1950 PROSPECTS

Faced with what seems to be the roughest schedule in years, Rev. George Holderith, C.S.C., bases his hopes for a winning season on four returning lettermen, backed up by a couple of long hitters from last year's frosh squad. Father Holderith places special hopes on Tom Veech, last year an NCAA semi-finalist, Captain Paul Hudak, Maury White and Bob Rolfs. "This year they all look rugged" says Father Holderith, "and we look for real trouble from Purdue and North Texas State, who were second and first in the country last year."

HISTORY OF GOLF AT NOTRE DAME

Golf at Notre Dame dates back to 1930 when the first Irish golfers went through a five-match schedule without defeat and also captured team honors in the Indiana Intercollegiate tourney. The 1931 team also boasted a spotless record, and the Irish rolled up 17 consecutive victories before bowing to Purdue in 1932.

The all-time record shows 132 wins, 35 losses and five ties. This is a winning percentage of .790, exclusive of ties.

Rev. George Holderith, C.S.C., was appointed golf coach in 1933. Since that date his charges have won 114 matches, dropped 33 and tied five times. That is a .776 average.

In 1944 the Irish won their first National Collegiate golf title at Toledo Inverness. The Irish have entered the nationals 14 times, winning once, finishing second twice, winding up third on three occasions and capturing the fourth position twice.

Last year, in dual competition, the Irish won six while losing three. Tom Veech went to the semi-finals of the Nationals before losing to the eventual individual champion.

- ROBERT T. CARVILLE---Junior from Reno, Nevada. Won two monograms at Bellarmine Prep in golf. Has reached finals in Notre Dame individual championship twice, but has yet to win the crown. Hit a 70 for his best medal score in competition in the Reno Open.
- JOHN S. DALY-----24-year-old senior from Bronxville, N.Y. This is his first year on the Irish varsity. The lightest man on the team, he weighs in at 150. He holds a cum laude average of 88.
- PAUL HUDAK (CAPT)---Senior from Joliet, Ill. He is a two-letterman, who gained the team captaincy even though he did not play as a freshman. He is 23 years old, has the best medal score in competition on the team--a 64 scored in the Dwight Amateur Tournament.
- ROBERT JOES-----From Jackson, Mich., he is a junior, 19 years old, 6 feet tall and weighs 190. He is a transfer from Jackson Junior College, where he was on the golf team.
- FRANCIS MARZOLF----From Worthington, Ohio, he is a sophomore in the College of Arts and Letters. He was a semi-finalist in the University tournament last year. He won 4 monograms and was team captain in high school. He lists his greatest thrill in golf as an eagle on a par 4 hole.
- PRESTON MURPHY-----20 years old, Murphy is a junior and an honor student in the College of Science. He has a record of four years of high school golf competition and the team captaincy at Georgetown Prep. He is from Hammond, Indiana, is 6'3" tall and weighs 185. He won all of his matches in his senior year of high school.
- ROBERT T. ROLFS-----Senior from West Bend, Wisc., he is one of four returning lettermen. He is 6'3" tall and weighs 195. Another four letterman in golf in high school, he captained his team and won about 90% of his matches.
- TOM VEECH-----The big gun on the Notre Dame golf team. High school team he captained in Milwaukee was city champ for two years. Called Tiny by his teammates, Veech weighs 265, stands six feet two. He was a semi-finalist in last year's NCAA tournament. He is a co-holder of the Notre Dame course record. His lowest score in competition is a 65, which he hit in the Wisconsin State Open.
- JOHN J. WENGLING----A sophomore, Jack hails from Lexington, Michigan, earned a numeral on the 1949 freshman team. He played on the all-Japan golf team while in service, and lists as his greatest experience in golf a hole in one he got in Osaka.
- MAURICE J. WHITE----Maury is another vet, and incidentally, the oldest man on the team at 25. He served for 27 months as a Navy pilot. He is from Fenwick High in Chicago, and Peoria, Ill. His father is a pro in Peoria. He was a caddie for four years.

