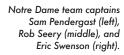
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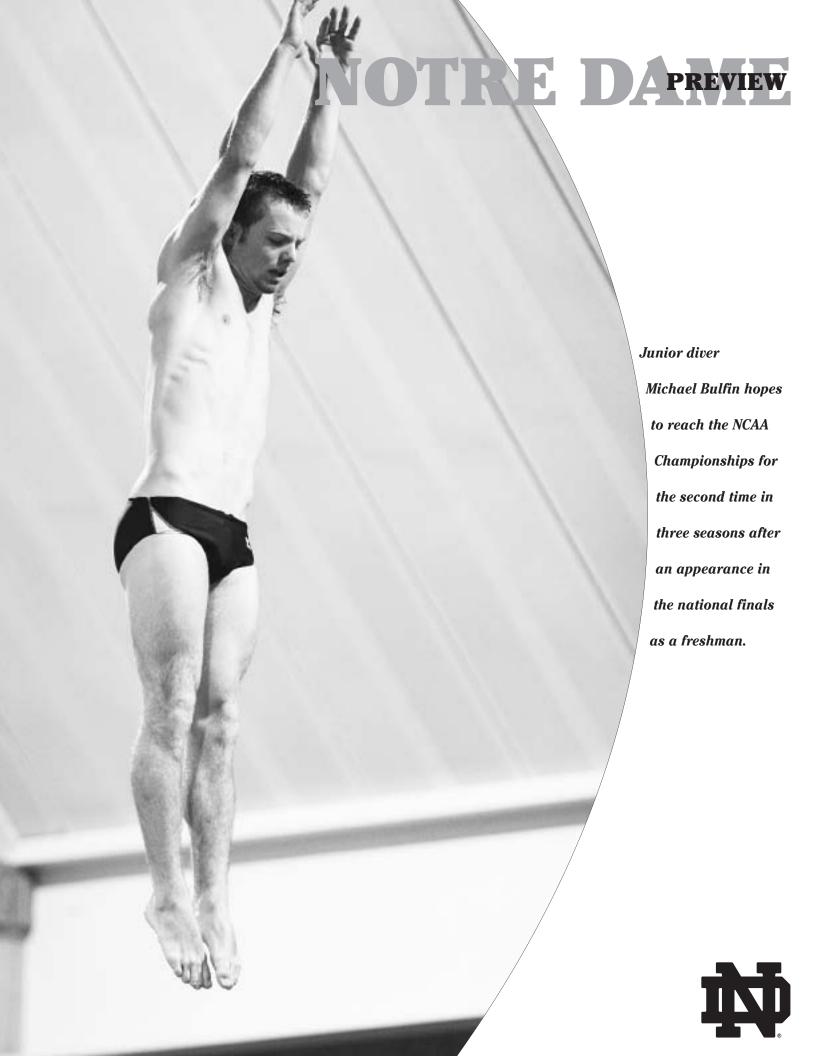

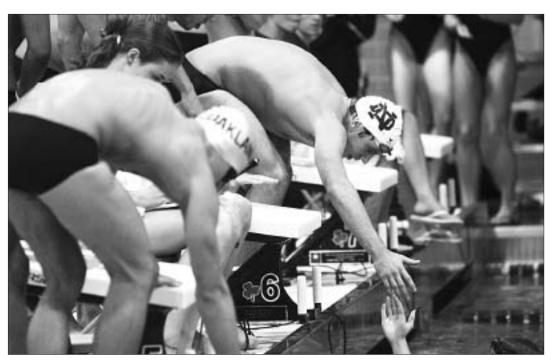
Strong Senior Class to Pave Way for Young Irish Squad

Irish underclassmen expected to replicate success of predecessors

After a runner-up finish in last season's BIG EAST Conference Championships, the University of Notre Dame men's swimming and diving team enters the upcoming season with the gut and determination to make it back to the top of the podium just as the squad did in 2005 and 2006.

Though several school records fell to the wayside and the program peaked at No. 16 – the highest ranking ever for the program – in the College Swim Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) dual-meet poll, being denied a third-straight BIG EAST title as West Virginia edged out the Irish, 765.5-761, may be the only thing lingering in the minds of this year's team.

Head coach Tim Welsh returns 23 letterwinners and welcomes 15 freshmen to the latest edition of Irish swimming and diving, which also features eight all-BIG EAST performers from last year's team that finished with an 11-3 dual meet record.



Seven school record holders on the swimming side and a pair of record-holding divers return for the 2007-08 season with the hopes of leading the Irish to their third BIG EAST crown since 2005.

THE CAPTAINS

Leading the charge for the infantry are team captains Eric Swenson, Rob Seery, Sam Stoner and Sam Pendergast.

Penderast earned all-BIG EAST honors in the 200 Medley Relay and 400 Medley Relay in last season's conference meet. He also holds three of the top-10 fastest times ever clocked at Notre Dame in the 100 Breast. Stoner joins fellow all-leaguer Seery (1,650 Free) and Swenson to round out the leading corps.

THE RETURNERS

This season's squad features seven individuals that hold or share school records, including 500, 1,000, and 1,650 Free title carrier Jay Vanden Berg and two-event champion John Lytle (100 Free, 200 Free).

That pair joins Jeff Wood, Andrew Hoffman, Michael Bulfin, Pendergast, Sam

Stoner, and Seery as Notre Dame's eight all-BIG EAST competitors from the 2006-07 season.

