When Father Edward F. Sorin started his school in the northern Indiana wilderness, he had only \$300, three log buildings badly in need of repair and a far-sighted vision of establishing a liberal arts school to meet the growing educational needs of the frontier. He dreamed of building a great university, and in 1842, he founded the University of Notre Dame du Lac.

Over the years, the University of Notre Dame du Lac would evolve into a preeminent place for Catholic thought. While becoming one of the top undergraduate institutions in the country, Notre Dame has also been at the cutting edge of research, including such innovations as the transmission of wireless messages and the development of synthetic rubber. Today researchers are achieving breakthroughs in astrophysics, radiation chemistry, environmental sciences, tropical disease transmission, cancer, robotics, and nanoelectronics.

The University has also stressed residential life, with four-of-five students living on campus in the school's 29 residence halls that serve as the focal point of social, spiritual and athletic activities. Notre Dame is one of a handful of universities with a truly international student body, coming from over 100 nations and all 50 states. Students come to Notre Dame not only to learn how to think, but to learn how to live, keeping faith with the vision of Fr. Sorin.

Notre Dame is one of the few universities to regularly rank in the top 25 in the *U.S. News & World Report* survey of America's best colleges and the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics Directors' Cup standings of the best overall athletics



programs. The University ranks first among all Catholic universities worldwide, according to the 2011 *Times Higher Education* survey and the Mendoza College of Business at Notre Dame boasts the No. 1 undergraduate business program in the nation according to *BusinessWeek* magazine.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C.
President

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., is in his second five-year term as the 17th president of the University of Notre Dame. His vision is for Notre Dame to be the Catholic research university for our time – an institution that unifies, enlightens and heals by engaging in scholarship of the first rank while maintaining its distinctive Catholic character and long-time excellence in undergraduate education.

During his tenure, Notre Dame has made significant progress toward its research goal, including selection as the lead partner in the Midwest Institute for Nanoelectronics Discovery, the creation of the Innovation Park research facility, and the construction of Stinson Remick Hall of Engineering.

His commitment to undergraduate education has been marked by the Notre Dame Forums, yearlong initiatives that have examined important issues such as religion and world conflict, global health, immigration and energy.

The University's Catholic identity has been strengthened during Father Jenkins' tenure in multiple ways, including the appointment of a coordinator for University life initiatives and the construction of multimillion-dollar facilities for the Institute for Church Life, including the Center for Social Concerns, and the Institute for Educational Initiatives, which includes the Alliance for Catholic Education.

Father Jenkins earned bachelor's and master's degrees in philosophy from Notre Dame in 1976 and 1978, respectively, and was ordained a priest of the Congregation of Holy Cross in 1983. He holds advanced degrees from Oxford and the Jesuit School of Theology. He is a professor of philosophy and the author of *Knowledge and Faith in*

John B. "Jack" Swarbrick Jr., a University of Notre Dame graduate who rose to national prominence as a lawyer, consultant and executive in the collegiate and Olympic sports industries, is in his fourth year as vice president and director of athletics at his alma mater.

Among Swarbrick's athletics initiatives are meeting the performance needs of Notre Dame student-athletes through establishment of a new sports performance division, reaching out to more former Irish student-athletes via the Notre Dame Monogram Club and other programs, utilizing emerging digital technologies to deliver better information on and access to Notre Dame athletic programs via expanded production and distribution of programming, and restructuring Notre Dame's approach to sport administration through assignment of a unique administrator to each of the 26 Irish sports.

Notre Dame ranked number one in the country (among Football Bowl Subdivision schools) in the three most recent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) surveys – in 2010 and 2009 with 99 scores (including in '09 a 97 score and '10 a 96 in football that both also ranked number one). The 2009 Academic Progress Rate (APR) statistics included more perfect 1,000 scores by Irish teams (nine) than by any other FBS institution. The 2010 Notre Dame APR report featured eight perfect 1,000 scores.

The past three years combined in Notre Dame athletics have featured 94 All-Americans, 19 Academic All-America selections and five NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship winners; record involvement in community service hours by Irish student-athletes; NCAA titles in 2011 in men's and women's fencing (a combined championship) and in 2010 in women's soccer (with Randy Waldrum named coach of the year); NCAA runner-up team finishes in 2011 women's basketball, 2010 men's lacrosse, 2009 fencing and 2008 women's soccer; NCAA semifinal appearances in 2011 hockey, 2009 and 2010 women's tennis and 2009 women's soccer, plus a 2010 third-place fencing finish; a men's basketball modern program record 27 victories and a number-two NCAA seed (its highest in 30 years) in 2010-11 (resulting in national coach of the year awards for Mike Brey); the hiring of new Irish head football coach Brian Kelly to start the 2010 season; construction of a new, freestanding ice hockey arena, scheduled to open for the 2011-12 season, plus the 2009-10 dedications of new facilities for soccer and lacrosse – as well

as opening of the new Purcell Pavilion within the south dome of the Joyce Center.

Born in Yonkers, N.Y., and raised in Yonkers and Bloomington, Ind., Swarbrick is a 1976 magna cum laude graduate of Notre Dame with a bachelor's degree in economics. Upon graduating from Stanford University Law School in 1980, he returned to Indiana to accept a position as an associate in the Indianapolis law firm Baker & Daniels. He made partner in 1987 and spent 28 years overall with the firm.

As a member of the Indiana Sports Corporation, including the chairmanship from 1992 to 2001, Swarbrick led many of the city's successful proposals to a wide array of athletics organizations – from the National Football League to the United States Olympic Committee to the Big Ten Conference. His leadership efforts resulted in the city earning the right to play host to the 2012 Super Bowl in Indianapolis at Lucas Oil Stadium; becoming the home of the National Collegiate Athletic Association national headquarters in 1999; hosting the 1987 Pan American Games, 1991 World Gymnastics Championships, NCAA Men's Basketball Final Fours and other college championship competitions and an array of national and world championships in Olympic sports.

At Baker & Daniels, Swarbrick served as general counsel for numerous national governing bodies of Olympic sports, including USA Gymnastics and USRowing, and as a consultant to the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta.

In his work as an advisor to the NCAA, Swarbrick coordinated the men's College Basketball Partnership, an NCAA-led group that addresses the opportunities and challenges in the sport, and developed the business plan for the new NBA/NCAA youth basketball enterprise, iHoops. In 2000 Swarbrick received one of the NCAA's highest honors, The Flying Wedge Award, for his work in establishing Indianapolis as the new home of the NCAA. In 2001 the State of Indiana presented him with the Sagamore of the Wabash Award.

Born March 19, 1954, Swarbrick was named Notre Dame's 12th athletics director on July 16, 2008. He and his wife, Kimberly, are the parents of four children: Kate, a 2010 graduate of St. Louis University; Connor, a 2011 graduate of Wake Forest University; Cal, a sophomore at TCU; and Christopher, a University of Notre Dame freshman.

SEASON IN REVIEW

2011-12 Season In Review

The Notre Dame women's golf team continued its string of recent success on the golf course, in the classroom and on the recruiting trail in Coach Susan Holt's sixth season guiding the program during the 2011-12 campaign.