REV. GEORGE L. HOLDERITH, C.S.C., GOLF COACH

Father Holderith has been coach of the Notre Dame golf team since 1933, and is the oldest coach from point of length of service at Notre Dame. He is from Kokomo, Ind. He has been instrumental in the growth of interest in golf at Notre Dame, is Vice-President of the Association of College Golf Coaches. 1951 PROSPECTS

If ruggedness of opponents is any criterion, the Notre Dame golf team, coached by the Rev. George Holderith, C.S.C., will have a hard time duplicating or bettering last year's seven won, three lost and one tied record. However, Father Holderith, in his nineteenth year as Irish golf mentor, has hopes that four returning monogram winners, including Capt. Tom Veech, a quarter-finalist in the 1950 national amateur tourney, will fare successfully in the ten-match schedule which includes seven Big Ten squads, among them, Purdue, second ranked college golf team in the country. Along to help the 275-pound, 6'3" Veech are seniors Preston Murphy and Tom Klett, and junior Frank Marzolf. Newcomers who should strengthen the Irish are Tom Matey, a sophomore, and senior Warren Higgins.

HISTORY OF GOLF AT NOTRE DAME

This will mark the twenty-first season of intercollegiate golf at Notre Dame. Back in 1930, the first Irish linksmen went through a five match schedule without defeat, and also captured team honors in the Indiana Intercollegiate tourney. The 1931 team also boasted a spotless record, and the Irish stretched the skein to 17 wins in a row.

The longest Notre Dame win streak in golf extended from May 7, 1933, to May 11, 1935, during which period the Irish golfers won 22 consecutive dual matches. Northwestern broke the string, 11½ to 9½, in the only defeat Notre Dame suffered that season. The all-time record shows 139 wins, 38 losses and six ties. This is a winning percentage of .785, exclusive of ties.

Reverend George Holderith, C.S.C., was appointed golf coach in 1933. Since that time his charges have won 121 matches, dropped 36 and tied six times. That is a .771 average. Father Holderith, incidentally, with eighteen years of coaching is the oldest mentor, from point of length of service, at Notre Dame.

In 1944 the Irish won the National Collegiate golf title at Toledo Inverness. Notre Dame has entered the nationals 15 times, winning once, finishing second twice, winding up third on three occasions and capturing the fourth position twice.

Last year, in dual competition, the Irish dropped three of their first four matches, two of them to highly-rated North Texas State and Purdue, then went without defeat the rest of the season, their record marred only by a tie with Detroit. The season's final stood at seven wins, three losses and one tie.

REV. GEORGE L. HOLDERITH, C.S.C., GOLF COACH

Father Holderith has been coach of the Notre Dame golf team since 1933, and is the oldest coach from point of length of service at Notre Dame. He is from Kokomo, Ind. NOTES ON IRISH GOLFERS

JAMES BRITT--Sophomore from Toledo, Ohio. 19 years old, 6', 185-pounder goes under nickname of "Jimbow". Was captain of high school golf team at Campion Prep, runner up in Toledo Junior Championship. Best medal score in competition is a 70 scored in Toledo Junior Championship.

ROBERT EATON--Sophomore from Greeley, Colorado. He is 6'2", 170 pounds, a member of the Notre Dame basketball team. Participated in 18 of 24 games for the Irish cagers in his first year of competition. Won three letters in golf, two in basketball in high school. Frosh numerals in both at Notre Dame.

WILLIAM FISCHER--23-year-old junior from Joliet, Ill. Bill packs a hefty 220 pounds on a 5'11" frame. Finished 3rd in Chicago District Open, same in Walker County Invitational. Rates greatest thrill in golf scoring hole in one on Notre Dame's Burke Course.

