




STUDENTS

- Notre Dame's graduation rate of 95 percent is exceeded by only Harvard and Princeton.
- Notre Dame's 98 percent retention rate between the freshman and sophomore years is among the highest in the country, thanks in large part to the University's unique First Year of Studies Program.
- Notre Dame has one of the highest undergraduate residential concentrations of any national university, with 80 percent of its students living in 27 residence halls. Some 40 Holy Cross religious leaders continue to live and provide a pastoral presence in the halls.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., took office as the 17th president of the University of Notre Dame on July 1, 2005. He was elected by the University's Board of Trustees to a five-year term April 30, 2004.

An associate professor of philosophy and member of Notre Dame's faculty since 1990, Father Jenkins had served from 2000-2005 as a vice president and associate provost at the University.

Prior to his service in the provost's office, Father Jenkins had been religious superior of the Holy Cross priests and brothers at Notre Dame for three years. As religious superior, he was a Fellow and Trustee of the University, but he relinquished those posts to assume his duties in the provost's office.

Father Jenkins earned degrees in philosophy from Oxford University in 1987 and 1989. He earned his master of divinity degree and licentiate in sacred theology from the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, Calif., in 1988.

Prior to entering the Congregation of Holy Cross, he earned bachelor's and master's degrees in philosophy from Notre Dame in 1976 and 1978, respectively. Father Jenkins was ordained a priest in Notre Dame's Basilica of the Sacred Heart in 1983. He served as director of the Old College program for Notre Dame undergraduate candidates for the Congregation of Holy Cross from 1991 to 1993.

A native of Omaha, Neb., Father Jenkins was born Dec. 17, 1953.



John B. "Jack" Swarbrick Jr., a Notre Dame graduate who has risen to national prominence as a lawyer, consultant and executive in the collegiate and Olympic sports industries, was appointed July 16, 2008 as the University's 12th director of athletics.

Raised in Yonkers, N.Y., and Bloomington, Ind., Swarbrick is a 1976 magna cum laude graduate of Notre Dame with a bachelor's degree in economics. Upon graduating from Stanford Law School in 1980, he returned to Indiana to accept a position as an associate in the Indianapolis law firm Baker & Daniels, He was made partner in 1987.

At the same time that Swarbrick began his career, the city of Indianapolis was beginning its effort to become a world-class center for amateur and professional athletics. An employment law specialist, Swarbrick soon shifted his focus to sports and quickly became active in the city's initiatives.

As a member of the Indiana Sports Corp., including the chairmanship from 1992 to 2001, Swarbrick led many of the city's successful proposals to a wide array of athletics organizations – from the NFL to the U.S. Olympic Committee to the Big Ten Conference. His leadership efforts have resulted in the city:

- Earning the bid to host the 2012 Super Bowl to Indianapolis
- Becoming the home of the NCAA national headquarters
- Hosting the 1987 Pan American Games
- Hosting the 1991 World Gymnastics Championships
- Hosting NCAA Final Fours and other college championship competitions and a wide array of national and world championships in the Olympic sports
- Securing rights to host the Big Ten Conference men's and women's basketball tournaments for five consecutive years beginning in 2008

Swarbrick's work has focused on the representation of owners of sports teams and organizations which sanction or conduct athletic competitions. He has served as general counsel for numerous national governing bodies of Olympic sports, including USA Gymnastics and USRowing, and as a consultant to the 1996 Olympic Games. He also served as president and chief executive officer of LMiV, an Internet-based network of radio stations.

- In his work as an advisor to the NCAA, Swarbrick has:
- Coordinated the men's College Basketball Partnership, an NCAA-led group that addresses the opportunities and challenges in the sport
- Worked with the NCAA's Corporate Partners and Champions Program
- Served as a member of the NCAA Division I women's Basketball Discussion Group
- Chaired the NCAA/USOC task force dedicated to developing proposals to expand sponsorship of Olympic sports among NCAA member institutions
- Developed the business plan for the new NBA/NCAA youth basketball enterprise Before accepting the offer to lead his alma mater's athletics department, Swarbrick had been a finalist for several high-profile positions in college athletics, including president of the NCAA and commissioner of the Big 12 Conference.

Swarbrick and his wife, Kimberly, are the parents of four children: Kate, a junior at St. Louis University; Connor, a sophomore at Wake Forest University; Cal, a junior in high school; and Christopher, a high school sophomore.



Notre Dame's Academic Services for Student-Athletes, housed in the Coleman-Morse Building, is designed to help Notre Dame fulfill its commitment to all student-athletes in their pursuit of a college degree and academic excellence.

In order to achieve these goals, Academic Services has several major objectives:

- 1. Maintain the academic integrity of the University
- 2. Help student-athletes maximize their academic potential

he University of Notre

- 3. Comply with University and NCAA rules and regulations
- 4. Assist every student-athlete as they work towards graduation in four years

Academic Services provides many services that begin when First Year students arrive on campus and continue through graduation. Services provided include but are not limited to:

- Consistent counseling and appropriate interventions regarding academic matters
- Refer student-athletes to campus offices where they can meet regularly with their professors and college advisors
- Monitoring the progress of student-athletes through regular communication with professors
- Provide tutorial assistance for the student-athletes

A new computer/study space was completed inside the Coleman-Morse Building for the start of the 2007-08 school year. This new 2,500 square-foot room can handle any combination of 80 student-athletes or tutors at once. There are also nine study rooms used for small group meetings or private sessions with tutors. The study space has approximately 20 desktop computers available for use and has wireless connections available for laptops.



Whether measured by the federal government in its Department of Education report or by the NCAA through its newer Graduation Success Rate (GSR) numbers, graduation rates for Notre Dame student-athletes rank among the national leaders in most categories among major football-playing colleges and universities.











FACILITIES





That blueprint, which touched nearly every varsity sport, continues to come to life. By the time the plan in completed, the entire area just east of the Joyce Center and north of Edison Road will boast a comprehensive and impressive athletic quad.



NEW FACILITIES

ALUMNI SOCCER STADIUM

• The new \$5.7 million stadium had its groundbreaking April 26, 2008 and is expected to be completed in June 2009. The stadium will be a lighted facility that will feature a natural grass field, locker rooms, restrooms, concession areas and 2,000 seats.

Arlotta Family Lacrosse Stadium

• Groundbreaking for the \$5 million facility occurred April 17, 2008 and is expected to be completed in June 2009. Arlotta Stadium will feature 2,000 seats, lights, an artifical-turf field, locker rooms, restrooms and concession area.

Melissa Cook Stadium

• Located on the southeast corner of campus, the new softball stadium opened April 12, 2008 and can accommodate up to 1,500 fans.

TRACK STADIUM

• Ground was broken for construction of the \$3 million outdoor track in June 2008. The new nine-lane facility will meet IAAF guidelines and completion is expected in late October 2008.

LABAR FOOTBALL PRACTICE FIELDS

Three new practice fields adjacent to the Guglielmino Athletics Complex will be ready for the start of fall practice in August 2008. Two of the fields will be FieldTurf and the third will be natural grass.





RENOVATED FACILITIES

PURCELL PAVILION

 Home to the Irish men's and women's basketball teams as well as the volleyball squad, construction on the \$26.3 million Joyce Center Arena addition and renovation will begin in September 2008.

CHARLES W. "LEFTY" SMITH, JR. ICE RINK

 Tentative plans for a \$30 million facility will create a new home for the Irish hockey team within the Joyce Center fieldhouse. The project would increase capacity to 4,000 while improving locker rooms, concessions and restrooms.

PROSPECTIVE NEW FACILITIES

OUTDOOR TENNIS COMPLEX

 The \$4.9 million project will create a new outdoor playing and practice home with seating for 2,000 and will meet NCAA requirements to host national championships on the Notre Dame campus.



SPORTS MEDICINE

- Head athletic trainer and physical therapist Jim Russ oversees a staff of three associate and eight assistant athletic trainers, plus two physical therapist/athletic trainers, all of whom are certified and boast nearly 200 years of collective experience.
- Irish athletes have access to three state-of-the-art sports medicine facilities in the Joyce Center, Notre Dame Stadium and the Guglielmino Athletics Complex.
- The Guglielmino facility encompasses more than 8,500 squarefeet of cutting-edge sports medicine technology including the latest in physical therapy modalities and rehabilitation equipment, with two 3,500-gallon therapy pools, a full x-ray unit and an MRI machine.


STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

- Director of strength and conditioning Ruben Mendoza is in charge of a department that has eight full-time coaches, an intern and a nutritionist.
- The 25,000 square foot Haggar Fitness Complex is located between the Loftus Sports Center and Guglielmino Athletics Complex.
- The Haggar Fitness Complex features a three-lane development track, a 45x18 yard Prestige Turf plyometric agility area, a Gatorade hydration station, six giant plasma screen televisions and a state-of-the-art sound system with 28 speakers and four subwoofers.



DIRECTORS' CUP STANDINGS

For the 10th straight year in 2007-08, Notre Dame posted a top-25 finish (21st) in the United States Sports Academy Division I Directors' Cup all-sports competition sponsored by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (formerly known as Sears Directors' Cup).

Notre Dame is among 14 schools to earn a top-25 finish in each of the past 10 years (1999-2008), as Irish programs finished 25th in '99, 21st in 2000, 11th in '01, 13th in '02 and '03, 19th in '04, 16th in '05, sixth in '06, 22nd in '07 and 21st in '08.

STUDENT WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT

- The Student Welfare and Development Program implements events and activities that are designed to facilitate learning within five key areas: academic excellence, athletic success, career preparation, community involvement and personal development.
- The program has three components: elective services (community service, leadership, social events); complementary services (encourages administrators and coaches to request coordination of workshops, events and activities); and essential services (student-athletes participate in a series of required skill-building and developmental workshops and activities).
- The Student Welfare and Developmental Program, founded in 1996, continuously seeks to develop programs that educate student-athletes on current issues, so as to ensure that when they graduate from the University, they are prepared to successfully meet the challenges of life.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

- More than 92 percent of Notre Dame's student-athletes (from all 26 varsity teams) participated in community service activities during the 2007-08 school year.
- Irish student-athletes completed more than 5,000 hours of community service while assisting more than 50 non-profit organizations and schools.

outh Bend and Mishawaka are the two largest cities in St. Joseph County and help boost the population of the area to 266,431.


- The College Football Hall of Fame is located in downtown South Bend.

The former team captain is also one of five softball student-athletes in the 20-year history of the program to win Notre Dame's Byron V. Kanaley Award.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Notre Dame's softball team has been well represented on the CoSIDA Academic All-America teams since 1993, when Casey McMurray became the first Irish honoree. Since that season, a Notre Dame player has earned Academic All-America honors on 15 occasions, including four first-team selections. In 2002, Jarrah Myers was named college softball's Academic All-American of the Year.

Most recently, Stephanie Brown earned second team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors following the 2006 and 2007 seasons. She graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a 3.44 cumulative GPA as a marketing major. Heading into the 2008-09 season, Notre Dame was second among Division I schools with 202 Academic All-Americans.

ALKIRE, MELANIE

One of the greatest Notre Dame sluggers set the previous single-season home run mark in 2000. That mark of 13 was later tied by Jarrah Myers during the 2002 campaign. Alkire also has the single-season mark for RBI (64) and slugging percentage (.665). The former shortstop still sits among the top-10 in virtually all of Notre Dame's career batting categories including hits (260), runs (129), batting average (.340), doubles (49), home runs (30), RBI (167) and walks (61).

ALL-AMERICANS

Notre Dame has seen 10 different players earn All-America honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) since 1994: Stephanie Brown (2006), Melanie Alkire (2000), Megan Ciolli (2004, 2005), Terri Kobata (1994, 1995), Jenny Kriech (2001), Andrea Loman (2002, 2003), Katie Marten

(1995, 1996), Jarrah Myers (2001, 2002) Kristin Schmidt (2001) and Jennifer Sharron (2000, 2001).

