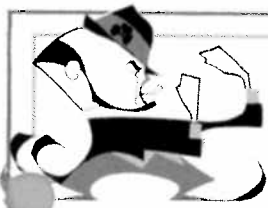

division record. Provided there is a tie for first in the University Division at the end of the year, the winner will be determined by total MLA records, which gives the Irish, who lost only to Ohio Wesleyan, a distinct advantage. The game against Denison also carries psychological importance since it looks like Denison (with a record of 10-1) will win the College Division title of the MLA and therefore would play Notre Dame for the MLA title if the Irish do win their division.

"Every game is a must-win situation for us now, although the Ashland game does carry more importance because of the divisional race," observes O'Leary. "It is always important to play well against the best team in the Midwest, and if we perform well for all four quarters, we have a chance to win," says O'Leary about the Denison contest.

The Irish coach is much more emphatic about the Ashland confrontation. "We need good offensive pressure and a top effort from our midfield lines to defeat Ashland," claims O'Leary. "We play best when we are aggressive, and lately our first midfield has showed improvement, and both of these factors should help us against Ashland," concludes the coach.

That first midfield line, with senior Bill Bonde (Barrington, R.I.), junior Dan Pace (Summit, N.J.) and freshman Joe Hart (Huntington, N.Y.), has been very productive. Bonde ranks second on the team scoring list with 28 goals and 10 assists, while Pace has 21 points (eight goals, 13 assists) and Hart is the highest-scoring freshman with seven goals and three assists. Senior attackman Steve Linehan (Lexington, Ky.) continues to lead the squad in scoring with a school-record 29 goals to go along with 12 assists. Fellow attackman Steve Pearsall, a sophomore from Greenlawn, N.Y., leads the team in assists with 22 while scoring 14 times.

Injuries have brought good and bad news to O'Leary, as senior co-captain Mike Lynch (Mendham, N.J.) sprained an ankle against Ohio State and may miss the Denison contest, but senior defenseman Rich Wichel (Weehawken, N.J.), who has spent the entire year as an assistant coach because of an off-season eye injury, has been allowed by doctors to play. "We will use Rich on our man-down defense until he gets into really good shape, and we will also use him as a defensive specialist," claims O'Leary. "The real advantage Rich gives us is his aggressive style of play."

Defensively, two freshmen, Rob Simpson (Port Jefferson, N.Y.) and Justin Shay (Carlisle, Mass.), have sparkled. Simpson has 143 saves to his credit while carrying the bulk of the playing time in goal, and Shay has set a team-record for goals and points for a defenseman with three and six, respectively.

BASEBALL -- There's something else warming up in South Bend these days besides the weather. Fortunately for second-year Irish head coach Larry Gallo, it's his Notre Dame baseball team. The Irish were on a hot streak -- winning 11 out of their last 13 games -- before losing a pair of close games last weekend. The squad has posted a 13-10 mark so far this year and looks to continue the "warming trend" in action this week.

The remainder of the '82 docket is scheduled to be played at Notre Dame's Jake Kline Field. On Wednesday, the Irish entertain St. Joseph's College in a twinbill slated for 1:00 p.m. Notre Dame swept the Pumas two years ago by 5-1 and 7-5 margins. The weekend will hopefully provide Irish fans the opportunity to bask in the sun and watch Notre Dame battle Dayton on Saturday and Detroit on Sunday in a pair of 1:00 p.m. doubleheaders. The Irish split with the Flyers (2-6, 19-3) and were swept by the Titans (3-4, 7-8) last year.

The past week started well for the Irish as they rolled to 4-1 and 10-3 victories over Wisconsin. Junior Steve Whitmyer (Columbus, Ohio) went the distance in the opener, claiming his first win of the year (1-1). Whitmyer yielded seven hits, while striking out four. Senior co-captain Chuck Tasch (Barrington, Ill.) provided the offensive punch contributing three runs batted in.

BASEBALL -- The Notre Dame baseball team is seeking an NCAA tournament bid -- and the Irish feel they deserve it. After returning from their spring trip to Oklahoma and Missouri with a disappointing 2-6 record (losing three one-run ball games), the Irish have won 25 of their last 33 games (13 of their last 16), and currently enjoy a six-game winning streak. The Irish conclude their regular season with a 1:00 p.m. doubleheader against the Northwestern Wildcats, Tuesday May 4, at home in Jake Kline Field. The Big Ten Conference Cats defeated the Irish 9-5 last year in the Rocky Miller Invitational Tournament in Evanston, Ill. The Irish, however, came back to sweep a doubleheader from Northwestern (10-2, 8-7) in a separate encounter at Notre Dame.

