

NOTRE DAME **SEASON IN REVIEW**

Ted Brown concluded his stellar four-year career by registering four all-BIG EAST honors and was a member of two school-record setting relay quartets at the 2007 conference championships while also earning an NCAA post-graduate scholarship.



No Slowing Down

Irish have another record-setting season, yet fall short in bid for third-straight BIG EAST title

In 2006-07, the Notre Dame men's swimming and diving team raced out of the blocks and posted one of the best starts in program history. The Irish won their first eight dual meets en route to garnering the program's highest national ranking of 16th in late November. Notre Dame concluded the season with an 11-3 record and finished the season with a runner-up performance at the BIG EAST Championships.

A bid for a three-peat at the BIG EAST Championships fell just shy as West Virginia topped the Irish 765.5-761. Notre Dame experienced yet another successful conference meet as eight school records fell by the wayside. The Fighting Irish had 11 student-athletes garner all-BIG EAST accolades and diving coach Caiming Xie claimed his second straight BIG EAST men's diving coach of the year award.

Freshman John Lytle posted a team-best five all-conference honors along with establishing program records in the 100 and 200-yard freestyle events. Lytle was also a part of the school-record setting 400 free, 800 free and 400 medley relays at the BIG EAST meet.

Seniors Ted Brown and Louis Cavadini both earned four all-BIG EAST accolades. Brown concluded his stellar Notre Dame career with 10 all-conference honors, which stands as the second-most in program history behind his classmate Tim Kegelman's total of 12. Kegelman earned three all-league nods at the 2007 meet as did sophomore Jeff Wood, who was competing in his first season with the Irish after transferring from Indiana University.

Despite not notching a third straight conference title, the 49th campaign in program history still had several high points. For the third straight season, Notre Dame registered double-digits in dual-meet victories. An emergence of young swimmers combined with the final go-around for some of the program's most decorated performers provided for a quality year.

The diving corps continued to excel behind Xie's tutelage. Sophomore Michael Bulfin registered all-BIG EAST honors off both the one-meter and three-meter boards. Sam Stoner produced his finest season to date at Notre Dame. The junior notched an all-BIG EAST accolade in the one-meter competition.

The duo along with junior teammate Steven Crowe all qualified for the NCAA Zone C Diving Championships in Ann Arbor, Mich. Bulfin, who qualified for the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships in 2006, fell just short of returning to the meet one year later. He totaled 339.90 points during the three-meter prelims, which placed him second heading into the finals. He registered 312.20 in the afternoon's finals to finish with 652.10 points and in fifth place.

Stoner was third going into the final round after totaling 337.15 points in the prelims of the three-meter competition. He posted 277 points in the finals to place 11th with a combined total of 614.15 points. Crowe had 272 points after the prelims and registered 277.45 points during the finals for a 549.45 total. Stoner and Bulfin placed seventh and eighth, respectively, off the one-meter board during the first day of action at the meet, which was held in the Canham Natatorium. The Zone C Diving Championships

marked the end of the 2007-08 campaign for the Fighting Irish.

The season commenced with the 42nd annual Dennis Stark Relays and for the 10th time in 11 years, the Irish captured the title. Notre Dame registered 264 points to best runner-up Oakland by 106 points. The Irish claimed 11 of 13 events while taking down five meet records.

At one point during the evening, the Irish captured seven straight events en route to the dominating victory. The marks eclipsed by the Fighting Irish on the night were in the 200-yard freestyle relay (1:25.46), 400-yard butterfly relay (3:23.76), 400-yard backstroke relay (3:28.36), the 400-yard freestyle relay (3:07.01) and in synchronized diving (244.20).

A matchup with Texas A&M down in College Station, Texas, began the dual-meet portion of the Irish slate. Notre Dame entered the meet ranked 17th in the first CSCAA poll and captured nine of 16 events to top the Aggies 169-129. Sophomores Wood and Sam Pendergast both collected two wins apiece in their first meet for the Fighting Irish. Wood won both the 100 and 200-yard backstroke, while Pendergast, who did not compete during his freshman season, notched victories in the 100 and 200 breaststroke.