ALL-TIME RECORD

Entering the 2009 season, Notre Dame softball has posted 801 wins in 20 seasons – just over 40 wins per year – and has never finished a campaign with a win total less than 30. The Irish have won over two-thirds of their games and have never had a losing record as the team enters its 21st season of competitive softball. The program boasts an overall record of 801-382-3 (.677).

BIG EAST CONFERENCE

In Notre Dame's first season of BIG EAST Conference competition (1996) Liz Miller guided her team to the league's South Division title with a 19-1 record. When the Irish first joined the conference, they faced each divisional team in a pair of doubleheaders over the course of a two-day weekend. The formula changed in 1998, as the games were dropped to just a single doubleheader followed by a solo contest the next day. The conference adopted its current format in 1999, which pits each team in a single-day doubleheader.

Notre Dame is currently 206-39 (.841) in BIG EAST Conference regular-season competition. They finished the 1999 (16-0) and 2001 (20-0) conference schedules with perfect records and have claimed the regular-season title in 10 of the last 13 seasons.

Notre Dame broke through with its first BIG EAST Tournament title in 1999 led by the event's Most Outstanding Player, Jennifer Sharron. The Irish repeated in 2000, then fell to fourth in 2001 before claiming the title in 2002 and 2003. The 2003 team pounded out 21 runs during the tournament and earned the title on Andrea Loman's walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning against Villanova. Loman would go on to earn the tournament's Most Outstanding Player award. The 2006 season produced the latest championship, as the Irish saddled the strong pitching of Most Outstanding Player Heather Booth to hoist the hardware. It was Notre Dame's fifth BIG EAST Tournament crown. and was followed by a runner-up finish in 2007. In all, Notre Dame has posted a record of 27-15 (.643) over the course of 13 league tournaments.

Notre Dame is one of only two BIG EAST teams that have won at least 18 league games in a single season. The Irish have accomplished the feat on three occasions since 2001, after first reaching the 18-win mark in 1996.

Notre Dame has seen a team member earn the BIG EAST Conference's top player award on eight occasions. Melanie Alkire won the award in 1999 and 2000, followed by Lizzy Lemire (2001), Jarrah Myers (2002), Andrea Loman (2003) and Megan Ciolli (2004). Meghan Murray also is a two-time honoree, winning the league's top award in 1996 and 1997.

Six players have earned the league's Pitcher of the Year award, five have garnered Rookie of the Year nods, and the coaching staff has been named the top in the conference on five occasions. All-BIG EAST accolades have been passed out to Irish players on 86 occasions since 1996.

BOOTH, HEATHER

One of the most durable pitchers to ever play at Notre Dame, Booth averaged 225.0 innings/season including a school-record 261.1 during the 2006 campaign. Booth ranks among the top-three pitchers on the all-time record list in seven single-season categories (appearances, games started, wins, complete games, shutouts, innings pitched and strikeouts) and tops the Notre Dame career record books in appearances, games started, wins, complete games and innings pitched.

CAPTAINS

In the 20-year history of Irish softball, a total of 39 different student-athletes have served as team captains. Among that group, six have served as multi-year captains. The two-time captains are Ruth Kmak (1990, 1992), Jennifer Sharron (2000-01), Danielle Klayman (2000-01), Katie Laing (2007-08), Brittney Bargar (2008-09) and Linda Kohan (2008-09).

CIOLLI, MEGAN

One of the top players in program history, she concluded her career in 2005 with an NFCA All-America honor. She also was an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District member in her final season. Ciolli was a four-time first-team all-BIG EAST selection – making her one of only four Irish softball players to gain the honor as many times – and was named the BIG EAST Player of the Year in 2004. A two-time NFCA third-team All-American and 2005 captain, Ciolli finds her name atop the all-time leaders in both career hits (284) and stolen bases (76).

DIRECTORS' CUP

The University of Notre Dame remained one of the nation's elite all-around athletic programs by posting its 10th straight top-25 finish (21st) in the 2007-08 United States Sports Academy Division I Directors' Cup all-sports competition. Sponsored by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), the Directors' Cup competition honors institutions for maintaining athletic programs that seek to achieve success in many sports, both men's and women's. In all, 16 different teams provided points to Notre Dame's final total, including the softball team that advanced to its 10th consecutive NCAA Tournament.

DRAMATIC HOME RUNS

Notre Dame has had its fair share of dramatic home runs in its 20-year history – shots late in contests that have tied the game or put the Irish ahead on the scoreboard.

Liz Hartmann has been at the plate for many of those moments, as she hit come-from-behind home runs at Nebraska (2002), Louisiana-Lafayette (2003) and against Nebraska (2004) in the UNLV Classic.

Also noteworthy is Andrea Loman's ninth-inning blast against Villanova in the 2003 BIG EAST Tournament finale to clinch the championship title. In 2004, Stephanie Brown hit the game-tying moon shot to send the 2004 BIG EAST Tournament title game into extra innings. Then two years later, she delivered again with a two-run blast in the bottom of the seventh inning that enabled the Irish to shock No. 10 Arizona State, 3-2, during the Judi Garman Classic.

Carissa Jaquish joined the group with a two-run home run at Syracuse in the 10th inning to give the Irish a 7-5 come-from-behind victory during the 2006 campaign.

Even pitcher Brittney Bargar got in the action when her first career hit – a walk-off homer in the bottom of the seventh – proved to be the game winner during a 2007 matchup with Toledo.

In 2008, Linda Kohan and Christine Lux joined rookie Katie Fleury in the home run department during an Irish win over Kent State to open NCAA Regional action in Ann Arbor, Mich. Moreover, the three home runs came in the same inning. It was the second time in school history that the Irish hit three home runs in the same inning - a feat last accomplished exactly one month prior against Wisconsin by the same trio.

Earlier in the season, Kohan sent a two-run homer out of Louisville's Ulmer Stadium in the eighth inning of a BIG EAST matchup to complete a come-frombehind victory over the Cardinals. The contest was televised live to a national audience.

FIFTY FOUR

The 2001 Irish softball team posted a stellar 54-7 record, easily setting the mark for the most wins during one season in Notre Dame softball history. Liz Miller's last team posted a national-best 33-game win streak during the season and knocked off nine ranked teams along the way. The Irish stubbed their toe in the BIG EAST Tournament that year, but were awarded a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's history. During the year, Notre Dame achieved its highest-ever ranking, peaking at seventh in the USA Today/NFCA Top 25 poll.

FIGHTING IRISH

Exactly where and how Notre Dame's athletic nickname, "Fighting Irish," came to origination has never been perfectly explained. One story suggests the moniker was born in 1899 with Notre Dame leading Northwestern 5-0 at halftime of a football game in Evanston, Ill., the Wildcat fans supposedly began to chant, "Kill the Fighting Irish, kill the Fighting Irish," as the second half opened. Another tale has the nickname originating at halftime of the Notre Dame-Michigan football game in 1909. With his team trailing, one Notre Dame player yelled to his teammates - who happened to have names like Dolan, Kelly, Glynn, Duffy, and Ryan - "What's the matter with you guys? You're all Irish and you're not fighting worth a lick." Notre Dame came back to win the game and press, after overhearing the remark, reported the game as a victory for the "Fighting Irish."The most generally-accepted explanation is that the press coined the nickname as a characterization of Notre Dame athletic teams, their neversay-die fighting spirit and the Irish qualities of grit, determination, and tenacity. The term likely began as an abusive expression tauntingly directed toward the athletes from the small. private, Catholic institution. Notre Dame alumnus Francis Wallace popularized it in his New York Daily News columns in the 1920s. The Notre Dame Scholastic, in a 1929 edition, printed its own version of the story: "The term 'Fighting Irish' has been applied to Notre Dame teams for years. It first attached itself years ago when the school, comparatively unknown, sent its athletic teams away to play in another city ... At that time the title 'Fighting Irish' held no glory or prestige ... The years passed swiftly and the

school began to take a place in the sports world ... 'Fighting Irish' took on a new meaning. The unknown of a few years past has boldly taken a place among the leaders. The unkind appellation became symbolic of the struggle for supremacy of the field ... the term, while given in irony, has become our heritage ... So truly does it represent us that we are unwilling to part with it." Notre Dame competed under the nickname "Catholics" during the 1800s and became more widely known as the "Ramblers" during the early 1920s in the days of the Four Horsemen. University president Rev.

Matthew Walsh, C.S.C., officially adopted "Fighting Irish" as the Notre Dame nickname in 1927.

GAMES PLAYED

Notre Dame set the school record for games played in a single season during the 2004 campaign, taking the field 69 times and compiling a 49-20 record to set the mark for the second-most wins in a single season.

Teammates Stephanie Brown, Meagan Ruthrauff, Sara Schoonaert and Nicole deFau all share the school record for games played, as each player appeared and started in all of 2004's 69 contests.

The Irish have seen action in a total of 1,186 contests.

GOLD AND BLUE

The origin of Notre Dame's school colors can be traced back to the founding of the University in 1842. At that time, Notre Dame's original school colors were yellow and blue; yellow symbolized the light and blue represented the truth. However, sometime after the Dome and Statue of Mary atop the Main Building was gilded, gold and blue became the official colors of the University.

GOLDEN DOME

The Main Building surmounted by a statue of Our Lady atop the world-famous Golden Dome – actually gold leaf periodically replaced, most recently in 2005 – at one time comprised the entire University infrastructure, and in 1879 was rebuilt in five months after a devastating fire. The twelve Columbus murals in the main corridor were painted by Luigi Gregori, an Italian artist who spent 17 years at Notre Dame in the latter part of the 1800s. The building now contains the primary administrative offices, including that of Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., who took over in June of 2005 as Notre Dame's 17th president. The exterior of

the building was renovated and cleaned in 1996 and the interior of the building was renovated and reopened in August of 1999, after being closed the previous two academic years.

GUMPF, DEANNA

The third head coach in Notre Dame softball history, Deanna Gumpf served as the Irish pitching coach under Liz Miller for four seasons before taking over the program in the summer of 2001 after Miller's retirement. In her first season, Gumpf and her staff landed the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year and the NFCA Mideast Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards while helping the Irish win the BIG EAST Tournament and advance to the final day of competition in their respective NCAA Tournament regional bracket.

Through seven seasons at the helm of the program, Gumpf has led the team to four BIG EAST regular season championships, three BIG EAST Tournament titles and 289 wins. Her career winning percentage (.681) is the 17th best among active coaches.

INDOOR FACILITY

Since the weather is not always conducive to outside practice during the winter months in Northern Indiana, the Notre Dame softball team takes full advantage of the indoor batting and pitching facility adjacent to Frank Eck Stadium – the home of Notre Dame baseball. Donated by alumnus Frank Eck, the facility features wall-to-wall artificial turf, four full batting tunnels and a regulation clay pitching surface. To sharpen its defensive skills during the winter months, Notre Dame heads to the Loftus Sports Center, which features a full Prestige Turf football field that is also lined for softball drills.

IVY FIELD

Once the home of the Fighting Irish, Ivy Field was the place to be for every Notre Dame home game since the program began in 1989. It played host to the BIG EAST Tournament in 1998 and 2006, and Notre Dame posted a 288-48-2 (.854) mark within its friendly confines.

Facility-bests include 24 wins in 1996 and a perfect 18-0 mark at home in 2001.

Ivy Field was retired after Notre Dame swept an April 9 doubleheader from Eastern Michigan. Christine Lux had nine RBI during the twinbill, tying a school record with seven RBI in the opening

HOME RUN POWER

Notre Dame exploded for a team-record 54 home runs during the 2002 season, shattering the previous record of 36 in 2000. Jarrah Myers ended up with a single-season-record 13 round trippers, followed by Andrea Loman (11), Andria Bledsoe (7) and Liz Hartmann (7). Hartmann's total was the most-ever by a freshman at Notre Dame until Stephanie Brown notched as many during her rookie campaign in 2004. In all, 10 different Irish players hit at least one home run during the 2002 season.