The key to Larry Gallo's squad this year has been the superb performance of the pitching staff which holds a 3.69 ERA. Sophomore Mark Clementz, a product of nearby Elkhart, Ind., paces the Irish mound crew with his 6-0 slate (1.50 ERA). Clementz also has recorded two of the Irish hurlers' six shut-outs. Senior fireballer Bryan Smith (Syracuse, Ind.) has been outstanding in his final year, notching seven wins against only two losses in over 60 innings of action. The feisty righthander moved himself into a tie for third place on the all-time single season win list by downing the Illinois-Chicago Circle on Sunday 9-2 and maintains a 3.88 ERA. Junior Bill Matre also has been a mainstay on the mound for the Irish, having registered a 5-4 mark and 3.47 ERA. He also owns two shut-out performances. Tom Conlin (Mt. Prospect, Ill.) has been the Irish fireman coming out of the bullpen this year. Making seven appearances and totaling 28 1/3 innings of work, the sophomore righthander has claimed an even 2-2 record and leads the team with his 0.95 ERA.

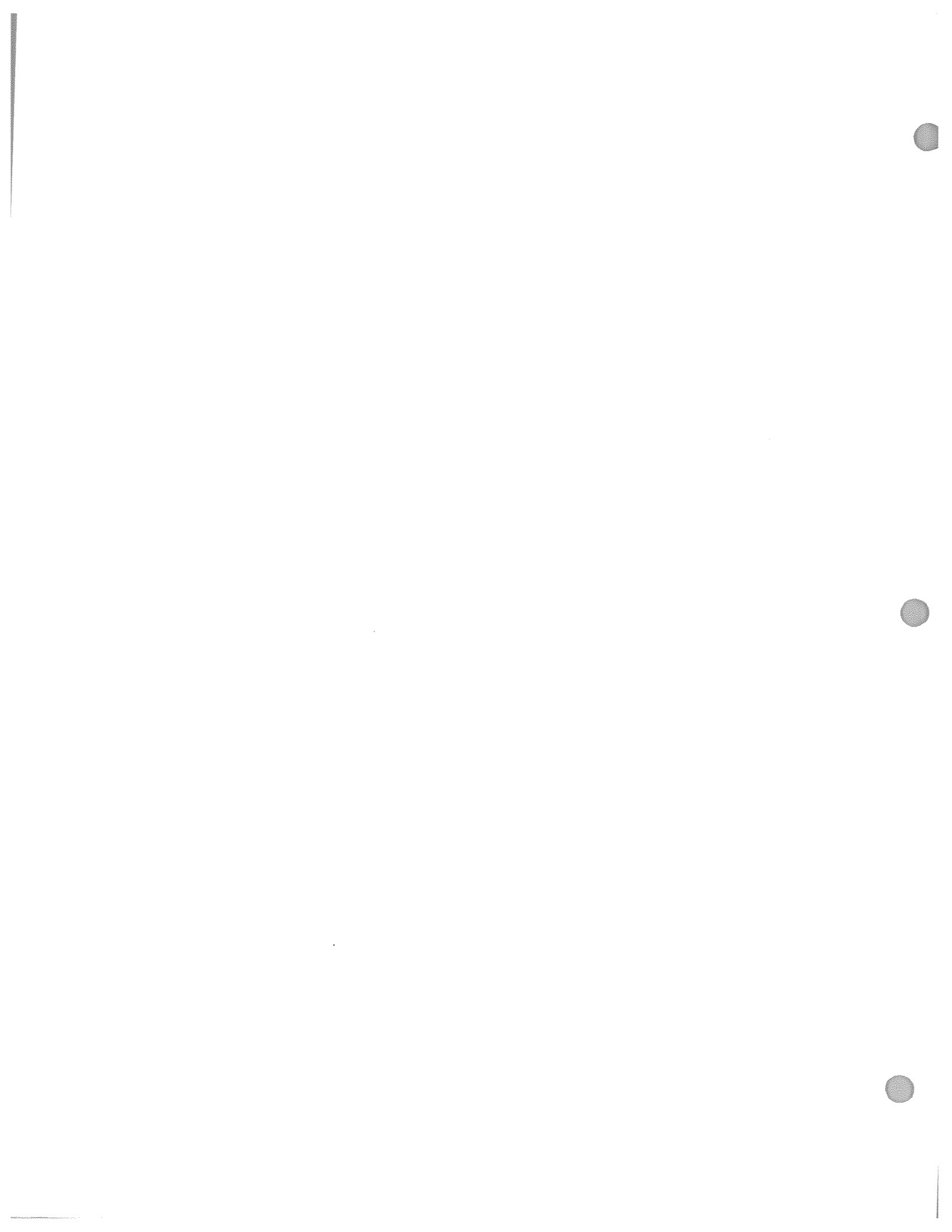
In the Notre Dame offensive department, three seniors have each contributed 40 or more base hits. Shortstop and co-captain Chuck Tasch, a product of Barrington, Ill., and classmate Dan Szajko, a South Bend, Ind., native have acquired identical .341 batting averages. Tasch currently leads the squad with 35 runs batted in, and has scored 25 times while swiping 13 bases. Szajko, the starting rightfielder for the last three years, will break into Notre Dame's top five for total hits in one season if he can smack a pair in his final doubleheader. Szajko has 45 hits, including five round-trippers, and already has surpassed the marks he set last year for most runs (41) and stolen bases (16) in a season. Szajko has crossed the plate 44 times already and has nabbed 20 bases. Co-captain Henry Valenzuela (Tampa, Fla.) has banged out 40 base hits, including four homeruns while garnering a .294 batting average. The senior first baseman is second on the squad with 33 RBI's.

