

## **About Notre Dame**

- The University of Notre Dame sits on 1,250 acres containing two lakes and has 137 buildings.
- The Basilica of the Sacred Heart, the 14–story Hesburgh Library with its 132–feet–high mural depicting Christ the Teacher, and the University's beautifully renovated 128–year–old Main Build-ing with its famed 23.9 Karat Golden Dome are among the most widely known university landmarks in the world.
- Notre Dame has 8,332 undergraduate students and a total enrollment of 11,479 students.

• Notre Dame is rated among the nation's top 25 institutions of higher learning in surveys conducted by U.S. News and World Report, Princeton he University of Notre Dame, founded in 1842 by Rev. Edward F. 





• Notre Dame ranks fifth in a listing of "dream schools" in a survey of parents by the *Princeton Review*. The top seven are Stanford, Princeton, Harvard, Brown, Notre Dame, Duke, and Boston College.

## **STUDENTS**

- Notre Dame's graduation rate of 95 percent is exceeded by only Harvard and Princeton.
- Notre Dame's 98 percent retention rate between the freshman and sophomore years is among the highest in the country, thanks in large part to the University's unique First Year of Studies Program.
- Notre Dame has one of the highest undergraduate residential concentrations of any national university, with 80 percent of its students living in 27 residence halls. Some 40 Holy Cross religious leaders continue to live and provide a pastoral presence in the halls.
- Graduate and undergraduate students at the University come from all 50 states and more than 100 countries worldwide.

## UNIVERSITY LEADERSHIP

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., took office as the 17th president of the University of Notre Dame on July 1, 2005. He was elected by the University's Board of Trustees to a fiveyear term April 30, 2004.

An associate professor of philosophy and member of Notre Dame's faculty since 1990, Father Jenkins had served from 2000-2005 as a vice president and associate provost at the University.

Prior to his service in the pro-

vost's office, Father Jenkins had been religious superior of the Holy Cross priests and brothers at Notre Dame for three years. As religious superior, he was a Fellow and Trustee of the University, but he relinquished those posts to assume his duties in the provost's office.

Father Jenkins earned degrees in philosophy from Oxford University in 1987 and 1989. He earned his master of divinity degree and licentiate in sacred theology from the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, Calif., in 1988.

Prior to entering the Congregation of Holy Cross, he earned bachelor's and master's degrees in philosophy from Notre Dame in 1976 and 1978, respectively. Father Jenkins was ordained a priest in Notre Dame's Basilica of the Sacred Heart in 1983. He served as director of the Old College program for Notre Dame undergraduate candidates for the Congregation of Holy Cross from 1991 to 1993.

A native of Omaha, Neb., Father Jenkins was born Dec. 17, 1953.

**John B. "Jack" Swarbrick Jr.**, a Notre Dame graduate who has risen to national prominence as a lawyer, consultant and executive in the collegiate and Olympic sports industries, was appointed July 16, 2008 as the University's 12<sup>th</sup> director of athletics.

Raised in Yonkers, N.Y., and Bloomington, Ind., Swarbrick is a 1976 magna cum laude graduate of Notre Dame with a bachelor's degree in economics. Upon graduating from Stanford Law School in 1980, he returned to Indiana to accept a position as an associate in the Indianapolis law firm Baker & Daniels. He was made partner in 1987.

At the same time that Swarbrick began his career, the city of Indianapolis was beginning its effort to become a world-class center for amateur and professional athletics. An employment law specialist, Swarbrick soon shifted his focus to sports and quickly became active in the city's initiatives.

As a member of the Indiana Sports Corp., including the chairmanship from 1992 to 2001, Swarbrick led many of the city's successful proposals to a wide array of athletics organizations – from the NFL to the U.S. Olympic Committee to the Big Ten Conference. His leadership efforts have resulted in the city:

- Earning the bid to host the 2012 Super Bowl to Indianapolis
- Becoming the home of the NCAA national headquarters
- Hosting the 1987 Pan American Games
- Hosting the 1991 World Gymnastics Championships
- Hosting NCAA Final Fours and other college championship competitions and a wide array of national and world championships in the Olympic sports
- Securing rights to host the Big Ten Conference men's and women's basketball tournaments for five consecutive years beginning in 2008

Swarbrick's work has focused on the representation of owners of sports teams and organizations which sanction or conduct athletic competitions. He has served as general counsel for numerous national governing bodies of Olympic sports, including USA Gymnastics and USRowing, and as a consultant to the 1996 Olympic Games. He also served as president and chief executive officer of LMiV, an Internet-based network of radio stations.

- In his work as an advisor to the NCAA, Swarbrick has:
- Coordinated the men's College Basketball Partnership, an NCAA-led group that addresses the opportunities and challenges in the sport
- Worked with the NCAA's Corporate Partners and Champions Program
- Served as a member of the NCAA Division I women's Basketball Discussion Group
- Chaired the NCAA/USOC task force dedicated to developing proposals to expand sponsorship of Olympic sports among NCAA member institutions
- Developed the business plan for the new NBA/NCAA youth basketball enterprise Before accepting the offer to lead his alma mater's athletics department. Swarbrick had been a finalist for several high-profile positions in college athletics, including presi-

dent of the NCAA and commissioner of the Big 12 Conference.

Swarbrick and his wife, Kimberly, are the parents of four children: Kate, a junior at St. Louis University; Connor, a sophomore at Wake Forest University; Cal, a junior in high school; and Christopher, a high school sophomore.





# A C A D E M I C EXCELLENCE

Notre Dame's Academic Services for Student-Athletes, housed in the Coleman-Morse Building, is designed to help Notre Dame fulfill its commitment to all student-athletes in their pursuit of a college degree and academic excellence.

In order to achieve these goals, Academic Services has several major objectives:

- 1. Maintain the academic integrity of the University
- 2. Help student-athletes maximize their academic potential


he University of Notre Dame ranks number one in the country in terms of graduating its student-athletes, according to statistics released recently by the NCAA.

- 3. Comply with University and NCAA rules and regulations
- 4. Assist every student-athlete as they work towards graduation in four years

Academic Services provides many services that begin when First Year students arrive on campus and continue through graduation. Services provided include but are not limited to:

- Consistent counseling and appropriate interventions regarding academic matters
- Refer student-athletes to campus offices where they can meet regularly with their professors and college advisors
- Monitoring the progress of student-athletes through regular communication with professors
- Provide tutorial assistance for the student-athletes

A new computer/study space was completed inside the Coleman-Morse Building for the start of the 2007-08 school year. This new 2,500 square-foot room can handle any combination of 80 student-athletes or tutors at once. There are also nine study rooms used for small group meetings or private sessions with tutors. The study space has approximately 20 desktop computers available for use and has wireless connections available for laptops.





Whether measured by the federal government in its Department of Education report or by the NCAA through its newer Graduation Success Rate (GSR) numbers, graduation rates for Notre Dame student-athletes rank among the national leaders in most categories among major football-playing colleges and universities.

# ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Eight years ago, the Notre Dame department of athletics and the University embarked on creating an ambitious athletics facility master plan so Irish student-athletes would have access to state-of-the-art venues for practice, training and competition.

That blueprint, which touched nearly every varsity sport, continues to come to life. By the time the plan in completed, the entire area just east of the Joyce Center and north of Edison Road will boast a comprehensive and impressive athletic quad.

## NEW FACILITIES Alumni Soccer Stadium

• The new \$5.7 million stadium had its groundbreaking April 26, 2008 and is expected to be completed in June 2009. The stadium will be a lighted facility that will feature a natural grass field, locker rooms, restrooms, concession areas and 2,000 seats.

## Arlotta Family Lacrosse Stadium

• Groundbreaking for the \$5 million facility occurred April 17, 2008 and is expected to be completed in June 2009. Arlotta Stadium will feature 2,000 seats, lights, an artifical-turf field, locker rooms, restrooms and concession area.

## Melissa Cook Stadium

• Located on the southeast corner of campus, the new softball stadium opened April 12, 2008 and can accommodate up to 1,500 fans.

## **TRACK STADIUM**

• Ground was broken for construction of the \$3 million outdoor track in June 2008. The new nine-lane facility will meet IAAF guidelines and completion is expected in late October 2008.

## LABAR FOOTBALL PRACTICE FIELDS

• Three new practice fields adjacent to the Guglielmino Athletics Complex will be ready for the start of fall practice in August 2008. Two of the fields will be FieldTurf and the third will be natural grass.



## **RENOVATED FACILITIES** Purcell Pavilion

• Home to the Irish men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad, construction on the \$26.3 million Joyce Center Arena addition and renovation will begin in September 2008.

## CHARLES W. "LEFTY" SMITH, JR. ICE RINK

• Tentative plans for a \$30 million facility will create a new home for the Irish hockey team within the Joyce Center fieldhouse. The project would increase capacity to 4,000 while improving locker rooms, concessions and restrooms.

## **PROSPECTIVE NEW FACILITIES** Outdoor Tennis Complex

• The \$4.9 million project will create a new outdoor playing and practice home with seating for 2,000 and will meet NCAA requirements to host national championships on the Notre Dame campus.


## **Rowing Boathouse**

• A new boathouse for the rowing team eventually will be constructed near the existing boathouse on the St. Joseph River.

## SPORTS MEDICINE

## **Sports Medicine**

- Head athletic trainer and physical therapist Jim Russ oversees a staff of three associate and eight assistant athletic trainers, plus two physical therapist/athletic trainers, all of whom are certified and boast nearly 200 years of collective experience.
- Irish athletes have access to three state-of-the-art sports medicine facilities in the Joyce Center, Notre Dame Stadium and the Guglielmino Athletics Complex.
- The Guglielmino facility encompasses more than 8,500 squarefeet of cutting-edge sports medicine technology including the latest in physical therapy modalities and rehabilitation equipment, with two 3,500-gallon therapy pools, a full x-ray unit and an MRI machine.




## STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

- Director of strength and conditioning Ruben Mendoza is in charge of a department that has eight full-time coaches, an intern and a nutritionist.
- The 25,000 square foot Haggar Fitness Complex is located between the Loftus Sports Center and Guglielmino Athletics Complex.
- The Haggar Fitness Complex features a three-lane development track, a 45x18 yard Prestige Turf plyometric agility area, a Gatorade hydration station, six giant plasma screen televisions and a state-of-the-art sound system with 28 speakers and four subwoofers.

## **Directors' Cup Standings**

For the 10th straight year in 2007-08, Notre Dame posted a top-25 finish (21st) in the United States Sports Academy Division I Directors' Cup all-sports competition sponsored by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (formerly known as Sears Directors' Cup).