The Irish threatened the record once again in 2003, cranking 49 balls out of the park. Eight players hit three or more home runs, led by Loman and Hartmann with nine apiece.

Notre Dame also started on a torrid pace with the home run ball in 2004, ending up hitting 39 dingers in 69 games. The Irish again flexed their muscle in 2006 by hitting 44 home runs with Meagan Ruthrauff ending the season with 12 home runs.

All About the Irish

HAYES, SARA

The premier hitter for the Irish in the early 1990s, Sara Hayes' name appears all over the Notre Dame career offensive record book. She ranks in the top five for doubles (44), triples (11), home runs (26), RBI (137), walks (66) and putouts (964). Hayes was named the Midwestern Collegiate Conference's Player of the Year in 1995 and was a three-time first-team all-conference pick.

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

The Notre Dame softball team has enjoyed three memorable international trips over the past several years. Prior the 2000 season, the team spent its fall break in Australia, while the 2004 team ended up in Ireland and England for several days in October of 2003.

While in Europe the Irish had a chance to develop softball at the grassroots level, as the team spent time in Dublin and London during its trip, offering clinics to local softball players.

Gumpf's 2008 squad trekked through Italy during fall break (2007), including stops in Rome, Florence and Venice. Upon leaving Venice, the team traveled to the town of Forli (near San Marino) where they competed against a compilation of players from Italy's professional softball league and members of the Italian national team.

KOBATA, TERRI

One of the most dominant pitchers in all of college softball in the early 1990's, Terri Kobata became Notre Dame's first softball All-American by claiming the honor in 1994. She ended her career with 42 shutouts, an overall record of 79-15 (.840), 907 strikeouts, 285 hits allowed, and a miniscule 0.63 ERA. Kobata's legacy also is highlighted by 15 career no-hitters – 14 of which were solo – which helps make her one of the greatest hurlers in Notre Dame history. She posted a 10.09 strikeout ratio for her career, the 10th-best mark ever in NCAA history. Her single-season 10.90 strikeout ratio led all of college softball in 1993.

LOMAN, ANDREA

It would be a difficult challenge to proclaim who the greatest player in Notre Dame softball history

may be, but 2003 graduate Andrea Loman would be one of the first players brought up in the conversation. Loman compiled one of the greatest careers in Irish history from 2000-03, claiming two All-America honors along with the BIG EAST Player of the Year, BIG EAST Championship's Most Outstanding Player and BIG EAST Rookie of the Year trophies.

Loman's presence in the Irish record book speaks for itself, as the Riverside, Calif., native stands first in career runs (164), second in walks (87) and home runs (31), fourth in RBI (148) and fifth in batting average (.347), doubles (44) and fielding percentage (.977). In 2003, Loman led the Irish in batting average (.402), runs (43), hits (68), doubles (12), home runs (9), RBI (42), total bases (111), slugging percentage (.657), on-base percentage (.466) and stolen bases (18)

MELISSA COOK STADIUM

A 1993 Notre Dame graduate and softball letterwinner, Melissa Cook was the first former player to pass away when she left us in 2002 – but her legend and spirit continue to thrive at the University.

At Ivy Field, head coach Deanna Gumpf – along with the 2003 Irish team and Cook's family – dedicated a bench near the facility to the former second baseman and shortstop during the team's fall

alumni game scrimmage.

In the summer of 2006 Cook's parents – Linda and Paul Demo – made a generous donation to the Notre Dame softball team to help defray the costs of construction for a new softball stadium in Melissa's memory. The Melissa Cook Stadium, a \$4.8 million facility, is located on the southeast corner of the Notre Dame campus near Eck Baseball Stadium. The stadium was dedicated in April 2008, and is considered one of the more remarkable softball facilities in the Midwest.

Raised in Merrillville, Ind., Cook played for the Fighting Irish softball team in 1991 and 1992, seeing time at second base, shortstop and catcher. She led the team in triples as a freshman and earned a monogram before opting to study abroad one year later. An accounting major, she earned her bachelor's degree and was the

controller for Teamsters Union Local 786 prior to her death.

She was a standout athlete in high school, excelling in basketball, volleyball and softball. When Notre Dame offered her a scholarship to play softball, she had achieved a lifelong dream.

Notre Dame broke ground on the stadium in April 2007 on the weekend the University celebrated 35 years of women's athletics.

MIDWESTERN COLLEGIATE CONFERENCE

Notre Dame competed in the Midwestern Collegiate Conference – now called the Horizon League – from 1989 through 1995 before joining the BIG EAST Conference. The Irish racked up a record of 66-15 (.815) in MCC regular-season play and won the league tournament title in five of its seven years of membership. Notre Dame's first coach, Brian Boulac, was named MCC Coach of the Year in 1989 while Liz Miller landed the same honor in 1994 and

MILLER, LIZ

The architect of Notre Dame softball's rise to prominence, Liz Miller coached the Irish for nine seasons (1993-2001) and led the team to six NCAA Tournament appearances. Miller posted an outstanding 377-156 (.707) record at Notre Dame, which was the final coaching stop of her stellar career. She was named to the NFCA Hall of Fame in the fall of 2005. Among her career highlights, Miller implemented the women's athletic program at Lake Michigan College and compiled a 1,047-331 overall combined record while coaching volleyball, basketball and softball at the school. After narrowing her focus solely on softball, she amassed 12 conference championships and 11 regional titles for Lake Michigan.

Miller received an honorary monogram from the University of Notre Dame upon her retirement at the end of the 2001 season. She and her husband, Lloyd, who also played a large part in the development of the Notre Dame program while Liz was head coach, are still very close to the program and to this day attend many of the team's games both at home and on the road.

Miller ended her softball coaching career with 918 career victories in 26 seasons, winning more than 75 percent of the games she coached.



MONOGRAM CLUB

The Notre Dame Monogram Club is comprised of some 4,300 due-paying individuals who have earned the University's varsity athletic insignia for their athletic or team support endeavors or have been honorary monogram recipients. The club supports the primary goal of the University: the spiritual, intellectual, and physical development of its students and alumni. By providing its members the opportunity to foster and maintain relationships across different sports, generations and geographical locations, the Monogram Club aspires to contribute through the common bond of sport - to the social and professional enrichment of its members while providing a means for ongoing association with the University. As an integral part of the Notre Dame family, the Monogram Club endeavors to uphold and enrich the great tradition of Notre Dame athletics.

MYERS, JARRAH

Possibly the greatest power hitter to ever don the blue and gold, Myers completed her career in 2002 with a trunk full of awards. In 2002 alone, she was named the BIG EAST Player of the Year, the BIG EAST Scholar-Athlete of the Year, first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, third-team NFCA/Louisville Slugger All-American, CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year for softball, and earned the Notre Dame Monogram Club Team MVP. Even more, she took home Notre Dame's Knute Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award and became the fourth Notre Dame softball player to land the school's prestigious Byron V. Kanaley Award.

Myers sits atop the Irish career lists in home runs (36), RBI (174) and putouts (1,337). Myers is also third in walks (76), sixth in stolen bases (43) and ninth (.976) in fielding percentage.

NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Notre Dame softball team has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 13 times overall including visits in each of the last 10 seasons. The Irish have reached the final day of regional competition five times before being eliminated by Michigan (1995 and 2003), Iowa (2001), Nebraska (2002) and Northwestern (2005 and 2006). Although Notre Dame has made 13 different trips to the show, they have only visited four different post-season sites (Bloomington, Ind. – 1994; Ann Arbor, Mich. – 1995-96, 1999-2000, 2003-04, 2008; Iowa City, Iowa – 2001-02; Evanston, Ill. – 2006-07).

The Irish served as a tournament host to regional competition in 2005, tacking on a 2-2 record during play at Ivy Field.

UNITED STATES NATIONAL TEAMS

Four Irish players have made their presence felt on the United States National Team over the past several years. Jarrah Myers, Lizzy Lemire and Jennifer Sharron became the first Notre Dame players to earn a spot on the U.S. National Team, doing so in the summer of 2001. Lemire played on the USA Red team, which competed in the 2001 U.S. Cup. Myers and Sharron landed on USA Blue, which traveled to Maracay, Venezuela, for the Pan Am Qualifier. USA Blue dominated the tournament, not allowing a single run to any of the competing teams. Sharron even tossed a perfect game for USA Blue in their battle with Brazil.

Mallorie Lenn earned a spot on the U.S. Junior National team in Hermasillo, Mexico, for the first Pan American championship team during the summer of 2002. Lenn was a key member of the gold-medal winning U.S. team, providing the game-winning RBI in its final round-robin game and was behind the plate for the tournament's final contest, which the United States won against Canada.

Alexis Madrid competed as a member of the Puerto Rican National Fastpitch team during the summer of 2002.

In 2006, Linda Kohan earned an invitation to join the Israeli National team, but declined the offer.

NATIONAL PRO FASTPITCH

National Pro Fastpitch, a six-team professional softball league, began competition in the summer of 2005. Megan Ciolli, who played for the Chicago Bandits, represented Notre Dame during the league's inaugural season. She made her alma mater proud by batting .241, adding eight RBI, eight stolen bases, and a homer.

Stephanie Brown was drafted by the Chicago Bandits in 2007 and enjoyed a successful, but brief, playing career that was cut short due to injury.

NO-HITTERS

There have been 36 nohitters thrown in Notre Dame softball history, including a pair last season.

Brittney Bargar recorded the program's first nohitter in an NCAA Tournament game, a 9-1 decision over Kent State, which also gave Bargar the honor of becoming the first Irish pitcher to record 30 wins in a season. Bargar's first no-hitter of the season came at Syracuse to celebrate Notre Dame's 800th overall win.

Terri Kobata ended her career as the queen of nohitters at Notre Dame with 15 on her resume.

ONE OF THE BEST

The NFCA announced the USA Today/NFCA All-Time Top 50 during the fall of 2003 and Notre Dame ranks among the top softball programs in the nation. The Irish were tagged with the poll's 32nd spot.

Based on the weekly national rankings from 1995 until the end of the 2003 slate, the poll was led by Arizona, followed by UCLA and Washington.

RANKED TEAMS

The Irish have a tendency to pull off the upset and defeat a ranked opponent on an annual basis. In every season dating back to 1994 – with the exception of the 2003 campaign – Notre Dame has downed at least one team that was in the top-25. Overall, Notre Dame has 48 wins over 27 ranked opponents. Among some of the higher ranked programs the Irish have knocked off in recent years are: Washington (#4), Nebraska (#4), Michigan (#5), Tennessee (#5), Oklahoma (#6), Fresno State (#7), Florida State (#9) and Arizona State (#10).

RECORD BREAKERS

Since Deanna Gumpf assumed control of the program for the 2002 season, the Irish have continued to match or eclipse several single-season records.

The 2002 team set school records for home runs (54) and runs scored (318). The 2003 edition set the school mark (at the time) for fielding percentage (.971). In 2004, the Irish established the record number of double plays (22), games played (69) and complete games pitched (52). One year later, Notre Dame set the school records for strikeouts thrown (527), strikeouts per seven innings (8.74) and attempted steals (134). The 2006 edition of the Blue and Gold holds the school record for single-season walks (144) and fielding percentage (.977). The single-season walks record was rewritten in 2008 (148).

All About the Irish

ROAD WARRIORS

During the program's second complete varsity season in 1990, Notre Dame began to hit the road and take part in what has become a stapled tradition in collegiate softball – the early season, warm-weathered tournaments. The Irish are one of the many softball programs that annually seek the top competition in the top tournaments slated for the season's first several weeks.