The duo were also part of the winning 200-yard medley relay team for the Irish. Joining them on the winning relay quartet were Kegelman and Louis Cavadini. Kegelman added to his victory total by winning the 100-yard butterfly.

Also claiming titles for the Irish against the Aggies were junior Jay Vanden Berg in the 1,000-yard free, Brown in the 200-yard free and Lytle in the 100 free. The Irish took three of the five scoring spots in 12 of 14 non-relay events.

Notre Dame opened the home portion of its slate with a showdown against No. 18 Purdue. The 17th-

ranked Irish produced a 12-point victory (156-144) over the Boilermakers to snap an 18-meet losing streak to instate rival. The meet went down to the final event with the Irish holding a slim three-point edge. Notre Dame delivered with a win in the 400-yard freestyle relay to take the meet and improve to 2-0 on the season.

The Fighting Irish claimed victories in nine of 16 events, with Brown and Vanden Berg each posting two wins apiece against Purdue. Brown notched a crucial win in the 200-yard IM, which was the second-to-last event of the meet. He also took the 200-yard free, while Vanden Berg won both the 1,000 free and 500 free.

Bulfin registered a win off of the three-meter board. Wood and Lytle picked up wins in the 100-yard back and 100-yard free, respectively. They were also part of the winning 400-yard medley and 400-yard free relay teams. Joining them on the 400 medley unit were Kegelman and Pendergast. Louis Cavadini and freshman Andrew Hoffman were the other two members of the 400 free relay unit that clinched the victory versus the Boilermakers.

A dominating 165-75 triumph over Michigan State in the Rolfs Aquatic Center featured the Irish taking 10 of 13 events. Brown notched wins in the 200-yard free and 200-yard butterfly for the Irish.

Also posting wins for Notre Dame were Louis Cavadini (50 free), Sam Stoner (one-meter diving), Andrew MacKay (200 back), Vanden Berg (500 free), Bulfin (three-meter diving) and Tyler Angelo (200 breast) along with the 400-yard medley and 200-yard freestyle relays.

Conference rival Pittsburgh came to Notre Dame on the following day and suffered a 172-126 defeat at the hands of the Fighting Irish. Notre Dame took nine of 16 events to improve to 4-0. Brown registered wins

in the 500 (4:31.37) and 1,000-yard freestyle (9:30.97) events against the Panthers.

Kegelman and Lytle collected three wins apiece on the day, with two coming on relays. Notre Dame's 200-yard medley relay quartet of Kegelman, Lytle, Wood and Pendergast took first in a time of 1:32.30. The Irish placed first in the 200-yard free relay with Kegelman, Lytle, Louis Cavadini and Nick Fanslau posting a mark of 1:24.38.

Kegelman won the 100-yard butterfly in 50.18, while Lytle was victorious in the 200 free (1:41.43). Also posting wins against the Panthers was Louis Cavadini in the 100 free (47.01) along with freshmen Ross Moore in the 200 fly (1:51.20) and MacKenzie LeBlanc in the 400 IM (4:05.68).

The win over Pittsburgh propelled the Irish to a No. 16 ranking in the College Swim Coaches Association of American (CSCAA poll). That marked the highest ranking ever in program history.

Notre Dame wrapped up first-semester competition with a third-place finish at the Ohio State Invitational. The Irish totaled 601 points in the McCorkle Aquatic Pavilion. Seventh-ranked Minnesota captured the meet title with 1,193 points. The highlight for the Irish came on the third and final day of the meet as freshman MacKenzie LeBlanc claimed a victory in the 200-yard butterfly in a pool-record time of 1:48.36. He was the lone winner for Notre Dame in the event.