WARREN HIGGINS--Nicknamed "Catus", Higgins is 5'10", 175 pounds. From Dallas, Texas, he was Southwest High School Tourney champ in 1946 and '47, runner-up in 1945. In 1948 he was the U.S.G.A. National Junior medalist. He was a quarter-finalist in the Western Amateur in 1948, where he lost to Skee Riegel, was a finalist in the Oklahoma Invitational where Charlie Coe beat him for the championship. Was Dallas City junior champ in 1944 and '45, Notre Dame student champ in 1948. He also qualified for the National Amateru in 1948 and '49. He is a senior. Best medal score in competition was sparkling 65 in '47 Dallas High School Tourney.

JAMES HUTCHINSON--Smallest man on the team at 5'9", 145 pounds, Hutch is a sophomore from Butler, Pa. Won a frosh numeral last year, was Western Pennsylvania Junior Tourney quarter-finalist, finished third in the Penn State Tourney. Captained Butler High team.

JAMES JACOBS--Jake is 6'1", 170 pounds. He is a junior from Bloomington, Ill. Also a monogram winner in fencing at Notre Dame, Jake is an honor student in the College of Arts and Letters, majoring in Journalism. Best medal score in competition was a 65 in his home club championship.

THOMAS KLETT--Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania senior, Tom was a quarter-finalist in the National Junior Tournament. His greatest thrill in golf came when he holed a seven-iron shot to win a match in that tourney. Klett is 21, 6', 190 pounds.

FRANCIS MARZOLF--21 years old, 5'10", 178 pounds, Frank is a junior monogram winner. Captained his high school golf team, finished fourth in Ohio State Junior Tournament. He is from Worthington. Won four monograms in golf while attending St. Charles Prep.

TOM MATEY--19-year-old sophomore from Warren, Ohio. If he lives up to his pre-college performance, should be red-hot prospect. Was Medalist in National Junior in 1948, quarter-finalist in Western Junior, won championship in State Junior tourney and State High School tourney. Captained his high school team for three years, during which they won the city title three years and the state once.

JOSEPH MORESCO--19-year-old sophomore from Staten Island, New York. Calls his greatest thrill in golf playing in the Gotham Open tourney with Joe Louis and Ray Robinson. Played football, basketball and baseball at New Dorp high. Went to quarter finals in Gotham Open tourney.

PRESTON MURPHY--21-year-old senior from Hammond, Indiana, Murph is one of four returning monogram winners. Will graduate cum laude in June. Captained Georgetown Prep team in Washington, D.C. Won Quebec Amateur tourney when he hit a 66, his lowest medal score in competition.

JOHN POWERS--Sophomore from Peoria, he is one of three members of Irish golf team from Illinois. Captained Spalding High team, won Peoria junior tourney two years in a row. 6', 180 pounds, Jack calls his greatest thrill in golf winning the Peoria City Tournament.

THOMAS VEECH--Captain of the 1951 Irish, Tom is one of the best Notre Dame golfers of all time. At 275 pounds he is the biggest member of the team. Won Wisconsin Open in 1948, won Western Junior in 1948. Was quarter-finalist in 1950 National Amateur, semi-finalist in 1949 National Collegiate tourney. Also took part in the 1951 Masters tourney, which he calls his greatest thrill in golf. Captained his Washington High School team for three years, during which years the squad won two city championships. He is a senior from Milwaukee, Wis.

JOHN WENDLING--6'1", 160 pounds, Jack is a junior from Lexington, Michigan. Has scored two holes in one, one while in service on Takarazaka course in Osaka, Japan, while playing on All-Japan golf team.