Notre Dame has traveled to 43 destinations in 30 different states for early-season tournaments since 1990

RUTHRAUFF, MEAGAN

Over a historical four-year career with the Irish, Meagan Ruthrauff established herself as one of the most productive hitters to play under the Golden Dome. Ruthrauff set a new standard for single-game offensive production during a 2006 meeting with Pittsburgh as she clubbed a team-record three home runs on her way to knocking in a school-record seven runs against the Panthers. The former first baseman and designated player is the all-time Notre Dame single-season leader in walks (36) and ranks second in single-season home runs (12), RBI (54) and on-base percentage (.477). Ruthrauff is the career leader in games played (247), doubles (49) and walks (112).

SHARRON, JENNIFER

Jennifer Sharron graduated from Notre Dame in 2001 but left her mark in the circle as a storied pitcher. The only lefthander to ever pitch for Notre Dame, Sharron sits among the all-time leaders in wins (88), complete games (76) and innings pitched (772.1). She became the first BIG EAST player to win four consecutive conference pitcher-of-the-year awards (1998-2001) and earned first-team all-conference honors four consecutive times.

STENGLEIN, STEFFANY

One of the greatest strikeout pitchers the Irish has produced, Stenglein ranks among the best for single-season strikeouts (310), innings pitched (250.2) and wins (27). She also finished her career in 2005 ranking among the top-three in appearances (154), games started (132), wins (79) and innings pitched (744.0). Stenglein was also a three-time all-BIG EAST first-team selection and a two-time conference pitcher-of-the-year.

SEVEN FIRST-TEAMERS

Notre Dame has improved its school record for first-team all-BIG EAST honorees three times in the last five seasons. The 2001, 2002 and 2004 teams included a record seven first-team award winners: 2004 – Steffany Stenglein, Heather Booth, Mallorie Lenn, Liz Hartmann, Stephanie Brown, Megan Ciolli and Nicole deFau; 2003 – Andria Bledsoe, Ciolli, Andrea Loman, Lisa Mattison, Stenglein, Jarrah Myers and Jenny Kriech; 2001 – Loman, Mattison, Kriech, Melanie Alkire, Lizzy Lemire, Jennifer Sharron and Kristin Schmidt.

VICTORY MARCH

The most recognizable collegiate fight song in the nation, the "Notre Dame Victory March" was written in the early 1900s by two brothers who were University of Notre Dame graduates. Michael Shea, a 1905 graduate, composed the music while his brother, John Shea, who earned degrees in 1906 and 1908, provided the corresponding lyrics. The song was copyrighted in 1908 and a piano version, complete with lyrics, was published that year. Michael, who became a priest in Ossining, N.Y., collaborated on the project with John, who lived in Holyoke, Mass., the song's public debut came in the winter of 1908 when Michael played it on the organ of the Second Congregational Church in Holyoke. The Shea brothers later presented the "Notre Dame Victory March" to the University, and it first appeared under the copyright of the University of Notre Dame in 1928. The copyright for the beginning of the song still is in effect. The more well-known second verse, which begins with the words "Cheer, cheer for Old Notre Dame," now is in the public domain in the United States (for both the music and lyrics) - but the second verse remains protected in all territories outside of the country. Notre Dame's fight song first was performed at Notre Dame on Easter Sunday, 1909, in the rotunda of the Main Building when the Notre Dame band performed the Victory March as part of its traditional Easter morning concert. It was first heard at a Notre Dame athletic event 10 years later. In 1969, as college football celebrated its centennial, the "Notre Dame Victory March" was honored as the "greatest of all fight songs." Michael Shea was pastor of St. Augustine's Church in Ossining until his death in 1938. John Shea, a baseball monogram winner at Notre Dame, became a Massachusetts state senator and lived in Holyoke until his death in 1965.

The original lyrics, written when all athletes at Notre Dame were male, refer to "sons," but in recognition of the fact that the Victory March is now played for athletic teams composed of men and women, many modify the words accordingly. The "Victory March" earned a number-one ranking in

ratings compiled in 1998 in a book, "College Fight Songs: An Annotated Anthology." The "Victory March" was also the No. 1-ranked fight song in a 1990 survey conducted by Bill Studwell, a librarian at Northern Illinois University.

Rally sons of Notre Dame: Sing her glory and sound her fame, Raise her Gold and Blue And cheer with voices true: Rah, rah, for Notre Dame

We will fight in ev-ry game, Strong of heart and true to her name We will ne'er forget her And will cheer her ever Loyal to Notre Dame

Cheer, cheer for old Notre Dame, Wake up the echoes cheering her name, Send a volley cheer on high, Shake down the thunder from the sky. What though the odds be great or small Old Notre Dame will win over all, While her loyal sons are marching Onward to victory.

WEBSITE

At any time of the day Notre Dame alumni and fans are just a keystroke away from up-to-date and complete coverage of all 26 Irish varsity sports through the expanded offerings now available on UND.com, the University's official athletics website. During 2007-08, a redesigned UND.com provided front-page linkage to Fighting Irish All-Access, Notre Dame's free broadband channel, which offered live video/audio coverage of 107 live athletic events as well as on-demand video programming. More than 50,000 visitors signed up for Fighting Irish All-Access last year.

Notre Dame's website, which also offers a variety of press releases, media guide information, individual team pages and other print material, ranked second nationally behind North Carolina in both unique viewers and total impressions from July 2007 through June 2008. More than five million fans (5,594,688) visited UND.com during 2007-08 registering more than 34 million (34,756,004) page views.

Five softball doubleheaders featured live streaming video and audio in 2008, with several more covered just on the audio end.

WOMEN'S ATHLETICS

Notre Dame celebrated 35 years of women's athletics in April 2007 with the Monogram Club serving as the primary sponsor and organizer of the historic event. More than 100 former Notre Dame women's athletes attended the weekend celebration, which included a Friday-night dinner at the home of athletics director Kevin White; athletic events on Saturday; sports-specific social events; and the concluding Mass and Sunday brunch that were held in the Joyce Center Arena. The Mass took on added significance for those in attendance, as current University president Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., was joined by his predecessors – Rev.Theodore Hesburgh, C.S.C., and Rev. Edward "Monk" Malloy, C.S.C. – as the celebrants.

Full Steam Ahead

Deep and experienced roster should bring out the best for 2009 squad

Many programs would bask in the success exhibited by the Notre Dame softball team during the Deanna Gumpf era: nearly 300 wins in just seven seasons, seven consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament, four regular-season BIG EAST Conference titles and a league tournament championship trophy.

But the taste of success for Gumpf and the Irish has not been enough. They want a bite. And with one of the most experienced teams in Gumpf's tenure at Notre Dame, the 2009 edition of the Irish softball team could be poised to make a deep run into the postseason. Notre Dame received 12 votes in the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 preseason poll.

"This program is ready to make the next step," Gumpf said. "We've been close so many times. We know what it takes, we know what we're up against, and we're ready to make that run."

The Irish return all of their firepower from the circle in senior Brittney Bargar and sophomore Jody Valdivia. Bargar was a dominating force as a junior in 2008 with 30 wins and 244 strikeouts in 291.1 innings of work. Her 1.47 ERA was among the lowest in the nation while the righty also had a pair of no-hitters. Bargar totaled eight shutouts and combined for one more with Valdivia. Valdivia was impressive in her first year with the Irish and showed flashes of brilliance with a tremendous repertoire of pitches. Her 8-7 record and 3.13 ERA in 2008 may be deceiving, as she averaged 1.18 strikeouts/inning - including 14 in one game against Eastern Michigan and wowed the coaching staff perhaps more than any Irish player this past fall.

On the latter half of the battery, junior Alexia Clay is primed to return to the field after spending her sophomore season as a redshirt. The transfer from Tennessee and Indiana native was among the top freshmen in the nation in 2007 while leading the Lady Volunteers to the Women's College World Series. Clay carries a big stick to the plate and could emerge as one of Notre Dame's most dominant sluggers. She'll share time behind the plate with freshman Kristina Wright, a 5-9 natural signal caller with sharp softball instincts and athleticism to spare. Notre Dame utilized three catchers in 2008 -Erin Marrone, Shannon Kelly and Sadie Pitzenberger - but each of those have made the shift to other positions from which they can better benefit the team.

A wealth of players will be competing for show time in the infield. Four all-BIG EAST performers in sophomore Katie Fleury, juniors Christine Lux and Heather Johnson along with senior Linda Kohan should carry most of the

load. Pitzenberger will make the switch to the middle infield, sharing the shortstop and second base positions with Fleury. They will fill the void left by graduated senior Katie Laing, who cemented herself as one of the most proficient fielders in Irish history with the program's career assists record. At the corners will be a rotation consisting of Kohan, Johnson and Lux. The trio combined for 22 home runs and 81 RBI in 2008 - despite Johnson playing in only 11 games before her season ended with a knee injury - and each of the three state a legitimate argument to provide power at the plate for the Irish. Freshmen Kasey O'Connor and Dani Miller displayed their skills this past fall and could possibly work their way into the lineup before all is said and done.

The outfield loses an all-NFCA Mideast Region player in Sarah Smith and her 60 hits in 2008, but returns sophomore Brianna Jorgensborg who saw action in each of the team's 61 contests last season. Senior Stephanie Mola returns to the grass from a wrist injury and will

join Jorgensborg, an all-BIG EAST choice in 2008. Marrone and senior Beth Northway will combat for a spot in the field along with freshman Alexa Maldonado.

Northway, Marrone, Pitzenberger, Kelly and senior Christine Farrell are among the players that should anticipate seeing action at a number of positions if called upon.

The team's 2009 schedule includes contests with four Women's College World Series squads from 2008 including reigning national champion Arizona State.

"Year after year we want to play the best teams in the nation, and this schedule shows that we're ready to do so yet again in 2009," Gumpf said. "Not only will we play some of the other top programs across the nation but we have the opportunity to face the best teams in this region as well."

Starting the season at the Bama Bash Feb. 13-15 in Tuscaloosa, Ala., Notre Dame will join No. 3 Alabama, East Carolina and Wisconsin in the



field. One week later (Feb. 20-22) the Irish head to Stanford's Nike Invitational along with Sacramento State and Western Kentucky. Stanford is ranked 11th heading into the season.

North Carolina State welcomes Notre Dame from Feb.28-March 1 for the Wolfpack Challenge. Rounding out the field with the Irish will be College of Charleston, Canisius and Buffalo.

The second of Notre Dame's westward-bound trips comes March 7 at the UNLV Invitational in Las Vegas, Nev. The Irish face the host Rebels and Texas Tech on the opening day of play with UC Santa Barbara and the Red Raiders waiting on March 8.

A single contest at No. 4 UCLA (March 10) will serve as a tune-up for the prestigious Judi Garman Classic in Fullerton, Calif. The stacked field, including Penn State, No. 10 Oklahoma, Pacific, No. 7 Arizona and No. 2 Arizona State, will each get a shot at the Irish from March 12-15.

Opening the home portion of the schedule with four straight dates at Melissa Cook Stadium, Notre Dame will first challenge Toledo in a March 18 twinbill. BIG EAST Conference play begins with a visit from St. John's (March 22) with non-conference foes Ball State (March 24) and Western Michigan (March 25) coming to town soon after.

A trip to first-year league member Georgetown (March 28) sets the stage for a flight

to USF (March 29). Consecutive home doubleheaders with Pittsburgh (April 4), Seton Hall (April 5) and No. 15 DePaul (April 8) along with a home match with Valparaiso (April 9) precede the longest road swing of the regular season. Notre Dame flies to Connecticut (April 11), visits Wisconsin (April 14) and then double-dips at Villanova (April 18) and Rutgers (April 19). The final road trip will be an April 30 matchup at Providence.

