HISTORY OF GOLF AT NOTRE DAME

This is the 31st season of varsity golf at Notre Dame. In 1930, the first Irish varsity golf team went through a five-match schedule without a defeat, and the next year's team accomplished the same feat. Four consecutive victories in 1932 gave them a consecutive win skein of 17. The longest Irish winning streak, however, is 22 straight (dual meets), from May 7, 1933 to May 11, 1935. The 1956-57 squads had a victory string of 14, sandwiched between losses to Purdue.

The all-time Notre Dame golf record shows 207 wins, and 71 losses for a .745 winning percentage, exclusive of ties.

In 1944, Notre Dame won the N.C.A.A. golf title at the famous Inverness Country Club in Toledo. Notre Dame has entered the Nationals 21 times, winning once, taking second twice, finishing third four times and winding up fourth twice.

Individual honors have also come to men coached by the Rev. George L. Holderith, C.S.C. Win Day, 1936 captain, reached the quarterfinals of the 1934 National Amateur. Tom Veech, 1951 captain, equaled Day's performance in the 1950 National Amateur. Tom Sheehan, two-time Irish captain, set a new qualifying record in winning medalist honors in the 1939 National Amateur, and Tom Matey, the 1953 captain, went to the semi-finals of the 1951 N.C.A.A. Tournament. Another former Irish golfer is Bill Casper, Jr., one of the current professional stars.

REV. GEORGE L. HOLDERITH, C.S.C., GOLF COACH

Father Holderith has been coach of the Notre Dame golf team since 1933, and in those 27 years as the Irish mentor, his golf teams have won 189 matches, lost 69 and tied 11, for a .703 winning percentage. From the standpoint of length of experience at Notre Dame as a coach, Father Holderith stands in front. He is also a past president of the Association of College golf coaches, and is presently serving in his first year of a six-year term as a member of the N.C.A.A. Golf Committee.

Assisting Father Holderith in coaching the 1960 Irish linksmen will be the Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C. Father Durbin has been an Economics professor at Notre Dame since last September, and previously while teaching at the University of Portland, he coached the golf team there for eight years.

1960 Golf Prospects

Six monogram winners plus a core of sophomore prospects must overcome the loss of three monogram-winning seniors who have graduated if the 1960 Notre Dame golf team is to improve on its 12-5 record of last year.

Gone are the 1959 captain and a two-year monogram-winner, Gerald Webster, and Dennis Nead and James Kennedy.

Heading the returning contingent is Captain Terry Lally, a senior from Louisville, Ky. Four of the other monogram winners are seniors--Tom Rose, Frank Hund, Clarke (Bud) Zesinger and Christie Flanagan. Ray Patak is the lone junior monogram winner. The sophomore group is headed by Tom Grace, Bruce Odlaug, Al Highducheck, Eddie Schnurr, and Russ Beaupre. Other promising prospects include senior Bob Skrzycki and juniors Phil Schuster, Jim Kenny, George Mack, Jack Whitaker and John Valicenti.

1961 GOLF PROSPECTS

For the 32nd season of golf at Notre Dame, Father George Holderith will have six returning monogram winners, plus other returnees of some experience and a few promising sophomores with which to build his squad. It will take a strong outfit, though, to follow the pace set by his recent teams. In the last five seasons, the Irish linksmen have won 57 meets and lost only 17, and last year's squad took 11 victories while losing only three contests.

Back from the 1960 squad are this year's captain, and two-year monogram winner, Ray Patak, who had a 76.8 average in nine rounds of competition last spring. The returning monogram-holder with the best average last season is a junior, Tom Grace, who played at a 74.8 pace in 1960, and tied for second in the Indiana Intercollegiate tournament. Two other juniors among the monogram returnees are Eddie Schnurr, who averaged 77.4 last spring and who also plays varsity basketball (averaging 12.2 points per game from his guard spot last winter), and Bruce Odlaug, who finished up last June with a 77.3 mark.

