Notre Dame Women's Tennis All-Americans

In the 28 years of varsity competition, eight Irish women's tennis players have earned All-America honors. In 1982, Pam Fischette and Laura Lee became the program's first two All-Americans. To qualify for All-America honors in AIAW Division II (in which Notre Dame competed at the time), a player had to reach the title match at her position in the national championships.

Since becoming a Division I program in 1986, Notre Dame has had six players earn a total of 13 All-America honors. The All-America teams are selected by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) each year, with the governing body of collegiate tennis naming all players who meet at least one of three criteria in singles or doubles. In singles, an individual must 1) finish in the top 20 of the final ITA national singles rankings; 2) earn one of the 16 seeds in the NCAA Singles Championship; or 3) advance to the round of 16 in the NCAA Singles Championship. To earn All-America mention in doubles, a player must 1) finish in the top 10 of the final ITA national doubles rankings; 2) earn one of the eight seeds in the NCAA Doubles Championship; or 3) advance to the quarterfinals in the NCAA Doubles Championship.

The eight Irish All-Americans are featured below with their qualifying criteria and career stats noted.

Francis Patrick O'Connor Award

First presented in 1993, the Francis Patrick O'Connor Award is named in honor of a former Notre Dame wrestler who died in 1973 following his freshman year at Notre Dame. The award is presented upon nomination of head coaches and is given to one male and one female student-athlete who best display the total embodiment of the true spirit of Notre Dame as exemplified by their contribution and inspiration to their teams and possess such characteristics as caring, courage, confidence, encouragement, humility, honesty, humor, kindness, and patience. More women's tennis players have won the Francis Patrick O'Connor Award than student-athletes from any other sport, including three recipients since 2000.

The Kanaley Award



Byron V. Kanaley

The most prestigious honor awarded to a Notre Dame student-athlete, the Byron V. Kanaley Award has been presented each year since 1927 to senior monogram athletes who have been exemplary as students and leaders.

The awards, presented by the Faculty Board on Athletics, are named in honor of a 1904 Notre Dame graduate who was a member of the Irish baseball team as an undergraduate. Kanaley went on to a successful banking career in Chicago and served the University as a lay trustee from 1915 until his death in 1960. Six members of the Notre Dame women's tennis team have received the award since 1990, the most of any sport during that span.

Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament

The Notre Dame women's tennis team has a long tradition of postseason play, especially since the move to NCAA Division I in 1985-86. The Irish have advanced to the team portion of the NCAA Championships in 11 of the past 12 seasons, including nine in a row. Notre Dame has advanced to the round of 16 on five occasions, including an appearance in the national quarterfinals in 1996. Only once have the Irish failed to win a match in the NCAA tournament.

In its four seasons on the Division II level (1981-82 to 1984-85), Notre Dame was a national power, finishing among the top six in the nation in each campaign. In the final year of AIAW play, the Irish tied for sixth in the national championship in 1982. The following season saw Notre Dame lose to UC Davis in the national semifinals, but rebound to beat Northern Colorado for third place. In 1984, the Irish fell to Tennessee-Chattanooga in the semis, but gained revenge on UC Davis to again claim third place. Notre Dame's final season in Division II saw it reach the title match before losing to Tennessee-Chattanooga.

In their first national tournament experience, the Irish were 22nd in the 1979 AIAW Division III National Championship (played in the fall) before taking 20th in the following season.

Notre Dame players have been regular participants in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships since moving to the Division I level. The Irish have had at least one player earn a berth in the NCAA singles tournament in 15 of the last 17 seasons. On five occasions, a pair of Irish competitors earned invitations to the event. In 1992, Melissa Harris became the first Irish player to win a match in the NCAAAs. In her fourth consecutive singles appearance in 2001, current assistant coach Michelle Dasso

reached the semifinals, marking the best finish ever for an Irish player.

In doubles play, Wendy Crabtree and Lisa Tholen made history when they became the first Irish duo to play in the NCAAAs, in 1993. In '94, they advanced to the final eight to earn All-America honors. Jennifer Hall and Tiffany Gates matched Crabtree and Tholen with their '98 quarterfinal appearance, with Hall and Dasso also reaching the quarters in '99. Dasso made return trips to the tournament in 2000 and '01 with

Becky Varnum. The Irish have had at least one entrant in each of the NCAA Doubles Championship in 11 of the last 12 years.