No. 9 Northwestern (April 21) and North Dakota State (April 22) are set to come to town on consecutive dates with Notre Dame's Senior Day scheduled for May 3 when the Irish face Louisville.

The 2009 BIG EAST Championship will be held at Louisville's Ulmer Stadium May 7-9. NCAA Tournament play starts on campus sites May 14 and concludes with the WCWS in Oklahoma City, Okla., May 29-June 9.

Alabama, East Carolina, Sacramento State, Stanford, Canisius, UCLA, Oklahoma, Arizona, Arizona State, USF, DePaul, Northwestern and Louisville each earned invitations to last year's NCAA Tournament. Alabama, UCLA, Arizona and Arizona State were WCWS participants.

Breaking Down the Irish ... with head coach Deanna Gumpf

On the team ...

"I think we are an explosive team this season. There is so much athleticism and power on this roster, both in the field and at the plate. The competition for playing time is heated, and that will bring out the best performances in our players. Our hitting and base running is very determined. We are deep and experienced, and hope to transform all of this talent into victories."

On the pitching staff ...

"We have a mature pitching staff in Brittney Bargar and Jody Valdivia. Brittney is ready to lead the team and she can win some big games for us. Jody has grown a lot during the offseason. She is so competitive and is throwing very hard, and we expect her to pitch right behind, if not on the same level, as Brittney."

On the catchers ...

"We are excited about our catchers and what they are going to bring to the battery. With a veteran like Alexia Clay and the strength of our freshman Kristina Wright, we have a very strong duo behind the plate. I look forward to having them spend more time with our pitchers, and whoever we put back there will certainly help this team win."

On the infield ...

"At the corners we have Christine Lux, Linda Kohan and Heather Johnson. At any time, we could have any combination of the three because they are each strong at the corners and will interchange at those spots all year long. In the middle we will have a combination of Sadie Pitzenberger and Katie Fleury. They are so smooth at second base and shortstop with incredible arms and glovework. Kohan, Kasey O'Connor and Dani Miller could also play second when called upon."

On the outfield ...

"Sharing time will be Stephanie Mola, Brianna Jorgensborg, Alexa Maldonado, Erin Marrone and Beth Northway. Each brings something to the table, and they push each other everyday at practice. We are very confident that whoever we put in the outfield, they'll get the job done."

On the batting lineup ...

"We know we can put anyone in the lineup and they'll be able to perform at the plate. Pitzenberger and Fleury share many of the same qualities with the ability to get on base and cross the plate, so they will make their way to the top of the lineup. Johnson, Lux, Clay, Kohan and Northway carry big bats. Marrone and Jorgensborg put together some great at-bats last season, and with some of the performances I saw across the board this past fall, it will be hard to narrow the lineup to just nine players."

On the schedule ...

"The schedule is very balanced from top to bottom. I think we got the best of the best, and the schedule is very fitting for the type of team we'll field this season. We will be at home a little more this year than previous seasons which will give us a chance to use and showcase our new stadium."

On the BIG EAST Conference ...

"The league gets tougher and tougher each season, as evident by the four teams (Notre Dame, DePaul, Louisville and USF) that made the NCAA Tournament in 2008. We are in the BIG EAST to win the regular-season and tournament titles."

The BIG EAST Conference — DePaul won its first BIG EAST softball championship in 2008 and has carried that success into top billing on the 2009 BIG EAST Softball Preseason Coaches' Poll. Nine of the BIG EAST's 13 head coaches gave the Blue Demons first-place votes, edging out defending BIG EAST regular-season champion USF by five votes. The coaches were not permitted to vote for their own teams.

With the Blue Demons and Bulls collecting all available first-place votes, the next two squads in line, Louisville and Notre Dame, share the poll's third slot. The Cardinals finished fifth in last season's final standings, while the Fighting Irish finished fourth. Both teams joined DePaul and USF in the NCAA Championship.

This year's BIG EAST Championship returns to Louisville's Ulmer Stadium for the second straight season from May 7-9.



Through only seven seasons as the head softball coach at Notre Dame, Deanna Gumpf has already established herself as one of the premiere college coaches in the nation.

Under her tutelage, the Irish have claimed three BIG EAST Tournament titles and seven trips to the NCAA Tournament. Even more, Notre Dame staked the BIG EAST's regular-season championship during her first four seasons on the bench to extend its dominance over league opponents.

In fact, Gumpf enters her eighth season as the Irish head coach with the 17th-best winning percentage among active coaches. With a seven-year mark of 289-136-1 (.680), her victory average is the highest of any BIG EAST skipper.

When assuming control of the Irish program in July of 2001 from her mentor and close friend, Liz Miller, Gumpf inherited a team that was fresh off a school-best 54-7 record one season prior. Without missing a beat, the Irish once again advanced to the final day of competition at the NCAA Regional Tournament and in the process smashed the school record for home runs in a season. Notre Dame also came through with a dramatic run in the 2002 BIG EAST Championship, rallying from a first-day loss to hand Virginia Tech a pair of defeats on the final day to claim the league title.

The second year of the Gumpf era began with a 10-11 start to the season before Notre Dame ripped off a 20-game win streak from April 1-26 to assume control of the BIG EAST Conference



standings. The team then swept through the BIG EAST Championship by scoring 21 runs in three games and won the title on a walk-off home run from conference player of the year Andrea Loman in the bottom of the ninth inning against Villanova.

The Irish rode their momentum into the start of the 2004 slate, upsetting No. 8 Nebraska during the first weekend of the season to claim the program's first-ever bracket championship at the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Leadoff Classic. The team also won the Hoosier Invitational title and the BIG EAST regular-season crown while taking part in a record 69 contests. Notre

Dame was victorious in 49 of those games – the second-best win total in school history – aided by an 18-2 mark in conference play.

By claiming her 100th victory at Notre Dame in record time in 2004, Gumpf was able to reach the 100-win plateau faster than any previous Irish head coach. She reached the 200-win plateau, again in record time, with a victory in the second game of an April 9 doubleheader against Pittsburgh in 2006. The Irish ensured the victory would be a memorable one, as they pounded out 21 hits to tie the school record. Two Irish players – Stephanie Brown and Meagan Ruthrauff – both finished with four hits apiece, as Ruthrauff would also set school records with three home runs and seven RBI.

Yet another landmark season came about in 2005 as the Irish hosted their first NCAA Championship competition at Ivy Field. Bolstered by a 20-game win streak – the second 20-game run of the Gumpf era which included tournament titles at the GRU Classic and Hawaii's Spring Fling – the Irish won the BIG EAST Conference regular-season title and advanced to the BIG EAST Championship final game.

Over the next two seasons, the Irish posted a 74-45 mark including 22 contests against 16 different top-25 opponents. The early stage of the 2006 slate was highlighted by a 3-2 comeback victory over No. 10 Arizona State, which came at the hands of Stephanie Brown's two-run gamewinning homer. After dropping a pair of games to No. 4 Texas and No. 7 Alabama, the Irish proceeded to post a nine-game winning streak including four wins in conference play. Notre Dame kept themselves among the top teams in BIG EAST play with the only five conference losses heading into the league tournament. The Irish entered the post-season showdown as the third-seeded squad and rolled through the competition with wins over Providence, Pittsburgh, and No. 18 Louisville to





claim Gumpf's third conference crown in only five seasons.

Notre Dame then headed to Evanston (Ill.) for the NCAA Tournament and defeated UC Santa Barbara and Southern Illinois before falling to Northwestern – who would go on to earn a seat in that season's World Series – to finish the year with over 40 wins for the third consecutive season.

Gumpf and the Irish rallied to a runner-up finish in the 2007 edition of the BIG EAST Tournament upon entering the event as the fourth-seeded team. Behind the solid play and leadership of senior Stephanie Brown, Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth consecutive season

before bowing out to Illinois State in regional action. Brown would later be named a second-team academic All-American, finishing her career ranked among the program's all-time leaders in eight career offensive categories (including hits, runs, stolen bases, home runs and batting average).

As an assistant coach at Notre Dame (1998-2001), Gumpf worked primarily with the Irish pitchers and hitters. In each of those four seasons, Notre Dame lowered its team earned run average and eventually posted a spectacular 0.89 ERA in 2001, which ranked seventh-best in the nation. And as the team ERA dropped, its batting average steadily rose as the team set single-season program records for home runs, batting average, runs scored and strikeouts thrown with Gumpf on the staff.

Irish players have mirrored their coach's competitive fire over the past six seasons and continue to show a flair for the ability to make clutch plays at key times. This became apparent in Gumpf's

first season, when she led the team to No. face Nebraska for the dedication game of the Cornhusker's Bowlin Stadium. Facing her alma mater for the first time as a head coach, Gumpf and the Irish left Lincoln with a 3-2 after win Liz Hartmann drilled a three-run homer in the top of the sixth inning for the upset victory.

The La Palma, Calif., native played

at Nebraska from 1989-92 while earning a degree in business management. Gumpf was an all-Big Eight Conference second-team selection in 1991 and an honorable mention pick in both 1989 and 1990

Prior to her collegiate success in Lincoln, Gumpf enjoyed an outstanding prep career with Gordon's Panthers, one of the most dominating Amateur Softball Association teams in Southern California.

Gumpf pursued a professional position with Delta Airlines after graduating from Nebraska but did not stay too detached from softball. She started to give private pitching lessons in the Southern California area and what began as a small side job turned into a major venture. After earning her master's degree from Azusa Pacific University in physical education and coaching in 1997, Gumpf entertained countless offers from college coaches hoping to entice her with the opportunity to get back into the college game. Perhaps not too surprisingly, one of the first



coaches to call Gumpf was Liz Miller.

Miller discussed the possibility of having Gumpf join the Irish staff, but a position was never established and Gumpf would opt to become the pitching coach at Long Beach State.

Two years later, Miller phoned Gumpf again to offer a position and the future Irish head coach jumped at the chance.

After winning her third BIG EAST Tournament championship in 2006, Gumpf soon inked a multi-year contract extension with Notre Dame.

Gumpf and her husband, John, reside in South Bend with son, Brady and daughter, Tatum. John coached high school baseball in Southern California before serving as a volunteer assistant coach for the Irish from 1999-2001, and is currently the head coach and assistant athletics director at St. Joseph High School in South Bend. He spent four years as a professional baseball player in the Minnesota Twins' minor league ranks from 1989-94.

Arguably the best all-around catcher in Irish history, Kris Ganeff is now in her eighth year of work with the Notre Dame softball program, this season on the sidelines as an assistant coach. Ganeff spearheads the recruiting efforts for the Irish, which annually attracts the top players from across the nation. In addition to being the program's recruiting coordinator, she also runs and directs Notre Dame's camps and clinics.

A key member of the 2002 and 2004 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year, Ganeff works closely with each player on hitting and defense while specializing in the development of the Irish catchers. In fact, she helped mold catcher Mallorie Lenn into an all-BIG EAST performer in 2004 - a season in which the Irish also finished with a 49-20 record and took home the conference championship. Then in 2008, the Irish were without a catcher when starter Sadie Pitzenberger's season was cut short due to injury. Ganeff took freshman utility player Erin Marrone, who had never played catcher before in her career, under her wing and to call the shots for all-region pitcher Brittney Bargar. Marrone saw action in 55 contests for Notre Dame that season and did not commit a single error in the field or behind the plate.

She has been a pivotal cog in aiding the development of the Irish bats and batteries as Notre Dame has posted seven school records since her first season on staff. The 2002 team set a school mark for runs (318) and home runs (54); the 2003 team posted the highest fielding percentage in school history (.974); the 2004 group logged a program-best 52 complete games and 22 double plays, and the 2005 squad set marks for strikeouts (547) and strikeouts per seven innings (8.74).

Ganeff completed her Notre Dame career by earning all-BIG EAST and all-NFCA Mideast Region honors in 1999. She hit a career-high seven home runs in her final season while snagging out 16 attempted steals from behind the plate.

