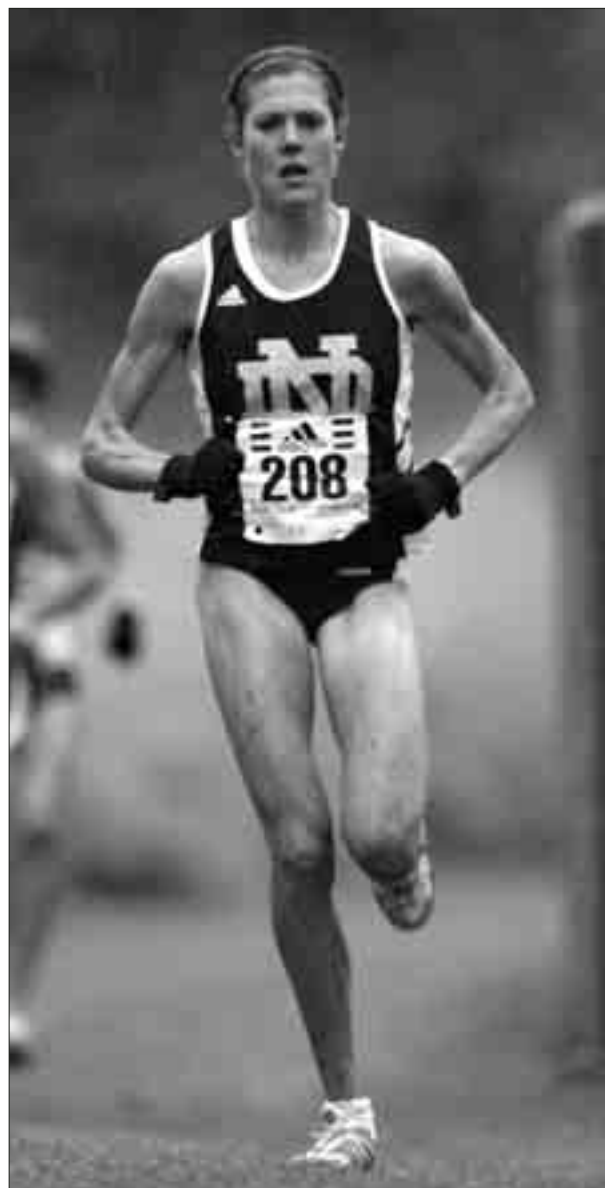

**AS A JUNIOR:** Capped another stellar cross country season in 2003 by becoming the first three-time All-American in Notre Dame women's cross country history ... finished 28th (20:35.6) at the NCAA Championship in Ames, IA ... helped the team finish 10th overall, the second-consecutive top-10 finish for the team at the NCAA Championship ... earned all-BIG EAST honors for the second consecutive season at the BIG

EAST Championship, finishing 14th overall as Notre Dame claimed its second-straight conference title ... ended up second in the Notre Dame Invitational, 12 seconds behind teammate Molly Huddle ... also competed at the Pre-National meet (19th) and the NCAA Great Lakes Regional (seventh) ... concentrated on the mile during the 2004 indoor track and field season ... claimed her second consecutive BIG EAST Championship in the indoor mile, finishing the race in 4:53.95 ... also

**AS A SOPHOMORE:** Carried over the momentum from an outstanding rookie season in 2001-02 to post one of the top second-year

campaigns in Notre Dame women's track and field history ... finished as an All-American in cross country and the indoor mile ... became the first Irish women's cross country runner to win the individual BIG EAST Championship, leading the Irish to their first team victory as well ... ended the season with three individual BIG EAST titles (cross country, indoor mile, distance medley relay) ... key member of Notre Dame's 2002 women's cross country team, which enjoyed its most successful ever ... began the cross country slate with a second-place effort in the adidas Invitational ... finished sixth in the highly-competitive Notre Dame Invitational ... made the trip to Terre Haute for the Pre-National meet, finishing sixth overall ... led Notre Dame's BIG EAST Champion cross country effort by finishing first in 20:23 ... ran well at the Great Lakes Regional, finishing third as Notre Dame claimed its first regional title ... second Irish harrier across the

finish line at the NCAA Cross Country Championship, finishing 19th to earn All-America honors ... Notre Dame finished third, its top finish in the program's history ... began the 2003 indoor season running the 800 meters against Western Michigan and Ball State, finishing second in 2:14.16 ... concentrated on the mile run for

most of the indoor slate, posting a blistering 4:38.37 at the Alex Wilson Invitational to qualify for the NCAA indoor meet ... claimed her first BIG EAST track and field individual title in the mile run, finishing in 4:46.90 ... also won a BIG

**AS A JUNIOR:** Did not compete during the 2004 track and field season to concentrate on volleyball.

**AS A JUNIOR MEMBER OF THE VOLLEYBALL TEAM:** One of Notre Dame's top offensive threats for the second straight season ... named honorable mention All-America by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) ... also garnered all-Northeast Region honors from the AVCA and was a second-team all-BIG EAST selection ... started all 30 matches and played in all 109 games ... played at opposite in every match before moving to middle blocker for the final two contests ... led team in kills (387/3.55) for second year in a row and was second in points (472.5/4.33) ... on Nov. 29 at Stanford, became the 14th player in Irish history to register 1,000 career kills ... set two Notre Dame records: consecutive matches with 10+ kills (21) and most kills in a match without an error (24) ... the former included the last six matches of 2002 and the initial 15 of '03 ... latter Irish record came on .571 hitting in three games vs. Valparaiso ... previous record was 23 by Jaimie Lee in 1995 ... missed ND record for kills in a three-game match by one ... a major reason Notre Dame led the nation in blocking (3.72) ... important in Irish defense that set school record for block average for second year in a row ... ranked eighth in conference — and fourth on Irish — in blocking (119/1.09) ... in BIG EAST matches, was among the league leaders in blocks (4th, 1.29), points (8th, 4.75), and kills (10th, 3.76) ... registered four double-doubles to bring career total to 12 ... joined Lauren Kelbley and Lauren Brewster to form the first Irish trio ever to have 350+ kills apiece in the same season

**AS A SOPHOMORE:** Continued her role as one of the top high jumpers for the Notre Dame women's track and field team ... became the first athlete in Notre Dame history to earn all-conference honors in two distinctly different sports (excluding indoor and outdoor track and field) ... broke through for her first individual BIG EAST Championship at the league outdoor meet in 2003, clearing 1.75m (5-8 3/4) to claim first place ... began the indoor season with a victory in the high jump vs. Western Michigan and Ball State ... came back the next weekend to win once again vs. Michigan State with a 1.75m (5-8 3/4) effort ... continued the win streak at the Meyo Invitational, clearing 5-7 3/4 to take first place in the competitive field ... finished second at the BIG EAST Indoor Championship with an impressive 1.79m (5-10 1/2) clearance ... has earned all-BIG EAST honors in all four conference high