In the early days of the program, the Irish excelled in the AIAW national championships. Laura Lee, just a freshman at the time, won the national title at No. 5 singles in 1982, while Pam Fischette was the runner-up at No. 3 singles the same year.

Irish Players in the Collegiate Grand Slam Events

The collegiate grand slam consists of the three most prestigious individual national tournaments in college tennis: the ITA All-American Championships (played in October), the National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships (played in November now after being a February event until 2001-02), and the year-end NCAA Championships. From 1986 until 2000-01, the September

National Clay Court Championships made up the fourth leg of the collegiate grand slam, but the event is no longer played.

Irish players have had considerable success in the collegiate grand slam events. Michelle Dasso reached at least the quarterfinals in each of the four events in 2000-01, highlighted by a runner-up finish in the Clay Court Championships. Jennifer Hall is the

only other player to reach the singles semifinals in a collegiate grand slam event, with her finish in the 1996 National Indoors. Dasso and Becky Varnum advanced to the semis of the 2001 tournament in doubles, while Wendy Crabtree and Lisa Tholen reached the same round in the 1993 All-Americans.

Conference Dominance

Following seven years competing as an independent, the University of Notre Dame women's tennis team has had incredible success in conference action over the past 21 years. The Irish have been league champions 17 times, including a streak of 14 consecutive conference titles from 1983-84 to 1996-97. Notre Dame won North Star Conference championships in each of its five years of membership (1983-84 to 1987-88), then captured seven Midwestern Collegiate Conference titles from 1988-89 to 1994-95. Since joining the BIG EAST Conference in 1995-96, Notre Dame has won five championships and finished as the league's runner-up on four occasions.

All 12 members of the BIG EAST Conference field teams in women's tennis, but the league does not require round-robin competition during the season. The top six teams, as selected by the conference based on national ranking and head-to-head results, earn invitations to the year-end BIG EAST Championship, a single-elimination team tournament with the top two seeds receiving byes and the winner gaining the league's automatic berth in the NCAA Championship. Prior to 2001, all 14 teams qualified for the con-

ference tournament, with the top two seeds gaining byes into the quarterfinals. For more information on the BIG EAST Conference, see page 96.

The Irish have faced now-departed Miami in the title match of the BIG EAST Championship in each of the last nine years, winning in 1996, '97, '99, 2001, and '03. In 14 early-round matches (first round-semifinals), Notre Dame is undefeated, having registered 13 shutouts. The Irish were the top seed heading into the tournament in every year but 2003, when they were the No. 2 seed. Notre Dame mentor Jay Louderback has been named the BIG EAST's Coach of the Year five times, while Irish student-athletes have been tabbed the league championship's Most Outstanding Player on three occasions.

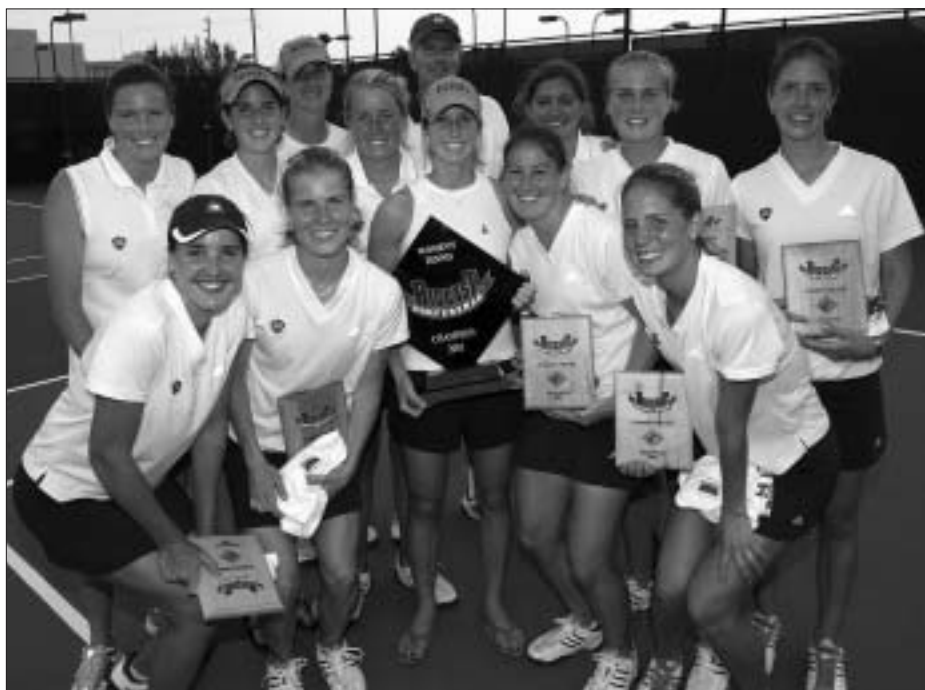

Notre Dame's Courtney Tennis Center, the home of Irish women's tennis since the establishment of the varsity program in 1980, has played host to the nation's top players on a number of occasions, while becoming an extremely difficult place for opposing teams to win.

