ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame takes to the road this weekend for games two and three of five consecutive road games, traveling to Bowling Green, Ohio for a series with the Bowling Green Falcons on Nov. 5 and 6. Game time both nights at the BGSU Ice Arena is 7:05 p.m. The five-game road trip for the Irish is the longest this season. Notre Dame brings a five-game unbeaten streak (4-0-1) into the series and is 5-1-1 overall to go with a 3-0-1-1 CCHA record, good for 11 points in the league

standings and a first-place tie with the Miami RedHawks. Bowling Green is 3-5-0 overall and is still looking for its first CCHA win with an 0-4-0-0 record and is in 11th place in conference play. Notre Dame is coming off a home-and-home series versus Western Michigan that saw the Irish defeat the Broncos, 3-2, on Fri., Oct. 29 before battling to a 2-2 overtime tie on Oct. 30th in Kalamazoo, Mich. Notre Dame picked up the extra point in the standings, winning the shootout, 1-0. The Falcons spent their weekend in Alaska, dropping a pair of 4-1 decisions to the Nanooks. The Irish continue their road schedule next week, Nov. 12-13, with a pair of games at Yost Arena against the Michigan Wolverines.

IRISH VERSUS FALCONS: Notre Dame and Bowling Green have met 91 times in the all-time series with the Irish holding a 48-35-8 advantage to date. At the BGSU Ice Arena, the Falcons are 23-20-3 in the 46 games played there. The two teams met four times last season with each team winning once and tying once at home. The Falcons picked up the two extra CCHA points as they won both shootouts. Notre Dame's lone win in the series was a 4-3 overtime victory as three of the four games needed extra time to decide a winner. At the Joyce Center, the Irish were 1-0-1 and at BGSU Ice Arena, the Falcons were 1-0-1. Bowling Green's 4-3 win on Feb. 19, 2010. snapped a Notre Dame 18-game unbeaten

streak (16-0-2) that started in the 2005-06 season. The two teams will meet again on Feb. 11-12, 2011 at Notre Dame.

THE RANKINGS: Notre Dame enters the week ranked 11th in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and the USCHO.com poll.

IRISH UNBEATEN STREAK: Notre Dame enters the series with Bowling Green on a five-game unbeaten streak (4-0-1) that started on Oct. 14 against Lake Superior State. The five-game unbeaten streak is the longest for the Irish since the team won five straight from Feb. 28 to March 21, 2009. That five-game winning streak was part of a 10-game Notre Dame winning streak that was the third longest in the school's history.

WESTERN MICHIGAN RECAP:

Friday, Oct. 29th - Notre Dame's freshman class accounted for seven of the team's eight points (3g, 4a) and rookie goaltender Steven Summerhays (Anchorage, Alaska) stopped 19-of-21 Western Michigan shots in a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. in Freshman center David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa) scored twice and freshman left wing Anders Lee got the game winner at 14:45 of the third period on the power play to give Notre Dame the win. Kevin Lind (Fr., Homer Glen, Ill.), Jeff Costello (Fr., Milwaukee, Wis.), Stephen Johns (Fr., Wampum, Pa.) and T.J. Tynan (Fr. Orland Park, Ill.) added assists for Notre Dame. Senior Ryan Guntzel (Woodbury, Minn.) had the lone non-freshman assist in the game for the Irish. Western Michigan freshmen Chase Balisy and Shane Bershbach had the goals for the Broncos. After a scoreless first period, Gerths got his first of two goals at 11:49 of the second period when he fired a wrist shot from the right circle past Bronco goaltender Nick Pisellini to make it 1-0. Western Michigan answered back just over a minute later at 12:52 when Balisy slid a backhander past Summerhays to even the score at 1-1. It stayed that way until the 6:26 mark of the third period when Gerths drove the goal and jammed a shot past Pisellini for his third of the year and a 2-1 lead. The Broncos came right back with Berschbach scoring a power-play goal at 8:48. That set up Lee for his game winner at 14:45 when he scored from in front on the power play assisted by Guentzel and Tynan. The goal was Lee's team-best fifth of the year. In the game. Notre Dame out shot Western Michigan, 24-21. Pisellini finished with 21 saves. The win was the first of Summerhays' career.

