### Top Returning Players

**Jen Buczkowski** (Sr., M; Elk Grove, IL) – among final-15 candidates for '05 Hermann Trophy, also NSCAA 3rd team All-American and BIG EAST midfielder of the year (6th on team with 21 pts/7G-7A, 2 GWG, 27 GP/23 GS) ... member of U.S. U-21 National Team (starter on '05 Nordic Cup champs) ... strong Academic All-American candidate, twice named Academic All-District (3.39 cum. GPA, marketing major) ... composed central midfielder who was '04 NSCAA 3rd team All-American and 1st team all-BIG EAST (also Freshman All-American) ... directed '05 ND offense that led nation in goals (110; 4.4/gm) and goal margin (95; +3.8/gm), trailed in just three of 25 games (153 min.) and owned commanding edge in shots (572-124; 22.9-5.0), shots on goal (307-54; 12.3-2.2) and corners (176-43; 7.0-1.7) ... 18th in nation with 11A in '04 ... has played every game of her ND career (76 GP/71 GS), totaling 62 pts (19G-24A) while helping Irish go 67-7-2 in the '03-'05 seasons (ND has yet to be outshot in a game during her career).

**Kerri Hanks** (So., F; Allen, TX) – among final-15 candidates for '05 Hermann Trophy, also NSCAA 2nd team All-American, BIG EAST rookie of year and *Soccer Buzz* national rookie of year (28G-15A/71 pts, 6 GWG, 25 GP/22 GS) ... tied teammate Katie Thorlakson for 2nd among nation's '05 points leaders (2nd pair of teammates in D-I history with 70-plus), one shy of ND record (72) ... also 3rd nationally with 28 goals (18th in NCAA history; 4th-most ever by D-I freshman; tied ND record) ... she and Thorlakson were nation's only players in '05 with 15G-15A ... her 135 shots were more than ND allowed (124) in entire '05 season ... tied ND record for goals in game (4, vs. Vermont) ... has played with U.S. U-21 and U-19 national teams ... 2004 signee who did not play for ND in '04 due to U-19 World Champ. ... two-year prep All-American and member of U.S. U-19 Nat'l Team (12G-2A, 12 GP in '04) ... earned U.S. Youth Soccer Golden Boot Award with Dallas Texans '03 national champs and '05 runner-up ... 47G in two seasons at Allen HS ('01-'02).

**Christie Shaner** (Sr., D; Ambler, PA) – three-time all-BIG EAST selection (2nd team in '03 and '05; 3rd team in '04) while splitting time in her career at central defense and left back ... previous Academic All-District pick who will be top candidate for All-America honors in 2006 (3.44 cum. GPA, as design major) ... logged all 25 games in '05 (24 GS, 5A) ... helped '04 national champs allow just 14 goals and 71 shots on goal in 27 GP (0.51 GAA, 2.6 SOG/gm) ... named 2003 BIG EAST rookie of the year ... invited to U.S. under-21 camp ('04) ... career stats: 3G-8A (14 pts), 75 GP/69 GS ... hard tackler who reads game well, with strong leftfooted service.

**Kim Lorenzen** (Sr., D; Naperville, IL) – team captain who boasts athleticism for multiple positions, with fitness to play outside back ('03, '04 starter at right back) while also logging time at central defense for most of 2005 season ... missed six games in '05 due to illness (19 GP/18 GS) ... provides quality service from the flank ... helped '04 national champs post 16 shutouts ... Academic All-America candidate with 3.43 cumulative GPA (finance major) ... career: 3G-4A (10 pts), 69 GP/59 GS.

**Jill Krivacek** (Sr., M; Geneva, IL) – standout 5-foot-10 defensive midfielder who earned 3rd team all-BIG EAST honors in 2004 (1G-2A, 27 GP/23 GS) and was defensive MVP of the 2005 BIG EAST Tournament (2G-4A; 18 GP/12 GS, missed 7 games due to injury) ... her last-minute goal beat Wisconsin in '04 NCAAAs (1-0) ... career stats: 5G-9A (19 pts), 68 GP/41 GS.

**Amanda Cinalli** (Jr., F; Maple Heights, OH) – played with U.S. U-21 National Team that was runner-up at 2006 Nordic Cup ... 3rd team all-BIG EAST in 2005, ranking 5th nationally in assists (17) and 3rd in BIG EAST with 37 points (10 goals, 25 GP/20 GS) ... has totaled 62 career points at ND (20G-22A) ... earned Freshman All-America (*Soccer America*), 1st team all-BIG EAST in '04 (10G-5A, 4 GWG) ... two-year prep All-American, member of U.S. U-17 Nat'l Team ... strong frontrunner with scoring flair.