Ganeff was drafted by the Virginia Roadsters of the Women's Professional Softball League after graduating from Notre Dame in 1999, though the former Irish team captain and MVP instead chose to head into the coaching ranks by taking an assistant position at UNLV.

Prior to the 2006 season she was promoted to the first assistant position with the Irish.

The shift paid off well for all parties involved – Ganeff would assume full control of the team during the first three weeks of the season and led the team to a 7-6 record while head coach Deanna Gumpf was on maternity leave

"Moving Kris into the first assistant position was an easy decision because of her coaching strengths and love of the team and University," said Gumpf.



"Kris and I complement each other well. We see things from different angles and have the ability to find a common ground. She has a strong desire to help our program get to the highest level possible."

A native of Westerville, Ohio, Ganeff earned a bachelor's degree in history from Notre Dame and will soon complete a master's degree in sports science from Ball State. The former Kris McCleary has been married to John Ganeff since 2002, and the couple resides in South Bend with their daughters, Deven and Hayden.

Lizzy Lemire

Assistant Coach Fourth Season Notre Dame '01

A former member of the U.S. National Softball Team and 2001 BIG EAST Player of the Year, Lizzy Lemire returned to her alma mater as an assistant coach for the Irish softball team in the fall of 2005.

Lemire works closely with the Irish outfield corps and is also a polished hitting instructor. She has helped Notre Dame advance to the NCAA Tournament in each of her last three seasons as part of the coaching staff, including a BIG EAST Conference tournament title in 2006.

"Over the past three years, Lizzy has become one of the top hitting coaches in the country," Irish head coach Deanna Gumpf said. "She has committed herself to become not only a student of the game, but a master of the profession. She is such a determined individual and gets better with each season under her belt. I am very proud of her accomplishments and look forward to seeing how she continues to develop our already extraordinary hitters here at Notre Dame."

It was under the guidance of Lemire that outfielder Sarah Smith posted one of the greatest single-season improvements in program history during

the 2008 campaign. Smith saw limited action for the Irish in her first three seasons, then broke out as a senior as the lefty slapper went on to earn first-team all-BIG EAST and all-NFCA regional honors. Furthermore, Smith was one of three Notre Dame outfielders to claim all-league recognition that season. Her .370 batting average and 60 hits in 2008 rank among the best performances ever by an Irish outfielder.

Lemire trekked from coast-to-coast after earning

a pair of degrees from Notre Dame in 2001 before landing back in South Bend. Upon graduation, she earned a spot on a U.S. National team that steamrolled the competition with four consecutive victories and a tournament title during the 2001 U.S. Cup in Hawaii.

After her time with the U.S. National team, Lemire returned to Notre Dame as an athletic department intern through the summer of 2002. It was then that she was accepted into the sport management program at the University of Massachusetts as she



In 2003, Lemire shifted gears by landing a position at Boston College within the athletic department's development office, and was one year later hired as an annual giving associate at Stanford University.

During her first season back in the blue and gold as a coach, Lemire steered the 2006 Irish squad to a collective batting average of .291 while the sluggers sent 44 homers out of the park. Lemire mentored outfielder Stephanie Brown to a pair of All-America honors, as Brown also became one of only a handful of Irish players — including Lemire — to earn all-BIG EAST honors on four occasions.

Lemire captained the most successful team in the history of the Notre Dame program, powering the Irish to an overall record of 54-7 along with an all-time best No. 7 national ranking and the first number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament. As a senior, Lemire hit .324 (including a .383 mark in BIG EAST play) with 38 RBI, 10 stolen bases and three home runs. She shares the single-season record for doubles with Katie Laing, logging 17 two-baggers in 1999. Lemire's career numbers included a .332 average, 28 stolen bases, 126 RBI, nine home runs and 43 doubles. Lemire is regarded as one of the most fearless and skilled defensive outfielders in Notre Dame history.

Her personal efforts were reflected in her team's success, as Lemire was part of a senior class that complied an overall record of 177-63 (.738), earned two BIG EAST Tournament championships, four regular-season conference titles, and made three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Lemire prepped at Woodbridge High School after growing up in Irvine, Calif., where she was the city and high school's scholar-athlete of the year in 1997. The Irvine World News also recognized her as its female athlete of the year following her senior campaign. Lemire led Woodbridge to a No. 2 national ranking and was an ASA All-American in 1997. The daughter of Kathi and Tom Lemire, this Irish coach's love for Notre Dame began at an early age aided by her mother's passion and respect for the University.

Season in Review

Irish Overcome Injuries, Bargar Rewrites Record Books

Midseason surge propels Notre Dame to 10th consecutive NCAA Tournament

The Notre Dame softball program's 20th consecutive winning season was secured with a 38-22-1 record in 2008, which was highlighted by a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Although Notre Dame bowed out of the NCAA Ann Arbor Regional after posting a 1-2 record against the field, the team showed a tremendous amount of resiliency after losing a pair of starters to season-ending injuries and Brittney Bargar shouldered the load from the circle en route to setting several single-season pitching records.

Seven Out of Nine Ain't Bad ...

Seven of Notre Dame's nine starters earned all-league honors at the BIG EAST Conference's annual championship banquet ... the Irish had more selections than any other conference team, trailed by DePaul and South Florida who both placed five on the squad ... Notre Dame placed seven players on the all-conference team in 2004, 2002, 2000 and 1999 ... nine Irish athletes were part of the all-conference teams in 2005 and 2001.

She Can Ball, and She's Smart, Too ...

Second baseman Katie Laing was selected to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District V softball team ... Laing graduated with degrees in marketing and psychology.

Strengthening the Strength of Schedule ...

Six teams on Notre Dame's 2008 schedule were crowned champions of their respective conferences: Northwestern (Big Ten), Texas A&M (Big 12), Long Beach (Big West), Florida (Southeastern) and Campbell (Atlantic Sun) ... NCAA Regional opponents Wright State (Horizon) and Kent State (Mid-American) also earned league titles ... of the 64 NCAA Tournament participants, 14 were on the Irish slate: Florida (overall No. 1 seed), South Florida, California, Texas A&M, Louisville, Virginia Tech, Long Beach, Northwestern, DePaul, Campbell, Purdue, CS Fullerton and UCLA.

The South Bend 800 ...

Notre Dame notched the 800th win in program history in a game-one win at Syracuse (May 4) with style ... junior pitcher Brittney Bargar blanked the Orange by tossing the fourth no-hitter of her career and the 35th no-no recorded in 20 seasons of Irish softball.

Launches By Lux ...

Christine Lux slammed a pair of solo homers in game two at Syracuse (May 4) ... her total of 14 in 2008 set a new single-season school record ... Notre Dame led the BIG EAST with 39 overall homers during the regular season, 22 of which were hit in conference games ... Lux had eight round-trippers against league foes, one short of the conference record.

Walk It Out ...

Junior Linda Kohan has found her knack for getting on base with her patience at the plate ... entering the team's conference home opener, she had drawn more walks (20) than hits (19) recorded for an on-base percentage of .412 which led the team.

Senior Salute ...

The Irish said farewell to a pair of four-year players during Senior Day ceremonies held between games with Connecticut (April 27) ... Sarah Smith and Katie Laing helped Notre Dame post a 53-14-1



Sarah Smith, a first team all-NFCA Mideast Region choice, had a remarkable 2008 campaign by leading the team with a .370 clip and 60 hits. The lefty slapper reached base at a .396 rate and had nine stolen bases. She was the BIG EAST's player of the week on April 28.

(.788) home record over the past four seasons ... the 11-4-1 home record in 2008, aided by a sweep over UConn, secured the 19th overall– and 16th consecutive – season the Irish have won at least 10 home games in a season ... the 1992 team was 9-1-1.

Double Slammy ...

It only took 1,263 at-bats, but Notre Dame finally recorded a grand slam in the 2008 season when Ashley Ellis sent one over the fence in game one against Providence (April 26) ... Notre Dame had hit 31 homers before Ellis' bomb, with only five of those coming with more than one runner on base ... Ellis had five RBI in that contest to set a new career high ... Katie Laing added the second grand slam of the season seven games later with a seventh-inning poke down the rightfield line at Syracuse (May 4) ... Laing tied a career high with four RBI in that game against the Orange, a feat she accomplished three times in 2008.

Tale of Three Seasons ...

The 2008 season started with Notre Dame winning seven of its first 15 games ... a 17-2 run soon followed and then Notre Dame went 13-10-1 over the last 24 contests ... the team had winning streaks of seven and eight games, and dropped at least two consecutive games on five occasions.

Where There's a Will, There's a Northway ...

Junior Beth Northway had hits in eight of 10 games from April 20-29 ... three of those games were multi-hit affairs, capped off by a 3-for-3 day at Valparaiso (April 29) ... she batted .367 over that stretch to raise her overall average from .218 to .256.

The Bri Spree ...

Freshman Brianna Jorgensborg had only one multi-hit game through 49 contests heading into an April 26 doubleheader with Providence ... she lit the Friars for two hits in three at-bats, then posted three hits including a home run one day later against UConn (April 27) ... Jorgensborg was also 2-for-3 with two RBI at Valparaiso (April 29).

Laing Hoists Hardware ...

The Notre Dame Athletics Department held the seventh annual O.S.C.A.R.S. (Outstanding Student-Athletes Celebrating Achievements and Recognition Showcase) on April 30, 2008, at the Joyce Center honoring more than 750 Irish student-athletes for their achievements on the field and in the classroom during the 2007-08 school year ... senior Katie Laing was one of six student-athletes that earned the Byron V. Kanaley Award, the most prestigious honor presented to an Irish student-athlete ... the honor has been given each year since 1927 to senior monogram athletes who have been most exemplary as both students and leaders ... chosen by the University's Faculty Board on Athletics, the awards are named in honor of the 1904 Notre Dame graduate who was a member of the baseball team as an undergraduate ... Kanaley went on to a successful banking career in Chicago and served the University as a lay trustee until his death in 1960

Celebrating Sarah Smith ...

Senior Sarah Smith took home player-of-the-week honors handed out by the BIG EAST Conference on April 29 ... Smith became the second Irish player to win the award as fellow senior Katie Laing racked up a pair of weekly accolades earlier in the year ... in Notre Dame's 5-2-1 outing from April 22-27, Smith recorded four multi-hit games including two three-hit performances ... Smith went 3-for-4 with two runs and one double for a .750 average in

Notre Dame's 4-3, eight-inning win over Loyola-Chicago on April 24 ... she also went 3-for-4 with one run and one RBI in a victory over Connecticut ... for the week, Smith was 14-for-26 (.538) in eight games with seven runs, four stolen bases, two RBI and two doubles along with a sacrifice ... at the time, Smith's overall batting average of .385 ranked third in the league while her .466 clip versus conference foes was the highest of any league player.

When She's On. She's In ...

Freshman Brianna Jorgensborg scored a career-high three runs in game two at Louisville (April 19) but did not register a single hit ... her only hits came from the arms of the Cardinal pitching staff courtesy of two beanballs ... she also drew a walk to put her on base in her first at-bat.

Mother Nature 1, Notre Dame 0 ...

Game two of an April 24 doubleheader with Loyola-Chicago ended in a 2-2 tie when lightning forced an end to the contest ... the Irish had Katie Fleury on first base in the bottom of the seventh with no outs when a bolt flashed over Melissa Cook Stadium ... the tie was just the third in the 1,173 games played in Irish history and the first that did not extend beyond the regulation 7.0 innings ... the last Irish tie came in 1992 when a 6-6 stalemate with Indiana State ended in the 11th inning of an April 28 ballgame.

Gettin' Lucky In Kentucky ...

