BIG EAST Freshman of the Week

OVERVIEW: Versatile, athletic wing who can play on the perimeter or attack the paint on the dribble drive ... has played role of Notre Dame's "Sixth Man" the past two seasons, and is poised to step into the spotlight for a potential breakthrough campaign in 2006-07 ... dependable scorer and rebounder who isn't afraid of contact inside ... has enjoyed added bonus of full off-season workout regimen for first time in college career (was sidelined in summer 2005 while recovering from knee surgery).

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2005-06): Appeared in all 30 games, including first career start (Jan. 17 vs. DePaul) ... averaged 8.5 points and 4.3 rebounds per game, ranking fourth on team in scoring and third in rebounding for second year in a row ... had career-best 14 double-digit scoring games ... scored game-high 16 points (6-14 FG) in season opener vs. Michigan ... cracked double figures for second time with 11 points and

career-high tying four assists at Indiana — six points came in game-changing 27-8 second-half run ... tossed in 13 points (4-7 FG) and hit three key free throws in the final minute to preserve victory over No. 24/21 USC ... matched career high with nine rebounds vs. No. 22/21 Utah in helping Irish win Duel in the Desert Gray Division championship ... collected eight points (4-7 FG) and seven rebounds in win over Valparaiso ... notched first double-digit scoring game since late November (USC) with 10 points against Seton Hall ... dropped in 15 points in career-high 38 minutes vs. Marquette, nailing crucial three-pointer with 2:23 left in regulation that helped propel Irish to overtime win ... had team-best 10 points at Louisville, marking the first time in her career she had three consecutive double-figure scoring games ... made first career start vs. No. 10 DePaul, scoring five points ... contributed 10 points and eight rebounds against South Florida ... recorded 10 points, eight rebounds, four assists and three steals vs. Providence ... had 14 points vs. Villanova, all coming in second half on 7-of-10 shooting in period posted team-high 15 points and plucked six rebounds at No. 17/15 DePaul ... shared team-best scoring honors vs. No. 8/6 Connecticut with 12 points ... chalked up 12 points in win at West Virginia ... tied season high with 16 points while adding five rebounds and three steals in regular-season finale against Pittsburgh ... registered 12 points, five rebounds and career-high three blocks in BIG EAST Championship first-round win over South Florida ... played pivotal role in team's late-season push to NCAA Tournament, averaging 9.9 ppg. and 4.5 rpg. in final 11 games.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2004-05): Ranked fourth on team in scoring and third in rebounding (first among Irish freshmen and reserves) ... showed poise of a veteran in pressure situations, going 20-for-20 at the free throw line in the final five minutes of regulation and overtime ... scored 14 points and grabbed team-high six rebounds in collegiate debut vs. Illinois State ... plucked eight rebounds (second on team) in victory over Nebraska ... came off bench to score 16



points (14 in the second half), including two critical three-pointers in Preseason WNIT semifinal win vs. No. 6 Duke ... made all three of her shots, finishing with six points and five rebounds in Preseason WNIT title game vs. No. 10/9 Ohio State ... pinched season-high five steals against Colorado State ... scored six points for fourth consecutive game and added season-high nine rebounds at Valparaiso ... tallied seven points, five rebounds and three assists before fouling out against No. 15 Michigan State ... rang up team-high 14 points (7-12 FG) in only 16 min-

Most Valuable Player

OVERVIEW: Fundamentally-sound post player who made significant strides in her development last season, more than tripling her scoring output and doubling her rebounding performance from her freshman campaign ... continued progress should place her among upper echelon of centers in BIG EAST Conference ... height and long arms make her a solid defender, both as a shot blocker and rebounder ... works well with her back to the basket, but can also face up and hit mid-range jumper ... gained added confidence and experience in summer 2006 at Pete Newell Tall Women's Camp in San Diego ... spent considerable time during off-season working to build up strength and conditioning, as well as diversify her game.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2005-06): Played in all 30 games, starting 17 times (the

first starting assignments of her career) ... averaged 5.9 points and 3.7 rebounds per game with eight double-figure scoring nights ... also was second on team and eighth in BIG EAST in blocked shots (1.17 bpg.), as well as second on squad in field goal percentage (.468) ... made first career start in season opener vs. Michigan, recording second-ever double-digit scoring night with 10 points and seven rebounds ... turned in first career double-double vs. No. 24/21 USC, logging 13 points (6-10 FG) and career-high 10 rebounds ... nearly had second consecutive double-double with 10 points and team-high eight rebounds against Iona ... had another solid outing at Wisconsin with 11 points (3-5 FG) and eight rebounds ... registered her best weekend as a collegian at the Duel in the Desert in Las Vegas, earning Gray Division MVP honors after averaging 16.0 points and 6.5 rebounds with an .824 field goal percentage (14-of-17) as the Irish won the title ... dropped in career-high 20 points on 10-of-12 shooting in only 18 minutes against Arkansas State ... came back with team-high 13 points (4-5 FG) and seven rebounds in title game vs. No. 22/21 Utah ... tallied 10 points (4-7 FG) against Valparaiso ... enjoyed strong performance in homecoming game at St. John's, finishing with team-high 14 points (7-10 FG) and six rebounds ... came off the bench for the first time at Louisville, contributing eight points (4-7 FG) and six rebounds ... collected career-high-tying 10 rebounds in win at Georgetown.

OVERVIEW: Physical, blue-collar post player who has been fiery emotional leader for Irish past three seasons ... relishes opportunity to mix it up in the paint on both ends of the floor ... does her best work on the glass, where she is coming off her highest output as a collegian ... showed tremendous mental toughness during 2005-06 season, playing entire campaign despite persistent pain in lower leg ... has recovered nicely during off-season while developing added dimensions to her offensive game, including a consistent perimeter shot.

JUNIOR SEASON (2005-06): Appeared in all 30 games, starting 19 times ... averaged 4.7 ppg. and was second on team in rebounding with 5.1 rpg. ... had quality minutes in win at Western Michigan, finishing with seven points and five rebounds ... registered perfect shooting night at Indiana (3-3 FG, 3-3 FT), ending up with nine points and four rebounds despite picking up fourth foul