The annual winter break training session took the team to Florida. The Irish competed in the second annual Saint Andrews Collegiate Invitational Swim Meet at Saint Andrews School in Boca Raton, Fla. on Sunday, Dec. 31. Teams from Notre Dame, North Carolina State, University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC) and Catholic University participated in the event. All of the races in the meet were contested over non-standard collegiate distances and the meet was not scored.

Highlights for Notre Dame included a 1-2-3 sweep in both the 150-yard and 75-yard butterfly events. Ross led the sweep in the 150 fly with his time of 1:22.31. Kegelman was a triple-winner at the meet and he led the way in the 75-yard butterfly with his time of 36.42. Kegelman also won the 100-yard IM (54.03) and swam the anchor leg on the winning 300-yard freestyle relay (2:16.8). Notre Dame's other sweep of

the afternoon came in the 150-yard freestyle with Brown leading the way at 1:13.6.

Notre Dame then took to the pool in the Scots Collegiate Relays held at Saint Andrews School in Boca Raton, Fla. on Saturday, Jan. 6. The Irish won nine of 12 events. Teams from Notre Dame, North Carolina State, Binghamton, Catholic University, Penn State-Erie and Rider University competed in the meet. The Scots Collegiate Relays Meet, like the Saint Andrews Collegiate Invitational Meet consisted of competition over a non-standard meet format. Neither meet was scored.

Kegelman continued his winning ways in Florida by being a part of four victorious relays. His wins in the Scots Collegiate Relays were in the 300-yard medley relay, the 300-yard butterfly relay, the 100-yard butterfly relay and the 10-man 250-yard freestyle relay.

Other four-event winners in the meet were Wood (300 medley, 100 back, 300 back, 250 free relays) and Lytle (300 medley, 300 free, 100 free, 250 free relays). Louis Cavadini and Brown each contributed to three winning relays.

The Notre Dame divers took to the board on Jan. 3 for the Mike Peppe One-Meter Diving Meet. Irish divers placed one through four in the meet with Stoner taking first with 337.75 points, which was the third-highest total in program history for one-meter dual-meet dives. There were eight divers in the field, with Michigan State being represented with three divers and Eastern Illinois having one competitor.

The second half of the season began with a trip to annual rival Oakland. The Irish took down the Golden Grizzlies 181-119. Lytle, Moore and Bulfin all won two events in the OU Aquatics Center. In all, Notre Dame won 11 of 16 events during the meet.

Lytle's first win came in the third event of the night as he took the 200-yard freestyle with a time of 1:42.16. His second victory came in the 100-yard freestyle with a mark of 46.77. Brown captured a win of his own in the 1,000-yard free with a time of 9:33.99. Moore registered a win in the 200-yard butterfly (1:51.78).

The one-meter board was the first diving event of the night and Bulfin registered 323.12 points for the win. Bulfin and Stoner would also go 1-2 off the three-meter board with respective scores of 343.80 and

342.53. Wood, who was a part of the winning 200-yard medley relay along with Kegelman, Pendergast and Ray Toomey in a time of 1:32.70, captured the 200-yard backstroke in 1:51.58.

The Fighting Irish produced another win as freshman Andrew Deters and junior Rob Seery went 1-2 with respective times of 4:38.41 and 4:42.05 in the 500-yard free. Notre Dame secured some crucial points by going 1-2-3 in the 100-yard fly as Cavadini placed first in 50.48, with Kegelman in second (50.66) and Toomey in third (50.90). The second victory of the night for Moore came in the 200-yard IM as he touched the wall in 1:54.58.

A trip to Cleveland State for a quad meet gave Notre Dame three more wins to bring its total to eight straight, which was the best start to a season since the 1974-75 campaign when the Irish started out of the gate 10-0. In addition to topping the Vikings 152-91, Notre Dame defeated Duquesne (156-41) and Xavier (168-29).

