## 1960 PROSPECTS

For this spring's defense of the NCAA Co-Championship, Notre Dame tennis coach Tom Fallon will have three monogram men returning from last year's undefeated team, plus three fairly experienced seniors, one junior, and a promising sophomore competing for the other three berths.

The Irish, who lost three of their top men from last year through graduation, face a longer and more difficult schedule this season. In addition to meeting eight Big Ten schools, including perennially powerful Michigan, they invade the Ivy League for the first time on a four-day, four-meet trip during the Easter Vacation, which includes Yale, Harvard and Princeton among the competition.

Don Ralph, the number two man on last year's team as a sophomore, will lead the Notre Dame netmen in their attempt to lengthen their present 18-meet win streak. Ralph, who comes from Bethesda, Md., went unbeaten in regular season singles competition last year and then took two out of three matches in NCAA competition.

Contesting his position will be another junior letterman, Bill Heinbecker

from St. Louis, who also went undefeated in regular season competition last spring as the No. 4 man on the squad. In NCAA tourney competition he split in two singles matches, but beamed up with Irish ace Max Brown to reach the finals in doubles competition.

Tentatively occupying third position this year will be the only other returning monogram winner, another regular from last year's squad and captain of this year's team, Ray Bender, a senior. Bender, who is from Burlington, N.C., was also unbeaten in regular singles competition last year, but did not go to the NCAA tourney.

The next position will probably go to another Heinbecker, Bill's older brother, Pete. A senior, Pete saw limited action last year but did not win a monogram. Close behind him comes another senior, Dee Stevenson, from Wichita, Kans.

The final berth will probably go to either Brian Campanara, a senior from Yonkers, N.Y., Jim Whelan a likely sopnomore prospect from Ridgewood, N.J., or Bill McGivern, a junior from Whitefish Bay, Wisc.

## COACH TOM FALLON

Now in his fourth year as Irish tennis mentor, Professor Tom Fallon reached a high point of his collegiate coaching career last June when his squad took the NCAA Co-Championship with Tulane. The NCAA crown was the climax of three years of steady improvement by Fallon-coached teams. In his initial season, the Irish netters won 9 and lost 4. The following year saw this mark improved to 17-1, and last year's squad went unbeaten in 14 straight contests. This gives him an enviable three-season mark of 40-5, and a win percentage of .888.

Fallon, a 1942 graduate of Notre Dame, joined the university faculty in 1951 after receiving his master's and doctor's degrees at Columbia University. A native of Flushing, N.Y., Fallon served as faculty advisor and coach for the Notre Dame wrestling club from 1951 through 1954. He was appointed wrestling coach in 1955 when the sport was elevated to varsity status, a post he still holds.

Last year's undefeated squad was the first for Fallon, and the fourth in the history of Notre Dame tennis—the others coming in 1942, 1944, and 1947. The 1944 team went on to share the NCAA Co-Championship with Miami (Florida). The all-time Notre Dame tennis record for 37 seasons of competition shows 213 victories, 119 losses, and four ties.

## 1961 PROSPECTS

With 15 matches of a difficult 21-opponent schedule still ahead, inexperience and lack of depth are the two major problems facing Notre Dame tennis coach Tom Fallon. He has two outstanding netmen in his two returning monogram winners, Don Ralph and Bill Heinbecker, but must rely on two juniors with very limited experience, and two sophomores to fill out his starting line-up.

For the first time in their history, the Irish netters will be playing a schedule which includes every one of the Big Ten schools, plus such independents as Detroit, Western Michigan, Toledo and Southern Illinois. In the case of one Western Conference member, Illinois, this will be the first meeting between the two schools in tennis since 1937, and the Notre Dame-Minnesota contest will be the initial court

competition between the two institutions.

Ralph and Heinbecker, both seniors and both two-year monogram winners, are running a close contest for the top singles position on the squad. Neither has lost a match yet this year, and together they have been unbeaten in six matches of doubles competition. Ralph, the team captain, who comes from Bethesda, Md., played the number one spot most of last spring, and reached the quarterfinals in the NCAA Tourney last June, besides collecting a 16-2 record in singles match competition. He was undefeated in singles as a sophomore, so he now owns a career mark of 36-2.

Heinbecker, from St. Louis, Mo., teamed up with Ralph to reach the quarterfinals of the doubles competition in the 1960 NCAA Championships. Playing second singles most of last year, he collected a 16-1 mark in match competition, which, combined with an undefeated singles season in 1959 and his first six victories this year,

gives him a career mark of 36-1.

