. He has been inducted into the University of Delaware and George Washington University Halls of Fame.

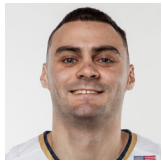

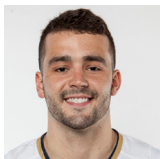