1952 PROSPECTS

Four monogram winners from the 1951 team will form the nucleus of this year's Notre Dame golf squad which is being called upon to play one of the most rugged schedules in Irish links history. The four men are: Capt. Bill Fischer, senior from Joliet, Ill.; Tom Matey, junior, Warren, Ohio; Frank Marzolf, senior, Columbus, Ohio, and Joe Moresco, junior, Staten Island, N.Y. Matey, last June, went to the semi-finals of the NCAA tournament. Marzolf is the only two-monogram winner on the squad. Reserves from last year include Jim Jacobs, senior, Hollywood, Fla., Larry Eaton, junior, Greeley, Colo., and Tom Doyle, junior, Morristown, N.J. Newcomers expected to help include Bob Filipiack, Toledo, Ohio, and Jim O'Connor, Crystal Lake, Ill., both freshmen, and Sophomore Tom Schweitz, Minneapolis, Minn. Six Western Conference opponents feature this year's 10-match schedule. Under the Rev. George Holderith, CSC, Notre Dame coach, the Irish golfers will be seeking to improve on last season's record of three victories, four losses and two ties. This, incidentally, was only the second time since golf was instituted at Notre Dame as an intercollegiate sport that the Irish have had a losing campaign.

This is a .745 average. Father Holderith, incidentally, with 18 years of coaching is the oldest mentor, from the point of length of service at Notre Dame. In 1944 the Irish won the NCAA golf title at Toledo Inverness. Notre Dame has entered the nationals 16 times, winning once, finishing second twice, winding up third on four occasions and capturing fourth position twice. Last year they were third. Individual honors have also come to the men coached by Father Holderith. Win Day, 1936 captain, reached the quarter finals in the National Amateur in 1934. Tom Veech, 1951 captain equalled Day's attainment in the 1950 National Amateur. And Tom Sheehan, two-time Irish leader set a new qualifying record in becoming the medalist in the 1939 National Amateur. Tom Matey, present squad member, went to the semi-finals in the NCAA tournament last June as a sophomore.

REV. GEORGE L. HOLDERITH, C.S.C., GOLF COACH

Father Holderith has been coach of the Notre Dame golf team since 1933, and is the oldest coach from point of length of service at Notre Dame. He is from Kokomo, Ind. 1953 PROSPECTS

Bolstered by the return of six monogram men, the Notre Dame golf team hopes to at least equal the eight won, three loss, one tie mark turned in by their 1952 predecessors. Captain Tom Matey, senior from Warren, Ohio, heads the list of monogram winners. Matey, a top member of the squad the past two years, is a consistent sub-par shooter and went to the semi-finals of the NCAA tournament in 1951. Other monogram men are: Joe Moresco, senior from Staten Island, N.Y.; Jack Powers, senior from Peoria, Ill.; Larry Eaton, senior from Greeley, Colo.; Mike Doyle, senior from Morristown, N.J.; and Bob Filipiak, sophomore from Toledo, Ohio. Moresco is the only two year man besides Matey. Others who are expected to see action during the season are Jim Terry, six-foot-seven junior from Kewanee, Ill.; Joe McInnerney, a senior from Chicago who is playing his first season with the squad; and John Foley, sophomore from Indianapolis, Ind. For the first time in the history of golf at Notre Dame the linksters took a Southern trip prior to the regular season, spending a week at Chapel Hill, N.C., as guests of North Carolina University. The Irish played exhibition matches with the Tarheels and Ohio University during their stay. An ambitious ten match schedule faces the Irish this spring, with six matches against Big Ten schools finishing up the card.

1955 PROSPECTS

The biggest single problem confronting Rev. George L. Holderith, C.S.C., as he begins his 23rd season as Notre Dame golf coach is that he will be forced to depend to a great degree on relatively inexperienced golfers with the result that the possibilities for a slow start make it difficult to forecast an improved performance over last season's 5-5 record.

Co-Captains John Foley and Bob Filipiak are the only returning monogram winners and are expected to battle for the number one position. Of last year's top six shooters, the other four have departed, including the two top men, Paul Minnich and Jim Terry. Leo Matt is the only other returning veteran but he did not earn a monogram in 1954. He is a junior, as are two other prospects who should see a good deal of action: Chuck Gordon and Joe Mulflur.