Kegelman and Wood both collected individual wins and were part of the victorious 200-yard medley relay. Other winners for the Fighting Irish were Deters in the 1,000-yard free (9:27.51), Brown in the 200-yard free (1:41.19) and the 200 free relay (1:25.68). That quartet consisted of Vanden Berg, Seery along with seniors Justin Barber and Brian Freeman. Pendergast and Lytle joined Kegelman and Wood on the winning 200 medley relay (1:33.30).

Notre Dame had a perfect 8-0 record and a No. 16 ranking when No. 8 Northwestern visited the Rolfs Aquatic Center on January 20. The eighth-ranked Wildcats used wins in 13 of 16 events to take a 167-131 victory and give the Irish their first setback of the season.

Bulfin led the Irish with wins off both the one-meter (317.77) and three-meter boards (346.80). Notre Dame's other victory was posted in the 1,650-yard freestyle as Deters touched the wall in 15:39.88.

The 17th-ranked Fighting Irish closed out the home schedule with the Shamrock Invitational. Notre Dame recorded wins over Oakland (230-139) and Connecticut (284-86) yet fell to No. 19 West Virginia (228-142) and Penn State (221.5-147.5)

On the first day of the two-day meet, Bulfin won off the one-meter board by posting a school-record total of 339.40. The sophomore was victorious in the three-meter competition on the second and final day of the event with a point total of 378.30, which was 5.55 points away from the school record. Brown was the only other winner for the hosts as he spearheaded an Irish sweep of the top four spots in the 500-yard free as he touched the wall in 4:31.55.

The 2006-07 dual-meet slate concluded with a visit to BIG EAST rival Louisville. No. 17 Notre Dame captured a 147-94 victory over the Cardinals in the Ralph Wright Natatorium. The Fighting Irish won seven of the 13 events to move their record to 11-3.

Wood and Hoffman helped the Irish to the victory as they captured wins in the 200-yard back (1:51.04) and the 200-yard free (1:41.58), respectively, along with being a part of the winning 400-yard freestyle relay unit (3:04.81). Joining them on the relay were Lytle and Brown.

Crowe had a personal-best day off of the three-meter board as he registered 352.28 points to take the win. Bulfin won his ninth event of the season by taking the one-meter competition with a point total of 333.53. Also winning for the Irish were Deters in the 1,000-yard free in a team season-best time of 9:25.35. Freeman won the 500 free in 4:40.72.

Following the conclusion of his senior season, Brown received accolades for not only excelling in the pool, but also for his stellar performance in the classroom. Brown became just the second student-athlete in program history to earn Academic All-America honors. He joined Ray Fitzpatrick, who garnered the honor during the 1999-2000 campaign. In addition to his All-America achievement, Brown was the recipient of an NCAA postgraduate scholarship.