The April 19 sweep over Louisville snapped a three-game losing streak to the Cardinals and marked the first time Notre Dame has taken a two-game league series from UofL ... Notre Dame last beat Louisville, 1-0, during a BIG EAST Conference Tournament game in 2006 when the Cardinals were ranked 18th in the nation ... after an Irish loss to the Cardinals in the 2008 conference tournament the all-time series record still favors UofL 7-4.

Erin-It-Out ...

Erin Marrone made her debut at catcher against Wisconsin (April 16) and started each of Notre Dame's games since then from behind the plate ... the freshman has also started games for Notre Dame in rightfeld and the designated player spot throughout the season ... she finished Notre Dame's game against UC Davis (March 1) at first base when the defensive lineup was shifted due to an injury to Heather Johnson early in the game.

Melissa Cook Stadium Unveiled ...

The rain in the South Bend area may have washed out an April 12 BIG EAST Conference doubleheader between Notre Dame and Rutgers, yet the day may still go down as one of the most significant in Irish history ... Notre Dame unveiled its new playing facility - Melissa Cook Stadium - during a morning ceremony held just outside the complex ... University president Rev. John Jenkins, C.S.C., blessed the site which will house the Irish softball program for years to come, and remarks were given from then-athletics director Dr. Kevin White, head softball coach Deanna Gumpf, senior tricaptain Katie Laing, and benefactors Lisa Hoffman and Paul and Linda Demo ... the Demos, parents of Melissa Cook, also helped bless a bronze relief of the former Irish player that sits just inside the main entrance of the stadium ... areas of the stadium made possible by gifts from the Delahanty and Hoffman families were honored as weell

Four Means More ...

A school-record three home runs in the fourth inning helped Notre Dame overcome a 5-0 deficit to post an 11-5 non-conference win over Wisconsin (April 16) ... the three homers were the most ever for Notre Dame in a single inning as the Irish totaled four homers in the contest, the first time since the team has done so since an April 9 meeting at Pittsburgh in 2006 ... Meagan Ruthrauff had three blasts in that game with Linda Kohan – who tallied a careerhigh two round-trippers against the Badgers – adding the fourth ... Kohan was joined in the home run department by Katie Fleury and Christine Lux ... Fleury had hit her first career homer – and the first Irish home run in Melissa Cook Stadium – two days earlier against Rutgers (April 14) ... the first bomb of the day for Kohan christened the scoreboard in left-center by leaving a noticeable point of impact.



Just a Couple of Benjamins ...

A win over Villanova (April 13) gave the Notre Dame program its 200th BIG EAST Conference regular-season win ... the Irish are 208-45 (.822) in regular-season games since joining the league ... the program is 272-53 (.837) in overall regular-season conference games, posting a 64-14 (.821) mark as members of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference from 1989-95.

Spin Cycle ...

Sophomore first baseman Christine Lux was batting .182 heading into an April 9 doubleheader against Eastern Michigan ... two games and a few hits later, that average was bumped up to .223, aided especially by a record-setting performance at the plate ... Lux hit for the cycle over the two-game swing, knocking a homer, double and single in game one ... she settled for a triple and one single in the second contest ... Lux tied a school record with seven RBI to open the day. matching Meagan Ruthrauff's total from a 2006 conference game at Pittsburgh, which was played exactly an abbreviated five-inning game, seeing the plate only assists. three times ... Ruthrauff had four hits in her five atbats, including three home runs ... senior Katie Laing totaled seven RBI during Sunday's series at Seton Hall (April 6), with four in game one and three in the capper.

Long, Strong Ivy ...

The home of Notre Dame softball since the program's inception in 1989, Ivy Field saw its final pair of games when the Irish swept Eastern Michigan (April 9) in a non-conference doubleheader ... Notre Dame finished with an all-time record of 288-48-2 (.855) within the friendly confines, including wins in each of the four home games played on its turf in 2008.

The Queens of Queens (N.Y.) ...

Notre Dame stayed flawless against St. John's with a doubleheader sweep on April 5 ... the team is now 26-0 all-time against the Red Storm, but the last two didn't come easy ... the Irish needed all of 12 innings in their 8-4 win to finish the twinbill, which was the largest margin of victory in program history in a game extending past the regulation 7.0 innings ... the last time Notre Dame won in a 12-inning contest was in 1994 when it defeated Indiana on May 20 by a count of 3-1.

A Freshman's First ...

Freshman Jody Valdivia was named the BIG EAST Conference's Pitcher of the Week on March 31 ... the first-year tosser picked up her fifth win of the season by handing No. 17 DePaul a 2-0 defeat in her first career BIG EAST action on March 30 to secure the honor ... the occasion marked the third time in seven weeks that an Irish pitcher has won the award, as Brittney Bargar claimed the accolade twice earlier in the season ... Valdivia (5-4) needed only 10.2 innings of work to pick up two shutout wins ... she dealt DePaul its first regular-season league loss since the 2006 campaign by keeping the Blue Demons at bay with a five-hit effort ... she also limited IUPUI to only three hits without a walk while fanning seven in Notre Dame's home opener on March 26 ... the Anaheim Hills, Calif., native struck out nine batters without allowing a single run over the course of her two outings.

More Than Just Downing DePaul ...

Jody Valdivia and Brittmey Bargar teamed to help the Irish defeat No. 17 DePaul to wrap up a March 30 conference doubleheader ... Valdivia got the win and went 5.2 innings and struck out three with Bargar stepping in to finish the final 1.1 frames to earn her first save of the 2008 campaign ... the duo's efforts put an end to DePaul's 25-game regular-season conference winning streak that dated back to April of 2006 ... it was also Notre Dame's first win at DePaul's ince the 2005 season ... the win also signified the first time that Notre Dame beat an opponent that carried a No. 17 ranking, and was the 16th time the Irish shut out a ranked foe ... Notre Dame has 49 all-time wins against ranked opponents.

BIG EAST Notices Blanking of the Broncos ...

Senior Katie Laing and junior Brittney Bargar found spots on the BIG EAST Conference's weekly honor roll for their efforts against Western Michigan (March 20) ... Bargar tossed a complete-game shutout to give Notre Dame a 2-0 non-conference win against WMU on a cold Michigan afternoon ... Bargar gave up only two hits in 7.0 frames of work and struck out nine Broncos ... she also helped herself by cleanly fielding six grounders for outs ... her only walk of the game came in the bottom of the sixth inning ... senior Katie Laing finished a perfect 2-for-2 at the dish against the Broncos and was the lone player on either team to record more than one hit in the game ... she singled in her first at-bat then belted a solo homer to deep centerfield during her second plate appearance ... it was her second homer of the season, and her 12th knock of the campaign that was good for extra-bases.

She Can Toss It ...

Junior Brittney Bargar was named the BIG EAST Conference's Pitcher of the Week on March 17, claiming the honor for the second time in as many weeks ... Bargar turned in a 0.41 ERA over three appearances at Charleston Southern's Lowcountry Collegiate Softball Invitational to earn a spot on the event's all-tournament team ... she pitched her way to three wins from the circle – including two shutours – while giving up only 13 hits in 17.1 frames ... Bargar struck out 12 batters over that interval and allowed one earned run ... she allowed only three earned runs for a 0.39 ERA since March 1, covering 11 contests and 53.2 innings of work in that timeframe.

The Lowcountry Lowdown ...

Four wins at the Lowcountry Collegiate Softball Invitational hosted by Charleston Southern highlighted Notre Dame's trip to South Carolina ... Sadie Pitzenberger and Katie Laing both totaled seven hits at the tournament to lead the team ... pitcher Brittney Bargar registered a pair of shutout wins from the circle ... a ten-run third inning gave the Irish a 10-2 win in five innings over host Charleston Southern on Saturday (March 16) ... the Buccaneers took a brief 2-0 lead in the top of the third before the Irish pounded out nine hits in the visitor's half of the frame to post the double-figure total ... Pitzenberger scored twice in the inning ... the Irish registered five consecutive hits at one point during the frame ... during a day-one sweep over Towson and Charleston Southern (March 15), Notre Dame's 23 scores on 25 hits marked the program's highest run total over a two-game stretch since taking a pair of contests from Valparaiso on April 23, 2003, by scores of 11-0 and 15-1 ... Notre Dame totaled a season-high 14 hits in 25 official at-bats in the second game against CSU ... Notre Dame totaled 51 hits (10.2/game) and scored 40 runs (8/game) at the event ... in fact, the squad registered at least 10 hits in three consecutive games over that stretch ... each of the 10 hits against Campbell (March 15) were singles ... Laing had two triples, two doubles and seven RBI at the tournament - including a career-high four RBI against Charleston Southern on opening day ... Ashley Ellis totaled two homers to go along with four singles for a .571 slugging percentage ... she also led the team with eight RBI in eight games ... collectively, Notre Dame hit .261 while holding opponents to a .218 mark ... the pitching corps posted a 1.07 ERA over 59.0 innings.

Twice the Fun ...

Two doubles by Katie Laing highlighted her 3-for-4 day at the plate and gave the senior the program's all-time career record by bringing her two-bagger total to 50 during Notre Dame's win at UC Riverside (March 4) ... her record-setting double in the fifth inning traveled to left-center to score Beth Northway ... Laing also led the team with three RBI against the Aggies.

Pound Town ...

Notre Dame racked UC Davis pitcher Jessica Hancock for 13 hits in its 6-5 win on March 1 ... at the time, the season-high hit total signified the most knocks Notre Dame had recorded in a game since it registered 16 against Syracuse on April 1, 2007 ... each Irish batter recorded at least one hit in the game ... Sadie Pitzenberger, Sarah Smith, Beth Northway, and Ashley Ellis each punched in multi-hit efforts at the plate ... Ellis – who screeched a homer over the leftfield fence that exited the park in a flash – also drove in a career-high four runs.

With Honors ...

Junior Brittney Bargar was named the BIG EAST Conference's Pitcher of the Week on March 10 ... the Corona, Calif., native made five appearances for the Irish from March 1-9, logging 25.1 innings of work while posting a 0.55 ERA over that stretch ... during that time she fanned 21 batters, issued three walks, and gave up only two earned runs ... Bargar tossed a one-hitter against Long Beach State (March 7) but did not get the run support needed to earn the win in Notre Dame's 1-0 loss ... one day later she out-dueled No. 24 Virginia Tech and its ace pitcher, Angela Tincher, by giving up only one run on six hits with four strikeouts in the winning effort ... she also checked in for the Irish against No. 2 UCLA to turn in a shutout relief performance.

Fallen Ranks .

Notre Dame earned its first win over a ranked opponent in 2008 when it topped No. 24 Virginia Tech, 2-1 ... previous attempts to upend foes in the top-25 faltered during battles with No. 3 Texas A&M (L, 1-4), No. 7 Florida (L, 2-3 / 2-5), and No. 2 UCLA (L, 2-3).

Laing Shines In Homecoming ...

Senior second baseman Katie Laing earned the first BIG EAST Conference Softball Player of the Week honor for the 2008 season (Feb. 18) ... Laing, a native of Tempe, Ariz., recorded a team-best batting average (.429), slugging percentage (.714), on-base percentage (.500) and RBI total (4) over the four-game stretch ... she totaled 10 bases on the weekend and had multi-hit performances in the 6-5 loss to Western Kentucky and the 4-3 win over California in front of her hometown crowd ... against the Golden Bears, Laing recorded a two-run homer to put Notre Dame on the board early in the contest, and then knocked a walk-off double to drive in the game-winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Bend It Like Bargar ...

Junior Brittney Bargar made three appearances and logged 18.1 innings of work and posted a 1.91 ERA for Notre Dame during the Kajikawa Classic to earn a seat on the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll (Feb. 18) ... she struck out 23 batters over that stretch and earned two wins while giving up only nine hits through three games ... Bargar helped the Irish to a comeback win over California after punching in 4.1 innings of relief time and gave up only two hits without a run ... she also held No. 3 Texas A&M to only four hits in a complete-game effort ... she opened the season against Utah with a 6-2 win, limiting the Utes to only three hits.