Three returning divers made it to the NCAA Zone C Diving Championships last season, as Michael Bulfin placed fifth off the three-meter board, while teammates Sam Stoner and Steven Crowe finished 11th and 18th, respectively.

Bulfin, who qualified for the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships in 2005, fell short of returning to the meet one season later. He totaled 339.90 points during the three-meter prelims, which placed him second heading into the finals. He registered 312.20 in the afternoon's finals to finish with 652.10 points and in fifth place. His fourth-place finish off the three-meter in 2006 is what gave him a berth into the national meet. He totaled 634.40 points off the three-meter board at last season's Zone Championship.

Stoner was third going into the final round after totaling 337.15 points in the prelims of the 3-meter competition. He posted 277.00 points in the finals to place 11th with a combined total of 614.15 points.

Crowe had 272.00 points after the prelims and registered 277.45 points during the finals for a 549.45 total.

"I feel better about heading into this season than I've ever felt before," said diving coach Caiming Xie, who was the 2007 BIG EAST Men's Diving Coach of the Year. "Our men know what it takes to get to the NCAAs, and they are dedicated and disciplined enough to reach their goals."

THE NEWCOMERS

The incoming freshman class was ranked nationally according CollegeSwimming.com, labeled by Welsh to be "large, fast, versatile, and exiting."

"Coming as it does on the heels of a large and fast senior class that is graduating, we are eager for this class to arrive and we welcome them with very high expectations," he added. "This is a class that can make significant contributions to our team immediately."

The class features one Olympic Trials qualifier and four U.S. National qualifiers. In addition, the Fighting Irish will be welcoming in 10 Junior National qualifiers and five state champions. Five of the newcomers were listed among the top 100 recruits of this class according to CollegeSwimming.com. Joshua Nosal (55), Michael Sullivan (74), Steven Brus (78), Christopher Wills (86) and Chris Douville (90) all received that honor.

"This class is full of some great talent and certainly fills some needed spots," said Irish associate head coach Matt Tallman. "Each member of this class will join our team with a great potential to improve on their incoming times. We have improved steadily over

the past few years and this group of student-athletes should keep the program going in the right direction."

THE SCHEDULE

Welsh believes that this season's slate may be the toughest his program will face since beginning his tenure with the Irish in 1985.

"Looking ahead to this season, we've yet again put together a very ambitious schedule just as we have done for the last several years," said Welsh.

The season will start when the Irish play host to the 43rd annual Dennis Stark Relays (Oct. 5), followed two weeks later by a dual meet against Southern California. The matchup with the Trojans will be the

first between the two of the more storied programs in collegiate swimming.

"It will be fun to have USC visit us the day

before the school's football teams will Welsh noted. "They are annually one of the leading teams in the nation with a stellar history, and we are thrilled to finally be able to compete with them."

Purdue will welcome Notre Dame and Texas A&M on Nov. 2. After visiting Pittsburgh (Nov. 9), the Irish will continue a historic rivalry when they host State one week later (Nov. 16).

The Irish will get another test against some of the nation's finest teams at the Ohio State Invitational (Nov. 30-Dec. 2). After the holidays, the team's midseason winter training session in Florida coincide with a New Year's Day competition against Louisiana State in Ft. Lauderdale and an appearance in the Saint Andrews Invitational in Boca Raton on Jan. 5.

A trip to Northwestern (Jan. 19) sits between home dates against a rising Oakland program (Jan. 12), conference foe Louisville (Jan. 18), and the Shamrock Dual Meet Invitational (Jan. 25-26).

The 2008 BIG EAST Championships will be held in East Meadow, N.Y. from Feb. 20-23, for the ninth time in as many years.

Ohio State will house the NCAA Zone C Diving event on March 14-15, and the NCAA Championships span from March 27-29 in Federal Way, Wash.

Qualifying for the NCAA Championships

The NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships have a fixed field of 270 swimmers, including 35 divers. The swimming field consists first of all student-athletes who have achieved an "A" qualifying standard in any event. Beyond that, entry is given to student-athletes with the best "B" qualifying standards in events with the fewest "A" qualifiers until all the events have an equal number of entrants. From there, additional "B" qualifiers are added in order, one per event at a time, until the field size of 270 is reached. If a complete additional round of next-best qualifiers will put the field over 270, the times that are closest in percentage terms to the national record are given the final spots in the field.

For instance, if there are four "A" qualifiers in the 100 backstroke, 10 in the 100 butterfly, and between four and 10 in every other event, then the top "B" qualifying times will be given entrance until every event has 10 participants in it. From there, the next best "B" time is added in each event, one by one, until the field is full. If not enough spaces remain to take the next entire round of "B" qualifiers, those swimmers' times are compared in percentage terms to NCAA records in the events and taken in order until the field is full.

In relay competition, teams with the top 12 times in each relay earn invitations to the meet. In addition, a team with four qualifiers also may compete in any relay in which it posted a "B" qualifying time at some point throughout the year, even if the NCAA qualifiers did not participate in the "B" time.

The diving field is determined by performance at five NCAA zone meets, which take place two weeks prior to the NCAA Championships. A student-athlete qualifies for the zone diving meet by registering a performance in which he scores points equal or better than the qualifying standard. Each zone sends a minimum of four divers to the NCAA meet, with the zones that had better performances at the previous year's NCAAs getting additional entries. Once in the field, a student-athlete may compete in both the one- and three-meter springboard events, but can only take part in the platform competition if he participated in it at the zone meet.