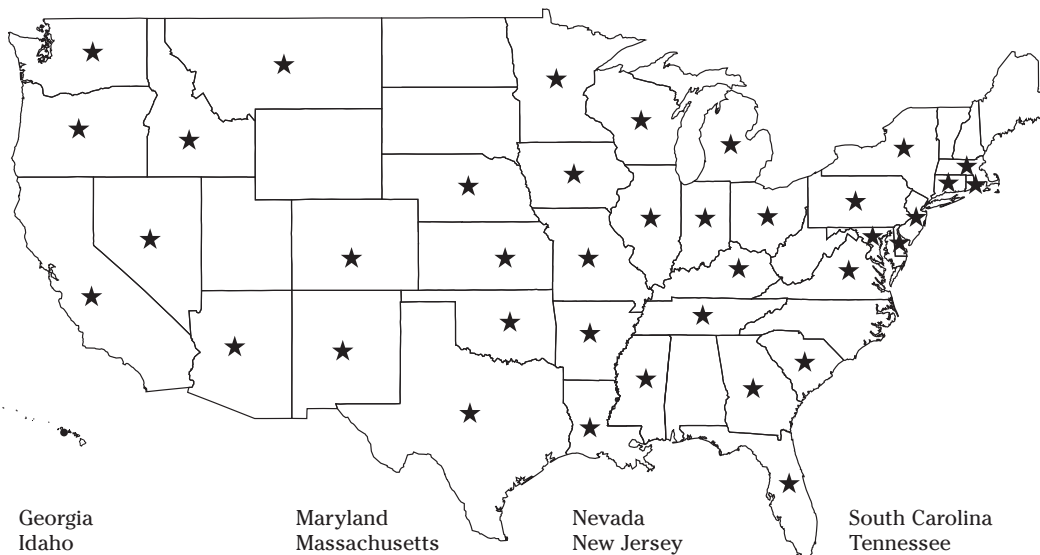

marks in 100 butterfly and seven of the top eight in the 200 IM ... joined Paul Godfrey (1988) and Scott Zumbach (1996) as only freshmen to be named Notre Dame's MVP ... was a member of Notre Dame's Academic Honors Program for Student-Athletes ... in 2003-04, ranked among top eight in U.S. among 17 and 18-year olds in 200 IM (5th), 100 fly (7th), and 200 fly (8th).

ASA SENIOR: Team co-captain ... copped three all-BIG EAST honors (200 free relay, 400 free relay, 200 medley relay) ... second on the team in the 100 fly ... placed sixth in the 100 fly at the BIG EAST Championships ... clocked a season-best time of 48.81 in the 100 fly during prelims at the conference meet ... went a season-best 1:54.04 in the 200 IM at the BIG EAST Championships ... notched three individual victories and was a part of seven winning relays ... won the 100 fly in dual-meet victories over Texas A&M, Pittsburgh and Cleveland State ... part of two winning 400 medley relays, including a victory against Purdue to help the Irish snap an 18-meet losing streak to the Boilermakers ... member of four winning 200 medley relays and one 200 free relay.

AS A JUNIOR: Earned all-BIG EAST honors in the 200 medley relay as the Irish quartet placed second in a school-record time of 1:30.04 ... clocked a fourth-place finish in the 100 fly at the BIG EAST meet with a season-best mark of 48.47 ... barely missed out on all-conference honors in the 200 IM with another fourth-place showing in a season-best time of 1:50.18 ... placed seventh at the BIG EAST meet in the 200 fly with a mark of 1:51.77 ... registered his top 200 fly time of the campaign in the prelims at BIG EAST (1:51.01) ... posted team-best times in the claimed 17 relay and 10 individual victories during the season ... competed at the Dallas Morning News Classic.

AS A SOPHOMORE: Qualified for the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships with a "B" cut time of 47.66 in the 100-yard butterfly ... also swam the 200 fly and the 200 IM in the national meet ... entered the meet seeded 26th in the 100 fly, 34th in the 200 fly and 45th in the 200 IM ... he placed 37th in the 200 fly, 39th in the 200 IM and was disqualified from the 100 fly ... named team MVP for the second straight season ... was the high-point scorer in the BIG EAST Championships with 89.5 points ... a major factor in Notre Dame claiming its first-ever BIG EAST title ... conference champion in the 100 fly, and the 200 IM ... swam the butterfly leg of the first-place 400 medley relay ... became first Notre Dame competitor ever to set a BIG EAST Championships record, first tying the 100 fly mark in prelims (48.10) and then bettering that time in the finals (48.06) ... all of his season-best times in his main events came at the Notre Dame Invitational in December in Rolfs Aquatic Center, when he helped the Irish to first place ... all three of those marks were University, meet, and pool records ... swam the anchor leg on the 400-yard freestyle relay that defeated Pittsburgh by .04 seconds in a November meet in the Rolfs Aquatic Center ... led team in points with 407.75 (276 individual, 131.75 relay) ... registered 14 individual victories and 12 more in relay events.

