PROSPE CTS

In starting his fourteenth year as Notre Dame's fencing coach, Professor Walter Langford will be faced with the problem of overcoming the loss of the first five men in the sabre event and the first three men in the epee along with the number three man in the foil. Graduation losses took Co-Captains Joe Klein and Jim Jock, and Tom Lee and Pat Green, who were number two and three respectively behind Klein in the sabre. Klein was 23-10 last year, Lee 18-11 and Green 18-14. Jock finished a three-year career with a 70-20 mark. John Lauerman, who was number three foil man, posted a 26-8 mark last year.

Coach Langford will have six monogram winners returning from last year's team which posted a 13-2 record. The veterans are headed by senior co-captains Jerry Johnson and Jim Russomano, both of whom have won two monograms in the foil event. Johnson is 58-19 for two years and Russomano 67-11. Norb Spitzer is another monogram winner in foil. Seniors John Ronayne and Pete Giaimo and junior John Donlon, all of whom earned monograms last year, bolster the epee but none of the trio took part in more than 10 meets. Terry Laughlin, who was a monogram winner in 1957, has returned to school to help the epee event. The sabre will likely go to seniors Ted DeBaene and John Wursta and junior Rudy Ehrensing, although several sophomores are in the running.

Coach Langford, also the head of the Modern Language Department of the University and a former Irish tennis coach, took over the reins of the fencers in 1951 after previously having tutored them from 1940 until 1943, when the sport was discontinued during wartime. In thirteen seasons, Langford's teams have won 131 and lost 27. Notre Dame's all time fencing record stands at 199 victories against 44 defeats and two ties in 23 years.

Coach Langford in 1958 directed the Irish to an undefeated season in 16 meets, and these coupled with three wins at the end of the 1957 season and six wins at the beginning of last year, set a new school record for consecutive victories.

Notre Dame has had three other undefeated seasons in fencing. Under Professor Pedro deLandero, the 1935 team finished 7-0, and the 1936 team compiled a 9-0 mark. In recent history, the 1950 fencing squad under the direction of Herb Melton finished with a 9-0 record.

Last year, Notre Dame finished eighth in the N.C.A.A. tournament.

PROSPECTS/

Professor Walter Langford will be facing the biggest rebuilding job of his career this year as he begins his fifteenth season as head coach of the Notre Dame fencing team. Graduation took practically his whole squad from last year, leaving only two monogram winners out of a total of 14. Gone are the top four men in the foil division, five out of the top six in the epee, and three out of the top four sabre men. Among these losses are last year's co-captains, Jerry Johnson (30-9 record last year, 88-28 for his career) and Jim Russomano (33-6 last year, 90-17 career) in the foil. In the epee, it was Pete Giaimo (27-5) and Jim Radde (27-7) who were lost, along with Ted DeBaene (30-11) in the sabre. In addition, Russomano, finishing in sixth place, Giaimo in seventh, and DeBaene in seventeenth brought the squad seventh place in the NCAA Fencing Championships at Champaign, Illinois, last

The two returning veterans whom Coach Langford must build his team around this season are his two co-captains for 1961, seniors John Donlon and Mike Curtin. Donlon, from Farmingdale, N.Y., has a 19-11 record for the past two seasons of competition, and will be counted on to provide a lot of strength in the epee. Two others expected to help here will be senior Miguel Fernandez and junior Dan Kenney. Curtin, who calls Tulsa, Okla., home, had a 6-3 record last year, and will be pacing the foil this season, closely followed by junior Tom Dwyer. With no monogram winners returning in the sabre, the top spot is up for grabs among three men who picked up some experience last spring: seniors Rudy Ehrensing and Larry Keough, and a junior, Tom Shipp.