The Irish advanced to the NCAA Regionals for the fifth consecutive time, finishing 15th at the Columbus, Ohio regional. Prior to that, Notre Dame finished second at the BIG EAST Championship, just one stroke behind the University of South Florida.

In the classroom, Holt's charges set Notre Dame records for the top team grade-point averages in three consecutive semesters. For the fall of 2011, the squad of five checked in with a team grade-point average of 3.665, then outdid themselves in the spring of 2012 with a 3.776 total, including Dean's List semesters from four of the five team members.

The future of the program continued to look bright as Holt and assistant coach Kyle Veltri were able to land two of the top junior golfers in the country - Talia Campbell and Lindsey Weaver - for the start of the 2012-13 campaign.

Coming off a 2010-11 season that saw the Irish win their fourth BIG EAST title and then advance to the program's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Championship tournament, the Irish had to replace three key members from that squad as So Hyun Park and Katie Conway graduated and Nicole Zhang decided to transfer.

Leading the Irish in 2011-12 was senior **Becca Huffer (Denver, Colo.)** who closed her Notre Dame career as one of the top golfers in the program's history. Huffer served as team captain and led the team with a 75.34 stroke average and had 28 of her 29 rounds count towards the team score for the year. She won her first individual tournament - the Hoosier Fall Invitational - played at Crooked Stick Golf Club in Carmel, Ind., during the

fall, taking medalist honors by three strokes with a four-over par 220 total, helping the team to a second-place finish. She was fifth at the BIG EAST Championship, earning her fourth consecutive all-BIG EAST honor, joining former Irish golfers Noriko Nakazaki (2004-07) and Annie Brophy (2007-10) as the only Notre Dame and BIG EAST women's golfers ever to be selected all-BIG EAST in all four years of competition. She closed her final season with a tie for 26th at the NCAA Central Regional and was named the Monogram Club's team Most Valuable Player for the second time in her career. Huffer finished with a 75.19 career stroke average, that is second all-time at Notre Dame but the best for any golfer to play more than 100 career rounds.

Fellow senior **Katie Allare (Phoenix, Ariz.)** stepped into a regular role in the Notre Dame lineup and in 28 rounds, turned in an average of 81.14 for the year. In 54 career rounds, Allare had an 80.19 career average.

Sophomore **Kristina Nhim (Cypress, Calif.)** finished third on the team with a 77.59 average as 25 of her 29 rounds counted towards team scoring. During the year, she turned in one top 10 finish and three top 25 finishes with her best finish, a tie for sixth coming at the BIG EAST Championship where she picked up all-BIG EAST honors for the second consecutive season. In two seasons for the Irish, Nhim has already played in 66 career rounds and owns a 76.86 average.

A pair of freshmen stepped into the lineup in 2011-12 and turned in solid rookie years. **Ashley Armstrong (Flossmoor, Ill.)** was second to Huffer in scoring with a 75.62 average and saw 27 of her 29 rounds count towards team scoring. Armstrong had an impressive spring season as she was Notre Dame's top finisher in five of the six tournaments played. She was named the BIG EAST rookie of the year and was named all-BIG EAST after winning medalist honors at the BIG EAST Championship where she defeated Louisville's Emily Haas in the third hole of a playoff as both golfers played 54 holes in seven-over par 223. She then closed out the season by tying Huffer for the top Irish finish (tie for 26th) at the NCAA Central Regional.

Rounding out the Notre Dame roster was freshman **Kelli Oride (Lihue, Hawaii)** who got off to a strong start in the fall on the way to a 78.66 stroke average for the season. During the fall, Oride was Notre Dame's top finisher once, was second once and third twice in the four tournaments. She was the top finisher for the Irish in her first tournament - the *Golfweek* Conference Challenge and then tied for fourth with a nine-over par 225, just five strokes behind Huffer at the Hoosier Fall Invitational.

The Irish opened the 2011-12 season at the Conference Challenge in Wolcott, Colo., facing many of the other conference winners from the previous season. Notre Dame would tie for ninth

in the field of 18 teams with a 917 total, 18 strokes behind tournament winner Oklahoma. Oride led the team as she tied for 32nd overall with a 14-over par total of 230. Armstrong and Huffer were a stroke behind at 231 for the 54-hole event.

Notre Dame's second tournament of the season took the Irish to Chapel Hill, N.C., and the prestigious Tar Heel Invitational that featured 15 teams ranked in the top 50 in the nation and many of the nation's top individual golfers in the 18-team field. The Irish shot their lowest 54-hole total of the fall (909/+45) yet finished 18th overall. Huffer was the team's top finisher with an eight-over par mark of 224 and tied for 55th while Armstrong was a stroke behind at 225.

Holt and her team returned to Indiana and regrouped, with the third tournament of the fall taking place in Carmel, Indiana - The Hoosier Fall Invitational - hosted by the University of Indiana at Crooked Stick Golf Club.

There, the Irish led after 36 holes by four strokes over Illinois, shooting a season-low 297 in the second round. Armstrong led the tournament by two strokes and had a three-stroke lead going into the final round on Oct. 18. She could not hold off her teammate, Huffer, who fired a one-under par 71 to erase a three-stroke deficit and move from a fourth-place tie to win the tournament by three strokes with a four-over par 220 total. As a team, the Irish finished second, one stroke off the

pace set by Eastern Michigan. Oride tied for fourth in the tournament with a +9 mark of 225.

The final event of the fall came in Wilmington, N.C., where the Irish tied for 10th at the Landfall Tradition, finishing 30 strokes behind tourney champ, Purdue. Huffer continued her strong fall by leading the Irish as she tied for 10th with an 11-over par total of 227. Nhim was second among Notre Dame golfers as she finished in a tie for 16th after shooting a 14-over par total of 230 for the 54-hole tournament.

The Irish opened the spring schedule March 2-4 at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate in Hilton Head, S.C., and hosted by the University of South Carolina. The early-spring weather played havoc with the tournament as the Irish were sixth after the first round with a 301 total but saw the second round stopped due to thunderstorms. Play was picked up on the third day of the tourney as the teams finished out the middle round, cutting the tournament to 36 holes. The Irish finished 13th with a 620 total, well behind first-place Alabama. Armstrong led the Irish with a six-over par 148 to tie for 14th. Nhim tied for 38th with a 12-over par 154 with Huffer a stroke behind at 155.

One week later, Notre Dame was back in

action in Baton Rouge, La., competing in the LSU Tiger Classic. There, the Irish finished 10th in a field of 14 of the nation's top teams. Armstrong continued her strong start to the spring schedule as she tied for 14th for the second week in a row, firing a nine-over 225. Huffer tied for 23rd as she finished with a 54-hole total of 229.

Mesa, Arizona was the next stop for the Irish as they played host to the first-ever Notre Dame Clover Cup Tournament at the Longbow Golf Club from March 16-18. The Irish got off to a fast start in the Arizona sun as they fired their best round of the season, an even par 288 that was paced by Armstrong's career-best, five-under par 67. Huffer and Nhim added even-par rounds of 72 to the fast Notre Dame start. A second-round of 296 kept the Irish in the hunt after 36 holes as they slid to third overall behind Colorado and Oklahoma. In the final round, the Irish fired a 322 and finished with a 906 for the weekend to finish fifth in the 12-team field. Huffer was the team's top finisher as she tied for eighth with a 221 (+5) following her opening 72 with rounds of 75 and 74. Nhim turned in back-to-back 72s, only to close with an 80 for an eight-over par 224 and a tie for 15th. Armstrong tied for 16th with a nine-over 225, following the 67 with rounds of 74 and 84.