Playing at both the Courtney Tennis Center and in the Eck Tennis Pavilion, the Irish have compiled an all-time home record of 235-56 for an impressive .806 winning percentage. Only once has Notre Dame had a losing home record, when it won just one of four matches at the Courtney Tennis Center in 1977, its second varsity season. The Irish have posted undefeated marks at home on six occasions: 12-0 in 1981; 6-0 in '82; 14-0 in '86; 8-0 in '89; 8-0 in '90; and 12-0 in 2000. Notre Dame has been beaten at home just once in six other campaigns.

Due to its exceptional facilities, Notre Dame has played host to a number of prestigious events, including serving as the national site of the NCAA Championships three times. Just four years after it was built, the Courtney Tennis Center played host to the 1971 NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Championships, which featured what is still considered by coaches to be the finest collection of collegiate tennis talent ever assembled. In that spring classic, freshman Jimmy Connors of UCLA defeated

Stanford's Roscoe Tanner in five sets to capture the singles title. That pair would go on to reach a combined 17 grand slam singles finals on the pro tour, including eight victories.

The NCAA men's tournament came to Notre Dame again in 1994, while the NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Championships were played at the Courtney Tennis Center in 1998. It still stands as the northern-most facility ever to play host to the NCAA women's tennis championships. Florida defeated Duke in the title match, while Blue Devil Vanessa Webb claimed the singles crown. In doubles, the California pair of Amanda Augustus and Amy Jenson won the first of their back-to-back NCAA doubles titles.

In all, the Courtney Tennis Center has played host to NCAA action on 10 occasions, including every year from 1994-2002 for either women's or men's play. In addition, it has played host to conference championships on nine occasions (three North Star, six Midwestern Collegiate), as well as an Intercollegiate Tennis Association Summer Circuit event for 10 straight years (1994-2003). During the early days of the program, Notre Dame played host to the Irish Invitational, a fall event, for 11 consecutive years from 1977-87.

The Irish played exclusively at the Courtney Tennis Center during their first 11 varsity seasons, compiling a 79-22 (.782) record. Since the Eck Tennis Pavilion was completed in 1988, it has become the predominant location of Notre Dame's home matches, while the Courtney Tennis Center has become a regular site for late-season matches and NCAA competition, as well as continuing to be an integral practice facility during both the fall and spring. The Irish have been particularly effective at the Courtney Tennis Center since '88, posting a 23-5 (.821) mark.

Notre Dame has put together a number of long winning streaks at home, highlighted by the school-record streak that saw the Irish win 25 in a row at the Courtney Tennis Center over a span of more than four years from 1979-83. Notre Dame won 23 straight from 1988-91, and, more recently, put together a 21-match regular-season home winning streak from 1999-2000.

On 21 occasions (in 45 matches), top-25 opponents have come to Notre Dame and left with a defeat. Among the biggest home wins have been four upsets of top-10 foes, including a 5-0 blanking of #8 Wake Forest in 2001. In all, the Courtney Tennis Center and Eck Tennis Pavilion have combined to play host to a showdown of top-25 teams 41 times, with the Irish prevailing on 18 occasions.

The Irish have been particularly dominant at home against teams not ranked in the national top 25, as Notre Dame holds a remarkable 122-7 (.946) mark since the 1988-89 season. That includes a current streak of 19 consecutive wins against non-top-25 foes at home, dating back to 2002.

Since opening in 1967, the Courtney Tennis Center has undergone a variety of improvements. Most recently, 14 of the courts were newly resurfaced during the summer of 2003 and the facility was reoriented in the winter of 2004 as construction began on the neighboring Guglielmino Family Athletics Center. That undertaking saw the con-

struction of a new tournament center tower, while the seating was moved from the west to the east end, which now plays host to varsity matches, making it more convenient for the teams headquartered in the Eck Tennis Pavilion. The reoriented Courtney Tennis Center, which features 14 courts, saw its first varsity action on April 15, 2003, when the Irish nearly pulled off an upset of #11 Northwestern before falling 4-3.

