## SEASON IN REVIEW



*Stephen Bass was the 17th different Notre Dame men's tennis player to be tabbed an All-American after his brilliant senior season in 2007. Bass went 36-11, was named the BIG EAST Performer of the Year, spent most of the year ranked among the top 10 in the country and earned the prestigious ITA/John Van Nostrand Memorial Award.*

off #62 Ryan Heller of Michigan, 2-6, 6-3, 6-3, and #109 Maciek Sykut of Florida State, 6-2, 6-2 ... clinched Notre Dame's berth into the NCAA Tournament round of 16 with a victory over Brett Joelson of Texas A&M (7-6 [5], 6-4) ... went 13-2 indoors, 3-4 in tie breakers, 16-14 in close sets, 16-0 when winning the first set, 8-5 outdoors, 11-3 in close matches, 8-1 at home and 9-3 against the Midwest Region.

**ASA SOPHOMORE:** One of team's top doubles players once again in 2004-05, boasting the team's best record in partnered play (20-13) ... in dual action, went 16-9; 10-8 at No. 1 with Brent D'Amico and 6-1 at No. 2 with Barry King ...

led Irish with seven clinching victories, including 4-1 record as the last match on court with the doubles point still undecided ... tabbed to BIG EAST all-tournament team with King ... went 10-10 overall with D'Amico and they were ranked 15th in Midwest Region ... won in final match on court to give Irish the doubles point against Indiana and #2 Virginia ... also clinched doubles point in 4-3 win over William & Mary ... other big victories came against Florida State and Northwestern ... finished spring with King, making No. 2 a strength for the Irish ... they won in final match on court to clinch doubles point against SMU and Ball State ... also won in tiebreaker against Michigan and provided team's lone doubles victory in the NCAA tournament against Louisville ... only defeat came in 9-7 match against Ohio State ... went 4-4 during the fall, playing with four different partners ... withdrew from ITA Midwest Championships due to injury ... was 8-6 in singles, including 4-3 in dual action ... was 1-0 at No. 3, 2-1 at No. 5, and 1-2 at No. 6 ... had victory at No. 6 in Notre Dame's 4-3 win over eventual NCAA quarterfinalist Florida State ... dropped three-set matches in close Irish defeats against Boise State and SMU ... won against Toledo in first career appearance at No. 3 ... posted 4-3 mark in fall action ... dropped first two matches of season in match tiebreakers ... was 6-2 indoors and 2-4 outside ... posted 4-1 mark vs. the Midwest Region and 11-4 in close sets (6-4, 7-5, 7-6).

**AS A FRESHMAN:** Earned a spot in both Irish lineups, playing mostly No. 1 doubles and No. 6 singles ... despite struggling with recurring injuries, finished 13-7 in singles, including 7-5 in dual play ... in doubles, was 18-14 overall with four different partners, as well as 10-11 in dual matches, and 7-9 at No. 1 ... was ranked as high as 14th nationally in doubles, becoming just the second Notre Dame rookie (also five-time All-American David DiLucia in 1989) to do so ... paired with Luis Haddock to reach the title match of the ITA Midwest Championships before losing to Illinois' Michael Calkins and Chris Martin ... upset #42 Scott Green/Ross Wilson of Ohio State in the semifinals ... split two matches in the season-opening Rice

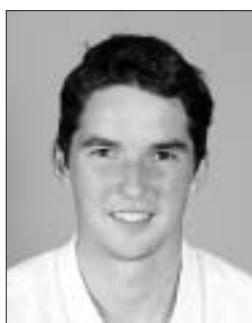
Crowne Plaza Invitational and lost 8-6 at No. 2 in the final match on court in an exhibition match against USC ... 6-3 fall record allowed the pair to vault into the national rankings at 18th ... beat Indiana at No. 1 in the spring opener before losing close matches to the top two doubles teams in the country and then being split up ... teamed with D'Amico and went 7-3 before losing five straight ... top victory was an 8-6 upset of #26 Joey Atas and Jeremy Wurtzman of Ohio State in the last match on court to give Irish a 1-0 lead in the match ... that started a four-match winning streak that included two more clinching victories and vaulted them into the national rankings at 44th ... dropped decision in final contest on court in three straight matches ... in early April, began pairing with Paul Hidaka, after that duo had been victorious against Illinois State at No. 1

earlier in the spring ... won at No. 3 against Florida State, but then had to team with Stephen Bass for both matches in the BIG EAST Championship due to team illness, registering a pair of key victories ... lost with Hidaka in the first round of the NCAA tournament ... started spring at No. 6 in singles lineup, but injuries kept him out of action at various times and hurt him on the court, as he lost four of his first five in dual-match play ... in only match at No. 4, won against Saint Joseph's ... in final two months of the regular season, won six of seven matches ... was struck by illness which prevented him from playing singles in the BIG EAST tournament.

