PROSPECTS

In their fifth year under the tutoring of Coach Walter M. Langford, the Notre Dame fencing team opened its 1952 season with wins over Case College, Ohio State and Iowa and a close loss to Michigan State. Seven sophomores have made the squad to bolster the possibilities of another good year. Ten seniors and seven juniors return to form the nucleus.

Only Co-Captains Nick Scalera and Dan Parisi are lost to Langford's crew through graduation, while nine monogram men are returning. The '51 Irish fencers won eight matches while losing but two, and placed tenth in the NCAA finals.

Coach Langford, also head of the Modern Language Department of the University and Irish tennis coach, again took over the reigns of the fencers last year after having tutored them from 1940-42 when the sport was discontinued due to war conditions. In four seasons, Langford's teams have won 25 and lost 11. *OK*

Notre Dame's all-time record in fencing stands at 94 victories against 28 defeats and two ties. Professor Pedro de Landero, a former student, inaugurated the sport at Notre Dame and coached the first Notre Dame team in 1934. His 1935 and 1936 teams were unbeaten and untied, running up 16 consecutive victories. de Landero's six season record was 38 wins, 12 losses and two ties. *OK*

Following World War II, Herb Melton, a pre-war Irish fencer, took over the coaching job for four years, winning 31 and losing 5. *OK* In 1950 he guided the Irish to an undefeated, untied season, winning 10 matches and placing sixth in the NCAA finals.

NOTES ON MONOGRAM MEN

JOE CONLON, a senior epee man, is making a 91 average while majoring in English. He hails from St. Louis High and lists classical music as his hobby. CHUCK DASCHLE has won 26 while losing 20 in the sabre division. He attended Central High in Aberdeen, So. Dak., participating in football and track. BRIAN DUFF, senior epeeist, played football at St. John's Prep in Danvers, Mass. An English major, he and his brother, sophomore Roderick, form the only brother combination on the squad. ERNIE FRANZGROTE, who won 30 and lost 12 in two years, suffered a broken finger while fencing against Michigan State. He will be sidelined for several weeks. Dave McBride will take his place in the epee lineup. PAUL GIBBONS is the only monogram winner veteran on the team. He served a year and a half in the Army, a year of that in occupational duty in Japan. He played both football and basketball in high school, and is now majoring in Political Science. JAMES GRAHAM, a finance major, also played football and basketball in high school, attending York Prep, Pa. JIM JACOBS won 10 and lost 6 his first year of competition in the foil division. He played both basketball and golf at Trinity High in Bloomington, Ill., although now residing in Hollywood, Fla. Jim is majoring in Journalism and has an 88 average. JOHN MOONEY, a junior, won five and lost three last year and is the only junior monogram winner. He attended Cathedral Latin High in Cleveland, O., and is now majoring in Law. JIM WALSH, captain of the 1952 Irish fencers, hails from University City, Mo., where he attended St. Louis High. In two years competition in the foil division, Jim has won 23 and lost 8. He is majoring in philosophy and has an 86 average.

An interesting sidelight on the Notre Dame fencing monogram winners is that none of them had any previous experience in the sport prior to attending Notre Dame. (The individual records do not include any 1952 results.)

PROSPECTS

In their sixth year under the tutoring of Coach Walter M. Langford, the Notre Dame fencing team opened its 1953 season with a convincing win over Northwestern. Seven sophomores have made the squad to bolster the possibilities of another good year. Six seniors and nine juniors return to form the nucleus of this year's squad.

Nine men are lost to Langford's crew through graduation. These include Capt. Jim Walsh and Brian Duff, who now assists Coach Langford in the tutoring of the Irish fencers. Duff is the brother of epeeman Rod Duff, one of Notre Dame's five returning monogram men. In 1952 the Irish fencers won nine matches, lost two and finished 11th in the NCAA meet.

Coach Langford, also the head of the Modern Language Department of the University and Irish tennis coach, took over the reigns of the fencers in 1951 after having tutored them in 1940-41-42 when the sport was discontinued due to the war. In five seasons, Langford's teams have won 34 and lost 13.

Notre Dame's all-time record in fencing stands at 105 victories against 34 defeats and two ties. Professor Pedro de Landero, a former student, inaugurated the sport at Notre Dame and coached the first Notre Dame team in 1934. His 1935 and 1936 teams were unbeaten and untied, running up 16 consecutive victories. Coach deLandero's six season record was 38 wins, 12 losses and two ties.

Following World War II, Herb Melton, a pre-war Irish fencer, took over the coaching job for four years, winning 31 and losing five. In 1950, he guided the Irish to an undefeated, untied season, winning 10 matches and placing sixth in the NCAA finals.