The home of Irish tennis for nearly 40 years, the construction of the Courtney Tennis Center was financed entirely by prominent Washington, D.C., attorney Jeremiah Courtney. The numerous courts and brand-new laykold surface make it a popular spot for students and faculty, as well as the varsity tennis teams. Courtney is a 1932 graduate of Columbia University, where he captained the tennis team. His two sons attended Notre Dame and played tennis under legendary coach Tom Fallon.

The first home of Irish tennis was the Notre Dame Fieldhouse, which played host to Irish home matches until the Courtney Tennis Center was built. The structure was razed in 1983. Indoor courts in Notre Dame's Joyce Center also were used sporadically before the Eck Tennis Pavilion's construction.

Since its completion in June of 1987, Notre Dame's Eck Tennis Pavilion has been an integral part of the success of Irish tennis, allowing the team to practice year-round, regardless of weather conditions, and providing an alternative surface to further develop the all-around skills of Notre Dame's players. Additionally, it has become an extremely difficult for opponents to be victorious and has attracted some of the top events in collegiate tennis.

Playing at both the Eck Tennis Pavilion and Courtney Tennis Center, the Irish have compiled an all-time home record of 232-56 for an impressive .806 winning percentage. Only once has Notre Dame had a losing home record, when it won just one of four matches at the Courtney Tennis Center in 1977, its second varsity season. The Irish have posted undefeated marks at home on six occasions: 12-0 in 1981; 6-0 in '82; 14-0 in '86; 8-0 in '89; 8-0 in '90; and 12-0 in 2000. Notre Dame has been beaten at home just once in six other campaigns. In 17 years of competition in the Eck Tennis Pavilion, Notre Dame has compiled a stellar 130-29 record, for a winning percentage of .818.

The combination of the Eck Tennis Pavilion and Courtney Tennis Center has allowed the University of Notre Dame to be the national site of the NCAA Championships. The NCAA men's tournament came to Notre Dame again in 1994, while the NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Championships were played at the Courtney Tennis Center in 1998. It still stands as the northern-most facility ever to play host to the NCAA women's tennis championships. Florida defeated Duke in the title match, while Blue Devil Vanessa Webb claimed the singles crown. In doubles, the California pair of Amanda Augustus and Amy Jenson won the first of their back-to-back NCAA doubles titles.

In all, Notre Dame has played host to NCAA action on 10 occasions, including every year from 1994-2002 for either women's or men's play.

In addition, the Eck Tennis Pavilion has three times welcomed the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's Midwest Region Indoor Championships and six times helped play host to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference Championship. After its completion, the facility played host to the Eck Classic for 15 consecutive years and also has provided additional courts for the men's Tom Fallon Invitational.

The summer of 2003 saw the Eck Tennis Pavilion newly renovated, as all six courts were resurfaced (changing them from red to green) and the color scheme was changed to blue and gold throughout the building. Among the other highlights were numerous pieces of new wood furniture, as well as additional trophy cases and other accessories. The facility features the offices for both the men's and women's tennis coaches, as well as locker rooms for both teams, and a spacious spectator viewing area upstairs that is ideally suited for videotaping.

"It is truly one of the great collegiate indoor tennis facilities in the country," says Irish head coach Jay Louderback.

In Sept. 1988, the Eck Pavilion received the 1988 United States Tennis Association (USTA) Award for architectural design. As a result, the USTA presented the facility with a handsome wooden plaque, a large sign placed in front of the pavilion and a complimentary one-year membership in the USTA. In addition, the facility and its award are recognized in an inscription on a large mahogany board displayed in the lobby of the USTA National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadow, N.Y.

The facility was underwritten by Franklin E. Eck. He is chairman and chief executive officer of Advanced Drainage Systems, Inc., which produces corrugated plastic drainage pipe for agricultural and commercial purposes. A 1944 chemical engineering graduate at Notre Dame, Eck earned an M.B.A. from Harvard University in 1949. In 1984, he endowed a collection in Notre Dame's Hesburgh Library. The generosity of Eck also made Notre Dame's baseball facility, Frank Eck Stadium, and the Eck Visitor's Center possible.

The Eck Tennis Pavilion is the third facility to play host to indoor Irish tennis action. The Notre Dame Fieldhouse, which was razed in 1983, was the first home of Notre Dame's varsity team, and the Irish also sporadically used courts in the Joyce Center.