First Time for Everything ...

For the first time in Notre Dame history, the Irish scored four runs in a season's opening inning when they accomplished the feat in the top of the first against Utah (Feb. 15) ... the previous record of three was set against Indiana in the 1990 season opener ... the four-run output in a single inning was the team's first since they racked up five scores in the top of the third against No. 12 DePaul (May 11) at the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament ... five freshmen earned starting nods at some point during the Kajikawa Classic ... Ashley Ellis' first career homerun – a deep solo shot to center came during the seventh inning to wrap up Notre Dame's scoring against the Utes ... in her first career at-bat, freshman Brianna Jorgensborg laced a three-RBI double down the rightfield line.

Mutli-Tasking ...

Both Sadie Pitzenberger and Katie Laing registered a pair of multi-hit efforts during the Kajikawa Classic ... Laing had two hits against both California and Western Kentucky ... in her first collegiate contest, Pitzenberger lit Utah for three hits and snagged a pair of doubles against the Hilltoppers ... four players — Pitzenberger, Laing, Heather Johnson, and Brianna Jorgensborg — had multi-RBI performances over the four-game stretch as well.

Take a Load Off ...

It's great to open a fresh season with a win, and head coach Deanna Gumpf has now done that on three occasions in seven tries with the Irish following a 6-2 triumph over Utah ... Gumpf's first career game as Notre Dame's head coach was against the top-ranked team in the nation ... Notre Dame fell in that duel to No. 1 Arizona, 3-0, in Tucson during the Arizona Pepsi Classic in 2002.

During the program's second complete varsity season in 1990, Notre Dame began to hit the road and take part in what has become a stapled tradition in collegiate softball – the early season, warm-weathered tournaments. The Irish are one of the many softball programs that annually seek the top competition in the top tournaments slated for the season's first several weeks. In fact, Notre Dame will begin the 2009 campaign by spanning the nation with trips to Alabama, North Carolina, Nevada and California. Over that stretch the Irish will face the likes of Alabama, East Carolina, Sacramento State, Stanford, Canisius, Texas,

UCLA, Oklahoma, Arizona State, USF, DePaul, Northwestern and Louisville - all teams that earned invitations to last year's NCAA Tournament. Alabama, UCLA, Arizona and Arizona State were WCWS participants as the Sun Devils took home the 2008 national title.



Byron V. Kanaley Award

The most prestigious honor awarded to a Notre Dame student-athlete, the Byron V. Kanaley Award has been presented each year since 1927 to the senior monogram athletes who have been most exemplary as both students and leaders. The awards, presented by the Faculty Board on Athletics, are named in honor of the 1904 Notre Dame graduate who was a member of the Irish baseball team as an undergraduate. Kanaley went on to a successful banking career in Chicago and served the University as a lay trustee from 1915 until his death in 1960. Notre Dame's softball team has had five winners of the award in its 20-year history. Terry Proksch claimed the honor in the first season of varsity softball at Notre Dame in 1989, followed by Kathy Vernetti 1991 and Katie Marten in 1997. Jarrah Myers became the fourth Irish softball player to win the award in 2002 with Katie Laing racking the latest honor in 2008.



Irish in the NCAA Tournament

Notre Dame has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 13 times overall and made its tenth consecutive appearance following the 2008 regular season. The Irish have advanced to the final day of regional action four times. They were eliminated on the final day by Michigan in 1995, Iowa in 2001 and Northwestern in 2005 and 2006.

Liz Miller guided the Irish to their first NCAA appearance and returned five more times. Deanna Gumpf has steered her Irish squads to seven NCAA trips in as many seasons.

Notre Dame has an overall record of 19-26 (.422) in the NCAA Tournament through 13 trips. The program registered three of those wins in of the more memorable showdowns at the NCAAs in 2001.

- The Irish have traveled to Big Ten regional sites since it began to qualify for NCAA regional play ... Indiana (1994), Iowa (2001-02), Michigan (1995-96, 1999-2000, 2003-04, 2008) and Northwestern (2006-07) have hosted the Irish in regional competition ... Notre Dame played host to its first regional at Ivy Field in 2005.
- First appearance: 1994 (Bloomington, Ind.) ... The Irish faced top-seeded Indiana in the first game of the tournament and dealt the Hoosiers a 3-0 defeat in eight innings ... the host team avenged the loss one day later with an 8-0 victory.

- First pitching victory: Terri Kobata (1993-96) ... Arguably the greatest pitcher in Notre Dame softball history, Kobata won the first NCAA Tournament game for the Irish with a two-hit, nine strikeout performance against Indiana in 1994.
- First No. 1 seed: 2001 ... Notre Dame was ranked as high as seventh in the nation during the 2001 campaign and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament number-one seed ... the team could not host the event that season, however, and would bow out on the final day of the tournament to No. 2 Iowa on the Hawkeye's home field.
- First no-hitter: 2008 ... Nine runs on seven hits by the Irish offense and pitcher Brittney Bargar's second no-hitter in as many weeks gave the second-seeded Irish a victory over third-seeded Kent State in six innings to open the 2008 tournament in Ann Arbor ... the 9-1 decision marked the fourth no-hitter of Bargar's career but the second in which the hurler allowed a run ... it was the 36th no-hitter in school history and the first for Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament, also giving Bargar the honor of becoming the first Irish pitcher to record 30 wins in a season.
- Three-In-One: 2008 ... In the 2008 opener against Kent State, Linda Kohan and Katie Fleury were joined in the home run department by Christine Lux, with each of the three bombs coming in the game's third inning ... it was the second time in school history the Irish hit three home runs in the same inning a feat last accomplished exactly one month prior against Wisconsin (April 16) by the same trio.

- Two of Notre Dame's most notable tournament runs occurred at the Salem, Va., site ... in 2002, the Irish rallied from a first-day loss to win four straight games to claim the tournament title in Deanna Gumpf's first season ... the next season the Irish utilized a walk-off home run by Andrea Loman in the bottom of the ninth inning to capture their second straight league title ... bolstered by that home run, Loman became the third BIG EAST player to earn the tournament's Most Outstanding Player trophy two times (UConn's Bridgett McCaffery and Janna Venice also earned the award twice) and joined McCaffery as just the second BIG EAST player to claim the award in back-to-back tournaments.
- · In 2006, behind the strong pitching of senior hurler Heather Booth, the Irish won their three tournament games over Providence, Pittsburgh and No. 18 Louisville by the combined score of 10-1 ... Booth started and threw complete games in all three games of the tournament, including a one-hit shutout of No. 18 Louisville in the championship game ... for her efforts, Booth was named the 2006 Most Outstanding Player.
- The 2007 BIG EAST Championship was hosted in South Bend, Ind., for the third time in as many seasons ... the tournament was played at the Belleville Softball Complex.
- Louisville will host the 2009 BIG EAST Championship at Ulmer Stadium from May 7-10.

BIG EAST Conference

The 2008-09 academic year will be the 30th for The BIG EAST Conference. While the league has gone through membership changes since its birth, it has never been stronger. This academic year will mark the conference's fourth year as the nation's largest Division I-A conference.

The goals of the BIG EAST have never changed. The league aims and expects to compete at the highest level and does so with integrity and sportsmanship. The student-athletes of the member schools continue to maintain the league's proud tradition of success.

BIG EAST teams earned their share of recognition at the highest levels in 2007-08. Four women's teams advanced to their respective NCAA Final Fours: Connecticut field hockey and women's basketball, Notre Dame soccer and Syracuse lacrosse.

Individually in men's sports, Villanova's Bobby Curtis was the NCAA outdoor track champion in the 5,000 meters. Connecticut's O'Brian White won the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy, the highest individual honor in soccer. Two years ago, BIG EAST male and female student-athletes were Hermann Trophy winners.

In men's basketball, the BIG EAST tied its own record set in 2006 by earning eight NCAA Championship bids. BIG EAST women's teams have received eight NCAA invitations in each of the past two years. The combined 16 men's and women's berths in 2008 was an NCAA first.

The quality of BIG EAST football has never been more balanced. Six of the league's eight squads were nationally ranked in 2007. For the third straight year, the BIG EAST representative in the Bowl Championship Series won its BCS bowl game.

The BIG EAST continued to produce student-athletes who were at the forefront of athletic and academic achievement. Nineteen BIG EAST players were chosen to their respective ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Teams, including eight first-team selections.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A group in 2005-06 when five new members began competing. The new schools were: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 34 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain almost one fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 25 national championships in six different sports and 125 student-athletes have won individual national titles

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 370 student-athletes have earned academic all-America honors. Last year in football, Louisville quarterback Brian Brohm, who finished his career as the BIG EAST's career passing leader, was one of the league's eight first-team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America team picks.

Also, Connecticut's Rebecca Lobo, one of the most heralded women's basketball players in the history of the sport, was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 2008. Lobo, a two-time BIG EAST Player of the Year, led the Huskies to the 1995 NCAA national championship.

The BIG EAST has enjoyed tremendous basketball success, especially in this decade. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. In men's basketball, BIG EAST squads have won three of the last 10 NCAA championships. BIG EAST women's teams have taken five of the last nine NCAA titles.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger.

In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse and rowing to its growing list of sports. The first women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003. In 2007, the league conducted its first women's lacrosse championship tournament. In 2009-10, the BIG EAST will begin sponsorship of men's lacrosse, its 24th sport

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based

programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student-athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably shows a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization needs outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Dave Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

For 2009-10, the BIG EAST will undergo one significant change. Tranghese has announced that he will step down from his position on June 30, 2009.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed long-standing relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant in soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 550 BIG EAST student-athletes have earned all America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams. Several athletes earned gold medals in each of the last six summer Olympiads.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 athletes

Melissa Cook Stadium



The Notre Dame family celebrated the life of one of its own during the softball team's inaugural season in the newly constructed Melissa Cook Stadium.

The Irish unveiled their new playing facility during a ceremony on April 12, 2008. University president Rev. John Jenkins, C.S.C., blessed the site

which will house the Irish softball program for years to come, and remarks were given by former athletics director Dr. Kevin White, head softball coach Deanna Gumpf, senior captain Katie Laing, Hoffman and Paul and The Demo. Linda Demos, parents of Melissa Cook, also helped bless a bronze

relief of the former Irish player that sits just inside the main entrance of the stadium.

Cook, a 1994 Notre Dame graduate, was one of four people involved in a March 2002 construction accident at the John Hancock Building in Chicago that claimed their lives. The families of the departed reached a settlement with the skyscraper's owners and other companies named in a joint lawsuit.

Her parents, Paul and Linda Demo, contributed a considerable amount of their portion of the settlement as a gift to Notre Dame and to the Melissa Cook Memorial Foundation, established to provide scholarship assistance to students in Northwest Indiana

Raised in Merrillville, Ind., Cook played for the Fighting Irish softball team in 1991 and 1992, seeing time at second base, short-stop and catcher. She led the team in triples as a freshman and earned a monogram before opting to study abroad one year later. An accounting major, she earned her bachelor's degree and was the controller for Teamsters Union Local 786 prior to her death.

She was a standout athlete in high school, excelling in basketball, volleyball and softball. When Notre Dame offered her a scholarship to play softball, she had achieved a lifelong dream.

Melissa Cook Stadium, a \$4.9 million state-of-the-art facility, sits on the southeast corner of the Notre Dame campus near Eck Baseball Stadium.

As a senior in 2001, Jennifer Sharron threw a five-inning no-hitter against BIG EAST conference rival St. John's.





One of the great all-time players in Notre Dame history, Meghan Murray wore No. 9 for three years (1995-97) after wearing No. 5 as a freshman in 1994.
