Irish Move One Step Closer in 2003-04

Team and individual superlatives dot strong campaign.

The 2003-04 season for the Notre Dame men's swimming and diving team was one that featured a variety of team and individual all-time superlatives. In the greater scheme of the progression of the program to that of one of the nation's elite, the '03-04 campaign will be seen as a definite step along that path, but it also was a season in which the Irish came close, but fell just short in a variety of endeavors.

"I would say it was both hot and cold," says Irish head coach Tim Welsh, who was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the second time. "We ended the year with modest success; we did take a step up in the BIG EAST Championships. We also set a number of University records, but I think, to a person, we thought we could have gone faster than we did. In looking at the year, I would say, 'It was a good year, but ...'"

The BIG EAST meet remains the main measuring stick for Notre Dame, and, that being the case, 2004 was definitely successful. The Irish scored 584 points to take second place in the conference championships, 162 behind perennial-champion Pittsburgh. The margin was just 46 points in the swimming events, as the Panthers used their seven divers (compared to only one for the Irish) to secure a comfortable cushion.

Notre Dame's point total was its highest-ever in the meet, and the runner-up result marked the third time since 1999 that the Irish had been second. Highlighting the meet was Notre Dame's first-ever 1-2 BIG EAST finish, which came in the 400-yard individual medley. Sophomore Jamie Lutkus, who was the runner-up in '03, became the first Notre Dame student-athlete since 2000 to claim a conference title, while junior David Moisan finished right behind him to complete the Irish domination of the event.

In addition, three other Irish swimmers finished second in the BIG EAST meet. Freshman Tim Kegelman was the top qualifier in the 100 butterfly with a University-record performance before taking second in the final, besting his record (48.45). Sophomore Patrick Davis turned in the third-fastest time ever in the 1,650 free, finishing second behind four-time conference champion and '04 graduate Eric Limkemann of Pittsburgh.

In the 200 backstroke, sophomores Doug Bauman and Steve Shomberger combined to post four of the top five times in school history on the same day. In the prelims, Shomberger broke Bauman's University record, but at night, it was reclaimed by Bauman in a time of 1:48.44 that was good enough for second place. Shomberger also improved upon his morning performance, with a 1:48.66 that placed fourth.

In all, the Irish registered nine top-three finishes in the BIG EAST meet after the previous three years had produced a total of only eight.

In addition to the 100 fly and 200 back, Notre Dame swimmers broke six other University records at the conference meet, marking the most Irish records set in a single season since 1999. Kegelman was in on half of those program-best times, as he also became the first Notre Dame swimmer to break the 1:50.00 mark in the 200 individual medley. His best time of 1:49.68 was good for a third-place finish. Kegelman covered the butterfly leg of the 200 medley relay that set a school record with a fourth-place time of 1:30.48. Bauman led off that quartet, with sophomore Tim Randolph handling the breast-stroke duties, and junior Frank Krakowski anchoring. Randolph, Krakowski, Kegelman, and freshman Louis Cavadini also broke the

University record (1:21.30) in the 200 free relay, with another fourth-place result.

A third Irish relay – the 800-yard freestyle – also set a school record in taking third place at the BIG EAST meet. In that race, senior co-captain Matt Obringer, freshman Brian Freeman, junior Matt Bertke, and rookie Ted Brown broke the University record for the second time in less than four months after the previous record had stood since 1991. That group turned in a time of 6:42.55 to earn all-BIG EAST honors and better their previous mark by nearly three seconds.

Brown also notched a school record in the 500-yard freestyle, turning in a 4:25.83 in finishing third. Bauman also etched his name in the record books on multiple occasions, as he finally notched a program-best time in the 100 backstroke after a number of near misses, finishing in 50.16 in taking sixth place in the final.

Notre Dame scored 584 points in the 2004 BIG EAST Championships, its highest-ever total in the meet, en route to a runner-up result which saw them outscored by perennial-champion Pittsburgh by just 46 points in the swimming events.

The BIG EAST meet was the culmination of a season that saw the Irish excel in championship meets. They began the campaign with an eye-opening performance at the first-ever Dennis Stark Relays (renamed in honor of the

former Irish swim coach). Notre Dame won every race in which it was not disqualified and set meet records in eight of 11 swimming events.

The Notre Dame Invitational also saw some brilliant Irish performances. The host school scored 2,259.5 points – a program high in the meet – to register a 710-point victory over the rest of the field, which featured a talented Harvard team that was in and out of the national top 25 for most of the season.

The Irish performance was highlighted by Notre Dame dominance in the individual medleys. Notre Dame swimmers took each of the top six spots in the 200 IM and posted a 1-2-3-4-5 sweep in the 400 IM. Leading the way was Moisan, who set a pool record in claiming first place in the longer race with a time of 3:57.62. Two Irish records also fell in the event, with Bauman breaking David Horak's mark in the 200 back en route to being the first Irish swimmer ever to go quicker than 1:49.00 in the event (1:48.98). The 800 free relay squad broke the longest-standing record on the books – a time of 6:45.63 by Jim Birmingham, Brian Rini, Greg Cornick, and David Nathe in 1991. Obringer, Freeman, Bertke, and Brown just

bested that mark, with a first-place finish in 6:45.44.