JACK MOONEY--senior captain of the 1953 Irish fencing squad hails from Cleveland, Ohio, where he attended Cathedral Latin High. John, the only two-time monogram winner on this year's squad, competes in the foil division. In two seasons of competition, he has won 26 and lost nine matches. Mooney is studying law.

PAT MULROONEY--Eagle River, Wis., and JIM HURLEY, Newark, N.Y., both seniors, form the backbone of the Irish sabre division. Mulrooney's two year record is nine wins and nine losses. However, seven of Pat's victories were scored in the 1952 campaign. Hurley, who won five of six matches in 1952, has an overall two season record of seven wins and three losses.

DAVE McBRIDE, senior epee man from Chicago, possesses an 11 won and 18 lost record for the 1951 and 1952 seasons. ROD DUFF, junior from Peabody, Mass., won six and lost three in 1952. Duff is the brother of Brian Duff, a former Irish fencing star who is now assistant to Coach Walter Langford.

PROSPECTS

In their seventh year under the tutoring of Coach Walter M. Langford, the Notre Dame fencing team opened its 1954 season with an impressive win over Iowa. Seven monogram winners, comprising six seniors and one junior return to form the nucleus of this year's squad. In addition, 11 sophomores have made the team to bolster the possibilities of another good year.

Six men are lost to Langford's crew through graduation. These include Capt. John Mooney, Jim Hurley and Dave McBride, last season's individual leaders in each of the foil, sabre and epee divisions. In 1953 the Irish fencers won 13 matches and lost only one, that to Illinois in their final bout of the season. Langford's fencers, who percentage-wise were the most successful athletic team at Notre Dame last year, finished seventh in the NCAA tourney.

Coach Langford, also the head of the Modern Language Department of the University and former Irish tennis coach, took over the reigns of the fencers in 1951 after having tutored them in 1940-41-42 when the sport was discontinued due to the war. In six seasons, Langford's teams have won 47 and lost 14.

Notre Dame's all-time record in fencing stands at 118 victories against 35 defeats and two ties. Professor Pedro de Landero, a former student, inaugurated the sport at Notre Dame and coached the first Notre Dame team in 1934. His 1935 and 1936 teams were unbeaten and untied, running up 16 consecutive victories. A record of 17 consecutive victories however was registered under Langford's tutelage extending from the Chicago win on March 1, 1952 until the Illinois setback on March 15, 1953. Coach de Landero's six season record was 38 wins, 12 losses and two ties.

Following World War II, Herb Melton, a pre-war Irish fencer, took over the coaching job for four years, winning 31 and losing five. In 1950, he guided the Irish to an undefeated, untied season, winning 10 matches and placing sixth in the NCAA finals.

NOTES ON MONOGRAM MEN

ROD DUFF—senior captain and only double monogram winner on this year's squad, Duff hails from Peabody, Mass., but attended high school at St. John's Prep in Danvers, Mass. Competing in the epee division for the third straight year, Duff finished the 1953 campaign with a record of 24 wins and 12 losses.

GERRY FINNEY—Grosse Point, Mich., and TONY MANDOLINI, Elmwood Park, Ill., both seniors, are the backbone of the Irish sabre division. Last season Finney compiled the best individual fencing mark in winning 28 of 33 bouts. In the NCAA tournament he won 24 and lost nine. Mandolini, a product of St. Ignatius High in Chicago ran a close second to Finney in the sabre department with 22 wins and nine defeats.

DICK HULL and JERRY BRAINERD, a pair of seniors, along with junior TOM BEELER carry the brunt of Notre Dame's foil attack. Hull and Brainerd had near identical records last season, the former possessing a 22-15 mark, the latter, 21-15. Beeler won five and lost four. Besides Duff in the epee division, senior JOHN MCGINN, 26-10 last season, and 22-11 in the NCAA tourney, is another fine competitor.

1955 Record in Parenthesis

EPEE--Capt. Don Tadrowski (33-7) is undoubtedly the top performer in this event. He was the NCAA Champion last year and his 33 wins are the highest ever recorded by an Irish fencer in a single season. Senior John Brogan (25-13) and Junior Denis Hemmerle (12-4) are also standouts in this division which won 99 of their 135 meets last year. Junior Dick Colman and two promising sophomores should give Coach Langford additional depth in this event.

SABRE--With the three top berths being contested for by **five** returning members of last year's squad and three outstanding sophomores showing continual advancement, this division could show improvement over their record of 73-62 in 135 meets last year. Seniors Dave Friske (9-6), Bob Eichelman (6-6), and Jerry Isaacs (28-8), a transfer from the epee all won monograms last year. Ed Koester (0-6) won a monogram as a sophomore and Frank Dwan (6-19) have developed well.