The last regular-season tournament came the final weekend of March when the Irish traveled to Athens, Georgia for the prestigious Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic from March 30 to April 1. In Georgia, Holt's squad put together its best 54-hole tournament of the season, firing a 28-over par 892 to finish 10th in the 18-team field that included 13 teams ranked among the nation's top 50 teams.

Armstrong paced the Notre Dame attack as she fired an even par 216 for the best 54-hole mark of her career. She opened with an even-par 72, was two-under par (70) in the second round and had a two-over par 74 for the third. She finished in a tie for 13th for the weekend and was later named BIG EAST women's golfer of the week for her play. Nhim was second among Notre Dame golfers with a six-over par 222, good for a 28th-place tie. She was followed by Huffer who shot an eight-over par 224 and tied for 40th.

The Irish opened postseason play at the BIG EAST Championship, hosted by South Florida in Orlando at the Reunion Resort and Golf Club, playing on the Tom Watson Course. Notre Dame led by two strokes over South Florida after one round (296-298) only to fall five strokes behind the Bulls after two rounds (609-604). The tournament came down to the final holes with South Florida holding on to edge the Irish by one stroke (911-910). The story of the tournament though, for Notre Dame, was the play of Armstrong who fired a seven-over par 223 to tie for medalist honors with Louisville's Emily Haas. In a sudden-death playoff, the two each bogeyed the par 4 18th and then parred it on the second hole. The third time was the charm for Armstrong as she birdied her

third attempt to Haas' par to win her first collegiate tournament and the BIG EAST Championship. In doing so, she became the fifth Irish women's golfer to win or tie for the BIG EAST title. Huffer finished fifth with a 10-over par 226 and Nhim tied for sixth with a 12-over mark of 228. All three golfers were selected all-BIG EAST for their finishes. Oride tied for 19th with a 238 and Allaire was 24th after shooting a 242.

Notre Dame would advance to the NCAA Central Regional as an at-large team, giving the BIG EAST two teams in the NCAA Tournament. The Irish would travel to Columbus, Ohio from May 10-12, looking to finish in the top eight teams for a second chance at the NCAA finals.

Armstrong and Huffer continued their strong play as they turned in rounds of 72 and 73 to open the tournament to tie for fourth and eighth respectively, helping Notre Dame to an opening round of 304 and fourth place after day one.

The middle 18 holes didn't go as the Irish hoped as a 320 total dropped the team to 13th after 36 holes. Armstrong, Huffer and Oride tied for team-best totals of 79 on the day.

Notre Dame would go on to finish 15th in the 24 team field and see the 2011-12 season end at Ohio State's Scarlet Course with a 936 total. Armstrong and Huffer finished in a tie for 26th as each had 12-over par totals of 228. Oride was third among Irish golfers as she tied for 57th with an 18-over mark of 234. Nhim shot a 54-hole total of 248 and Allaire checked in with a 252 final total.

For the year, the Irish finished with the team average of 305.93, a mark that proved to be the fifth lowest in the program's 24 years of existence.



Senior Becca Huffer closed out her brilliant Notre Dame career in 2011-12 as she led the squad with a 75.34 stroke average. A four-time all-BIG EAST selection, Huffer won her first collegiate tournament in October when she finished first at the Hoosier Fall Invitational.

NCAAs/Team Recap

Notre Dame made its fifth consecutive appearance and the seventh in the last eight years (since 2004) in the NCAA Central Regional. The Irish played for the second time at Ohio State's famed Scarlet Course and finished 15th in the 24-team field. They finished 16th at Ohio State in 2009. The 15th-place finish proved to be the second-best showing for Notre Dame in the NCAA women's tournament, surpassed only by the fifth-place finish in 2011.

The Irish got off to a strong start in the opening round led by the strong play of freshman Ashley Armstrong and senior Becca Huffer who opened with rounds of 72 and 73 to tie for fourth and eighth respectively. That helped Notre Dame get off to a fourth-place start after 18 holes with a 304 total.

The middle 18 holes didn't go as the Irish hoped as a 320 total dropped the team to 13th after 36 holes. Armstrong, Huffer and freshman Kelli Oride tied for team-best totals of 79 on the day.

Notre Dame would go on to finish 15th in the 24-team field and see the 2011-12 season end at Ohio State's Scarlet Course with a 936 total. Armstrong and Huffer finished in a tie for 26th as each had 12-over par totals of 228. Oride was third among Irish golfers as she tied for 57th with an 18-over mark of 234. Sophomore Kristina Nhim shot a 54-hole total of 248 and senior Katie Allare checked in with a 252 final total.

Freshman Kelli Oride closed out her rookie year with a strong showing at the NCAA Central Regional at Ohio State's Scarlet Course. She tied for 57th overall after shooting a 54-hole total of 234 following rounds of 78, 79 and 77. That placed her third among Irish golfers.





COACHING STAFF

The Irish women's golf coaching staff of Susan Holt and Kyle Lynne Veltri have teamed to guide the Notre Dame women's golf program since 2006. In those six seasons, the Irish have won 10 tournaments, including two BIG EAST Championships, have qualified for the NCAA Central Regionals for five consecutive years and reached the NCAA Championship finals in 2011.

In six seasons as the Fighting Irish women's golf head coach, Susan Holt, the 2011 BIG EAST Coach of the Year, has moved the program into a period of unprecedented success that includes an active streak of five consecutive NCAA Regional appearances, including the first NCAA Championship appearance in program history in 2011.

Additionally, the top-five season stroke averages in program history have been set under her watch. In Holt's tenure, the Irish have won 10 tournaments titles and captured two BIG EAST Championship crowns in both 2008 and '11, while her players have garnered medalist honors on eight different occasions.

Holt was introduced as head coach of the University of Notre Dame women's golf program in August of 2006. She became the second full-time head coach in the history of the Fighting Irish program and the fourth overall since women's golf became a varsity sport prior to the 1988-89 season.

This past season - the 2011-12 campaign - the Irish again turned in a strong season that included two second-place finishes, two medalist honors, a fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Central Regionals and the fifth-best team average of 305.93.

Notre Dame finished second at the Hoosier Fall Invitational at Crooked Stick Golf Club while senior Becca Huffer won her first collegiate tournament by three strokes with a four-over par 220. In the spring, the Irish finished second at the BIG EAST Championship, falling to South Florida by one stroke. There, freshman Ashley Armstrong took medalist honors, becoming the fifth Notre Dame women's golfer to win or share a BIG EAST crown. Huffer, Armstrong and sophomore Kristina Nhim took all-BIG EAST honors. Huffer's accolades made her the third Notre Dame women's golfer and the third in BIG EAST history to win four all-BIG EAST honors. More importantly, the Irish were selected as an at-large participant for the NCAA Central Regional where the team finished 15th overall.