Although the squad is inexperienced and weak in some areas, Coach Langford has exhibited in past years a definite capability for developing strong teams out of green and supposedly weak material. His over-all record for fourteen seasons of coaching now stands at 145-29, and in the last five years his teams have lost only seven meets while winning 72, and have never finished lower than eighth in the NCAA Championships. Professor Langford, until recently the head of the Modern Language Department of the University and a former Irish tennis coach, took over the reins of the fencers in 1951 after previously having tutored them from 1940 until 1943, when the sport was discontinued during wartime. PROSPECTS

Mike DeCicco enters his first season as head coach with four monogram men returning--seven monogram winners were lost by graduation. But to have a successful season DeCicco will be counting on men with little or no experience to come through.

The four monogram men--all seniors--are co-captains Dan Kenney and Tom Shipp, Tom Dwyer, and Mike Bishko. Kenney (20-15 last year) will be taking over All-American John Donlon's spot in the epee. Juniors John Ricci and John Wagner, and Sophomores Stephen Dreher and Dick Marks round out this division which could become the strongest for the Irish. Dreher, who is considered the brightest prospect in the last few years, finished first in the varsity tournament. Tom Shipp (24-19) will head the Irish sabre event which seems to be the weakest division. Others who should lend support are Senior Leonard McCue, Juniors Ralph DeMatteis and Mike Connor, and Sophomore Sam Crimone. The foil division offers the most experience with Tom Dwyer (25-16) and Mike Bishko (18-12) giving DeCicco a good nucleus. Seniors Ed Barton and Mike Zwettler will back them up.

In the NCAA tournament last season, the Notre Damers finished 13th. This marked the first time since 1956 that the Irish weren't in the top ten. DeCicco hopes to regain this status by producing a team with over-all balance in the three events.

PROSPECTS

The 1962-63 Notre Dame fencing squad, with experience in all three divisions, should be vastly improved, according to head coach Mike DeCicco. Last season's team finished with a 7-8 won-lost mark. This was only the third losing season in Notre Dame fencing history.

Entering his second year as Irish mentor, Mike DeCicco is guardedly optimistic about the team's chances for the '62-63 campaign. He has eight monogram men returning this fall, compared with last season's total of four.

The Epee division once again must be considered the most powerful, with four varsity returnees. Along with co-captain John Wagner is senior John Ricci and juniors Dick Marks and Steve Dreher. In the foil division, senior Tom Dwyer is the single returning monogram man, and is expected to be the squad's most consistent winner. Backing up Dwyer are juniors Jack Joyce and Jack Tate, who are both expected to see plenty of action. Co-captain Ralph DeMatteis and Jim Connor, both seniors, and junior Sam Crimone will form the nucleus of this year's Sabre team. All three are monogram winners.

After a 17-meet season, top members of the squad wil be chosen to compete in the 1963 NCAA Tournament, to be held on March 30-31, at the United States Air Force Academy in Denver. Colorado.

PROSPECTS

With but seven monogram men returning to face another tough schedule, Coaches Mike DeCicco and Walter Langford will rely on a crop of highly improved juniors and some promising sophomores.

Optimistically, however, stalwarts such as Sam Crimone, Steve Dreher, Jack Joyce, and Dick Marks will form the all-important nucleus of the squad. The sabre division, headed by co-captain Crimone, will be strengthened by senior Will Kennedy and junior Mike Dwyer. This could be the strongest weapon for the Irish as all three have earned monograms. In the foil, the ND forte last season, only one monogram-winning veteran, senior co-captain Jack Joyce, is returning, but he will receive a boost from twins Joe and Mike McQuade, and Bill Ferrence - all juniors who saw little action last year but looked very strong in pre-season competition. Senior monogram winners Dick Marks and Steve Dreher will set the pace in the epee with a pair of sophomores and a junior fighting for the other starting berth.

This season, the Irish have complemented their schedule with the addition of Syracuse after their one-year absence from the list of ND opponents. The NCAA tourney will take place on March 21-22 at Harvard University in Cambridge, Mass. Last season's Notre Dame three-man team placed 10th in the NCAA competition.