Saturday, Oct 30th - Freshmen Anders Lee and Jeff Costello scored solo goals and sophomore goaltender Mike Johnson (Verona, Wis.) stopped 29-of-31 shots as Notre Dame and Western Michigan battled to a 2-2 tie at Lawson Arena. Chase Balisy scored twice for the Broncos. The Irish took the extra point in the shootout, when Ben Ryan (Sr., Brighton, Mich.) beat Western Michigan goaltender Nick Pisellini with a backhander for the lone goal in a 1-0 Notre Dame shootout win. Johnson stopped all three shots he faced while Pisellini made a stop on Calle Ridderwall (Sr., Stockholm, Sweden). In regulation, Lee gave the Irish a 1-0 lead just 1:14 into the game only to see Balisy get his two goals. Costello got the game-tying goal at 16:37 of the second period. Pisellini finished with 19 saves in the game as Western Michigan out shot the Irish, 31-21. Notre Dame was 0-for-3 on the power play while the Broncos were 1-for-5.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Notre Dame's Oct. 30, 3-2 win over Western Michigan was the 200th CCHA win for Irish coach Jeff Jackson. Now in his 12th season at the Division I level, Jackson is 200-80-45 in his career in CCHA play in six seasons at Lake Superior State (1990-96) and six seasons at Notre Dame. Earlier this month, Jackson won his 300th career game as a Division I coach. His all-time record stands at 303-118-48 for a .697 winning percentage.

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD: Saturday's game at Western Michigan was the start of five straight road games for the Irish and a stretch of nine of the next 11 games away from the Joyce Center for the Irish. Between Oct. 30 and Dec. 4, Notre Dame will have played at Western Michigan (Oct. 30) and will be at Bowling Green (Nov. 5-6); at Michigan (Nov. 12-13); at North Dakota (Nov. 26-27) and at Miami (Dec. 3-4). The lone home series for the Irish comes on Nov. 19-20 when Notre Dame plays host Michigan State at the Joyce Center.

SHOOTOUT FACTS AND FIGURES: Notre Dame's shootout win over Western Michigan on Oct. 30 was the first for Notre Dame in CCHA play since Nov. 19, 2009 against Michigan State. The Irish had lost four consecutive CCHA shootouts. Last season, Notre Dame was 2-5 in the shootout in CCHA games and 3-5 overall. The extra win was a shootout win in the championship game of the Shillelagh Tournament. In the three seasons that the CCHA has had the shootout, the Irish are 6-5 all-time (3-0 in '08-'09; 2-5 in '09-'10 and 1-0 in '10-'11).

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame's freshmen class has played a key role in the 5-1-1 start for the Irish. In the series versus Western Michigan, 11 of the 12 rookies saw action (only third goaltender Joe Rogers did not play) and accounted for all five Notre Dame goals in the win and tie. In the first seven games, the Irish freshmen have accounted for 15 of the team's 25 goals (60.0%), 18 of the 46 assists (39.1%) and 33 of team's 71 points this season (46.5%).

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Sophomore goaltender Mike Johnson and freshman goaltender Steven Summerhays split the goaltending duties last weekend in the Western Michigan series. Summerhays recorded his first collegiate win on Friday night (Oct. 29), making 29 saves in a 3-2 win over the Broncos. He is 1-1-0 with a 3.54 goals-against average and a .844 save percentage. His first start came on Oct. 10 versus Boston University in a 5-4 loss to the Terriers. Summerhays joined the Irish after playing the last two seasons with the USHL's Green Bay Gamblers. In '09-'10, Summerhays was a first team all-USHL selection and the USHL goaltender of the year after going 31-2-3 with a 2.17 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. Johnson ran his personal best unbeaten streak to five games (4-0-1) in the Oct. 30, 2-2 tie with the Broncos, making 29 saves in the game. For the year, Johnson is 4-0-1 with a 1.97 goalsagainst average and a .934 save percentage. As a freshman, Johnson took CCHA all-rookie team honors, playing in 29 games in '09-'10, going 10-13-5 with a 2.60 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage. Joining Summerhays and Johnson in the Notre Dame goaltending corps is freshman Joe Rogers (Marvsville, Mich.) who has yet to play this season. Rogers joins the Notre Dame roster after playing last season in the North American Hockey League (NAHL) with the Albert Lea Thunder. Rogers was 13-19-2 with a 3.97 goals-against average and a .891 save percentage.

BEST OF THE BEST: Over the past four seasons, the Notre Dame hockey program ranks among the top five programs in the country. Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Irish have won 108 games and have a .679 winning percentage. The Irish are third in that time period in wins, trailing Michigan (118) and Miami (114). Notre Dame's .679 winning percentage is also third behind Miami (.698) and Michigan (.688). Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage since 2006-07.