Notre Dame is among 14 schools to earn a top-25 finish in each of the past 10 years (1999-2008), as Irish programs finished 25th in '99, 21st in 2000, 11th in '01, 13th in '02 and '03, 19th in '04, 16th in '05, sixth in '06, 22nd in '07 and 21st in '08.



## ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

## **Post-Graduate Scholarships:**

• Notre Dame has had 44 student-athletes receive a postgraduate scholarship from the NCAA since the program was founded in 1964. During the 2007-08 school year, John Carlson (football) and Brett Lilley (baseball) became the most recent recipients of the prestigious scholarship.

# STUDENT WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT

## STUDENT WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT

- The Student Welfare and Development Program implements events and activities that are designed to facilitate learning within five key areas: academic excellence, athletic success, career preparation, community involvement and personal development.
- The program has three components: elective services (community service, leadership, social events); complementary services (encourages administrators and coaches to request coordination of workshops, events and activities); and essential services (student-athletes participate in a series of required skill-building and developmental workshops and activities).
- The Student Welfare and Developmental Program, founded in 1996, continuously seeks to develop programs that educate student-athletes on current issues, so as to ensure that when they graduate from the University, they are prepared to successfully meet the challenges of life.

## **COMMUNITY SERVICE**

- More than 92 percent of Notre Dame's student-athletes (from all 26 varsity teams) participated in community service activities during the 2007-08 school year.
- Irish student-athletes completed more than 5,000 hours of community service while assisting more than 50 non-profit organizations and schools.

# SOUTH BEND

outh Bend and Mishawaka are the two largest cities in St. Joseph County and help boost the population of the area to 266,431.

- The College Football Hall of Fame is located in downtown South Bend.
- The Studebaker National Museum is located in South Bend and displays carriages of four U.S. Presidents, prototypes and industrial treasures.
- The community's version of "Willy Wonka" can be found at The South Bend Chocolate Company and Chocolate Museum.
- Adventurers can enjoy both rafting and kayaking on the East Race Waterway, the first artificial whitewater course in North America.
- During the summer, the South Bend Silver Hawks (the Class A minor league affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks) plays at Coveleski Stadium.
- On Friday's prior to an Irish home football game, downtown South Bend features a Football Friday Tent Party with live music, food and drink on the grounds of the College Football Hall of Fame.








## Monogram Club

• The Notre Dame Monogram Club is comprised of nearly 7,000 individuals who have earned the University's varsity athletic insignia for their



athletic or team-support endeavors or who have been honorarymonogram recipients.

• Yearly dues entitle members to a variety of benefits: annual golf outing; membership card; the *Inside Irish* publication; members' children eligible for Brennan-Boland-Riehle scholarship at Notre Dame; and ticket applications for home football games.

## Alumni

- The University's network of 275 alumni clubs—including 60 international clubs—is the most extensive in higher education.
- The Notre Dame Alumni Association's current membership reaches nearly 110,000.
- With graduates renowned for their loyalty and generosity, Notre Dame annually ranks among the top five in percentage of alumni who contribute to the University.
- In the world of business, Notre Dame alumni serve in chief executive and other leadership positions at firms such as Andrews McMeel Publishing; the Chicago Mercantile Exchange; General Electric; Goldman, Sachs & Co.; Haggar Company; Marriott Corp.; Merck & Company; and Office Depot.


## Glossary

**Academic All-Americans** – The 2006-07 season proved to be a banner one, both on the fields of competition and in the classroom, for the Notre Dame track & field/cross country program. The Irish had four student-athletes earn *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, led by middle distance runner Thomas Chamney, who was a first-team selection in 2007 after picking up third-team plaudits in '06.

Chamney became the fifth Irish track and field athlete to be tabbed a two-time Academic All-American and the fourth to earn first-team honors. The three-time All-American on the track earned a Bachelor's Degree from the College of Arts and Letters in 2007, graduating with a 3.56 cumulative grade point average in English.

Joining Chamney as 2007 Academic All-Americans were sprinter Maryann Erigha and distance harriers Sunni Olding and Todd Ptacek. The honors were the first for each athlete. Erigha was also awarded an Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award (first team) along with fellow sprinter Okechi Ogbuokiri (fourth team), and was a recipient of Notre Dame's Byron V. Kanaley Award for exemplary scholarship and leadership among senior monogram winners.

Through the years, the Notre Dame track & field/cross country program has produced 20 student-athletes who have been awarded a place on the *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-America Team a total of 26 times. The program has been especially strong the past four seasons, as 10 athletes have combined to garner 14 Academic All-America certificates, including four first-team berths.


<u>All-America Streak</u> – Irish runners have a proven record in national championship meets, as evidenced by their current line of All-America citations.

The Irish men's track & field team is on a streak of 17 years (1990-2007) with at least one competitor earning All-America honors (the Irish have amassed 166 All-America honors since 1921). The Notre Dame women's track & field team has enjoyed at least one All-America performance each season since 1997 (ten-year streak) and 38 overall since 1994.

**All-American (Two Sports)** – Former Irish great Raghib "Rocket" Ismail is part of an exclusive group of four student-athletes who have combined All-America honors in football and another sport during their Notre Dame careers. Ismail was a two-time consensus first-team All-American in football (1989, 1990) and also earned All-America honors on the track as a sprinter in 1991.

The other members of this elite club are: Edward "Moose" Krause (football 1932; basketball 1932-34), Dick Arrington (football 1965; wrestling 1966) and Bob Golic (football 1977-78; wrestling 1978-79).

Recently-departed high jumper Emily Loomis narrowly missed becoming the first female student-athlete in school history to join this group. She earned her first track All-America citation with a tie for eighth place in the outdoor high jump at the 2006 NCAA Championship, in addition to earning honorable mention All-America laurels in volleyball following the 2003 campaign. Technically, Notre Dame has not considered honorable mention selections in its final count of All-Americans.

Aragon - Former Irish track and cross country standout Dr. Chuck Aragon was presented with the Spirit of Notre Dame Award during the Notre Dame-Michigan game in the fall of 1992. The award, sponsored by Maxwell House and General Foods, recognized Notre Dame athletes, past and present, who distinguished themselves in competition, demonstrated the "Spirit of Notre Dame" and exhibited the ideals of the University. Aragon captained both the Notre Dame cross country and track teams during his career (1977-81) and was the first Irish subfour-minute miler. An All-American and bronze medalist in the 1,500 meters at the Pan Am Games, he placed fourth in the 1984 Olympic Trials. Aragon, who completed his residency in anesthesiology, donated many hours to the Logan Center while at Notre Dame.

**Back to the Bend** – Although the Irish won their only cross country national championship in 1957, the bus ride home from East Lansing, Mich., was anything but a celebration. In 26degree weather, the Irish upset heavily-favored Michigan State, but when coach Alex Wilson added up the team's score of 121 points, he felt the score was extremely high to contend for the title. As a result, he and his team packed up and took the bus back to South Bend. About halfway home the stunning news came over the bus radio, Notre Dame had defeated Michigan State by six points.

**Coaching Tree** – Although one of Notre Dame's oldest varsity programs (dating back to 1890), the Irish track and field team didn't bring on its first coach until 1916, when Knute Rockne took the job. He held that position until 1927, starting a trend of stability among Irish track coaches.

Current Notre Dame track & field coach Joe Piane is perhaps the best example of this, as he is in his 34th year at the helm of the Irish. Piane is the longest-tenured coach among active mentors at Notre Dame, with men's swimming coach Tim Welsh next in line with his 23rd season on tap in 2008-09.

**Deeter** – JoAnna Deeter ended her career as one of the best women's cross country and track and field runners in Irish history. A native of Glen Ellyn, Ill., Deeter earned All-America status twice for cross country in 1996 and 1998 and three times in track & field, all in 1999. Included in her accomplishments were two then-school records - the indoor and outdoor 3,000 and the 10,000.

**Fifth** – One-fifth of a mile (approx. 320 meters) is the length of the Meyo Track, the largest collegiate indoor surface in the country and the home track for the Irish indoor teams. First opened in 1988, the track was named for Ray and Marie Meyo of Brecksville, Ohio, and is made of the Mondo track surface featuring six 42-inch lanes.

The Meyo Track has established itself as one of the fastest surfaces in the nation and welcomes a number of high-class athletes in a "last chance" meet (the Alex Wilson Invitational) who are attempting to qualify for the NCAA

Indoor Championship. The Meyo Invitational, which features the "Meyo Mile" (a special race that features many of the top milers in the nation) and the Alex Wilson Invitational are fixtures on the Notre Dame indoor track & field schedule each season.

**Football Players** – The Notre Dame football and track & field programs are two of the oldest varsity sports on the Irish campus. There have been a number of football stars who have crossed over to the track, or the field, and left an impression on the track and field program. Just a glance at the Notre Dame track and field record book shows the effect that football players have had on it. Raghib "Rocket" Ismail, who finished second in the Heisman Trophy balloting in 1990, holds the school record for the indoor 55 meters and finished as an All-American in 1991.

Former Irish defensive back Allen Rossum (now a standout return specialist with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons) currently holds the school record in the indoor 60 meters (6.68), former running back Randy Kinder set the indoor 200meter record in 21.11, former receiver Ryan Postel owns the indoor 400-meter record (47.01) and former halfback Aubrey Lewis holds the top mark in the 400-meter hurdles (50.2).

Some football players who also earned monograms on the track include 1987 Heisman Trophy winner Tim Brown, Jack Elder, Edward "Moose" Krause, Elmer Layden, Dean Lytle, Ryan Mihalko (the school-record holder in the javelin), Dwight Ellick, Terrail Lambert (still active in football), Creighton Miller and Knute Rockne.

**Ghana** – The impact of Notre Dame track can be felt around the world as evidenced by William P. Mahoney, an Irish alumnus who served as the U.S. ambassador to Ghana under the Kennedy Administration. A sprinter for coach John Nicholson, Mahoney took over the coaching duties when Nicholson died in 1940. Mahoney guided the team to an unofficial victory in the Drake Relays before he entered the Navy in 1942.


**Golden Anniversary** – The 2006 season marked the 51st running of the Notre Dame Invitational cross country meet, one of the nation's oldest and largest intercollegiate races. The invitational was started by former Irish head coach Alex Wilson in 1956 as a four-mile race, extended to five miles in 1968 and a women's competition added in 1987. Notre Dame has won the men's event 15 times (most recently in 2003) and the women's race on six occasions (also last doing so in 2003).