**IN NON-COLLEGIATE ACTION:** Advanced to doubles semifinals in 2005 ITA National Summer Championships, playing with Ashwin Kumar of Harvard ... won a match in singles before losing a match tiebreaker to the tournament's third seed, Robert Cameron of Tennessee ... played in summer circuit event at Notre Dame in '03, winning the doubles title with Matthew Scott and reaching singles semifinals.

## HIGH SCHOOL AND PERSONAL DATA:

Won Indiana state singles title in fall of 2002 ... won 6-0, 6-0 in final over player who eliminated him in '01 to finish 26-0 and become first state champ from South Bend since 1993 ... played No. 4 on the Midwest team that won the '02 National Junior Davis Cup Championship ... ranked 46th in USTA 18-and-under listing, including 18th among players who entered college in '03 ... was ranked as high as 30th ... won Winter Super National doubles title in 16s ... lost only five times in high school ... three-time regional champion and all-state honoree ... earned All-America honors as a senior ... brother Jeff played tennis at Dayton and sister Carrie was a diver at Indiana ... continues long tradition of Irish varsity athletes from St. Joseph's High School ... born Sept. 2, 1984, in South Bend, Ind. ... graduated from the Mendoza College of Business as a marketing major.

**AS A SENIOR:** Put together the best year of his career and one of top seasons in school history ... went 33-8 overall in singles and 22-4 in dual matches ... the 33 victories rank tied for the 10th most in single-season Irish history ... also broke the school record for most doubles victories in a single-season ... went 33-10 in doubles, surpassing the previous mark of 32 held by Casey Smith (2002) and Javier Taborga (2002) ... became the first player in Notre Dame men's tennis history to register a 30-30 season (30+ wins in singles and doubles) ... recorded a combined record of 66-18 ... the 66 combined wins are the second-most in single-season school history ... only David DiLucia's 67 (46 in singles, 21 in doubles) combined victories is higher ... also established new single-season school records in doubles-point clinching wins (11) and combined clinching wins (17) ... finished career with a record of 90-37, good for 12th on the all-time Irish win list ... registered 68 career singles dual match victories, tied for 10th best ... shares the school record with Stephen Bass for match-clinching victories (14) ... went 1-0 (No. 3), 13-3 (No. 4) and 8-1 (No. 5) ... knocked off a pair of ranked opponents, including #66 Denes Lukacs of Baylor and #120 Will Gray of Tulsa ... captured 19 of his last 21 matches of the season ... opened the year with five consecutive wins, including a perfect 4-0 mark at the Tom Fallon Invitational ... clinched the 5-2 victory over #8 Illinois with a triumph over Marc Spicijaric ... went 10-0 overall with Andrew Roth in doubles, including 9-0 at No. 3 ... went 20-9 overall

with Brett Helgeson in doubles, including 12-6 at No. 2.

**AS A JUNIOR:** Provided experience in the middle of the Irish lineup ... recorded a 14-8 overall singles record, all coming in dual action ... was 5-2 at No. 3, 2-3 at No. 4 and 7-3 at No. 5 ... moved into the national rankings for the second time in his career on March 7 (106th) ... opened the dual season with three consecutive victories, including a three-set triumph over #54 Rylan Rizza of Virginia, 6-3, 6-7, 6-1 ... put together a career-best five-match winning streak that was snapped in the Blue-Gray Classic final against Sergi Arumi of VCU ... led all three matches in the BIG EAST Championship, but each went undecided ... went 8-5 indoors, 2-4 in tie breakers, 8-13 in close sets, 14-3 when winning the first set, 6-3 outdoors, 5-6 in close matches, 6-2 at home and 6-3 against the Midwest Region ... went 11-10 in doubles action, all in dual format ... teamed up with six different Irish players, mostly with classmate Ryan Keckley ... went 5-5 at No. 1 doubles with Keckley ... went 4-1 with Sheeva Parbhu at No. 2 doubles ... he and Keckley were ranked as high as #20 ... ranked in seven of the 10 polls a year ago ... Keckley and King posted an 8-4 victory over then #1-ranked Raian Luchi and Brad Pomeroy of North Carolina on Feb. 4 ... that was the first time an Irish doubles team had knocked off the nation's top-ranked squad since Feb. 18, 1993, when Chuck Coleman and Will Forsyth prevailed 8-3 against Anders Eriksson and Trey Phillips of Texas.