The remaining three berths will probably be filled by sophomores Sam Merrra, and Bill McGuire and senior Tom Kinsler. All three have been impressive but are as yet untried. All things considered, it may be that better team balance than last year will ultimately outweigh the factor of inexperience.

HISTORY OF GOLF AT NOTRE DAME

This will mark the 26th season of intercollegiate golf at Notre Dame. Back in 1930, the first Irish linksmen went through a five match schedule without defeat, and in 1931 the Irish were also undefeated. Notre Dame extended this victory skein to 17 in a row. The longest Irish winning streak is 22 consecutive dual match victories from May 7, 1933, to May 11, 1935. The all-time record shows 156 wins, 52 losses, and 11 ties. This is a .750 winning percentage, exclusive of ties. Rev. George L. Holderith, C.S.C., was appointed golf coach in 1933. Since then, his charges have won 138 matches, lost 50, and tied 11. In 1944 the Irish won the NCAA golf title at the famous Inverness Country Club in Toledo. Notre Dame has entered the Nationals 17 times, winning once, finishing second twice, winding up third on four occasions, and capturing fourth position twice. Individual honors have also come to men coached by Father Holderith. Win Day, 1936 captain, reached the quarterfinals of the 1934 National Amateur. Tom Veech, 1951 captain, equalled Day's achievement in the 1950 National Amateur. Tom Sheehan, a two-time Irish captain, set a new qualifying record in becoming the medalist in the 1939 National Amateur. Tom Matey, the 1953 Notre Dame captain, went to the semi-finals of the 1951 NCAA tourney.

NOTES ON THE IRISH GOLFERS

ROBERT FILIPIAK-- 22 year old senior Co-Captain from Toledo, Ohio. "Flip" is beginning his fourth season as a Notre Dame varsity golfer, having won monograms in 1952 and 1954. A graduate of Central Catholic high in Toledo, Bob once caddied for Ben Hogan when Hogan won the Inverness Invitational Tourney.

JOHN FOLEY-- A senior from Indianapolis, Ind., John is the other Co-Captain for 1954. A monogram winner last year, John is 21 years old and will probably alternate with Filipiak in the number one position this season. Last summer John won the Indiana State Junior crown with a brilliant 10 and 9 victory in the finals.

CHARLES GORDON-- Chuck is a 20-year old junior from New York City where he attended St. John's Prep. He is in the College of Commerce at Notre Dame and is out for his first season of varsity competition.

LEO MATT-- A junior from Cherokee, Iowa, beginning his second season on the golf team. Leo has competed in the Iowa State Junior and State Amateur tourneys and recently won the Esterville Invitational.

BILL McGUIRE-- 19-year old sophomore from Rocky River, Ohio, Bill picked up his golfing experience through a five-year caddying career in and around Cleveland. His biggest thrill to date was shooting a hole-in-one on the Notre Dame course in last fall's intramural tourney.

SAM MERRA-- One of the top sophomore prospects, Sam is from Brockton, Mass. His high school team won three city championships and Sam himself once won the State Junior Chamber of Commerce tournament.

JOE MULFLUR-- Another first-year man on the Irish varsity, Joe is a 20-year old junior from Highland, Ind. A graduate of Noll high school in Hammond, Joe lists his biggest thrill as winning his first tournament in 1950.

THOMAS KUNSLER-- A senior in the Notre Dame College of Commerce, Tom will be competing for the first year as a varsity golfer, although he gained some experience as a high school golfer in his hometown of Omaha, Nebraska.

1956 PROSPECTS

1957 PROSPECTS

The 1957 Notre Dame golf team could benefit greatly from five monogram juniors, all of whom gained valuable experience as sophomores last year. Eight Irish linksmen received monograms last year and five of these return. The five, Co-Captains Joe Grace and Charles Thurn, Lloyd Syron, Tom Garside and Joe Leslie, were key figures in the fine, 9-4, record turned in by last year's team, and the sixth place finish in the N.C.A.A. tourney.