**Heisman** – Achieving success on both the track and the football field was the trademark of former Irish runners Tim Brown and Raghib "Rocket" Ismail. Brown won the 1987 Heisman Trophy in addition to running with the track team during the offseason. Brown owned the school record in the 55 meters until 1990 when '90 Heisman runner-up Ismail ran 6.07 in the event, and eventually went on to earn track All-America honors by finishing second in the 1991 NCAA indoor 55 meters.

**Hurd** – Dr. Bill Hurd was honored in 2002 at the annual Notre Dame Monogram Club dinner with the Moose Krause Distinguished Service Award, the highest honor presented by the Monogram Club. A world-class sprinter and 1969 Notre Dame graduate with a degree in electrical engineering, Hurd now is a noted eye surgeon, with an ophthalmology practice in Memphis that specializes in cataract, glaucoma and diabetic treatment and keratorefractive surgery.

Hurd annually spends 2-3 weeks providing voluntary eye surgery to the poor in Africa, Mexico and Brazil. On the most recent trip to Madagascar, he and two other doctors saw 1,100 patients in 10 days and he performed 35 eye surgeries – with Hurd and his colleagues increasingly in demand as their reputation grows.

Hurd's days of distinction as a collegian included being named Notre Dame's "athlete of the year" for 1967-68 and establishing the American indoor record in the 300-yard dash (29.8). He set eight Notre Dame records and totaled five All-America finishes at the 1968 and '69 NCAA meets (only two Notre Dame student-athletes ever have totaled more All-America honors).

He also was a finalist (top eight) at the Olympic Trials in the 100 and 200 meters, finishing fifth in the 100 to just miss a spot on the Olympic squad (his competitors included the likes of Jim Hines, John Carlos, Tommy Smith and Mel Gray). Hurd – who added graduate degrees from Massachesetts Institute of Technology (master's in management science) and Meaharry Medical School in Nashville – was a Rhodes Scholarship regional finalist and received Notre Dame's Harvey Foster Award in 1992 (recognizing alumni for distinguished civic activity) and the NCAA's prestigious Silver Anniversary Award in 1994 (recognizing career success and community service). He holds two U.S./foreign patents for optical devices, including a slit-lamp, mountable intraocular biometer.

Also an accomplished jazz musician, Hurd recently completed work on his fourth CD, in which he plays the saxophone and flute.

Hurd and his wife Rhynette, an attorney, have sent both of their sons to Notre Dame. One of his sons, Ryan, was a four-year monogram winner on the Irish track & field team from 2001-04.

**Jinx** – Although Irish great Greg Rice is widely regarded as one of the best distance runners of all time, his coach only saw him race once during his Notre Dame career. Coach John Nicholson superstitiously felt he jinxed Rice during races and therefore stayed in South Bend while Rice traveled to meets. The only race Nicholson saw was perhaps one of Rice's finest as he outdueled Taisto Maki and Don Lash to win a three-mile race in 13:52.2. Unfortunately, the race would also be Nicholson's last as the coach died two days later from complications of a heart attack that he suffered just hours before the competition. **Lieb** – Tom Lieb, an Irish shot put thrower in the early 20's, is credited with introducing the spin-style delivery to the sport, a style which is still used today. Lieb won the NCAA title in the event during the 1923 and 1924 seasons.

**Loftus Center/Guglielmino Athletics Complex** – Notre Dame first utilized the Loftus Center in October of 1987 and is enjoying its 22nd full season of use in 2008-09. The indoor facility is highlighted by Meyo Field, a Prestige Turf surface installed in 2003 that is shared with several Irish field sport teams, including the football and lacrosse programs. The Loftus Center is connected to the Guglielmino Athletics Complex, which features the 25,000-square foot Haggar Fitness Center, a facility holding more than 250 pieces of weight training equipment, six plasma televisions and a state-of-the-art sound system. It also houses the 150-seat Isban Auditorium as well as plentiful meeting space.

**Meyo Invitational** – Four minutes, one mile. For years it was the unbreakable barrier and it remains among the most celebrated feats in all of sport. Folks that know the sport of track and field will tell you that 3:40 in the 1,500 or 7:55 in the 3,000 are just as impressive, but to the casual fan there is something about the simplicity of it; four laps, four minutes, one mile.

In February 2009, the 22nd annual Meyo Invitational will return to the Loftus Sports Center on Notre Dame's campus with the marquee event at the meet being the Meyo Mile. In the past six seasons, 13 runners have broken the magical four-minute mark, highlighted by two

of the most exciting races at Notre Dame in recent memory.

In 2003, Notre Dame senior Luke Watson won the race in school record time (3:57.83), moving into the lead a mere 30 meters from the finish line. After the dust had settled, the top five in the race were each in under four minutes, each within a half second of the others and each owned one of the five fastest times in the world that year.

The 2005 race turned out to be just as thrilling, with four runners breaking the fourminute barrier, including a pair of Notre Dame athletes (Watson, running unattached, and sophomore Kurt Benninger). All four sub-four minute runners earned automatic qualification to the NCAA Indoor Championship and Benninger's time of 3:58.75 put him less than a second off Watson's school-record mark of two years earlier. Notably, Indiana's Sean and John Jefferson also became the first American brothers to run sub-four minute miles.

The Invitational, as well as the Meyo Mile, are the brainchild of Irish head track & field coach Joe Piane. When the Loftus Center was built, Notre Dame installed a track that was oversized (one-fifth of a mile, or approximately 320 meters) and topped with a Mondo surface, which produced a rare and very fast combination.

Piane recounted the invention of the Invitational, "We put the meet together because it was a huge track and it was attractive to just give it a try. The name comes from Ray Meyo, who donated everything, and we decided to highlight the mile because even the average person knows that a sub-four-minute mile is very good, so we put together a 'four minute challenge' knowing that if the race did go under four minutes, everyone was going to say, 'Wow! This is really something."

The Meyo Mile, however will not be the only great event on the weekend. The Meyo Invitational is always packed with outstanding performances from start to finish. In 2007 athletes registered 85 automatic or provisional qualifications for the NCAA Championship, and through the years, numerous track and school records have been shattered. In fact, six meet records and three track marks went by the boards during the 2007 meet alone.

**National Champions** – Fifteen Irish athletes have won 16 national track titles during the program's history, in addition to the two individual crowns and one team championship in cross country. The most recent track champion was Ryan Shay, who ran away with the 10,000 meters at the 2001 NCAA Championships in Eugene, Ore.

Before Shay's triumphant victory, Notre Dame's last track & field champion was Tom McMannon who won the 55-meter high hurdles in 1972. Greg Rice (1938) and Oliver

Hunter (1942) were individual cross country champions, while coach Alex Wilson's 1957 squad won the NCAA cross country national championship.

**Pioneer** – Harry M. Jewett was the first recognized Notre Dame track and field athlete, making his debut in 1890 at a relay invitational in Ann Arbor, Mich. The school was next represented in 1898 and the Irish have competed in every year since then with the exception of 1906.

Rockne - The name that has become synonymous with Notre Dame football also was involved in the Irish track scene. After a difficult freshman year as a reserve on the varsity football team, Knute Rockne turned his attention to track where he earned a monogram and, as legend has it, once broke the world record in the indoor pole vault with his best effort of 12-4, but held it for such a brief period that he never received official recognition for it. Rockne became the University's first track coach in 1916 and the first cross country mentor in 1920. During his tenure, Rockne guided five Olympians and two Olympic medalists. The coach resigned his track responsibilities in 1928 to devote his energy to football until his death in 1931.

**Roof Top Coaching** – Injured by a wild discus throw, John P. Nicholson (Irish track coach from 1927-40) sat on the roof of a car and shouted instructions to his runners through a megaphone during training. The method proved so effective that Nicholson made the car a regular part of his training regimen.

**Scholarships** – Beginning with the 2004-05 season, all 26 varsity programs at the University of Notre Dame received the full NCAA complement of scholarships.

"Fully scholarshipping all our programs will help us realize our goals over the next five or six years of pushing Notre Dame's athletic program toward a top finish in the annual NACDA Directors' Cup standings," former Director of Athletics Kevin White said.

"This eventually will put all of our programs in position to compete for national championships."

**<u>Starting Blocks</u>** – John P. Nicholson bestowed upon the track world perhaps his greatest innovation, the starting block. His starting block caught on in the late 1920s and was well-received by the track community.

"You have a device which will materially make short distance, hurdle and relay racing more popular with both the public and athletes," wrote former Illinois coach Harry Gill in a 1929 letter. "It appears to be a real help to track athletics."

John Griffith, former chairman of the NCAA track & field rules committee and commissioner of the Big Ten Conference, was equally impressed in a letter written the same year.

"I have studied the pictures of your new starting device with a great deal of interest, and am of the opinion that you have made a distinct contribution to track athletics."

**Sub-four** – Jake Watson made history on June 2nd, 2007 at the Music City Distance Carnival. It was there that he ran 3:59.4 over one mile, breaking the elusive four-minute barrier, but even more notably, joined his older brother Luke as just the second pair of brothers in American history to run sub-four minute miles. Luke, an Irish distance running legend and former assistant coach, first broke the barrier indoors at the 2002 Meyo Invitational. Jake performed the feat after earning his first career All-American honors during the 2007 track and field season. The Watsons (Stillwater, Minn.) join twins Sean and John Jefferson who both broke four minutes in the 2005 Meyo Mile.

**Varsity** – While the men's track & field and cross country teams are two of the oldest teams at Notre Dame, dating back to the 19th century, the women's program is only in its infancy. The women's cross country team is in its 22nd year and owns seven conference titles, including three BIG EAST crowns, all won in the past six seasons. The women's cross country team also has finished among the top 10 at the past four of the past five NCAA Championships, including a third-place outing in 2002 and a fourth-place showing in 2004.

The women's track & field squad enters its 18th season of varsity competition this year and has won seven league championships in that time (three in the BIG EAST) and advanced at least one runner to the NCAA Championship for the 11th consecutive year in 2007. In 2008, the Irish won their first-ever outdoor BIG EAST Championship, edging Louisville 120.5 to 106.5 in a total team effort.


J. Gregory Rice

All-American 1937-39 Sullivan Award Winner

Greg Rice, billed as the greatest distance runner the United States has ever produced, was presented with the 1940 Sullivan Trophy as the nation's top amateur athlete after he set a world three-mile record at the national championships. Named "the Little Man with a Big Finish," Rice smashed the world threemile record with a time of 13:51. He earned All-America honors in the mile in 1937, and also received those honors in the two-mile as he won the event in 1937 and '39 and placed second in 1938.