Foil--Three seniors, Bill Fox (13-13), Jack Friel (9-9), and Julio Vizcarrondo (3-2), are the standouts. Both Fox and Friel are monogram winners. Close behind the top three are Joe Blazina (3-6), Pierre du Vair (4-7), Jim Burlage (1-5), John Ryan (0-1), and Mike Todd (0-0).

PROSPECTS

In his eleventh season as Notre Dame fencing coach, Professor Walter Langford faces the difficult task of replacing his best talent in all three fencing divisions. Lost through graduation was Captain Don Tadrowski, who compiled a record of 76 wins and only 18 defeats in the epee division, over a three-year span, the highest total of victories by an individual in Notre Dame history. Besides Tadrowski, the Irish lost the third-high scorer in the epee, John Brogan; the top three performers in the sabre, Dave Friske, Frank Dwan, and Bob Richelman; and the leading duo in the foil, John Friel and Julio Vizcarrondo.

Five of last year's monogram winners are returning to bolster an inexperienced squad. Heading the list is Co-Captain Denis Hemmerle, who finished second to Tadrowski in the epee last season with 35 victories and seven losses. Along with Hemmerle, the epee will be strengthened by the return of monogram-winning senior Dick Colman, senior Ray Brennan, juniors John Kearns and Ron Farrow, and sophomores Dan Clancy, Jim Brogan and Jim Jock. Seniors Joe Blazina and Co-Captain John Ryan, both monogram winners, and senior Pierre du Vair lead the Irish in the foil division. Added depth will be supplied by sophomores John Lauerman and John Shields. Junior monogram winner Dick Fagon, senior Art Price, and juniors Jerry Meyer, Joe Klein and Ed Warnicke head the list of Irish sabremen. Promising sophomores in this department are Tom Lee, Pat Green and Klaus Muller-Bergh. With the top three scorers graduated from the sabre, this division remains as Coach Langford's biggest problem.

Coach Langford, also the head of the Modern Language Department of the University, and a former Irish tennis coach, took over the reins of the fencers in 1951 after having previously tutored them from 1940 until 1943, when the sport was discontinued during wartime. In ten seasons, Langford-coached teams have won 88 and lost 24. Notre Dame's all-time fencing record stands at 156 victories against 39 defeats and 2 t.

Coach Langford has the distinction of twice tying the all-time Notre Dame record for consecutive victories within the past five years. The record of 17 wins in a row was set by the undefeated 1935 and 1936 fencing teams, coached by Professor Pedro deLandro, who inaugurated fencing at Notre Dame in 1934. Langford's teams tied the record in 1952 and 1953, and duplicated the feat during the 1955 and 1956 seasons. Both times the Irish streak was halted by Illinois and by identical scores, 14-13.

Notre Dame has had three undefeated fencing seasons. Under Professor deLandro, the 1935 team finished with 7-0, and the 1936 team compiled a 9-0 mark. In recent history, the 1950 fencing squad, under the direction of Herb Melton, ended with a 9-0 record. Melton, a pre-war Irish fencer, took over the coaching job for the four years following World War II, winning 31 and losing five.

Last season, the Irish fencers finished with 15 wins and but two losses in regular competition, and 15th in the N.C.A.A. tournament.

SABRE--Junior Dick Fagon is the most promising of the returning sabremen. Jerry Meyer, Joe Klein and Art Price are also to be counted upon to boost the sabre event from last year's record of 88 wins in 153 bouts. The sabre event is heavily stocked with promising sophomores headed by Tom Lee, Pat Green and Klaus Miller-Bergh.

FOIL--The standout returnee of the foil event is senior Pierre duVair whose last year's record was 16 wins against 6 defeats. Senior Joe Blazina and Co-Captain John Ryan provide added depth in the foil. Coach Langford also has several sophomores in John Shields, John Lauerman and Chuck Duggan to call upon for foil action this season.

PROSPECTS

In his twelfth season as Notre Dame fencing coach, Professor Walter Langford again faces the task of replacing his best talent in all three fencing divisions. Gone via graduation is Co-captain Denis Hemmerle, whose record of 84 wins and 18 defeats over a three-year span in the epee division, is the highest total of victories by an individual in Notre Dame history. Hemmerle also finished second in his division in the N.C.A.A. meet. Also lost from the epee team will be Terry Laughlin, who posted a 20-7 record last year. He is unable to compete because of illness. The top three performers in the foil graduated, as did the second man in the sabre. The sabre event also lost its top man from last year, Joseph Klein, who suffered an accident while on an NROTC cruise last summer. Klein won 21 of 29 bouts last season.