Facing the most difficult schedule in program history, the Irish had a slow start to the dual-

meet season, but eventually they came on strong to register their seventh winning season – and eighth non-losing record – in the last nine years. Notre Dame opened with a 1-5 mark before excelling in the 2004 portion of the schedule. The Irish led off the new year with wins on the road against UC Santa Barbara and Wyoming, which would go on to finish 22nd at the NCAA Championships. The highlight of the dual-meet season may have been the contest at #15 Northwestern, which saw Notre Dame hold leads against a nationally-ranked team in dual-meet action for just the second time ever before the Wildcats rallied for a 155-133 triumph. Nonetheless, the Irish took two of the top three positions in 10 of the 12 swimming events. It was a step forward from the Irish holding a lead early in the events of a quadrangular meet in the fall against #19 BYU, Iowa, and Louisville. In all, Notre Dame took on seven teams that were either ranked or receiving votes in the College Swim Coaches Association (CSCAA) national dual-meet poll.

Kegelman, who was Notre Dame's top point scorer at the BIG EAST Championships (64 points, 41.5 in individual events), became just the third freshman to be voted team MVP. He also registered 15 victories in dual-meet competition and was beaten just once in the 100 fly. Kegelman finished second on the team (behind Brown's 465.5) in points scored with 407.75.

A major part in the Irish fortunes in 2003-04 was the quartet of seniors: Obringer, fellow co-captain Josh Dermott, Brian Coughlan, and J.R. Teddy.

"The leadership from our senior class, especially from our two captains, really provided the spark for us," says Welsh. "They were performance leaders and team oriented. This is just a remarkable group of guys, and definitely no two of them are alike. They are a wide-spread group in pretty much every way, but they contributed a lot to this program, both through their performance in the pool and their leadership."

Notre Dame's accomplishments were accentuated by their notable youth. The Irish had just eight swimmers that had more than one season of collegiate experience prior to the commencement of the campaign. That youthful quality figures to bode well for the continued evolution of the program.

"We began to get glimpses of what we hope our future is," says Welsh. "Although we did not beat any top-25 teams, we led a couple of them at points during the meet, which has never happened before. We could see it from where we were, but we couldn't finish it. That was exciting and the future is even more exciting."

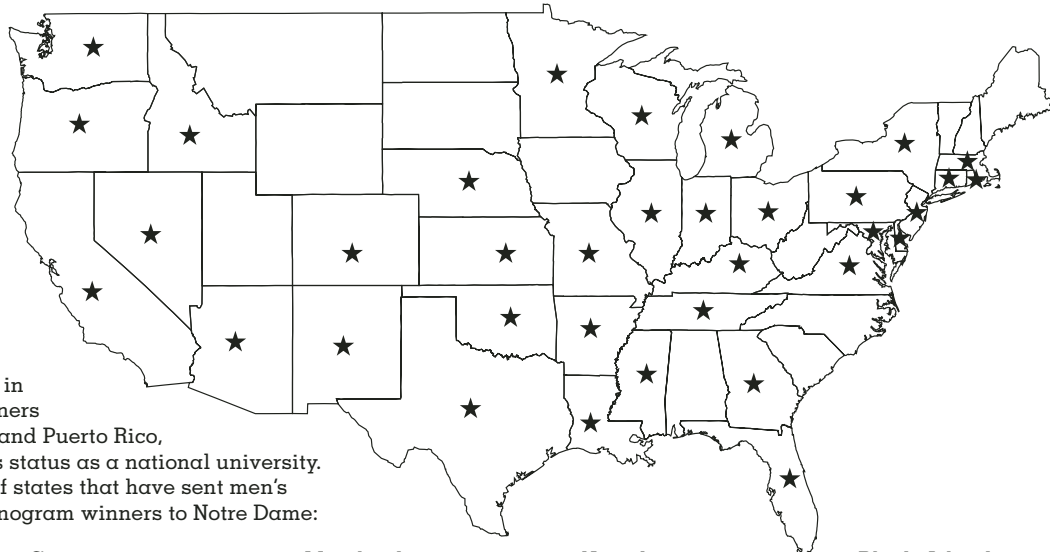

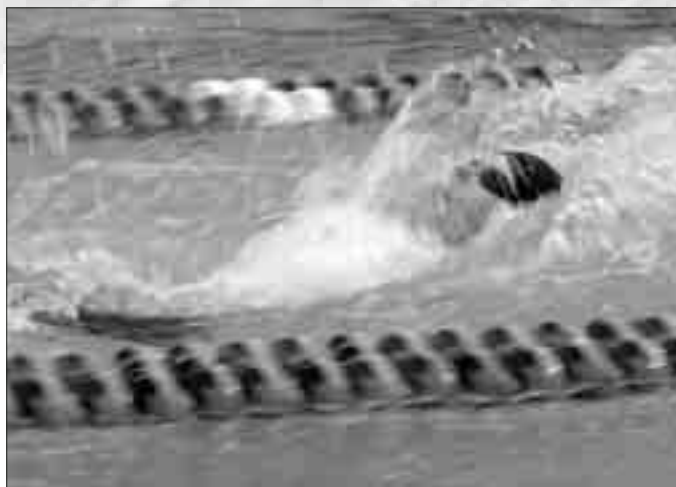