Rice was undefeated in 65 major indoor and outdoor races in just over three years with 10 world records in six different events. Rice became the first-ever cross country national champion in 1938 when he ran the four-mile course in 20:12.9 to lead the Irish to a second-place team finish.

Born in 1916, Rice died in May of 1991.



Nicholas Sparks

Monogram Winner 1987-88

Best-selling author Nicholas Sparks graduated in 1988 and was a two-time monogram winner in track & field. At Notre Dame, Sparks was a member of the 4x800-meter relay team, which still holds the outdoor school record.

After pursuing a variety of jobs after graduation, he wrote his first published novel entitled "The Notebook," which was released in 1996. It became one of only five novels published in the past 35 years that spent more than a year on the *New York Times* hardcover best seller list, and was eventually made into a movie in 2004 starring Ryan Gosling and Rachel McAdams.

His second novel, "Message in a Bottle," was published in 1998 and remained a bestseller for 43 weeks. The film version, starring Kevin Costner, Paul Newman and Robin Wright Penn, opened at number one at the box office and grossed more than \$100 million.

His third novel, "A Walk to Remember," was published in October 1999 and turned into a movie in 2002 starring Mandy Moore.

In 2004, he was honored by Notre Dame with the first-ever Rev. Robert F. Griffin, C.S.C., Award, for establishing an initiative in the University's Creative Writing Program that includes fellowships, internships and an annual Sparks Prize to support a student writer-in-residence.

Nicholas Sparks has been married for 17 years and has five children. He lives in New Bern, N.C., and still runs nine miles a day.



Alex Wilson

#### All-American 1930-32 Irish Track Coach 1950-72

A middle-distance track star at Notre Dame, Alex Wilson is a perfect example of an outstanding athlete and legendary coach.

While at Notre Dame, Wilson was undefeated in the quarter- and halfmile events and set a national indoor record of 49.3 for the 440 in 1932. He set records in both the 440 and 880 races. Wilson also won the Amateur Athletic Union 600 and twice captured the Milrose 600.

In 1928 and 1932, he competed in the Olympics for his native Canada and won a silver in the 800-meter race and a bronze in the 400-meter run in 1932.

In 1950, after 18 years as a successful track and swimming coach at Loyola (III.), he returned to coach at Notre Dame. During his 23 years with the Irish, his teams finished in the national top 10 11 times. Wilson guided three track national champions, 28 track and eight cross country All-Americans and led the Irish to the cross country national championship in 1957. His teams appeared in the meet a total of 18 times.

He was voted into the Canadian Track Hall of Fame in 1954 and in 1967 he was elected to the Helms Athletic Foundation Hall of Fame for his contributions as a track coach in the United States.

Wilson was also honored as national coach of the year by the NCAA Cross Country Coaches Association in 1972, and an indoor track and field meet is held in his honor each year at Notre Dame.

Wilson died on Dec. 10, 1994, at the age of 87.



### Rick Wohlhuter

All-American 1969-70 U.S. Olympian Sullivan Award Winner

Rick Wohlhuter, a two-time Olympian and 1971 Notre Dame graduate, was selected to the Track and Field Hall of Fame in 1991. Winner of an Olympic bronze medal in the 800 meters in 1976, he holds the distinction of being the last man to qualify for the Games in both the 800- and 1,500-meter events. Wohlhuter won the IC4A 880-yard title in 1971 and qualified for the Olympics in 1972.

In addition to his appearance in the Games, Wohlhuter broke the U.S. 800-meter record twice and twice set world records for the 880-yard race. He also set the world record for the 1,000 meters in 1974 and won the event the next three indoor seasons. Wohlhuter also won national outdoor titles in 1973 and '74. In 1974 he earned the Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete.

A 1970 NCAA champion in the 600-yard event, the two-time All-American was also a member of Notre Dame's two-mile relay team which placed second in the nation in 1969.

Wohlhuter joined John Beatty, the first man to break the four-minute mile indoors, high jumper Charles Dumas, a 1956 gold medalist and first jumper to clear seven feet, and Doris Brown-Heritage, winner of 14 U.S. distance titles and five world cross country championships, as the 1991 Track and Field Hall of Fame inductees.

Tameisha King

Four-time All-American Four-time BIG EAST Champion

Tameisha King graduated from Notre Dame in 2003, and left the University as its top female long jumper.


King owns both the indoor and outdoor school records for the long jump, in addition to running in the school record 4x100-meter relay.

She was a four-time All-American, with three of those honors coming during the outdoor season, and one during the indoor season. Each of her All-America honors came in the long jump.

King had five top-10 finishes in the NCAA Championship as well as four BIG EAST Championships to her credit.

King also has a very impressive résumé outside of the collegiate spectrum. In 2001, as a sophomore, she placed second in the long jump at National Junior Track & Field Championship, and went on to finish among the top 10 at the World Junior Championship in Santiago, Chile.

More recently, King won the 2004 USA Track & Field Indoor long jump title after finishing fourth in '03. She also ended up sixth at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials and was the top finisher from the United States at the 2003 Pan American Games.



Ryan Shay

#### Nine-time All-American 2001 NCAA Champion 2003 USA Marathon Champion

A 2001 graduate, Ryan Shay became the USA Marathon Champion in 2003, continuing the championship ways of his collegiate years. Shay is the most decorated athlete in the history of Notre Dame track & field. A 2001 NCAA champion in the 10,000 meters, Shay was a nine-time All-American including two honors for cross country, two for indoor track and five for outdoor track. His nine honors are the second-most in school history.

In 2002, a fifth year of eligibility, Shay was named an Academic All-American, and had a second-place finish in the 10,000 meters at the NCAA Championship.


Shay was a nine-time BIG EAST champion in his years at Notre Dame, with one of those victories coming in cross country. He also had seven top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships in various distance events including the 3,000, 5,000 and 10,000 meters.

In 2000, he competed for the right to represent the USA Track & Field Team at the Olympic Games, finishing 10th in the Olympic Trials.

Upon graduation, he held school records in the indoor 5,000 meters, the outdoor 5,000 meters and the 10,000 meters.

Shay's 2001 national championship was the first outdoor championship by a Notre Dame athlete since 1954.

Shay died unexpectedly on Nov. 3, 2007 during the running of the 2008 U.S. Olympic Marathon trials in New York City.



Luke Watson

Eight-time All-American Six-time BIG EAST Champion Sub-Four Minute Mile

Enjoying one of the best careers in the history of Notre Dame track and field, Luke Watson competed in one of the most exciting moments in the history of the track and field program.

In January of 2003, Watson broke one of the great barriers in sports, the fourminute mile, in front of one of the largest crowds to ever see a track meet at Notre Dame. Watson's mile of 3:57.83 was the fastest collegiate indoor mile in the country in '03 and was only the second sub-four-minute mile in school history.

In the '03 season, Watson's last with the Irish, he was honored as an All-American for the eighth time, including two for cross country, four for indoor track and two for outdoor track. He was also named an Academic All-American in both the '02 and '03 seasons.

Upon graduating, Watson had five top-10 finishes in the NCAA Track & Field Championship, and two top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championship for cross country. Additionally, Watson held six school records upon graduation – the indoor and outdoor mile, the 3,000-meter steeplechase, the indoor 3,000 meters, outdoor 5,000 meters and the distance medley relay.

Watson was also a force to be reckoned with in the BIG EAST. During his career he was a six-time BIG EAST champion. He also led the 2003 Irish to BIG EAST Championships in both the indoor and outdoor seasons, the first time a Notre Dame team accomplished that feat.



## Molly Huddle

Ten-time All-American Seven-time BIG EAST Champion

Molly Huddle graduated from Notre Dame in 2007 as one of the most decorated athletes in Irish sports history. Huddle concluded her career at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships, finishing third in the 5,000-meter run to earn her tenth All-America selection, a record for the most All-America selections by a Notre Dame athlete in any sport.

Huddle's other accolades include six BIG EAST track titles, the most by any Irish woman, and four NCAA Mideast Regional 5,000-meter titles.

She set records across the boards by being the first woman in BIG EAST history to win both the outdoor 5,000-meter and 10,000-meter race in back-to-back years as well as be named the BIG EAST Outstanding Outdoor Track Performer for two consecutive seasons. Former sprinter Liz Grow is the only other Irish athlete to win the award, receiving the honor in 2002.

Huddle posted top-four finishes in each of her four NCAA 5,000m appearances, taking the runner-up spot in 2006. She currently holds four Irish school records (indoor 3,000m & 5,000m/outdoor 5,000m & 10,000m) as well as the BIG EAST meet record in the 10,000m.

Huddle's success was not limited to the track. In her freshman season of cross country she was named the 2003 NCAA Great Lakes Regional Runner of the Year after ger first-place performance. She earned All-America honors in 2002, 2003 and 2005 with 6th-, 41st- and 15th-place finishes, respectively.

Huddle has competed at several USA Track and Field Championships, placing seventh at the 2004 Olympic Trials and winning the 2003 U.S. Junior National 3,000-meter title.

## Experience Will Play Key Role in Success of 2009 Irish Squad

The Notre Dame men's track team will turn to its veterans to continue success

After winning the 2008 BIG EAST Outdoor Championships and finishing second at the indoor meet, the Notre Dame men's track and field team will look to carry over its momentum from last season into the 2009 campaign.

Now in his 34th year, Irish head coach Joe Piane and his crew will look to stay atop the conference ranks and challenge for the national spotlight.

At the top of the returnee list for the Irish is two-time track and field All-American Patrick Smyth. The senior from Salt Lake City, Utah had a phenomenal junior season, earning All-America honors and two BIG EAST titles. Smyth won his first BIG EAST indoor title in the 5,000 meters with a time of 13:57.44 and finished 13th in the 3,000 meters at the NCAA Indoor Championships. He followed that by taking the BIG EAST outdoor title in the 10,000 meters with a time of 29:14.76 and finished third at the NCAA Mideast Regionals. He wrapped up his season with an eighth-place finish in the 5,000 meters at the NCAA Outdoor Championships for the All-America notice.

Junior Jake Walker will add experience to the Irish distance roster this season. The Ellwood City, Pa., native scored points at the BIG EAST indoor meet, finishing fifth in the 5,000 meters and sixth in the 3,000-meter run. After resting an injury during the outdoor season, Walker looks to bounce back and lead the Irish squad in '08.