In 2010-11, Holt led the Irish to four first-place finishes. The team won the Mary Fossum Invitational to begin the 2010-11 season, followed by a victory on their home course, at the William K. Warren Invitational. Then, at the John Kirk/Intercollegiate Classic the Irish finished first, before capturing the BIG EAST title where Nicole Zhang, Becca Huffer, So-Hyun Park and Kristina Nhim each earned all-BIG EAST honors. The BIG EAST title was the second under Holt's guidance and gave the Irish an automatic bid into the NCAA Regionals at the Warren Golf Course. The Irish would finish fifth and make the program's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Championships that were held in Bryan, Texas. There, they finished 22nd in the 24-team field.

In her fourth season (2009-10), Holt guided the Irish to a third consecutive NCAA Central Regional appearance and led the Irish to a then fourth-best season stroke average with a 306.60 mark. Notre Dame's best finish of the season was a tie for second at the Alamo Invitational where Annie Brophy became the sixth Irish player to win two individual titles in her career.

Three of Holt's players earned all-BIG EAST accolades in 2010 including Brophy, Katie Conway and Huffer. With her fourth such honor, Brophy became just the second player in program history to earn all-BIG EAST accolades four times, while she and Huffer had the added distinction of being two of the six unanimous selections to the 12-person team.

In her six seasons with the Irish, Holt has seen 11 of her players combine to win 22 All-BIG EAST honors. Additionally, Huffer earned BIG EAST Rookie of the Year accolades in 2009 while Armstrong followed in 2012.

During the 2009-10 campaign, Holt presided over one of the program's best individual performances as Huffer put together one of Notre Dame's most statistically impressive seasons. Huffer recorded a 74.90 stroke average, which is the third-best mark in program history. She also saw all 30 of her rounds counted towards team scoring and she led the Irish at six of their 11 tournaments. At the end of a dominating season in which she finished in the top-20 at 10 of 11 events, Huffer narrowly missed individual qualification for the NCAA Championship field but, with her tie for 16th at the NCAA Central Regional, she turned in the best ever finish by a Notre Dame golfer in NCAA play.

In 2008-09, Holt led the Irish back to the NCAA Central Regional for the second consecutive year. She did so with the Irish playing a challenging slate of tournaments that included the Northrop Grumman Regional

Challenge in Palos Verdes, Calif. and the Bryan National Collegiate in Greensboro, N.C. The Irish were ranked inside the Golfstat top-25 for parts of the season for the second consecutive year and they captured the Heather Farr Memorial Tournament, finishing with a program low score of 858 (-6), besting the previous record by 12 strokes. The Irish combined to post a 303.39 stroke average for the season, a mark that is currently the third best in program history. The Irish finished in the top-five in four of the 11 tournaments on the season and registered 16 top-15 individual showings.

Holt fielded a team that earned four all-BIG EAST accolades. The four all-league members tied a program record, which had also been achieved the previous two seasons under Holt. Huffer claimed BIG EAST Freshman of the Year honors, while Lisa Maunu claimed medalist honors at the 2009 BIG EAST Championship, Notre Dame's second medalist in as many years at the event.

Four seasons ago, in Holt's second season with the Irish, Notre Dame won the 2008 BIG EAST title. Holt was named the conference's coach of the year after putting together what turned out to be a record-breaking campaign in many ways. The Irish produced a then school-record 300.47 stroke average and won a program-best five tournaments, including the BIG EAST championship. Three straight wins to open the season signified another program milestone for the Irish. Three golfers combined to win four tournaments on the season and the year was capped with a trip to the NCAA Central Regional in Austin, Texas.

After the record breaking 2007-08 campaign, Park became the program's first All-America honoree as she capped honorable mention All-America accolades from the National Golf Coaches Association and *Golfweek* magazine. Park won two tournaments on the year and posted a single season-best 73.63 stroke average.

The 2007-08 season commenced with a win at the Cougar Classic in Hanahan, S.C. Maunu earned medalist honors by firing a school-record three-round total of 210 (-6). Maunu's first-round six-under par 66 also represented a program record. Notre Dame followed that wins at the Napa River Grill Cardinal Cup and a win at the Wolverine Invitational in Ann Arbor, Mich.

A fourth team victory was achieved in the spring at the Rio Verde Collegiate Invitational in Rio Verde, Ariz. For the third time that year, Notre Dame swept the hardware as Park captured the individual title.

Holt and the Irish then delivered on one of the team's goals by winning the BIG EAST title by nine shots over two-time defending conference champion Louisville in Batavia, Ohio. Brophy became the first Notre Dame golfer to win the BIG EAST title outright.

In all, the Irish finished in the top-five in nine of the 11 tournaments on the season and registered 20 top-10 individual showings. Notre Dame also reached as high as 12th in the Golfstat rankings during the year. That was the highest ranking ever for the Irish, who had two freshmen and two sophomores in the five-person scoring lineup all season long. Notre Dame garnered the ninth seed in the NCAA Central Regional before finishing 16th.

In her first campaign with the Fighting Irish, Holt's team posted a 305.46 during the 2006-07 season. Holt steered Notre Dame to a runner-up finish at the 2007 BIG EAST Championship. The Irish tied Louisville with a season-best 891 (+27) total during the 54-hole event but Notre Dame fell to the Cardinals by one stroke in the first hole of a sudden-death playoff. The Irish tied a program record by placing four student-athletes on the all-BIG EAST Team with the fine performance at the 2007 BIG EAST Championship.

Throughout the season, Notre Dame produced two runner-up finishes, including one at the Lady Irish Invitational. The other second-place finish occurred at Kansas' Marilynn Smith Sunflower Invitational. The results were even more impressive given the Irish squad featured three freshmen in the five-person scoring lineup during the entire spring semester.

Notre Dame also made history when senior co-captain Noriko Nakazaki became the first team member in program history to qualify for NCAA play as an individual entrant. Nakazaki carded a three-round score of 224 (+11) to place in a tie for 18th at the NCAA Central Regional in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Holt's presence at the head of the Fighting Irish program has also produced big dividends on the recruiting trail. Holt brought in the top recruiting class in program history for the 2007-08 season as Notre Dame's Class of 2011 was comprised of Conway and Park, who were both ranked in the top-25 nationally. Another stellar class that featured Huffer- also a top-25 recruit- and Katie Allare joined the Irish in the fall of 2008. In the fall of 2010, the highly touted duo of Kristina Nimh and Nicole Zhang, joined the lineup. This past season saw highly touted newcomers Armstrong and Kelli Oride join the roster and the incoming duo of Talia Campbell and Lindsey Weaver are among the top junior golfers in the nation for 2011-12.

In addition to their performances on the course, Holt's teams have excelled academically as well. Sixteen times, her players have been named to the National Golf Coaches Association All-Scholar Golf Team (3.5 grade-point average and play in 66 percent of events). In 2010-11, six of her players earned BIG EAST Academic All-Star honors, bringing her five-year total to 25 BIG EAST Academic All-Star honors while leading the Irish program.

In each of the last three semesters, (spring of 2011, fall of 2011 and spring of 2012) the Notre Dame women's golf team has set University team GPA records among all Irish teams going from 3.638 in the spring of 2011 to 3.776 during the spring of 2012.

Holt came to Notre Dame from the University of South Florida, where she spent 13 successful seasons guiding the Bulls. In her final season, USF joined the BIG EAST Conference and she led the Bulls to a tie for third, along with the Irish, in their inaugural BIG EAST tournament.