AS A FRESHMAN: Turned in one of the most impressive rookie campaigns in program history, earning team MVP honors ... broke University records in 100 butterfly (48.43) and 200 individual medley (1:49.68) and was part of record relays in the 200 medley (1:30.48) and 200 free (1:21.30) ... registered NCAA "B" times in 100 fly and 200 IM ... tabbed honorable mention Academic All-America by the College Swim Coaches Association (CSCAA) ... scored team-high 64 points in helping Irish to highest-ever point total and

second-place team finish at BIG EAST Championships ... earned all-conference honors in 200 IM and 100 fly, finishing as BIG EAST runner-up in the latter ... ranked among top 75 in Division I in each of his three main events: tied for 53rd in 100 fly, 69th in 200 fly (1:49.44), and 72nd in 200 IM (1:49.68) ... also was part of three relays that were among the top 45 nationally: 200 medley (30th), 200 free (35th), and 400 medley (42nd, 3:19.66) ... all three of those quartets finished fourth at the BIG EAST meet, with both 200s breaking the University records ... team leader in both butterfly events and 200 IM ... also ranked fourth on Irish in 100 breaststroke (58.33) and fifth in 50 free (21.29) ... posted three fastest times in school history in the 100 fly, as well as six of the top nine for the Irish on the season ... also had four of the best six marks in the 200 fly and the two best in the 200 IM ... finished second on team in points scored with 407.75 ... broke 100 fly school record in qualifying second with NCAA "B" time of 48.45 at BIG EAST meet before improving upon that time to tie for second place (with West Virginia's Pedro Pinto) in the final, just 0.03 seconds behind the champion, Connecticut senior Dustin Rogers ... prior to that, no Irish swimmer had ever been in the top six at the BIG EAST meet in the 100 fly ... also was the top returning swimmer in the conference in the 200 IM, in which he was the only competitor to post an NCAA "B" cut in prelims, coming in as the top qualifier with a school record ... slipped to third in finals, but still improved eight spots from his seeding (11th) ... qualified 10th in 200 fly, but came back to beat field by three seconds in taking ninth and posting time that would have been third had he been in the championship final ... runner-up to Pinto in the 100 fly at the Notre Dame Invitational ... took fourth in the 200 IM and swam butterfly leg on first-place 200 free and 200 medley relays ... the 200 medley relay set a meet record (1:31.62) ... registered 15 dual-meet race victories ... was beaten just once in the 100 butterfly ... highlights included winning both butterfly events against both #17 Pittsburgh and #19 BYU, as well as a 100 fly triumph vs. North Carolina (23rd at NAAs) ... posted second-fastest time in the conference in the 100 fly during the regular season ... qualified for BIG EAST meet in team-high six events, also posting season-best time of 47.03 in the 100 free ... swam second leg of 400 butterfly relay that set a meet record at the Dennis Stark Relays ... became just third freshman ever to be tabbed team MVP.

THE KEGELMAN FILE: Four-year letterwinner at Tabb High School where he helped his prep team to two Virginia team state championships ... 14-time state champion (eight relays and six individual events) ... two-time state champion in the 200 individual medley and 100 breaststroke ... also won state titles in 50 freestyle and 100 butterfly ... state record holder in 100 breaststroke, 50 freestyle, and 200 individual medley and was a member of three relay teams which established new Virginia marks ... U.S. Sectional champion (100 fly) and the high point scorer at the 2002 sectional (spring) ... qualified for U.S. Nationals and was a scholastic All-American in 2001 and 2002 ... appeared all over the national U.S. Swimming rankings (third in the 100 fly, ninth in the 200 fly, 14th in the 200 breast, 15th in the 200 IM and 16th in the 50 free) ... member of Notre Dame's Academic Honors Program for Student-Athletes ... father Jerry received Ph.D. from Notre Dame in 1981 ... oldest of four children ... born April 25, 1985, in St. Louis, Mo. ... son of Jerry and Mary Ellen Kegelman ... graduated from the College of Engineering in May of 2007 with a chemical engineering degree.