Piane will also look to sophomores Dan Jackson and Paul Springer to contribute in the distance runs for the Irish. Jackson finished 10th in the 5,000 meters at last year's conference indoor meet and was seventh in the 10,000meter run at the BIG EAST outdoor contest.

Newcomers Jordan Carlson, who finished third in the mile at the Nike Outdoor Nationals, and Joe Miller will also add depth for the Irish.

In sprints and hurdles, the Irish will likely turn to the "Hungarian Twins," junior Balazs Molnar and sophomore Miklos Szebeny.

Molnar stormed onto the scene for the Irish as a freshman in 2007, racking up four all-BIG EAST honors, including the BIG EAST outdoor 400-meter title, and posting 13 performances that rank among the top-10 in Notre Dame history. Last season, he earned his fifth all-conference nod with a third-place finish in the indoor 400 meters, clocking in at 48.00, and was fourth at the

Szebenv won the first four events of his collegiate career and scored points for the Irish with a fifth-place 200-meter finish at the BIG EAST Indoor Championships. He also qualified for the league outdoor meet in the 100 and 200 meters in 2008.

outdoor meet.

Senior Billy Buzaid will also add to the Irish sprints in '08. He scored points for the Irish with a sixth-place finish in the 500 meters at the BIG EAST Indoor Championships and was a member of the fourth-place 4x400-meter relay team at the league outdoor meet.

Irish sprints coach John Millar also hopes newcomers Jordan Rincon and Alex Korenstra can contribute to the Notre Dame squad this season.

In the field, senior Jeff Mensch and sophomores Denes Veres, Greg Davis and John Belcher return for the Irish.

Mensch scored points for the Irish with a sixthplace weight throw finish at the BIG EAST Indoor Championships and finished fourth in the hammer throw at the outdoor meet.

Veres earned his first all-BIG EAST honor with a second-place finish in the shot put at the league indoor meet, recording a toss of 17.12 meters (56-2). He garnered more all-conference accolades with a third-place shot put performance at the BIG EAST Outdoor Championships.

Davis narrowly missed all-conference honors a year ago, finishing fourth in the weight throw at the BIG EAST indoor meet and was fifth in the hammer throw at the outdoor championships. Belcher finished sixth in the shot put at the conference outdoor meet.


Newcomers Mitchell Gormley and Andrew Hills will also look to contribute to this year's squad.

Handling the pole vaulting duties will be junior Matt Schipper, who won the '08 BIG EAST indoor pole vault title and qualified for the NCAA Mideast Regionals. He'll be joined by his younger brother, Kevin, who will be a freshman for the Irish this season.

Senior Blair Majcina and junior Eric Quick return as the top two jumpers for the Irish. Majcina finished second in the outdoor high jump at the conference meet a year ago. Quick earned all-BIG EAST honors with third-place finishes in the indoor long jump and triple jump.

Sophomore Justin Schneider will compete in the heptathlon and decathlon again for the Irish this season.

With the experience of the returnees and talent of the newcomers, the 2008 Irish men's track team will have a solid chance to sweep the BIG EAST trophies and make a run for the national stage.

## Women's Track & Field Preview

## Irish Women Look to Veterans for Results, Newcomers for Depth

The Notre Dame women return almost all of last year's top performers and hope to take advantage of that experience in 2009

The Notre Dame women's track and field team will turn to its veterans this year to lead a talented group of newcomers to the medal stand at the BIG EAST Conference meets.

The Irish finished sixth at last year's BIG EAST Indoor Championships and were third at the league's outdoor meet. Eight members of the women's squad went on to compete at the NCAA Mideast Regionals and two took part in the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

At the top of the list of returning Irish is All-American Alyissa Hasan.

Hasan destroyed the Irish record books last season and set a new mark of 4,069 points in the pentathlon at the NCAA Indoor Championships. The senior from Williamsville, N.Y., finished ninth at the meet and became Notre Dame's first-ever multi-event All-American. Hasan also earned her first all-BIG EAST indoor honors with a secondplace finish in the pentathlon. Her second-place heptathlon finish at the league outdoor meet earned her more all-conference accolades. Hasan finished 23rd at the NCAA Mideast Regionals in the 100-meter hurdles and was 15th in the heptathlon at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Newcomer Maddie Buttinger, the top-ranked junior pentathlon and heptathlon competitor in Canada, will provide depth in the multi-events for the Irish.

In the distances, the Irish will turn to sophomore Marissa Treece, junior Lindsey Feguson and senior Heidi Rocha. Treece was sixth in the 3,000 meters at the BIG EAST indoor meet a year ago and finished in the same spot in the 5,000 meters at the outdoor meet. Ferguson earned all-BIG EAST honors with a third-place finish in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the conference outdoor meet. At the league indoor meet, Rocha was 14th in the 10,000 meters and finished 10th in the event at the outdoor contest.

Leading the Irish sprints in '08 will be junior Joanna Schultz. The Holmen, Wisc. native finished seventh in the 400 meters at the BIG EAST Indoor Championships, then earned all-conference honors with a third-place showing in the event at the outdoor meet. Schultz also earned all-BIG EAST accolades as a member of the Irish 4x400 and 4x800-meter relay teams.

Irish sprints coach John Millar will also rely on Cora Dayon, Natalie Johnson and Kelly Langhans, who are all returning for their second season with the Irish.


Dayon finished second in the 500 meters at the BIG EAST Indoor Championships, earning her first all-conference honor. Johnson finished just behind her in third, garnering all-BIG EAST accolades, as well. Both Dayon and Johnson earned all-conference outdoor honors as part of the Irish 4x400-meter relay team that finished second at the league meet.

Langhans just missed all-conference honors with fourth-place finishes in the 800 meters at the indoor and outdoor conference meets, but earned all-league honors as part of the third-place 4x800-

meter outdoor relay team. She also competed in the 800 meters at the NCAA Mideast Regionals, finishing 17th, behind Johnson in 16th.

Two-time junior Canadian 400-meter champion and Canada's 2007 Youth Athlete of the Year, Natalie Geiger will also add depth to the Irish sprints in '08.

Mary Saxer returns for her senior year as the reigning BIG EAST Conference outdoor pole vault champion. She also competed in the long jump for the Irish, finishing ninth at the league indoor meet and 10th at the outdoor contest.



Sophomore Kelly Langhans competed at the NCAA Mideast Regionals a year ago and hopes to take the Irish squad to the NCAA Championships in 2009.

Handling the throws for the women's squad will be senior Anna Weber and junior Jacqueline Espinoza.

Weber earned all-BIG EAST honors with a third-place finish in the weight throw at the indoor conference meet and a second-place showing in the hammer throw at the outdoor contest.

Espinoza garnered an all-BIG EAST outdoor nod with a second-place finish in the discus and a third-place performance at the NCAA Mideast Regionals. She went on to finish 25th in the discus throw at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Sophomore Rudy Atang looks to add to the mix of Irish throwers this season, while junior Elise Knutzen will handle javelin duties for Notre Dame.

This season, the Irish women's track and field team looks to improve on last year's results with the experience of the returnees and contributions from the newcomers.

#### **New Outdoor Track**

Groundbreaking ceremonies heralded the start of construction of the \$3 million outdoor track in June 2008. The new nine-lane facility will be located southeast of the Joyce Center. The new track will be the competition and practice site for the Notre Dame men's and women's track and field teams. The track will meet IAAF guidelines with the widest possible turns. One synthetic "D" zone will be provided at the south end of the track. Throwing and jumping events will be provided in two directions, and a warm-up area will be located at one end of the track. Construction began in late June, with the completion tentatively expected in November 2008. Fundraising efforts continue on the remaining \$5 million stadium portion of the new track facility.


Lead gifts for the project have come from an anonymous benefactor, as well as six named Notre Dame supporters: John Hatherly '82, who ran track for the Irish as a miler; Dr. Bob Harris '69, a chemistry major who played intramural football and has participated in Notre Dame's Football Fantasy Camp; Dr. Jim Kerrigan '79, a monogram winner for the Notre Dame track team; John Leahy '84, who continues the Leahy athletic legacy at Notre Dame; Mike Lukas '79 MA, whose daughter, Katherine, is part of Notre Dame's Class of 2012; Rick Peltz, South and а Bend/Indianapolis business man.

Notre Dame's new \$3 million outdoor track will be the competition and practice site for the Irish track and field programs. Constrution on the nine-lane facility began in June 2008.

## Men's Cross Country Preview

## Irish Runners Set Sights on BIG EAST Title, NCAA Championship

The Irish men's cross country team will turn to experienced leadership for success in 2008

The Notre Dame men's cross country team will look to make its fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Championships in 2008 and continue its reign as one of the top squads in the country.

In 2007, the Irish finished in the top five in six of the seven races in which they competed, including three straight wins to open the season. The Irish took first at the Valparaiso Invitational, the National Catholic Championship and the Notre Dame Invitational. They finished fifth at the Pre-National Meet and took fourth at the BIG EAST Championships. The Irish were third at the Great Lakes Regional meet and ended the season with a 21st-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

Despite the departure of several top runners, the Irish are serious contenders for a sixth BIG EAST title and are looking to earn a spot at the NCAA Championships.

"Cross country should be pretty solid this season," Irish head coach Joe Piane said.

After graduating four of their top seven runners, the men's team will have to rely on several sophomores, who gained a year of experience competing as freshmen last season. "Men's cross country is going to be a little bit thinner than what we were last year, because we graduated our Nos. 2, 4, 5 and 6 runners, but we have some very, very good sophomores that were not in the top seven last season," Piane said.

Leading the '08 Irish is senior Patrick Smyth, who earned his second All-America honor with a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2007.


"We're starting off with a very, very good athlete up front in Patrick Smyth," Piane said.

Smyth competed in four meets for the Irish last season. He ran the Notre Dame Invitational in 23:44 to finish second and followed that with a fifth-place showing at the Pre-National Meet, covering the course in 23:18. Smyth earned all-BIG EAST honors after completing the league meet in 23:28 for a third-place finish. He won the NCAA Great Lakes Regional in 30:22 before finishing 15th at the NCAA Championships in 30:05.


Behind Smyth will be junior Jake Walker. "Jake did well last year in cross country and competed well indoors at the BIG EAST meet. He was injured for the outdoor season, but he should be a factor for us this year," Piane said.

Walker's top finish came at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional, where he placed 14th with a time of 31:14. He also finished 26th in 24:37 at the BIG EAST Championships.

Leading the pack of sophomores is Dan Jackson, who has six collegiate meets under his

belt. Jackson finished second in his Irish debut, covering the 2007 National Catholic Championship course in 24:50. He finished 16th at the Notre Dame Invitational in 24:19 and was 99th at the Great Lakes Regional with a time of 32:55.