"First and foremost, I was attracted by the opportunity to come to what I believe is the best academic and athletic combination that's out there," says Holt on why she decided to come to Notre Dame following a successful run at South Florida.

"The commitment to the golf program with the course and the new indoor facility makes a statement. As a coach you want to know that you have a chance to be successful and you can tell that's how it is at Notre Dame and it's impressive to see that."

A native of Dayton, Ohio, Holt made a return to the Midwest, where she began her college coaching career at Purdue University, beginning in 1990 to 1993.

She took over the USF program in 1993 and led the Bulls to 16 team titles and 17 runner-up finishes, including five of 10 Conference USA Championships. She guided the team and/or individuals to 11 NCAA Regional appearances and trips to the NCAA Championship Finals in 2001 and 2002.

Holt's teams at South Florida won at least one tournament in 10 of her 13 seasons and she was recognized as the Conference USA Coach of the Year in 1996, 1999 and 2001. In the spring of 2005, Holt was named Conference USA Coach of the Decade for women's golf (1995-2005). Under Holt's watch, South Florida players were named to the Conference USA All-Conference Team 23 times. Current LPGA player and South Florida graduate Kelly Lagedrost was named Conference USA Player of the Year in 2001. Former South Florida golfer Christina Jones was named Conference USA Freshman of the Year in 2005.

Prior to college coaching, Holt worked as a club professional in West Palm Beach, Fla., and in Ipswich, Mass. She is a 1988 graduate of Ohio State University, where she played on the women's golf team that won Big Ten Championships in 1985 and 1988 and played in the NCAA Championship those same years.

Holt graduated from Fairmont High School in Kettering, Ohio. She has been a member of the PGA of America since 1992.

Susan married Tim Holt of Kokomo, Ind., in 1993 and they are the parents of two children, Justin and Kristin. Tim, who is also a PGA member, is the current head coach at nearby Holy Cross College.

Kyle Lynne Veltri completed her seventh season as the assistant women's golf coach at the University of Notre Dame with the conclusion of the 2011-12 campaign. Since teaming up with current head coach Susan Holt prior to the 2006-07 season, Veltri has helped the Fighting Irish post the top-five scoring averages in program history while also leading the Irish to five consecutive NCAA Central Regional appearances and the NCAA Championships for the first time in the program's 24-year history in 2010-11. In fact, if you take into account her first year as an Irish assistant coach, the 2005-06 season, Veltri has been a part of the top-seven scoring averages in program history.

A 2001 graduate from Saint Mary's College in Notre Dame, Ind., and a recipient of a Master's of Science and Education degree from Indiana University in May of 2009, Veltri returned to the Notre Dame community when she was hired in August of 2005.

This past season, Veltri saw the Irish finish the year with the fifth-best team stroke average (305.93) while the team finished second at the BIG EAST Championship (losing by one stroke to South Florida). Notre Dame reached the NCAA Central Regionals at Ohio State with an at-large bid, giving the Irish five consecutive trips to the NCAA tournament since 2008.

Becca Huffer, Kristina Nhim and freshman Ashley Armstrong took all-BIG EAST honors with Armstrong being named the BIG EAST rookie of the year after taking medalist honors at the BIG EAST Championship. Huffer became the third Irish and BIG EAST women's golfer selected all-BIG EAST in four consecutive seasons. Veltri also was instrumental in the recruiting of two of the nation's top junior golfers in Talia Campbell and Lindsey Weaver for the 2012-13 season.

The talented assistant also played a major role in the first-ever Notre Dame Clover Cup Tournament that was played at the Longbow Golf Club in Mesa, Ariz., this past March. She served as one of the tournament's organizers and oversaw the 12-team event from the Notre Dame campus.

In 2010-11, Veltri helped lead the Irish to their first-ever NCAA Championship appearance and fourth BIG EAST Championship. Notre Dame posted a stroke average of 299.53, the lowest in program history. All five golfers in the regular lineup currently rank in the top-10 in stroke average in program history. So-Hyun Park, Huffer, Nicole Zhang and Nhim each received all-BIG EAST honors. The Irish won three regular season team titles (Mary Fossum Invitational, William K. Warren Irish Invite and John Kirk/Panther Intercollegiate), in addition to the BIG EAST

Championship. Veltri also helped secure a recruiting class for 2011-12 that included Armstrong and Kelli Orde.

The 2009-10 campaign marked Notre Dame's third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Central Regional as the Irish put together a team stroke average of 306.60, the sixth best mark in program history. The team's best finish was a second-place tie in the 12-team field at the Alamo Invitational. There, Annie Brophy earned co-medalist honors to become just the sixth golfer in program history to win multiple individual titles, having already captured medalist honors at the 2008 BIG EAST Championship.

Three of Veltri's players earned All-BIG EAST honors in 2010 including Brophy, Katie Conway and Huffer. With her fourth such honor, Brophy became just the second player in program history to earn all-BIG EAST accolades four times. In her seven seasons with the Irish, Veltri has seen nine of her players combine to win 23 all-BIG EAST honors.

Known as an excellent recruiter, Veltri has helped the Irish welcome the top recruits in program history during her seven years at Notre Dame. Holt and Veltri brought in Notre Dame's top rated recruiting class at the start of the 2007-08 season as the Class of 2011 was comprised of Conway and So-Hyun Park, who were both ranked in the top-25 nationally. Another stellar class that featured Huffer-also a top-25 recruit-and Katie Allare joined the Irish in the fall of 2008. In the fall of 2010, the highly touted duo of Zhang and Nhim joined the Irish. Zhang was another top-25 recruit who qualified for the 2010 U.S. Women's Open, becoming the first member of the Fighting Irish women's golf family to play in the premier event. Nhim was a top-50 recruit who matched Zhang by achieving All-BIG EAST honors as rookies. The 2011-12 class includes Orde and Ashley Armstrong, who became key players in their freshman years with Armstrong taking BIG EAST rookie of the year honors.

One of Veltri's prized recruits, Huffer, closed out her brilliant career in 2011-12, finishing with a 75.19 stroke average in 129 career rounds, the second lowest total in Notre Dame history and the lowest for any golfer with over 100 career rounds. In four seasons, Huffer saw 123 of her 129 career rounds counted to team scoring, including a 30-for-30 mark in 2009-10. A four-time all-BIG EAST selection, Huffer was a two-time team most valuable player and won the BIG EAST Sports Excellence Award for women's golf in her senior year of 2011-12.

During the 2008-09 season, the Irish combined to post three of the five lowest rounds in school history and four of the top-eight tournament totals in program history. Notre Dame also captured the Heather Farr Memorial Tournament, finishing with a program low score of 858 (-6), besting the previous mark by 12 strokes. The Irish combined to post a 303.39 stroke average for the season, the second-best mark in program history.

The Irish opened the 2007-08 season with a win at the Cougar Classic in Hanahan, S.C. Lisa Maunu earned medalist honors by firing a school-record three-round total of 210 (-6). Notre Dame tied a program record by placing four student-athletes on the all-BIG EAST Team after a fine performance at the 2007 BIG EAST Championship. The Irish were tied with Louisville following the 54-hole event with a season-best 891 (+27) total, but Notre Dame fell by one stroke in the first hole of a sudden-death playoff to the Cardinals.