FAST START: Senior right wing Ryan Guentzel leads the Irish in scoring after seven games with nine points. All nine points have come on assists, giving him a career high in that category. A year ago, Guentzel had just six points in 36 games, with all six coming on assists. The Irish alternate captain last scored on March 13, 2009 in a CCHA playoff game against Nebraska-Omaha. He has now gone 46 games without scoring a goal. His career-best season came in 2008-09 when he had four goals and seven assists for 11 points in 40 games.

SHOOTING THE PUCK: After averaging 35 shots per game over the first five games of the season, the Irish were held to a combined 45 shots in the series against Western Michigan last weekend (24 on Friday and 21 on Saturday). Previous to that, the fewest shots Notre Dame had in a game was 34, something that happened three times. After seven games this season, the Irish are now averaging 31.4 shots per game. The 21 shots that Notre Dame surrendered to the Broncos on Oct. 29 also was a season low with the previous being 24 to Boston University. For the season, the Irish are holding the opposition to 28.0 shots per game.

PLAYING SHORT-HANDED: Through the first seven games of the 2010-11 season, Notre Dame has been very successful killing penalties. The Irish have killed 34-of-39 opponent power-play chances for a 89.7% success rate. While giving up just four power-play goals in seven games, Notre Dame already has scored three short-handed markers on the season. In 2009-10, the Irish had just four short-handed goals in 38 games. To date, Joe Lavin (Holy Cross), Bryan Rust (Boston University) and Billy Maday (Lake Superior State) have scored short-handed for the Irish.

IRISH WINS VERSUS NO. 1: Notre Dame's win over No. 1 ranked Boston College on Oct. 23 marked the 12th time in the program's history that the Irish have defeated the nation's top team. Prior to Oct. 23, 2010, the last time came on April 10, 2008 in the NCAA semifinals versus No. 1 Michigan. A year ago, the Irish played twice versus the No. 1 team in the nation - Miami University - and lost both games on Dec. 4-5. Notre Dame has defeated Boston College when the Eagles were ranked No. 1 four times since the 2003-04 season. Here's a list of previous Irish wins versus top-ranked teams.

RIGHT PLACE, RIGHT TIME: In each of Notre Dame's last two wins over No. 1 ranked teams, **Calle Ridderwall** has played a part. On Oct. 23, Ridderwall scored two goals, including the game winner in a 2-1 win over No. 1 Boston

College. On April 10, 2008, Ridderwall scored twice, including the overtime game winner in the 5-4 overtime win for the Irish against No. 1 Michigan. That victory came in the 2008 NCAA semifinals in Denver, Colo.

THE SPECIALIST: Senior left wing Calle Ridderwall is second on the team in goals with four through the first seven games this season. He has led Notre Dame in goals in each of the last two seasons, getting 17 in 2008-09 and 19 last season in 2009-10. Over the last two-plus seasons, Ridderwall has scored 40 goals with 24 of them coming via the power play. Last season, his 11 power-play goals led the CCHA. Ridderwall had 11 power-play goals in '08-'09 to match last season's total and has two this year. His 24 power-play goals tie him for ninth on Notre Dame's all-time list with **Brian Walsh** '77. For his career, Ridderwall has 45 goals and 25 assists for 70 career points in 124 games.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Senior left wing Calle Ridderwall is one of 20 Division I hockey players to be selected as a candidate for the 2010-11 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in 10 sports based on achievement's in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. FULL HOUSE: With sellout crowds in each of the first four games, Notre Dame has now recorded 11 consecutive sellouts since Nov. 28, 2009. The Irish have had sell outs in 18 of the team's last 22 home games and last year averaged 2,765 fans per game. Since Dec. 13, 2008, the Irish have recorded sellouts in 27 of their last 31 home games. A sellout at the Joyce Center is 2,713 with 2,857 capacity with standing room. Twice during the '09-'10 season - Jan. 15 vs. Michigan State and Jan. 29 against Nebraska-Omaha - 3,007 fans jammed into the Joyce Center. Prior to that number, the largest crowd to see an Irish hockey game was 3,310 on March of 1995 when Notre Dame play Illinois-Chicago. The following season, new seating was installed and capacity was reconfigured.