Classmate Paul Springer finished just behind Jackson at the National Catholic in third at 24:53. He finished 34th at the Notre Dame Invitational in 24:36 and was 51st at the BIG EAST meet with a time of 25:18.

Piane expects several freshmen to make an impact for the Irish this season.

Jordan Carlson, one of the top high school milers in the country, and Joe Miller, a two-time all-state cross country selection out of Ohio, could see action with the Irish this season.

Behind experienced leadership, the Irish men's cross country team looks to find success in the BIG EAST and climb to the top of the national rankings.

## Women's Cross Country Preview

## Irish Look to Rebound After Difficult 2007 Campaign

The Irish women's squad hopes returning veterans will lead '08 season

After battling injuries and illness a year ago, the Notre Dame women's cross country team will look to rebound in 2008 and compete for the BIG EAST title and a spot at the NCAA Championships.

The 2007 Irish women's cross country team got off to a hot start, taking team titles in their first two races, before feeling the effects of multiple injuries and illnesses. The Irish finished 12th at the Notre Dame Invitational and 15th at the Pre-National meet. They were sixth at the BIG EAST Championships and ended the season with an 11th-place finish at the Great Lakes Regionals.

The women are looking to bounce back with the help of two of their top runners from the '07 campaign.

Sophomore Marissa Treece and junior Lindsey Ferguson will lead the Irish this season, after both found success a year ago, before shutting down their seasons early due to illness.

As a freshman, Treece won the National Catholic Championships, her first collegiate race, in 17:24. Ferguson was just 25 seconds behind her in fourth.

Ferguson earned all-BIG EAST honors with a 14thplace performance at the league meet, clocking in at 21:13. Treece was not far behind, covering the course in 21:35 to finish 26th.

Treece also competed in the IAAF World Cross Country Championships in March as part of the U.S. Junior National team.

The Irish will also turn to seniors Heidi Rocha and Becca Bauman for solid contributions.

Despite being injured last season, women's head coach Tim Connelly expects Rocha to be a competitor for the Irish in '08.

Bauman competed in five

meets for the Irish a year ago, finishing 19th in 18:41 at the National Catholic Championships. She finished 43rd at the BIG EAST Championships with a time of 22:11.

Sophomore Abby Higgins will also play a major role this season, after competing in all six meets for the Irish as a freshman.

Higgins opened her collegiate career with a sixth-place finish at the Valparaiso Invitational, clocking in at 19:27. She was also 10th at the

National Catholic Championships and finished 61st in 22:27 at the BIG EAST meet.

Connelly and the Irish will also look to senior Emily Wauford, junior Beth Tacl and sophomore Theresa Cattuna for contributions this season.

Wauford opened the 2007 campaign with a seventh-place finish at the Valparaiso Invitational and finished 15th at the National Catholic Championships. She was 42nd at the BIG EAST meet and finished 53rd at the Great Lakes Regional.

Cattuna finished fifth at the National Catholic Championships, before prematurely ending her season due to injury.

Connelly also hopes several freshmen can make an impact for the Irish this season, especially New Mexico all-state selection Rachel Velarde and Indiana all-state pick Molly Hirt.

With the return of experienced veterans and the promise of strong newcomer talent, the 2008 Irish women's cross country team looks to move on from a tough '07 campaign and contend for a BIG EAST title and a place at the NCAA Championships.

In 1889, track and field became the second varsity sport in school history. One hundred and 18 seasons later, student-athletes continue to represent the Fighting Irish across the nation on the track, in the field and on the cross country course.

For the past 33 campaigns, Joe Piane has been leading the program – and shows no signs of stopping any time soon. The longest active tenured coach at Notre Dame, Piane begins his 34th season under the Golden Dome in the fall of 2008, having recently inked a multi-year contract extension that will keep him with the Irish through at least the end of the decade.

The 2008-2009 season will be yet another landmark for Piane as he moves into a tie for second place in Notre Dame history for longest coaching tenure. Fencing coach Mike DeCicco also spent 34 seasons (1962-95) with his program. Piane passed former Irish tennis coach and wrestling coach Tim Fallon (32 seasons from 1934-75) and now sits behind legendary baseball skipper Jake Kline, who spent 42 seasons with the Irish from 1955-87.

"I'm thrilled to know that I'll be here at Notre Dame for the next several years and hopefully well beyond that until my retirement," Piane says. "My family and I truly enjoy living in South Bend and being a part of the community here. I also value and appreciate the opportunity I have had to work at a place like Notre Dame because of the quality of the people I've been fortunate enough to work with. I have coached many very special studentathletes during my time here and seeing their development has been one of the most rewarding aspects of my job — one that I'm eager to continue well into the foreseeable future."

Piane's record at Notre Dame speaks for itself. Just consider the accomplishments Notre Dame athletes have made under Piane's watchful eye:

• Men's cross country runners have earned All-American status 25 times, with Patrick Smyth taking home the honor in 2007.

• A Notre Dame cross country runner has appeared at the NCAA Championship meet in each of the past 18 years, while the team has made the trip 18 out of the past 24 years. •The Notre Dame men's cross country team has finished in the top 10 at the NCAA meet in 11 of the past 20 seasons, highlighted by third-place finishes in 1990 and 2005 (matching the program's best showing since winning the 1957 NCAA title).

• The Irish men's cross country team has won five BIG EAST Conference titles since joining the league in 1995, including crowns in 2004 and 2005. What's more, Notre Dame men's harriers have earned all-BIG EAST honors 38 times, with a school-record five runners receiving that distinction in '05.

• The Irish men's track & field team has earned 69 All-America citations since 1974 (including Kurt Benninger in the 2008 indoor season and Patrick Smyth in the 2008 outdoor), while the women's team has received 39 such accolades since 1994 (most recently Alyissa Hasan in the 2008 indoor pentathlon). Combined, Piane has helped mentor 108 track & field All-Americans (and 129 overall when including cross country honorees) during his tenure.

• Both the Notre Dame men's and women's track & field teams were champions in 2007 with the Irish men taking the indoor title and the Irish women claiming their first outdoor team championship. The men also claimed the 2008 BIG EAST outdoor title. Overall the men's team has won eight BIG EAST titles (three indoor/five outdoor), while the women's squad has hoisted the hardware three times (two indoor/one outdoor).

• In the school's 12-year BIG EAST membership (1995-96 to present), Notre Dame athletes have won 108 conference individual or relay titles in track & field and cross country, with eight student-athletes going on to be named the conference's outstanding track or field performer award at its indoor or outdoor championship meets.

A distance-coaching specialist, Piane is recognized across the nation as one of the best in the business. He has been named NCAA Division I National Cross Country Coach of the Year on two different occasions (1987 and 2001) while garnering five district/regional coach-of-the-year honors and nine league cross country coach-of-the-year plaques (most recently as part of the '05 BIG EAST Men's Coaching Staff of the Year). In total, Piane has earned or shared 26 league coach of the year awards (indoor track, outdoor track or cross country), including 14 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year accolades in the past 10 years (1999-2008). In 2007 alone they earned two of those BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year honors, one for men's indoor track & field and one for women's outdoor track & field. They also racked up another for men's outdoor track and field in 2008.

As the Irish track & field program continues to assert itself on the national stage, Piane has led from the front every step of the way. In 2008, the Notre Dame men won the BIG EAST outdoor title, marking the seventh time in nine seasons that the Irish took home either the conference indoor or outdoor trophy. The Irish women's outdoorperformance earned them the third-place trophy, just 20 points shy of the championship title. Persistence paid off for the women in 2007 as they won their first BIG EAST outdoor championship.

Individually, Piane and his assistants at Notre Dame produced four All-Americans in track and field in 2008 with three during the indoor season and one during the outdoor season. Alyissa Hasan became Notre Dame's first-ever multi-event All-American, earning her first All-America honor in the pentathlon at the NCAA Indoor Championships. Kurt Benninger garnered his fifth track and field (sixth overall) All-America honor in the 3,000-meter run and Jake Watson earned his second consecutive All-America honor in the mile. Patrick Smyth earned his first career track and field All-America honor in the 5,000-meter run at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Piane's success has not just been in the present, as three of his more successful pupils in recent years have been 10-time All-American Molly Huddle (2007), nine-time All-American Ryan Shay (2001) and eight-time All-American Luke Watson (2002).


Huddle finished her career under Piane with then All-America certificates, a record for the most All-America selections by a Notre Dame athlete in



any sport. The Elmira, N.Y., native had seven career BIG EAST championships, including backto-back double victories in the 5,000m and the 10,000m in her last two seasons. Her seven championships are the most by any Irish woman and she joins former student-athlete Liz Grow to be named the BIG EAST Outstanding Outdoor Track Performer in two consecutive years (2006, 2007). She currently holds four Irish school records (indoor 3,000m & 5,000m/outdoor 5,000m & 10,000m).

In 2001, Piane helped distance specialist Shay compile one of the greatest track seasons in Notre Dame history. The Central Lake, Mich., resident won the BIG EAST indoor 5,000 meters, the conference outdoor 5,000 and 10,000 meters and finished off the season in legendary style by becoming Notre Dame's first individual NCAA champion since 1972 by taking first place in the 10,000 meters (29:05.44) at the NCAA Outdoor Championship in Eugene, Ore. Shay moved on to become one of the best marathon runners in the country, winning five U.S. titles as well as USA Running Circuit (USARC) titles in 2003 and 2004. Tragically, Shay's life was cut short as he died suddenly during the running of the 2008 U.S. Olympic marathon trials in New York.

Shortly after helping steer Shay to the top of the college running mountain, Piane had similar success with Watson. Both men had set their sights on breaking the four-minute mile barrier at the Meyo Invitational in 2002, hoping that Watson would become just the second runner to crack the mark. Piane helped assemble an outstanding field for the race, which was arguably the highlight of the entire collegiate indoor season. Watson did his part, scorching past the field in the final straight away to win in 3:58.83, easily a school-record time and briefly the fastest mile run in the world during the indoor season. Watson eventually moved on to garner All-America honors in the indoor mile, indoor 3,000 meters and outdoor 5,000



meters – as well as taking home BIG EAST Championships in the mile, 3,000-meter steeplechase and outdoor 5,000 meters. In the summer of '06, Watson returned to his alma mater as a member of the Irish men's distance/cross country coaching staff.

With Piane at the helm, the Notre Dame men's cross country team has enjoyed five of its most successful seasons in the program's history during the past eight years. In 2000, Piane helped the Irish recover from the loss of Shay due to injury and earn a ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championship meet.