Notre Dame produced two runner-up finishes at the Lady Irish Invitational and Kansas' Marilyn Smith Sunflower Invitational. Senior co-captain Noriko Nakazaki became the first team member in program history to qualify for NCAA play as an individual entrant.

In her first season as a Notre Dame assistant, Veltri helped guide the Fighting Irish to a (then) school record 306.66 scoring average. The Irish had seven top-five finishes, including a win at the Notre Dame Invitational.

Before her arrival at Notre Dame, Veltri compiled seven years of experience in the golf industry, tracing all the way back to her work at the Notre Dame/Saint Mary's College Nike Golf Camp in 1999 and 2000. The Clarksburg, W. Va., native also worked at Notre Dame's Warren Golf Course as a golf shop assistant during her time at Saint Mary's.

Following her graduation from Saint Mary's College, Veltri worked for nearly one year at Captain's Choice Golf Services Inc. in Orlando, Fla., where she served as management/tournament coordinator while also working in sales. During the summers of 2003 and 2004, Veltri served as an instructor/counselor at the Stonewall Resort Nike Golf Camp in Roanoke, W. Va. Prior to her arrival at Notre Dame, she worked at the Palmer Course at the Stonewall Resort as the assistant golf professional for three years.



TOM HANLON

Tom Hanlon has been involved with the women's program from its days as a club sport through its transition to a varsity sport. He served as co-head coach, along with George Thomas, of the Fighting Irish women's team when they began varsity play in 1988. He and Thomas served in that role until 1993.

Hanlon has been linked with Notre Dame golf since his playing days back in the 1940's. He was a member of Notre Dame's 1944 NCAA championship team. Following the 1944 NCAA competition, Hanlon joined the Navy and served on a cruiser in the Pacific during World War II.

After being discharged at the end of the war, Hanlon returned to Notre Dame and received a Bachelor of Science degree in pre-medicine in 1949. He later received a master's degree in education from Notre Dame in June of 1951 before going on to teach science and math and coach basketball and track at Jefferson School in South Bend.

Hanlon sold the insurance firm of Tom Hanlon and Associates in order to devote his time fully to the varsity golf duties. Hanlon is still actively involved in both the men's and women's programs at Notre Dame.



GEORGE THOMAS

George Thomas helped found the women's golf program at Notre Dame. Thomas and Tom Hanlon were co-head coaches when women's golf was elevated to varsity status in 1988 and they remained in that role until 1993. Thomas is still actively involved in the Fighting Irish program.

Thomas also served as the Notre Dame men's golf coach from 1989-2001. He was a two-time BIG EAST Coach of the Year while guiding the men. Thomas also was named the Midwestern Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year for the 1988-89 campaign.

As a player, Thomas qualified for the U.S. Open twice (1965, 1976) and the PGA Championship once (1974). He has also appeared in the U.S. Senior Open from 1981-86. The Elkhart, Ind. native was inducted into the Indiana PGA Hall of Fame in 1979-80 and was the Indiana PGA Player of the Year three times (1970, 1973, 1977).

After serving as a B-17 navigator with the Eighth Air Corps during World War II, Thomas accepted a football scholarship to Purdue University. He served as a backup quarterback to All-American Bob DeMoss.

Thomas also was a four-year member of the golf team at Purdue. During his playing days at Purdue, Thomas was a member on the NCAA runner-up squad for the Boilermakers in 1950. He graduated from the Purdue School of Pharmacy and served as a pharmacist for 12 years while playing professionally.

The longtime member of the Notre Dame community earned an honorary monogram from the Notre Dame Monogram Club in 1999.

The date of May 1, 2000, marked the beginning of a new era in the history of Notre Dame golf as the University unveiled the championship-caliber William K. and Natalie O. Warren Golf Course at Notre Dame.

Since its opening date, the course has been hailed as one of the best new courses in America by *Golf Digest* and has been featured in *Links Magazine* and *Golf Digest* as a must-play venue.

In 2012, the course was ranked by *Golfweek* as one of the top six courses in Indiana in its state-by-state top courses issue and earlier, *Golfweek*, ranked it among the top 15 college golf courses in the nation, ranking it 12th overall.

Since opening 12 years ago, the Warren Golf Course has played host to many prestigious golf tournaments. The course has been the site of five BIG EAST men's tournaments ('01, '02, '03, '04, '05) and three women's championships ('03, '04, '05). In 2005 and 2010, the NCAA Division I men's regional championship was played at the Warren and in 2011, an NCAA women's regional graced the course.

In 2010, the U.S. Women's Public Links Championship came to the Warren Golf Club and U.S. Open qualifiers for the men were played at the Warren in 2009 and 2010. Six U.S. Men's Amateur Qualifiers ('01, '02, '04, '08, '11, '12) and the 2005 Western Amateur Qualifier was also played at Notre Dame's Warren Golf Course.

Through the generous donation of Notre Dame alumnus and Tulsa, Okla., resident Bill Warren ('56), the University features an impressive 18-hole golf course, located a stone's throw away from the northeast corner of campus. Constructed in a heavily wooded area, the facility is bordered by Douglas Road to the south, Juniper Road to the west, Ironwood Drive to the east and the Indiana Toll Road to the north.

The course was designed by the Austin, Texas based architectural team of Coore and Crenshaw, headed by Bill Coore and PGA Tour veteran Ben Crenshaw. Coore began his design and construction career in 1972 with noted course architect Pete Dye and formed his own company in 1982 before joining forces with Crenshaw four years

later.

Founded in 1986, Coore and Crenshaw has established a reputation for creating courses based on traditional, strategic golf, including: the Plantation Course at the Kapalua Resort in Maui, Hawaii; Cuscowilla Golf Club in Greensboro, Ga.; Sand Hills Golf Club in Mullen, Neb.; Barton Creek Club in Austin; the New Town Golf Club in Indonesia; Talking Stick in Scottsdale, Ariz.; and the East Hampton Golf Club on Long Island. Sand Hills was recognized as the number one modern golf course" by *Golfweek* magazine.

Coore and Crenshaw also has undertaken several renovation projects, including the Southern Hills Country Club (in Tulsa) and the Prairie Dunes Golf Club (located in Kansas). The firm oversaw nine-hole additions to the Southern Hills Country Club in Tulsa and the Onion Creek Country Club in Tulsa and the Onion Creek Country Club in Austin.

The existing Notre Dame Memorial Golf Course, located on the southwest side of campus, served as an 18-hole facility for the Notre Dame community until 1993, when the back nine was lost due to the addition of four campus dormitories and several athletic fields. The 70-year-old University course remains a convenient nine-hole facility available to the campus community. After losing the back nine of the existing course, Mr. Warren came forward with an interest in developing a new 18-hole, championship course.

Since Mr. Warren was familiar with the team of Coore and Crenshaw through its work in Tulsa, it was a very natural fit.

"We are very grateful for Mr. Warren's generosity," said Beauchamp. "Such a championship-level course allows our golf teams to be more competitive on a national level. The course is intended to benefit the entire Notre Dame community while still retaining the existing course as a nine-hole facility for instructional purposes."