Grace and Thurn alternated as top man last year, Syron alternated between the third and fourth spot, and Garside and Leslie saw considerable action in the fifth and sixth positions. Grace with an average of 73.13 and Thurn with 73.83 were the low shooters on the squad.

Grace, Thurn, Syron and Garside will more than likely hold down the top four positions in that order this season. The fifth spot could go to junior Stan Lorens and the sixth position to sophomore Wayne Pence. Others who will be in contention are Leslie, junior Jim Mrus, and sophomores Dennis Nead and Don Williams.

The Irish face a tough fifteen match schedule, including a meeting with N.C.A.A. runner-up Purdue, in the season's final match. Father Holderith's linksmen then close out the season with the N.C.A.A. tourney, June 23-29, at Broadmoor Country Club, Colorado Springs, Colo. In last year's tourney, despite a sixth place finish, the Irish finished only six points behind the champions and qualified four men for match play.

HISTORY OF GOLF AT NOTRE DAME

This is the 29th season of intercollegiate golf at Notre Dame. In 1930, the first Irish linksmen went through a five-match schedule without defeat and were also undefeated in 1931. Four consecutive victories in 1932 gave them a consecutive victory skein of 17 in a row. The longest Irish winning streak is 22 consecutive dual match wins from May 7, 1933 to May 11, 1935. The 1956-57 teams had a winning string of 14 sandwiched between losses to Purdue.

The all-time record shows 183 wins, 63 losses, and 11 ties, for a .744 winning percentage, exclusive of ties. Rev. George L. Holderith, C.S.C., was appointed golf coach in 1933. Since then, his teams have won 165 matches, lost 61, and tied 11. In 1944, Notre Dame won the N.C.A.A. golf title at the famous Inverness Country Club in Toledo. Notre Dame has entered the Nationals 19 times, winning once, finishing second twice, winding up third four times, and finishing fourth twice. Last year the Irish tied for 14th place.

Individual honors have also come to men coached by Father Holderith. Win Day, 1936 captain, reached the quarterfinals of the 1934 National Amateur. Tom Veech, 1951 captain, equaled Day's achievement in the 1950 National Amateur. Tom Sheehan, a two-time Irish captain, set a new qualifying record in winning medalist honors in the 1939 National Amateur, and Tom Matey, the 1953 captain, went to the semi-finals of the 1951 N.C.A.A. tourney. Lloyd Syron, now a senior two-year monogram winner for the Irish, was the 1957 Michigan amateur champion.

REV. GEORGE L. HOLDERITH, C.S.C., GOLF COACH

Father Holderith has been coach of the Notre Dame golf team since 1933, and in those 23 years as the Irish mentor, his golf teams have won 165 matches, lost 61, and tied 11 for a winning percentage of .703, exclusive of ties. He is from Kokomo, Ind., and is the oldest coach from the point of length of experience at Notre Dame. Father Holderith has been instrumental in the great development of the sport of golf at Notre Dame, conducting many interhall golf tournaments, from which have come many of the varsity golfers. He has also from time to time sponsored exhibitions by well-known golfers on the University's Burke Memorial Course. Father Holderith is a past president of the Association of College golf coaches.

1958 PROSPECTS

Experience will be the factor in any success achieved by the 1958 Notre Dame golf team. Since none of the monogram winners from the 1957 team were lost through graduation, and the junior-studded team which compiled a 13-2 mark is in tack for this season's schedule, the outlook is bright.

Topping the list of returning veterans are Charles Thurn and Joe Grace, both of whom were re-elected as co-captains for the 1958 campaign. Last season these two seniors alternated in the number one position for the golf team. In 15 matches Thurn averaged 74.27 for 18 holes and Grace was second on the team with a 75.63 average. Lloyd Syron and Tom Garside, winners of two monograms each, are again expected to be mainstays on any six-man team the Irish field this season. Syron ranked third on the squad from the standpoint of lowest average medal score and Garside led the team in number of points earned, besides winning the University golf championship last fall. Other senior golf monogram winners who are expected to bolster the team are Jim Mrus, Joe Leslie, and Marty Carroll. Don Williams, the only sophomore to letter on last spring's squad, is also returning. Williams ranked sixth in number of points earned on the 1957 squad.