With Shay back on the team in '01, Notre Dame achieved its highest-ever national ranking (fourth), won the BIG EAST Championship (Piane and his staff earned the league's Coaching Staff of the Year award) and ended up sixth at the national meet to give the Irish (at the time) their highest team finish since 1993.

In 2004, Notre Dame threatened to eclipse its best-ever ranking, as Piane deftly guided his charges from an unranked start all the way to a BIG EAST title and a No. 5 national ranking before placing 11th at the NCAA Championship. For his efforts, Piane and his aides garnered a second BIG EAST Men's Cross Country Coaching Staff of the Year plaque. That set the stage for 2005's successful run that culminated in Notre Dame's return to the NCAA awards podium for the first time since 1990.

In 1985, Piane was named a member of the United States National Track staff. As such, he was one of 40 collegiate coaches given the opportunity to coach a United States squad in international competition. During the summer of 1987 he did just that, guiding a team of American all-stars in meets held in England and Ireland. Upon the conclusion of the 1991 Notre Dame track season, Piane once again faced international competition as he was appointed coach of the U.S. Pan American juniors team for the games in Kingston, Jamaica.

Piane became Midwest regional chairman for United States Olympic Development in the area of track and field in 1984. Piane's other Olympic preparation experience came in '85 when he coached the North team in the National Sports Festival. He also coached the U.S. team against England in Birmingham, England.

Piane has produced a winning record in all but one season with the Irish men's cross country team and is also the creator of Notre Dame's National Catholic Championship, an annual meet held on campus since 1980. The Irish running program continues to be a rapidly-growing entity thanks to Piane's achievements. Continually searching for greater challenges, he also founded the Mevo Invitational and the Alex Wilson Invitational, both traditional indoor Notre Dame track & field meets. The Meyo Invitational has turned into a prime breeding ground for record-setting performances, with the 2007 meet resulting in 85 NCAA provisional or automatic qualifying marks, six meet records and three Meyo Track standards broken. The 2006 meet had similar results with 76 NCAA provisional or automatic qualifying marks hit and seven meet records and three Meyo Track records falling. At the same time, the Alex Wilson Invitational has developed into one of the top

indoor "last chance" meets in the nation, hosting the country's best performers just prior to the NCAA Championship.

A 1969 graduate of Loras College, Piane ran both track and cross country for four years at the Dubuque, Iowa, institution. He captained Loras' undefeated cross country squad as a senior, while excelling in middle distance events during the track season. He was inducted into the Loras College Athletics Hall of Fame in the fall of '02.

Piane began his impressive coaching career in 1970. Working for the Peace Corps, he coached track & field and cross country at both the regional and national levels in the North African country of Morocco. Piane guided a top-ranked junior cross country team, sending three runners to Cambridge, England, for the International Cross Country Championship (now known as the IAAF World Championship) in 1972, where Morocco finished third. Several of those Moroccan runners went on to compete at the '72 Summer Games in Munich, Germany, and one advanced to the 1976 Summer Games in Montreal, Canada.

After returning to the United States in July 1972, Piane assisted the track and cross country programs at Western Illinois. During that time he earned a master's degree in physical education.

Born Aug. 6, 1946, in Westchester, Ill., Piane joined the Notre Dame staff in 1974 as an assistant track coach and physical education instructor with plans to stay on for just one year. He was named head track and cross country coach the following season.

Piane and his wife, Mimi, reside in South Bend, with their son, Nick.

**Head Coach** Tim Women's Cross Country Assistant Track & Connelly **Field Coach** (Women's Distance) Notre Dame '83

As the Notre Dame women's cross country team continues to establish itself as one of the best in the nation, the man standing at the forefront of that emergence has been Tim Connelly.

Now in his 21st season at Notre Dame, Connelly not only serves as the head coach of the Irish women's cross country team, but also tutors the middle distance and distance runners during the indoor and outdoor track seasons. As one of the longest tenured active assistants at the University, he is closely involved with all aspects of the Notre Dame track & field/cross country program and is known as one of the best coaches in the Midwest.

Since taking over the Irish women's cross country program during its infancy in 1988, Connelly has helped Notre Dame reach unprecedented heights, finishing among the top 10 at the NCAA Championship four of the past six seasons. Notre Dame also has garnered a trip to the NCAA awards podium twice, finishing in a program-best third place in 2002, followed by a fourth-place showing in 2004.

However, that hardly begins to scratch the surface of Connelly's accomplishments during his two-decade run at Notre Dame. The Irish women also have won three BIG EAST Conference titles (all in the past six seasons) and placed either first or second at five of the past seven NCAA Great Lakes Regional meets. What's more, Notre Dame harriers have collected 14 All-America honors and 25 all-BIG EAST cross country citations since the Irish joined the conference in 1995-96.

On the track, the Notre Dame women's distance program has grown exponentially in recent years. Irish runners have earned no fewer than 19 All-America certificates, including 14 in the past seven years alone, while Connelly's athletes have advanced to NCAA Championship competition 34 times (14 indoors/20 outdoors).

In addition. Notre Dame women's distance runners have garnered all-conference status 63 times and won 10 BIG EAST individual titles (as well as the 2003 distance medley relay crown) during the past 12 seasons. The Irish thinclads also have played a critical role in a pair of team titles at the BIG EAST Indoor Championship ('02, 2006) and one BIG EAST Outdoor Championship (2007), as well as nine runner-up finishes at conference meets (five indoor, four outdoor).



For his efforts, Connelly has been richly rewarded with numerous coaching honors. He has been chosen for the BIG EAST Women's Cross Country Coaching Staff of the Year award three times ('02, 2003, 2005) and has been part of the BIG EAST Women's Indoor Track & Field Coaching Staff of the Year twice ('02, '06) and the BIG EAST Women's Outdoor Track & Field Coaching Staff of the Year once (2007).

Connelly's distance runners helped the Irish women's program to a third-place finish at the 2008 BIG EAST Outdoor Championships, while the women's cross country squad finished sixth at the BIG EAST Championship with sophomore Lindsey Ferguson garnering all-conference honors.

Under Connelly's tutelage, Notre Dame's distance program was able to excel in 2007, playing a large role in helping the Irish win their first BIG EAST outdoor championship since joining the league in 1995-96. Connelly produced six top-eight finishers to bring in points for the Irish. The women's cross country team season ended with a third-place finish at the BIG EAST Cross Country Championships and a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional meet, just shy of a bid to the national meet. The conference finish was the fifth consecutive top-three BIG EAST finish by the Irish women.

In 2007, Senior Molly Huddle led the women's distance with a runner-up performance in the 5,000m at the BIG EAST indoor championships and a double crown at the BIG EAST outdoor championships in the 5,000m and the 10,000m only the third multiple winner of the honor since its inception in 1993, and the first back-to-back recipient since former Irish All-American Liz Grow took the hardware in 2001 and 2002. Her outdoor performance earned her BIG EAST Outstanding Outdoor Track Performer honors. She went on to the NCAA Mideast Regional meet to win her fourth consecutive 5,000m title to pave her way to the national meet where she became a ten-time All-American after taking third in the 5,000m.

Connelly's charges were at the forefront of a historic run in 2005-06, as Notre Dame came within 10 points at the conference's outdoor meet of becoming the first school in 18 seasons to win the BIG EAST women's "triple crown" (cross country, indoor track, outdoor track). It all started with an impressive 25-point win at the BIG EAST Cross Country Championship, with the 34point Irish performance being the best scoring outing by any league school since 1994. Notre Dame had four of the top eight runners in the field, giving the Irish their largest-ever crop of all-conference honorees.

That outing preceded a runner-up showing at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional, where Notre Dame once again was dominant up front with four of the top 10 run-

Moving indoors on the track for the 2005-06 season, Jacqueline Carter and Brianne Schmidt made excellent strides in the middle distances, notching school records in the 800- and 1,000-meter runs, respectively. Madia was strong at the longer distances, peaking well late in the year with two of the top-four 5,000-meter times in school history before earning her second All-America honor with a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championship.

Huddle then took center stage during the '06 outdoor season, posting the nation's fastest times at both 5,000 and 10,000 meters, and becoming only the second woman in BIG EAST history to win both races at the conference meet. She went on to be named the BIG EAST Outstanding Outdoor Track Performer, as well as the USTFCCCA Great Lakes District Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year and won her third NCAA Mideast Regional 5,000-meter title in as many tries. Huddle's season ended just short of the brass ring, as she finished second in the 5,000 meters at the NCAA Championships, still the best placement ever by an Irish women's track athlete in any event. She also garnered her ninth All-America citation.

In '04, Huddle had one of the most prolific seasons in Irish track and field history. She was an All-American in the indoor 3,000 and 5,000-meter runs as well as the outdoor 5,000-meters. Connelly accompanied Huddle as she competed in the United States Olympic Trials, eventually finishing seventh in the 5,000 meters as the top non-professional/collegian in the race. A year earlier, Connelly guided Huddle to All-America honors in the indoor 3,000 meters and outdoor 5,000 meters. Huddle capped that season by running away with the U.S. Junior 3,000-Meter Championship at the national meet in Palo Alto, Calif.

A 1983 Notre Dame graduate, Connelly ran both cross country and track for the Irish. Following his graduation, Connelly served as a graduate assistant coach under Joe Piane while working toward his master's degree in business.

In 1986, Connelly moved on to Syracuse as an assistant cross country and track coach. During his time in central New York, he coached the men's and women's middle distance and distance runners and managed recruiting duties for both programs.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pa., Connelly and his wife, the former Donna Southerly, are the parents of two children - daughter, Alexandra, and son, Brendon.





John Millar Assistant Track & Field Coach (Sprints/Hurdles) Western Ontario '78

One of the top sprint and hurdle coaches in the world, John Millar enters his 18th season at Notre Dame and has developed the Irish sprint groups into a force in the BIG EAST Conference. Millar's tenure at Notre Dame, which included serving as the speed coach for all Notre Dame athletic teams for several years, is the third longest active streak of any current Irish assistant coach in any sport.


A dedicated coach, recruiter and organizer, Millar also has played a key role in Notre Dame's management of four home indoor meets, which are widely regarded as being among the top events in the country each season.

Millar's sprinters and hurdlers have continued to have success for the Irish on both the men's and women's side of the field. While many of Millar's top athletes completed their final seasons in 2008, he still has a strong crop of young athletes, who in only their first and second years, have proven to be competitive at the conference level.