FAST START: Notre Dame freshman left wing Anders Lee knows how to get his career off to a fast start. The 6-3, 218-pounder scored a goal on his first shot in the 6-3 win over Holy Cross (Oct. 8), just 1:58 into the first period. He went on to record two more goals for a hat trick in his first-ever collegiate game. Lee then added an assist in the 5-4 loss to Boston University in the championship game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament. For his efforts, Anders Lee was named the CCHA rookie of the week for the week ending Oct. 10. He joins John Noble '73 as the only other freshman to score three goals in his first game as Noble did the trick on Nov. 15, 1969 in an 8-3 win over Windsor. He joins recent Irish players - Billy Maday, Christiaan Minella '10 and Tim Wallace '06 - as freshmen who scored on their first shot on goal. Lee added a goal and an assist in the Oct. 15 win over Lake Superior State and through the first five games of the season, is tied for the Notre Dame team lead in goals with four and is second in points with six.

CAPTAINS: Four members of the Irish senior class will serve as captains for the 2010-11 season. Defenseman Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) will wear the "C" for Jeff Jackson's squad this year. His three assistant captains will be Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden), Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) and Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.). For all four players, this is their first time as captains at Notre Dame.

HOME OPENERS: Notre Dame's home opener on Thursday, Oct. 14, a 4-2 win over Lake Superior State, gives Notre Dame an all-time record of 24-18-1 in home openers at the Joyce Center. With the win on Oct. 8 against Holy Cross, Notre Dame is now 21-20-2 in season-opening games.

CAREER BESTS: With three assists in the season opener versus Holy Cross, senior **Ben Ryan** equaled his career best for points in a game while setting his personal best with the three assists. Linemate **Ryan Guentzel** had career highs with three assists and three points in the win over Holy Cross. Their line, with freshman **Anders Lee**, accounted for three goals, six assists and nine points in the 6-3 win over Holy Cross.

FRESH START: Sophomore defenseman Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.) had a freshman season that he would love to forget. The product of the USA Under-18 Team, Calabrese played in just three games, registering no points. Last Dec. 4, on the first shift of his third game, he suffered a broken leg at Miami that sidelined him for most of the season. This year, in five games, he has two assists and leads the team with a +6 rating.

EXTRA HOCKEY: During the '09-'10 season, the Irish were involved in nine overtime contests, finishing 1-0-8 in those games. The eight ties equaled a Notre Dame record set during the 1999-2000 season. All eight ties in '09-'10 went to a

shootout where the Irish were 3-5 in those games. The lone overtime win came on Nov. 27, 2009 versus Bowling Green (2-1) and was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win. Through the first seven games of the 2010-11 season, the Irish have played one overtime game - on Oct. 30 at Western Michigan. That game ended in a 2-2 tie and the Irish won the overtime shootout, 1-0. Notre Dame is now 3-0-12 in overtime since its last overtime loss, a 2-1 decision to Miami on March 21, 2008, in the CCHA semifinal game.

CAN'T TELL THE PLAYERS WITHOUT A **SCORECARD:** The Notre Dame hockey team that takes the ice this year will be much different than last year's 13-17-8 team as 13 players from that team are gone and 12 freshmen will take their place. Seven players - seniors Brett Blatchford, Kevin Deeth, Dan Kissel, Kyle Lawson, Christiaan Minella, Tom O'Brien and Ryan Thang have graduated. Three players - defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth along with forward **Kyle Palmieri** - signed with the NHL teams that drafted them. Cole (St. Louis) and Ruth (Columbus) left after their junior seasons while Palmieri (Anaheim) left after his freshman year. Three are no longer with the team. Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips** is currently with the Bloomington PRairie Thunder of the Central Hockey League. Sophomore left wing Kyle Murphy returned to junior hockey for more playing time and is with the Vernon Vipers of the British Columbia Hockey League (BCHL). FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - sophomore forwards Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.) and Rilev Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) and freshman goaltender Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.) have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Nugent's father, Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78 was a member of the Notre Dame hockey team from 1974-78. During his career he played in 131 games, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. His son becomes the second Irish player to follow his father to Notre Dame. He joins Rory Walsh '06 who followed his father, Brian Walsh '77 who was a teammate of Nugent, Sr. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman Brock Sheahan '08 who played for the Irish from 2004-08. Rogers is a cousin of former Notre Dame defenseman Tony Bonadio '83 is a Port Huron, Mich., native. Bonadio played in 79 games between 1980-83, scoring one goal with nine assists for 10 points.