Joe Brown, a sophomore from Seattle, Wash., has taken over the third spot in the line-up. Brown, now in his first year of varsity competition, won his first five singles matches without losing a set, and has only been on the losing side in doubles competition once in five matches.

Don Doyle, another sophomore, was expected to take over the number four singles position, but he is out for the season because of bursitis. In the lead for the fourth spot right now is another sophomore, Jim Bemis, from Cmaha, Nebraska. Bemis has a 2-3 record in singles competition so far this year. Right behind him, in number five, is a junior, Jamie Whelan. Whelan, from Ridgewood, N. J., was a member of last year's squad, but failed to see any action. Currently playing number six singles position is a junior from Ft. Wayne, Ind., Maury DeWald, who saw some play in doubles competition last spring.

## Tennis Coach Tom Fallon

At the beginning of his fifth year as Irish net coach, Professor Tom Fallon could show an enviable record for his first four years. In that period his teams have won a total of 54 matches, losing only nine, and this record includes one 17-1 season, one undefeated season, and a tie (in 1959, with Tulane) for the NCAA Championship. Already this season, his 1961 team has won four and lost one on its spring trip through Washington, D.C., North Carolina and Virginia.

Fallon is a 1942 graduate of Notre Dame, and joined the university faculty in 1951 after receiving his master's and doctor's degrees from Columbia University. A native of Flushing, N. Y., Fallon served as faculty advisor and coach for the Notre Dame wrestling club from 1951 through 1954. He was appointed wrestling coach in 1955 when the sport was elevated to varsity status, and still holds that post in addition to his tennis duties.

He began coaching tennis in 1957, and his first team had a 9-4 record. The next year saw this mark improved to 17-1, and the 1959 squad went unbeaten in 14 matches, and tied for the NCAA Crown. Last year's team suffered three early season losses to Yale, Harvard and Princeton, then came back to win a total of 14 matches and lose only one more for a 14-4 season mark. The All-Time Notre Dame tennis record for 38 seasons of competition shows 227 victories, 119 losses, and four ties.

## 1962 PROSPECTS

Although his two top men have graduated, Tennis Coach Tom Fallon has four monogram men returning, and good material from last year's freshman team, to face the 1962 tennis season. With a 19 meet schedule, including nine of the Big Ten teams, Coach Fallon does not expect a repeat of last year's fine 17-2 record. ## 1963 PROSPECTS

Inexperience and a difficult 20 meet schedule are the two main problems facing Tennis Coach Tom Fallon as he prepares for his seventh season as Irish net coach. Despite the loss of two top men, Fallon, with three returning monogram men and excellent material from last year's freshmen team, is very optimistic about his squad's chances in 1963.

The opposition will be as rugged as any faced in the past. This season the Irish must face seven Big Ten schools, including nationally ranked Northwestern and last year's Big Ten winner, Michigan. Such powerhouse independents as Southern Illinois, Western Michigan, and Detroit are also on the schedule.

Graduated from last season's 11-8 squad are two monogram men, Jamie Whalen and Maurie DeWald. Whalen was the team's captain and number two singles man.

This year the number one spot will probably go either to Joe Brown, Captain and a senior from Seattle, Washington, or Raull Katthain, a much heralded sophomore from Mexico City. Brown is the team's only two year monogram winner and has competed in the NCAA tournament the past two years.

The remaining singles assignments may be handled by Jim Goetz, a sophomore from Cleveland, Ohio, Skip Davidson, a junior from New York City, and Bob Fitzgerald, a junior from Winnetka, Illinois.

## Tennis Coach Tom Fallon

The 1963 season marks the seventh year as Irish net coach for Professor Tom Fallon. His record over the past six years is an enviable one as his teams have won a total of 82 matches while losing only 19. Included are 17-1 and 17-2 seasons, one undefeated year, and a tie in 1959 with Tulane for the NCAA Championship.

Fallon, a 1942 graduate of Notre Dame, joined the University faculty in 1951 after receiving his Master's and Doctor's degrees from Columbia University. A native of Flushing, New York, Fallon served as faculty advisor and coach for the Notre Dame wrestling club from 1951 through 1954. He was appointed wrestling coach in 1955 when the sport was elevated to varsity status, and continues to hold that post in addition to his tennis duties.

Fallon began coaching tennis in 1957, and his first team had a record of 9-4. The following year the Irish netmen went 17-1, while the 1959 squad was unbeaten in 14 matches and tied for the NCAA crown. Last season's team, handicapped by the loss of two top men and a rugged 19 game schedule, finished with a record of 11 wins and eight losses. The All-Time Notre Dame tennis record for 39 seasons of competition shows 255 victories, 129 losses, and four ties.