As a sophomore in 2008, Balazs Molnar grabbed all-BIG EAST indoor honors with a third-place finish in the 400-meter dash. Freshmen Cora Dayon and Natalie Johnson earned their first all-BIG EAST indoor honors in the 500 meters, finishing second and third, respectively. The men's 4x100-meter relay team finished third at the BIG EAST Outdoor Championships and played a major role in helping the Irish men's squad to their fifth outdoor conference title. For their efforts, Millar and the other Irish coaches were named the 2008 Men's Outdoor Coaching Staff of the Year.

In 2007, Molnar took the BIG EAST outdoor 400meter hurdle race by storm with his time of 51.62. His all-BIG EAST performance marked the first time an Irish sprinter (male or female) won a league 400meter hurdle title in school history.

Millar's women sprinters undoubtedly found success on the track and were a key play in helping secure the team's first BIG EAST Outdoor Track & Field Championship in 2007. Both the women's 4x100 and 4x400-meter relays took titles at the 2007 BIG EAST Outdoor Track & Field Championships, spurring the Irish women's first BIG EAST outdoor championship since joining the league in 1995.



Millar set up dominance in the women's individual 400m with Okechi Ogbuokiri, Joanna Schultz and Brienne Davis taking second, third and fourth in the event respectively while Maryann Erigha went on to earn additional all-BIG EAST honors with her second-place finish in the 100m.

Both Erigha and Ogboukiri have had previous success under Millar's tutelage. Erigha was a two-time BIG EAST champion in the outdoor 100m and indoor 200m while Ogbuokiri was a conference titlist in the indoor 400m. Both sprinters went on to qualify for the NCAA Championship for the first time in their respective careers in 2005.

Millar also helped cultivate the skills of men's hurdler Selim Nurudeen, who was a two-time All-American, seven-time BIG EAST Champion and 15-time all-BIG EAST selection during his career at Notre Dame from 2001-05. Nurudeen also was named the '05 BIG EAST Indoor Championship Outstanding Track Performer after helping the Irish win the team title and competed in the 2008 Summer Olympics as part of the Nigerian track and field team.

Prior to his current proteges, Millar helped cultivate '02 graduate Liz Grow into Notre Dame's first women's All-American sprinter, as Grow was a fixture at the NCAA indoor and outdoor meets during her four years on the team.

Millar's sprint group made a huge splash on the national scene in '02. The women's 4x400 relay unit consisting of Ayesha Boyd, Kristen Dodd, Grow and Kymia Love qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships, becoming the first Irish women's sprint relay to achieve that distinction. In the outdoor season, the same group took a step further, earning All-America honors after placing fifth in the nation at the NCAA Championships. Millar's 4x100, 4x400 (outdoor) and 4x400 (indoor) all have set school records in the past seven seasons and the 4x100 group won BIG EAST Championships in 2003 and 2004.

The development of the women's sprint corps allowed Notre Dame to capture its first-ever BIG

EAST team title in '02 at the league indoor meet. Millar and his fellow Irish coaches were named the BIG EAST Indoor Coaching Staff of the Year that season. They repeated that performance in 2006, nearly winning the league's "triple crown" for the first time in 18 years before a runner-up finish in the BIG EAST outdoor meet. Nevertheless, Millar was again part of the BIG EAST Indoor Staff of the Year.

Millar helped the women's 4x400 team return to both the NCAA indoor and outdoor meets in '03. The squad of Tiffany Gunn, Kristen Dodd, Ayesha Boyd and Kymia Love just missed out on a repeat All-America effort at the outdoor meet, finishing ninth.

In his first year with the Irish, Millar began the process of enhancing the Notre Dame sprint corps, which culminated in three school records in the 55 and 200 meters along with the 4x100 relay. He guided Raghib Ismail to a second-place finish in the 1991 NCAA indoor championships and the fastest collegiate 55-meter time in the world. Millar also coached two-time All-American Allen Rossum to seventh-place finishes in the 55-meter dash at

the 1995 and 1997 NCAA Indoor Championship, and hurdler Errol Williams was an All-American in both indoor (55-meter hurdles) and outdoor track (110meter hurdles) in 1998.

The native of Toronto, Canada, took a break from his coaching duties at Notre Dame in early March of 1999 to serve as the head coach of the USA women's track squad, which earned eight medals at the '99 World Indoor Championships in Maebashi, Japan.

Millar is a seasoned veteran of coaching athletes both on the national and international levels. During a six-year stint at Texas, he coached 96 NCAA All-Americans, including 10 national champions, and helped guide the Lady Longhorns to four national titles.

Prior to his position at Texas, Millar was an assistant at Tennessee for two years where he worked with 1984 Olympic gold-medal hurdler Benita Fitzgerald-Brown. In addition, he served as an assistant coach on the Canadian Olympic track staff and assisted in training world-class hurdler Mark McCoy. He also served as USA Track and Field's national women's hurdle coordinator, coach of the North team at the 1992 U.S. Olympic Festival and assistant coach of the USA Junior National Team at the 1993 Pan-Am Junior Championships.

Millar was head coach at York University in Toronto from 1981 to 1983 where he served as chief director for both the men's and women's programs in track & field. He led the school to a Canadian national championship in 1981.

He also traveled to the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia, as a member of the Canadian track & field coaching staff.

Millar graduated from Western Ontario in 1978 and holds a master's degree from Arizona State.

He and his wife, the former Lynn Haan, have a son, James, who graduated from Notre Dame in May 2008 as a track and field monogram winner.

## Assistant Coaches



Adam Track & Field Coach Beltram (Throws) University of Missouri-Kansas City '99 Adam Beltran joined the Notre Dame men's and women's track and field program in 2007 as an assistant coach for throws.

Beltran guided the Irish throwers to seven all-BIG EAST honors in 2008, including Brandon Drenon's first BIG EAST outdoor title in the discus. Six of Beltran's athletes qualified for the NCAA Mideast Regionals. Alyissa Hasan earned all-BIG EAST and All-America honors in the pentathlon. She also garnered all-BIG EAST honors for her heptathlon performance at the BIG EAST Outdoor Championships. Jaclyn Espinoza finished 25th in the discus at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Prior to joining the Notre Dame staff, Beltran was on the track and field staff at Saint Francis (Pa.) University where he worked with the Red Flash throwers and oversaw the program's recruiting efforts. Under his tutelage, 20 St. Francis student-athletes won Northeast Conference (NEC) titles in the men's and women's weight throw, javelin, hammer throw, discus and women's shot put. During his tenure at St. Francis, Beltran watched 17 Red Flash throwing records fall in the men's and women's indoor shot put, discus, javelin, women's outdoor shot put and the men's hammer and weight throws. In 2007, junior Lisa Morse earned the Outstanding Field Performer award at the NEC Outdoor Championships, while Dian Gmiter went on to win the same award at the indoor league meet.

Before his stint at St. Francis, Beltran served as an assistant coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. He worked with throwers and coached the athletes to Mid-Continent Conference titles in the shot put and the javelin. Nine of his athletes went on to break school track and field records under his tutelage.

A 1999 graduate of UMKC, the Austin, Texas, native earned his bachelor of liberal arts degree with an emphasis in American studies and a minor in black studies/cultural anthropology. He has earned USA Track and Field Level I and Level II certifications

The 53rd running of the Notre Dame Invitational, one of the nation's oldest and largest intercollegiate cross country meets, is scheduled for Oct. 3, 2008, at the University of Notre Dame Burke Golf Course. The Invitational was started by former Irish head coach Alex Wilson in 1956 and regularly features runners from approximately 60 schools around the country. A 5,000meter women's race was added in 1987 to the current men's event (lengthened from four to five miles in 1968).



## Irish in the BIG EAST

The 2008-09 academic year will be the 30th for The BIG EAST Conference. While the league has gone through membership changes since its birth, it has never been stronger. This academic year will mark the conference's fourth year as the nation's largest Division I-A conference.

The goals of the BIG EAST have never changed. The league aims and expects to compete at the highest level and does so with integrity and sportsmanship. The student-athletes of the member schools continue to maintain the league's proud tradition of success.

BIG EAST teams earned their share of recognition at the highest levels in 2007-08. Four women's teams advanced to their respective NCAA Final Fours: Connecticut field hockey and women's basketball, Notre Dame soccer and Syracuse lacrosse.

Individually in men's sports, Villanova's Bobby Curtis was the NCAA outdoor track champion in the 5,000 meters. Connecticut's O'Brian White won the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy, the highest individual honor in soccer. Two years ago, BIG EAST male and female student-athletes were Hermann Trophy winners.

In men's basketball, the BIG EAST tied its own record set in 2006 by earning eight NCAA Championship bids. BIG EAST women's teams have received eight NCAA invitations in each of the past two years. The combined 16 men's and women's berths in 2008 was an NCAA first.

The quality of BIG EAST football has never been more balanced. Six of the league's eight squads were nationally ranked in 2007. For the third straight year, the BIG EAST representative in the Bowl Championship Series won its BCS bowl game.

The BIG EAST continued to produce student-athletes who were at the forefront of athletic and academic achievement. Nineteen BIG EAST players were chosen to their respective ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Teams, including eight firstteam selections.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A group in 2005-06 when five new members began competing. The new schools were: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 34 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain almost one fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 25 national championships in six different sports and 125 student-athletes have won individual national titles.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 370 student-athletes have earned academic all-America honors. Last year in football, Louisville quarterback Brian Brohm, who finished his career as the BIG EAST's career passing leader, was one of the league's eight first-team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America team picks. Also, Connecticut's Rebecca Lobo, one of the most heralded women's basketball players in the history of the sport, was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 2008. Lobo, a two-time BIG EAST Player of the Year, led the Huskies to the 1995 NCAA national championship.

The BIG EAST has enjoyed tremendous basketball success, especially in this decade. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. In men's basketball, BIG EAST squads have won three of the last 10 NCAA championships. BIG EAST women's teams have taken five of the last nine NCAA titles.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger.

In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse and rowing to its growing list of sports. The first women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003. In 2007, the league conducted its first women's lacrosse championship tournament. In 2009-10, the BIG EAST will begin sponsorship of men's lacrosse, its 24th sport

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student-athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably shows a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization needs outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first fulltime employee, and for 11 years the associate to Dave Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

For 2009-10, the BIG EAST will undergo one significant change. Tranghese has announced that he will step down from his position on June 30, 2009.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed longstanding relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant in soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 550 BIG EAST student-athletes have earned all America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams. Several athletes earned gold medals in each of the last six summer Olympiads.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 athletes.