The Irish won eight of 10 ballgames last week. Their only losses came to a tough Western Michigan ballclub (5-1, 3-2). In their last 11 games the Irish pitchers have allowed an average of only two runs a game. Over the weekend the Irish claimed a (5-2, 3-0) sweep of Wright State and (9-2, 11-4) trounce of Illinois-Chicago Circle. Bill Matre hurled 5 1/3 innings of no-hit ball until being nixed for two hits in the sixth -- the only two he gave up for the game in notching his fifth win in the opener against Wright State. Dan Szajko smashed a two-run homer and junior Rick Chryst (Platteville, Wis.) added a bases-loaded double that drove in three runs. In the nightcap, Mark Clementz advanced to 6-0 behind his six-hit, six-strike out shut out. On Sunday, Henry Valenzuela knocked in five runs in the second game against Illinois-Chicago Circle on two two-run singles and a sacrifice fly. The Irish sluggers have swung their way to a .279 team batting average, while their opponents have been limited to a .251 mark. Notre Dame also has outscored their opponents 243-147 this far in the season.

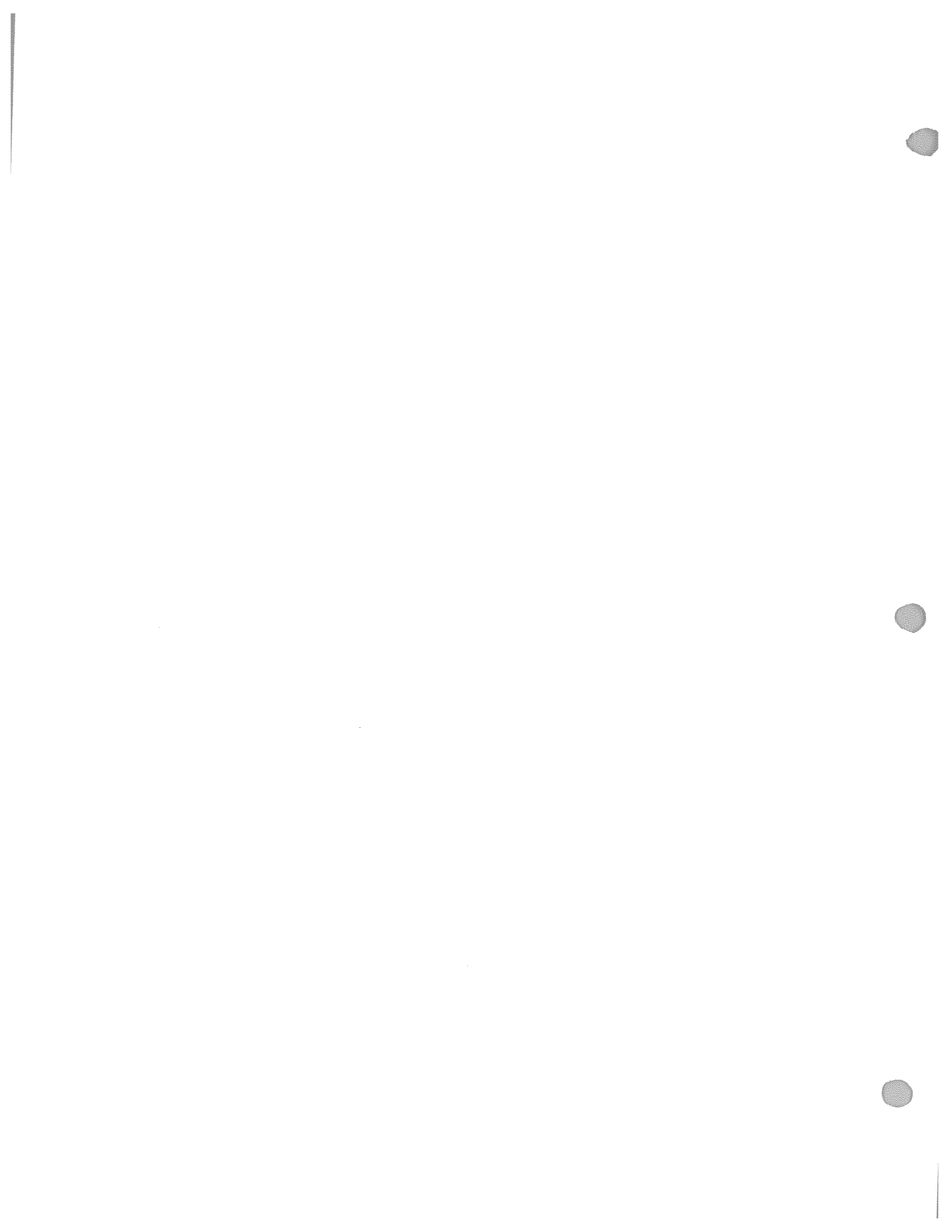
GOLF -- The Notre Dame golf team completed its season this past weekend, finishing 14th in the 15-team, 54-hole Northern Intercollegiate Invitational at the University of Iowa.