Course construction began on March 1, 1997, with the first actual phases of dirt movement beginning two months later. Many of the day-to-day tasks were coordinated by the University's department of facility engi-

Warren Golf Course Earns Top Rankings From *Golfweek*

The University of Notre Dame's Warren Golf Course has been chosen as one of the top 15 college courses in the nation, according to a feature article in the September 2011 issue of *Golfweek*. To qualify for the *Golfweek*'s Best Campus Courses list, a course must be part of a school's recreational life in terms of preferential access for students, faculty and alumni. The Warren was ranked 12th best in the nation for 2012 after being 14th the previous year. In March of 2012, *Golfweek* chose the Warren Golf Course as one of the top six courses in Indiana in the magazine's Best Courses - State-by-State edition. Since *Golfweek* began ranking "Best Courses in the State" in 2007, the Warren has been one of only three courses to earn a top 10 ranking in each of those years.

The current rankings add to the list of honors that the Warren Golf Course has received in its brief history. Here's a partial list of the accolades the Notre Dame layout has received since opening in 2000:

neering, under the ultimate supervision of associate vice president for business operations Jim Lyphout. The project also was coordinated by former associate athletic director Bubba Cunningham, who had responsibilities for athletic facility and financial affairs at the time.

Final construction for the course was overseen by Doug Marsh, director of the Notre Dame facilities engineering office. Assisting in this monumental task was Butch Layman, a construction administrator in the facilities engineering office.

South Bend-based Rieth Reilly Construction was contracted to handle the movement of approximately 100,000 yards of dirt. Another local company, Ziolkowski Construction, handled construction of the course's buildings and other structures.

Final details of the course were directed by Tom Beck, construction superintendent for Coore and Crenshaw, and his associate Jeff Bradley. Kim Hocker, the now former golf course superintendent of the Warren Golf Course and the existing University golf course, and his dedicated staff added their expertise to the successful finish of the project.

Final construction - completed in the fall of 1999 - included grading and seeding of the driving range, construction of tee areas around the clubhouse, completion of the many strategically-placed bunkers, overseeding of the fairways and roughs, and the defining of the course during the "grow-in" period. A number of trees and ornamental grasses were planted to add finishing touches.

Brian Godfrey was named the first PGA director of golf and general manager for the Notre Dame Golf Courses in October of 1998. In 2003, John Foster assumed the post of General Manager and Head Golf Professional at the Warren. His duties at the Warren Golf Course include overseeing the operation of both courses, in addition to pro shops, clubhouse and driving range management. He coordinates course use to balance and meet the requirements of the varsity golf teams, course members, faculty, staff, students and the public. Foster also maintains the golf facility budgets as well as oversees staff training.

The design of the Warren Golf Course is reminiscent of the classic, walkable Irish and American courses built in the late 1800s and early 1900s, with short distances between the greens and tees. Winding its way through 250 wooded acres, the course incorporates traditional elements of the great golf courses of the early 1900s and - unlike many modern layouts - is built on subtleties rather than special effects.

Warren Golf Course Recognized For Environmental Excellence

The William K. and Natalie O. Warren Golf Course has achieved designation as a "Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary" by the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary System (ACSS), the educational division of Audubon International. The Warren Course was the sixth course in Indiana and the 335th in the world to achieve this honor.

"The Warren Golf Course has shown strong commitment to its environmental program. They are to be commended for their efforts to provide sanctuary for wildlife on the golf course property," said Joellen Zeh, staff ecologist for the ACS.

"To reach certification, a course must demonstrate that they are maintaining a high degree of environmental quality in a number of areas," said Zeh.

"We are extremely proud to be certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary," said Kim Hocker, the now former golf course superintendent at the Warren Golf Course. "From the beginning, it was the goal of the University of Notre Dame to create an environmentally-sound golf course. In addition, the overwhelming positive response from golfers and the local community has made our efforts worthwhile."

Distinguishing features include: rectangular tee boxes that provide a classic start to each hole; undulating greens of varying shapes constructed in a push-up style that slopes from back to front; false fronts to greens that allow for a golfer to run the ball or fly it to the flag; strategically-placed bunkers that visually enhance each hole while challenging players to proceed with caution.

The designers received full permits to realign the existing Juday Creek that runs through the course and environmental safeguards were a priority in design and construction. A new creek channel was opened, resulting in a complete created habitat. The creek winds through the finishing holes, which are noted for heavy woods and change of elevations - providing a beautiful, challenging completion to the inward nine. Constant monitoring of the creek ensures a healthy and natural environment. The scenic venue is a Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary.

Some 4,400 native hardwood trees and shrubs were planted to increase the stream's canopy cover. Approximately 360 large boulders, along with gravel and logs, were added to the slopes and bed to enhance fish habitat while a permanent sediment trap was installed. A combination of pest management, drainage and filtration techniques minimizes the use and impact of fertilizers and pesticides while 2,200 feet of new shaded stream course were created to relocate the stream from the golf course proper.

Environmental engineers J.F. New & Associates directed these aspects of the project, and Ronald A. Hellenthal, professor of biological sciences at Notre Dame and Gillen Director of its Environmental Research

Center, reviewed the plans and continues to monitor the creek.

Two lakes add to the challenge of the course, with one stationed between the third and fourth holes while another provides a hazard from the tee of the 17th hole. Water comes into play with the existing Juday Creek winding through holes 16 and 18 while additional creeks were added on holes 10 and 18.


The 7,000-foot clubhouse - designed by Moake-Park Group Inc. of Fort Wayne, Ind., in a French Country style - was completed in June of '99. The building matches the period of the course architecture (early 1900s), with a classic "clinker" style brick exterior. The design is completed by copper cupolas, dormers and trim, a slate roof and an enclosed porch. Brick fireplaces are located on both sides of the building, which welcomes the University community to venture over for lunch, meetings or shopping.

The course runs 7,020 yards from the back tees, 6,346 from the middle and 5,302 from the front tees and plays to a par 71. It includes 88 bunkers scattered among the 18 holes, and water comes into play on six holes. The course has bent grass fairways and fescue grass rough, playing surfaces found at some of today's top facilities.

The clubhouse is open to the public and houses some of the finest in men and women's golf apparel, with the Warren Golf Course logo as well as traditional Notre Dame merchandise and souvenirs. The Warren Grille, serves traditional golf course fare, as well as, specialty items and sandwiches.

A view from the 372-yard 1st hole. A slight dogleg to the left, this hole gives you an idea of what is to come with the rough look of the bunkers on the left to the well protected, small green.



The fairway bunkers on the 216-yard 11th hole provide an architectural deception, in that – from the tee – the front bunkers appear to be located on the sides of the green when they, in fact, are 20 yards short of it (bunkers also are located on the sides of the green).



The view from behind the 414-yard eighth hole looks to a green that is rectangular in shape and slopes dramatically from the rear, with an open front that allows either a bump-and-run shot or one that is flown to the green.



The 197-yard 14th is one of Ben Crenshaw's favorite holes on the Warren Golf Course. Noted for its old-Scottish style, the hole includes an elevated green and two bunkers to the right of the green that cannot be seen from the tee (unlike those to the left of the green). The hole is even more scenic when framed by full foliage in the surrounding trees.