Two seniors round out the group of six monogram winners. One is Jim Stahl, who shot a 77.1 two years ago, but did not compete in 1960, and the other is Phil Schuster, who compiled a 79.5 record last season. Other seniors of some experience are George Mack, Jim Kenny and John Palumbo. Top juniors include Craig Vollhaber, Al Highducheck and Russ Beaupre, while some of the better sophomores are Bob Ferrell, Terry Kitch, Pete Bisconti, Jay Strack and Kenny Nelson.

Rev. George L. Holderith, C.S.C., Golf Coach

Father Holderith has been coach of the Notre Dame golf team since 1933, and in those 28 years as the Irish mentor, his linksmen have won 200 matches, lost 72, and tied 11, for a .735 winning percentage, exclusive of ties. In addition to holding first place in point of experience as a Notre Dame coach (he has a one-year lead over baseball mentor Jake Kline), Father Holderith is also a past president of the the Association of College Golf Coaches, and is presently serving his second year as a member of the NCAA Golf Committee.

Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C., Assistant Coach

Assisting Father Holderith in coaching the Irish golfers for the second straight year will be the Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C. Father Durbin has been an economics professor at Notre Dame since the fall of 1959, and previously, while teaching at the University of Portland, he coached the golf team there for eight years.

History of Golf at Notre Dame

As a varsity competition, golf had one of the brightest beginnings of any sport at Notre Dame. The first two teams, in 1930 and 1931, managed to finish out their seasons unbeaten, and the 1932 squad added four more victories before losing, so golf history on the South Bend campus began with a 17-meet winning streak. The longest Irish win skein, however, is 22 straight (dual meets), from May 7, 1933, to May 11, 1935. The 1956-57 team also put together a victory string of 14 straight, in between losses to Purdue.

The all-time Notre Dame golf record shows 218 wins, 74 losses, and 11 ties for a .746 winning percentage, exclusive of ties.

In 1944, Notre Dame won the NCAA golf title at the famous Inverness Country Club in Toledo. The Irish have entered the Nationals 21 times, winning once, taking second twice, finishing third four times and winding up fourth twice.

1963 GOLF PROSPECTS

Notre Dame Golf Coach Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C., pointed out the main problem facing the Irish squad during the '63 campaign in saying "we may lack the depth to go with the schedule." Father Durbin is relying on this season to develop a crop of very promising underclassmen for next year.

The Irish squad can claim only three returning monogram winners from the 1962 team. Bob Ferrel, one of the returning trio of seniors and owner of two monograms, averaged 75.8 for twelve rounds in 1961 and posted a 76.1 median last season. Completing the veteran threesome are Pete Bisconti and Mike Voss who recorded 78 and 77 averages last spring.

A pair of outstanding sophmores, Jim Hiniker and Mike O'Connell, are bright spots and could easily tee off from the top two positions of the six man team used in competition. Juniors Skip Vaughn, Jerry Lefere, and Joe O'Neill will give needed support as the Irish meet 22 different schools in 21 individual matches including last year's number one and two teams in the Big Ten, Indiana and Purdue.

1964 GOLF PROSPECTS

After a season of rebuilding that produced a record of 23 wins against nine losses, Coach Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C., feels that he has come up with a squad that will be competitively eager and fundamentally strong. "These boys, although still young, have one big factor going in their favor and that is a strong desire to play good competitive golf," says the Irish head coach.

Bill Regnier, Chuck McLaughlin, Ed Schaffler, plus Pat Danahy and Jim Murray were all strong golfers in their freshman years and will be heavily counted on to add depth to the squad. Jim Tenbroeck and Jerry Lefere will be the only seniors on the squad this year.

The Irish face the usual formidable schedule with three schools - Dayton, Toledo, and Illinois State - the only new opponents in recent years that the Irish have scheduled. The Notre Damers will host the annual Big State tournament on the Burke Memorial course, May 4.

1965 GOLF PROSPECTS

Last season, a young Notre Dame golf team posted an impressive 20-4 record, and finished in a tie for fourth place in the 46-team NCAA championship field. Only two of the starters had seen previous varsity competition, but they were eager to learn and had the desire to win. This year, Coach Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C., can only be optimistic as he will have five of the top six men of last spring back.