Ohio State topped the field with a stroke total of 1072, followed by Indiana (1094) and Northern Illinois, Ball State and Michigan State (tie -- 1098). Notre Dame's team total was 1135.

BURKE MEMORIAL GOLF COURSE

The sprawling 6,445-yard Burke Memorial Golf Course has been home to the Irish linksmen since 1935, when the course was created through a land donation by William Burke. Since that time, the course has matured into one of northern Indiana's most challenging layouts.

The course, which features small, undulating greens and tight fairways, plays to a par-71, 36-35. The present course record dates back to 1963 when Mike O'Connell traversed the course with a seven-under-par 64. The team record belongs to the 1974 Irish squad which scored a 359 in a dual meet with Tri-State University.

Bobby Kloska (Elkhart, Ind.) will be one player who the Irish can depend on in '88. The sophomore enters his second collegiate season and there is no substitute for experience, especially in such a high pressure sport. This is something which his coach definitely recognizes.

"A member of the Blue team last year, Bobby will be challenging to play this spring and most likely will get a chance," O'Sullivan says.

Rounding out the Irish roster are three newcomers who may surprise many people this year. Senior Mike Lynch (Wilmington, Del.), sophomore D.J. Romano (River Forest, Ill.) and freshman Jim Troutman (Centerville, Ohio) all finished in the top 10 at the Notre Dame Open, an annual fall tournament which any student at the University can enter. Although the odds are stacked against them, these linksters, like their teammates, should not be counted out. Anything can happen.

The Irish major obstacle in their quest for a bid to the NCAA championships in Thousand Oaks, Calif, is possibly the most demanding schedule that a Notre Dame team has had to face. Besides one dual home match, the Irish are slated to play in six 54-hole tournaments. The sites include some of the toughest courses in the Midwest such as Ohio State's Scarlet Course, designed by Jack Nicklaus, which is the site of the Kepler Intercollegiate.

In order to prepare themselves for such an arduous season, O'Sullivan has taken on a new approach to the upcoming season.

"During the off season, the team has been working under the supervision of strength coach, Gary Weil," O'Sullivan says. "The reasons for the workouts are to become both mentally and physically tough for a long season."

"No one can make a prediction in advance with this type of mixture," O'Sullivan says. "We have the potential to be a very fine team. Every player on this team is a hard worker and has earned his position. Like all Notre Dame teams, we try to meet the challenge no matter how great the odds by giving our all everytime out. If this mixture gets cooking, it can click into a wonderful season."

Anything can happen.

Rounding out the Irish lineup are two veterans, Jim Troutman (Centerville, Ohio) and Mike Lynch (Wilmington, Del.) and freshman Mike Crisanti (Elgin, Ill.), another newcomer who could be a strong asset for the future of the Irish. If these three players can adapt Thomas' teaching, they may get their shot at the starting five.

If the Irish can adapt to the seven-time Indiana Senior Champion's simple teachings, they may accomplish a lot this season. It is the beginning of a new era at Notre Dame and George Thomas plans to carry on the Notre Dame tradition of excellence.

"I want to make an excellent showing and compete on the Division I level," Thomas says. "My purpose is to try to put together a nucleus of players who will represent Notre Dame in the same manner of excellence, both academically and athletically, as our other teams do. Since I have had the opportunity to compete in the U.S. Open and the U.S. Senior Open, I believe that I have an advantage of knowing things that you don't read about. I want to teach these kids how to play that will affect them the rest of their lives."