This is a look from the fairway of the 436-yard sixth hole. The green is guarded by two trees and has a narrow entrance that is protected by bunkers both left and right. The Starter's Cottage is visible in the right side of the picture.



The 15th green is located just a stone's throw from the clubhouse, yet the building is obscured by a distinctive variety of trees that rim the putting green.



Above is a look from the picturesque tee at the 16th hole. Overlooking Judy Creek from the elevated tee, the hole ascends up and to the left to a tiny, undulating green that is very well protected by classic Coore- and Crenshaw-designed bunkers.



The finishing hole's tee shot (above) must carry the new stretch of Juday Creek and bend left to the green. The entire left side of the 18th fairway is bordered by the bed of the former Juday Creek, which has been filled to form a new stream.



The elevated tee from the longest hole on the course, the 480-yard 17th hole, overlooks a pond to the left and the large bunkers in the bank of the hill, leading to a sharp dogleg-left approach to the green.

The 495-yard 10th hole is another long hole that a big hitter may try to reach in two. Watch out for the creek that runs diagonally across the entire width of the fairway in front of the green.



The eastside back porch of the clubhouse (above) overlooks the finishing holes and welcomes golfers from the nearby 18th green.



The westside entrance to the clubhouse sits beyond the ninth green, which is noted for its back-to-front slope and is surrounded by deceptive and treacherous bunkering.



The ninth hole, as seen from one of the Warren Golf Course's distinctive rectangular tee boxes, is beautifully framed by trees, and the clubhouse is located behind the green.



A picturesque view from the tee box greets golfers at the dogleg-left seventh hole (398 yards), with a solitary tree adding some danger down the left side of the fairway.

Rolf's Facility

The Robert and Marilyn Rolfs Family All-Season Varsity Golf Facility

(opened Sept. 30, 2006)



A 5,000-square foot indoor short game area, that includes a putting green, chip and pitch area along with a practice bunker allows the student-athletes the ability to practice their short game year-round on campus.



One of the nicest features of the facility are the six hitting stations that are located within the building that lead out to the Warren Golf Course driving range, allowing players to work on their swings in all weather conditions. Incorporated within the stations is state-of-the-art video equipment to give players and coaches instant feedback on players' swing techniques.



Each student-athlete has his or her own locker area in their respective locker room.



The Robert and Marilyn Rolfs Family All-Season Varsity Golf Facility, which is located at the Warren Golf Course on the northeast corner of the University of Notre Dame campus, opened on Sept. 30, 2006 with a private dedication ceremony. The \$2.1 million, 10,333-square foot facility is used by both the Irish men's and women's golf programs.

Four offices are located on the east end of the building to accommodate the coaching staffs. A fully furnished lounge is available to members of both teams for studying or relaxing. Another asset for the teams is a club repair room, which is located in the southern wing of the facility.

Byron V. Kanaley Award

Perhaps the most prestigious honor awarded to Notre Dame student-athletes is the Byron V. Kanaley Award. Presented each year since 1927 at commencement exercises, the Kanaley Awards go to the senior monogram athletes who have been most exemplary as students and leaders.

The awards, selected by the Faculty Board on Athletics, are named in honor of a 1904 Notre Dame graduate who was a member of the baseball team as an undergraduate. Kanaley went on to a successful banking career in Chicago and served the University in the Alumni Association as a lay trustee from 1915 until his death in 1960.

A four-year monogram winner and 2004 graduate, **Shannon Byrne** was the first, and only Irish women's golfer to date to earn the award.

A captain as a senior, Byrne carded 103 rounds in her Irish career, being selected to the all-BIG EAST team once and the NGCA all-scholar team a trio of times.



The BIG EAST Conference

The 2011-12 academic year is the 33rd in the history of The BIG EAST Conference as the unique consortium marches on competing at the highest level with integrity and sportsmanship.

The BIG EAST has gone through membership changes since its birth, but the 2011-12 year marks the conference's seventh straight with the same 16-member group, making for the nation's largest Division I-A conference.

The BIG EAST Conference's goals have always been the same. The outstanding performances of the student-athletes at BIG EAST schools are evidence of the league's proud tradition of success. The league has always been able to boast that many of its best students are also its best athletes. The 2010-11 year was no different.

Seven BIG EAST student-athletes were named NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship winners, while 22 earned Capital One Academic All-America recognition. Maya Moore, Connecticut's women's basketball standout, won the NCAA Honda-Broderick Cup as the nation's top female student-athlete and was chosen as the Capital One Academic All-America of the Year.

In the athletic arena, BIG EAST student-athletes again enjoyed success on the national stage. The Connecticut men's basketball team won its third national championship, completing a magical run through five games of the BIG EAST Championship and six wins in the NCAA tournament. The Villanova women's cross country team won the NCAA title for the second straight year and the ninth time overall. The Notre Dame women's soccer team won its third NCAA title, while BIG EAST teams reached national championship games in women's basketball (Notre Dame) and men's soccer (Louisville).

The BIG EAST placed two teams in the NCAA Women's Final Four for the second time in the last three years as Connecticut joined Notre Dame in Indianapolis, capping a season in which the Huskies extended their NCAA-record winning streak to 90 games.

Individually, BIG EAST student-athletes won five NCAA championships, including an unprecedented four by Villanova's Sheila Reid. Reid was the 2010 individual cross country champion, a member of the Wildcats' winning indoor distance medley relay team and won the 5,000- and 1,500-meter titles in outdoor track & field. Louisville's Matt Hughes, meanwhile, repeated as the NCAA champion in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the NCAA outdoor meet.

Moore and Reid joined Notre Dame soccer standout Melissa Henderson as winners of Honda Sports Awards as the top performers in their respective sports. Moore also became the first three-time winner of the Wade Trophy as the nation's top women's basketball player and joined Villanova lacrosse player Brian Karalunas as winners of the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

BIG EAST football maintained its national profile as a competitively balanced group. Connecticut claimed the league's Bowl Championship Series bid for the first time as the Huskies shared the conference title with Pittsburgh and West Virginia. Six of the league's eight squads went to bowl games and helped the BIG EAST post a 4-2 bowl record for the second straight year.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A conference in 2005-06 when five new

members began competing — the University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, the University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 35 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Cincinnati and Milwaukee. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain almost one-fourth of all television households in the U.S. When Texas Christian University joins the conference in the 2012-13 academic year, the conference will have a footprint in 30 percent of the nation's television households.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 31 national championships in six different sports and 133 student-athletes have won individual national titles.

In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA basketball titles in the same season. In '02-'03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. In men's basketball, BIG EAST squads have won four of the last 13 NCAA championships. BIG EAST women's teams have taken seven of the last 12 NCAA titles.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger. The conference currently crowns champions in 24 sports.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization has had the good fortune to have outstanding leadership. The BIG EAST primarily was the brainchild of Dave Gavitt, who was the conference's first Commissioner. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

John Marinatto, who had served as senior associate commissioner, moved into the Commissioner's chair in 2009 and has continued to steer the conference on its path of success.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed longstanding relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

BIG EAST men's basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden. The women's basketball championship has led all conferences in attendance for the past eight years. Attendance figures also are significant in soccer and baseball.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 student-athletes.