Strength has been added to the team with the eligibility of five good sophomore prospects. They are: Christie Flanagan, Terry Lally, Tom Rose, Bud Zesinger, and Frank Hund. Four juniors, who did not win monograms in 1957, have also shown well in practice this spring. They are: Gerald Webster, Bob Marso, Bob Nowak, and Dennis Nead.

The Irish linksmen will face 15 teams in eight matches this spring. Many of the midwest's top collegiate teams, notably those in the Big Ten, are scheduled. The golf team will close out the season with the N.C.A.A. tournament which will be held June 22-28 at Williams University, Williamstown, Mass. Last year in the Nationals Notre Dame finished 14th, though with virtually the same team the year before they placed sixth, six strokes off the winning total.

HISTORY OF GOLF AT NOTRE DAME

This is the 30th season of intercollegiate golf at Notre Dame. In 1930, the first Irish linksmen went through a five-match schedule without defeat, and next year's team accomplished the same feat. Four consecutive victories in 1932 gave them a consecutive win skein of 17. The longest Irish winning streak, however, is 22 straight (dual meets), from May 7, 1933 to May 11, 1935. The 1956-57 squads had a victory string of 14, sandwiched between losses to Purdue.

The all-time Notre Dame golf record shows 195 wins, 66 losses, for a .747 winning percentage, exclusive of ties.

In 1944 Notre Dame won the N.C.A.A. golf title at the famous Inverness Country Club in Toledo. Notre Dame has entered the Nationals 20 times, winning once, second twice, winding up third four times, and finishing fourth twice.

Individual honors have also come to men coached by The Rev. George L. Holderith, C.S.C. Win Day, 1936 captain, reached the quarterfinals of the 1934 National Amateur. Tom Veech, 1951 captain, equaled Day's achievement in the 1950 National Amateur. Tom Sheehan, a two-time Irish captain, set a new qualifying record in winning medalist honors in the 1939 National Amateur, and Tom Matey, the 1953 captain, went to the semi-finals of the 1951 N.C.A.A. Tournament. Another former Irish golfer is Bill Casper, Jr., one of the current professional ranks top young stars.

REV. GEORGE L. HOLDERITH, C.S.C., GOLF COACH

Father Holderith has been coach of the Notre Dame golf team since 1933, and in those 26 years as the Irish mentor, his golf teams have won 177 matches, lost 64, and tied 11 for a .734 winning percentage. From the standpoint of length of experience at Notre Dame as a coach, Father Holderith stands in front. He is also a past president of the Association of College golf coaches.

1959 Golf Prospects

Severe graduation losses, coupled with another tough schedule, figure together to make the 1959 Notre Dame golf team fortunes less bright than a year ago when the Irish linksmen compiled a fine 12-3 mark. Departed are the two 1958 co-captains, Joe Grace and Charlie Thurn, plus two other three-year monogram men, Tom Garside and Lloyd Syron.

To replace them, Father Holderith has seven returning monogram men, only two of which are seniors. Heading the list is Frank Hund, a junior, who led last spring's team in points earned with 47. Captain Gary Webster, a senior, is also counted on heavily. Junior Terry Lally, with the lowest average medal score last season is back, along with three other junior veterans, Tom Rose, Christie Flanagan, and Bud Zesinger. Don Williams, a senior, is the final monogram-winner returnee, but he accomplished this two years ago. Prominent sophomore prospects are Ray Patak, George Mack, Phil Schuster, and Jim Stahl. Jim Kennedy, a senior, also has looked promising in pre-season practice.