However, Coach Langford will have seven monogram winners and a promising group of sophomores to rely on. Heading the returnees is Captain Dick Fagon (19-19), senior monogram winner Gerald Meyer, Patrick Green and Charles Petrungaro, both juniors, and senior Ed Warnicke, in the sabre. In the foil, Langford will be relying on two sophomores, Jim Russomano and Jerry Johnson, and monogram winner John Lauerman. Russomano and Johnson are only the fifth and sixth fencers who have had previous experience before coming to Notre Dame in the past 22 years. Also in the foil will be sophomore Norbert Spitzer and junior Theodore Bares. Leading the epee division will be Ron Farrow, whose 1957 mark of 20-5 was second best in the event. This division also had returning monogram winners in John Kearns, James Jock, and Daniel Clancy. Peter Giaimo is an outstanding sophomore prospect.

Coach Langford, also the head of the Modern Language Department of the University and a former Irish tennis coach, took over the reins of the fencers in 1951 after having previously tutored them from 1940 until 1943, when the sport was discontinued during wartime. In eleven seasons, Langford's teams have won 102 and lost 25. Notre Dame's all-time fencing record stands at 170 victories against 42 defeats and two ties.

Coach Langford has the distinction of twice tying the all-time Notre Dame record for consecutive victories within the past five years. The record of 17 wins in a row was set by the undefeated 1935 and 1936 fencing teams, coached by Professor Pedro deLandero, who inaugurated fencing at Notre Dame in 1934. Langford's teams tied the record in 1952 and 1953, and duplicated the feat during the 1955 and 1956 seasons. Both times the Irish streak was halted by Illinois and by identical scores, 14-13.

Notre Dame has had three undefeated fencing seasons. Under Professor deLandero, the 1935 team finished with 7-0, and the 1936 compiled a 9-0 mark. In recent history, the 1950 fencing squad, under the direction of Herb Melton, ended with a 9-0 record. Melton, a pre-war Irish fencer, took over the coaching job for the four years following World War II, winning 31 and losing five.

Last season, the Irish fencers finished with 14 wins and but one loss in regular competition, and ninth in the N.C.A.A. tournament.

PROSPECTS

In his thirteenth season as Notre Dame fencing coach, Professor Walter Langford will try to keep a 19-meet win streak alive, but to be able to do this, he must replace his top men in the sabre event and his first and third men in the epee division. Gone via graduation is Captain Dick Fagon, who posted a three-year mark of 55 wins and 34 losses in the sabre, and was the leading sabre man in 1958, finishing 14th in the N.C.A.A. meet in his division. Also lost from the sabre team is Gerry Meyer, whose 24-11 record in 1958 was the second best in the event. Missing from the epee is Ron Farrow, number one in 1958 with a 32-6 mark. Farrow placed third in the N.C.A.A. meet. John Kearns, number three man in epee last year was also graduated.

However, Coach Langford has 10 monogram winners returning from last year's undefeated team (16-0), including three top performers in the foil. In this latter event, juniors Jim Russomano and Jerry Johnson and senior John Lauerman are the three returnees while co-captain Joe Klein, who missed the 1958 season with an injury, will bolster the sabre event. Senior monogram winners Pat Green and Tom Lee are the other two possible starters. Coach Langford has indicated this event has the greatest balance. Heading the epeeists will be co-captain Jim Jock, the number two man last year. Monogram winners Dan Clancy and Jim Brogan, along with juniors John Ronayne and Peter Giaimo and sophomores John Donlon and Jim Clarke, are others likely to see action. Rudy Ehrensing, a sophomore, may help in the sabre division.

Coach Langford, also the head of the Modern Language Department of the University and a former Irish tennis coach, took over the reins of the fencers in 1951 after previously having tutored them from 1940 until 1943, when the sport was discontinued during wartime. In twelve seasons, Langford's teams have won 118 and lost 25. Notre Dame's all time fencing record stands at 186 victories against 42 defeats and two ties.

Coach Langford last year directed the Irish to an undefeated season in 16 meets, and these coupled with three wins at the end of the 1957 season, set a new school record for consecutive victories. Coach Langford previously had tied the old Notre Dame record of 17 wins originally set by the undefeated 1935 and 1936 teams, coached by Professor Pedro deLandro, who inaugurated fencing at Notre Dame in 1934.

Notre Dame has had three other undefeated seasons in fencing. Under Professor deLandro, the 1935 team finished 7-0, and the 1936 team compiled a 9-0 mark.
