Team Notes

- ND's 10-to-1 scoring ratio (73-7) ranks behind only ND's '97 squad (135-9, 15-to-1).
- Prior to the Miami game, ND played 6-of-7 on the road (27-day stretch), with 10-of-11 days on the road from Oct. 14-24.
- ND is 28-0-1 in last 29 games vs. BIG EAST teams (69-3-2/.946 since joining the BIG EAST in '95).
- The Irish have allowed just 4G in the last 18-plus games (1,738 minutes) and have 12 shutouts in the last 15.
- ND has led for 60% of the minutes while trailing just 1.3% of the time (28 minutes, vs. BC)
- ND has scored in the first half 18 times.
- Season stat edges: 560-132 shots (avg. 24-6), 316-62 shots on goal (avg. 14-3), 151-52 CKs (avg. 7-2).
- ND has reached 30 shots six times and has owned a shot margin of 25-plus in eight games.
- The Irish are 43-4-2 (.898) in the two-year tenure of head coach Randy Waldrum.
- ND is 117-7-1 (.940) in 11 seasons at Alumni Field, including 93-3-1 in the last 97 and 82-1-0 vs. unranked teams (75 straight wins).
- The Irish own a 35-3-1 all-time record when playing as the top-ranked team.
- ND posted the third unbeaten regular season in its 13-year history (17-0-1 in '94, 18-0-1 in '97).
- ND is ranked No. 1 for the first time since '96.
- ND lost five starters from its '99 team (21-4-1, NCAA runner-up).
- The Irish lead the nation in GAA (0.30), 8th in scoring (3.2 gls/gm).
- ND's typical starting 11 hails from nine states and Finland ... the 27-player roster includes players from 17 states, two foreign countries.
- The Irish opened 16-0, the top start in team history (13-0-0 in '96)
- Current 23-game unbeaten streak ranks 3rd in ND history (24-0-0 in '95-'96; 23-0-1 in '97).

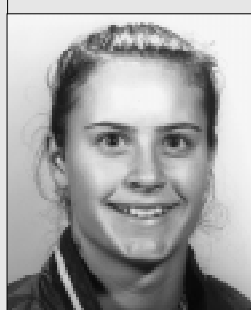

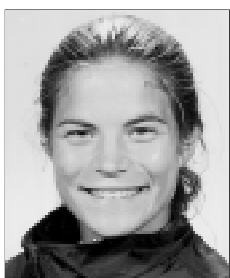
