GAME NOTES

- With the 90-72 victory, Baylor improved to 32-4 on the season and 2-1 all-time against the Wildcats of Kentucky. The loss drops Kentucky's record to 26-9. The two schools met earlier this season with Kentucky winning the quadruple overtime contest, 133-130 in Arlington, Texas (12/6/2013).
- Baylor has advanced to the Elite Eight four of the past five years and a total of five times in program history.
- Baylor's **Odyssey Sims** became just the second player in NCAA Division 1 women's basketball history to score at least 1,000 points in a season. Jackie Stiles (Missouri State) holds on the record for most points in a season with 1,062.
- With 25 points in the game, **Sims** moved into third place on the Baylor all-time scoring list with 2,500 career points. Sims has now scored 20 or more points 30 times this season.
- Baylor is now 203-6 (.971) under head coach **Kim Mulkey** when scoring 80 or more points. The Lady Bears are now 122-3 (.976) over the last four seasons when scoring 70 or more points.
- Baylor's **Nina Davis** recorded 8 rebounds in the contest. She is now second on Baylor's all-time list for rebounds by a freshmen with 319 career rebounds.
- Baylor's **Niya Johnson** entered the game ranked number one in the nation in assist/turnover ratio (4.05). Johnson registered 11 assists while only committing one turnover against Kentucky, which raises her season assist/turnover ratio to 4.17.
- **Johnson** recorded her first double-double of the season in the game (11 points, 11 assists).
- Kentucky entered the game with 186 consecutive contests in which they forced double-digit turnovers. Baylor snapped the streak as the Lady Bears only committed nine turnovers in the game.
- Kentucky entered the contest 4-0 all-time in Regional Semifinal contests. Today's loss is Kentucky's first in a NCAA Regional Semifinal.
- Despite the loss, Kentucky held Baylor to 47.8% shooting in the game. The Wildcats held all but two teams to under 50% shooting this season.