Included in the "big five" are senior Co-Captains Mike O'Connell and Jim Hiniker, and junior Pat Danahy. As a sophomore, O'Connell fired a seven-under par 64 to establish a Burke Memorial Course record. Danahy advanced to the "circle of 16" in last season's NCAA individual competition. Rounding out the list of returning starters are juniors Chuck McLaughlin and Bill Regnier.

With golfers like juniors Bill Sebasky and Ed Schaffler, and sophs Monty Kuka, Chris Siegler, and Mike Thorp vying for a starting assignment, Father Durbin figures to have the necessary experience and depth to improve on a fine 1964 record.

Schedule-wise, the Irish take on only one new opponent, hosting the Air Force Academy in a quadrangular meet on May 15. The Notre Damers' spring outing will be a return trip to Memphis, Tenn., where they will spend a week competing against Memphis State, the Memphis Country Club team, Southwestern University, and the University of Mississippi.

Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C., enters his seventh year as Notre Dame's golf mentor after serving as assistant coach from 1959-61. Over the past six years, Fr. Durbin-coached teams have compiled an impressive collegiate record of 107 victories, 39 losses, and two ties for a winning percentage of .739.

Last season Father Durbin's golfers accumulated a campaign mark of 10-8, following a more impressive 1966 season of 23

wins versus only seven defeats.

A golfing advocate since his youth, Fr. Durbin has been extremely active in the NCAA Golf Coaches Association. Presently holding the office of Vice President in the organization, Fr. Durbin will assume the presidency of the Association for the 1968-69 season this June at the annual meeting in Las Cruces, N.M. In addition, he is also the chairman of the District Four NCAA selection committee.

Previous to coaching at Notre Dame, Fr. Durbin was the head golf coach at Portland University from 1948-59 where he compiled a record of 146 wins, 34 losses, and three ties. In almost two decades of collegiate coaching, Fr. Durbin's win-loss tally now stands at 253-73-5.

During his tenure at Portland, Fr. Durbin coached Walker Cupper Bruce Cudd, twice winner of the Oregon Open and the Oregon Amateur, winner of the Northwest Open and the Western Amateur, and two-time entrant in the Masters Tournament.

An excellent golfer, Fr. Durbin has recorded a low-score 65 on Notre Dame's par 71, 6,535-yard Burke Memorial Course although he considers his best effort a 64 on a par 74 course while at Portland. He has also registered three aces in his golfing career.

A Notre Dame graduate, Fr. Durbin is also an assistant professor of economics at the University.

Prospectus

Despite the return of only one monogram winner and a basically inexperienced squad, the Notre Dame golf team enters the 1968 season with strong hopes of improving last year's unimpressive 10-8 performance.

The lone returnee for the Irish linksters is captain Charles Musick, a junior from Miami, Fla. Musick spent the past summer working under Bob Toski, a popular Florida golf professional and sportscaster.

Senior candidates for the six positions on the Notre Dame club include a pair of Illinois natives, Frank Mentone of Chicago and Mike Heaton of Seneca. Mentone maintained his proficiency during the summer winning the 1967 Cook (Ill.) County Amateur Tournament. Heaton will be attempting to earn a monogram in a second sport this spring, having been awarded a monogram in football as a split end and placekicker during the fall.

Aspirants from the junior class are Mike Brands (Portland, Ore.), a former all-state prep quarterback who boasts a three handicap, and Dick Freehan (Birmingham, Mich.), brother of Detroit Tiger catcher Bill. Other junior prospects include Roger Bonahoom (Grosse Pte Farms, Mich.), George Farrell (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and Brian Williams (Birmingham, Mich.).

The Irish also have amongst their golfing ranks three top sophomores led by Bob Wilson (Memphis, Tenn.) who won the 1967 Memphis City Open and qualified for the 1967 National Amateur Tournament.