**AS A SOPHOMORE:** Broke through to be one of Notre Dame's most-consistent winners and top clutch players in 2004-05 ... posted 26-10 record, including 19-7 in dual action – the second-most wins on the Irish ... was 5-3 at No. 2 and 14-4 at No. 3 ... ranked for most of the spring, peaking at 100th ... slipped out of final rankings, but was listed 12th in the Midwest Region ... posted 5-2 record in three-set matches, including 4-2 with the dual-match outcome still undetermined ... was named to BIG EAST all-tournament team in both singles and doubles ... following first-year struggles, broke through in doubles to post 15-13 record ... was 10-9 in dual action (6-1 at No. 2, 4-8 at No. 3) ... notched five clinching victories in both singles (shared team lead) and doubles ... posted a pair of singles victories at No. 3 with the score tied 3-3 during the Blue-Gray National Tennis Classic ... won 3-6, 6-1, 6-1 over Colin O'Brien

of William & Mary in opening round and two days later beat Ben Harknett of Rice 6-3, 6-7, 6-1 ... also won three-setter against Matias Silva in ND's 4-3 defeat against Boise State in the quarterfinals ... lost 7-5, 7-5 to #52 Devin Mullings of Ohio State at No. 2 with 3-3 score in that match ... clinched Notre Dame's 1,000th all-time victory with 6-4, 7-6 (7-0) win over Geoff Boyd at No. 3 in 5-2 upset of #18 North Carolina ... came through in ND's only two-match losing streak, defeating #53 Roger Gubser of Texas and #106 Stephen Amritraj from #9 Duke, both in straight sets at No. 3 ... other notable victories came against Northwestern, Michigan State, and Michigan ... was only Irish player to post singles victories in both matches of BIG EAST tournament ... paired with four different partners in doubles ... finished spring with Keckley, making No. 2 a strength for the Irish ... they won in final match on court to clinch doubles point against SMU and Ball State ... also won in tiebreaker against Michigan and provided ND's lone doubles victory in the NCAA tournament



against Louisville ... only defeat came in 9-7 match against Ohio State ... played most of the spring with Stephen Bass, going 6-7 overall and 4-6 in dual matches ... lost 9-7 in final match on court against Duke ... clinched doubles point against North Carolina ... played twice at No. 3 with Patrick Buchanan ... teamed with Parbhu in fall, going 2-3 (they played together in the ITA Midwest Championships) ... in doubles, posted 9-6 record outdoors, compared to 6-10 inside ... won Olen Parks Award for having the best personality on the Irish.

#### AS A FRESHMAN:

Immediately stepped into the Irish singles lineup and provided a boost in the bottom half ... finished 17-11, including 13-8 in dual matches, mostly at No. 5 ... was 9-5 at No. 5, 3-3 at No. 4, and 1-0 at No. 3 ... won six of his first eight matches in the spring ... had key three-set wins against Indiana and Illinois State in helping Irish to victories ... also won in three against Adel Abbas of Virginia Tech in 4-3 Notre Dame defeat ... in only match at No. 3, won against Saint Joseph's ... clinched Irish upset of #30

Fresno State in the Blue-Gray National Classic ... entered NCAA tournament on a five-match winning streak ... had late start in the fall due to some injuries ... went 3-1 in the adidas Invitational and lost at No. 4 against USC in exhibition match ... won one match in the ITA Midwest Championships before losing to #62 Michael Calkins of Illinois ... went 5-2 in three-set matches and was 14-2 when taking the opening set ... struggled in doubles action, losing in all seven of his matches (all dual) ... played five times with classmate Stephen Bass, but could do no better than a tiebreaker defeat against SMU ... played twice with Paul Hidaka.

#### IN NON-COLLEGIATE

**ACTION:** Had outstanding summer of 2004 ... paired with Colin O'Brien of William & Mary to win the Irish Close doubles championship, defeating Tom Hamilton, formerly a national top-five doubles player at Arkansas, in the final ... reached semifinals of Irish Close singles

tournament, falling to eventual champion Peter Clarke, who was ranked among the top 400 in the world ... defeated Conor Taylor, formerly North Carolina State's No. 1 player who was ranked as high as 36th in the nation, twice in the semifinals of tournaments in Ireland ... played his way into a wild card while qualifying at the Peoria, Ill., futures in 2005, but could not participate due to summer school.