**Brittany Bock** (So., M/D; Naperville, IL) – longtime member of U.S. youth soccer national-team program, including spot on U-20 National Team that will play in Russia at 2006 U-20 World Championship ... named 2nd team all-BIG EAST in 2005 (12G-9A, 24 GP/17 GS) ... Academic All-America candidate (3.45 cum. GPA) ... 4-year NSCAA All-American, 2-time *Parade* All-American ... Golden Boot Award (top scorer) for Illinois '03 ODP national champs ('05 runner-up) ... helped Windy City Pride reach '02 national finals and F.C. Indiana win '05 WPSL/Open Cup titles ... combines physical play with great poise on the ball and passing ability, plus rocket shot.

**Carrie Dew** (So., D; Encinitas, CA) – member of U.S. Under-20 National Team that will play in Russia at 2006 U-20 World Championship ... starter at central D in '05, earning honorable mention all-BIG EAST and leading team with 2,097 minutes /avg. 84 per game (3G, 25 GS) ... Academic All-America candidate (3.33 cum. GPA) ... 4-year NSCAA youth All-American ... won national titles as captain with San Diego Surf and Cal-South ODP ... played with U.S. U-16 and U-17 teams and USASA U-23 National Select Team ... 5-foot-9 player with strong play in the air.

### **Top Newcomers** (all freshmen)

**Courtney Rosen** (M; Brecksville, OH/Hathaway Brown HS; U.S. U-17s/ Internationals/ODP Region II) – NSCAA All-American in all four of her HS seasons (plus two on youth level) ... member of the U.S. U-17 and U-16 national teams and ODP Region II since 2000 ... led Ohio North ODP to 3rd at '03 nationals ... helped Internationals reach USYS Region II semifinals in '06 (lost to Eclipse team that includes two ND teammates) ... played with W-League's Cleveland Internationals in '04-'06 summers ... totaled 101G-51A in first three prep seasons (22G-12A on state champs as junior) ... two-time Ohio player of the year ... "Ohio High Magazine" woman of the year.

**Michele Weissenhofer** (F; Naperville, IL/Neuqua Valley HS; Eclipse Select/ODP Region II) – A 2004 NSCAA All-American and two-time EA Sports All-American ('04, '05) ... top scorer for Chicago-based Eclipse team that won US Youth Soccer national title in 2004 (U-16) and '05 (U-17) before finishing 3rd in '06 (U-18) ... played for ODP Region II team in '03, member of Illinois ODP since '01 ... helped lead Illinois to '05 ODP national finals ... member of Neuqua Valley HS state champs in '05 (27-2-1; dnp HS soccer in '06), tying for team lead with 26 goals (3 in title game) ... her uncle Ron Weissenhofer ('87) was a top linebacker with ND football team in mid-80s.

**Haley Ford** (M/D; Midland, TX/Midland HS; Dallas Texans/ODP Region III) – Helped Dallas Texans win U-18 national title (starter at central D) ... member of ODP Region III team since '02 (North Texas ODP since 2000) ... member of North Texas team that placed 3rd at '04 nationals ... captain of Texans squad ... played three seasons at Midland HS, earning all-district honors in '04.

**Amanda Clark** (M/D; Naperville, IL Neuqua Valley HS; Eclipse Select/ODP Region II) – Defensive midfielder who earned all-state honors as senior at Neuqua Valley HS while helping Eclipse finish 3rd at '06 USYS Nationals (U-18; national champs in '04 and '05 for U-16 and U-17) ... she and ND classmate Michele Weissenhofer were teammates at NVHS and with the Eclipse ... member of ODP Region II since '04 (Illinois ODP since '01) ... helped lead Illinois to '05 ODP national finals (alongside future ND teammates Weissenhofer and Brittany Bock, who also played at NVHS) ... member of NVHS state champs in '05 (27-2-1), earning all-state honors.

**Kelsey Lysander** (G; San Diego, CA/Rancho Bernardo HS; San Diego Surf/ODP Region IV) – Key member of '06 San Diego Surf team that won Cal-South and Region IV titles to advance to four-team USYS Nationals (U-18) ... 5-foot-10 'keeper who named '06 NSCAA All-American ... has played with ODP Region IV since '04 (Cal-South ODP since '02) ... four-year starter and two-year captain at Rancho Bernardo HS (1st team all-state as junior) ... father Rick Lysander pitched in Major Leagues with Oakland and Minnesota.