HOMETOWNS: The 2010-11 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 11 states, two Canadian provinces and Sweden. NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have 10 players on the 2010-11 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Leading the way is sophomore Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) who became Notre Dame's third-ever, first-round pick last June when he was chosen 21st overall by the Detroit Red Wings. He joins former defenseman Ian Cole (2007 - St. Louis) who was selected 18th overall and former right wing Kyle Palmieri (2009 - Anaheim), the 26th pick overall. Sheahan was followed by freshman defenseman Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.), who went in the second round, 60th overall to the Chicago Black Hawks. One round later in the third round, with the 80th overall pick, freshman forward Bryan Rust (Novi, Mich.) was chosen by the Pittsburgh Penguins. Notre Dame's final player selected in 2010 was defenseman Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.), who was picked in the sixth round, 177th overall by the Anaheim Ducks. Two other Irish freshman were selected in the 2009 draft. Left wing Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.) was chosen by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round, 146th overall and six picks later, center Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) was a New York Islanders' choice in the sixth round, 152nd overall. The new group of draftees join sophomore left wing Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.), a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall; junior defenseman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.), a member of the 2008 draft class, by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall and seniors Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) and Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.). NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: Construction on Notre Dame's new, on-campus ice facility - The Compton Family Center - began in March of 2010 and is on pace to be finished for the Notre Dame hockey team to begin play there during the 2011-12 campaign.

On Sept. 11, 2010, a project blessing ceremony for the \$50-million facility was held with many of the key benefactors in attendance. At the ceremony, Notre Dame director of athletics, **Jack Swarbrick**, announced that the building would be named the Compton Family Center in honor of the generous donation from Kevin and Gayla Compton and their family. The Comptons are part of the ownership group of the National Hockey League's San Jose Sharks.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., Notre Dame's President began the ceremony with a blessing of the site and offering of a prayer for the safety of those working on the project.

Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** followed by talking about the original plans and how those plans changed to become the Compton Family Center

"When I first came here, we were talking about a renovation in the Joyce Center," said Jackson, now in his sixth season behind the Notre Dame bench.

"With Jack's (Swarbrick) foresight and Tom [Nevala] and everyone involved in pushing for this to happen, waiting an additional year to have a new facility is something that is going to have a tremendous impact on the future of our program, and we're very proud of that."

Jackson also thanked the benefactors in attendance for their generosity towards the project.

Notre Dame's head coach was followed by Irish junior **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, III.)** who spoke for his teammates to the benefactors in attendance.

Swarbrick spoke last at the ceremony, and touched upon how important the Compton Family Center will be for the Michiana community.

"There's a limit to how much the community can use our dormitories and our classrooms and our laboratories, but the athletic facilities can be a special point of contact," Swarbrick said.

a special point of contact," Swarbrick said.

"I hope we win national championships with teams that train here and I hope we build new programs for our athletes and our students. But the ultimate success of this facility will be if we inspire a young boy or a young girl from the community to shoot higher, if we challenge them to be better people because they spend time on our campus. Then we've realized the potential of athletics at Notre Dame."

The original announcement for the new building was made on Feb. 12, 2009 by Notre Dame executive vice-president John Affleck-Graves and Swarbrick after the University's Board of Trustees approved the plan.

The Compton Family Center will house both the Charles "Lefty" Smith rink, within the new 5,000-person capacity, home of the Irish hockey team and a second sheet of ice (Olympic-sized) with limited seating availability. The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety.

The Compton Family Center also will include offices for the Notre Dame coaching staff, a state-of-the art locker room suite that includes both wet and dry locker rooms, meeting rooms,

a sports medicine area that includes hot and cold hydrotherapy, cardio and weight rooms, a players' lounge, equipment areas, video operations and a multi-purpose room that will be the location for weekly team Mass and serve as a study lounge and dining area.

The arena also will feature a balcony level with a 200-seat, Irish pub-themed club, multiple concession areas on both levels, spacious restrooms and a merchandise shop.

The Compton Family Center also will serve the Notre Dame and South Bend community as a place for the Irish Youth Hockey League (IYHL) and local figure skating groups to flourish. On campus it will become the home of club and interhall hockey, the figure skating club and intramural broomball, curling and physical education classes

Multiple locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

Design and construction of the Compton Family Center are under the auspices of the Southfield, Mich., office of Barton Malow, a national design and construction services firm and their project partner Rossetti Architects, also of Southfield, Mich.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, Charles "Lefty" Smith. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years,

retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of