### **Top Players Lost** (2006 graduates; Chapman was fifth-year player)

**Katie Thorlakson** (F; Langley, British Columbia) – one of three finalists for '05 Hermann Trophy, consensus 1st team All-American and repeat BIG EAST offensive player of year (BE Tournament off. MVP) ... led nation in assists during '04 (24) and '05 (35; 2n in NCAA history); 2nd player in NCAA history with 23-plus assists in multiple seasons ... 2nd nationally with 71 pts in '05 (one shy of ND record) ... only player in nation during '05 with at least 16 goals and 16 assists (18G-35A; 11th on NCAA goals list) ... scored/assisted on more goals (53) than any other D-I player in '05 ... ended career with ND-record 14-game point streak (9G-22A) ... set ND records for career points in postseason (53; 15G-23A) and career gamewinning points (45; 17 GWG-22 GWA) ... 6th in ND history with 183 career points (55G-73A, 2nd in assists and 8th in goals ... 17th D-I player ever to reach 50G-50A in career ... played all 95 games of career, 5th-longest streak of consecutive GP in ND history ... helped Irish go 47-4-1 in '04 and '05 (tying best two-year ND win total) ... totaled 23G-24A in '04 (UNC's Mia Hamm, in '92, is only player ever to post more goals and more assists in same season) ... set ND record for points in season opener (8; 2G-4A vs. UNH in '05) ... holds ND records for points in game (10; 4G-2A in '04 BIG EAST quarterfinal vs. St. John's) and points vs. top-25 team (8; 3G-2A vs. #4 Santa Clara in '04) ... led Irish to '04 national title (College Cup MVP) ... top '04 honors included national player of year from *Soccer America*, *SI on Campus* and *Soccer Buzz* ... one of five nominees (only soccer player) for ESPN's ESPY "best female college athlete" of '04-'05 ... first ND player ever to score/assist on team's first five goals in game ('04 opener vs. Baylor; 2G-3A), again vs. Santa Clara in '04 (3G-2A) and went one better with G/A on first six goals in '04 vs. St. John's (4G-2A) ... set ND record for points in one postseason (27 in '04; 9G-9A, 9 GP) ... member of Canadian National Team ... 5-foot-3 sparkplug who coupled great finishing and playmaking.

**Candace Chapman** (Sr., F/D; Ajax, Ontario) –NSCAA 2nd team All-American as a sophomore right back in '02, missed '03 due to injury, made shift to forward in '04 and ended career as an NSCAA 3rd team All-American in '05 (right back) ... one of two defenders among final-15 candidates for '05 Hermann Trophy ... '05 BIG EAST defensive player of the year, repeating honor she earned in '02 ... 2nd team Academic All-District pick in '05 (3.32 cum. GPA; double major in sociology/computer applications) ... led '05 defense that finished 16th in nation with 0.60 goals-against avg., plus 17 shutouts (2nd in nation) ... '05 defense allowed just 54 shots on goal (2.16/gm) ... third BIG EAST player ever to repeat as defensive player of year ... fourth ND player to be all-BIG EAST four times (1st team in '01, '02 and '04; 3rd team in '04) ... 3rd on '05 team with 1,760 minutes played (70/gm) ... 9th on '05 team with 13 pts (2G-9A) ... 4th among '05 BIG EAST player in assists ... starter with Canadian National Team ... 20th ND player to reach 20G-20A in career (20G-24A), in 92 GP/80 GS ... ended career playing in 52 consecutive games (32 straight starts) ... one of two ND players to start every game in '05 (25) ... 2nd-leading scorer for '04 NCAA champs (12G-8A; ND record 27 GP) ... scored gamewinning goals in '04 NCAAAs vs. UConn (2-0) and Santa Clara (1-0, semifinal) ... named to '04 College Cup all-tournament team ... '05 team co-captain ... combined physical presence with strong marking skills, ability on the ball and scoring punch.

**Erika Bohn** (Sr., G; Brookfield, CT) – One of six D-I players ever named CoSIDA Academic All-American three times (2nd team in '03; 1st team in '04 and '05) ... one of three ND student-athletes ever to be three-year Acad. All-American ... grad. with 3.72 cum. GPA (art studio major) ... 3rd team all-BIG EAST selection in '05 who missed half of season due to injury before posting 0.70 goals-against avg. in 17 GP/15 GS (13-2-0 record, 17 saves, 9 GA) ... 2nd in ND history for career wins (66-13-2) and 'keeper starts (80), 3rd in minutes (6,788) ... made late penalty-kick save and two more in shootout of '04 NCAA final v. UCLA (College Cup defensive MVP) ... member of U.S. U-21 National Team ('05 Nordic Cup champs) ... led nation in '04 GAA (0.41) before posting 3.80 GPA in '04 fall term ... logged 967-minute shutout streak in '03 (5th in NCAA history) ... 5th in nation with 0.49 GAA in '03 ... NSCAA 2nd team all-region in '03 ... athletic 6-foot frame with strong play in the air.

**Annie Scheffer** (Sr., M; Yakima, WA) – Two-time Academic All-American (2nd team in '04, 1st team '05), graduating with 3.81 cum. GPA as double major in psychology and pre-professional studies ... appeared in all 25 games during '05 season (17 GS) as team's 8th-highest scorer (17 pt; 4G-9A) ... played all 76 games in '03-'05 (12G-21A/45 points, 58 GS), with Irish going 68-6-2 in that stretch (dnp in '02 due to injury) ... helped win '04 NCAA title before posting 3.72 GPA in '04 fall semester... former member of U.S. Under-19 National Team ... co-captain of '05 team ... 5th-leading scorer on '04 NCAA title team (4G-7A) ... key set-play performer with great soccer sense.
